ing audience, bringing them a program of "Melodies 'n' Memories" planned and presented with their expressed wants and wishes in mind.

"It's just a kind of personal gesture of appreciation from me to the listeners of KFOX," Hal Nichols asserts.

The program originates in Nichols' own private study, the "Memory Room"— a real room in the Nichols' home which contains an extensive library of books and documents relating to music, one of the best collections of old-time sheet music, an immense collection of recorded

#### Pets at Mike

Frequently heard on the Memory Room microphone are the genial maestro's constant companions, "Nosey," his 18-pound tortoiseand-white cat, and his two canary songbirds, "Dixie" and "Trixie." "Nosey" is called the "Pin-Up Cat" since he has been made absentee mascot of two groups of men in the armed forces. The official Memory Room program mascot, "Nosey" has had his picture sent out to thousands of "Memory Roomers."

Since starting his show almost two years ago, Mr. Nichols has received from his listeners all manner of souvenirs and curios—sun dials, Edison phonographs, antique music boxes, and early recordings, among them, a privately-made disc of the voice of Lillian Russell.

One time a casual mention of interest in old newspapers resulted in a full mail bag containing an almost complete collection of old periodicals dating back to 1794!

On another occasion, Nichols mentioned that he had recently installed an antique hitching post, and regretted his inability to use it in this mechanical age.

The next morning, he found two large draft horses tied to the post!

Hollywood Goes Overboard

Hillbilly Craze Takes Sophisticated Center by Storm, Prompts Air Program

NOCK YOUR heads together, stomp your feet, whistle, chunk your children around. You can do anything on this program!"

Yes, the hillbilly craze, whose rise has been predicted by musical authorities for some months past, has finally taken Hollywood by storm! Every Saturday night, CBS listeners are gluing their ears to their speakers at 7:15, and every Saturday night they're turning 'em away at Colum-

bia Square. "We've never failed to turn 'em away," remarked friendly, good-looking Cottonseed. "Our type of entertainment right now has the biggest record sale and fan mail pull."

The music jogs along in best hillbilly and Western tradition: "Hang Your Head in Shame," "Ragtime Cowboy Joe," or "Dusty Skies," reminiscent of a hard-riding cowboy on the range. The humor which complements the songs is rustic and unsubtle. It smacks of plain living, is without pretense, sometimes just misses vulgarity. But it is the routine which requires no diagramming and folks go for it in a huge way. Example: "I just can't please that woman of mine. I gave her a present last week. I gave her a brand new washing machine and she doesn't like it. She sez every time she gets in it, the paddles keep knocking her back out!"

Radio Life, covering the show the other night, chatted with Cottonseed, who was standing in the wings of the studio while the Riders of the Purple Sage ran through a number. His well-shod cow-booted foot kept exact time to the rhythmic music. As he talked, it became more and more apparent that hillbilly musicians are not second-rate, broken down, corny performers. They're tops.

#### 15 Years in Radio

Take Cottonseed himself. He has been in radio for fifteen years. From two years at Texas "U," he went into professional baseball, then to New York radio, where he worked as a producer-director for two years. While he stayed in the big city, he became lonesome for the hillbillies, snapped at a chance to come west on an audition for a show written for Andy Devine and Walter Brennan. During the past few years, Cottonseed has attained a firm reputation in the business of discovering and developing hillbilly talent. All that appearing on the Barn Dance is his own, the idea for the program, too, is his.



HERE, JOHNNY BOND looks pensive. But on the show, the lanky Johnny is a wit, represents Clark's idea of "an up and coming hillbilly comic,"

Cottonseed, his friendly eyes wandering about the stage, began singling out some of his performers.

"That fellow by the piano," he said, is Foy Willing, my musical director. We've been in radio together for ten years. He is one of the best trio arrangers in the business. Next to him is Al Sloey. He studied for opera. Today he's the best tenor trio singer in the business. He's also a soloist, "the Sinatra of the West." That fellow behind them is Charlie Linvalle, Kentucky state champion hoe-down fiddler. Over in the corner is Kenny Driver. He comes from Oklahoma City. Can sing with the best of 'em!"

Ranging the length of the platform, Cottonseed pointed out other outstanding members of the cast— Carolina Cotton, girl yodeler, "out of this world;" Kirby Grant, baritone singing star who always closes the (Please turn to Page 34)

Many are those who are mourning the recent sudden death of boyishfaced, thirty-five-year-old Tom Treanor, who somehow seemed to have become the strongest, closest link between our boys on the battlefronts and us folks here at home. Radio shares greatly in his loss. Treanor, whom Damon Runyon named "one of the four best reporters the war has produced," was NBC's special representative with General Patton's Third Army in France. He was injured fatally in a tank accident near Dreux and died on August 19 at an evacuation hospital in the field. He had been with our boys from Africa onward.

"Tom was where he wanted to be," declared NBC's John MacVane from the American sector in France. "He was at the very tip of the units of the American Third Army. There were Germans behind him and all around him. It was his great ambition to be the first radio correspondent to reach Paris.

"Tom's loss will be great," continued MacVane. "He was greatly loved by his fellow, correspondents. He was such a swell guy."

In response to the wishes of his many West coast admirers, Dunninger, the Blue Network's Mental Marvel, who demonstrates the miracle of telepathy on the airlanes, will be California-bound, come October. His, too, to enjoy is the compensation for his air efforts, for at present his money is frozen in France, where he lived for twenty-two years before coming to California.

Brought up in the best English tradition, educated at Harrow, he describes his childhood as "uneventful," claims that before he entered World War I he "did nothing." Pressed to qualify "nothing," Sir Charles admitted he "played polo and looked after business interests in the Argentine." Wounded in Flanders the latter part of 1914, he was discharged from the army in 1915, entered British intelligence the following year and was attached to the British Embassy in Paris until Hitler started his drive for the French capital.

It was at their apartment in Paris



and at the Villa Trianon palace, the only privately-owned home on the Versailles grounds, that Sir Charles and Lady Mendl did their fabulous, pre-war entertaining. Pictures in Lady Mendl's well-thumbed scrapbooks show how elaborately the affairs were staged—the cleverest of circus acts imported for amusement of the guests, a tricky champagne bar erected around a huge tree in the garden, hedges of hot house lilies which special florists spent three days to arrange, fantastically illuminated pools — all for one evening's pleasure. Furnishings of the Versailles place exemplified Lady Mendl's flare for decorating in its most versatile and skillful degree.

#### Left Paris Hurriedly

All this, the Mendls left hurriedly when they were ordered to evacuate the French capital just two days before Hitler's storm troopers overran the city by the Seine.

Leaving before his wife, Sir Charles awaited her arrival in Lisbon, where after several hectic days they were allowed to book steamer passage to America.

Now that they live on Benedict Canon Drive in Beverly Hills, the noted couple say, "We have found sanctuary here."

Obviously, they dislike talking about their home in Versailles for the Germans, so they have been told, took the place over and converted if into a "powder room," as Sir Charles delicately expresses it.

Attuned to war-time living is the new home. Gone is the \$15,000 Rolls Royce—sold as a prop car to Warner Brothers for \$750. Into the new place and with remarkable courage, Lady Mendl has again injected her exotic taste in decorating and has indulged her favorite green and white color scheme at every possible vantage point. The popular Mendls enjoy a modified social life, entertaining quietly and in small numbers and being hosted by many of the world's famous (they count among their close friends such personalities as Mary Pickford, Elsa Maxwell, the Duke and Duchess of Windsor). Reduced to war-time simplicity, too, is Lady Mendl's noted wardrobe, but her love of grooming and chic, a love which won her the title of "best dressed woman," is still apparent. The woman who used to make the headlines for turning cartwheels every morning and who once turned them at a Paris ball," admits she no longer performs this routine because of her arthritis, but her quick, bird-like motions and general vivacity label her as a person half her age.

Indulgent Sir Charles, whose Eng-



lish reserve shies from "publicity," describes with evident relish, his radio debut. Through an agency friend, he obtained the role of the parson on the Lux presentation of "Jane Eyre." So faithfully did he enact his part that he was the recipient of honest-to-goodness fan letters, among them, one from Mary Case of Vogue who wrote: "The wedding ceremony never sounded more fatal and you can marry me any time you want!"

Following his Lux debut, Sir Charles met Carlton Morse at tea and shortly after, he was invited to appear on "One Man's Family." He has no misgivings about broadcasting, says of the mike, "It won't bite you!" About enlargement of his air career, he chuckles: "I don't think there's any chance for me to be on 'I Love a Mystery' unless Mr. Morse invents a wicked old Englishman."

Man of Many Pursuits, Genial Mike Stuart Works Fourteen Hours a Day And Dreams of Retiring to a Ranch

"LET'S GO TO THE DOGS" was the name of Mike Stuart's popular program about pets. Of all the shows he has done, it remains his favorite, and he hopes to bring it back to the airtangs soon. Here, he is shown with his own Irish setter, "McGinty."

ISTENERS to KMTR's "Lamplighter" programs, which bring radio-dialers news and views of the local after-dark entertainment spots. have been hearing the familiar voice (or rather, voices!) of Mike Stuart, substituting for "The Lamplighter," Ted Yerxa, during the latter's illness.

He is the same Mike Stuart who wrote, produced, and enacted the ten parts on his popular "Let's Go To The Dogs" program. He hopes to bring that show back to the airlanes sometime in the near future, but meanwhile, he has his hands full writing, producing, announcing, spinning records, interviewing celebrities, creating sound effects and publicity stunts, doing the bookkeeping, billing, selling and collecting for the Lamplighter's programs.

"I wish I could find a good secretary," moaned Mike, as we sat in with him during his hour-and-a-half midnight stint over KMTR.

#### Home Is Office

The living room of Mike's home is his office, where he spends more than twelve hours daily, attired in rumpled sailor's pants' and an old sweater, and surrounded by filing cases, transcriptions, old scripts, a piano, a typewriter and three well-worn desks. In addition to his work for "The Lamplighter," Stuart appears on the NBC Spanish-speaking CIA "Youth of the America's" programs, and plays a variety of parts on numerous commercial transcriptions in which he employs his many voices to enact cleverly-gagged advertisements.

The patchwork pattern of Mike Stuart's career in show business started when, at the age of ten, he entered vaudeville as a boy-tenor, singing such hits of World War I as "Over There" and "Rose of No-Man's Land." Schooled by his mother during vacations from show business and ranch life in Utah, he was in and out of many educational institutions, the last being the University of California.

From time to time he ventured away from the entertainment field, to follow such varied pursuits as soldiering, steeple-jacking, commercial fishing, dog-training, bookkeeping, and reporting, but always to return to his first-love—show business. He went through the hard schools of traveling stock, old-time melodrama, the circus and midway side-shows.

#### Is Author-Composer

In addition to radio programs, he has written short stories, plays and songs such as the familiar "Don't Want No Change of Pasture," which is frequently featured by the bands of Spike Jones, Hal Grayson and Spade Cooley.

Stuart admires the work of such varied artists as George Bernard Shaw, Voltaire, Duke Ellington, Frank Capra, Orson Wells, Fred Allen, Art Baker and Walt Disney. Personally he considers satire an ideal field, contending that satire more clearly paints for the imagination the "pictures worth ten thousands words."

A quiet-voiced, kindly person with a ready wit and an obviously genuine love of people, Mike is happlly married to the beautiful and talented dancer, Serrita Camargo. The two of them are almost always accompanied by their tremendous Irish setter named "McGinty."

Asked how his wife feels about his heavy working schedule. Stuart smiled, "She says, 'Honey, why don't you quit?'"

"And that's my biggest ambition." he went on. "To retire to a ranch, where I can spend my time raising dogs and a few horses, and living with things that are real."

Now required to make the rounds of the night spots regularly, in the course of doing "The Lamplighter's" shows, Mike frowned, "Night clubs aren't for me. They're make believe."

"Besides," he added, "I don't even drink. And I can never get a good cup of coffee!"

Against Engineering and Medicine, Music's Pull Won Out to Dominate Richard Aurandt's Rising Career



CCOMPANYING Mme. Schumann-Heink, recalls Richard Aurandt, was the proudest moment to date in his musical career.

The melee which occurred while he was thumping piano in a tough roadhouse near Napa, he wincingly confesses, was the most disconcerting. Which is a clumsily roundabout way of saying that Conductor-composerarranger Aurandt's musical experience embraces everything from grand opera to boogie woogie.

Currently serving as musical director of CBS's new "Hollywood Mystery Time" and on NBC's "A Song Is Born" (which he also originated and owns) thirty-eight-year-old Aurandt

has had twenty-five years of musical experience.

"I joined the union when I was thirteen," he remembers. "They had to grant a special dispensation to let me in."

#### Is Versatile

Watching Aurandt rapidly pencilling the notes of an arrangement or meticulously whipping his orchestra into shape, an onlooker develops a singular feeling when he knows that Dick might have been an equally successful electrical engineer if music had not made parallel demands on his time and interest along with his courses at the University of California. The feeling is intensified when Aurandt surveys his capable looking hands and exclaims: "If I had \$30,000 in cash right now, I'd

> kick over my music and study to be a doctor. That's what I've always wanted to be!"

But wading now, chin deep in music, Aurandt has his eye glued on one objective: "To be recognized as one of the finest conductors and composers in Hollywood." This leaves some corporation minus a top notch technician and some sick folk without a comforting bedside manner, but makes radio listeners lucky people.

For Dick, as a his friends hail him, has a substantial contribution for the ether lanes. Lightly to be skipped over is the fact that, as a small lad, he fudged on his keyboard practice. "Instead of doing my exercises. I'd unwind a player piano roll very slowly as if I were playing," he now ad mits.

By the time he was twelve, he was accompanying his mother, a solo dancer. At thirteen, when he was sufficently proficient to join the union, he invested himself with the impressive title, "The Jazz Piano Kid." At fifteen, when he matriculated at Berkeley upon advice from his father, a pioneer automotive engineer, he squeezed in piano and organ study on the outside.

#### Into Show Business

After three or four organ lessons, Dick was practicing early one morning at the Capitol Theater when the accompanist failed to show up for a stage rehearsal of Fanchon and Marco's "Pepper Box Revue" with Sophie Tucker. Young Aurandt was mustered into service, took the song

melodies down by ear, and played for the chorus to run through its routine. He made an instant impression with his work, but was considered too young to assume the duties of musical director. Later on, however, when the show took to the road, Dick toured as its musical director.

Meantime, the inevitable had happened and he had let music take precedence over his engineering course. "Every time I'd get ready to turn my back on music, something would happen to pull me back. So I decided to stay," he resumed.

He had taken only a dozen organ lessons and boasted four paltry selections in his repertoire when he dared to take a \$175-a-week job presiding at the console of San Francisco's Warfield Cafeteria. "All I could play was 'Moonlight and Roses,' 'Skaters' Waltz,' 'The Rosary,' and 'Love Tales,' he recalls qualmishly. "I did variations on these four themes and skinned by, but if they'd asked me to play anything else, I'd have fallen flat on my face!"

#### **Theater Organist**

Two years later, at the venerable age of nineteen, Dick was organist for San Francisco's new twin theaters, the Fillmore and the Mission, then he stepped up to head organist (Please turn to Page 34)

THERE'S A TRICK TO PACKING— Fruit carelessly packed may be the cause of the "floating" of the contents of the jar after cooking, may resuit in unevenly cooked fruit, may be the reason for losing the juice during processing, and may be the key to spoilage. Here Mufual's food expert, Norma Young, demonstrates the proper packing of peaches. She is using a small suction cup on a wooden prod to place the fruit in the jars firmly, without breaking the delicate slices. Jars are filled to no more than onehalf inch from the top, syup is poured on immediately to the same level, and jar top is placed.

## **Tips On Canning**

Cold pack canning is the most popular way of preserving fruits, and the processing can be done in a steam cooker, requiring about three inches of water in a tall, tightly covered kettle; in a water bath, where the water must cover the jars and be kept boiling throughout the process time; or in a pressure cooker, which requires less cooking time than any other method. (VEGETABLES, WHICH ARE NON-ACID, MUST BE COOKED IN A PRESSURE COOK-ER IN ORDER TO BE SAFELY PRESERVED, ALWAYS BOIL CANNED VEGETABLES TEN TO FIFTEEN MINUTES BEFORE SERVING.)

The pressure cooker is recommended for processing vegetables, meats, and non-acid foods, as it gives a greater degree of safety. The hot water bath is good for processing fruits and tomatoes. A wash boiler or a large deep vessel that has a closefitting cover may be used in this procedure, but the vessel must be fitted with a rack made of laths, wire, or other perforated material, and the rack must hold the jars at least half an inch above the bottom of the receptacle. Water should cover the jars at least an inch over the top, and the water should be kept boiling for the entire processing period. If

for Fox West Coast in their giant movie palace—the "Fox." Having organized a dance band while in college, he felt the urge to resume his orchestral activities at this same time, and aired his group on KTAB. Between 1938-1941 he served as musical director for KSFO, led the Palace Hotel Rose Bowl orchestra, made numerous appearances at Treasure Island, composed the torch song, "It Serves Me Right," recorded by Decca.

Curiously enough, Dick didn't land in Hollywood because of his musical accomplishments. It took Petrillo and Tojo to shuttle him south. For some years prior to Pearl Harbor, Aurandt had been busy making all San Francisco's major commercial recordings. When war came, he switched his recording work to night-time and took a day job as machine tool engineer. When Petrillo's ban put a halt to Dick's recording enterprise, he asked for a transfer to the war plant's Los Angeles factory. Three months after arriving here, he resumed his radio work, playing the organ for Billie Burke's "Fashions in Rations," for NBC's "Dreft Star Playhouse," and for KFI's "Sunday Serenade."

Lately he has nixed several similar offers in preference to conductorarranger assignments. But he's lost 15 of his 172 pounds.worrying about special effects for "A Song Is Born." "I spend about twenty hours arranging a spot that takes four minutes to play," he lamented.

#### Works at Home

He does most of his arranging and composing at the grand piano in his living room overlooking Silver Lake (in the house formerly occupied by Aimee Semple Macpherson). The telephone is jangling constantly. "When it gets too bad," Dick shrugged resignedly, "I take my work and go up in the hills where there's some peace."

In spite of his many years playing for night spots, he has the get-upearly habit and piles out of bed every morning at 7:15. "But I love to sleep," he yawned. "I can doze off in a bucket of water."

Handball is about the only other relaxation he finds time for. He likes to fish, claims that all anybody has to do is dangle a pole in front of his nose and he drops any thoughts of work ... is keen about movies, goes about once a week and thinks Rosalind Russell is tops ... likes golf. "I usually go around in 60. That's for nine holes," he added facetiously.

He has a mania for collecting mechanical pencils and has a cigar boxful of every make you can name likes to shine his own shoes, usually takes refuge with polish and cloth in the garage and gives vent to his ideas by talking to himself... considers blunt honesty his biggest fault ... would read a lot if his schedule weren't so tight, demonstrates his good intentions by clutching a book at bedtime but drops off to sleep after three and a half paragraphs.

#### Still Invents

He still loves to putter with machinery and would make his own car repairs if the work weren't so hard on his hands. But he is no jack of all trades and master of none. The others are side interests to music, which he studies seriously and continuously, taking weekly lessons in composition and counterpoint.

But now and then his inventive mind rigs up something special, like the commercial butter slicer he designed. He also developed special sound euipment to enhance the reality of organ music.

A few years ago he employed this idea to make records for funeral homes and cemeteries and sold his discs and playing equipment to more than 400 mortuaries and burial parks throughout the country. By means of push-button control, this music can be loud speakered to any part of the memorial grounds.

Observed the very lively Dick with a semi-twinkle: "I suppose I'll play for my own funeral!"

#### Hillbilly Comic

Then, Cottonseed's eyes lit on lanky, droll-faced Johnny Bond. "He's my idea of an up and coming hillbilly comic," exclaimed Clark.

A few months later we listened to Johnny running through some of his lines: "I started married life on a fifty-fifty basis. When my wife wanted fifty dollars for a dress, she gave me fifty cents for a shirt. One morning she sez to me, 'By the way, I found this here slip of paper in your pocket and it was wrote down on it: Myrtle, two hundred eighty. She shows it to me and sez: Okay, brother. Explain that.' And I sez, 'Why, that's easy. Myrtle is just a race horse and two hundred eighty is the race she's to run in.' Next day I come home and my wife had that look in her eye, so I sez, 'What's the matter?' She sez, 'Oh nothin,' except that your race horse called up today. You deceiver you, before we was married, you fold me you was well off.' And I sez, 'I was, only I didn't realize it then.'"

Another portion of the program is devoted to what Cottonseed calls his "brushwood philosophy and rhyme." He writes his verses at night in bed. They are based on his memories of boyhood days when he lived with his three brothers, sister, and parents on a 250-acre ranch and where he "farmed from five in the morning until time to go to school."

#### Sample Verse

Recently, Clark compiled his versephilosophy into a booklet which CBS printed. More than five thousand requests poured in for the poems.

- "Now I hear folks fuss 'bout th' work they do, an' how it tuckers 'em out.
- Like rakin' leaves, an' washin' th' car, or walkin' their dog about;
- Why they oughta be ashamed to ever complain over little things like that,
- Such triflin work is fun fer mejest as easy as skinnin' a cat.
- Did you ever chop cotton in th' summer sun, an' sweat like an ol' work horse?
- Did you ever saw logs, or call th' hogs till yore throat wuz dry an' hoarse?
- Well, I have, an' many a time, in this land of th' brave an' th' free.
- But I don't repent one minute I spent, 'cause it helped shape my destiny."

Cottonseed expressed it best himself when he remarked: "I can be illiterate or otherwise. I had a pretty good education, but started out talking hillbilly for fun and ended up sounding like a cow eating cactus." Asked about his homey cognomen, he explained he got it when he played baseball and players were given a sack of feed for making a home run.

His claim that hillbilly craze is in full swing was verified the other day when "Barn Dance" became a sponsored program. That there is money in being a hillbilly entertainer was obvious when Cottonseed was quizzed about the cowboy suit he was wearing. The suit, he said, cost \$125; his boots, \$40; his belt, \$35; his tengallon hat, \$50.
