Seventy-Six Cars and One"A" Book!

James Melton's Success Has Given Him Chance to Achieve Childhood Ambition to Be a Flivver Fancier

Sunday, 6:30 p.m. CBS—KNX

AMES MELTON, who made a welcome return to the airlanes this summer, showed up at Hollywood's CBS studios one Sunday afternoon, late for the rehearsal of his weekly "Texaco Star Theater" broadcast. Reason was, his Stanley Steamer had refused to steam!

Owner of the world's largest collection of antique motor cars, Melton has seventy-six of the old-time flivvers, and among them, two picturesque Stanley Steamers which he brought with him when he came to the West Coast for the making of the new MGM technicolor extravaganza, "Ziegfeld Follies". While here, he drove the Stanley Steamer models to and from the radio and movie studios, saving gasoline, since the ancient jalopies run on mere kerosene and water. In fact, although he owns seventy-six automobiles, Melton has just one A-Book!

All of the singer's cars are in per-

fect running condition. "I work on them myself," Melton told us, adding that he also employs a crew of mechanics.

The day his 1921 Stanley Steamer balked, making him late for his broadcast rehearsal, he spied a sailor in the audience who had been a member of his maintenance crew before going into service. During the show's "warm up", Jimmy shouted to him, "I wish you'd hurry up and get out of the Navy, so you could keep an eye on my steamer prima donnas!"

But Melton's cars as well as his mechanics are currently working for Uncle Sam! The ancient auto originally owned by Atwater Kent has been reconditioned and is now at Ream Hospital, Florida, taking convalescing war heroes for rides in the Palm Beach sunshine. Other vehicles of the Melton collection have raced in the east, with proceeds going to war charities.

His Prize Conveyance

Melton names as the prize conveyance of his collection, a horseless stage coach that a millionaire had built to go to the races on Long Island in 1893. It is powered by two steam engines and equipped with eight tool boxes, four on each side. He also has a De Dion Motorette, 1898 model, which was the first car registered in Connecticut, and the 1908 Fiat, with plum-colored upholstery and sterling silver fittings, that was once owned by the fabulous Diamond Jim Brady.

On his lapel, we noted, Melton wears a miniature diamond and platinum replica of Brady's 1906 Locomobile that won the Vanderbilt Cup Race.

Jimmy's interest in automobiles dates back to the days of his childhood, when, as a small boy, he was fascinated by his uncle's "White" automobile. He determined then that he would some day own one.

Born in Moultrie, Georgia, Melton spent his youth in a small Florida lumbering community and made his singing debut in a Citra, Florida, church.

He attended the University of Florida, the University of Georgia and Vanderbilt University, and became a dance-band saxophonist and vocal soloist to help pay for operatic studies with Gaetano De Luca. When he finished college, he solicited help from Nashville business men to finance a year of musical study in New York. His first break there was with S. L. Rothafel's (Roxy's) Gang in 1927.

Later, came a series of radio

shows ("Selberling Singers", "The Voice of Firestone", "Sealtest Sunday Night Party", "Palmolive Beauty Box", "Telephone Hour" and currently, "Texaco Star Theater"), supplemented by outstanding success in the varying fields of motion pictures, records, the concert and opera, all of which has made possible his unique hobby of collecting rare and historic automobiles.

His Characteristics

Six feet, three inches tall, with dark brown hair and smiling brown

eyes, Melton is boyish, friendly, informal and likeable. He finds enjoyment in hunting, cooking, collecting pewter and antique glass and taking children for long drives in his fabulous jalopies.

While the Meltons were in Hollywood this summer, they occupied ZaSu Pitts' home. In exchange, Miss Pitts was given the use of one of the Melton flivvers in New York. The Pitts house is located in Brentwood, next door to Shirley Temple's, so the famed young film actress was one of Jimmy's frequent jalopy passengers while they were neighbors.

Melton is married to writer Marjorie McClure. Their home is a lovely old Connecticut farmhouse, and it is there that he keeps most of his cars, housed in stables on the grounds.

He has only one sad confession to make concerning his beloved flivvers. Last year, he entered his pride and joy, a 1900 Hansom, in a charity race against a horse and buggy. "Yes," admitted Jimmy sadly, "the horse won!"

Life of the Party

Newscaster Glenn Hardy Is Not Always As Serious As He Sounds; Off the Air He Does Card Tricks and Practical Jokes



Daily, 10:00 a.m., 5:00 p.m. Matual—KHJ

WICE DAILY, news-hungry radio-dialers receive crisp, concise reports of the day's world events by tuning in to Mutual's Alka Seltzer newscaster, Glenn Hardy. He has been bringing airlane audiences the news for over ten years. Listening to him, one visualizes the reporter as a serious-minded, somber-faced person of quiet dignity.

"Not always!" smiled Mrs. Glenn Hardy, when we asked her for some intimate lowdown on her husband. "He's full of the devil, too!

"He likes to play practical jokes,"

she went on. "He had a tiny replica of a black beetle around the house for a while, and was always scaring me with it. He'd leave it lying around on the bed sheet or tablecloth, and sometimes. I sat on it."

She told us that Glenn likes to tour Hollywood's joke shops in search of new novelties. He is an amateur prestidigitator and has a repertoire of coin and card tricks.

"He's not nearly as serious as he may seem to be," Mrs. Hardy said again. "In fact, he's pretty much the life of the party!"

Before he became a radio reporter, Hardy was an aspiring young actor. After playing roles in amateur

theatrical productions, including Pasadena Playhouse dramas, he entered the broadcasting field with the hope of furthering his acting ambitions.

Started at KMTR

He worked at KMTR, first as a mail handler and switchboard operator, then eventually advanced to the position of the station's chief announcer. His early experience on the airlanes was wide and varied, but listeners will best remember him as the friendly emcee of KNX'S "Crocker Family" and "Hollywood Barn Dance" programs.

"The people I worked with on those shows were simply wonderful," Glenn told us with enthusiasm, as he reminisced about his early air career. "I've always had a great liking and respect for radio's socalled 'hillbillies.' They're real folks and fine artists."

In time, during his daily stints on radio row, Glenn had occasion to do some news broadcasting. As an actor, he found it a thrilling assignment. He was attracted to the drama in the news and the tense thrill of radio reporting. In 1934, when Alka-Seltzer began its series of sponsored newscasts, Glenn Hardy was selected as the mikeman to deliver them. He has been newscasting for the same sponsor ever since!

His Delivery

Hardy endeavors to be not overly dramatic in his news delivery, but at the same time, to avoid any monotony of tone. "I try to put just the right amount of feeling into the words," he explained.

He reads over his material preparatory to bringing it to his listeners, and explains that every dispatch coming over the wire is rewritten by the news editor of the Alka-Seltzer newscast shows, Bud

The client, we were told, will foot the bill, which will run into big money (\$1,000:1,500) when the origination of the program is in the east. The first show, we understand, will emanate from Toronto.

We were taken aback and somewhat chagrinned (for his sake) since we had always regarded him as a big guy. This seemed to be a rather "small-potatoes" attitude for a big guy-or can it be he fancies himself so big he's taken on a dictator complex, like Adolf?

ANYWAY, OF ALL contests ever conducted in Los Angeles, this is one of the fairest. WE HAVE NO FAVOR-ITES. We have a staff of three, carefully sifting the piles of cards and letters that come in. Most frequently noted on the applications of the others was: "good voice; needs coaching." In other words, from the producers' standpoint, the talent outlook is splendid. But from the amateurs' position, competition is terrific and the oft-repeated "Not this week" of Director Harkins might very probably discourage the less determined.

Contestants should keep in mind, however, that the "this" in Harkins' dismissal contains more hope than they might think. At each try-out he is searching for one or two specific voices for as many parts in (Please turn to Page 24)

Rutherford. "I like to think of our program as a three-legged stool," Glenn said. "If it lost one of its legs, it would be unable to fulfill its purpose." The three "legs" to which he referred are the program's news editor, Rutherford; its announcer, Fred Shields; and its reporter, Hardy.

Glenn admits to abiding by two idiosyncracies during his appearanc-es at the microphone, but he gives good reasons for them both. He always wears his hat while broadcasting, because it shades his eyes and acts as a "sounding board" for his voice. He always sits with his back to the control booth, in his desire to forget that he is in a radio studio. He likes the feeling of telling the news to his listeners in their own living rooms.

He confesses to experiencing frequent, extreme nervousness at the microphone, particularly when aware of the presence of a stranger in the studio. "I become panic-stricken," Hardy admitted to us, "if somebody I don't know walks in to watch me broadcast."

Most Embarrassing Moment

His most awkward moment at the mike was the time he absent-mindedly started reading his sign-off news story after Fred Shields had delivered a commercial. Actually, the program was only half over!

Glenn has made his job his hobby, and spends the greatest portion of his free time on activities directof his free time on activities direct-ly pertaining to his work. He re-ceives a large number of letters weekly, and answers all of his mail personally. He enjoys reading, and names "Berlin Diary" and "Argen-tine Diary" among the best and most important books of this war. He is an avid student of voice, delivery, pronunciation, world events and people.

When he is in the mood for relaxation, however, he is most likely to be found, dressed in old coveralls, painting the back fence.

Both he and his wife name fish-ing as their favorite sport, and Glenn confesses to a passion for playing poker. "I'm no gambler, however," he added.

Pride and joy of the Hardy house-hold is twenty months-old Jimmy, whose smile and personality indi-cate that he will be as much the life of the party as his father.

Glenn's "missus" tells us that her handsome dark haired husband is a handy man around the house, qual-ifying as an expert "Mr. Fixit".

Who Wants to be An Actor?

Almost Everybody! But Until NBC's New "Opportunity Theater," Amateurs Had Little Chance at the Microphone

NDLESS LINES of amateurs, starry-eyed and shaky-limbed, have been circling in and out of broadcasting studios for years—since that day back in radio's moppet stage when somebody dreamed up audience participation shows.

But until the recent advent of "Opportunity Theater" there was little place in those lines for wouldbe actors. Whistlers, yodelers and animal imitators yes; actors (which probably half of your friends want to be), no.

"Opportunity Theater," heard Saturdays over KFI and the Pacific, Coast NBC network, has licked the production problems involved in presenting amateur thespians to a radio audience. What's more, actors who make good are given a three-month membership in the American Federation of Radio Artists and a professional engagement, complete with union salary.

Un-professional actors of both San Francisco and Los Angeles are "in" on the chance—are competitive, in fact, though San Francisco has the outset advantage of numbers. One San Franciscan takes part in each of the three Saturday shows originating at KPO, while Southern Californians get a crack at the one show a month broadcast in Hollywood. Out of the four monthly participants, the board of judges names one Northern Californian to receive an expense-free trip, to Hollywood and a professional appearance on the program in which will also be cast the Los Angeles winner. If the latter is the following month's grand winner, he gets a professional engagement, plus a \$50 war bond in lieu of a trip.

Have Rehearsal

Unlike Haven McQuarrie's late "Do You Want To Be an Actor?", this program does not put its amateurs on the air "cold." Winners of twice-weekly tryouts take home scripts for over-night study and are given two thorough rehearsals before program time. And, of course, they are cast opposite top NBC arfists, headed by "Opportunity The-

In years of programming and writing for NBC, Mutual, CBS and for Warner Bros., Harkins has a u ditioned and worked with thousands of amateurs. ater's" regular star, versatile Archie Presby.

And how do these professional showmen treat the quaking ama-teur? Listen to what Athene An-drews, "Opportunity Theater's" first winner, told us:

"I had studied my script practic-ally all night and when I walked in for the first rehearsal I was all business — very serious about the whole thing and particularly ser-ious about myself. I saw Mr. Pres-by, Monty Margetts and the others and suddenly an awful thought made me go all weak and shaky: 'They're all professionals and I'm just an amateur'.

"Then somebody said: 'Hello, there. Congratulations!' and started to introduce me. Archie broke out with his famous giggle and began (Please Turn to Page 28)

Melt butter over low heat, add flour and stir to smooth paste. Add seasonings and milk, cook--stirring--until sauce is thick and smooth. Add cheese, stir until melted and cool. Beat egg yolks, until thick and light colored, and fold into cheese sauce. Fold in stiff-beaten egg whites. Pour into ungreased casserole, set in pan of hot water and bake in a slow oven (325) about 45 minutes or until top is firm to the touch and nicely browned. Serve at once. HERE'S A JAP pillbox on an island somewhere in the Pacific that bears a sign reading, "Gloria Blondell's Pacific Paradise". The enemy pillbox has been playfully dubbed with that name by the gallant Seabees who captured it. Gloria Blondell is their favorite pin-up girl.

Younger sister of the movies' Joan, Gloria has gained prominence via Broadway and radio—appearing on the former in "She Loves Me Not", "Three Men On A Horse", "Dead End" and "Iton Man", and currently on the latter as "Dovie" of "Lady of the Press", "Adhesive Plaster" of "Mayor of the Town", and as the feminine lead of the new CBS series entitled "Hollywood Mystery Time". Several years ago, she attempted a film career, but emerged on the screen looking too much like sister Joan. Besides acting, Gloria has one other predominant interest in the realm of cre. tive arts. She paints in oils, and earnestly pursues the study under the tutelage of artist Paul Clemens.

Currently, she is at work on a portrait of her father, the late Edward Blondell. The completed painting will be a gift for Joan.

Gloria's own most prized possession is her cat, which she calls "Bags" because he has big circles beneath his eyes. "He takes bubble baths with me," she laughed. "He dives from my head into the tub."

Gloria lives in an apartment in Beverly Hills. She is married, and has been for four years, to Alberto Romelo Broccoli, of the famous Italian family which began the broccoli industry in the United States. He is in the special service division of the Navy.

Has Trouble

"They'd always insist that my hair would stick up straight if they did as I told them—and refused to mind my orders. Even after I explained why I wanted it that way they wouldn't believe," he told us, as reason why he's his own barber.

Kay Kyser plays straight man to Ish's antics—giving Ish the highest paid straight man in the business. "Here's a riddle. Give Up?" asks Ish. "But you haven't TOLD me the riddle yet," groans Kyser, in a typical routine.

Comedy isn't the only thing Ish takes seriously. His hobbies — the little time he has for them these days—he pursues with an eye to the future. He has a record of the war highlights on wax that may prove a gold mine to some historian of the future. Major speeches of Churchill, Roosevelt, and other world figures, plus newscasters' and commentators' broadcasts on Pearl Harbor day, Dday, and other important events are all preserved for posterity in his home recorded disc collection.

Several years ago his three youngsters became interested in making model ships. Ish offered to lend them a hand, became so interested in models that he started his own miniature collection of jeeps, landing craft and other wartime mechanized equipment. Now he has dozens of such delicately perfect dup-

licates of the originals that he won't let the kids touch them—and it was their idea in the first place!

Home Movies

Home movies are another of the hobbies Ish Kabibble has very little time for these days. In between radio appearances and camp shows he still manages to sandwich an occasional production on 16 millimeter film. His specialty is comedy—he makes up his own plots, drafts family, friends and neighbors for his cast, then cuts and edits the film. "Splitsecond timing is the secret of comedy," he told us, "I try to cut the film so that the timing of gags and funny sequences is just right."

Like father, like son, the saying goes. It looks as if Ish's eldest is destined to be a comic, too. When young Peter started to school Mr. and Mrs. Bogue joined the Parent-Teachers' Association. At the first meeting of the P-TA they met Peter's teacher, and were rather taken aback when she asked if they wouldn't plaster Peter's hair down so that he couldn't comb it forward into bangs. "He tells little poems with his hair combed down over his eyes and the class won't do their lessons," she explained distractedly, admitting her inability to compete with such hilarious antics. It seems that Peter, unbeknown to both his parents, had been listening to the "College of Musical Knowledge" every Wednesday night and memorizing all Ish's poems.

The two youngest children's hair just naturally grows in bangs—which leads one to believe maybe Ish's barbershop quartet may be a dream come true one of these days. The words, if not the music part of it, anyway. The four of them—Ish and the three kids—look alike, and so far, two of them do lfttle poems in a dead-pan way.

Ish is prepared to take one more step in the direction of the barber shop. What with the war and all, there's a shear shortage, he understands. So if he's ever caught with his hair long and without scissors he'll just pop his silken black tresses in the ice box, freeze them, then break off his bangs at raised-eyebrow level.

plays already purchased for use. In Miss Andrews' case, for instance, she was stopped almost before she began to read the try-out scene. So short was she stopped, she confessed, that she was sure she was through. But by the few lines she read, Harkins recognized hers as "the" volce—not for the part she was reading but for another he had in mind.

Sample Applicants

A very small percentage of auditionees have had professional experience. In this group was Tony Pawley who, along with amateur Lee Stone, was given a part in "Opportunity Theater's" second opus. Instantly recognizing Pawley's work as professional, Director Harkins welcomed the opportunity to use him. Pawley is the brother of screen "heavy" William and radio actor Ed and is a screen, stage and radio actor in his own right.

In contrast, Stone, a former salesman, is now an instructor in burning in Mr. Kaiser's Richmond shipyards. (If you heard the broadcast you know Stone seemed as familiar in his dramatic role as In his burner's outfit.)

And so, if you want to take a whirl at becoming a professional actor, you may have more ability than you think—as the following anecdote illustrates. After she had auditioned, one woman confessed she hadn't had the slightest intention of trying out. She had come to the studio for the Radio Institute. But, handed an application and script, what else could she do?

What she probably still doesn't know is this: On her application, carefully filed away, is this comment: "Very unusual voice; good reading; future use."

E'S A frustrated barber, you might say. 'Way back in 1933, Merwin Bogue bought a book of old barber shop quartet favorites, v in t a ge 1890, which he wished to

sing before the public. But being a frumpeter and there not being three fellow musicians in Kay Kyser's band who wished to form a barber shop quartet, when he did get his big chance to sing it was alone and not in a song of his own choice, "Put Away the Moustache Cup For Father Is An Angel," but a song then popularly known as "Love, Nuts and Noodles." He shook with fright, the audience went into convulsions, and a clown was born.

Thus began the comic career of Ish Kabibble, star pupil (when he isn't warming his seat in the dunce's corner) on Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge."

Merwin Bogue, alias Ish Kabibble, evokes more laughter by doing less than any other comedian in the business. He just stands quietly, his black bangs neatly combed over his forehead, giving him a slightly flatheaded appearance, and soberly recites little poems. Example:

There was a young man from Perth

Who was born on the day of his birth

He was married they say

On his wife's wedding day

And he died on his last day on earth.

How Name Started

Merwin Bogue was dubbed Ish Kabibble when his rendition of an old barber shop favorite of the same name became so popular with Kyser band fans that he was requested to sing nothing but "Ish Kabibble" for five years. So Ish he became to the general public and Ish he has been ever since.

He looks and acts like an animated tin-type, but not too animated to shatter the illusion. He got the idea for the type of character he portrays from grim-faced, stiff-stanced por-

traits of his ancestors in an old family album.

Ish takes his comedy-making very seriously, claims it doesn't "just come" to him, and that he has "to sit down and figure it out." His ability to stay in character at all times is a result of long study and practice. But when he stands on the bandstand and produces hysterics in the audience without moving a muscle, the practice pays off. Or when he launches into a little ditty such as the following:

I sneezed a sneeze into the air

It fell to earth I knew not where But you should have seen the looks of those

In whose vicinity I snoze.

With Kay Kyser's band Ish Kabibble has toured over 500 army camps, done over 1900 performances for servicemen since February, 1941, and has helped sell \$400,000,000 worth of bonds—in cash, not promises. To G.I.s he is known as "the man with the G.I. haircut—in reverse.

His Characteristics

Ish is six feet tall, slim, has black hair which is ordinarily combed back just like anybody else's, and brown eyes. He looks more like a serious-minded young engineer or scientist than a comedian. He's 36, is married to his boyhood sweetheart, and they have three children —Peter, who is 8, Pamela, 5 years old, and Janet, the baby, who is 3. Merwin Alton Bogue was born in a little town called North East, Pennsylvania, but he isn't very nostalgic about the place since his folks moved to Erie when he was three and he grew up in the city by the lake. Erie neighbors of the Bogue family do not recall being thrown into fits of laughter by the antics of little Merwin. If they recall him at all it is rather as a thoughtful youngster with a fondness for carrying live frogs around in his pockets. He had trouble keeping his hair out of his eyes in his early days and tried soap, library paste, and the whites of eggs, with various results—these were but little incidents in a normal childhood.

He learned to play the trumpet when in high school, and when those years were finished, left for the University of West Virginia with his horn under his arm. He became a member of the campus orchestra and worked out a comedy routine with three other boys to form a quartet. Kay Kyser heard of the outstanding young trumpeter at the U. of W. Va. and persuaded Ish-to-be to skip his last year of college and finish his last year of college of Musical Knowledge." Ish did—he's been postgraduating ever since.

His Hair-Cut

Ish Kabibble's famous haircut is a result of evolution. He used to do a tin type pose, legs crossed stiffly, (Please turn to Page 34)
