


Before Johnny Young commenced his Sydney appearances he linted to me that the GO!! Show could be finishing for good in the near future.

'Generally, the disc is very ordinary and has to be heard several times to be appreciated."




"It is too much like his previous hit.

"This is something we don't expect of Tom Jones. It is quite good sound, but not up to the standard of 'Green, Green Grass'. The record is not nearly as simple and therefore loses much of its effect

"Most of his songs have been written by Gordon Mills. He should have stayed with Mills instead of recording another artist's material. I'm disappointed in the record, particularly because I've always been a great fan of Jones. I've got all his LP's and singles, but wouldn't buy this one. However it'll probably take off, for Jones, like so many others, can sell records on his name. But, I'm sure many people hope he never does another song like it.

THEY ALMOST NEVER GOT INTO POP!

By Ian Meldrum

Since the rise of Elvis Presley in the mid-firities the popular music scene has popular music scene has been divided in half. The adults got one half and the teenagers the other, and never the twain met, except to complain about the other half's lack of taste. But the 'sixties came and

so did a new sound, which the middle-roaders dug, and so did the swinging Top 40

The sound was a chart topping, radio-filling, mood-setting, curiously refreshing voice of the Tijuana Brass and its creator leader, Herb

"LONELY BULL"

That was in the year '64, and a cry went up for per-sonal appearance by T.J.B. "Lonely Bull" that put T.J.B. on the charts throughout the world was a wanted product But the strange thing was tnat Hero Aipert's group were only session-musicians wno sat in for the recording session. So Herb did the logical thing and formed

them into a group which pecame known as the Tijuana Brass

Herb was no stranger to the record scene, as by this time he had his own record-ing company namely A. & his partner being Jerry Moss who had previously worked with Hero in pro ducing records for such people as 'Jan and Dean''.

A TASTE OF SUCCESS

Herb never dreamt when recording "Lonely Bull" that it would achieve world wide success. After completing "Lonely Bull", Herb felt it was good but there was still something missing, so he spent a whole afternoon at a bullfight recording band roises, crowd noises, and Ole's which he dubbed into the record, the finished product turned into a master-

Since then Herb Alpert and T.R.B. have become as big a legend as the Beatles. they have topped the L.P. sales for the past two years. and have topped the charts or Honey" and "Zorba the

They have packed audiences in auditoriums in nearly every part of the world, and have them screaming for more when they finish.

TRUMPET - GREAT

Herb Alpert himself has achieved personal success as a trumpeter, as has been de-clared a great amongst such names as Louis Armstrong, Harry James, Clifford Brown, etc. Herb also by many of his fans has been called the matador of music, a fitting description to the lithe, dark headed actor handsome performer. He describes his music as

a "wild happy sound, like the Mariachis at a bullfight, it's good natured and full of humor. It's not a protest and not a put down. I think people were bugged with hearing music which had an undercurrent of unhappiness and anger, even sadism. But our music you can get with in a hurry, tap your feet and

a lot of time and thought has gone into its furnishings . . . contemporary furniture, vivid oranges and bright greens. The walls are de-corated with examples of modern sculpture and paint-ing, and several of Barry's own paintings.

Born within ten minutes of each other, at Leeds in 1948, Paul and Barry are not identical twins and it is no problem telling them apart. Their personalities are also individual.

Paul is outspoken, frank and believes that honesty in speech and thought, is one of the most important things in life. He is the more aggressive of the two. Barry is gentler, he feels


