VSAC seminar series

The heart of the conference aspect of VSAC will be a series of seminars, hosted by VALVE's technical editor and resident smart guy, Paul Joppa. A practicing acoustical engineer and active AES member, Paul is a valiant defender of the right to have fun in audio. The schedule will be organized to allow everyone to spend part of their time visiting exhibitor's rooms. Sign ups for seminars will be done at check in. Each seminar is limited to 50 participants.

We expect Grego Sanguinetti's "tube tasting" to be a sellout. Grego will be demonstrating the sound of different output tubes in a versatile breadboard style amplifier chassis. Participants will have the rare opportunity to compare and contrast the sonic qualities 2A3s, 300Bs, 45s, and a bevy of other popular DHT's.

Dr. Bruce Edgar will also headline our seminar series, giving his well regarded talk on the virtues of tractrix horn designs.

MagneQuest's Mike Lefevre will make available his encyclopedic knowledge of transformer and choke design in an open, question and answer type of seminar. VALVE's Dave "Full Track" Dintenfass will give a demonstration of minimalist recording techniques, and Paul Joppa will give an invaluable presentation one of the more elusive elements of tube circuit design, that of calculating operating points.

Frank Morris of Gold Aero will give us guidelines on proper tube testing techniques, explaining what various tests can really tell us.

John "Buddha" Camille will give some insight to another major challenge of tube audio circuit construction, that of eliminating hum and ground loops.

Jennifer Crock will lend us her well developed insights on interconnect and speaker cable design, and knowing Jennifer, she may embrace a whole range of other design issues.

Eduardo B.E. de Lima will share his newly developed techniques for optimizing the SE amplifier-loudspeaker interface, considering in some detail many ideas he proposed in the recent issue of Glass Audio.

Ah yes. And yours truly will hold court with presentation of the latest developments on the parallel feed front. Doc B.

The Sakuma Concert: Remembrance of Sounds Past

Sunday night August 31, at 7 p.m. in the Admiral Ballroom, we will host a very special event. Direct from Japan, Mr. Susumu Sakuma will give a concert, Remembrance of Sounds Past, with his esoteric all transformer coupled, directly heated monophonic audio system through an Altec based horn loudspeaker system.

The Sakuma system has a near cult following in Japan. Through years of experimentation Sakuma san has developed techniques of building and tuning his system entirely by ear, with breathtaking results that have been demonstrated in Paris and Milan as well as Japan. To get a feel for the exotic philosophy of this very special man and his world renowned system, we present here an excerpt from the Direct Heating website, home of the Sakama System devotees:

"After two hours ride from Tokyo, the express train brings you to the small town of Takyama near the beautiful seaside. At the end of the street, you find a small restaurant called *Concord*. As soon as you step into the entrance, you are puzzled by the fantastic sight of many hand made vacuum tube amplifiers. "Am I in a restaurant, or in an audio shop?" When you need someone's help, across the counter you will find the man with a smile. This is *Mr*. Susumu Sakuma. We call him "Sakuma san".

"Sakuma san was born in 1943. After making many amplifiers, he noticed that the amplifier conforming to electronic theory does not always satisfy our emotional sense. He decided to build his system by his emotion, not theory. His many original ideas have resulted in an unusual monophonic system. Sakuma amplifiers are especially unusual. He didn't care about slander against himself, but he was concerned for the feelings of Sakuma amplifier users.

"The one way to prove their correctness, was by giving audio concert demonstrations. During some two scores of years, there have been presented innumerable domestic audio concerts, as well as those in Milan and Paris, using amplifiers of his own production and other audio instruments of his choice. More than 4,000 people have listened to music played through his system with great enjoyment. Newspapers and magazines welcomed his performances. Experiencing his sound, both music fans and the media agreed that reproduced music can be also a form of ART that has beauty and communicates as much emotion as "real" music.

"Today more than 200 audiophiles visit Sakuma each year to seek truth in the words "Farewell to theory". In 1977 the editor of "Audio technology MJ Musen to Jikken" visited the Concord Restaurant. He was impressed with Sakuma sound and requested Sakuma san to write a report of his works for "MJ". More than 40 Sakuma articles have appeared in "Audio technology MJ Musen to Jikken" in nearly 20 years. "MJ Musen to Jikken" is a most anthoritative magazine, published since 1924.

"In 1980 Direct Heating was incorporated. Our activities include publishing "Direct Heating" migazine, giving audio concerts and other beneficial steps to bring audio into the fine arts,

"In 1989 Soluma san published "The Remembrance of Sound Past". Both 1st and 2nd edition are out of print, and he is writing a new book."

An article by Sakuma san can be found in the latest issue of Sound Practices.

Vintage Audio Display

The VALVE vintage audio display will be located in room 344, from 9-6 Saturday and Sanday. Two local VALVE members will contribute the majority of the display.

Eric Lenius is a hardcore vintage Fisher collector. He will be displaying a selection of vintage Fisher and other "golden era" tube audio gear, highlighted by a recently restored Western Electric Model 60A push pull 205D amplifier. Also tentatively scheduled are a Scott LK150, the Fisher 60A featured recently in VALVE, an Altec 340, and several other rare and collectible pieces.

John Hoffman is a collector specializing in early acoustic phonographs. He will offer a display entitled "Audio State of the Art - 1897 to 1927". The display will feature both cylinder and disc type phonographs from this time frame.

Here's a shot of the prototype of the new Electronic Tonalities two way tapered pipe kit speaker. Although the original drawings spec'd a height of 72", the eventual design came out 69" tall, hence the name.

Efficiency is approximately 96 dB, impedance, 4-8 ohms. The crossover is a single Axon capacitor.

The speakers were so new when this photo was taken that we hadn't run a response curve yet, but the woofer's resonant frequency is 62 Hz, so we expect the pipes go down to 50Hz or so.

We hope to have this speaker available as an "assemble and finish it yourself" kit, with the drivers, crossover, wire, terminals, and cut-but-notassembled-or-finished cabinet panels.

Target price is \$499 the pair. The finished prototypes will be available for audition at VSAC 97.
