RECORD REVIEW

Quite a few records by Australian folk singers and/or of Australian folk music, have been put out recently some good, some not so good.

"Will Ye Go Lassie Go and other Folksongs" Martyn Wyndham — Read, Glen Tomasetti and Brian Mooney (W & G) - This is an excellent record and W & G should get a pat on the back for producing it. These three have produced fine music for several years now, and this record is no exception. They combine parti cularly well, in sensitive renditions of a number of Ene lish, Scottish, Irish, Australian and even French and Danish folksongs Outstanding are — Brian's "Famine Song" sung against a keening-type harmonic background provided by the other two. Glen and Martyn's Scots ballad Huntingtower, and all three together on the beautiful Irish song, made famous by the McPeake family, "Will

Ye Go Lassie Go Tina Lawton (C.B.S.) - A rather disappointing re cord from the popular Miss Lawton. Again mainly songs from the British Isles, but sung in such a genteely Frolicsome lah-de-dah manner that they're almost totally un-contincing. That she can do much better than this is shown by an unaccompanied "She Moved Through the

"The Springtime It Brings on the Shearing", Gary Shearston (C.B.S.) — This record marks the beginning of Shearston's attempts to really get inside the stylistic discipline of traditional singing. He is only half successful at this stage, but it has proved a more fruitful ap-proach. His singing still very much reflects the indivi-dual influences — Simon McDonald, Duke Tritton, and, obvious example). Still this is far better than his first record of traditional songs and definitely superior to most other city singer's attempts at Australian folk music Richard Brooks' harmonica is excellent and Les Miller supplies capable banjo and second guitar. Edgar Waters' notes are comprehensive and informative and the record

cover is attractively designed.

Two of the very few blues singers still singing traditional style blues in Melbourne are Ken White and Graham Squance (if there are any others please write in and let me know where they are (inging). They both play harp and that almost extinct instrument the acoustic guitar. They describe their style as country-style city blues - "we play city blues the way a country blues

Their main influences are Muddy Waters Sonny Boy Williamson II, Robert Johson and Son House. They started playing blues about a year ago under the inspiration of Tony Standish (Heritage Record Snop - abov Trainers). Kenny feels that the blues are the "real me" This identification with blues is the result in Graham's opinion of being brought up on Rock and Roll, to them the blues is more a part of their Heritage than their own Australian folk music.

Unlike the masses they both think that Dylan is great and see no real difference between the early and later

Key and Graham are interested in forming an R and B group but at the moment can't afford the necessary electrical accessories (for a while they were playing in a group but they found themselves playing "white and anyway the amplifyer broke down).

At this stage Graham dashed off to do a bracket at Trainers explaining as he went that the 12 string he used to play was too limited. However Ken stayed long enough to declare that he didn't think there was any R and B being played in Australia, that he liked the Beatles but not the Rolling Stones and hadn't heard of Billy Thorpe

The two play at their best very relaxed, liquid blues. Both of them are also fine artists in their own right Ken playing a very wild Harp and Graham playing extremely beautiful running blues in the style of Mississippi John

DANNY ROBINSON

Well known for his appearances with John Duffy at the Workshop. Danny Robinson has given away the Maton steel string for an electric Bass and is now singing in the Ward Mob.

Danny started singing country blues under the influence of John Duffy after a brief firstation with the folkie world (Irish Ballads, early Dylan etc.) but he feels the most important influence on his development was Shane Ducknam who started him playing R and B. His favorite recording artists are Solomin Burke, James Brown and Ray Charles. He thinks he'll end up playing Modern Jazz which he refuses to distinguish from Blues anyway. Of the recent crop of white blues men he prefers Geoff Maldeur I haven't as yet heard him sing with the group but if it sounds anything like the stuff he was singing at the workshop it should be well worth

How To Enter RACING GA

Some years ago the British Racing Drivers' Club issued a booklet in which they gave some very worthwhile information and advice to those intending to start motor racing. This article is beated largely on that booklet and those for whom! It is not those for whom! It is not the property of the property

Motor racing is not only dangerous — it is also expensive. However keen you are to race, don't start until you to race, don't start until you can really afford it. Apart from the danger of racing a car prepared and perhaps even built "on a shoestring" don't forget that to put it right a blow up or prang may cost far more than you can afford. There are many other afford. There are many other less expensive branches of motor sport for you to enjoy until you can afford it.

until you can afford it.

Do you know exactly what it jeels like to drive at racing speeds? It you can truthfully answer "Yes" you are lucky to be allee. Nobody in his right mind drives at racing speeds on public roads. Try to get in some practice on a closed circuit before the day of your first race.

Of your first race you car "inside out?" It is not you normal road car, it's almost certain you don't. It's then

normal road car, it's almost certain you don't. It's then even more important that you should get in some prac-tice apart from official pre-race training. Make sure you are completely conversant with your car's handling and senseral, characteristics. To with your car's handling and general characteristics. To do this it is essential that you should find the correct seat-ing position. You should drive in the position which feels most comfortable to you and at the same time gives you complete control over the vehicle. The impor-tance of this point should not be underrated: a driver who is uncomfortable in his car is a potential menace to self and other competi-

Note that it is definitely not recommended that you should experiment with tyre pressures, damper settings and the like without profes sional guidance. Neither should the amateur dabble in special fuels which have not en tested in the vehicle. be better and sater take expert advice on these matters. Most concerns in-terested in Motor Racing are only too anxious to help you get the best results from their products and will gladly

give you the benefit of their erverience.

Even if you have a mechanic to help you, make yourself familiar with the technicalities of your car. The more "mechanical sense" you have, the less are the risks of a costly high you Don't aim too high until you have 'found your feet'. Probably the best type of event in which to make your debut will be a Club Closed Meeting, of which there are many throughout the year. The first of the control of
