HE DAY Radio Life chatted with General Junius Pierce, Germany had just begun her counter-offensive. But like a true soldier, Pierce

didn't view the situation too darkly. Instead, he pointed out one theory that General Eisenhower might want to fight the decisive battle on the west side of the Rhine, rather than become involved in the palisade country to the east. Supporting this theory, Pierce drew attention to the fact that Eisenhower had not ordered the bridges over the Rhine destroyed. Thus, it might be, that the wily leader planned to draw the Germans back across the Rhine (in hopes of re-taking the port of Antwerp and thus crippling the supply lines) and then close in or them for a show-down.

"The Army," observed Pierce, "is like drinking. After you've been in a war, you swear off and say 'Never again.' Having been in the service since 1908 and in Europe from 1917 to 1920, I thought I'd come to California and grow oranges. But in 1940, when I was asked to organize a company of the California State Guard, it was like a whiff of a dry Martini. There I was, 'drinking' again!"

In Redlands, General Pierce helped organize a State Guard that expanded to a regiment reaching from San Bernardino to Blythe. When Pearl Harbor Day came, Governor Olson asked him to serve as Brigadier-General of the California National Guard, subsequently made him State Adjutant-General.

"The sun was still shining on December 7, 1941, when the State Guard members took up their posts at vital positions like the San Francisco bridges," he remarked in praising the efficiency of his men.

Introduced to Radio

It was while he was recruiting

members for the State Guard that General Pierce was introduced to radio. He liked it and with his technical background it was not surprising that he ended up a few months ago as a war news commentator. A seasoned Army man who has seen service on the Mexican border (1910-1912), along the Coast defenses of California, in the Philippines, China, Japan, France, England, Germany, Belgium, and who served as a member of the U. S. Liquidation Commission following World War I, Pierce takes a practical viewpoint of the news that almost seems to the uninitiated to be pessimistic.

Furrowing his black, bushy eyebrows and narrowing his blue-gray eyes, Pierce said: "Germany is not licked. She's stopped us wherever she's wanted to stop us. We must distinguish between a retreat that is forced and a retreat that they want to make." Germany, observed the General, is now fighting a defensive war, waiting for a break in the Allies of which she'll take advantage. Then pointing up his remark, he said, "I wouldn't mind being in a ring with Joe Louis if he was always running away."

Some people, thinks General Pierce, believe that because the same scenes of 1917-1918 are being re-enacted, we will arrive at the same conclusionsin other words, this war will fold up quickly like the last.

Scratching his white, clipped mustache, Pierce continued his remarks: "We can't base our present assumptions on the previous war. Then, the German General Staff which was in command, was a perpetuating body and as such. it was to its best (Please lurn to Page 31)

member of NBC, he broadened his airlane activities to include the announcing chores on Andy Devine's "Melody Roundup" program, which led to his present varied mike assignments.

In spite of his heavy schedule, Doyle always manages to be on time for his stints at the microphone. But one morning, when he was still doing the Devine show, he overslept, awakening at 7:30 a. m., the hour for the start of the program's rehearsal. There's not much use," Pierce emphasized, "to cease what you're doing if the alternative is worse."

Japanese View

As far as the Japanese war is concerned, Pierce expressed the belief that the Philippines could have been circumvented, and that it might have been better instead to have made straightaway for the China coast. "In my opinion," he said. "the ultimate defeat of Japan is going to be sealed on the battlefields of China and Manchuria. From a military standpoint, Germany was defeated the day she started to invade Russia. But we carr still lose this war," he warned as his weather-beaten face clouded.
