what has changed?

Well, loudspeakers for one thing. Practically all loudspeakers designed in the last few years have (rightly) followed the trend towards lower efficiency and therefore require more power to drive them.

And pickups, too. The trend here is towards smaller and lighter moving parts producing lower outputs, requiring greater sensitivity and improved signal to noise ratio in the pre-amplifier.

Notwithstanding the reduced scope of our demonstration, we should make it clear that the KEF range continues in production and is unaltered. Multiplex Stereo Receivers, Players and Loudspeakers Systems

A series of high quality tuner amplifiers, matching loudspeaker systems and transcription playing decks is being shown this year. All the integrated units incorporate F.M. SX-1000TA provides 40 watts R.M.S. clean sound from each singleended push-pull channel. This is a superb high fidelity tuner amplifier for professional use having an overall frequency response of ± 1 db from 20 c/s to 30 Kc/s. Double protection circuitry ensures 100% safety in operation. By combining the monitor switch with the mode switch four tracks recording and reproduction of mono can be achieved.

Amplifiers, Tuners and Loudspeakers

Recent trends in loudspeaker and pickup design have led to changes in amplifier requirements previously unchanged for many years. These are mainly greater power output for driving low efficiency speakers and greater sensitivity for low output pickups. In addition, developments in transistors have now made it possible to produce amplifiers of rather better performance than the best valve models, with not too great an increase in price, and these factors together led to the introduction of the new Quad 33/303 models.

The unique output circuit arrangement of the **Quad 303** is the subject of a technical article in *Wireless World* (April, 1968) and is causing considerable discussion in technical circles everywhere. Very favourable reviews of both units have appeared in the hi-fi magazines both here and abroad.

This equipment maintains the flexibility of installation associated with separate units not possible with more cumbersome "integrated" units, while the physical size of the power amplifier (two 45 watt power amplifiers in the same volume as the old single 15 watt amplifier) and cool running greatly simplify cabinet design. Conversion of existing Quad installations is also quite simple as the control unit and tuner require virtually the same panel cut-out as their predecessors.

Apart from the front panel the FM tuner is substantially unchanged, but is now self powered and with multiplex facilities incorporated. The latter provide automatic stereo switching which can be over-ridden if required, by pressing the mono radio push buttons on the **Quad 33** control unit.

The Quad electrostatic loudspeaker is completely unchanged but speakers more than about two years old do require a small modification to avoid risk of damage when used with the **Quad 303** power amplifier.

High Fidelity Loudspeakers and Enclosures

Only recent developments in output power transistors have permitted true **Class A** operation to be achieved. **Class A** operation offers a distortion content which is negligible at low power and rises in linear manner with increasing output. In simple domestic terms this means that the distortion content at normal listening levels (between $\frac{1}{4}$ and 1 watt) is many times lower with **Class A** operation than with its Class B counterpart. These differences are not only measurable but readily audible.

Two models are being offered. A fully integrated 10 watts per channel version complete in teak case (Model A21), and a highly sophisticated 20 watts per channel power amplifier of advanced specification (Model A41) and a separate control unit (Model C41) featuring facilities designed for the discriminating enthusiast and professional user.

Complementary to these amplifiers is the **Pavane**, a new, compact free standing triple speaker system measuring $25\frac{1}{2}$ in. x $15\frac{1}{2}$ in. x 12 in. deep. New in the dynamic range are three microphone has a specially tailored frequency response for a particular application. The MD 415 has been designed as a vocalist's microphone with excellent anti-feed-back properties, and a built-in on/off switch. The MD 421 HL de luxe is a development of the MD 421 studio cardioid microphone, but this new version has a smoother frequency response and is used in particular by jazz groups, dance bands, and night club entertainers. All these three models are easily recognisable by the black and gold finish.
