HE STIRRING story of the Theater Guild-its fantas. tic creation following the first World War, its expansion into the realm of radio at the end of World War II and its aims and aspirations in this new medium —was told to the ABC program's first-night audience by Lawrence Langner, the Guild's co-director, with these words;

"Ladies and gentlemen, I want to welcome you to the opening night of "The Theater Guild on the Air." In the theater, opening nights are very exciting affairs. You sit expectantly in your seat—the lights go down and there is a magical glow on the curtain. To me, one of the most beautiful things in life is this moment of expectancy. The curtain rises. We hope for a great experience. Too often it's denied us, but every once in a while a fine play is revealed-sometimes a masterpiece.

"That is the excitement of the theater. Thanks to our sponsor (U.S. Steel), we hope to bring you some of this excitement on our program...

"About this same time after the end of World War I, a small group of young people who loved the the-ater were meeting at my apartment to form the Theater Guild. We took ourselves very seriously, which was just as well—because no one else did.

Love Was Capital "We had very little financial capi-

tal—as a matter of fact, just five hundred dollars. But our real capital was our love of the good things of the theater and our faith that the American public, given the opportunity, would share this love with us.

"Our faith was more than justified. We have since produced over one hundred and fifty plays in the theater, some gay, some serious, some both gay and serious, and now we are bringing them to you over the air. "We shall give you the cream of the crop, and where possible, the actors and actresses who created the parts in the theater. We shall bring you the best plays of the best authors—Eugene O'Neill, S. N. Behrman, Maxwell Anderson, Philip Barry, Ferenc Molnar, and last but not least. George Bernard Shaw.

"Speaking of Mr. Shaw, I recently received a cablegram from him, reading, "The answer is definitely no." Since I hadn't asked him for any-

The Hick Who Produces the Hope Show

"Cappy", or "Fuse-Face", Is Smart Business Man on Radio Row, But a Disheveled Farmer in Spare Time

> became a network producer, and three years ago took on the job of production head for the agency, Foote, Cone and Belding.

> His main problem with Hope is that the comic wants to jam twice as much material into a half hour as it's possible. Next in brain twisting processes is keeping the transportation rolling (Hope has put on only one studio show since Pearl Harbor). There are 42 in the Hope troupe and getting 42 across country and into hotels gives Cappy a big headache.

Hope Helps

But Hope lightens the general pain by being such a superb showman. According to Capstaff, the comic goes over every bit of the material his seven writers turn in. He checks the jokes he thinks good, double checks the sure-fire gags, and draws an egg for the flat ones. Inasmuch as Hope tells a gag in three lines, complete from bulld-up to pay-off, the wording is extremely important. "He'll work for one hour on a one-word change," observed the producer about Hope. "By the time he goes on the air, he knows his gags by heart." But the script is invariably seven minutes over at final rehearsal and that's when Cappy faces his No. 1 problem.

Hope's producer also supervises the work preceding the comic's appearance from a camp. Because the script is designed to fit the audience, a survey is made before the Hope troupe plays a camp. Two weeks before broadcast time, guide material is handed over to the writers. This material is gained from the public relations officer and especially from hitch-hiking soldiers whom the surveyors pick up and guiz for slants on G.I. sentiment.

Cappy's fondest memory is the per-(Please Turn to Page 28)

"CAPPY", WHO HAS SERVED as producer of Hope's air show for the past two years, used to be a radio engineer, twisted the dials for the same program for three seasons before turning into a cue-thrower.

RODUCER of Bob Hope's sophisticated top comedy show (it led the rating list for eight months out of last season's nine) is a reserved, six-foot-oner, Al Capstaff—"Cappy" for short, or "Fuse Face" because he always has a cigar stuck in his mouth. Cappy delights, however, in being a hick.

During business hours he presents the appearance of a well-groomed executive. On his two and a half acre ranch in the Valley, on the other hand, Cappy "dresses" in a pair of shorts and sneakers. Recently he ran a tractor to uproot thirteen trees and currently he's putting up a corral for his three race horses.

One of the horses is now running at Tia Juana. The other two, brood mares, are stabled in central California. "I've tried to route the Hope show through central California for the two years I've been producing it, but to date I've had no luck," grinned blond, blue-eyed Cappy. It's a wonder he hasn't covered every inch of the country, for he's traveled 100,000 miles in the time he's produced Hope's show ... a "join the Hope troupe and see the world" proposition.

Cappy became interested in radio when he was eight, when his father bought him a crystal set which he hooked to his bed springs. By the time he was in high school in the early thirties, Cappy made bold to apply for an engineering job at WODA, Patterson, New Jersey. "Take this copy of the Saturday Evening Post and read this page," they told him. "But I want to be an engineer," young Capstaff remonstrated.

From Jersey

"You'll have to combine two jobs here," he was told. "And you'll make a fine announcer if you get rid of your 'dese, dems, and dozes'"... "I really was from Jersey," explains Cappy. "Lived right near Palisades Park and remember when they built the Cyclone roller coaster. Before taking on passengers, they gave it a trial run, filled with sand bags and me!"

For several years, young Capstaff was a radio engineer—for three seasons he twisted the dials for the Hope show he's now producing. Then he

Everything But Boogie

HE FIRST thing one should note about Wilbur Hatch, CBS musical director, is the fact that the memorable music he orchestrates and conducts on an impressive handful of CBS' top dramatic programs are melodies of his own making.

To create the score of one show alone, Monday night's "Screen Guild Players," Hatch spends from twelve to sixteen hours writing the music and seven or eight hours orchestrating it. He attends the program's initial rehearsal Friday evening when the cast assembles to read the script, then goes home and spends his weekend working on a musical score to suit the theme and the mood of the play to be presented. This practice enables him to study the actors' delivery of dialogue and to create appropriate melodic embellishments.

This procedure is duplicated several times weekly as the conductor composes and orchestrates additional musical scores for "The Whistler," "Hollywood Preview," "Twelve Players" and a goodly number of the other popular programs emanating from Hollywood's Columbia Square studios.

Modest

Hatch modestly terms himself "a slow composer and an average orchestra leader." He calls his musicmaking "a lot of hard work." He sometimes works as many as four hours on one idea, then throws it out as unsatisfactory.

Bill Hatch turned to music professionally when faulty eyesight forced him to forego a career in chemistry, the subject in which he majored at the University of Chicago. He was graduated from there with a bachelor of science degree.

Hatch is now forty-three. He is light-complexioned, quiet-mannered and good-natured. He wears glasses, stands five feet, seven and a half inches tall and admits that he is trying to take off some of his excess weight.

The musical director is married to Peggy Mathews, formerly a professional blues singer. The couple has three children—sixteen-year-old Robert, fourteen-year-old Nancy and two-year-old Margaret. Bobby and Nancy both play the plano—"but are not exactly musical geniuses," their father added smilingly. "They do, however, have a fine appreciation of good music."

The Hatch family frequently attends concerts and programs at the Hollywood Bowl.

Mr. Hatch admits that he seldom listens to the radio. "I don't even know what my 'competitors' are doing," he smiled. "Don't even know the theme songs of other shows."

Hatch himself wrote the theme of "The Whistler" series. It is a fragment of melody he originally created as musical enhancement for "troubled mind" sequences on the old "Gateway to Hollywood" air series.

Interested Spectator

As musical conductor on the "Screen Guild" shows, Bill Hatch has watched many of Hollywood's most outstanding dramatists at work.

An airing of several weeks ago presented "The Vallant," with Dorothy McGuire as its feminine star. "I don't believe," Hatch remarked during our interview, "I've ever enjoyed watching anyone perform as much as I did watching her. One could almost see her mind working out every step of the play."

The CBS maestro also related for us the amusing coincidence that brought about his first meeting with another artist whose work he greatly admires, Alec Templeton. "My wife called me at the studio one day and told me to guess who was coming to our house for a party that night," recalled Bill. "Alec Templeton!"

It seems that radio producer Thomas Freebairn-Smith and his wife had planned a party, with the famous blind planist among the invited guests. Then they encountered the (Please Tyrn to Page 28)

We realize that to accrue a gigantic, screaming following you've got to murmur softly into a mike so that the folks standing a foot away can't hear anything but a hiss. It also helps if you close your eyes, sag at the knees and lean at a forty-five degree angle.

Jack knows all this, too. But he can't help singing! Out loud, too, as if he enjoyed it, and wanted everyone around to hear and enjoy it with him.

Most people who've been accustomed to the dronings of crooners have been shaken awake by Jack's personality voice. And they've said so, in no uncertain terms. Jack used to raise hogs, until the war took away his hog tenders. Now the pens are a great ghost town, for Douglas gave away the pigs to newspaper columnists and editors (and created quite a stir in the process).

Appropriately enough, the Douglas Ranch is called "Loose Ends." Driving along Reseda Boulevard, one is apt to speed past the place unless he knows exactly where to turn off, for from the road, it appears to be a dense jungle. A narrow, twisting lane leads through this overgrowth back to the large, rambling L-shaped house.

Quiet?

One is impressed with the utter quiet—not a sound comes through but the cheeping of the birds. But once the big knocker on the front door is used, all pandemonium breaks loose. Scout Looms

Shortly after that, a certain talent scout spotted an attractive blonde in one of the popular Vine Street restaurants. As soon as she discovered he was on the watch-out for new material, she shyly asked: "Could you use a good comedian?"

"Why-a-a-a, ye-e-e-s, but we'd have to hear a recording first."

Without batting her blue eyes, the blonde reached under the table and produced a record. That record did the trick, for the blonde was Mrs. Jack Douglas and the recording was Jack's audition disc, introducing him as a performer as well as gag-writer. It resulted in his engagement on the "What's New?" show, making (Please Turn to Page 35)

panel board of planes rarely know that their scholarly teacher is the same young singer whose buoyant enthusiasm in putting over a song has garnered him 3,000 fan clubs! On the afternoons before each show and on three evenings a week following the program, Jack is at the school, lecturing and directing the rehabilitation studies of discharged than a song!

While he was still a student at Hollywood High School, Jack formed a rhythm trio with two pals. When the Rhythm 'boys, Harry Barris, Al Rinker and Bing Crosby, left the Cocoanut Grove in 1931, 16-year-old Jack and his trio, the Ambassadors, applied for the job and landed it. For about a year they were featured at the Grove at night, and went to school in the daytime. After graduation, all thoughts of being an architect, Jack's original ambition, disappeared and the Ambassadors went east with radio in mind.

Rapid Rise

The boys hooked up with Kate Smith, Eddie Cantor, and Ray Bloch. Then Kate Smith gave Jack a solo opportunity and after that he was on his way. Last spring Jack Smith emerged as a new personality to be reckoned with. He was featured singer on "Gaslight Gayeties" when the producer decided to try Jack with some comedy lines. Smith proved such an able comedian he became one of the regular characters on the show. Consequently, Jack's present CBS series finds him handling dialogue as well as ditties.

Jack was born in Seattle, Washing-

ton, the son of an Annapolis naval officer, on November 10, 1915. Coincidentally, that was the same day and year that the future Mrs. Smith was born. Mrs. Smith is the former Victoria Schertzinger, niece of the late Victor Schertzinger, film director and composer.

The Smiths met when Victoria's cousin, whom Jack was courting at the time, arranged a double birthday party. Their wedding anniversary is —appropriately—November 10!

Jack has a hatred of idolatry, and sees to it that the Jack Smith Fan Clubs resort to none of the bobbysox hysterics associated with the crooner craze. Another fan letter, signed by 620 people, says they consider Jack "one of the finest and most outstanding young singers on the radio today." Which some think is a much nicer (and much quieter way of complimenting an artist than the audible squealing and sighing that the fans of some popular singers seem to substitute for attention. Jack is most appreciative.

Though Jack's brother, Walter Reed, was a well known leading man in pictures before the war, Hollywood is one of the things on Jack's black list. (And he should know, having been brought up in the film capital.) He believes that married couples, particularly those in show business, have a better chance for uninterrupted happiness away from movieland.

"You can't be in a different and beautiful girl's arms every other day —making pictures—and not eventually succumb. Radio is safer. All you can hug is the mike!" he says. But you don't even need to do that, Jack. Just stand back and sing!
