shaky."



He retains the same reserved, thoughtful air even in the privacy of a small circle of friends

Herb is the guiding light behind the Tijuana Brass a sound which could even surpass the magical melody of the Beatles. They have been called the greatest sen-sation in American show-business in the past 25 years. Yet it is only two years since the group got a stand-ing ovation after its first

performance. And it all began with a visit to a Mexican Herb described the sound Melbourne last week.
"The idea hit me when I went to a bullfight in Tijuana in Mexico" he said. "I wasn't exactly a fan of the fights — in fact it was only my second visit to the bull-

ring.
"I decided to blend the sound of the trumpets with a jazz beat. It was for a

tune I'd wanted to record but didn't quite know how to handle' The result was "The Lone-ly Bull" and led to Herb's own record company. The disc was a world-wide suc-cess and was followed by an album. Then ame pub-lic appearances and The Brass began to boom.

It couldn't have come as a

Which for a self-made himself "I knew I had some musical millionaire seems a sort of sound, but wasn't prepared for the sudden reaction", he said "It has reaction, he said. It has all been fantastic and I'm deeply grateful". Which isn't very surprising. The Brass can now ask and get, up to \$45,000 for a single perform-

ance.
As well as playing at dozens of the best-known dozens of the best-known clubs, they command fan-tastic fees at American Universities and Colleges. Each of the bigger colleges has its own auditorium, with seating capacities of the following the size of Festival Hall or Sydney Stadium.

But given the chance to play before a huge crowd or in a small theatre, Herb will pick the theatre every time

"I would rather play to a small crowd that is fully satisfied, than a big one which goes away restless' he said.

But small audiences are becoming a rarity. The Brass packs them in where ever they appear and record sales have soared. They have sol dover 5 million albums. Which again doesn't seem in keeping with the quiet shy-ness of this Los Angeles born musical wizard who has
