Radio Gives Again

Saturday, Feb. 14, 9:45 p.m. is launched a new program over all four nation-wide networks. Titled "This Is War," it is radio's all-out contribution toward dramatizing and interpreting the wartime resources and activities of the government to the American people and the entire world. The series was offered to the government by the broadcasting i nd ustry and "gratefully accepted" by the same officials who have been "riding" the major networks for the past several months.

From a lengthy list of proposed titles and subject matter, "This Is War" was selected as most suitable for the series. Norman Corwin, topflight CBS writer-producer who did such a magnificent job on the "Bill of Rights" program, is directing the series which will star outstanding actors, actresses, and artists. With an anticipated outlet in 500 stations, this will mark the first time in radio history that combined network facilities are employed simultaneously for a broadcast series. Arrangements are being completed to short-wave the programs as well. For the premiere, President Roosevelt speaks.

Navy Ties Vallee

Rudy Vallee, the Maine Man on the Blue Network's Sealtest show, has a knack for sustained interest in everything . . . but the same girl.

Time's New Pattern

A change in format as drastic and spectacular as the change in the maps of the world has marked the March of Time broadcasts of the past two weeks.

Devoting two half-hour programs entirely to the dramatization of a single phase of "history in the making," the Blue Network's "Time" show appears to have evolved a new technique that is finding immediate public acceptance.

"doing as well as can be expected" and "holding its own," has rallied right out of bed into vigorous life.

This condition of needing a pick-up for the program didn't reflect in the least on Bob Burns' capabilities. He's solid, with a unique brand of humor that strikes a responsive chord in American hearts. Successful, he's still humble. Backstage he eyes his shiny new bazooka, then says, "I don't want to mistreat the old bazooka on the way up. I might have to pass it on the way down."

But it's too tough an assignment for a radio comedian to carry a show alone. Ace Benny doesn't. He has Mary and Rochester, uses Announcer Don Wilson, Singer Dennis Day, Orchestra Leader Phil Harris as stooges, even made recent call on talents of Virgil, the sound effects man. Fibber McGee is supported by Molly, Mrs. Uppington, and Bill Thompson, man of many roles. Bob Hope relies on Jerry Colonna, Frances Langford, Betty Hutton, Skinnay Ennis. Simil-

arly ensconced are other laugh-fetchers.

Last fall, when Harold Peary (Gildersleeve) left Fibber McGee and Bob Burns departed the old Kraft Music Hall, both to star in their own programs, there was speculation on their ventures.

By the end of October, when a poll of radio listeners was tabulated, Burns was close on the heels of veteran Rudy Vallee, Blondie, and Dr. Christian, was ahead of Vox Pop, Al Pearce, and Gildersleeve, who also made a creditable showing ahead of Orson Welles, Helen Hayes, and Battle of the Sexes. But he trailed far behind the top notchers like Fibber, Charlie McCarthy, Benny, and Hope.

First of this year, Burns and Gildersleeve were neck and neck, were still behind Vallee, had passed Blondie and We, the People, were still ahead of Vox Pop, Al Pearce, and Battle of the Sexes. Gildersleeve, however, was fortified with such cast members as Lurene Tuttle (Marjorie), Earle Ross (Judge Booker) and Walter Tetley (Leroy). Burns' show hadn't been given the prescription of a supporting cast.

Now, the name of the Burns opus has been changed from "The Arkansas Traveler" to "Bob Burns' Show." Guest stars are being billed weekly and Ginny Simms has been called back for three repeat appearances. First night under the new arrangement enhanced Burns tremendously, his salty remarks scooped up brilliantly by Miss Oliver or falling softly against the foil of Simm-ish femininity.

It's better this way—The Traveler jogging along with companions—and radio listeners said so, because a mythical but mathematical 2½ more persons out of every hundred tuned to the re-vitalized show. An additional 1½ was believed to have dialed in for the second program.

It's just what the doctor ordered!

The night Ann Rutherford appeared on the show, she and Ginny ran a men's clothing shop, with Burns as a customer. "Sorry," the girls chorused, "we're conserving material. No double-breasted coats, no lapels, no pockets this year." "Mebbe," proffers Burns, after I pay my income tax I won't NEED pockets. You say no collars too? I wonder if I dare mention trousers!"



Billy Artzt, Burns' maestro, does "take" as Burns tells Ginny and Ann: "I got to be careful about what I wear. I'm in radio, and I have a large following." "Oh," soothes Ann, "we'll fix that so you won't notice it."

Francia White Snubs Dan Cupid Enroute to Fame and Fortune

Francia White-prima donna of Telephone Hour.

HE usual requisite for attaining a goodly amount of success in the musical field as far as sopranos are concerned is to have left at least one or two husbands behind in the dim but not too distant past, a long line of broken hearts and a series of spectacular experiences with Dan Cupid. That was B. F. W.—Before Francia White.

All of which, as a starting conclusion, makes the lovely soprano star of the Sunday Telephone Hour over NBC's transcontinental network, something just short of a phenomenon.

For here is Francia White, at the right pretty age of 32 summers, one of the mbst talked of sopranos in the country, and the co-star with Tenor James Melton of one of radio's most successful programs, unable to shake any romantic skeletons out of her closets to make the fan magazine writers happy and grab headlines for herself.

The only big romance of Francia's life has been music, and it's always been that way for the 5-foot 3-inch, brown-haired, brown-eyed Telephone Hour star who practiced her do-re-mi's a few doors away from the Whitehead family home in Covina years ago.

Attractive and well poised for a youngster of 15, Francia even in her high school freshman days at Covina was far too wrapped up in trills and cadenzas to notice the admiring glances of the male students on the campus.

Francia, as I remember her in "the Covina era," could almost always be found in the music room at high school or in the drama department. Joseph Ainley, now one of Chicago's outstanding radio producers who was head of the music department at Covina Union High School when Francia was in school, used to encourage Francia to play tennis when he felt she was doing a little too much singing. On the court, Francia possessed the same fine sense of timing and relaxed breathing control that have always shown to advantage in front of the microphone.

When in 1940 Francia was signed to co-star with James Melton on the Telephone Hour in New York, a group of Francia's old friends in Covina drafted a letter to Mrs. Phoebe Ara White, Francia's mother, inviting the star to do a concert on the stage of the high school auditorium in Covina where Francia first began démonstrating her talents in the leads in high school operettas. I'll never forget the evening when Francia came back to her home town for a farewell appearance before entraining for New York.

People from near and far, old friends and new friends, youngsters who had heard the legend of Francia White but who had never seen her in person, jammed the Covina high school auditorium to the rafters to see and hear the little country girl who was making good in big-time music circles.

And the tiny soprano sang magnificently. For two hours' Francia sang the classics, light opera tunes and the English folk songs that have won her much of her popularity.

Francia never mentioned her "home town" until just before her final song. She stepped out of the wings after a tremendous ovation, up to the footlight railing at the edge of the stage and said simply:

"I love all of you for having

me here to sing and please remember my songs will always be for you out here in Covina."

With that she dedicated her final number to "Aunt Ellen."

Everyone in the audience knew whom she meant by "Aunt Ellen" for "Aunt Ellen" is as famous in Covina as Francia White and Harold Teen.

One of the first persons to take a personal interest in Francia's talents as a young girl in Covina was "Aunt Ellen" Beach Yaw, one of the big name sopranos of the era just prior to World War I. Known the world over as Lark Ellen, the famous singer became "Aunt Ellen" to her friends in Covina when she settled there after a long, successful career on the stage.

Ellen Beach Yaw and Francia's mother had been friends for many years when the Whites lived in Texas, and when Francia was 5 years old "Aunt Ellen" persuaded Mrs. White to come to Covina to live.

Mrs. Phoebe Ara White, for many years a voice teacher and who had given up ambitions for an operatic career years before to marry, decided when she brought Francia to Covina that she would devote her time to teaching her daughter the singing art.

Encouraged by "Aunt Ellen," who saw great possibilities in the child's vocal talents even before Francia was out of grammar school, Mrs. White began spending more and more time on the development of Francia's voice.

While still a junior in high school Francia was being paged by Los Angeles music critics for guest appearances with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. At 19 she was selected to sing the

Radio Revives Legion

Belying any idea that religion is dead or slipping, is the fact that one of the fastest growing and already one of the largest of all types of broadcasting is the religious alreast. Of recent years, broadcasting alone has been responsible for the construction of complete churches, and the rehabilitation of many a weak parish, as a result of contributions mailed in by appreciative listeners.

An example of a radio-built church is the "Firebrands for Jesus Tabernacle" at the corner of 63rd and Broadway. Two years ago Pastor Earl Ivie began his air ministry over station KFOX. Today his air schedule includes a daily 45-minute aircast, a Sunday afternoon period, and a new hour and a half program on Tuesday nights. From his experience, Rev. Ivie can say, "The radio is God's greatest medium of getting the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ out to the hearts of the people today. It is the cheapest means and therefore the most helpful in religious work."

Recalling cures and "miracles" wrought at old world shrines, Rev. Ivie briefly points to thousands of letters received from listeners, mentioning healing they have received directly by radio. The Ivie broadcasts are now given from the church by remote control, where visitors are welcome.

Ordering of great Feasts, Preserving of all sorts of Wides, conceited Secrets, Distillations, Perfumes, Ordering of Wool, Hemp, Flax: Making Cloth and Dying; the Knowledge of Dayries: Office of Malting; of Oats, their excellent uses in Families: of Brewing, Baking, and all other things belonging to an household.—A Work generally approved, and now the Eighth time much augmented, Purged, and made most profitable and necessary for all men, and the general good of this Nation."

Well, ladies, are you up to it?

AN APPLE A DAY:

In spite of the fact that "an apple a day keeps the doctor away," the medical profession and the humble apple have finally joined forces. It's all due to the recent discovery of scientists that the pectin made from apples can be used in blood transfusions.
