While you may know that your car is faster than the next man's, the luck of the game in track racing often acts against you. But the way to prove once and for all who's got the quickest car in a straight line — build a drag strip. It costs much less than a full track and you can incorporate it into an existing track yet still use the basic layout for circuit racing.

As much straight track as you can lay your hands on satisfactory length would seem to be about 25 ft. for 1/32 scale cars, about 36 ft.


