Sydney violence SHARPIES BLAMED

GO-SET SURVEY



Margaret Bailey and Lyn O'Rafferty give their views

The steadily increasing reports of teenage violence at and near the discotheques have, once again, become news in Sydney. Police and civil authorities have been forthright in condemning the state of affairs that recently culminated in the death of a teenager in a main city stroet.

Outbreaks of fighting between rival groups of teenagers and persistent reports of vandalism and intimidation prompted Go-Set to find out what is really happening.

Last Saturday morning we interviewed well over a hundred teenagers in the city streets. Go-Set spoke to teenagers and older disco patrons in boutiques, arcades, coffee lounges and even on pedestrian crossings.

The large majority of those interviewed were emphatic in their condemnation of the gargs of sharple troublemakers. Something like 90% of those interviewed were of the opinion that the police were: (1) inefficient in stopping trouble; and (2) too inclined to put the blame on the "long hairs" rather than "the sharples and alfs".
