The programmes in English are outlined as follows:

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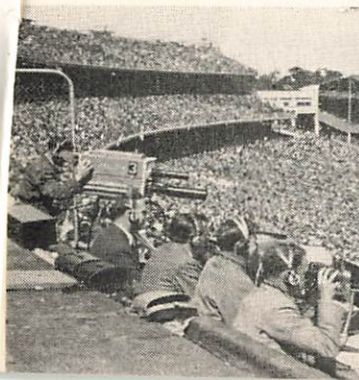
THE WORLD IN THE LIVING ROOM

Television, as elsewhere in the world, has brought to Australia new patterns of family and social life through 225 hours of programmes each week — which is the output of the three stations in one capital city alone.

Selective viewers can find riches indeed in the entertainment, for they can see on the screens in their living rooms plays, operas, ballets, concerts and recitals, documentaries and commentaries from all over Australia and the whole of the outside world. This has been made possible by what is virtually a pooling of world resources through distributing organisations such as the British Commonwealth International Newsfilm Agency, of which the Australian Broadcasting Commission is a member. The A.B.C. operates the National television stations, Australia having both National and Commercial television. The National and Commercial organisations buy extensively from overseas networks and independent production organisations.

The A.B.C.'s offices in London, New York and Singapore are in direct contact with programme sources and also arrange for the distribution of Australian television material abroad. This material is mainly film of important events in this country covered by television cameramen, but it also includes more creative works, for many Australian operas and plays produced for television are of International standard.

The A.B.C. operates one television station in each State capital and in the Federal capital, Canberra. The Commercial stations, which operate under licence from the Postmaster-General's Department, are more numerous. There are two Commercial stations in each of the four larger cities, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Brisbane — and one in each of the other capitals. There are also eleven Commercial stations in country areas. By the end of next year, the A.B.C. will have twelve regional stations in four States and there will be a new Commercial country station in Queensland.

This will not, of course, be the limit because even more stations are planned for the years to come and eventually the A.B.C. alone will have 33 stations beyond the big cities. This will bring 96% of the nation's population within reach of at least one station; 75% will be able to choose from two or more simultaneous programmes.

National (or A.B.C.) stations are financed by the Commonwealth Government, while Commercial stations get their revenue from advertising.

Since most people regard television as essentially an entertainment medium, viewer ratings for instructional or cultural programmes are comparatively low; so quality programmes have become largely — but not by any means exclusively — the province of the National stations. The A.B.C. presents schools programmes supplementary to normal curricula — physics, literature, music, biology, history, current affairs, art, speech and drama. Its

University of the Air covers similar ground at an adult educational level.

The Broadcasting Control Board, among its other duties, keeps a check on good taste in television programmes, for it is well aware of the family nature of the medium. This does not mean, however, that mature programmes are not shown; but stations are required to indicate what programmes are suitable for adult viewing only. Censorship is then up to parents.

While programmes originating in one State can reach all others by way of film or videotape, television's greatest virtue remains its capacity to take what is happening "there and now" into individual homes everywhere. But this presents grave problems in a country where large centres of population are widely dispersed. However, the recently completed coaxial cable between Melbourne and Sydney, more than 600 miles apart, which was laid primarily for telephone communication, can also carry television programmes. Accordingly, people in each of these cities are now able to see direct telecasts simultaneously.

The Adelaide Cricket Test was relayed directly to Melbourne by a link station in an aircraft that circled for hours over a point between Adelaide and Melbourne. Eventually microwave links of a more permanent nature will enable people in rural areas to watch important events in the big cities at the instant they are happening.

Whatever his viewing tastes, the average Australian is far more knowledgeable generally than he was before television brought the world into his living room.

茶の間で見る世界

テレビは世界の他の国と同様、オーストラリアでも家庭や社会生活に新しい変化をもたらしました。今メルボルンにはテレビ放送局が公営、商業合わせて三つあり、毎日延べ225時間放送しています。聴視者は茶の間でいながらにして国内及び海外のドキュメンタリーや解説、或いはコンサート、バレエ、オペラ、演劇等を楽しむことができます。これを可能にしたのは、世界のテレビ番組の交換配給に当る機構で、ABCの加入している英連邦国際ニュースフィルム社もその一つです。オーストラリアには公営のABCテレビと、商業テレビの両方があります。ABC、商業局共に海外のテレビ網や独立プロから手広く番組を購入しています。

ABCのロンドン、ニューヨーク、シンガポール支局は海外からの番組の直接購入と、オーストラリアのテレビ番組の海外配給を担当しています。

ABCは現在連邦首都のキャンベラと各州の首都に一つずつテレビ局を運営していますが、商業テレビの方はもっと数が多くなっています。シドニー、メルボルン、アデレード、ブリスベンの四大都市には、各々二つの商業テレビ局があり、パースとホバートは一つとなっています。又地方にも合計11の商業テレビ局があります。ABCは来年中に四つの州に12の地方テレビ局を作る予定で、クイーンズランド州には、商業テレビの地方局が出来るよていである。勿論、これが限度だということではありません。将来も続々テレビ局が建つはずで、ABCは七大都市以外に33のテレビ局をもち、人口の凡そ96%がテレビの視聴可能範囲にはいる。又75%が二つ以上のテレビ局を選振出来る地域にはいる予定です。

さて大方の人がテレビをまず娯楽と考えている為、いわゆる教育、教養番組の視聴率は、割合に低いのです。従って全部という訳ではありませんが質の高い番組はABCテレビのものです。現在、ABCは、正規のカリキュラムの補充として、学校番組を放送しています。その中には、物理、生物、文学、歴史、時事、音楽、芸術、演劇も含まれます。又成人向けのテレビ教育番組も出ています。

という訳で、テレビが茶の間に登場して以来、オーストラリア人の知識が増したことは疑いありません。

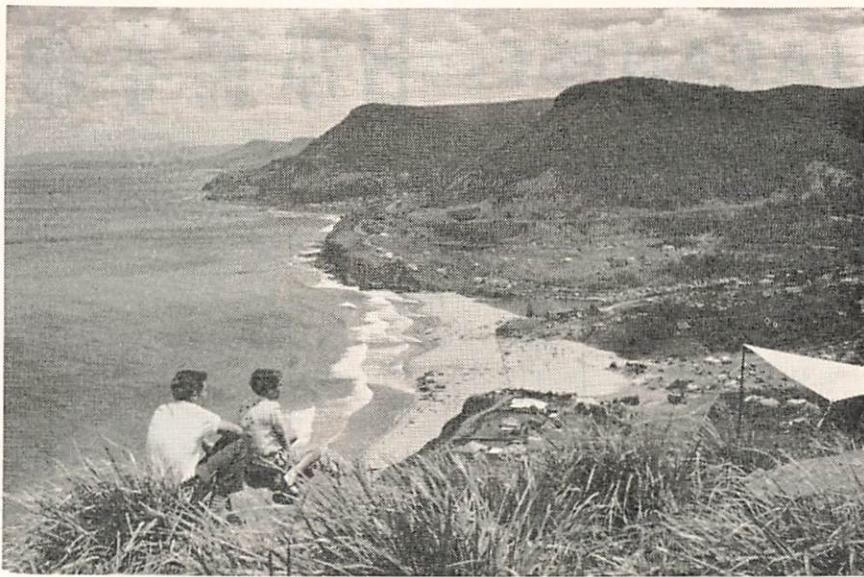

DUNIA DIRUANG DUDUK

TELEVISI di Australia, seperti juga ditempat manapun didunia, telah melahirkan suatu pola baru dalam kehidupan keluarga dan sosial. Dari hanya tiga pusat penjiaran TV disatu ibukota negarabagian sadja, disiarkan atjara2 selama 225 djam seminggu.

Para penonton yang kaja dengan tjitarasa biasanja dapat menemukan tjukup banjak hiburan, karena melalui lajar TV diruang duduknja mereka sudah dapat menjaksikan berbagai pertundjukan drama, opera, ballet, konser dan hiburan musik lainnja, atau film dokumenter dan komentar dari seluruh Australia dan berbagai pelosok dunia. Kemungkinan ini antarlain berkat hasil pengumpulan dari berbagai sumber didunia dan disebarkan oleh badan2 seperti British Commonwealth International Newsfilm Agency, yang salah satu anggotanja ialah Australian Broadcasting Commission, badan induk Radio Australia.

Kalau A.B.C. mengendalikan pusat2 penjiaran TV Nasional, maka siaran lainnja di Australia diusahakan oleh pihak swasta atau usaha komersil. Kedua organisasi itu tidak sedikit membeli bahan2 siaran televisi dari djaringan TV luarnegeri serta badan2 pembikin dan pengolah bahan2 atjara TV yang berdiri sendiri.

Perwakilan A.B.C. di London, New York dan Singapura mengadakan hubungan langsung dengan sumber2 atjara TV disamping mengusahakan penjebaran bahan2 siaran TV dari Australia untuk luarnegeri. Bahan2 itu pada umumnja berupa film mengenai peristiwa2 penting di Australia, yang dibuat oleh djurukamera2 Australia sendiri. Disamping itu juga film2 mengenai usaha yang mengandung lebih banjak dajatjpta, karena tidak sedikit diantara opera dan drama Australia untuk siaran televisi dibuat dengan ukuran internasional.

Pusat2 penjiaran TV yang dikendalikan A.B.C. ialah satu disetiap ibukota negarabagian dan satu pula diibukota nasional, Canberra. Lebih banjak lagi ialah djumlah pusat2 penjiaran komersil atau swasta yang harus mendapat idjin Djawatan PTT. Di-empat ibukota negarabagian, masing2 di Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide dan Brisbane terdapat 2 pusat penjiaran komersil, dan masing2 satu ditiap ibukota lainnja. Belum terhitung 11 pusat penjiaran TV yang tersebar didaerah pedalaman atau pedesaan.

Sementara itu, sekitar akhir tahun yang akan datang A.B.C. akan mempunyai 12 pusat penjiaran daerah di-empat negarabagian disamping satu pusat baru Lainnja milik swasta dinegarabagian Queensland.

Perkembangan ini sudah tentu tidak akan ada batasnja, karena untuk tahun2 yang akan datang juga telah direntjanakan pembangunan2 baru. A.B.C. misalnja, akan mempunyai sekitar 33 pusat penjiaran TV diluar kota2 besar dalam beberapa tahun lagi. Ini berarti, kurang lebih 96% dari seluruh penduduk benua ini akan dapat menjaksikan sekurang-kurangnya satu siaran televisi dari suatu tempat, dan 75% akan dapat memilih dua atjara atau lebih dalam waktu yang sama.

Pusat2 penjiaran Nasional atau A.B.C. dibiayai oleh pemerintah pusat, sedangkan lainnja milik swasta mendapat penghasilan dari iklan2.

Masyarakat biasanja memandang televisi sebagai media hiburan belaka, sehingga tidaklah besar djumlah peminat atjara2 pendidikan dan kebudayaan atau kesenian. Karena itu, atjara2 yang bernilai tinggi pada umumnja menjadi tanggungjawab atau tugas siaran nasional. Sebagai tambahan bagi matapelajaran2 biasa diruang sekolah, bagi murid2 yang menaruh minat disediakan atjara pendidikan sekitar ilmu pasti, kesusasteraan, musik, biologi, senirupa, sedjarah, pidato dan drama serta masalah2 baru didunia. Sedangkan atjara "universitas diudara" menghadirkan bidang2 pengadjaran untuk para mahasiswa.

Bagaimanapun minat penonton terhadap atjara2 TV, boleh dikatakan rata2 penduduk Australia telah mendapat penerangan lebih banjak, dibandingkan dengan masa djauh sebelum pesawat TV membawa masuk dunia keruang duduk mereka.

หน้าโลกมาในห้องรับแขก

ในนครหลวงของรัฐต่างๆของออสเตรเลียมีรายการวิทยุโทรทัศน์สัปดาห์ละ ๒๔ ชั่วโมงส่งจากสถานีวิทยุโทรทัศน์ที่มีอยู่ในนครหลวงแต่ละแห่งสามสถานี ซึ่งผู้ฟังจะได้รับการบรรเทาและความสะดวกสบายจากรายการต่างๆ เช่น อกร อุปรากร ละครเวที สังกัด การบรรเลงดนตรีและรายการกีฬาทางวิทยุ โทรทัศน์ เอกสารต่างๆจากทั่วทั้งออสเตรเลียและทั่วโลกโดยมีทั้งการถ่ายทอดสดจากห้องนั่งเล่นในบ้านของตนเองที่รายการวิทยุโทรทัศน์ทำไว้เช่นนี้ก็ด้วยการตกลงร่วมกันถึงด้านของการจำหน่าย เช่น องค์การภาพยนตร์นานาชาติในจักรภพบริติช ที่คณะกรรมการกระจายเสียงออสเตรเลีย หรือเรียกเป็นอีกชื่อว่า เอ.บี.ซี. เป็นสมาชิก ออสเตรเลียมีสถานีวิทยุโทรทัศน์ที่เป็นของชาติ ซึ่ง เอ.บี.ซี. ดำเนินการ และของวงการพาณิชย์ สถานีของ เอ.บี.ซี. มีรายได้สำหรับใช้จ่ายจากรัฐบาลของสหพันธรัฐออสเตรเลีย ส่วนสถานีพาณิชย์มีรายได้จากรายการโฆษณา ต่างก็ซื้อรายการวิทยุโทรทัศน์จากต่างประเทศอย่างกว้างขวาง

สำนักของ เอ.บี.ซี. ในกรุงลอนดอน, นครนิวยอร์ก และลอสแอนเจลิส ได้ติดต่อกับหน่วยงานวิทยุโทรทัศน์โดยตรง และได้ติดต่อจำหน่ายรายการของออสเตรเลียให้ต่างประเทศ เช่น ภาพยนตร์ของเหตุการณ์ที่เกิดขึ้นในออสเตรเลียที่คนชาวล่าภาพยนตร์ไว้ รายการละคร หรือ อุปรากรที่แสดงได้ถึงมาตรฐานนานาชาติ

ในนครหลวงรัฐต่างๆและแต่ละแห่งและที่กรุงแคนเบอร์รา เอ.บี.ซี. มีสถานีวิทยุโทรทัศน์หนึ่งสถานี ส่วนสถานีพาณิชย์นั้นทำการได้โดยได้รับอนุญาตจากรัฐมนตรีว่าการไปรษณีย์และมีจำนวนมากกว่าสถานีของชาติ เช่นในเมืองใหญ่อย่าง ซิดนีย์ เมลเบิร์น อะดิลด์ และบริสเบน มีสถานีพาณิชย์เมืองละสองสถานีตามเมืองในส่วนภูมิภาคมีสถานีพาณิชย์ ๑๑ สถานี ภายในสิ้นปี เอ.บี.ซี. จะเปิดสถานีส่วนภูมิภาคอีก ๑๒ สถานีในสี่รัฐ และในรัฐควีนส์แลนด์จะมีสถานีพาณิชย์ในส่วนภูมิภาคอีกสถานีหนึ่ง

สำหรับการขยายงานต่อไปนั้น เอ.บี.ซี. จะมีสถานีวิทยุโทรทัศน์ทำการนอกเมืองใหญ่ ๓๓ สถานี และจะทำให้ราษฎร ๘๖ เปอร์เซ็นต์อยู่ในวิสัยที่จะดูวิทยุโทรทัศน์อย่างน้อยหนึ่งสถานี ส่วนราษฎรที่จะเลือกดูสองสถานีหรือมากกว่านั้นก็มีอัตรา ๗๕ เปอร์เซ็นต์

เพราะเหตุที่วิทยุโทรทัศน์มักจะถือเป็นการบรรเทา ผู้ที่เห็นเป็นการศึกษาหรือรายการวัฒนธรรมมีน้อย ดังนั้นรายการที่หนักในทางให้ความรู้มักจะอยู่กับสถานีของ เอ.บี.ซี. ที่ได้จัดทำรายการอุปการะการสอนในโรงเรียน เช่นมีการสอน ฟิสิกส์ วรรณคดี ดนตรี ชีวะวิทยา ประวัติศาสตร์ เหตุการณ์ปัจจุบัน ศิลปะ สุนทรพจน์ และนาฏกรรม รายการมหาวิทยาลัยทางอากาศเป็นรายการศึกษาผู้ใหญ่ในวิชาการต่างๆ

แต่ไม่ว่าผู้ที่จะมีสมณอย่างไร ชาวออสเตรเลียทั่วไปยอมรับว่าวิทยุโทรทัศน์ก็นำโลกเข้ามาในห้องรับแขกของเขาได้

THỂ-GIỚI TRONG PHÒNG KHÁCH

Vô-tuyên truyền-hình ngày nay đã đem đến cho Úc-đại-lợi, nhữn sự thay đổi mới trong đời sống gia-dinh và xa-hội. Trong mỗi đô thị Úc, có 3 đài vô-tuyên truyền-hình trình-bày 225 giờ chương-trình mỗi tuần.

Các khán-giả có thể tìm thấy mọi khía cạnh giúp vui và tiêu-khiển, vì họ có thể thưởng-thức ngay trong phòng khách của họ những màn nhạc-kịch, vũ-diệu, nhạc hoà-tấu, độc-tấu, ca hát, phim tài-liệu và những bài bình-luận thời-sự từ khắp nơi ở Úc-đại-lợi và trên thế-giới. Điều này đã thực-hiện được nhờ bởi sự tập-trung mọi tài-nguyên của thể-giới xuyên qua những tổ-chức phân-phối như là Cơ-Quan Thông-Tin, và Điện-Ảnh Quốc-tê của Liên Hiệp-Anh, mà Ủy-Hội Truyền-Thanh Úc-đại-lợi là một hội-viên.

Ủy-Hội Truyền-Thanh Úc điều-khiển các đài Vô-tuyên Truyền Hình quốc-gia: Úc có cả hai ngành vô-tuyên truyền-hình quốc-gia và thương-mại. Nhưng tổ-chức vô-tuyên truyền-hình quốc-gia và thương-mại mua rất nhiều tài-liệu điện-ảnh của các hệ-thống hải ngoại và những tổ-chức sản-xuất phim độc-lập.

Những văn-phòng Ủy-Hội tại Luân-Đôn, Niu-Uớc và Tân-Gia-Bà giao-dịch trực-tiếp với những nguồn sản-xuất chương-trình, và cung cấp đặt việc phân-phối tài-liệu ra ngoại-quốc. Những tài-liệu này phần lớn gồm những phim ảnh thời-sự của Úc, và cũng gồm những tác-phẩm ca-nhạc và kịch-ngệ có giá-trị quốc-tê.

Ủy-Hội Truyền-Thanh Úc điều-khiển 1 Đài Vô-tuyên Truyền-hình tại mỗi thủ-phủ các tiểu-bang, và tại thủ-đô Liên-bang Úc, Canberra. Nhưng Đài V.T.T.H. Thương-mại hoạt-động với giấy phép của Tổng Nha Bưu-Điện Liên-Bang Úc, lại nhiều hơn các đài quốc-gia. Tại những thủ-phủ các tiểu-bang đều có ít nhất là 1 đài thương-mại, và tại 4 đô-thị lớn nhất là Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide và Brisbane, mỗi nơi đều có 2 đài V.T.T.H. thương-mại. Ngoài ra còn có 11 đài V.T.T.H. thương-mại ở các vùng thôn-quê.

Cuối năm sau, Ủy-Hội Truyền-Thanh Úc sẽ có 12 Đài địa-phương trong 4 tiểu-bang và sẽ có 1 đài thương-mại thôn-quê mới tại tiểu-bang Queensland.

Nhưng đó chưa phải là hết, vì trong tương-lai sẽ còn có thêm nhiều đài được thiết-lập, và cứu-cánh, Ủy-Hội sẽ có 33 đài ở ngoài phạm-vi các đô-thị lớn.

Chính đó, có đến 96 o/o dân chúng Úc sẽ tiếp-xúc với ít nhất là 1 đài; và 75 o/o dân chúng sẽ có thể chọn lựa nhiều chương-trình khác nhau.

Các đài quốc-gia do Chánh-phủ Liên-Bang Úc đài-thọ phí-tổn, còn các đài thương-mại thu-hoạch lợi-tức bằng công việc quang-cáo.

Vì phần đông dân chúng coi Vô-tuyên Truyền-hình như một phương-tiện giải-trí, nên số người chú ý đến các chương-trình có tánh-cách giáo-dục và văn-hoa tương-đối ít. Bởi đó, những chương-trình có giá-trị giáo-dục và văn-hoa phần nhiều nằm trong phạm-vi hoạt-động của những đài V.T.T.H. quốc-gia. Ủy-Hội Truyền-Thanh Úc trình-bay những chương-trình giáo-dục phụ-trợ thêm vào các môn học ở nhà trường, như vật-lý, văn-chương, âm-nhạc, sinh-vật-học, sử-ký, mỹ-thuật, thương-vụ, kịch-ngệ và diễn-thuyết.

Mặc dầu những sở thích của họ như thế nào, người dân Úc trung-bình ngày nay nói chung, đã có nhiều kiên-thức hơn rất xa trước, trước khi Vô-Tuyên Truyền-Hình đem cả thể-giới năm châu vào ngay tận phòng khách của họ. /.

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LA TELEVISION EN AUSTRALIE

La télévision, comme partout ailleurs dans le monde, a modifié la vie en Australie tant sur le plan familial que social. Chaque semaine, les trois stations qui fonctionnent dans une des grandes villes, par exemple, diffusent des programmes d'une durée totale de 225 heures.

Leur variété est, par conséquent, extrêmement grande : opéras, ballets, concerts, pièces de théâtre, documentaires, commentaires. etc. . . ., proviennent de tous les coins de l'Australie et du monde entier. Le téléspectateur n'a que l'embaras du choix. Cet état de choses a été rendu possible grâce à une mise en commun des ressources mondiales, par l'intermédiaire d'organismes de distribution, tels que la British Commonwealth International Newsfilm Agency dont la Radiodiffusion Australienne fait partie. Cette dernière est en charge de stations de télévision nationales. Il existe ici, également, des stations de télévision publicitaires. Toutes deux se procurent beaucoup de programmes à l'étranger en s'adressant, soit à des réseaux, soit à des organismes indépendants.

La Radiodiffusion Australienne a des bureaux à Londres, à New York et à Singapour qui sont en contact direct avec les diverses sources pouvant nous fournir des programmes. Ces bureaux s'occupent aussi de la distribution à l'étranger de programmes télévisés en Australie. Il s'agit surtout de films d'événements importants qui ont eu lieu ici, mais comprenant également des opéras et des pièces de théâtre télévisés en Australie et qui sont d'un niveau international.

La Radiodiffusion Australienne a une station de télévision dans chacune des capitales des divers Etats, de même qu'à Canberra, qui est notre capitale fédérale. Les stations publicitaires, elles, sont plus nombreuses et nécessitent une licence octroyée par le Ministre des P.T.T. — Dans chacune des quatre villes les plus importantes du continent, à savoir, Sydney, Melbourne, Adélaïde et Brisbane, il y a deux stations publicitaires. A Hobart et à Perth, il n'y en a qu'une seule. Il y a également 11 stations publicitaires en province. D'ici la fin de l'année prochaine, la Radiodiffusion Australienne aura 12 stations régionales dans 4 Etats et il y aura également une nouvelle station publicitaire au centre du Queensland. Il va sans dire que d'autres stations sont prévues et la Radiodiffusion Australienne, à elle seule, compte avoir 33 stations en dehors des grandes villes. Cela veut dire que 96 % de la population pourraient voir les programmes d'une station au moins et 75 % pourraient choisir entre au moins deux programmes simultanés.

Par opposition aux stations publicitaires, les stations nationales émergent au budget du Gouvernement Fédéral.

Comme les programmes de télévision sont considérés par la majorité des téléspectateurs comme un moyen de divertissement, les programmes culturels sont relativement peu prisés; cela revient à dire que, de façon générale, mais nullement exclusive, seules les stations nationales ont des programmes d'un niveau élevé. La Radiodiffusion Australienne émet également à l'intention des écoles des leçons de physique, de musique, de littérature, biologie, de même que des pièces de théâtre. Des cours similaires sont également télévisés à l'intention des adultes par l'Université de l'Air.

Quoiqu'il en soit, grâce à la télévision, l'Australien est mieux au courant de ce qui se passe dans le monde.

Front: The Koala (*Phascolarctos Cinereus*) is the most lovable of Australian animals. It is commonly called the Koala or "Native Bear" but it is really not a bear at all. The name Koala is derived from an aboriginal word meaning that the animal seldom drinks. It obtains liquid from the dew and moisture in the leaves of the Eucalypts tree on which it feeds.

Koalas breed every second year, and usually have only one young which spends the first few months in the mother's pouch, and then on her broad thickly furred back.

The Koala has a stout body and strongly nailed hands and climbs well, but is awkward on the ground. It is nocturnal, sleeping during the day in the forks of trees.

The Koala is the subject of the Nature Notes talk to be broadcast on July 26.
