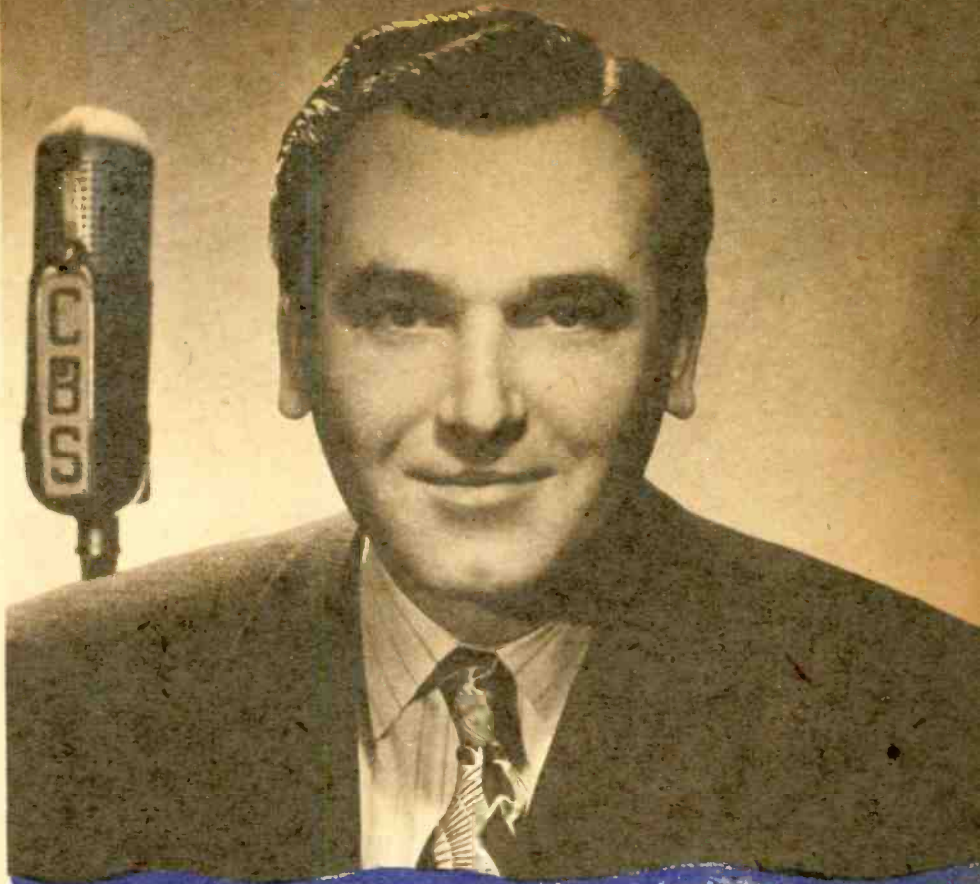

His new lease on life gives him time to enjoy gardening, cooking, and putting into practice his important rehabilitation work.

Once a week you'll find Carlton as announcer on the Jack Carson show. But the rest of the week you're lucky if you find him at all. For Mr. KaDell finds to his amazement that at present he is as busy if not busier than he used to be averaging a show a day.

The handsome bachelor not only decorated his four-room cottage in North Hollywood, but is his own chef and bottlewasher. "I enjoy cooking now and then and I'm rather good at it too," he laughed. "My specialty is chicken cacciatore — but don't ask me how to spell it."

His home is filled with books, records, and penguins. The books might be any kind because he enjoys all types of literature. The records usually are classical. And the penguins — there are one-hundred-and-seventy-five of them — include twenty-five cent birds graduating from dime store trinkets to solid ivory birds of much larger proportions. This odd hobby began simply because he liked penguins.

Shirley Ross Taught Piano When She Was Thirteen, Now Caters to One at Home; Admits She Is Not An Interior Decorator's Dream

YOU KNOW, of course," smiled Shirley Ross, "there's only one thing a woman with children wants to talk about—her children."

Her svelte figure glamorously garbed in a black gown that provided a striking setting for the long blonde bob that fell loosely about her shoulders, the songstress settled herself comfortably in a corner of her NBC dressing room and spent the better part of the half-hour preceding the early airing of the Bob Burns show talking about her two lively young sons — four-year-old Johnny, who looks like his mother, and two-year-old Ross, who looks like his father, agent Ken Dolan.

"Both of the children have colds now," Shirley lamented, "and so have I. When one of us gets something, we all get it."

The four Dolans, and a nurse who

cares for the children, live in a spacious, ten-room house in Beverly Hills. "We had a cook," Miss Ross said wistfully, "but she and the nurse weren't compatible. They're both lovely people, but not when they're together, so we had to bid one of them goodbye. Now," Shirley smiled grimly, "we eat out."

"Whenever we do stay home," she went on, "I do the cooking. My cooking," she added, "is just so-so. I never had the time to learn to cook during my childhood, because I was always practicing the piano."

Taught at 13

Shirley Ross is an accomplished pianist. She taught piano at the age of thirteen (when most of her pupils were older than she was) and continued to teach for the five years following. Today, her most prized possession is a Beckstein piano. It's insured to the last string," she assured us, adding, "The only thing I hated to see blown up in Germany was the Beckstein factory."

SHIRLEY INTERRUPTED her college course to join Gus Arnheim's orchestra. Movies signed her, and moviegoers still remember her singing of "Thanks for the Memory" with Bob Hope in "Big Broadcast of 1937."

"My piano," she went on in a lighter vein, "takes up practically our whole living room. The living room is large, but so is the piano—nine feet long! I've decorated the room around it!"

In the first place, the only place for the piano was a space right beside the radiator. When the piano-tuner discovered this, he shrieked in horror. "You most certainly don't ever have this radiator turned on, I hope!" he exclaimed in frantic dismay. When he departed, he put a sign on the heater saying, in big, emphatic letters, "Do Not Open This Radiator!"

"We haven't had heat in the living room since," laughed Shirley.

The Dolans purchased their Beverly Hills home three years ago. Shirley has done most of her own decorating, with no special period predominating.

"It may not be good," she said, "but I loved doing it. When we bought the place, it had a lot of arches," she explained, "so the first thing I did was to have them all squared. I hate arches."

Now and then, she would get worried and call in a professional decorator, but he wouldn't stay long. "I'm afraid I'm not the decorator's dream," she confessed. "I always have to have my nose in everything."

Her ambition is to buy an old house and completely re-do it.

When not performing on the air-planes or entertaining servicemen (she performs regularly at the Hollywood Canteen), Shirley spends most of her time caring for her large

Let Us Be Grave!

Radio's Gloomiest Character Has Fun Accent-chu-ating Negative, Losing Friends, Alienating People

THERE'S A FELLOW in radio who's making quite a name for himself by "accent-chu-ating the negative and eliminating the positive." He says you've "got to spread gloom up to the maximum"—and means it. He has somber blue eyes, wears drab blacks, and thinks "Arsenic and Old Lace" with its two bloodthirsty spinsters was "awfully gay."

Weekly, radio's gloomiest man spreads his Sabbath "cheer" to millions—and they love him. "Digger," the morbid mortician of Blue's "Life of Riley," is motivated by other people's misfortunes. Usually they're last ones. His favorite greeting is, "Don't bother to get up. Just lie there. You look so fine—very natural."—or—"Why walk around half dead, when I can bury you for \$40."

The story behind "Digger" began a good many years ago when actor John Brown was a lad of seventeen. John, newly-arrived from Australia, wanted a job. A New York agency

sent him to an unknown address and before he knew it, he had been hired as secretary. The wool had been pulled over his eyes because not only did he sign a contract binding him to the same salary for a year, but he had become confidential secretary to the town's leading undertaker. And the sight of a dead body made him sick!

Poor John stuck it out for the year. Every day he'd comfort himself by thinking that some day he'd get even. He didn't know how, but he would! In 1944 his chance for revenge came. Into the script of "Riley" had been written a small part for an undertaker. Ah, thought John, this will be fun. The payoff came when Brown's satirization was an overnight success. Thousands of fan letters poured in asking who was the mortician. And "Digger" was born, not only becoming one of John's most popular characterizations but his favorite!

Goes Dramatic, Too!

English-born John got his start in radio by satirizing. He recently told

Radio Life over the luncheon table that all of his characters are done with tongue in cheek. He likes to use himself as model, such as the laughable "Father Foster" on "Date With Judy." But he doesn't confine all of his radio acting to comedy. Some of the twenty-five shows a week he used to do in New York were deadly serious. Such as the one on which he was heard as the villain who died, the policeman who killed him, and the judge who heard the policeman's story — all in fifteen minutes.

His first air job was with Eddie Cantor. An excited John appeared at the rehearsal. He was handed his script. It said: Brown—Cackle like a chicken. "Me?" said John, pointing to the spot. "Uh huh," they nodded. "Huh uh," answered John, putting on his hat and leaving.

But the very next week he won an audition for Fred Allen and was signed to a ten-year contract. It was then Charlie Cantor, Harry Von Zell, and he were known as the "Sad Macks"—probably not too distantly related to Sad Sack.

To California

When Fred Allen left the airlines, Brown joined Jack Benny's group and in 1943 came to California. Today he does innumerable shows, including "Duffy's Tavern," "The Saint," the Charlotte Greenwood, Jack Carson and Bob Burns programs.

The Fred Allen influence still plays a prominent part in his life, for his old cronies, Charlie Cantor and Harry von Zell, live several houses down from John on a street they've dubbed "Allen's Alley."

Away from the mike, Mr. Brown's prime interest is his family, wife

He Traded One Hundred Lives for One

JEAN HERSHOLT likes to tell this story on himself. During one of his recent stays in New York City, he was walking down Broadway with a friend one day, rounding a corner, accidentally bumped into a sailor.

"Pardon me," said Mr. Hersholt.

"That's okay, bud," said the sailor, a bit cockily.

Mr. Hersholt's companion smiled and made an attempt at an introduction. "You know 'Dr. Christian,' don't you?" he said to the sailor.

"Sure," acceded the sailor, "he's that old jerk my grandmother goes for!"

That sailor might not know it, but his grandmother isn't the only one who "goes for" the good doctor. Millions of people of all ages, throughout the nation, share her affection for "Paul Christian," the gentle-hearted country doctor characterization which Jean Hersholt created eight years ago, as a result of his original screen portrayal of Doctor

Dafoe, physician to the Dionne Quintuplets. Three years ago, Hersholt restricted his screen and radio portrayals exclusively to the "Christian" characterization. (The only departures have been his appearances in Lux Radio Theater's recent revival of "Seventh Heaven," a special Screen Guild airing, and shows in the interest of the war effort.)

In so restricting his acting activities, Jean Hersholt brought to an end an impressive parade of diverse portrayals that won for him in his thirty-nine years of movie-making undisputed renown as one of filmland's most accomplished character actors.

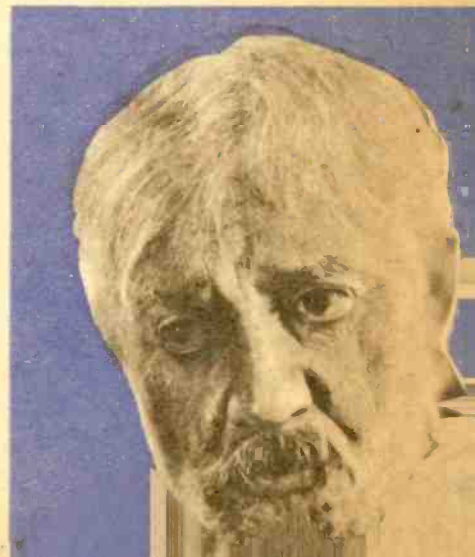
Long-time moviegoers will remember him vividly as he appeared with Rudolph Valentino in "The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse" in 1920, with Constance Talmadge in "The Gold Fish" in 1921, with Norma Shearer in "The Student Prince" in 1927, with Greta Garbo in "Susan Lennox" in 1930, with Marie Dressler in "Emma" in 1931, and with Ann Harding in "The Fountain" in 1934. Screen audiences saw him behind the masks of a hundred different

faces, ranging in type from the sleek-haired, snake-eyed gambler in "Stella Dallas" to the gentle-faced, white-whiskered old grandfather in "Heidi."

In 1916 and 1917, when he was under contract to Universal Studios, Hersholt shared a dressing room with Lon Chaney, and both of them

The songstress can cook, and does. Her pet culinary creation is a delicious dessert concocted of angel food cake, jello, whipped cream and maraschino cherries. "It's wonderful," she said happily, "and so-o-o fat-tening!"

Fond of Clothes

Nora loves to shop, names blue as her favorite color, with fuschia second choice. She is forever sewing sequins and beads on her clothes to add sparkle to otherwise plain ensembles. At home, she lounges around in slacks. She is crazy about hats, buys them often but usually wears them only once, then leaves them in the closet. She doesn't like to arrange the fussy hairdos they require. She likes to wear her hair in a long, loose bob.

RECORD BREAKER

STUART HAMBLEN has been breaking records ever since he started in radio twenty years ago. But there's one unbroken record, related in our story, which he still has his eye on.

AROUND A RADIO station a record breaker is one of two things—either a clumsy oaf who's not to be trusted with studio property—or the sponsor's delight—depending on the kind of records he breaks.

Stuart Hamblen has been breaking records ever since he started in radio, which he will tell you was "quite some time ago." In fact, that's one of his records—the length of time he has been on the air. He started in Texas 20 years ago, at the age of fifteen, and since then has had more than 35,000 hours of actual broadcast time. Moreover, and here's the one you can't top—

every minute of that time has been strictly ad lib!

If script writers had to depend on Hamblen programs for a living, they would starve to death, for no one on his program ever looks at a script. Hamblen himself is the ad lib artist supreme. From his father, a Methodist minister in Abilene, he inherited the gift of gab, and it has stood him in good stead.

For the one hour and fifteen minutes of his program . . . something of a record in itself, since average radio time is thirty minutes. Hamblen ad'libs the musical continuity, commercials, and everything else, including often a ten-minute dramatized story, in which he takes all the parts.

Is Story Teller

Telling a story interestingly, without script or notes, is an art given to only a few. Stuart Hamblen is one of the few. His clever little wife, Suzy Belle, who with her two small daughters also takes part in Stuart's programs, recognized the worth of this talent and recorded many of her husband's stories as he told them on the air. Later she transcribed them and published them in book form.

Suzy Hamblen is so obviously the ideal mate for her talented, soft-spoken cowboy husband, one immediately becomes curious to know how they met. Their first meeting, strangely enough, was in a Hollywood radio station, though they are from the same part of the country,

and it was their mutual love of dogs and the outdoor life that brought them together.

"She wouldn't go with me at first," Stuart complains. "I spent a lot of money on theater tickets, but she wouldn't go with me until she saw my coon hound!"

"That's right," Suzy agrees. "I was secretary to the manager at KMTR when Stuart was there, and he kept asking me to go out with him. I didn't especially like him, but I sure fell for his hound! He brought the dog to the studio one day and said he was going coon hunting that night and asked if I would like to go along. He told me that all the boys on the program went, too, and took their wives, so I said I'd go."

"I had a wonderful time, and I guess that clinched the deal for Stuart and me, but I found out later none of the boys had ever gone coon hunting with him before. He ordered them to go, on my account, and they were pretty sore about it."

Have Ranch

The Hamblens have a ranch out in San Fernando Valley now, where they raise race horses and hound dogs. Stuart's pack of hounds is reputedly the best in the state for big game, having bagged more than ninety bears, and a considerable number of mountain lions—another record.

The Hamblens' recreation consists mostly of hunting and camping trips, when they can find the time.

*Veteran of 35,000 Hours of Broadcasting,
Stuart Hamblen Has Shattered Precedent
But Still Has Eye on Unconquered Field*

Night clubs hold no appeal for them. A show or play occasionally is the extent of their night life.

Stuart often finds on camping trips that his fame has preceded him to out-of-the-way places. Once, on a trip to the Oregon woods, the natives found out who he was, and nearly a hundred of them came out to the camp, bringing all sorts of refreshments and musical instruments for an impromptu party.

On another occasion, Stuart and Suzy went into New Mexico to round up wild horses and the owner of the local store kept insisting he ought to know Stuart, because his voice was familiar. When he learned Stuart was on the radio, he immediately exclaimed: "I know — you're King Cowboy"—Stuart's air name at the time on KNX.

Same Sponsors

Hamblén has worked on every one of the stations in Los Angeles since he started 16 years ago at KFI. And throughout all those years, he has kept the same sponsors . . . Star Outfitting Company and Podolor Motor Company. Not many radio stars can make the same claim.

In 16 years, he has been on the air an average of three hours a day, except Sundays. He now has a Sunday program over KFWB from 4:45 to 6 p. m.

Of the boys in his orchestra, several, including "Herman the Hermit," picturesque character actor, have been with him for 16 years. Some of them are now in the army, but they are still part of the gang, and will be back when their jobs

with Uncle Sam is completed. All of them are excellent musicians, who can improvise in any key . . . for the music on Stuart's program is ad libbed just like everything else. Rehearsals are unknown.

Another record of which Hamblén is very proud, is his perfect score in locating lost children and dogs. He often broadcasts descriptions of children who have run away from home or dogs that have been lost or strayed, and has never failed to locate them. He almost failed on his own pup, though. It was several weeks before a woman finally called in and announced she had found his dog.

Stuart has probably also set some kind of record for having his family on the air. His two daughters, Suzanne, 8, and Obee Jane, 6, have been constant program participants. Suzanne sings and plays the piano, while Obee Jane, who apparently takes after her father, "talks chiefly," but sings, too. Mrs. Hamblén accompanies the girls on the piano, also sings.

THE HAMBLÉNS love to hunt, also raise race horses and hound dogs. Hamblén claims a bagging of ninety bears for his hound pack.

Stuart, himself, plays the guitar, although he has almost given it up because of having so much else to do. He still plays at the Saturday night dances they give at the VFW hall in South Gate, however, and he writes songs consistently. Most of his original tunes are published in a song book, and his latest, "They're Gonna Kill Ya," has been adopted as an official song by the Marines.

Outside of the studio, Stuart spends most of his time with his horses. He keeps only one saddle horse now—his show animal, "Nat-chee." Twenty-three others are bred for racing, with Hamblén the proud owner of a race horse trainer's license. He had two winners out of the first five starts at the last season's Hollywood Park.

But all of Hamblén's records pale into insignificance beside the one he has his eye on.

He wants to own a Kentucky Derby winner!

The Man Behind The Music

A FEW MONTHS AGO, during a "Thanks to the Yanks" broadcast, Bob Hawk was quizzing war veterans at the Halloran General Hospital in New York. The soldiers who supplied the right answers were kissed by a pretty Hollywood starlet. As the quiz progressed, Hawk asked this question: "What is the name of the theme song on 'One Man's Family,' and who is the organist who plays it?"

A young soldier's face lit up. "The theme is 'Patricia,'" he answered happily, "and it's played by Paul Carson."

"Good for you," beamed quizmaster Hawk. "Who is he—your cousin?"

"No," smiled the soldier, "He's my dad!"

Recounting this incident to his father later, young Bill Carson grinned. "I got a swell kiss from a beautiful girl because I knew the right answers, Dad."


Paul Carson laughed as he related this story to your Radio Life reporter in our office one recent afternoon. His blue eyes smiled merrily and a broad grin spread across his face as he went on to tell us more about his son.

Carson, weaver of magic organ melodies on the Blue's "Bridge to Dreamland" late each Sunday evening, has four prime interests in life—his home and his family, his music and his treasured collection of early American glassware.

Stately Home

The former is a beautiful house built of English brick and situated among the hills overlooking Hollywood. Guests are enraptured by the spacious regal splendor of its living room, which is forty feet in length, and they are delighted to find such evidence of their host's musical prowess as the two Mason & Hamlin pianos and the mellow-toned pipe organ which the organist has had installed in the big, lavishly furn-

ished house. Its rooms are enhanced by the presence of rare antiques that Mr. Carson has garnered from every corner of the country.

"Some day," he prophesied happily, "I'm going to have an antique shop of my own." After the war, he hopes to tour the New England states in search of more pieces to add to his already-impressive assortment of antique glassware.

A middle-aged man of medium height, light-complexioned, with wavy gray hair, Paul Carson is one of the pioneers of radio, having started his career in the early days of Station KFRC, San Francisco. He has been the organist on "One Man's Family" since its initial chapters which emanated from the Bay City; his "Bridge to Dreamland" has been aired for some fifteen years, and he is again presiding at the console for Commander Scott on the latter's "Romance of the Highways," series, hav-

ing originally appeared with Scott in San Francisco.

When the organ was installed in Hollywood's swank NBC building, Paul Carson was called upon to supervise the task.

His Family

Carson is married; his wife, Jean, writes the verse heard on the organist's Sunday night program. They have one son, the aforementioned World War II veteran, Bill. He is twenty years old, has been in the Army two years and served in the bitter fighting on the western European front. At this writing, he is home on a 27-day leave.

"He hates every place in the world except California," said his father. "He's so happy to be home."

Like every other Carson, both Paul and his son answer to the nickname of "Kit." Paul names golf as his

became deeply interested in the difficult art of deftly applying movie makeup. They conducted revolutionary experiments together, and both acquired an unequalled skill that eventually brought them to the screen in weird, distorted disguises. Hersholt, now familiar to millions as a round-faced, smiling-eyed man of gentle appearance, once paced across the screen as brusque-mannered villains and stark-raving idiots.

Today, however, he has so completely identified himself with the single role of "Dr. Christian" (as he is heard weekly over CBS) that he regularly receives letters from members of his vast listening audience requesting him to furnish them with disease cures and medical advice.

Frequently, people approach him personally and ask that he "have a look at my throat, doctor," or "could you tell me what this pain in my chest might mean," etc. Hersholt doesn't disillusion them, but refers them tactfully to a local doctor or to their family physician.

Because he has purposefully fused his own personality and name with that of "Paul Christian's," he laughs good-naturedly over any resulting confusion, and likes to relate an incident that occurred during a location trip when he attended a boxing match and was introduced to the spectators from the prizefight ring. The officiating master of ceremonies gave him a glowing introduction, then shamefacedly turned to him and surreptitiously whispered, "What's your name?" Hersholt told him.

"Lad-ees and gentlemen," shouted the emcee, "meet Jean Hotshot!"

The restriction Hersholt has voluntarily placed upon his thespian endeavors doesn't mean that he is leading a quiet life of limited activity. On the contrary, he has increased his varied pursuits with his recently-acquired position as motion picture producer, and his acceptance of an assignment that will send him to his homeland, Denmark, under the auspices of the American-Denmark Relief Committee, at the war's end to conduct a survey of the country's post-war needs. In addition to his activities in these two capacities, Hersholt is president of the Motion Picture Relief Fund, first vice-president of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, a director of the Los Angeles Area War Relief Council, president of the Mark Twain Association of America, and active in United Nations Relief.

Mr. Hersholt is happily married to Via Anderson, a charming woman of Danish parentage. Last year, they

celebrated their thirtieth wedding anniversary and the actor presented his wife with a beautiful mink fur coat in honor of the occasion. They have one son, Allan, a popular young Hollywood publicity man.

The Hersholts live in a beautiful home in Beverly Hills. Its walls are hung with many rare paintings, which Hersholt enthusiastically collects in addition to pipes and expensive first editions. Hersholt, himself, is an accomplished artist, has painted excellent landscapes and portraits of famed personalities. He attended the Copenhagen Art School in Denmark before turning to the theater and coming to America in 1914.

The Hersholts entertain frequently, like rich foods, have wine with every meal.

Resuming the discussion of his disguised identity, Mr. Hersholt was reminded of one fan who was *really* confused. A Marine once wrote to him an enamored letter, addressed to "Dear Jean," and requesting an autographed picture—and a "date!" "I think you're gorgeous," wrote the Marine.

"I sent him my autographed picture," chuckled Hersholt, "and I never heard from him again!"
