



# A closer look at Melbourne's "new brigade"

With the Port Phillip Folk wited to the blues workshop month away, it might be featured on the Loved buseful to have a look at some of the more important sing forthcoming L.P. ers currently involved in the Melbourne folk scene. With the departure of Mooney and Wyndham-Read for Eng-land, and with David Lums-den taking a break from public singing, a gap was left in the ranks of per-formers at Traynor's, Melbourne's most permanent and most important folk place. The following are the major singers who have filled this gap.

Danny Spooner and Gor-don McIntyre are probably the two most popular folkies around at the moment. Besides occasionally doing con-certs they have made a record with Martyn Wyndham-Read and have been topping the bill almost nightly at Traynor's. The L.P. "A Wench, a Whale and a Pint of Good Ale", (score) contains among other things, a number of the sea songs and shanties in which Danny, who learned many of them at sea, specializes. The record does less justice to Gordon who not only plays some neat guitar (e.g. Davy Graham's piece "Angie") but it is also a fine singer of both traditional and modern both traditional and modern British songs. The only major flaw in their recent work is a lack of new material, a problem of which they are both well aware. It has been largely due to these two that Traynor's, according to Don Carlos, has had its best attended Christmas period ever.




