Great Plays Program Closes This Sunday

The third season of the National Broadcasting Company's Great Plays Programs will come to an end on Sunday, May 5, when Maxwell Anderson's "Winterset" is presented over KECA-NBC from 10:00 to 11:00 a.m.

James Church is to direct this poetic masterpiece, which was inspired by the Sacco-Vanzetti case, and which was tremendously successful when first produced on Broadway in 1935.

Anderson is the only playwright whose work has been presented in each series of Great Plays. His "Valley Forge" climaxed the first season and his "Elizabeth the Queen" was the final Great Play presented last year.

Carole Lombard Closes Silver Theater Program

Carole Lombard, famous for her comedy characterizations on the screen, climaxes her two-week engagements on "Silver Theatre" and the 1939-40 dramatic series itself by portraying a rollicking comedy role, over KNX-CBS, Sunday, May 5, from 2:00 to 2:30 P.M.

In a production directed by Conrad Nagel, Miss Lombard's portrayal is to be in direct contrast to the serious dramatic vehicle in which she appeared the previous week.

CBS Workshop Back With New Show Series

Columbia Workshop, famous CBS experimental theater of the air, moves to a choice spot in the Sunday evening broadcast schedule of KNX-CBS coast-to-coast network on May 5, to be heard from 6:30 to 7 P.M. with two plays, a musical comedy and a half-hour monologue on the tentative schedule for May.

As a curtain raiser for the new time and date plan, the May 5 production is an original play by Knowles, Enriken and Howard Breslin, called "The Honest Captain." It deals with efforts of an 18th Century New Englander to preach religious freedom—even when he has to mount the pulpit with a shotgun.

For May 12, CBS is negotiating to produce an adaptation by Ellen Lee Brashear of Robert Nathan's best seller—"A Portrait of Jenny."

Radio To Cover Conventions

Political Conclaves Expected to Take Nearly Week In Selecting Candidates

PLANS for coverage by the National Broadcasting Company of the Republican and Democratic National Conventions have been completed. A. A. Schechter, NBC Director of News and Special Events, with George McElrath, NBC Operations Engineer, has been working for several weeks with the radio committees of both national committees, and now announces all is in readiness for coverage of the conclaves.

The Republicans will open in Philadelphia on June 24 in the Municipal Auditorium, and the Democrats will foregather at Chicago, in the Chicago Stadium, on July 15. Both conventions are expected to last from five days to a week.

On the NBC-Red Network, H. V. Kaltenborn and Earl Godwin will follow the program of the conventions. On the NBC-Blue Network will be heard Baukhage, Raymond Clapper, noted Washington columnist, and Lowell Thomas.

Jim Ameche and Gale Page Returning

Gale Page and Jim Ameche, who co-starred last year on Woodbury's Hollywood Playhouse, will return to the program in July when the summer series of playhouse dramas is inaugurated.

Miss Page and Ameche last year replaced Charles Boyer when the celebrated French dramatic star left for France, and they were heard in a second series of engagements last fall.

Miss Page began her NBC career in 1933, as a singer. Like his brother, Don, Jim Ameche made his radio debut in Chicago, and also like Don he rose to stardom in dramatic roles. He played juvenile roles in a daytime serial from 1933 to November, 1937, when he was signed for his first big role.

Amos 'n' Andy to New York

Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll, known to millions of radio fans as "Amos 'n' Andy" left Hollywood via TWA Friday night for New York, where their program will originate for two weeks. They plan to see several Broadway shows and visit with old-time friends during their stay in Manhattan.

CBS to Have Staff of Experts at Both Democrat and Republican Meets

ELABORATE arrangements for radio coverage of the Republican and Democratic national conventions this summer—arrangements which will place a microphone at every spot in the convention cities where news may be made—were announced by the Columbia Broadcasting System in New York. There will be more radio "pickups" at the big conventions of 1940 than at any other time in the history of broadcasting—these "pickups" providing quick outlets for CBS news to the nation's listeners.

Paul W. White, Columbia's director of public affairs, has mustered an impressive list of analysts to give the radio audience informed reports on developments. Scheduled thus far are Elmer Davis, Bob Trout, Albert Warner and John Charles Daly. Edwin C. Hill and Paul Sullivan also may participate in Columbia's coverage direct from the convention cities.

'I'm An American' New KFI-NBC Show

A new series of programs devoted to an exposition of the privileges, responsibilities, and possibilities of the democratic way of life, entitled "I'm An American," was presented by the National Broadcasting Company in cooperation with the immigration and naturalization service of the United States Department of Labor, starting Saturday, May 4, from 10:00 to 10:15 A.M., over KFI-NBC.

Sounding the keynote on the first program by reading his widely discussed poem, "America Was Promises," was Archibald MacLeish, Librarian of Congress, who also is an outstanding American poet.

During the following twelve weeks of the series, distinguished naturalized Americans will appear as guests.

Bookman's Note Book Holds Airway Record

Back in 1924, when radio sets had three or four dials, cornucopia loudspeakers and unlimited static, a young man walked into the one-room studio of KGO in Oakland to present the first radio broadcast of his career. The day was May 22, and the young man was Joseph Henry Jackson, then managing editor of *Sunset Magazine*.

Jackson's broadcast was rather revolutionary for those times. He was going to talk about books and books only. His friends cheerfully told him that no one would listen, that the public wasn't interested in books. But Jackson thought they were wrong, and so did Mrs. Wilda Wilson Church, then educational director of KGO, who encouraged him. He launched his program, "Bookman's Note Book," heard on KECA-KFSD.

Thus on that day back in 1924, the oldest sustaining radio program in the United States was born and book reviews were given by radio for the first time. And on his broadcast over the NBC-Blue Network on May 26, of this year, Jackson will begin his seventeenth year of continuous broadcasting.

Today Jackson is literary editor of the *San Francisco Chronicle*, a successful author in his own right, and still goes on the air on every Sunday to discuss the merits (or lack thereof) of current books. And when he says, "I think you'll like it," booksellers frequently run out of the edition during the following week.

Dramas of Youth Program on Regular Transcontinental Schedule Over Mutual Net

MUTUAL'S famous "Dramas of Youth" Company bowed in on their first regularly scheduled transcontinental program Saturday, May 4, from 4:00 to 4:30 p. m., with Don Chapman playing the title role in the life story of former Vice-President Charles Curtis, in observance of National Boys' Week. Hereafter the company will be heard every Saturday over the facilities of the Mutual Broadcasting System coast to coast, 4:00 to 4:30 p. m.



As a boy, Curtis wore the Indian blanket and drew rations the Government allowed him on the Kaw Reservation in Kansas, where he was born in 1860. At maturity, by his own efforts alone, he had replaced the Indian blanket with the toga of Republican leader in the United States Senate. When he retired from public life in 1933, he had served the nation at the capitol longer than any other man—first as a member of the House, then in the Senate, and finally as Vice-President of the United States.

Marion Ward writes and directs the plays for the Dramas of Youth Company, which she organized six years ago almost to the day that the company starts its first transcontinental broadcast on a regular schedule. Van C. Newkirk, program director of the Don Lee network, gave the juvenile actors their chance by allotting them air time six years ago, when there were very few children broadcasting.

Radio's Little Red Schoolhouse

**Here's An Opportunity For The Parent-Teachers Association
To Bring Modern Educational Methods To Every Classroom**

THIS may seem like a funny time to discuss education by radio, when the school year is nearly at an end, but you may have heard that things move slowly in pedagogical circles and if you want to make any plans for next term you have to begin now. Just as an example, I heard of one primary school that had had its recess at two o'clock in the afternoon for twenty-five years and because of the Columbia School of the Air being broadcast at that hour over KMPC, the recess time was changed! And this after TWENTY-FIVE years, mind you! Maybe we'd better not be too sanguine about next term.

Education has kept pace with our swiftly-moving times by using new methods, new tools and new approaches to the problem of teaching the young idea how to shoot. And one of the best and most useful of these innovations is the radio. What a privilege for the teachers of today, to be able, with the flick of a switch, to bring the great world inside the classroom walls! The greatest minds in science, in literature, in music are available for the cost of a single set of textbooks for only one course. And they are brought to the children in the living, breathing form of words and sounds—not merely dull printing in a book.

Have you any idea what splendid educational programs are available to the children in your community here in Southern California? The broadcasters have done more than their share by bringing to their microphones such outstanding offerings as the American and Don Lee Schools of the Air each weekday (KMPC, 2 P.M.) (KHJ, KGB,

KVOE, 1 P.M.) the Standard School Broadcast (KECA, 11 A.M.), Adventures in Reading, Gallant American Women and Music for Young Listeners (KECA, Mon., Tues. and Wed., 10 A.M.), Young America Presents (KHJ, Thurs., 1:30 P.M.), Modern Immortals (KFAC, Fri., 10 A.M.), Adventures in Mythology (KECA, Fri., 1:45 P.M.), and School Edition of the News (KECA, daily, 2 P.M.).

Now, with this varied menu dished up on the air, how much of it is actually being used by our schools in Southern California? At the present time the use of radio is not obligatory in our educational system. It is left entirely to the individual teacher to decide whether she will take advantage of what is offered on the air or not. Naturally it is the most advanced and alert instructors who give the youngsters the benefit of this added stimulus to their development.

The crux of the situation here is that at the present time the school authorities do not purchase radio receivers. Such instruments as are now available have been obtained by the individual schools by means of collections, benefits, newspaper drives, P.-T. A. donations and so on. When you consider that a radio costs less per use than any other piece of school equipment, it does seem that some systematic and standardized methods of acquiring receivers could be worked out by the powers that be. Maybe if we parents did a little fussing and insisted that something be done to remedy this situation, a way would be found. Here's a really worth-while project for the P.-T. A.

In the Los Angeles County system, for instance, out of three hundred schools only forty do not have radios, but those figures make no mention of individual classrooms. Elizabeth Goudy, Director of Radio for the county, tells us that about 3,900 of our teachers are using the American School of the Air, which makes that splendid program available to about 136,000 pupils, approximately 19% of the young students in Southern California. Mrs. Goudy gets out a monthly Radio Log of programs recommended for school use, 1,600 copies of which go to teachers at their own request.

The Radio Coordination Office of the Los Angeles City Schools also sends out a monthly bulletin, with a weekly clip-sheet giving more detailed information.

Various study guides and source material is also available for the use of instructors, as it has often been proven that the students get a great deal more out of a broadcast when they have been prepared for it in advance. Some educators have been afraid that constant use of the radio would discourage reading on the part of adults as well as children. Princeton University recently made a study of that question and has proved that instead of decreasing the use of books, radio has created a demand for more information on a variety of subjects that might never have been brought to the individual's attention otherwise.

Listening outside of school hours is also stressed by many teachers, a careful list of recommended program being put on the blackboard or on the bulletin board for student use.

Fifty teachers in the Los Angeles County System are co-operating with a three-year study being made by Ohio University to determine the effect of radio on children's education. They are applying certain techniques to the problem and the results of such a long-time study should be most interesting. Eight geographical centers in the United States are co-operating, so the findings will be national in scope.

As a matter of fact, the Los Angeles area is one of the most air-minded in the country, educationally, even though the American School of the Air has not been adopted as a regular part of the curriculum as it has in some states. Perhaps one of the main reasons that radio is not used more in the West is because of the time element. The best of the educational programs which emanate from the East reach us at a time which does not fit into the school schedule. That is the reason, for instance, that the American School of the Air is rebroadcast by transcription over KMPC at two in the afternoon, instead of coming to us direct over KNX.

Modern educators agree that there is no denying that radio **MUST** be used in our schools. The only question that must be answered is **HOW**? When we consider the advances that have been made in the past few years, we will undoubtedly soon have that answer.

All this time we have talked only of educational programs for children. There is undoubtedly even a greater goal to be reached in the field of continuation and adult education. Although the California State Department of Education has for several years sponsored programs designed particularly for adult audiences, the possibilities of cultural and educational radio for our mature citizens have scarcely been touched. In an effort to estimate the response to a program of Self-Education 1,000 booklets were sent out to organizations and agencies throughout the state giving suggestions for tests with certain adult radio material. Over 20,000 requests for more books came in to the office of Mr. George C. Mann, Chief of the Division of Adult and Continuation Education for the State. Mr. Mann says that as soon as the details can be worked out, the state will begin offering definite courses of study to its citizens by radio.

This is in line with repeated requests to broadcasters for more educational programs during the evening hours when adults can take advantage of the cultural opportunities offered by their radios. This is especially valuable in areas where no

night-school facilities are available or where the presence of small children or other encumbrances keep people at home nights.



Combining an element of education and entertainment for millions of children and adults as well as themselves, KFI has started its "Dramas of Youth" program on a transcontinental series over Don Lee-Mutual network. The program is heard each Saturday from 4 to 4:30 p. m. under the direction of Marion Ward. The youngsters play the parts of the early life roles of famous people with the fire and vim of veterans.

WATCHING a Lux Radio Theatre broadcast (KNX Mon. 5 p.m.) demonstrates again why this big dramatic show continues to remain tops in radio entertainment: infinite care in preparation. To see an intricate production, with a large cast and many complicated effects, move along as though on oiled wheels is a real pleasure. There's never a "bobble," a scrambling about or a frantic sense of tension that so often characterizes other large programs. A sense of dignity pervades the whole affair and yet it isn't stiff or lacking in human qualities. Maybe it's because Melville Ruick never "ballynoos" or maybe it's just down-right good radio. One objection is that they never tell who creates the splendid adaptations of the plays.

* * *

The best thing about KFI's new series: "Once Upon a Midnight" (KFI Wed. 9 p.m.), is the original music composed and directed by Claude Sweeten. He really gets most interesting and unusual effects out of his orchestra. Ted Osborne is fine as Edgar Allen Poe and the rest of the cast is good, too; the adaptations by Forrest Barnes preserve the spirit of the original stories, but I'm afraid Poe is just a bit too slow-moving for our modern taste. We noticed the same dullness in the Sherlock Holmes series when it was on the air. Maybe "Ellery Queen" and "Big Town" and such-like have spoiled the feeling for the old-time thrillers.

Last Sunday, I paid a visit to the "What's On Your Mind" show (KNX, Sun. 4 p.m.), and now I can hardly restrain myself from writing a dozen letters to Sam Pierce, producer of the program, telling him a FEW of the things on my mind! Wain Sutton, who prepares the material sent in, says they're tickled to death to get your letters, so don't hold back, folks!

RCA has re-arranged its prices to fit the pocketbooks of us ordinary people by starting them at \$190.00. This is, of course, quite a difference from the former price of \$395.00 and up.

Dumont Televisors start at \$250.00, and Graybar has not as yet given any quotations, but it is expected that they will be in line with all the others. Gilfillan, being a locally manufactured Televisor, will have the edge on the Eastern manufacturers, it is expected. But whatever the setup is, television is now receiving its impetus so that we all will soon be seein' as well as hearin' the programs.

As for programs, the local Don Lee Mutual Network station, KHJ, is right at this moment sitting pretty with its purchase of the Hollywoodland hilltop site from which a radius of 60 miles in all directions can be covered like a blanket. In other words, every home within this radius can take advantage of the fine programs being telecasted from this station, if they have a little Televisor in their home. Also, the May Department Stores, the American Television Laboratories, and the Earl C. Anthony interests have already applied to the Federal Communications Commission for television channels. This means that program material will be plentiful, as well as variable, in the very near future.

Right now KHJ gives the average scanner a more than sufficient variety of telecasts with thousands of feet of motion picture film, live talent shows, fashion parades, dramatic skits, as well as current news of the day. The most current are the baseball games, the Hollywood Legion Stadium wrestling matches every Monday night at 8:15 o'clock and the fights every Friday evening at the same time.

And to view one of these telecasts is something to write home to the folks about! When a "scanner" sees a telecast for the first time he usually looks around to see if there isn't a motion picture projection camera shooting the stuff out on a mirror. But after being assured that nobody is trying to fool him, he looks in wonder and amazement at the action taking place in the Televisor.

And if there is anyone in my audience this week who would like to take the family to view a telecast, just drop me a note and we'll direct you to the nearest Televisor in your neighborhood. Many Gilfillan Televisors have been placed in spots around the city to give

Although Nelson Eddy, famous baritone, has not been on the air since he ended his NBC series last winter, he was voted radio's "Star of Stars." The runner-up was Don Ameche, whose new NBC program is heard Friday nights.

Jack Benny, three times winner of the "Star of Stars" title, was voted the best comedian, with Bob Hope in second place and Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy in a close third.

Bing Crosby was voted best male singer of popular songs, and Nelson Eddy topped the field as a classical singer. Margaret Speaks was selected the best woman singer of classical songs.

One Man's Family was picked as the best serial drama.

"Information Please" placed first in two separate divisions of the poll, being voted the best educational program on the air, and the best quiz program.

Don Ameche was named the best actor, Don Wilson the best announcer, Bill Stern the best sports commentator, and Don McNeill the best master of ceremonies. Lowell Thomas and Dorothy Thompson were voted the best news commentators.

Kay Kyser's College of Musical Knowledge led all audience participation programs, and listeners voted the NBC Breakfast Club their favorite show.

A total of 830,000 votes were tabulated in the poll, representing the opinions of listeners in all parts of the United States and Canada.

Favorite Recipes

Kate Smith, popular CBS singing star, favors the following recipe for fluffy cottage pudding, which is offered here as the table treat of the week:

Two cups sifted cake flour, 2 teaspoons Calumet baking powder, ½ teaspoon salt, 3 tablespoons butter or shortening, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup milk, ½ teaspoon vanilla.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Cream butter, add sugar gradually, and cream together well. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in greased pan, in moderate oven, 50 to 60 minutes, or until done. Serve hot, with apricot cream topping.

Exclusive Air Right Given Kate Smith

OF ALL the songs Irving Berlin has written and has composed many of America's most popular tunes—his favorite is "God Bless America," made famous by Columbia's Kate Smith, who has exclusive rights to sing it over the air.

Berlin revealed his choice in a survey by Andre Kostelanetz, who asked six of the nation's foremost composers to pick the favorite among their song hits. "God Bless America" was introduced by Kate Smith on her weekly CBS show Armistice Eve, 1938. It was immediately acclaimed and she sang it for about two months.

Then, feeling that the public might be tiring of it, she dropped it from the program. A deluge of protests flooded her office. When she resumed singing it, some critics chided her for "flag-waving."

Some of the crackpot fringe even threatened Kate if she continued to sing the patriotic number. She scheduled it week after week and replied to critics:

"Call it flag-waving, patriotic hysteria or anything else you care to, but that's the way I feel and I want the whole world to know it."

The World on Your Dial

High in the majestic Ecuadorean Andes of South America is one of the most unusual and interesting short wave radio stations operating today. Located in the quaint and colorful city of Quito is HCJB, "The World's Pioneer Missionary Station," disseminating the glorious gospel of He who "is come to seek and save that which was lost."

The station is owned and operated by Clarence Jones, missionary to the Indians in the country whose very name, Ecuador, is the Spanish equivalent of equator. Primarily intended to serve just the northern Andean country and the Indians and Spanish speaking peoples inhabiting the region, HCJB today actually numbers a listening audience that includes every continent of the globe. The pioneer gospel short wave outlet is active every day except Monday, and it's program continuity invariably begins with the gospel "glad tidings" in Spanish and Indian languages, while during the final 30 minutes "the old-old story" is repeated in English to bring to those who speak that tongue, a message of comfort and peace for the "weary and heavy-laden."

The programs from "The Voice of the Andes" are very informal, with Clarence Jones playing gospel selections, the while he gives extemporaneous sermonettes or sings the words to the hymns he plays. The regular sermons or evangelistic messages are transcribed by the internationally known exangelist, Bob Jones, of the Bob Jones Bible College, Dayton, Tennessee. From there these "gospels in wax," so to speak, begin their long journey to far-away Ecuador.

Literally thousands of letters are received by Mr. Jones at HCJB each year, testifying to the blessings received and the lives that are changed by the gospel's power. The most unusual and interesting of these letters are read before the microphone on some of the broadcasts. The words of the old familiar hymn: "From Greenland's Icy Mountains to India's Coral Strand," have a literal fulfillment EVERY DAY as the "words of life" go forth from "The Voice of the Andes."

The assigned frequency of 12.46 Mc. on which the station operates, is of distinct advantage and insures a larger audience because it is entirely OUTSIDE the CROWDED BANDS on which practically all other short wave stations of the world are found. Even the uninitiated short wave listener can tune in HCJB the first time with comparative ease, particularly since the new higher-power transmitter went into service about a month ago.

Truly now (in the words of another hymn), HCJB can "give the winds a mighty voice, Jesus saves! Jesus saves! and let the nations now rejoice!"


