OU COULD feel the letdown in the studio, and you just knew the listeners at home were experiencing the same disap-

Whether it be at the microphone or at home, the Jordans are seldom apart—only during the "break" in their radio rehearsal, when they emerge on Vine Street to partake of a light lunch. Marian usually favors

sharp mind and a chubby good-natured face.

A penchant for getting in and out of mischief.

Unwitting victim of humorous incidents.

That's ex-Master Sergeant Ezra Stone, squeaky-voiced Henry of the "Aldrich Family," who was recently caught in the Army's demobilization program after four years of service and whose antics during that period proved that he never really stepped out of the Henry role.

Known as the only "all-American waterboy" for the Fourth Air Force Flyers' football team in California, Ezra was catapulted into the job of radio publicity director for the team because he happened to be standing near his commanding officer at the time.

Thus, with the rare acumen sometimes characteristic of the Army, Stone, who had seen only one football game in his life, was ordered to go ahead and be an expert. Gathering his bewildered wits together. he collected all the books on football he could find and proceeded to study the phraseology of the game as he would a radio script. As a result he became genuinely interested in the sport and ended up talking about "single wing" and "mouse-trapping" with the nonchalance of an expert.

In relating the saga of his experiences, Stone recalled the time, just before a night football game with the Washington Redskins, when he asked the secretary of the Los Angeles baseball team to call off his game because of the conflicting dates. The secretary, Stone said, became indignant, threatening, and ended a long tirade with an emphatic "NO."

Unique Tactics

Undaunted by the man's unneighborliness, Stone acquired an Army sound truck and paraded around the baseball park announcing the coming football game. With loud screams of pain, the surly secretary rushed out and threatened an injunction, to which Stone calmly replied, "It will be rather difficult, sir, to get an injunction on the United States Army."

The next night he and several of his "staff" walked through the parking lot of the baseball park and attached bumper signs to the rear of the cars, with the result that the citizens of Los Angeles were treated to the incongruous spectacle of baseball players 'unwittingly advertising a football game. The largest sign, of course, was attached to the secretary's car.

At another time, while operating the sound truck at eleven o'clock at night on Hollywood boulevard, his vehicle was suddenly surrounded by siren-wailing police cars converging from all directions. It turned out that the loud speaker had blared out through the valley for miles and people from as far away as neighboring towns were making the desk sergeant's formerly placid existence a nightmare with their complaints.

EX-MASTER SERGEANT Ezra Stone, who plays Henry Aldrich, experienced happenings in the Army that equalled Henry's air shenanigans.

Ezra also recalls the morning before an important game with Randolph Field, when he had to chauffeur All-American Bill Dudley to the field in a jeep. Dudley, the rivals' star, had played half the season with the Fourth Air Force before being transferred and as Ezra declares, "I really gave him a ride." Dudley arrived at the field white and shaken after that experience and, of course, Stone's team won the game.

His greatest thrill came the day General H. H. Arnold entered the field just as Jack Jacobs, the Flyers All-American from Oklahoma, caught the opening kickoff and raced down the field ninety-five yards for a touchdown

When his discharge came through. Ezra boarded a plane for the East wearing his uniform, but carrying the only civilian clothes he could buy because he wanted to meet his wife as a civilian. Just before the plane reached Washington, D. C., Ezra slunk into the plane's washroom with his suitcase and, balancing himself on one leg, proceeded to change his clothes. Then, before the startled gaze of the bug-eyed stewardess, he stepped out sartorially brilliant in a yellow sport shirt, slacks, brown suede jacket and light brown shoes. "No," she moaned, though with a faint tinge of admiration in her voice. "What happened to the soldier that went in there?" Stone told her

played a trumpet . . . and a gang-ster. In "Sons and Soldiers" he did a straight dramatic part, sans horn. An actor by the name of Gregory Peck was also in the cast.

When the life of the late, great jazz trumpet man, Bix Belderbecke-Young Man with a Horn"-is filmed, Leonard is pretty certain to be playing the lead, both dramatically and musically. Leonard has listened to and studied the records of the fabulous Bix and of Louis Armstrong since he first became a trumpet student and thinks they have both influenced his style. They are still his favorite trumpet players and he adds Harry James to that list as a popular favorite. "A musician hears so many records and jam sessions that when he plays he retains certain things that he remembers and admires. But remember, the public still has to like it-at least a little bit. Lots of musicians fluff off their audience, but I think it's possible to please both the musicians and the audience." Leonard admits that he enjoys all good music whether it's symphony or jazz. "A good musician is a good musician no matter which he plays," he added.

RING your sit-down chores, draw up a chair, relax, and TAKE IT EASY!"

That's the idea behind "Take It Easy's" rollicking quarter-hour of mirth and melody presented for harried housewives who need a few minutes of leisure in the midst of their early morning housework. Old songs, new songs, and novelty songs are offered by those long-time favorites, the Landt trio, known on this broadcast as the "Song Chefs." Master Dick Willard gives out with queries regarding dozens of homemaking problems, running the gamut from how to defrost a refrigerator to repairing last summer's straw hat, to which Helpful Dan always knows the answers. Dick's not kidding when he gives the solution to one of these questions. His methods are tried and true and certain to give satisfactory results.

Rounding out the cast is Frank Novak and his Dinette Ensemble, featuring five of radio's most talented musicians. Frank, himself, has gained fame for his versatility, playing over forty legitimate musical instruments, plus hundreds of novelty ones. Al Duffy, a composer in his own right, takes care of the violin, Tony Getuso plays the guitar. Johnny Cole fingers the ivories and slaps the bass. Frank Novak just picks up whatever instrument isn't being used at the moment and fills in.

Dad Helped

The stars of the show, the "Song Chefs" are Jack, Dan and Carl Landt —real brothers, by the way. Their repertoire of songs is one of the most complete in musical history—and they admit that their seventy-yearold dad has been invaluable in putting them on the track of some really old-time melodies.

The three boys have been vocalizing together for quite a few years, but their entry into the musical world wasn't exactly what they had planned as individual careers. Dan was in the paint business, Ca I was teaching chemistry and Jack still attending high school when they hooked up with Howard White.

White was the only one of the four who could read music, but they got along famously and soon began headlining on the vaudeville circuit. Perhaps their top assignment was playing "The Palace" in 1934, every (Please Turn to Page 28)

"Beulah" Stilled

Sudden passing of Marlin Hurt, well known and liked star of the "Beulah" program, shocked all Radio Row on Thursday, March 21. Feeling under the weather the preceding two days, Marlin visited his doctor Thursday morning and was ordered to bed. A friend drove him home and Mrs. Hurt was



helping her husband into bed when he suddenly slum ped and died in her arms, of a heart attack, a few moments later.

Marlin, who would have been 41 next May 27, had risen rapidly in his radio career since coming to Hollywood about

three years ago, but had been in radio since 1929 and had been interested in show business ever since boyhood. He pestered his father, a Duquoin, Illinois, theater manager, until he was given the job of carrying a spear in a mob scene, from there went on to dialects, with special interest in that of the Hurts' Negro cook, from whom Marlin got the inspiration for his Beulah characterization. After appearing in Hollywood on the Fred Brady show, Hurt was written into the Fibber McGee script by Don Quinn and his "Love dat man!" be came a national catch phrase.

Since last July 2, Marlin had been starred in his own show on CBS. Into the broadcast time he would have occupied Sunday had he lived was scheduled a Marlin Hurt Memorial half hour, with Gordon Jenkins, one of Hurt's closest friends (dating from early radio association in St. Louis) conducting the music and many other musical friends playing in the orchestra.

All for Nylons

KLAC's Al Jarvis and Peter Potter stuck their necks 'way out last week —and all for the sake of publicity and about a hundred pair of nylons.

Celebrating the moving of the "Make-Believe Ballroom" show to 570 on the dial, Al and Peter promised to give away nylons. The rush was preceded by a parade, with the women (and men!) following a sound truck from which an announcer loudspeakered free nylons to the first persons claiming them. The paraders, leaving the corner of Selma and Vine in Hollywood, were drawn to KLAC at the corner of Cahuenga and Santa Monica where Jarvis and Potter were handing out the hose.

The nylons were disposed of within fifteen minutes, leaving in their wake wails of disappointed stockingless.

"How popular can you get?" grinned Jarvis and Potter, veritable wrecks after several hundred women had mobbed them.

To "Be-Bop" or Not

To "be-bop" or not to "be-bop" seems to be the \$64 question along Radio Row; and what is rumored to have originated as a publicity stunt for Ted Steele, musical director of Station KMPC, has started a snowball of comment across the nation.

Radio Life, interested in the tempest caused by Musical Director Steele's banning of "be-bop" music for the aforementioned station, has attempted to track down the facts to report to its readers.

Owner G. A. Richards of the "Station of the Stars" issued the following statement:

"In our opinion, the playing of 'hot jive music,' which usually emphasizes suggestive lyrics, is a type of music that arouses degenerative instincts and emotions. We will not feature artists who continually try to reach the public with music of this type.""

Young director Steele on March 12 issued a memorandum, in keeping with the station's conservative policy, forbidding the playing of any "hot jive." Steele's press agent titled the brand of music in question "be-bop," due to the instrumental sound achieved by the rhythm, and released the item to various news services. The avalanche of response proved a source of surprise to Steele.

Steele, to date, has received hundreds of letters of commendation from persons throughout the United States. Adults prove themselves to be 100 per cent in favor, with 'teen-agers in 90 per cent accordance. Congratulatory letters include messages from the managing director of the Hollywood Bowl, and a score of churches and organizations across the nation.

Brickbats as well as roses have been heaped upon Steele, with local disc jockeys using the issue to further the sale of "be-bop" music and artists by claiming there is nothing suggestive about either the lyrics or music. The battle is on, but statistics prove that the sale of the banned melodies has jumped sky high since their thrust into the limelight.

I've been living on a farm I know I'm a farmer at heart," he grinned, "especially when it comes to keeping hours."

He is used to rising at 4 a.m., retir-ing at 9 p.m. and finds that life in the big city (Hollywood at this writing) exhausts him. In a confidential aside, he smilingly whispered that he was going right back to his hotel and take a nap because he might have to stay up until twelve o'clock!

after a twenty-year old Tennessee walking horse, keeps growing. If another room isn't added to the antique-filled house, a new barn might be added to the present company of five. Next summer Paul intends making two lakes. He is thrilled over a recent purchase of brightly-colored horses from an old fashioned carousel. He'll use them to line his front walk. "We'll be the horsiest farmers you ever saw," grinned Whiteman.

But that isn't so. In addition to horses, Whiteman raises Aberdeen Angus cattle, a black, short-legged breed, source of the most luscious steaks that "Pops," or any other hearty eater, ever wrapped himself about. "We have the tenderest steaks you've ever bitten into," he remark-ed, looking reproachfully at a neigh-bor's tough sirloin.

Paul, who raises only thoroughbreds, is proud of the ribbons he has won with his animals and considers them too valuable for the slaughter-house, although their descendants usually wind up on dinner tables all over the country. His cold storage lockers sometimes boast as much as two hundred fifty pounds of good meat.

Hampshire hogs are another Whiteman farm product. As most of the feed for the animals is grown on the farm, Paul briefly explained the strip farming system of planting a few rows of produce alternated with a field of grass. The farm also is equipped with extensive drainage ditches which carry off the water after heavy rains and prevent flood-ing of the fields.

Remote Control Farms

At least several days a week are spent on the farm. When he is away, such as his latest visit to Hollywood, complete weekly reports are sent him so that he is in constant sent nim so that he is in constant touch with his home. "I'm a farmer by remote control," he laughed. "Some day," he added in a more serious vein, "I could retire and live very comfortably on Walking Horse."
