



to make a choice, Opie smiled, "Well, I'd rather make a livin'." And that brings us right back to that farm he "couldn't get away from."

Opie commutes daily between a ten-acre hog ranch in Van Nuys and his work at NBC. He and a hired man do all the jobs on the ranch, which borders Farmer Andy Devine's. Neighbor Devine raises hogs too, and not long ago Opie traded "a mean old sow who wouldn't watch her litter" to Andy for a fine Poland China—who died of heat the next day! Hog trading, warns the experienced Mr. Cates, is just as shrewd a fine art as horse trading. Sometime soon he plans to buy a hog from friend and fellow Arkie Bob Burns, a famous hog raiser. "Burns raises Berkshires and I raise Durocks, and I want to mix the breed," explained Opie, getting businesslike. "The difference between us is, Burns is interested in ribbons, and I'm interested in bacon. Yes, that'll be something, buying a hog from that Burns—I'm hoping to get the professional rate." Next fall Opie is going to put in a smoke house and a refrigeration system, and smoke and cure his own meat. As you may have gathered, his favorite dish is ham.

#### 1,000 Discs

This busy hog rancher who leads a band (or is it bandleader who raises hogs?) also does his own musical arrangements, a rare and wonderful accomplishment in a hog raiser—pardon—bandleader. Opie just likes music—all kinds. He has a record collection that numbers over a thousand discs, most of which are unobtainable now. His favorite is Louis Armstrong's "Sleepy Time Down South." When the information was volunteered that he could probably check on the price listing of some of those precious records, he looked up a little suspiciously and said firmly, "I wouldn't sell a one of them, no matter how much money they would bring." To repeat—the man likes music.

His list of favorites include Jack Teagarden, Red Nichols, Benny Goodman's old crew, and Louis Armstrong's band as the best. He names Goodman as the top clarinetist, but doesn't think his own style has been influenced as a result. He doesn't like any of the present day big bands, and when challenged, could not name a favorite. Then he brightened, "I guess my favorite band nowadays is Opie Cateses'."

"Jazz was good when it was young and spontaneous," he says regretfully. "When it got taken up and popularized, it lost something. I

## RADIO: West ★ National and International

### Strike

Two of radio's national networks were severely crippled last Wednesday (September 12) when engineers affiliated with the National Association of Broadcast Engineers and Technicians staged a mass walkout. Their grievance? More money.

The sudden strike, which resulted in the engineers abandoning their control boards at three o'clock that afternoon, caused the American Broadcasting Company to go off the air completely in this area when no one could be found to man the KECA transmitter. NBC, the other network affected, was off the air for only a brief period and not in this area, where KFI is its local outlet. CBS-KNX, KHJ-Don Lee-Mutual, KFI and other local stations were not affected in that they have contracts with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and have no affiliation with the independent NABET union.

As the strike went on, executives of both networks were pressed into service, doing a commendable job of putting programs on the air.

At 4:40 p.m. last Thursday, the strike was called off. The five hundred striking engineers returned to work but their union continued negotiations in an attempt to come to a satisfactory agreement as to their dispute.

### Associated Moving In

Van C. Newkirk, vice president in charge of West Coast operations for the Associated Broadcasting Corporation, announced completion of negotiations for Hollywood network headquarters to be located at 6000 Sunset Boulevard. Occupation is expected within forty-five days.

Now in construction, the building is designed with recording facilities and audience studios in addition to office space.

### Fall Is Here

As early as three and four o'clock, they gathered to await the six o'clock broadcast and amused themselves by happily comparing autographs and pictures of their idol. ### A Little Sweet, Please

Jive fans like light classics and semi-classical musical music as well as "gutbucket" swing, according to the hepsters themselves, so Al Jarvis now is devoting a half-hour of his three-and-a-half-hour original "Make-Believe Ballroom" on KFWB to the more serious type of melody. Honest!

Last week Jarvis played fifteen minutes of music by Andre Kostelanetz on the Ballroom, and asked listeners whether they would like such music as a regular feature of the program. Hundreds of letters and cards came in, more than 95% of them approving the idea.

Typical comment: "I think you should by all means play some of the semi-classical records. I dig Ellington, Hines, Basie, Goodman, etc., but—as to Kostelanetz, Gould, Rose, Gershwin, etc.—more, more, more! Let's hear all kinds of the best."

that there couldn't have been a happier choice.

### Parallels are Few

Regardless of how aptly he emulates Nero Wolfe on the air, in private life there aren't many parallels. Wolfe, for instance, never moves his 400 pounds from behind his desk, and Archie, his secretary-leg man, played by Charles Victor, does everything Wolfe's own feet should do.

Bushman, on the other hand, has always been an ardent believer in physical exercise . . . boxing, wrestling, bike racing, distance running, weight lifting. In "Ben Hur," his last great picture, Bushman himself and no double raced past the cameras forty times for the Roman chariot race scene . . . a chore the very thought of which would have turned Nero Wolfe pale. In fact, when he was seventeen he worked so intensely at physical exercise that he had a nervous breakdown.

Because Rex Stout himself is an authority on rare orchids, he made Nero Wolfe also a collector, and hinged the solution of several of his earlier Wolfe mysteries on the exotic flower. Bushman thinks orchids are nice but there are other things he likes better. Amethysts, for instance, and Great Danes. At one time, Bushman had 300 of the dogs on his Maryland estate.

Possibly one of the reasons why Bushman is so able to convey the character over the air is because he is as fond of what might be termed "a mouthful of words" as is the detective. Both Wolfe and Bushman like the sound of a good sentence . . . Wolfe because he so often is able thereby to confound and impress a character of lower mentality, and Bushman because he acquired a liking for words when he played in stock companies in his youth. Like most such actors, he enjoys the sound of a well-developed phrase and the feeling of it as it rolls over his tongue. He always renders Wolfe's more verbose lines in the script with a very obvious relish.

### No Smile

Now in his 60's, the famous profile that made Bushman the matinee idol of the pre-twenties is still very much in evidence. Throughout the taking of the pictures which illustrate Radio Life's story, Bushman kept it in rigid immobility, never once betraying so much as the flicker of a smile. After the photographing was over, someone remarked,

"Mr. Bushman, I've never seen anyone look so impassive."

Bushman broke out in laughter.

"That," he said, "is the type of remark I love!"

Born in Virginia, Bushman started his stage career at thirteen doing bits in Baltimore stock companies against his family's wishes. Al-

though they didn't forcibly stop him, they tried their best to convince him that he should be a priest or a doctor.

But Bushman knew where his heart belonged. By the time he was full grown his stage experience had turned him into a seasoned actor. From Baltimore he went on the road with stock companies, finally landing in Chicago with the old Essanay Film Company. The rest is history. For eight years he was the nation's No. 1 celluloid hero . . . the first male star to receive the adulation only America's theater-goers can heap upon their idols.

During his film career he made 424 starring pictures . . . an all-time record for a single actor. No man who has been that active can easily think of retirement. So, after he withdrew from motion pictures, he decided to launch a new career via the airlines. In 1932 he began it over a Chicago station, starring in an air serial titled "Stepmother" one of the first so-called soap operas. Seven years of this and he decided to retire again. He came to Hollywood, bought a house, but he still couldn't settle down. For Bushman, settling down just won't work. Before he knew it, he was back in harness again. If family tradition has anything to do with it, it will be a long time before he'll really be able to resign himself to loafing. For his mother is still active . . . and she's only 98!

"Whenever something has to be cut, the comic cuts the music. I've been lucky, though. Some bands are reduced to playing just a fill and sneaking in behind a commercial."

### Family Fans

Sharing musical ranch life with Opie is wife, Kay, and "four young rowdies": Robert, 7, Dixie, 5, Dinah, 3, and Linda, 1. They listen to Daddy being funny on "Meet Me At Parky's," but they like Parky better. So far, they have shown no musical talent (Linda still has several years to make good), and Opie isn't sure that he would like them to be musicians. "However, if they really wanted to be, I wouldn't stop them," he adds. He claims that his own musical interest started at the age of five, but that he didn't start to study seriously until he was 17. Between those years, he mastered piano, mandolin, violin and clarinet. He has studied the classics, and when asked his preferences in that field replied, "Well, I sorta lean toward Ravel and Debussy and those boys, but Wagner is my favorite

composer, and Sibelius 1st Symphony is my favorite work."

Opie's ambition is to retire eventually to a big ranch in Oregon and devote his time to, you guessed it—the hogs. But what do you want to bet that those one thousand records go with him?



well known to listeners of "Those We Love" and "Glamor Manor," and has appeared as guest star on many programs. But his "Nero Wolfe" por-


trayal is the first time that the Stout hero has been brought to the air in series form, and listeners agree

haired son. "You may do your sound effects, John—then depart."





A quiz show strictly for laughs is CBS' "Trading Post," emceed by snow-haired Art Baker and scripted by pretty Beth Barnes, who maintain: "We try to get a laugh out of every question—if not, then on the answer."

It is Miss Barnes who dreams up such wacky questions as the above, as well as other gags that round out the hilarious half-hour fun-fest.

"Sometimes a crazy idea comes to me in the middle of the night, and I have to get right out of bed to jot it down!" Miss Barnes told us. "But the gags aren't half as hard to think up as those questions. I have probably the most extensive store of knowledge about the most useless facts in the world!"

### Rugged Research

Spending three days a week doing the writing chores for "Trading Post," Beth Barnes regularly peruses the dictionary, five or six question and fact books, keeps her eyes, ears and mind open constantly for something new in the way of a gag question, and checks meticulously with innumerable sources of information to make certain she has her facts straight.

"Once I called the planetarium and asked if there are as many stars in the little dipper as the big one. Another time I phoned every riding academy in town to discover which color of horses can stand the heat better—black or white. On another occasion, for a gag, I called the zoo and asked if I could rent an ostrich

Above the desk, framed and autographed, hangs the 1945 Distinguished Achievement Award which Radio Life presented the "Date With Judy" show as "the program making the greatest advance."

Husband Tom also uses the same desk and typewriter to work on the "Corliss Archer" program, which he weekly produces. "You should see each of us bustle into this room, shove the other's work aside and spread our own all over the place," laughed Helen.

"We also have to watch each other. I often catch myself saying to Tom, 'Oh golly, I've got a swell idea for next week's . . . aah, well, never mind!', or once in awhile, I'll ask him, 'What are you doing on "Corliss" next week?' He just smiles and says, 'Oh, nothing much. You wouldn't be interested!'"

"It's funny that we both happen to be doing a show about 'teen-agers,'" Miss Mack continued, "but

actually the two programs are not at all alike."
