CONTEST WITH A VENGEANCE: Hard put to it are manufacturers of soaps in a soap-conscious America to nullify competition of each other. Paying out huge sums for time to air "soap serials," most of which are denounced by clearthinking women in American communities, the manufacturers assiduously woo the geese that lay golden eggs of purchasing power with contests of one sort or another. More often than not the soap cerials are mere blatant frames into which is fitted a lure to burgeon the cupidity and sportsmanship of men, women and children. The lure is the contest.

Last forthight makers of Palmolive soap baited Americans into usual contest white lies with a contest that had competing soap companies hanging on. The Palmolive contest seemed likely to do what the soap-makers hoped—to hike purchases of Palmolive to financial sky-limits, make Americans Palmolive conscious. Announced was a \$27,500 phrase-finishing plan, 30 daily prizes of 5 \$50 bills plus one prize of \$500, the whole creamed with a topper-\$5000 at contest's end.

Smart were promoters of the contest. They sold Girl Scouts a plan whereby Girl Scout troops would place Troop numerals on soap wrappers in markets, receive for each wrapper turned in during contest two cents, one of which would be retained by the local unit, the other to go to Girl Scout national offices.

CITY HALL IN FLIGHT: On a day last week as they had for many a day, special events sections of radio's western networks stood by at Mines Field, California, watching preparations for departure from earth of Douglas Aircraft Company's B-19, mightiest of United States defense bombers.

The ship, largest ever built by man, was still undergoing ground tests. Disappointed by delays were hundreds who had congregated on a nearby golf course, who clung to adjacent rooftops and hung stifffingered from light and phone poles.

What many didn't know as reason for the delay: Scheduled to take off last week, the bomber, carrying 11,000 gallons of fuel, more than the average motorist would use in 10 years, sank three feet into hard earth under its own staggering weight. Army experts fidgeted, wondered where actual gruelling tests could be made, guessed that Muroc Dry Lake, California scenic wonder spot would be the place.

In flight, its great multiple motors roaring Garguantua-like, the B-19 to radio's special eventers, to others who would view it, was likened to the phenomenon of Los Angeles city hall taking wings. The now puny, once great, transport planes, were thought of as irritated bees following an eagle of the heavens in their accompaniment of the fortress on wings.

For ear-wise radio listeners radio had stood ready, microphones tied into main studios, alert announcers and reporters awaiting a world-balting event—man lifting with his fabricated power what amounted to a three-story building into the free airs above earth. SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT: With news bulletins from Europe devoted to bombing attacks, concentration camps and enslaved peoples, citizens of Southern California this week were given something else to think about: "The Story of American Liberties."

Seeking greater realization by citizens, young and old, of American civil liberties, the Los Angeles Bar Association, in cooperation with California's Department of Education, aided by the Works Progress Administration, began dramatizations of historical development of fundamental American liberties.

Chief weapon in the campaign is a radio dramatic series presented each Saturday from KF1 at 4:00 p. m. The series is to be used as a subject of study in the public schools of California.

POET, MUSICIAN, BUSINESSMAN: Part poet, part musician, and part businessman.

That was the formula prescribed for the writer-director of the "Golden Treasury of Song," Columbia network's daily morning musical feature. It was a tough formula to fill, but It was filled—by Paul Phillips.

Phillips is a University of Missouri graduate. He produces the five-times-aweek program starring Tenor Frank Parker. Background and experience give him a "triple-threat" versatility. Student of literature and poetry, he has read the masters all his young life . . . can talk on equal terms with David Ross, who reads the daily poems on the program. Musical training was gathered first at home from a musical family, later in association with amateur and professional musicians. In his third role of businessman, Phillips confers weekly with sponsors on policy, distribution and sales. For that work, he was trained as an executive at CBS' big 50,000-watt station, KMOX in St. Louis, where he was engaged for three years in local and national sales.

He holds frequent meetings with David Ross on the subject of poetry selection for the program. Together they decide on verse likely to have the greatest appeal, and at the same time fit the mood of the particular songs being sung by Tenor Parker.

RADIO SWORD OF DAMOCLES: The honor which most radio performers want, (Concluded on Page 11) BY virtue of Hearst, Louella Parsons is the nation's most copious producer of whim-wham, a commodity that is dished up by journalistic back-fence "fishwives" doing their ubiquitous daily dozens of washing other people's linen out in the open.

For years this portly Tycooness of Trivia, backed by the Hearst newspaper empire, has swung a potent verbal sceptre over Hollywood. That the flash of that sceptre has interested the bucolic hinterlands of the nation more than it has or does the sophisticates of entertainment's world is to her credit, and the credit of those circulation-wise Hearst executives who know that seemingly inside stuff on the great and near-great of Film-city is as food and drink to Hearst's inarticulate nillions.

Louella Parsons in her heyday was a feared and hated columnist, as well as a respected and loved one. Those who hate her have known the columnar sceptre could as easily knock on the head an incipient career as knight the hopeful who sought her accolade.

Those who hated her most had hoped that Orson Welles in Citizen Kane might have apostrophized her part in the life of Hearst newspapers. Apparently Welles, canny dramatist, saw no reason to try and compress fluff into the hard substance of drama. By indirection — so many thought—he did a sympathetic job of Marion Davies and Arthur Brisbane, but ignored La Louella completely.

Those who respect Miss Parsons are unanimous on one point: She could be a deadly enemy, but if she chose to be your friend — well, you had something there. Those who dislike her have, perhaps, good reason to. From all accounts, she hangs to the memory of a slight with all the tenacity of an elephant remembering through circus season after circus season the map of the guy who slipped it the piece of chewing tobacco. There are a few people in Hollywood who, because of the sycophancy that has marked and always will mark-motion pictures, and latterly, radio, have been helped by the Parsons girl. There are others who have never gained the plaudits of an entertainment-avid public because they underestimated her potency as a frappeur of frippery. These, because fawning adu-lants were afraid to stand up for them, became objects of scorn or compassion, depending upon what the current vogue was in accepting the Parsons formula. Not long ago entertainment-wise biggies issued storm warnings to this writer be-cause, having been born light-headed, he made bold to administer in his column, a rebuke to the makers of the soap currently sponsaring Hollywood Premiere. He thought it a pretty buin piece of business to use people on a radio program without paying them for it except in publicity.

"Hollywood Premiere" debuted on Friday evening March 28, and for days before its opening there was much shooting in its direction from the headquarters of the Screen Actors' Guild. Opposition of this group was predicated upon the fact that Miss Parsons, who presents the program, was promoting her guest stars free. This policy, challenged the irate Guild, was harmful, as all actors should work for American dollars—and nothing less. Through the medium of the film trade press, the Guild hurled hot shot at "Hollywood Premiere" and its hostess and there was even vague talk of crippling the opening performance through the American Federation of Radio Artists, which, said the rumors, would amputate their members from the supporting cast at the 11th hour.

On the evening prior to the premiere, Miss Parsons, in advertisements printed in the motion picture trade papers, announced that she would limit her freetalent policy to 13 weeks, the original commitment on the show.

There's always a story behind the story and the case of "Hollywood Premiere" does not take exception to the general rule. For some years, Kate Smith had promoted free talent for her shows in connection with productions plugging motion pictures. However, the Screen Actors' Guild had never been provoked to a point of taking direct action to stop this practice until the Parsons show made its debut. Then, suddenly galvanized into something resembling action, the Guild's officials reached the belated conclusion that the policy was a foul thing and should be stamped out. It's reasonable to presume that Kate Smith and her show would have continued indefinitely, immune from criticism, if Miss Parsons had not appeared on the radio horizon with a somewhat similar setup. But, you see, Miss Parsons, as any energetic, news-digging columnist is bound to do, had offended certain people and now they expressed themselves in a protest against her un-thinkable policy.

But, in all the hubbub and chatter along radio's airlances a salient Parsons fact was lost sight of. It is only fair that this fact be revived and told. While it is true, indicatively, that professionals should be paid their hire in something more real than publicity hokum, It is also true that radio owes a great deal to the much maligned and much praised Louella.

Louella Parsons really gave Western-and, particularly, Hollywood — radio its first real bid for attention. In a literal sense she helped the radio industry establish itself in Hollywood and thus to her credit may go the employment of not a few thousands among whom there have been a goodly host, including me, who have found fault with the estimable lady. For, a few years ago, Louella brought to the air Hollywood Hotel, the first of the important Hollywood radio originations. This was pioneering stuff, and while Louella may have used her column to make more secure her radio success, the final result, the more honest will admit. has been to help significantly the progress of the industry in the West. For this, then, she should be lauded. She may be even forgiven, perhaps, for something that, in sincere appraisal, may not be completely her fault. For business is business and motion picture makers, of all people, know best how loud a golden eagle can be made to scream, or how much sweat may be squeezed out of Liberty on an American dollar. And no one has ever claimed that Louella Parsons should overlook down for her do-mestic nest, even as we ... If a soap company wants to publicize motion pictures via Louella Parsons it would seem they, too, know how to back their greenbacks. Personally, I'm beginning to like the

Hootnannyin' JIM From Old Texas!

This would he the "Hootin' Nanay," which, under the gentle touch of Terma Jim, is said to produce a form of masic. Radio Life takes no sides on the matter.

A^N inanimate but highly articulate member of "Texas" Jim Lewis' KHJ-Don Lee network program is a weird assembly of bells, horns, automobile klaxons, fire-bells, sirens, cowbells and washboards.

PPEE!

"Texas" Jim affectionately refers to this outlandish mechanical concoction as his "Hootin' Nanny." And the way he mentions the thing, one gets the general impression that it has some of the qualities of a human being. For, in Jim's tones there is the admiring note of a person who is pleased to present you to a good friend, wants you to see the sterling qualities of that friend and get to understand each other.

"There she be," said Jim the other day at a KHJ rehearsal. "She mebbe ain't so much for looks, but l'm tellin' you when I takes her in my arms and starts manipulating her, she shore goes to town."

The rest of the Lewis musical variety aggregation was coming out on the stage in preparation for the first half of the morning program. Lewis went over to his pal, the Hootin' Nanny, and sat down on its bicycle seat, idly pressed a few horns affixed to various sections of its anatomy, drubbed a mid-riff washboard, pulled a cord or two, wound up a siren, kicked a prize-fight gong and then got going. His arms, elbows, hands, feet and even his backside went into action. It was astonishing. One expected, of course, to hear nothing that could be called melody from such a calisthenics-like routine on a number of gadgets usually associated with traffic, blue Monday, the fire-boys rushing to work, and harvest hands being called to lunch. Yet melody there was. It honked, screamed, tolled, grunted, roared, rumbled, and belched—but it made music. Well, music of a sort. It was not hard to detect that this Gargantua

had emitted from its fantastic depths something that was reminiscent of Interniezzo.

"Just a-practicing some deep stuff," Lewis said modestly. He patted a horn or two on Hootin' Nanny, said feelingly: "Good baby, Hootin'. You're shore tootin'."

For those who know that hill-billy music can be entertaining stuff under the proper direction, and for those who think that the music is a sign of cultural decadence, Texas Jim and his two KHJ morning programs are worth listening to. And it isn't all hill-billy. The Lewis aggregation of accordions, cellos, bass flddles, guitars and Hootin' Nanny can, with equal facility, strum and bow out a classic as well as music-waft you into hinterlands of the great southwest to renew acquaintance with the nostalgic music and songs of the lonely cowboy on the lonely prairie.

In a way this slightly bow-legged South Georgian (he is only incidentally a Texan), having begun his radio career on a Houston station after a few years of tent-show work in the deep South) is an artist. He rolled into Hollywood with his crowd last year after five years of adventures as c strolling troubadour. He strolled into "some mighty high places for a cotton-born pusson," he revealed. With his Lone Star Rangers he wowed New York City for three successive years, broadcast over the Mutual net, toured in vaudeville, recorded a string of American folk-lore songs for Decca. In Hollywood he was lucky, got a contract for himself and gang to do western highlights for Warner's.

Each member of his "cowboy band" is a soloist in his own right. Pedro DePaul plays accordion and fiddle, does the band's arrangements. Loman Landell yodels, plays guitar and harmonica. Jim's

brother, "Tiny," is a guitarist who can pick up a guitar and make it sound pretty much like a symphony instrument when he wants to. The star fiddler of the group is Carl La Magna, a tempestuous-eyed, American-born Latin who has studied at Naples' Royal Conservatory. La Magna has a profound respect for Texas Jim.

"Anybody who can bump into the side of a house, fall down with an armful of tin, roll into the street and startle motorists to bear down on their horns all at the same time—and make this performance sound like music, is deserving of respect," said La Magna. "At least, that's pretty much what playing the Hootin' Nanny amounts to."

The composer of 22 published melodies, Lewis has enriched Americana with such haunting pieces as "When the Robins Sang in Texas," "Saddles in the Sky." "The Old Water Wheel," and "Covered Wagon Trail."

A soft-spoken fellow, Lewis believes the strength of America lies in its heterogeneous composition.

"Dissimilarities in tastes, particularly in music, make America a constant festival," he said. "And American music is perhaps as cementing a bond between the diverse races and nationalities of the country as anything could be. We are a sectional people—I mean our different peoples tend to establish themselves according to backgrounds and races, Scandinavians in North Mid-west states; the Spanish, Irish, French, Italians and English in the East, South and West, with music tastes indigenous to them. Their music is of interest to the others, thus ties them all up in a neat bundle of appreciation of all sorts of music."

Texas Jim chooses to specialize in the music of the hills and the rolling ranges of the South and the West.

"To me, this music with the songs attached to most of it is a tonal history of a great pioneering spirit. It is, too, a history of development in song and note. Besides, it's fun to play it—fun to listen to."

With characteristic reserve, Fibber and Molly have enjoyed the second or third place they have occupied in official broadcasting polls for the past year, have been content in knowledge their show was well received coast to coast.

Fibber and Molly became number one radio act in the Hooper survey this year. Three weeks after their sixth anniversary celebration, they became number one in the Crossley survey. This rise in popularity may be attributed, partially, to in-creased listening audience in the East.

A BOUT six years ago a young couple moved into a shady little home on Main street in the little town of Cedar Springs, and into the hearts of thousands of radio listeners all over the country, where they have remained ever since. They are Joe and Mary Marlin, brain children of Jane Crusinberry, the gifted author of "The Story of Mary Marlin," fivetimes-a-week radio serial presentation.

Mrs. Crusinberry had just returned from two years of singing opera in France and Italy and was trying to find work as a singer in Chicago, when Joe and Mary first appeared on her mental horizon. She had thought more than once that she would like to try writing a radio serial, and suddenly there were the Marlins, begging her to tell their story.

At first it was just the story of the post-marital adventures of two typical Americans, absorbed in the small town life of Cedar Springs. But Joe Marlin, a young lawyer by profession, became so interested and influential in politics that Mrs. Crusinberry had to send him to Washington as the senator from Iowa, and of course Mary and the new third member of the Marlin family, their little son, Davey, had to go along too.

Because Mary and Joe made many friends wherever they went, the story began to be concerned with the lives of fascinating men and women in the political life at Washington, the nation's capital, with the peaceful and simple atmosphere of Cedar Springs, to which the Marlins always returned, providing a gracious accompaniment to the heavier and more hectic undertones of Washington life.

When Joe was sent on a mission to Russia about two years ago, another locale was added to the story by the versatile Mrs. Crusinberry. For Joe was severely injured in an airplane wreck on the steppes of Russia, and completely lost his memory. The exciting adventures of the unknown "Mr. Ex," as he now calls himself, have taken us to strange and faroff places, and have added an exotic and thrilling strain to the symphony of the story.

Woman Behind NARY NARIN

For more than two years now Mary has believed Joe to be dead, and our story has moved on and developed at home, as well as abroad. For time, as well as characters, moves and develops naturally in "The Story of Mary Marlin," and the lives of the many people whom this story includes weave and interweave in life-like reality as they unfold before our eyes.

Mrs. Crusinberry attributes much of this air of reality to the fact that the story is based on events that have occurred within her knowledge, and the



characters are, for the most part, drawn from real life. Timothy, the little blind boy who has been adopted by friends of the Marlins, actually exists, and the beautiful music which he composes in the story is written by the real-life boy on whom Mrs. Crusinberry based Timothy's character.

Another more recent addition to the cast is Rosemary Garbell, who plays the part of Tootie, an obstreperous young waif who is now making her home with Frazer and Bunny Mitchell in Washington. According to all accounts, Rosemary and Tootie are practically one and the same person, and when Tootie is in the day's cast anything can happen. Betty Lou Gerson, better known to listeners as Mary Marlin, has had quite a time with the formidable youngster herself. Frances Carlon plays Bunny Mitchell in the script, and "Bunny" is a rival of Mary. Bunny has been kind to Tootie, so Rosemary and Tootie prove their undivided loyalty by being cool to both Miss Gerson and Mary Marlin, which poses a nice problem for an otherwise friendly and united cast.

Betty Lou Gerson, herself, was born in Chattanooga, Tenn. She studied dramatics at the Goodman Theater in Chicago, and then set out to teach "creative dramatics." Her radio debut was made over a Chicago station as an amateur to help a friend who had written a play. After a few other amateur appearances, Betty Lou decided that radio offered more opportunities than teaching, and applied for an audition at NBC. Within a few days she was cast in a network program.

"The Story of Mary Marlin" has grown and developed in line with the original conception of the characters whom it concerns. Since Joc's disappearance, Mary has stepped into his shoes and become Senator Marlin herself, and the courage and clear-headedness with which she was endowed from the first have helped her to steer an even course through the difficulties of political life at the capitol. WORLD ON YOUR DIAL

EUROPE—Out of "Nazified" Germany last week came another caustic shortwave blast intended as propaganda for U. S. A. listeners. President Franklin D. Roosevelt was the theme of this bit of "ether spleen" although "president" was not the title the arsenic-mouthed commentator employed in referring to our nation's chief executive. Coming through the medium of DZD, Berlin, on 10.54 Mc., the broadcast was marred by fading and "rock crusher" static but it was not difficult to get the gist of the verbal bombast.

According to Berlin the "land of the free, and the home of the brave" is headed toward a violent political, economic, and social death solely because of the imperialistic program of Czar Franklin Delano. He was likened to the late Czar Nicholas of Russia, who was charged with having plunged his country into an orgy of revolution and bloodshed. They insisted however, that Czar Franklin Delano's economic policy was more outmoded than that of Czar Nicholas. The Berlin radio charged Czar Franklin with incompetence and claimed he was wilfully withholding information vital to the welfare of the people of the United States.

FAR EAST-The recent speeches of Charles A. Lindbergh have been quite favorably received in both Berlin and Tokyo, officially. The day following their delivery, news broadcasts, particularly those from Tokyo's JZJ on 11.80 Mc. are devoted almost exclusively to comment on his remarks, local news being dispensed with. Reader-listeners of RADIO LIFE would do well to follow these DIRECT foreign broadcasts in order that they might keep posted on just what Axiscontrolled radio stations are saying about the historic "radio debate" now being waged over U. S. air waves on the matter of U. S. participation in Europe's war. There will be lengthy and significant comment from Axis capitals too in the wake of President Roosevelt's (already delivered when you read this) message of Tuesday May 27th. Summer is always the time of "volume to spare" reception from Europe, so make good use of the short wave bands of your all-wave radio in the days and hours of International crisis that lie ahead.

CENTRAL AMERICA—Refreshing indeed are those short wave stations which dispense a bare MINIMUM of war news and war propaganda. In this classification is TGWA the "Voice of Guatemala" In Guatemala City, Guatemala Central America. Dial 15.17 Mc. between 9:45 and 10:45 A. M. for the hour of "popular tunes" featuring the Excelsion Marimba Ensemble, one of the finest instrumental groups to be heard on the air. The transmission is generally free from fading and is the best reception ever enjoyed from Central America. Adios, amigos!

ROAD OF LIFE

Modern Doctor Pictured As Hero

"DR. BRENT ... Call surgery ... Dr. Brent ... Call surgery ... Dr. Brent ... " are the words of the voice on the filter mike at 8:30 a. m. over KFI that have called listeners to the dynamic broadcasts of "Road of Life" every day, Mondays through Fridays, since September 1937. It is the acknowledged pioneer of serializations dramatizing doctors as heroes.

Much has happened in the life of young Dr. Jim Brent since the noted radio authoress, Irna Phillips, brought his career to the air as it was beginning with internship at City hospital. Experiences have faught Jim much of life and of treating and lengthening the span of life, but he personally stands in the middle of the road of life. Strong currents have from time to time carried him off this stable middle course and he has been inevitably drawn into tempestuous whirlpools concerned with other people mainly. They all learned how surprising and how utterly unpredictable this road called life is.

Recognizing the symbolism of life as a road, Irna Phillips titled her script accordingly. In further explanation of her choice of title, Miss Phillips says: "We all know when life begins, but when it will end, we never know. Being only human, we want these lives of ours to be long, happy and without pain. So it is that certain of us are chosen to devote ourselves to the art of prolonging this road—of taking souls that are in darkness and pain and leading them back into sunlight and happiness once more. This is the physician's work—this is the road that Dr. Jim Brent has chosen to travel."

Miss Phillips has depicted Jim's fine responsibilities, his unswerving devotion to the highest ideals of the medical profession and of his travel along the road of life alone. Jim is not married. His childhood sweetheart passed away before their marriage in the early part of the story. Jim has since had many other wo me n friends, whose interest turns to respectful friendship when they find he isn't a specialist in affairs of the heart.

As the story develops, one wonders how he fails to perceive the rare regard Carol Evans has for him and for the orphan boy Jim adopted. Mutual concern for this boy brings them together, as does an ever-growing circle of acquaintances.

Perhaps Jim is afraid of marriage. Afraid a woman married to a doctor cannot be happy. Afraid that even with eyes open, as were Sylvia's and Dr. Parsons', JOAN WINTERS, known to CBS listeners as "Sylvin Bertram" in the daytime scrint "Road of Life," exhibits the intext addition to her famous collection of 150 mntique and foreign dolls.

that marriages for those in the medical profession often end unhappily. The whole world calls a doctor away from his wife, and he wants to go and must go.

There are other problems that confront people in many different situations that come up for scrutiny before the microphone carrying Mss Phillips' understanding and helpful delineations. Throughout these episodes she has tried to emphasize certain health measures, facts of a helpful, general nature, which should be common knowledge but are not. She has also shown the importance of the specialists without minimizing the effectiveness of the general practice doctors.

The central character of Irna Phillips' "Road of Life" is Dr. Jim Brent, played by Ken Griffin, who is one of Chicago's most popular radio leading men. Ken's interests away from the studios are music, sailing and baseball. His chief superstition is the hanging on to a pair of old shoes, the ones that took him to his first radio audition.

Three of Chicago's hest looking actresses are heard regularly. They are Joan Winters, as Sylvia Bertram Parsons: Lesley Woods as Carol Evans, and Muriel Brenner as Helen Gowan Stephenson. Miss Woods received her dramatic training at the Goodman School of the Theatre in Chicago, and is superstitious like Ken Griffin and keeps the first pair of shoes

and hat that she wore at her first radio job. Joan Winters' hobby is collecting rare and exotic perfumes. Miss Bremner studied to be a concert pianist.

In addition to Ken Griffin, other important man in the cast is handsome Reese Taylor as Dr. Parsons, and two very important young men are Don ald Kraatz as John Brent and Dick Holland as Junior Stephenson. The last two players are in their early 'teens and are alrendy radio acting veterans.

Irna Phillips, attractive young Chicago woman, has created hundreds of popular characters during the course of her radio career. Currently, four of her programs are heard daily over the air: "Woman in White," "The Right to Happiness," "Road of Life" and "The Guiding Light," are heard over const-to-coast networks.

Fortune Magazine cited Irna Phillips as "Radio's No. 1 author" in an article devoted to description of her successful and prolific work. Miss Phillips is remarkably well schooled for her work. She earned a diploma from the University of Illinois, took post-graduate courses and got a master's degree from the University of Wisconsin, and taught school in Teacher's College in Dayton, Ohio, for a year before resigning for radio activities. She dictates her radio scripts to fleet shorthand-writing secretaries.

RADIATION--An Editorial

By HANSON H. HATHAWAY

RIME is a revolting word. It stands for revolting deeds. And there are many aspects of crime with degrees of seriousness.

One crime for which punishment is rare because of uncertainty of fixing original responsibility for ideas is representing the fruits of another's efforts as one's own. Some motion picture makers, by implication have been the greatest criminals in this nefarious husiness. Resuits to suit bringers have rarely been good for them. The reason for this has always been that it is difficult to prove original conception of ownership of an idea.

Unless a writer or producer of an idea with literary value, bestirs himself on make his works public knowledge, the Courts are hard put to discern merit in claims of plagiarism.

Yet plagiarism, as we know, is a flourishing business dealt in by knaves and stooges. Many readers of Radio Life have complained that ideas they have had were later revealed in pictures or on radio. I suggest that it is difficult to determine who, of any number of pcrsons, should enjoy responsibility for an idea that occurs to many, yet is claimed by one who gave it to the public first.

Actually, the writer had had heretofore little protection of basic ideas. Prior protection has never been sufficiently well set up to provide a writer with sufficient evidence to lay strong claim to ownership. Interestingly enough, howeve:. there has occurred in radio, heretofore clean of hands and morals in this malodorous business of literary theft, an incident to encourage all honest writers to believe they have found the precedent for actions to recover what is rightfully the.rs against connivances of others who



were not original enough to provide their own ideas.

In this particular case (more of which will be related in the national lay and trade press) links usually missing in the chain of circumstances and evidence to establish undisputed claim to a program idea (which is in the category of literature) have been found. So complete is the evidence in this particular case of collusion between officials of a network station, a public organization, a former employee of that station, and an advertising bureau that probability is Federal action will ensue.

This tends to isolate this case for the interest of all those who have had disagreeable experiences with their brain children.

Music In Wax

Ed. Note: The late issue recordings discussed in the following review have been selected as among the best of the week, but critically heard. Late issue records may be heard and pur-chased at Music City, Sunset houle-vard and Vine street, Hollywood.

SLEEPY SERENADE: Woody Herman and his orchestra. Decca. The tinkling melody of what is reminiscent of an Old World lullaby is opening cadenza of this new release. As you perhaps have guessed, this doesn't last long. The tempo changes quicker than you can say Woody Herman Into a slow, smooth beat with heavy accents on the brass. A conglomeration of slurs by the banl and sax modulations. There are good guitar bars. The melody is quite tuneful, which accounts for its popularity.

Reverse: Everything Happens to Me. Sometimes it's the melody, but this time it's the lyrics that make the song. There is singing that is flat and a tenor sax that bemoans the whole thing, but the lyrics hold up, which helps.

IN THE HUSH OF THE NIGHT is based on "Scheharazade" by Rimsky-Korsakoff. Recorded by Jimmy Dorsey, adapted by Leslie Deacon, and vocals by Bob Eberly and Helen O'Connell. This is a curious recording in that one should hear it backward. To be specific, the second chorus is all swing, with Rimsky-Korsakoff at the end of the rope. The first chorus is the coup de soleil, in which our now dead Russian shrivels into an intangible mass that slowly disinte-
