OMETIMES it's a sudden tug at the heartstrings, like the time Don Norman asked a boyish faced sailor what he wanted to do when the war is over. "Just go home to Mom," said the sailor.

When the war came, an edict was issued to broadcasting stations banning the man-on-the-street type of airshow, a program so completely unrehearsed and unpredictable that it was considered a risk to allow it to continue during crucial wartimes. Recently, however, the government has considered it safe to lift the ban, and these programs are fast returning to the ether waves.

Don Norman, veteran of many years of man-on-the-street broadcasting, has initiated his "walkie-talkie" series over the American Broadcasting Company network, util-izing the famous "walkie-talkie" izing the famous "walkie-talkie" shortwave equipment developed by the U.S. Army during this war.

With this modern portable broad. casting outfit, genial Mr. Norman goes wherever he wishes, to talk with people about almost every subject under the sun. Los Angelans have found him in any one of a number of spots these past few weekseverywhere from the bustling corner of Hollywood and Vine to the campus of U.S.C. and the back lot at the Paramount Pictures studios.

At this writing, he is planning soon to conduct his program from the Santa Monica fishing pier, in the homes of a number of wellknown people, and inside a moving automobile. "Of course, the car will have to keep going straight ahead," laughed Don. "We can't turn any corners, or the interference would cut us off the air."

Go Anywhere!

The show will also not limit itself to southern California; it will travel up and down the west coast. "We can go *anywhere*," Don beamed happily.

We were talking to the smiling mikeman in a conference room at Hollywood's Radio City ABC studios, where he had just finished listening to a recording of one of his broadcasts. Hearing it, his keen eyes winkled in merriment and his ready smile flashed often. It was obvious

The Man at the Mike

Don Norman's real name is Dalton Martin Don Norman Carroll Crosno. He was born in Crosno, Missouri, says "I don't know which of my relatives founded it." He started doing man-on-the-street broadcasts in 1935, when he was manager of a local radio station in Dubuque, Iowa. At first, he couldn't find anyone who would submit to an air interview, so he stood on a corner and talked to himself. "That's how I learned to ad-lib," he grins.

Later, he went to Chicago where he did the first man-on-the-street show to be aired on a network. It was a tremendous hit, and Don has been doing that type of program almost exclusively ever since then.

As a child, Don's health was poor. He spent the years between his twelfth and fifteenth birthdays in bed, studied with a tutor and qualified for college. He enrolled at the University of Cincinnati.

While bed-ridden, he also became interested in radio, read every available book on the subject, and in 1925, joined the staff of WLW, Cincinnati.

Besides radio, Don Norman has worked as a cab-driver, a "pitchman" at Coney Island, and as a singer with dance bands.

Before coming to Hollywood, he had become one of the most popular personalities in Chicago radio, conducting "Your Date with Don Norman" and "The Don Norman Show". Last year, he retired from radio for a much-needed rest.

Slight of build, with straight brown hair, a lean tanned face and a liking for sports clothes, Don spends his leisure time fishing and listening to broadcasts on his short-wave radio.

On June 19, 1942, he married his secretary, Irene Smith (whom he calls "Smitty"). He describes her as "a very, very pretty blonde who is very, very smart."

he found deep enjoyment in his job and in the people he met doing it. He told us he had no particular rules for handling people or keep-

ing the show going smoothly. "I simply let the people talk." he explained, "and I never laugh at them, always with them!"

HILE LUNCHING with Victor Borge, Radio Life discovered a story so full of drama and

By now his summer air show for the Johnson Wax Company is a "must" on your listening list. Perhaps, you are unfamiliar with his face and immediately picture a tall, blond vik-ing type with a charming accent and a way with Americans.

But you're wrong. In reality, Mr. Borge is a six-foot brunet with flashing black eyes. His lithe physioue is usually garbed in impecc-ably-cut plaids or conservative pinstripe suits. And his charm lies in his quiet. almost whimsical continental manner.

Bleak Beginning

refugee from Denmark stood upon the docks of New York. He had hurriedly left his native land, knowing his name was on the Nazi black list. He had always wanted to come to America, perhaps not under such abrupt circumstances, but he was here—and he was alive.

In Denmark, Sweden and on the continent he had been the most popular and highest paid entertainer. Now he was nobody. Just another refugee and one who didn't speak a word of English.

He was broke. What money he had possessed was in the Nazi-held banks of his homeland. But he wasn't discouraged. He intended to start a new life in this new country.

With the help of his Americaneducated wife and American movies, he learned to speak the American way. He went to picture after picture, sitting through each three times. At the end of the day he would go home and try out his newlv-gained knowledge on his wife, Elsie.

One year later he ran into a friend of a friend who invited him to guest on the "Kraft Music Hall." This, happily thought Borge, might be the chance I've been waiting for. "The night of the bfoadcast he nervously took his place at the plano.

He stayed for a fifty-four week engagement

"You ask me how I like radio," he smiled, "I love it. After all it intro-duced me to the American public. But aside from that, it is exciting, always going forward."

Original

If you've never watched this musician at work you have a treat in store. He and the piano blend har-moniously to present enchanting original compositions. Nearly all of the music he uses is his own. As for his language lessons, please don't for his language lessons, please don't Borge can do that. The inflation double-talk (you know, whe e to, two and too become three-for and four become five, etc.) and the punctua-tion language are his favorites. They

are translations from his Danish repertoire.

"How," your incredulous reporter asked," do you dream up your rou-tines?"

"No special way," he laughed. Perhaps they come to him in the shower or at a concert or originate from something he hears on the radio. He works on them diligently and is a worrier. He's afraid he'll never be able to top his last week's perform. ance.

Since his American debut in 1941 he has been carefully building him. self as a comedian. He loves enter-taining people and feels he is at his best when improvising. He can walk onto a bare stage or into a crowded room totally unprepared and play for hours. This is what he likes to do best.

At home he works when there is work to be done. He is never idle. If he isn't listening to music he is making it. His wife worries about him and thinks he is working far too hard. "Maybe she's right." he too hard. "Maybe she's right." he grinned. "Before I went on radio. I used to have hair to here..." indicating his brow line-"but now I have it only up to here-" pointing to his slightly receding hairline. pull it all out in nervousness."

Here for Rest

It was for rest reasons that he returned to California a few months ago. But when radio again beck-oned, he postponed all thoughts of a vacation and buried himself in preparations for a new show. After the summer season is concluded he is poing on a concert tour.

His wife was not to be outdone and enticed him into a ranch house in Northridge. There they have wide open spaces and she hopes he'll relax. But knowing Mr. Borge, who has tours and perhaps a forthcoming movie on his mind, we doubt it.

Mrs. Borge, who was recently selected as one of the ten bestdressed women, has her husband to thank for the title. He selects her clothes.

Taps

Last week radio mourned the death of well-liked anouncer-emcee, Gary Breckner, who died on June 24 from injuries sustained in an automobile accident near Redlands, California.

Breckner came to radio in 1928 as a sports announcer. He later branched out as emcee and his CBS interviews from Catalina Island were summer favorites. When John Conte was called into service a few months ago, Breckner took over his duties as emcee for the "Maxwell House," as well as substituting for Tom Breneman on "Breakfast in Hollywood" during the latter's two week vacation.

A Calvary Captain in the last war, Breckner again tried for active service but was rejected because of his age (49). Surviving are his wildow and son, Robert, a Naval lieutenant, whose wedding Breckner attended the night before his death.

Did Come True

Once upon a time there were two boys who had dreams of some day owning their own radio station.

Dreams are made of pretty thin stuff and seldom, if ever, come true you say?

Well, this little story DID come true. It has just happened to two of Hollywood's nicest radioites—Dick Joy, an announcer-newscaster; and Don Mc-Bain, radio technician.

The Federal Communications Commission has granted them a construction permit for a standard broadcast station to be erected at Palm Springs and both McBain and Joy expect to have their station—a 250 watter on 1340 kilocycles—operating early this fall, possibly in October.

Ever since they were kids in kneelength pants, McBain and Joy have had visions of owning their own radio



station. So, about six months ago, they decided to investigate the possibilities and came to the conclusion, after a complete survey, that Palm Springs was the ideal spot.

They have obtained the full cooperation of the Palm Springs Chamber of Commerce, business men and civic groups and, as a result of a special survey made by the Chamber of Commerce there, will accentuate such programs as news, good music, sports, school, church, Army and civic.

"Old Grads"

On July 1st, those mighty-minded moppets, the "Quiz Kids" rounded out their fifth year on the airwaves by gathering in the schoolhouse of the air a distinguished quintet of "Old Grads" plus the five youngest "Quiz Kids" and Joe Kelley, genial quizmaster-of-ceremonies.

The alumni were Joan Bishop, 18, who recently made her operatic debut; Cynthia Cline, 19, a junior at Northwestern University; Van Dyke Tiers, 18, who is studying advanced chemistry at the University of Chicago; Jack Lucal, 18, freshman at Harvard University, and Seaman 1/c Richard Frisbie, 18, who represented the sixteen former "Quiz Kids" now serving with the armed forces.

In rounding out five years in radio, the "Quiz Kids" have received \$135,000 in war bonds from their sponsor in return for answering 2,640 questions, 86 percent of them correctly. They have appeared in seven movie shorts, entertained servicemen at sixty camps, navy bases, hospitals, and canteens, and heard themselves eulogized on the floor of the U. S. Senate.

Their chief accomplishment, they feel, is the fact that they have sold \$118,800,000 worth of war bonds.

as an authentic testing ground for the jokes.

Even before our men started coming back from overseas, AFRS was getting reports on what the men did and didn't like by way of radio humor. Now, the writers of the Journal (formerly top scripters for stars like Benny, Bergen, and Burns and Allen) evolve their funny remarks and if they're in doubt as to their "socko," they still leave the lines in and let the men at the Canteen decide.

If the boys laugh long and hard, the gag stays in. If it flops, out it goes. This convenient manner of grading gags is made possible by a show-saving feature — editing which puts a Journal production on a basis similar to movies.

For a half-hour comedy script like this one, there should be several hours' rehearsal to assure a smooth presentation. But when Hollywood's top stars readily volunteer to squeeze a Journal performance into their already-crowded schedules, there isn't time for hours of rehearsal. So they punch in at the Canteen for a once or twice over lightly, the show is recorded—and if there are any fluffs or "eggs," they are taken out when the record is edited. The result is atight, fast-moving thirty minutes of exactly what the boys like. AFRS knows it, because all the gags, and the songs, too, have been pre-tested.

Such editing has also saved many a performer a red face. Like Jerry Colonna . . who forgot the opening lines to his song, but knowing that the mistake could be taken from the record, calmly signalled the orchestra leader to start all over again!

Famous Editors

"G.I. Journal" was conceived about two years ago by Sgt. Sterling Tracy and Kay Kyser. Kay played for the program for more than ten weeks, and when he was called out of town to do camp appearances, Bing Crosby stepped in as "editor." When Bing went on tour, his "son," Bob Hope, took over, followed by Jack Carson. From then on, these four stars have tried to rotate as editors of the Journal.

After the first few months, the show outgrew the studio at Radio Recorders and it moved to Columbia Square. But something was haywire. The scripts, written especially each week by two top men whose style best suited the stars appearing, didn't seem to hit the mark. The gags fell flat before a civilian audience which didn't seem to get the point of the jokes. Producer Frank O'Connor (Sgt. at AFRS) wondered if the problem might be solved by moving the show to the Canteen. The same script that had played to frozen faces at CBS, wowed the G.I. crowd at the service center.

At that time, only the comedy

spots were recorded before a liveaudience. Music was recorded at the studio and added when the entire program was "assembled." Corp. Jim Burton, who succeeded Sgt. O'Connor as producer, felt that the audience was really being cheated. So. Lieut. Jimmy Grier was asked to present his Coast Guard band on the program. When Jimmy went overseas, Dick Aurandt became music editor and each week has a wonderful time dreaming up special touches for the now-complete edition.

Sings Original Number

An added attraction of each Friday night's "cutting" is a number by petite Connie Haines, who sings the original song of the week—a song written by a serviceman overseas. Hundreds of exceptionally good songs have been received. When Connie's busy schedule doesn't permit her to make her usual appearance at the Canteen, she goes to a recording session with Major Meredith Willson and the AFRS ochestra, and the result is a perfect version of some aspiring songwriter's dream child.

Like all AFRS programs, "G.L. Journal" boasts a million dollar cast every week—with Hollywood's great appearing as editors, secretaries, reporters, or office boys. A recent cast had Frank Sinatra as editor, with Fibber McGee and Molly trying to help him out so he could make a good impression on "columnist" Ginger Rogers. Supplementing these stars were Arthur Q. Bryan, the King Sisters, and Mel Blanc.

No matter who else is on the bill, it's Mel who always steals the show with his impersonation of Private Sad Sack— the G.I. version of his Mooney character on "Point Sublime." Sad Sack turns up every week either because he's lost on maneuvers, has won an overnight pass in a crap game, or just because the show couldn't get along without him.

For example: Bing says, "Now, Sack, she's a serious young girl. She'll probably expect you to marry her and raise a family. Maybe as many as three children.

Mel: Th-th-three children? But I'm an ar ar army ma ma—I'm a soldsold-sold—Oh, what the heck! That's thirty-six points, anyway!

Besides Bing, Hope, Carson, and Kay, other editors who've blue-pencilled the Journal have been: Bill Bendix, Jack Haley, Monty Woolley, Jack Benny, Burns and Allen, Frank Morgan, Judy Canova, Robert Benchley, Edgar Bergen and Charlie Mc Carthy, Miltor Berle, Bette Davis, Red Skelton, Roy Rogers, and Orson Welles.
