HAT sprightly old fellow who lifted his priestly robes for a surreptitious try at leaping the hedge a la crosby in an amusing sequence of "Going My Way" and that salty old character, "Judge Fitz," whose rascally, warm-hearted interpreta-tion of the law is now delighting air-dialers, are neither of them a far cry from their portrayer, Barry Fitz-gerald. This, Radio Life discovered, when we enjoyed a pleasant visit with the skilled character actor at his unpretentious Hollywood home.

Mr. Fitzgerald, looking exceeding-ly natty in a blue checked sports shirt, casual beige slacks and canvas shoes, and speaking with all the lilt of Ireland in his voice, talked with zest about "Judge Fitz," a character originally created for motion pic-tures by his friend, Nate Slott. It is Fitzgerald's first regular air stint; he had turned down all previous offers, waiting for the character he felt was right for him. He believes "Barnard Fitz" is it. Judge of the District Court of Vincent County, Fitz is an absent-minded, mischievous old soul who was formerly the town barber. In that capacity, and maintaining that he would just as soon go back to his barber shop at at any time, he criticizes the law as much as he enforces it, and slyly finds a loophole when he thinks a culprit needs a helping of simple kindness.

Judge Fitz's chief antagonizer is "The Sheriff" (played by Bill Green) who holds to the letter of the law,

Now He Belongs

A Studio Policeman Once Ejected David Ellis from CBS' Studio A, But the Actor Returned to Establish a Place for Himself in Radio

HAT have been my biggest thrills in Hollywood radio?" David Ellis repeated

our query, getting a smiling glint of reminiscence in his dark brown eyes. He settled his long six-foot, three-inch frame into a comfortable cushioned booth at Brittingham's Restaurant, and took another healthy swallow of milk (He downs two quarts a day, two glasses with every meal).

"It gave me a big kick to do the "This Is My Best' broadcast from Studio A at CBS," he declared, beaming broadly. "The last time I was in California, when I was about fifteen years old, a studio cop kicked me out of that same studio and told me to stay out, I didn't belong there."

Still little more than a youth, in his early twenties, David Ellis is. now an established radio actor, wellknown to alr-dialers for his distinctive work as "Captain Friday" on "Adventures by Morse"; title role on "Doctor Paul"; and as a regular performer on "Twelve Players" (he played the lead in "Concerto for

Hatred"), "That's a Good Idea" and "The Whistler".

Debut at Ten

The enterprising Mr. Ellis was a mere tot of ten when he made his initial bow before the microphone on a school program "I was scared to death," he confessed. He recognized radio as his aspiration, however, and during the ensuing years, overlooked no opportunity in learning all that he could about the art. He studied at the RCA Institute, at NBC's Northwestern Radio Institute, became an earnest young apprentice on Chicage's local stations, was one of Les Mitchell's WBBM "Midwest Mobilizers".

At nineteen, he was penning scripts for a popular daytime serial. In one week, his schedule included twelve broadcasts to do, five scripts to write, plus school. He peeled off twenty-five pounds from overwork.

Is Writer, Too

David still harbors other radio aspirations in addition to acting. He is currently writing a new airshow which he hopes soon to sell. It is a series of half-hour realistic dramas entitled "Nightmares". He has no desire to act on his own program, because he believes that would cause him to lose perspective. He doesn't even want to actend the rehearsals. "I just want to sit home and listen," he maintained.

The youthful actor lives in a Los Angeles apartment, is unmarried, likes to spend most of his spare time writing. He works at a typewriter, using only four fingers and looking deadly serious, even when turning out laugh lines.

David's mother and father still live in Chicago. They are both lawyers and met the first time in court. "You should hear some of the conversations they have at the dinner table," laughed Ellis.

His folks want him to come back to the midwest, but David declares an undying devotion to California. He enjoys swimming, and every Thursday night, joins the horsebackriding, picnicking "CBS Night Riders".

David's pals call him "Dave", but his mother doesn't like the nickname and David, himself, prefers his more formal name for use on the air.

The actor drives a maroon "41" Chevrolet, likes to travel; has been in forty-seven of the forty-eight states. "So far, I've somehow missed Maine."

Besides broadcasting in the onceforbidden Studio A in Columbia Square, as Jimmy Wallington's substitute on "This Is My Best", he also treasures the thrill of stepping in for Joe Kearns as the narrator on "Suspense".

"I also still find my mouth hanging open whenever I see a movie star," David admitted further. "It's fun being in Hollywood, and I'm still a kid about it."

Mr. Fitzgerald has no fears of radio nor objections to being tied down to a microphone each week. "It's a nice easy job," he asserted, injecting a twinkle of laughter into his genial Irish brogue.

Having been in Hollywood for an entire decade doing a commendable job with every type of character role in an innumerable list of pictures, Barry cannot help but be a bit amused by the lavish attention that has suddenly been focused on him since his Oscar-winning performance in "Going My Way."

The "Oscar" statuette that occupies a place of prominence in the living room of his home is not the coveted one awarded him by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, but a comedy figurine of a haughty Marine with his large nose held high in the air. It is the "Oscar" presented to Barry by the Marine Corps' own magazine, "The Leatherneck," in honor of the actor's "Going My Way" portrayal.

The Academy "Oscar" stands on a shelf in an inconspicuous corner of the actor's den. The statuette now has a new head, the original one having been broken while Barry was practicing golf swings in the house.

Golfer

Colf is one of the actor's favorite pastimes. He plays it every chance he gets. but steadfastly admits that he's "the worst golfer in Hollywood."

Fifty seven years old, twinkleeyed, lantern-jawed Barry Fitzgerald is a bachelor, lives in a modest seven-room house, tended several days a week by a hired housekeeper. He doesn't cook, eats his meals out-at restaurants or, often, at the home of his brother, film actor Arthur Shields. (Barry's real name is William Joseph Shields.)

Evidences of Mr. Fitzgerald's love of art, music and books abound in his home. The paintings of old masters decorate the walls. (We saw only one portrait of the actor himself—a character study of him as "Flutter Good" in "The Plow and the Stars," a role he played in London with the Abbey Theater group in 1930, later recreating it on the screen.)

As one enters the front door of the Fitzgerald abode, the first item seen is the piano, music spread open on the rack. The actor plays well the melodies of noted classical composers, and he spends many of his hours at home at the keyboard.

At night, he seldom goes out, sometimes has a few friends in, more often sits and reads. His favorite author is Thomas Wolfe.

Fitzgerald is five feet, three inches tall, has thinning gray hair, is almost always smoking a pipe and has what he terms "a smoker's cough"

The wife of the genial senior partner of the coast-to-coast "Vox Pop" CBS program has a 52-weeks-a-year Christmas shopping job to provide the gifts which her husband and Warren Hull give away each Monday to their guest interviewees from the armed forces and ranks of war workers.

Louise Johnson, travelling with "Vox Pop" show—by plane, train, automobile, boat, bus, horse and buggy and on foot—probably has visited more department stores, specialty shops and out-of-the-way merchant establishments than any comparative shopper in America.

And "Mrs. Santa Claus" undoes her purse-strings to the tune of hundreds of dollars a week!

How She Started

Mrs. Johnson has given up a comfortable life on the Johnson ranch at Wimberley, Texas. Her son is an officer in the Marine Corps on overseas duty, and her daughter is married.

She doesn't know exactly how she got the job of shopping for the "Vox Poppers" but she has a suspirion that it started with one or two requests to pick up this or that item for a soldier's mother, sailor's sweetheart or marine's wife.

Now she's corresponding secretary for the entire "Vox Pop" crew... Parks and Warren, program director Dave Grant and Rogers Brackett, assistant director of the show.

On tour, the Johnsons and Hull usually arrive at the broadcast location on Friday or Saturday prior to the Monday evening show. Grant and Brackett have preceded them to size up the possibilities of the program, and, by the time the "Vox Poppers" show up, have twelve or fifteen candidates for the air eliminated from the hundreds of volunteers. Saturday and Sunday, Parks and Warren pare down the finalists to the six or seven they will interview on the broadcast.

All this time, Louise Johnson is quietly working. Armed with her favorite flat-heeled shoes, a note-

jumps a foot and his face turns red in embarrassment. It isn't that he has a guilty conscience; as far as he remembers, he's never even known anyone with that moniker but, nevertheless, he reacts to it like an announcer pulling a bad fluff...

Rinehart's "Beulah" phobia started a few weeks ago when on a Sunday he took his wife and young daughter to an evening church service. Five-year-old Shirley Ann was a little new at this church-going routine and when the minister requested Miss Beulah, the church organist, to come forward to play for the song service, she turned to her parents and inquired in clear, carrying tones that reverberated through the church, "Did somebody bawl for Beulah?"

The effect on the congregation was stunning, but after a momentary silence someone snickered. Then followed a most un-church-like cackle of merriment, joined in by even the minister. It was several minutes before he could carry on the service.

Is Beulah's Phrase

The incident, however embarrassing to the Rinehart family, is a real tribute to the success of a handsome, well-groomed young man who has put the once-popular, though now-old-fashioned, name of "Beulah" back on the lips of millions of Americans. The line which little Shirley Ann voiced to the consternation of her parents is, of course. the This Is the Saga of a Theater Manager's Son Who Had a Liking for the Stage and for the Carefree Philosophy of Gentle Colored Folk

now famous catch-phrase which, with another, "Love dat man!" is the air trade mark of Marlin Hurt. If you are a real, dyed-in-the-hide radio fan you already know whô he is. If you are only an average listener you may have difficulty placing that name but, as "Beulah," the one-day-a-week maid of the Fibber McGee and Molly program who often tops Fibber's cantankerous humor with these magic phrases—and who now is heard Sundays on a CBS airshow of "her" own—you will have no trouble in identifying the gentleman. After fourteen years of Indifferent attention from Dame Fortune, he finally parlayed a natural gift for mimicry and a top-notch imagination into a winning ticket that pays off weekly in plenty of "lettuce."

Wagers and squabbles over "Beulah's" real sex and color bring stacks of fan mail every week. All of which makes Marlin Hurt feel pretty good, but he hopes it won't weaken the loyalty of these fans when they learn that instead of being female, colored and romantic, he is thoroughly male, white and happily married.

Though it was only comparatively recently that he became a radio star, Marlin Hurt is no newcomer to the theatrical profession. The fictional "Beulah" was born in Duquoin, Illinois, along with Marlin on May 27, 1905, but a lot of years in-

tervened before "she" stepped up to the mike and made "her" air debut. Marlin got his first professional stage experience when he was ten. He pestered his dad, who was a theater manager, for a chance to earn extra money during school vacations and first was offered the job of prop boy. "Nix, Dad," said Marlin. "I'm going to be an actor when I grow up. Can't you give me something better than that?" The elder Hurt relented and gave his son a chance to strut his stuff as a spear carrier in mob scenes. In a couple of years he was doing monologues in dialect as a fill-in between acts while the scenes were being shifted. Meanwhile, in school, he took part in class plays and upon reaching high school played leads in many of the dramatic class productions. As a student, Marlin recalls, he maintained only average grades ... being more interested in the theater and playing the saxophone than in attempting to win local fame as a scholar.

Effortless Imitation

Another hobby was his fascination for the colored people who lived in Duquoln. He liked their carefree philosophy of life and was intensely interested in their manner of speech. He learned that by studying their pronunciation and tone inflections he could—with a little practice—im-

itate the Negro dialect with scant effort.

Upon graduation from high school, however, Marlin forsook his theatrical ambitions temporarily and went to work in a cigar factory. After three years rolling "stogies" he decided that the cigar business had little lure for him and he quit. He soon regretted his rash act as jobs were scarce and the only other job he could get was as a coal miner. "First tobacco, then coal," says Hurt. "It seemed that no matter what I did

Approaching Mrs. Johnson with another man at his side, obviously a store detective, he asked, "Something, Madam?"

"Just looking," Louise replied. Before their mystified gaze, she took the notebook from her purse and hastily penciled an entry. Then she breezed down the aisle and out on the street.

Mrs. Johnson laughs delightedly as she recalls the episode.

"I know that floorwalker thought I was a professional shopper from a rival store or a shoplifter. You can imagine his surprise when I came back to this store two days dater. His eyes popped when I paid cash for quite a number of lovely and valuable gifts."

Louise is constantly trying to think of new and unusual gifts. The presents she has bought range from baby carriages to puppy dogs, and from tocking horses to sets of silver. If she discovers that one of the service men to appear on the show has his heart set on an Angora cat for his wife, she'll find one'somewhere in town.

Often Mrs. Johnson learns that men in uniform want gifts they can send to their families back home. She has walked miles looking for objects "which just are not in stock any more" but which Private Jones' mother "would love to have."

Canoe for Seaman

Antiques are a favorite with many guests. As browsing in antique shops is a hobby with Louise she usually locates some rare items. In one of her jaunts, to New London, Connecticut, she found a century-old baby buggy in the shape of a cance. It was presented to a seaman on the broadcast.

Louise makes a habit of buying all "Vox Pop" presents at the local stores where the broadcast originates. "I want them to feel free to exchange the gifts if they don't suit," she says. "I buy with the right to exchange and the stores always stand behind their merchandise." But her record of exchanges is very small. There are practically no returns unless in the matter of sizes.

Soft spoken and neighborly in her approach, Louise Johnson packs a deadly wallop for black market dealers. Since taking on her job, she has learned values and knows prices better than almost any woman in America. By the cost of merchandise and the availability of certain restricted commodities she can smell "black market" instantly.

Louise realizes the presents are a

big attraction on the "Vox Pop" show for recipients and listeners alike. She makes certain that Parks and Warren broadcast accurate descriptions. She never permits them to say simply, "a set of table silver". They must describe if it is sterling and give the number of pieces, pattern and brand. She even insists on "A Duncan Phyfe tilt-top tea table", a tongue twister likely to throw any experienced broadcaster.

Shy herself, she sees no story in her activities, and always is surprised when reporters want to interview her. She insists, "I'm only excess baggage".

my life work was destined to go up in smoke."

But Marlin couldn't get the thought of a show business career out of his mind. Meanwhile he had developed into a tenor of more than average ability and so decided that perhaps singing might be his forte. Hearing that a St. Louis radio station was friendly to newcomers with talent, he went there and won a spot on a sustaining program. Hurt has never been out of a radio job since.

Later he went to Chicago and joined "Tom" (Bud Vandover) and "Harry" (Gordon Vandover) who were singing there. Marlin took the radio moniker of "Dick," thus forming the trio of "Tom, Dick and Harry." That was in July, 1929. The combination was successful and soon became a network feature. Marlin remained with the trio for 13 years. In February, 1943, Bud Vandover (Tom) died suddenly a few mlnutes before going on the air, thereby breaking up the long-time association.

During the intervening years Hurt had appeared on other programs including one of his own wherein he sang, played the saxophone and did dialect parts. It was on this show that "Beulah" was first heard. From the number of letters that poured in following "her" debut, Marlin felt sure he had a winner worthy of something more than a fill-in charactor on a sustaining program. He withdrew "Beulah" from the show and spent his spare time perfecting the character.

When Hurt felt he was well enough acquainted with "Beulah" to maintain a high level of listener interest in the character week after week, he migrated to Hollywood where he found a spot on the Fred Brady program. There he aroused the interest of Don Quinn, writer of the Fibber McGee and Molly program, and Quinn wrote "Beulah" into the script as the McGee's irrepressible oneday-a-week maid of all work. That put Marlin and his brain-child into

radio's big time, and this year he is starred in his own airer.

Is Real Person

Concentrating on development of his brain-child, Hurt has given "Beulah" every characteristic of a real human being, except visibility.

To Hurt, "Beulah" is as real as if she were flesh and blood. He always speaks of her in an objective, third-person fashion, describing her as being "in her thirties, man-crazy, about 140 pounds in weight with good teeth and a flashing smile. She likes short skirts and high 'heels. Beulah isn't lazy. She's the sort of person who'd say: "All work and no play makes jack—and lots of it!"
