Ira Cook's Formula Is Hard Work Coupled With "Surprises"

Monday through Saturday, 10 p.m. KFAC

RA COOK'S formula is presenting the latest and best of popular records — band and vocal — coupled with an element of surprise. "It's a surprise, all right! Every night!" laughed tall, genial Ira. "We're never sure who our guests are going to be until they drop in."

Since 1941, "Lucky Lager Dance Time" has been a favorite with young and old. It was developed to appeal to war workers, but the interest of its ever-increasing fans jumped it in its first year from seventh to second place among recorded-platter programs covering that period.

Ad Lib Interviews

Ira, who believes "names" make news, brings favorite recording stars to the microphone, and interviews them in a completely fresh and original style. "We—the names and I—get together and just talk. It's all ad lib on the air and only lasts a couple of minutes, so nobody has time to get scared or tongue tied. The only people I've seen nervous are announcers."

A recent change was made by Lucky Lager when it moved from KFAC's studios to Radio Row. It is now broadcasting from Music City, at the corner of Sunset and Vine. "Because we are now in the heart of Hollywood, many friends drop by on the spur of the moment and appear on the air with me. Names in our guest book include Andy Russell, Dick Haymes, Bob Haymes, Spade Cooley, Vaughn Monroe, Frankie Carle, Helen Forrest, Frances Langford, Ella Mae Morse, The Merry Macs, King Sisters, Andrews Sisters, Pied Pipers, King Cole Trio, Hoagy Carmichael and a host of others."

Born in Duluth, Minn., where he attended high school, dark-haired, dark-eyed Ira Cook came to California for a pre-medical course. Having won a degree at Stanford, he switched to radio in 1938 and started as an announcer on KMTR. Since his honorable discharge from the army a year ago, he has been busy building a name for himself as an authority on popular recordings and musical trends.

His day usually starts around nine a.m. and ends with his last broadcast at 12:00 a.m. the following day. He writes scripts, selects records, emcees and conducts interviews with top bandleaders, singers, musicians, songwriters and special guests on "Lucky Lager." He also handles special announcing, public relations and exploitation for a prominent advertising agency.

Asked what his ultimate goal is, he laughingly answered sinking into a chair, "Just to see that I get every thing done—on time."

"Hit Parade" Organist Ethel Smith Is Vivacious Red Head Who Swings A Mean Golf Club, Adores Finery

> Saturday, 6 p.m. CBS-KNX

POR TWELVE DOLLARS a week and sauerbraten, Ethel Smith started playing the Hammond organ

in a little Bavarian restaurant in Miami—a restaurant "with a Hammond, but no business" and a boss who was anxious to please his chef, a lover of Viennese waltzes.

"I played during the lunch hour," Ethel recalled to Radio Life. "I got into the Vienna woods at twelve o'clock and I didn't get out until

two. Every few minutes the chef would peek into the room where I was playing and exclaim, 'Ach! So schoen!'—with two 'umlauts," the vivacious musician added.

Emerging from the "Vienna woods," Miss Smith always relished her sauerbraten, often supplemented by red cabbage. "I used to eat myself unconscious," she sighed.

Ethel Smith, the girl who jumped from fifty dollars a week to pay in four figures, is currently being heard on George Washington Hill's "Hit Parade," substituting for Lawrence

ETHEL SMITH is red-headed. stands live feet two, and weighs 115 pounds. She loves evening dresses that glitter, has "one for every night of the week and two extras for holidays."

Tibbett, who is here on a Pacific Coast concert tour. "There isn't anything," she said, "that you can't learn in ten easy years!"

While she was attending Carnegie Tech, she learned how to play regular pipe organ, also took up foreign languages. One day in 1939 she walked into a radio studio and first touched a Hammond electric organ. The instrument's immediate response thrilled her. "It's made just for me!," she cried. (She now thinks seamless stockings were also invented for her special enjoyment.)

Progress

Already an expert of pipe organ, Ethel went about the job of mastering the electric instrument, which requires an altogether different technique. After practicing on the customers of the Bavarian cafe in Miami, she returned to New York and "managed to play summer resorts in the summer and winter resorts in the winter to keep up my golf swing" —Ethel says playing the organ requires intense coordination between head, hands, and feet, so she's consequently a good athlete and has "wonderful pictures of my backswing taken in Brazil!"

Her first trip to Brazil, taken in 1937, unknowingly molded her whole career. It was at the time of the first Pan-American Conference and the S.S. American Legion had been chartered. to take the diplomats south. "They wanted a sober, reliable person to take care of the nightly program for the passengers." Miss Smith was selected to shepherd a group of entertainers aboard and keep the diplomats in good humor.

Every night after the show the gentlemen invited her to dance. The not too light-footed statesmen ruined every pair of evening slippers she owned.

While the conference was meeting, Ethel took a side trip to Buenos Aires and fell in love with South America and its music. In 1941, when she was back in New York playing organ, and the manager of Buenos Aires' Casino Copacabana offered her a job, it didn't take Ethel much time to make her decision. She trotted southward and stayed until Pearl Harbor—taking the last boat northward bound.

Back Home

"I caught a cold on the pier in New York while the inspector read my diary," she remarked. "Of course they had to be careful, but I finally told him 'Gee! I'm freezing here. You don't have to *enjoy* what you're reading!' Then I went home and promptly tore the diary up."

What Ethel brought from South

America was the scintillating Latin rhythms, combined with her artistry at the electric organ. Back in New York she played for Mrs. Vincent Astor and Prince Serge Oblensky. Said Mrs. Astor: "That is the most captivating music!" Said the Prince, noting Ethel's footwork, "Those are the most captivating legs!"

Immediately the clever organist was offered a position at the Rainbow Row for twice what she was getting at the St. Regis. But she stayed where she was, and that's where George Washington Hill found her. After coming for several nights to watch Ethel perform, he offered her a job on his "Hit Parade."

"So I made my debut in Carnegie Hall—it was the first night that the 'best tunes of all moved to Carnegie Hall'—instead of playing Bach, I played 'I Had the Craziest Dream,' but I threw a little Bach in the arrangement.

"That was February 12, 1943," Ethel remembers. "Mr. Hill wanted me to wear a white lace gown, so I chose one dripping with sequins. I was hardly able to play in it, and then Carnegie Hall is such a dirty place! The next morning I took the dress back and ordered three petticoats cut off the voluminous skirt!"

Ethel admits she's crazy about clothes. "I think I prefer tailored things," she smiled, "but I wear the other kind all the time." She has seven evening dresses — "one for every night of the week and a couple extras for holidays," and her favorite colors are chartreuse, blue, white, and gold. She likes glitter and sequins, laughs about the recent experience when Georgie Jessel's little girl watched Miss Smith perform. After the program, the child's nurse approached the organist and remarked that her charge had been dazzled by the musician. "Gee!" replied Ethel, "She must be wild about music!" "No," replied the nurse, "she's wild about sequins.!"

Ethel, since being catapulted to fame via her brilliant organ arrangements of Latin American numbers, especially the samba, has appeared in several movies. Her first was "Bathing Beauty," followed by "Twice Blessed." She's now working at Disney's as leading lady to Donald Duck, and carries an important part in "Early to Wed" with Van Johnson and Esther Williams.

She has a home off the Sunset Strip and also an apartment in New York, is unmarried, and wants to keep right on with her crowded career. "Now I'm reading 'Forever Amber' in my spare time," she grinned with a grimace that accentuated her short little nose and her brown eyes. Her naturally red hair has been toned down to blondish-auburn for pictures, but she seems to have the energetic disposition and wonderful sense of humor bestowed on the brightly-tressed. F'example, Capitol's Jo Stafford was voted the Finest Singer of the Year by thousands of radio listeners in Martin Block's New York poll. Tiny Miss Hayes pulled her leopard coat closer about her legs and adjusted the polka-dotted scarf at her throat; at the same time muttering something that sounded like "hate to be sick."

"It's ridiculous—this cold, I mean. Before we reached Southern' California I carefully warned the 'Harriet' cast not to discard their winter clothing completely. Then I, in turn, sent my winter things home. This" pointing to her smartly tailored brown-checked jacket, brown skirt, and leopard coat—"is the only warm thing I have. And it fails me at times. Oh, well, it gives all of my friends a chance to knit sweaters for me. But I'm afraid by the time they'll have them done, I'll be on my way."

down from the sky one day to come to them like an angel from heaven—or, even better, an angel from home. With the Bob Hope troupe, NBC songstress Frances Langford, who will star on her own air show this summer, has canvassed

both the major and out-of-the way service camps throughout this country, journeyed through Alaska, trekked across the Atlantic to tour England, Iceland, Tunis, Algiers, Bizerte, and flown out over the Pacific to its many lonely island outposts.

Back in the States, she continues to tour Army and Navy bases across the continent and visit, at every opportunity, the wounded veterans housed in the nation's service hospitals. She takes time out merely "to make a living."

When Radio Life resolved to bring its readers a view of Langford at leisure, we knew it wouldn't be easy. JON HALL SHARES his wife's love of music. In fact, it is he who is the avid record-collector in the family. "I just sit back and listen," the songstress laughs. She and Jon also like to see mystery movies. (The Halls are pictured with Patty Thomas, dancer who accompanied Frances overseas.)

It wasn't. There was no moment to find her lounging on the patio of her attractive West Los Angeles home. Tuesday, she was broadcasting from a Naval base; Wednesday, she was entertaining at an Army camp; Thursday and Friday, she was working before the movie cameras in the picturization of "People Are Funny"; Saturday, she was singing at a hospital in Santa Barbara; the following week, she was to start work on a new film at RKO.

No Leisure

We finally settled for Friday, when we could talk to her between "takes" of her song number in "People Are Funny." We asked her, and her sister-in-law, Louise Locher, who is her close companion and secretary, "what does Langford do in her leisure time—if she ever has any?"

"She doesn't," laughed Miss Locher, "but if she did, she'd stay in bed until eleven every morningthen get up and eat her customary big breakfast of grits, eggs, toast and coffee."

"I eat anything and everything," grinned Frances, settling herself in a chair on the sidelines of the set, as comfortably as she could in the fragile yards of the filmy, flowered net evening gown she was wearing for the picture. Her small, five-foot, three-inch figure belied her hearty appetite, and she insisted, "I try to gain weight. It's good for me."

Still speaking of breakfast, she confessed, "Until I've had mine in the morning, I don't like conversation."

"Frances," put in Louise, "always likes to eat on the kitchen table and, except when they have guests that aren't family or close friends, she and Johnny (husband Jon Hall) always eat in the breakfast nook."

The Halls like to spend their evenings at home, and have little taste for nightclubbing. "They go out about once or twice a month because it is expected of them," explained sister Louise. "Then Franny always comes home and says with sigh of relief, 'Well, I'm glad that's over!" Now we can stay home for a while!"

Like Musical Friends

When they entertain, Frances and Jon enjoy the company of a few close friends (several of them servicemen), all of whom enjoy music.

"We like people who like music," Frances smiled. "Jonny has a wonderful record collection. He loves it, so he goes to all the work of finding the records, and I can just sit back and listen to them."

"Radio is easywhen you broadcast from a STUDIO," smiles Frances. "But we have fun touring the camps and hospitals, too, and we have the best audiences in the world!"

Miss Langford, surprisingly shy and soft-spoken (her Southern accent very much in evidence), was working diligently on crocheted pieces for a bedspread as we talked to her. "It keeps me from getting nervous" she explained.

Once so timid about appearing in public that she had crying spells before going on-stage, the singer has conquered this complex to a great extent, but still doesn't warm up to people easily. "She takes her time feeling people out at first," Miss Locher told us, "but when she knows them better, she becomes at ease and 'chatty.' She's much better than she used to be. When I first met her, she was terribly shy."

Frances is still unwilling to view herself on the screen. "It's fun making movies," she said, "as long as I don't have to see myself in them." She never views the "rushes" (the completed sequences of the picture which are shown to its cast and crew at the close of each day's work). "If I ever saw them," she frowned, "I wouldn't come back to work the next day."

About radio, she declared, "It's easy—when you broadcast from a studio." Langford, with the Hope show, does it the hard way—broadcasting from remote Army and Navy camps throughout the country. "But we sure have fun, too," she smiled then, "and the best audiences in the world!"

Loves Planes

Out over the Pacific, Frances fell in love with flying. "I've flown a lot, but it isn't official. I sometimes acted as co-pilot, but never handled the controls for take-offs or landings. Airplanes, though," she smacked her lips, "they're for me!"

She is equally enthusiastic over boating. Currently, husband Jon has a new speed boat which is being demonstrated for Navy use. "But just the sound of its motor scares me," she shivered. "After the war, we'll go back to sails."

Frances' other fikes include reading historical novels (most recently, "Immortal Wife"), and seeing mys-

Just Because He's Jack of All Trades, It Doesn't Make Him the "Poor Man's Welles," Says Edwards

HEN SOMEONE once referred to young Jack Edwards, Jr. as the "poor man's Orson Welles" he laughed out loud. "Just because I act, can sing if I'm forced to, design clothes because I like to, want to write and produce, believe me, I'm no Welles. It's a wonder someone hasn't branded me a 'smattering of talent."" Twenty-five-year-old Jack, youngest of the famous Edwards Family, is known to radio dialcrs for his work on the "Bullock's Show," "Screen Guild," "Aunt Mary," and many others. (He has just completed the role of "Clyde" on the "Dreft Star Playhouse" dramatization of "An American Tragedy.") He has twenty-some years of "theater" behind him. Yet he describes himself as a "simple guy with simple likes." JACK IS THE YOUNGEST OF THE FAMOUS EDWARDS FAMILY, which plans to resume its skits when brother, Sam, returns from the army.

"If it's the real Edwards you want to know about," he told Radio Life with a smile, "you won't find tinsel and glamor. You'll find a homebody, with a craving for Mexican food, a passion for Mexico, a rancho rita, and a yen to travel."

As for the "smattering of talent," he guesses he came by his acting career by heredity. "When I was a kid my mother wrote a radio show for my brother, Sammy, and me. Sammy didn't want to act, but consented to do the singing. We ended up by being one character who sang and acted. In reality I read the lines and Sammy sang."

Most Confusing Time

"When the fan mail poured in congratulating us on the show, Sammy told Mom that maybe he'd give her a break and join the cast as another character. As he was doing my singing for me, I had to do his singing for him. To top it, we became ill at the same time and my sister, Florida, had to go on for both of us. That was the most confusing time I've ever had in radio!"

At present, the Edwards are separated with Sammy away in the army. But when he returns, they plan to resume the adventures of their happy clan. "Mom's busy keeping house. Florida, of course, is still in radio. Me, too," he facetiously pointed out.

"I'm planning to do some writing some day. But first of all I'd like to travel and see the world. Think I'll work my way on a fruit steamer.

"But while.I'm here and waiting for that day," he remarked with a wink, "I'm doing my damedest to portray every type of role. If you were to ask me how to get into radio, I'd tell you by acting in everything you could. You learn only by doing it."

His present ambition is to play the role of Caligula in the forthcoming picturization of Lloyd C. Douglas' "The Robe." "I know I could do it," he earnestly said, "if they'd give me a chance. But they probably won't think I look the type. In radio, it's funny. You look like the listener pictures you. When they do see me, some of them say, 'You're so young'-which is a nice tribute. You see, I like to appear older."

Collegiate-looking Edwards wrinkled his brow, stooped and began walking with an imaginary cane. "This," he croaked, "is what I mean."

"It's true," he concluded, 'that I do want to write and produce a good radio show. And I'll always want to act. But I think the most important thing is to be a real person. I hope I never have so many irons in the fire that I forget that."

This was amply illustrated in creating the eighty-eight year span of "Victoria" in two-and-a-hours a night for four years. She is gracious, down-to-earth, and lives by the rule of simplicity.

"Oh, my yes," Miss Hayes happily smiled," it's good to be in California again. I'm quite thrilled about tonight. Norma Shearer is giving a dinner party for me and it will give me a chance to see friends I haven't seen in ages. In the years I've been away, Hollywood hasn't changed, but the people have. I don't get to attend many movies and there are so many new faces and names that I don't know. I just remember the 'old' people," she laughed.

"Do you know a young fellow by the name of Van Johnson? I don't seem to be familiar with his work except that I do remember in Chicago his name was in lights across the street from my hotel room. Norma, bless her heart, has planned to show me one of my old movies after dinner because he requested it. Just imagine," with a grimace, "if I hadn't been prepared. What a shock!"

"Ma and I just like to lie around in the sun," "Gabby" explained. "I don't do any exercise when I'm not working because when I'm making Westerns, I have to be as rough as any young fella, and it's hard work. Westerns are really strenuous."

Fifty-nine years old, "Gabby" was born in Wellesville, New York, the son of a hotel operator. At the age of eight, he took part in amateur theatricals, and in 1902, while still in high school, he ran away from home to join a stock company. Later, he learned to dance, worked in burlesque for twelve years, then went into vaudeville, soon headling bills on both the Keith and Orpheum circuits. Meanwhile, in Chicago, on March 4, 1914, he married Miss Earle, then a busy Broadway actress.

Hayes created his "Gabby" characterization twenty-five years ago, and, at first wore false whiskers. He found them "too much trouble," however, and the ones he wears today are all his own. He hasn't shaved in almost ten years, and the picturesque cowboy garb that he wears for his role is over fourteen years old.

Radio Debut

His appearance on the Andrews Sisters series is his first fling in radio. Before the program's initiation on the airwaves, "Gabby" was skeptical about his humor being right for radio. "I was scared, at first," he chuckled.

"Now," he added, "I'm gettin' used to it. In fact, I'm even beginnin' to enjoy it."
