Home Is Not Really Like That

A Peek Into Hanley and Vyola Staffords' Delightful Abode Contradicts Their Air Roles



NE DAY ABOUT five and a half years ago, Joe E. Brown opened his cavernous mouth and didn't put his foot into it. Instead, he introduced Hanley Stafford to the beautiful radio actress, Vyola Vonn. That was all Joe needed to do, because Cupid took over from there on, and four years ago, Vyola and Hanley were married.

As they form one of radio's most interesting Mr. and Mrs. twosomes, R ad io Life recently took a CBS camera man out to the Stafford estate high up on a hilltop overlooking Sunset boulevard's strip. The resulting pictures tell, far better than words, the story of Hanley's and Vyola's home life. In them we see Baby Snook's tormented daddv (and the beleaguered Mr. Dithers of "Blondie" fame) as a devoted spouse, and the lovely Vyola, who has helped sing the Rinso commercial for four years, who is always "the other woman" on "Maxwell House" and who introduces sex interest on "Blondie" as a domesticated house wife.

For several months past, Vvola has been doing all the work in the pair's ten room house. "I adore cooking", she enthused, "and right now I'm in the throes of Chinese dishes. I'm trying something special out on twelve of the family next Sunday. Yes, I've learned about cooking since I was married. Mother never let me putter around because I messed the kitchen up too much. When Henley married me, all I could make was a marble cake—the pink, brown. and white kind."

Was Career Girl

Vyola, whose mother was a specialty dancer and whose father's father was an Austrian baron, started in show business when she was five, did parts on Uncle John's "Children's Hour", worked in vaudeville singing, dancing, and playing the ukelele. She attended John Marshall high school, studied French and is able to sing in that language. Later on, she sang with Larry Lee's band at the Beverly Wilshire, at the Paradise in New York with Paul Whiteman, and with Vincent Lopez' and Gus Arnheim's orchestras. During 1937 and 1938 she played Mademoiselle Fifi on the Eddie Cantor radio program, later enacted romantic parts on "Big Town". She is usually cast in a Carmen Miranda type of role, but sighs, "Golly, I'd love to get away from accents and into straight dramatic parts!"

Vyola provides Hubble Hanley with an extremely photogenic home-movie model. The Staffords are energetic 16 mm. fans and love to shoot scenes in their beautifully landscaped garden. Hanley takes the pictures

Or How to Unzip Your Lip

MERICANS," averred Art Baker, "are noted through all countries

through all countries as singing good and loud. Sometimes it's not so good, but it's a w f u l loud. We've been hearing a lot of talk lately about 'zipping the lip,' but what I'm advocating now is unzipping it—with community singing."

The boyish-faced, white-locked song leader of NBC's "A Song Is Born" threw us a twinkle and said, "The secret of good community singing consists of creating a bathtub atmo-sphere in public" sphere in public."

Art Baker ought to know because every Monday night he coaxes 350 assorted individuals, packed into NBC's Studio B, to warble "good and loud." What magic does he employ to elicit lusty tones and spontaneous melody?

Baker flashed his engaging smile

and responded: "People like to sing. But people have been taught to act like little ladies and gentlemen and when they come to a broadcast and are asked to join in a community sing, they're coated in a veneer. When you meet up with that veneer, you are up against something."

According to Baker, it takes only a split second after a song leader steps in front of an audience to classify the potential canaries as predominately one of four types.

Type No. 1

Type No. 1: "It's beneath my dignity to sing." This is most frequently encountered among swank women's clubs.

Baker's antidote: Some ridiculous song like "Old McDonald Had a Farm." At first they'll look down their noses. Then Baker says: "Gals, you can't kid me. When you were a young, blushing bride and scrubbed your own floors, you used to give with the harmony. Now you can afford to hire a maid but the soap's still there. Come on-dig it out!"

A few timid souls break down and follow Baker's song leading directions. By the time they come to the "chick chick here and a chick chick there," three-quarters of the ladies are singing and looking in amazement at one another as if they expected to fall apart performing such unbecoming antics. The remaining one-quarter, the hide-bound hold-outs, also gaze in utter astonishment and titter before breaking down and joining the hoi poloi. It all ends up in a crescendo of ee-eye-ee-eye o's.

Type No. II: "Dare me to sing!"

Baker's antidote: Some nostalgic number like "Let Me Call You Sweetheart."

Of this type of audience, Art observes: "Meet it by giving them confidence. Don't get up and wave a lily white hand and say, 'Everybody will sing like this' and then the leader gives with a beautiful covered tone like he learned in Ipswich Conservatory of Music and the guy in the seventh row says: 'Nuts! I didn't come here to learn how to sing. I came to enjoy myself.'

"If the leader," continues Baker, "assumes a hog caller's voice and sings with a so-called white tone (that's with no color) the guy in the seventh row will exclaim: 'Heck! I can sing better than that, and furthermore they'll never hear me what with him bellowing!' So, the leader gets less loud, the audience sings so hard it gots red in the face, and you're off to the races."

High 'n' Mighty Type

Type No. III. "Are we not endowed with greater gray matter and does not that gray matter say it's corny to sing?"

Baker's antidote: "God Bless America," plus a serious talk on the tremendous power of music.

The song leader bumped into this attitude when he guested-conducted a sing for a well-known advertising club. He reminded the men that music is used as an anaethesia; that tobacco plants hire a fellow-not to strip the leaves,-but to sing while others strip, and how production is thus increased as much as ten per cent. He reminds them, too, of the physical power of music and of the diapason stop in New York's largest theater-a stop which has been locked because its use was cracking the ceiling. Recalls Baker, too, that a scientist has claimed that if a certain note were to be played continuously, that note could cause the Chrysler tower to vibrate.

After a talk like this, Type No. III audience realizes that it is definitely not corny to sing, but that it is human and great.

Gets All Types

"Of course," Baker points out, "although an audience may be predominately one of the types mentioned, we usually find all three combined in one assembly. There have been very few times when I've not been able to break 'em down. If a song leader can't get 'em mellowed up

Mutual's New Daytime Show Tells Story of American Small Town

HE STORY of "Midland, USA" could be the story of almost any small town in the United States—the

leading character of the series, played by Griff Barnett, is "Judd Adams," and he, too, could be found in almost any hamlet in the country.

A newspaper editor, he's the kind of a fellow who everyday is busy with a hundred things that have nothing to do with the editing of "The Midland Daily Gazette." He's a detective without badge of office, seeking the source of trouble besetting one of his friends; he's a minister without pulpit, helping a wayward soul return to the path of grace; he's a teacher without diploma who gives instruction to the slow of wit (and sometimes to those too sharp for Midland's welfare).

And above all, "Judd," who is never "Mr. Adams" to a "Midlander," is a philosopher capable of seeing two sides to every argument, and quite capable of finding a common meeting ground for those who argue.

For all that, "Judd Adams" is a very human fellow—in fact, according to Jack Holmes, writer of the series, "Judd Adams" is a composite of a dozen newspaper editors whom he himself has met in his career as a newspaper writer and columnist.

Typical Wife

Likewise, "Judd's" wife, "Martha," played by Charlotte Knight, is a typical small town housewife who helps her husband in his business affairs, keeping one eye on the "Gazette's" cash drawer, and the other on the comfort and appearance of her beloved "Judd."

Another important character in "Midland, USA," is one Clarissa Pinney, trouble - maker par excellence. It's really Clarissa who directly or indirectly causes most of "Midland's" —and "Judd's"—trouble, and though "Judd" may try to defend her, even he has to admit that most generally "Clarissa" is a hazard to neighborhood peace and quiet.

Other "Typicals"

Other "Midlanders" you meet are "Bill Hackett," owner and operator of the "Midland Hotel and Truckin" Company," played by Joe Forte; Jimmy Harris, a 17-year old with a past; "Henry White" who counts it among his misfortunes that he lives next door to "Clarissa"; and "Dot," a newcomer to "Midland" whose arrival whets the interest of the whole vicinity, especially Clarissa's.

Perhaps the accompanying pictures will help you visualize the characters and add to your listening pleasure.

Clete Back

Clete Roberts, handsome, dark haired war correspondent for the Blue, says he'll never forget last Christmas. He was on a "troop carrying destroyer" prepared to strike at Cape Gloucester, New Britain. "That night as we sat on the ship lying off the coast waiting to move, we could hear other Marincs singing Christmas carols. On our ship some of the lads were cleaning machine guns, sharpening their machetes, or going over their flame throwers, but as the familiar melodies came waiting over, some of our boys softly joined in."

It's the little things like the carols, or the soldiers trying to find a lost dog, or the sergeant having to stop

his weather-map making to wipe the sheet of bugs off his paper that one remembers, observed Clete. Or he remembers the Marine, a veteran of Guadalcanal, who accidentally shot himself in the foot and who lay on the deck and cried like a baby because "they'll think I did it on purpose so I wouldn't have to land."

Last week, Ciete was back for a brief stay in Hollywood after nine months as a war correspondent for the Blue Network in the Southwest Pacific. He scarcely had time to become re-acquainted with his wife, Mary, and their five-year-old daughter, Penny, so insistent were his radio friends. Everyone wanted to hear about Clete's experiences, so Radio Life considered itself more than favored when the popular radio man took time to pay us a lengthy visit. Seems Clete's the kind of chap who hadn't forgoten the first story we did on him some three years ago out at KMPC.

We recalled that he had joined the Blue news staff shortly afterward, had served in the Army for a year before receiving his discharge, then had been heard on the "Blue Newsroom Review" before being assigned by the Blue's New York News and Special Events department to the Southwest Pacific. "I was finding it very difficult to be a civilian," he observed.

After taking shots that "frightened me to death but didn't make me sick," Clete left the U. S. in October, 1943. "En route to our destination we never saw another ship, never saw a bit of land," he remarked.

Reporting to an Australian officer to arrange transportation to General MacArthur's headquarters, the correspondent received a grim introduction to his work. The plane which was to pick him up crashed and never got in. Two fellow correspondents were killed.

"My biggest problem," he said, "was getting acquainted with a strange country and its method of broadcasting. Some of their methods are very different from ours. For one thing, they have no sense of our split-second timing and would try to put me on the air at 5:31 or 5:33 if they couldn't make it by 5:30."

"I had a free rein in deciding what and when to visit. I covered some 45,000 miles and went on four or five combat missions. My responsibility was to get .n the line-up, partleipate in the landing and then get out and back to the nearest point of broadcast as soon as possible. Getting back, of course, was the problem." He recalls one time when he and two other correspondents were put ashore off the north New Guinea coast in the drenching rain, waded through surf to a jungle, sloshed around in the mud for most of the night, but eventually arranged to get to the point of broadcast—thirty hours after the start of the raid and six hours before release time.

He skipped lightly over several other exciting stories to say: "What I enjoyed most was getting acquainted with the G. I.'s—the 'dog faces.' I think the;"re heroes—every one—as

Asked about the boys, Clete replied: "Every American boy overseas is one consuming ache to get home. Many of them said to me 'I think if I could have a good cold chocolate malted milk in the corner drug store, I'd never ask for anything more.' At night, they don't discuss global strategy. They talk about getting home and what kind of a job they'll have."

Roberts was in Australia when the WACs first arrived. "They were a most welcome sight to the American boys," he stated. "Their hair and nails were nicely done and they were well turned out in their uniforms. Believe me, they were models of deportment." "Clete interviewed General MacArthur just before he came home and observed of him. "He looks remarkably

observed of him. "He looks remarkably young and healthy for his years. His office was like that of a successful businessman. I was impressed by the efficiency. No nonsense, no unnecessary movements. He's running his end of the war as efficiently as he possibly can."

Cooperation between networks overseas is wonderful, Clete stated. "The various networks present a solid front and get things done. We drew straws to see which one of us correspondents went on the air for a combined broadcast. I did the first combined broadcast from Hollandia. In front of a mike, out there, we broadcast only in a pair of shoes and shorts, with the perspiration rolling down in rivulets."

Overseas Clete saw several Hollywood lads, among them Lieut. Bob de la Torre, Bud Hiestand of the O.W.I., Capt. Hal Berger (since returned) and Capt. Ed Tidwell, formerly of KHJ and now of the Armed Forces Radio Ser-

vice. "When I first saw Tidwell he was cutting jungle growth with his machete and piling it up so his transcriptions wouldn't sink in the mud. 'I'm going to put on a show for the boys,' he said."

Roberts thinks the radio picture is definitely picking up in the Pacific and that the radio men are doing a swell job of entertaining and informing the fighting men.

He himself made constant use of the new wire recorder equipment, by means of which an hour and ten minute program can be recorded on a small spool containing 11,000 feet of wire.

Clete left last week-end for Chicago to cover the Democratic convention, then on to New York to lecture and to confer with his chief, Johnny Johnstone, Blue news head. He plans to return to the Pacific.

"I made thirty-two broadcasts a month, aired nation-wide, but only three of them were heard in Los Angeles. I'm the forgotten man of California radio," he concluded rather sadly.

Virginia's Recipe for Lemon Pie

Crust: "(For two single crust pies)

- 1 1/2 c. flour
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 1/2 c. shortening
 - About 1/4 c. ice cold water

Sift together flour and salt, work in shortening, either by cutting it with a knife or rubbing in with the fingers. Mix to light dough with water, handling as little as possible. Divide into two portions, work slight-ly with fingers to insure a smooth surface, and roll out once only to fill ple plate. Bake ten to fifteen minutes in oven at 475 degrees. If only one shell is needed, wrap the only one shell is needed, wrap the other half of the dough in wax paper and keep in the refrigerator. Filling:

- C. SUGAL
- 3 tbsp. corn starch
- I pt. boiling water egg yolks 3
- I tsp. butter
- 2 large Meyer lemons (grated rind and juice)

Mix the sugar with the corn starch and add the bolling water. Boil one minute, stirring constantly. Place over hot water and add the beaten egg yolks and butter. Cook until thickened. Add the lemon juice and rind and pour into the pie shell. Cover with meringue.

Palliative for War Nerves By Don Ross

"Out With Boogie Woogie And Barrelhouse Music," Says Maestro Leonardi, "And On With Quiet Tunes"

AR-JANGLED NERVES have created a tremendous increase in listener demand for good music, according to Leon Leo-

according to Leon Leon nardi, director of the KFWB-Warner Brothers Orchestra heard nightly at 8:15 on Utter-McKinley's "Music for You."

Pointing to his steadily-mounting fan mail for substantiation, the maestro holds that most people want relaxation after a hard day's work under war-created pressure, and seek melodies of the "quiet" type, rather than the more blatant boogie-woogle, swing and barrelhouse kind of music.

"Don't misunderstand me," says Leonardi. "I am not condemning modern jive. I think it fills an important place in music. Dancing is good pastime, and these types of music are good for dancing. As a matter of fact, I can and do play swing if the occasion warrants it.

"But for listening pleasure, which is what the average radio listener wants, the 'better' kind of music is far superior and far more popular."

Music Schedule

Five evenings a week, Leonardi and his orchestra broadcast on KFWB their "Music for You," alternating their programs. On Monday and Thursday nights, they feature (Please turn to Page 34)

HE RADIO DIALER who tunes in to KMTR's Sunday noon Mass to hear the clear youthful voices of the Robert Mitchell Boy-

choir blended in the sacred songs of the church, may easily fancy himself listening to a choir of Angels. There comes to his mind the aweinspiring picture of small, blackrobed figures assembled together within the stately, stain-windowed walls of St. Brendan's, their golden voices rising softly on the wings of age-old hymns, their eager young faces intent upon the guiding gestures of their singing instructor, David Street.

"But sometimes," smiles Mr. Street, "they get pretty scrappy." Gifted as they may be, the boys of the famed Mitchell choir are real rough-andready youngsters. They are not above a bout of mischief and like all adolescents, admits their leader, they have sometimes displayed smartaleck antics. "Only then," he declares, "do I have to become stern with them."

The boys' director, David Street, is the tall, dark, youthful lad in his late twenties who sings each Friday evening on NBC's "Village Store" comedy show. Since Robert Mitchell entered into service with the Navy, Street (who himself has an honorable discharge from the Army) spends some forty eight hours a week working with the choir, and his golden-voiced charges have enveloped him with hero-worship. As often as possible, they attend his network broadcasts.

Small Boy's Tribute

At every airing of the program, the one little colored boy in the choir is to be found in a front seat holding tightly to a battered bag of candy, and after the show, he hurries up to his singing instructor to offer him a piece.

Several nationalities are represented in the Mitchell choral group. One of the boys is Chinese. Each boy's tuition amounts to three dollars monthly, in addition to the cost of the books. Thirty per cent of the money the organization earns for professional appearances is put into the choir fund, to cover the expenses of the organization and the maintenance costs of the choir house. In addition to its KMTR broadcasts, the choir regularly makes appearances at weddings and benefits, and has been seen and heard on the screen in a much-lauded musical short, as well as in such recent feature-length productions as "Rosie O'Grady" and Bing Crosby's "Going My Way".

in ten minutes, he might as well go home."

Baker speaks from years of experience leading the public in tonsil stretching. In World War One, when he was just a plain buck private, he was wont to sing in a loud voice. Two or three other privates became accustomed to joining him and eventually they formed a quartet which attracted a tent full of other soldiers. When occasion arose for a huge community sing among 15,000 Americans stationed at Grantham, England, the commanding officer ordered: "Go get that buck private with the loud voice and have him lead the crowd." That was Art Baker's debut as a big time tune elicitor.

"I came back home," reminisces Art, "and drifted into leading a church choir of 40 voices in Mishawaka, Indiana. Then I joined the Rotary Club and led the singing. In 1939, out of 4700 International Rotary song leaders, I was chosen leader for the San Francisco convention. Which probably shows I had a louder voice than any other leader!"

Sandwiched in between his return from England and his entry into radio about seven years ago, Baker traveled for ten years as song leader with Evangelist George Wood Anderson. Anderson saw Baker in action when Art was directing a choir comprised of choir leaders during a Billy Sunday gathering. Baker, who was making \$27.50 a week in a Mishawaka factory, confesses to "controlling myself admirably" when Anderson offered "not more than \$150 a week and all expenses" to tour the country as Anderson's song leader.

Art's answer was: "Well, I guess that will do." Continues Baker, "I also made ten cents on each song book we sold, and if you don't think I sold song books like mad, you're nuts!"

In action before a community sing audience, Art doesn't spare himself a whit. He waves his arms energetically, bends double, stamps his foot in time to the music, tosses his head around until his silver mane shakes, and disregards mussing his customary immaculate, sartorially perfect attire. He probably takes off a couple of pounds in the process of getting his audience to give all the way. He still remembers some audiences that, once warmed, refused to quit singing. At a Kiwanis Club convention in Atlantic City, the men roared "Far Away" for twenty minutes.

"I couldn't stop 'em," shrugs Art. Again, in Ithica, New York, a high school assembly waxed enthusiastic on "Ham 'n' Eggs" and carolled it so persistently that the speaker didn't get a chance to speak.

"Once a year," Baker claims with a happy chuckle, "I get Type No. IV —a self-starting audience. They love to sing and I don't have to use any psychological tricks to lead them into it. When I see that kind of a group, all I have to do is say, 'Gosh! I feel like singing. Don't you?' And the greatest chorus on earth can't compare with such people."

"Me, a singer?", Baker became quizzical in answer to a nudge. "Don't be crazy. I just sing loud, not good. I've only had fourteen music lessons in my life!"

"was a Hopalong Cassidy western. Put twenty-three happy, husky young boys on horses, and turn them loose in wide open spaces, and you can imagine how wild they went."

Enjoy Outings

Street plans carefree Sunday afternoon outings for the singing group, after their period of broadcasting, and often accompanies them on camping trips and sporting activities. During the week, they devote each morning to their vocal instruction, then attend regular school classes at St. Brendan's during the remainder of the day.

Asked where they have found the outstanding young voices that he and Mitchell have assembled, Street declared, "I don't know where they come from; they simply show up for auditions. To be eligible, a boy must have a high, clear voice and the ability to take musical instruction."

Street himself did not sing in a choir during his childhood. "I wish I had, however," he maintains. "It would have saved me three years of later work."

He considers his present work with the choir of invaluable advantage to him. In 1937, he sang with the St. Brendan's men's choir, and before that, had gained preliminary experience with his singing and acting appearances in high school plays.

Professionally, he played and sang with dance bands, was one of the "Six Hits and A Miss" and in 1940, won the Mary Astor award on her "Hollywood Showcase". In the same year, he appeared in the musical revue, "They Can't Get You Down", and later enacted roles in the movies, "Reveille With Beverly" and "We've Never Been Licked". Recently, he directed a chorus of sixteen men in making an album of hymns for servicemen overseas, at the request of the war department.

Are Diversified

Although the boys of the Mitchell Choir are most noted for their thrilling renditions of sacred and classical melodies, outstanding too, are their interpretations of such all time favorites as "Shortnin' Bread".

"By the way," declared Mr. Street with a smile, at the mention of this song, "whenever we do that number, I must always remind the little colored youngster to say 'sho'tnin' without the 'r'.

"He's our boogie-woogie expert,"

continued David. "And no matter what melody the choir is singing, be it a hymn or a classic, according to him, it's 'plenty sharp'!"

"Music in Three-Quarter Time," including world famous waltzes. For their Tuesday evening programs, they present "Music of All Faiths," with local church choirs as guest artists and featuring religious music.

Their Wednesday and Friday programs, called "Little Concerts," feature light classics.

Most of the orchestra has remained intact since the group was organized by Leonardi seven and a half years ago, although a few of the original members have gone into the nation's armed forces.

The maestro himself is a pioneer radio musical director, with twentyone years' background in that field. Holder of the Grand Prize of Honor of the Paris Conservatory, he was for two years associate musical director of the world-famous Radio City Music Hall in New York.

War Programs

With the Warner Brothers orchestra, he has been active in many causes supporting the war effort. One of his major contributions was the organization, at the request of the United States Navy, one week after Pearl Harbor, of a transcontinental radio program, "Anchors Aweigh," which he continued for 85 consecutive weeks. At the same time, Leonardi served as musical director and musical producer of "Halls of Montezuma" for the United States Marine Corps, a program broadcast from the Marine Corps base at San Diego.

Thus, for almost two years, he gave three days of each week as a volunteer to the two branches of the nation's military forces that constitute the first line of attack.

One of Leonardi's favorite undertakings is the introduction of works of new and little-known composers whose compositions he believes merit attention.

"Music," he explains, "should be judged solely on its merit, rather than on the fame of the composer or the age of the composition. If I can be instrumental in bringing good music to the public, I feel that I am doing more than helping the composer; I am giving the public something beautiful and worthwhile."
