AT BEST the road to success in the concert field is a stony one. Any artist who has won acclaim is the first to warn the neophyte that toil, sweat, and tears are the price of fame.

But, cheerless as the picture of the future is painted, countless young people annually embark upon a serious vocal career. Their ranks are as large as their opportunities for recognition are limited, which, in itself, creates an urgent demand for workshops, so to speak, wherein the promising voice student can acquire valuable experience through concert appearances. Such an opportunity is afforded singers on the KFI-Hollywood Bowl Auditions — a competition open to all vocalists under the age of thirty.

The grand prize offered on the

auditions consists of a paid solo performance in the Hollywood Bowl on August 26 as featured artist for a regular Sunday evening concert of Symphony Under the Stars under Leopold Stokowski. You can readily see that the winner must be a young singer of exceptional merit and this necessitates an exacting preliminary audition for all applicants.

Those sufficiently advanced to qualify are then scheduled to appear over the air during a series of thirteen weekly concerts, broadcast over KFI from early May through August 13 on Monday evenings at 9:30. Claude Sweeten and the KFI Symphony Orchestra accompany two vocalists each week, with all air performers heard by a distinguished panel of jurors who will select the soloist for the Hollywood Bowl.

Those comprising the jury are: Dr. Mary Carr Moore, noted composer; Dr. Richard Lert, director of the Pasadena Symphony Association; Leon Raines, professor of music; and William von Wymetal of MGM and former stage director of the Metropolitan Opera.

Director Enthusiastic

Leopold Stokowski, music director of the Hollywood Bowl Symphony, is more ardently devoted to the development of American musical talent than perhaps any of our foremost symphony leaders. The now famed All-American Youth Orchestra which he headed did an outstanding job in promoting nationwide enthusiasm for native musicianship and consequently, the winner of the auditions has the good fortune to make a debut under the baton of a completely sympathetic conductor.



Satire On Suspense

Seldom does an airshow draw an audience of onlookers who are themselves members of the radio industry, spontaneously gathered to witness a broadcast they know will both entertain and benefit them. Such a group congregated within the "sacred" walls of CBS' Studio B week before last to watch Bill Spier's presentation on "Suspense" of "Fury and Sound," a spine-tingling satire on eccentric radio producers.

Star of the show, as "Kingsley Roachler, famous for his radio plays, a small, ugly man who affected a beard," was Norman Lloyd, current Actor's Lab sensation of "Volpone." Wiry, flaming-haired Mr. Lloyd, in spectacles and loud suspenders, leaped about the broadcast stage with as much abandon and agility as he displays in his lively role as "Mosca" in the Lab's "Volpone" production.

The skillful actor was a vaudeville "hooper" at the age of seven and took extensive ballet lessons as a child although he has never done ballet dancing professionally.

Lloyd was a member of the original "Mercury Theater," appearing in "Julius Caesar" and "Shoemaker's Holiday." He made his radio debut on the "Columbia Workshop" in New York under the direction of Irving Reis, the man who wrote "Fury and Sound." Moviegoers will soon see Norman Lloyd in Alfred Hitchcock's "Spellbound," "The Southerner," "Walk in the Sun" and "Letter for Evie."

The amplified heartbeats heard during the "Suspense" airing of "Fury and Sound" were those of actor Clifton Cromwell. The heartbeats of soundman Berne Surrey, actress Lurene Tuttle (who portrayed "Merle" in the play) and Cromwell were auditioned to discover which were best suited for broadcast purposes.

Laugh-getting dialogue of "Kingsley Roachler—the radio's boy-wonder" in the play included such lines as the following:

ROACHLER: Stop the rehearsal! Roachler has worked with insensitive asses in many places and under many conditions, but he is forced to yield top honors to the radio artists of California! How can this girl perform these sensitive thoughts against your noise and indifference! How can these fragile

dreams achieved by nights of creative sweat, compete with your gum-chewing, chair-creaking, walking-talking, thick-skinned detachment!

At the completion of the "Kingsley Roachler production" presented during the play, an announcer proclaimed: "You have just heard another original by Roachler in the series, 'Roachler Presents.' It was produced, written and directed by Mr. Roachler, who also suggested the musical theme. Next week, Mr. Roachler, acclaimed as the most imaginative dramatist in radio, will—but let radio's foremost producer tell you about it—Kingsley Roachler. . . ."

At the completion of the "Suspense" presentation, bearded Bill Spier stepped to the microphone, declared with exaggerated dignity: "This is William Spier. Spier wants you to know that he hopes you have enjoyed tonight's little expose of backstage radio. . . . I should like you to know, of course, that tonight's story was all in the spirit of fun, and was completely fictional. . . . So Spier says goodnight . . . oh, and you. . . ."

Narrator: Me? Yes, sir.

Spier: When you say "Suspense" is produced, edited and directed by William Spier, I want a great deal more importance there. Those are the most vital words in the show.

for the use of non-cripples as well, the idea of the "Botkin Fatigue Seat" was inspired when Perry and Bing, playing camp shows, noticed that crippled soldiers in the audience frequently had to stand during the entire performance, leaning heavily and uncomfortably on their crutches.

Two Years' Work

Botkin has spent over two years on the development and perfection of the novel equipment to qualify it for acceptance by the armed forces service hospitals, public health and medical authorities, which are today making full use of it.

Now that this project has culminated in success, he plans to turn over its manufacture and distribution into other hands, and devote his own time to other inventions now in their initial stages.

"As long as they're in trouble, I like to work on them," maintained Mr. Botkin, as we talked with him in his gadget-stocked office in the Crosby Building. "Once they're out of trouble, I want to get on to something new."

"Gadgets" are Perry Botkin's only interest outside of music. His life has revolved around music ever since, at the age of fourteen, he witnessed the birth of jazz from his vantage point in Richmond, Indiana. He promptly learned to play the banjo, and when only fifteen, he left home, went to New York City and secured a job playing in an orchestra at a Greenwich Village night club. The salary was one hundred and forty dollars a week, and the job lasted eight years.

"I was therefore spared most of what the average musician has done—weary years on the road and so forth," Perry pointed out.

In 1927, Botkin began radio broadcasting and record-making. He played on most of New York's major airshows, and estimates that he has probably made more phonograph records than any other one performer, with his own band, as accompanist for Crosby and other top entertainers, and as a staff musician with all of the leading recording companies.

Takes Guitar

An admirer and friend of the late Eddie Lang, guitarist who accompanied Crosby on his early recordings, Perry was always selected by Lang to substitute for him whenever he (Lang) was not available. It was after watching Lang play that Botkin switched his talents from the banjo to the guitar. After Lang's sudden death, Perry was the logical one to become chief instrumental accompanist for the great Groaner when the guitarist came to the West coast ten years ago.

Botkin met Bing's batoneer, John

A rotund gentleman with bright blue eyes, thinning light brown hair and an easy-going manner, Botkin lives in Van Nuys, next door to Roy Rogers. The guitarist has three children (twelve-year-old Perry Jr., six-year-old Ted and two-year-old Molly) and is happily married to a non-professional.

He smilingly states, "I haven't found it necessary to make a change in wives yet. I haven't reached that pinnacle of success—and I don't want to!"

"Big Annie"

KNOWS WHAT YOU WANT TO HEAR

BIG ANNIE,"—solid, stolid and streamlined in an elephantine sort of way — is one of the newest and most valued employes of the Columbia Broadcasting System; an employe that will some day have much to say about the form and content of radio programs; an employe whose reports have already gained the respectful attention of important CBS executives and sponsors.

"Big Annie" is a program analyzer, the latest and largest in a series of such machines which Columbia researchers and engineers have been working with since 1937. A program analyzer, to over-simplify a technical explanation, is a mechanism that measures listeners' reactions to radio programs; a gadget that tells broadcasters exactly how people feel about their programs.

Instant Report

"Big Annie," for example, can sit quietly in a room where a hundred people are listening to a radio show, take down a detailed record of their simultaneously expressed opinions and then report at second-by-second intervals on how many people liked and how many disliked the program.

Suppose you have expressed a desire to take part in a program analyzer test. You may not realize it, but when you are invited to attend, it is because the broadcaster considers you "typical" of the kind of audience he wants to please. If, for example, he wants to test the popularity of a daytime serial, he would not invite octogenarian bankers or professional ballplayers to hear and judge his program. Neither would he be likely to call on young married suburban housewives for their reactions to a proposed new sports program.

Once in the studio, you are made aware of two electric push-buttons



Man With a Past

Being Radio's Highest Hooper-rated Daytime Newscaster Is Only One More in a Long List of Distinctive Achievements of Gil Martyn

Monday through Friday 10:00 a.m.—1:30 p.m. ABC-KECA

HIGHEST Hooper-rated daytime newscaster, Gil Martyn, who is at the ABC microphone each weekday at 10 a. m. and again at 1:30 p. m. to present "This Moving World," has had an interesting life of varied and distinguished achievements which well qualify him to be an able conveyor of world-enveloping news.

Talking with the tall, dark, athletic-looking newsman at KECA's new Highland studio, we discovered the following facts! He was born in Denver, Colorado, of English descent, was a violin prodigy at the age of twelve, when he gave his first concert in the Royal Conservatory in London. At the same time, his ambition as a boy was to be a brain surgeon, and it was with this goal in mind that he studied medicine for four years. But his well-laid plans went astray when he incurred a serious internal injury while playing polo.

Following his hospitalization, he turned to a journalistic career, although both music and medicine have remained of prime interest to the newsman. Today, he still delights particularly in doing air in-

terviews with prominent personages of the medical world and in doing the commentation for serious musical programs. Highlights of his radio career include his commentating assignment with the Detroit Symphony during the World's Fair in Chicago, and the memorable occasion when he was requested to do the English commentary for Italy's famed Rome Symphony.

His Record

Looking back over his distinctive record of activities on the ether waves, Martyn recalls that he has worked in about every major field of special events, was at the microphone to describe the Normandie's collapse when the giant ship was in harbor for repairs, was associated with Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt on a number of her broadcasts, has interviewed such world-renowned personages as Russia's Molotov, the late Wendell Willkie, Ambassador Kennedy, Madame and Generalissimo Chang Kai-Shek, Generals "Jimmy" Doolittle and "Hap" Arnold.

During his diverse career, Mr. Martyn has, in addition, held the position of assistant professor of

Hollywood apartment with his wife, Shirley, a former New York fashion writer. Martyn's particular pride is his eighteen-year-old son by a former marriage, Gil Martyn, Jr. Related the boy's father proudly: "He is holder of his high school's tennis championship and the inter-high school shotput record—and he will soon enter a diplomatic school to pursue the study of South American politics."

Gil, Sr. is as keen about sports as is his son. Forced to forsake riding, he now devotes what spare time his crowded schedule allows to tennis and swimming.

Aided Many

His chief avocation, however, continues to be helping youngsters interested in radio announcing to get a start. The two hundred and five graduates of his announcing school at Columbia are now working at various assignments all over the globe.

Martyn's hobbies have always been horses and dogs. Since his morning newscast is sponsored by Gro-Pup Dog Food, he regularly fea-

tures interesting canine tales on the program, and has received from ten to twelve thousand dog stories from his listeners, which he plans someday to have published in book form. He also keeps an extensive file of some five to six thousand letters from grateful members of the families of servicemen and women, whose stories he has told on his program. As much as is possible, these letters receive his personal attention and are meticulously answered.

Martyn's workday begins at six-thirty or seven in the morning when he reports to the studio news room to prepare material for his early (8:30 a. m.) broadcast (not heard locally). He remains at the studio to do his remaining two programs, and to continue checking and re-editing news until the middle of the afternoon. He spends at least one hour every day thoroughly digesting all the news periodicals and forming a synopsis of their contents. At least two hours weekly he devotes to the study of his extensive collection of dictionaries. He has a copy of every dictionary in use in the world today.

Boosts News Programs

One of the newsman's chief ambitions is to see the mediums of radio and slide-films on current events employed for the benefit of students in all school classrooms. He also expresses the opinion that the war has made people aware of the value of radio newscasts; he thinks news programs will retain their large listening audiences; he stresses the fact that news broadcasts should continue to be a daily part of everyone's radio habits.

He has complete faith in the eventual practical use of television, expects it to be put to effective use in the broadcasting of news events, and to a lesser extent, in newscasting.

Gil Martyn was the first newscaster to broadcast over a television station—WMBT in New York City. During this broadcast, as he read the news, he pointed out on maps, for the benefit of his seeing audience, the areas about which he was talking.

different to what you hear, you are to leave both buttons strictly alone. That's all you have to do while the program is on the air. "Big Annie" does the rest.

From where they may be seen at the top of the machine, two slowly revolving rolls of graph paper begin to unwind under the points of two vertically-fixed fountain pens. These pens are going to chart your reactions to the program you are about to hear—your favorable reactions on one roll of paper, your unfavorable reactions on the other. So long as you and your neighbors leave all buttons untouched the pens trace straight unwavering lines down the left-hand sides of the moving rolls of paper.

Tells the Story

But when you press a button, the affected pen—"Favorable" or "Unfavorable"—will move almost imperceptibly to the right. And so will the line that it traces. If fifty of your test group press the same button, the pen will move fifty times further to the right than it did under the impulse of your single reaction. At the conclusion of the test, experienced eyes can read from the completed charts exactly how the audience reacted to any given part of the program—how many liked the opening announcement, how many disliked the unexpected scream in the middle of the second scene, how many were indifferent to the detective's explanations at the end.

Because of its ability to report accurately and quickly, this newest program analyzer may add considerably to the radio audience's enjoyment. It can be used in auditions of proposed programs to determine in advance whether or not the untried show will be well received. It can be moved into dress rehearsals of established programs and reveal rough spots in time for them to be ironed out before broadcast.

In fact, the day may come when political candidates will ask "Big Annie" to tell them how their campaign speeches are getting across—what party pledges are winning favor and what platform planks are full of splinters.
