Phonies . . . frauds . . . manufactured, etc., are just a few of the names that have been used to describe the Monkees since they hit English scene two months ago. This has come about be-cause the Monkees did not provide the musical backing to their first two singles . . . "Last Train to Clarksville and "I'm a Believer".

So in the course of Australian justice we have asked some of the top names in the Australian pop business it they think that the Monkees are phonies.

Anyone who claims that the Monkees are phonies should call the Beatles Stones, Normie Rowe, and all of us, the same as every artist at one time has had to use some form of techni

cal or musical help to put down a record. The Mon-kees started in America on their own television show as entertainers, they also put down records which in turn became international hits . . so, if the record buying pub lic thought they were good enough to buy . . what is everyone beefing about. Let's face it . . . you don't have to play an instrument to become a pop star.

LYNNE RANDELL Lynne would be one of the best authorities on this subject as when she was visiting America she not only saw the Monkees television show, but had the thrill of meeting them.

"With these numbers the Beatles seem to be branching out. They are beginning to record to please them-

selves musically. "The group seems to be working more for their own satisfaction. Neither of the sides is what you'd call commercial — although this

word.

"Although they naturally want their discs to sell, they don't particularly care whether it's the kind of sound people expect. In a way, especially with these sides, the Beatles are anxious to prove they can change public attitude. This shows they are still progres-

sing.
"I was particularly taken "I was particularly taken by the strong electronic effects used on both sides. "In general, I think the record is well in keeping with the Beatles' best work. "It should give them yet

"Yes, I agree with Judy, they're both good numbers. But then what else can you expect from the Beatles — they're one of those rare

— they re one of those rate groups who've never made a bad record.

"I suppose you could say I'm prejudiced, as I'm a great fan and have always liked all their work. They're different songs to what we've become accustomed to, but I don't think the group is trying to start a new trend. 

Let's take a look at skin. Do you really know much about it? So few skins are truly normal or even belong to the one classification. So much depends on what you do, how you feel, where you live — and how you treat it.

Skin is active all the time. The outer layer is called the epidermis and the cells here are continually being rubbed off the surface as invisible white scales, to be replaced from beneath by another layer. Below the epidermis lies the dermis. Contained in this are the nerves that give your skin its sensations and the blood vessels that nourish the skin and regulate its temperature. In the dermis we also find two types of glands; sebaceous glands which secrete a fatty substance through the hair follicle, giving lu-brication to hair and pli-ability to the surface of the

skin; sweat glands which open through the pores and cool the skin through eva poration.
Your skin deteriorates in

appearance if you regularly take sleeping pills or other drugs. Some kinds of acne are caused by indigestion or the skin's protest to alcohol

not necessarily a high intake. Nasal or sinus com plaints can cause dark shadows under the eyes, so if late nights are not respon-sible for these — check with your doctor. Bad teeth can cause unhealthy skin too, so a check may be necessary here also


