NSWERING the question, "Where can a G.I. co to be heard?", KFI presents the "G.I. Theatre" every - other Thursday n ight at

KFI presents the "G.I. Theatre" every other Thursday night at 11:30, with alternate Thursdays devoted to auditions. The half-hour program, produced by Al Poska and Charlie Chaplin, show-cases G.I. talent in an effort to obtain radio work for these deserving people.

Each time a program is presented, KFI mails notices to all radio producers in Hollywood, inviting them to listen and giving the names of the actors and actresses to be heard and the roles they will play.

Typical Cast

Typical program of the series was the opening one, a moving drama built around an injured veteran. The cast included Hy Averbach (A.F.R.S., thirty-nine months); Harry Carr (infantry, eleven months); Bob Cole (aviation, eight months); Mary Headley (Marines, two-and-a-half years); Hugh Mosher (Navy, three years); Charles Royal (Coast Guard, fiveand-a-half years); Laurie Sheklow (Air Corps, four years); William Thompson (Coast Guard, four-and-ahalf years).

Auditions are open to ex-servicemen and women with honorable discharge certificates. All auditionees

Abe Shore, Max Factor's Dean of Make-Up—Monday's Expert

There is no more powerful asset than beauty, and a woman's greatest beauty asset is a good skin. The great art of any artist is to imitate nature so effectively that it looks natural. This is one of the most important points of make-up; women should remember it faithfully.

The human face has three contours oval, round, and square. The oval shape is the desirable contour, and successful make-up should be so applied that it gives the illusion of an oval face. Proper arrangement of the hair can improve this illusion.

Rouge Important

Cheek rouge is one of the principal colors that can be used to create the illusion of a desirable looking contour. It can also create the illusion of youth and health.

Rouge will cut down the length of a long face if it is applied in a horizontal direction on the cheek bones, blended up toward the lower eyelid, and out toward the temple. Conversely, it can give length to a wide face by applying it vertically.

Women with prominent noses should not apply rouge too close to the base of the nose. This makes the nose appear even larger. Women with small noses can blend the make-up carefully toward the base of the nose.

Renie, RKO Designer-Tuesday's Expert

Never buy anything until you have seen yourself in a full-length mirror from all angles. Sit down in your dress, stand up in it, and walk around in it. Don't just look in one position.

When buying a hat decide what it is to go with before buying and coordinate the two. Have a coiffure for each hat.

Before leaving the house, take a good look at yourself and then remove one more thing, whether it be jewelry, flowers, etc. People usually over-dress and don't under-dress.

It's better to buy one good thing and spend what you might consider a great amount than to buy two, three, or four items that end up costing the same amount of money.

If you are short and stout, don't cut yourself in two with a twocolored dress—for instance, a red blouse and a black skirt. Use one color tone, for example, shades of blue.

Hemlines Individual Matter

There is no rule or regulation on how long a dress should be. It should be long enough to be becoming. It is particularly important for tall people to have hemlines far enough below the knee to be pretty.

Most redheads can wear pink and

red if they stay away from orange tones.

Just because you wear glasses you don't necessarily have to wear brimmed hats, but you do have to be careful in choosing them. Wear glasses when buying a hat. Don't take them off to see how the hat looks.

Most women with figure problems can wear suits (middle aged women with "middle aged spread" often wonder if they can wear a suit). Be careful of design and cut. Most short women can wear bolero suits providing jacket and skirt actually meet to create a long line.

Clothes should be fitted properly. A twenty-five dollar dress that is fitted properly can look wonderful, while a dress costing one hundred and fifty dollars that does not fit looks terrible.

Josephi, Milliner to the Duchess of Windsor-Wednesday's Expert

Women should be extremely careful in their selection of a hat, to make sure it suits the lines of their face, their size, and their coloring. It's most essential to be sure that the hat is broad enough—that its width corresponds with the width of the jaw line so that the hat has that on-the-head look. Crowns are larger and more important nowadays; a hat should not look as if it is sitting on top of the head but rather as if it were a part of it.

Today's stress is on the smaller hat with a very important trim, yet with a light look. Opened crowned hats with flowers and hats with feather swirls create this look.

Hat Rules

Tall women may wear large brimmed hats; short women may not because it cuts their height. Correspondingly, a tall woman should wear a large-crowned hat that really fits her head. Suit hats may be

smaller, but the trim must be important.

There is a great tendency this year to continue the off-the-face hat. All women can wear this type of hat if their coiffure and make-up is correct. The open-crown effect so popular this summer will continue into fall and winter. With a small, forward hat women should wear their hair up. For off-the-face hats, it may be worn down in a very simple, clean chignon. In any event hair should always be neatly groomed for the best effect.

Women's worst fault in buying hats is lack of courage to wear the dramatic.

Hazel Rogers, RKO Hairstylist-Thursday's Expert

And Thousands of Other Effects Originate in This Behind-Scenes But Always on the Job Department

> ment has just acquired one of the new RCA experimental wire-recorders on which it plans to snatch any wanted sound innovations.

> Twenty sound effects experts serv-ice the noise needs of Radio City's scores of shows. Of several girls who became interested in this work when majority of the department's men went into service, blond Dorothy Waknitz (former secretary in NBC's publicity department) is the lone survivor. Dorothy, who had to un-dergo stringent training and work six months on studio shows before being allowed to handle a commercial program, now supplies sound for some of NBC's most important pro-grams (Rudy Vallee, "Date With Judy"). Conforming to radio's irreg-ular hours, sound effects engineers put in a hodge-podge working week of forty hours.

Preparation Needed

Assembling of effects for a big time program is handled with the same care as script or music. Several days before broadcast time, the sound man obtains a copy of the script and studies it to learn what is expected by way of sound. Some of the effects, like opening doors or ringing telephones, will be manual. Others, like barking dogs or screams

These run the gamut from the whimper of a newborn baby to the streaking wham of a jet-propelled plane. The depart-

of persons will be recorded and to select the precise effect wanted, the sound man will consult a fat catalogue which tabulates and describes all available effects. As deadline for rehearsal time approaches, the sound man will recheck the script, load, the truck with his miscellany of items, and shove down the hall, ready to put the sound into a Skelton or Kyser script.

Typical lead for a recent Bob Hope show included effects for: car door, house door, elevator door, guns and ammunition, slide whistle, glass crates, feather duster, glove, glass crash, platform, wood crash.

Often the department is called upon to figure out an effect for which there is no recording or man-ual procedure. Recently, Ed Ludas of NBC's Sound Department rigged up a motor and built the effect of a model T. Controlling the contraption by hand, Ed can supply the effect of a tin lizzie starting, chugging up a hill, sailing along a stretch, and of killing the engine. By manipulation, the invention also is made to sound like an elevator or a motor boat.

Snakes Rattle

The department is bursting its buttons over two newly-acquired slot machines. For the past few years it has been using a tree-like stand of tin into which small coins were dropped by hand. Another new gim-

man hosted and Rudy Vallee emceed Souvenair's first anthology of radio entertainment last Tuesday evening at Breneman's Restaurant on Vine Street.

The event was staged to introduce the new album of recorded Highlights from Breneman's "Breakfast in Holly-wood" broadcasts. The album was played for those present. It contains hearty samples of Breneman's banter with his uninhibited breakfast guests who are apt to-and do!-say most anything.

Also spun for the assembled audience of press and radio folk were transcribed excerpts from outstanding radio fare of the past three decades-including Enrico Caruso's first radio broadcast in 1910; Edward of England's abdication speech for the "woman I love"; Jean Harlow singing "Reckless"; Herb Morrison's heart-wrenching eyewitness account of the Hindenburg disaster; Will Rogers in-tervfewing Irvin S. Cobb; those three men who wanted to control the world - Herr Hitler, Superman and Mad Man Muntz; George Hicks' on-the-spot Man Muntz; George Hicks' on-the-spot report of the English Channel cross-ing; Orson Welles' alarming "Mars" broadcast; the one and only Bing singing "Just One More Chance" in the twenties; Rudy Vallee introducing Alice "Cuddly" Faye on her network radio debut; and Franklin D. Roose-velt's declaration of war against Japan.

The evening's entertainment was entertainingly concluded when Vallee crooned a nostalgic rendition of "The Whiffenpoof Song" and a rib-tickling version of "Mad Dogs and Englishmen", and Breneman crowed an ear-scraping chorus of "When I Grow Too Old to Dream".

Daytime Radio

According to a six-year study by Cooperative Analysis of Broadcasting, "soap opera" radio fare is now taking up far less time on the air than in 1940-and at the same time, this type of show has become more popular.

In 1940, serial drama occupied 77.5% of daylight radio time, last year the percentage was only 44.5. But it still used four times as much time as the second biggest consumer of daytime commercial hours-news, commenta-tors and talks, occupying 11.6% of the time.

Serial drama also, moved into a

first-place tie with "other drama", where it had formerly ranked third in popularity.

Biggest daytime gain in share of total air time was made by audience participation programs which climbed from 0.4 to 9.7%.

The number of rated network day-time programs on the air increased from eighty-one in the fall-winter of 1940 to 122 in the same period of 1945.

The Winner

Nobody was more surprised by the national and local hooperating of the recent Louis-Conn Fight than KECA, the station which carried the broadcast. A 70.1 (local rating) and 67.2 (national rating) were tabulated for the event. This meant that in the Los Angeles area alone, ninety-seven per-cent of the radios in use were tuned in on the fight!

To stimulate interest in the sports event, KECA offered prizes to five winevent, KECA offered prizes to five whit-ners who could guess the correct hoop-erating prior to its happening. Those eligible for entry were members of the local press. The gentleman who walked off with first prize was Mr. Jimmy Fitz with a guess of 69.6.

All in a Name

A deep rosy blush graced the face of Don Ross, publicity agent for Mu-tual's "Queen for a Day" show, when he boarded the plane as escort to "Queen" Emma K. Lemley, winner of a royal trip to San Francisco.

Ninety-one-year-old Miss Lemley and in his early thirties Ross had been booked as "Mr. and Mrs."!

New Record

Bill Henry, the man whom Time Magazine called "a journalistic insti-tution", established a record for his specialized type of news reporting when he made his 700th broadcast over the Columbia Network on June twenty-first.

From eight o'clock in the morning until he goes on the air that evening, he selects and edits the news for those few topical items he delivers in slightly less than four minutes of broadcast time (about 600 words).

His morning hours are spent at one of Washington's press conferences or at Congressional hearings. His luncheons are planned to include government officials, congressmen, or international figures visiting Washington. Throughout the day he jots terse notes. At 3:30, he is ready to write his script. In one hour he makes his final selection, places the items in proper sequence, has someone read the script to him, and then "Bill Henry and The News" goes on the air.

directly in the center of hair which cuts the face in half, making it appear longer. Dress the hair close to the sides of the head. High bangs are good. To balance the jaw line, build the hair up on top of the head.

For the oval face, use a center or side part according to other facial advantages. Hair is equally attractive worn low or high.

With a diamond-shaped face, wide at the eyes and narrow at forehead and chin, balance the face by dressing the hair wide at both top and lower portion of the face. Bangs and chignon are good.

More Lips

The triangle face has the upper half narrower than the lower, so try to make the upper portion seem wider to balance the jaw line. A low side part slanting away from the center is helpful. Keep the hair flat on top and build out at the sides above the ears. Dress high back of the part line and square off even with the jaw line.

The inverted triangle or heartshaped face is the reverse of the above. To increase the appearance of width in the lower part of the face. use a wide chignon or soft fluffy hair by the jaw line. A center part is good.

To square up a long face, part a low diagonal part on either side; keep the hair flat on top and built out at the sides to form a rounding contour.

A square face needs a slanting part from the center front diagonally back to break up the wide top of the head. Dress the hair high on the head to balance the souare taw line. leaving the sides soft. The most becoming style is a halo cut with high front bangs.

When the hair is dressed right, the face has an oval appearance.

Rita La Roy, Director, School for Models—Friday's Expert

The posture of the average American woman is almost invariably bad—stooped shoulders, sway backs, thick middles, and an awkward walk. Timidity and self-consciousness contribute to a lack of poise.

In remaking yourself, work first on your posture. Shoulders back and down, tummy up and In. "derriere" tucked under. Ear, shoulder, wrist, knee and ankle should be kept in a straight line.

Keep this proper posture while walking, with the thigh the first part of the body to be moved forward, and the weight carried evenly, not dropped from one hip to the other. Carry yourself erect; walk proudly, without bounce or waddle. point your toes straight ahead; give each foot

a separate track about an inch apart.

Avoid Self-Centeredness

After posture, build a more interesting personality. Eliminate selfconsciousness. Most people are rather shocked to discover that it is a mild form of selfishness and a sign of mental adolescence. If the self-conscious woman begins to think about the other fellow, and tries to make conversation easier for him, she finds she hasn't time to worry about herself and the impression she is making. When this practice is followed for a few months, it gets to be a habit and the whole personality changes.

Never Give 'Em Enough

Is Jack Smith's Creed and He Tries to Keep His Airshow a "Short" 15 Minutes

HOPE it never stops being fun!" So spoke Jack Smith on the subject of his airshow, heard five times weekly over CBS. Save for several weeks this spring when Jack was on the West coast briefly, the program emanates from New York in a Columbia studio on 39th Street. "It just seems like a group of us go up there and enjoy ourselves," Jack related. "We don't have an audience," he informed us, and added with questioning seriousness, "Who would come?"

Personable young Mr. Smith is actually surprised at his popularity, and sincere in his appreciation of the interest shown in him. "You know, I was never sure anyone even heard my show until I came out here," he told Radio Life, as we lunched with him at Billingsley's one afternoon during his stay in California. "In Hollywood, you meet people on the street and they say, 'By the way, I heard your show last night.' In New York, you know," Smith smiled, "people don't even speak to each other. Why, nobody there ever tells me they listen to my show—except my wife."

Smith's mail, however, has been some indication. "What pleases me," he related earnestly, "is that I've been getting letters from people of all ages, from eight to eighty and over!"

Compliment

Smith is heard weekly on CBS' "Family Hour", in addition to his own nightly fifteen minutes. "Somebody told me once that it's a short fifteen minutes," he related. "I think that's the best comment we could ever hope for." JACK WISHES HE COULD ACT like his brother, Walter, who wishes he could sing like Jack. Brother Walter (center, above) uses the name Reed on the screen, thinks now he should have stuck to Smith! That's pretty Janet Blair at the piano; she was Jack's guest during his show's stay in Hollywood.

He added that that was one reason he favored not having an audience. "I don't like the idea of applause between musical numbers, and I'm afraid an audience would make our fifteen minutes seem too long."

Smith endorses the formula of a good vaudeville act — "never give them quite enough so they'll want to come back for more." With that in mind, he limits his Spanish songs, for which his listeners constantly clamor, to only one a week. Recently he was contacted to make some Spanish records. "I didn't think I should," Jack demurred modestly. "I told them that Miguelito Valdes was doing all right in that department." But on the day before his departure for Hollywood, he was approached on the idea again and consented. Arrangements for the songs were made that night, and Jack recorded them the following day before planing out of town.

Crowding every hour of every day with activity comes naturally for this singing Smith. Until recently, besides his ether assignments, he held a full-time job as an instructor at the New York School of Aircraft Instruments. "I was working from nine a.m. to eleven p.m.," he recalled. "Eventually, I found I had to give it up."

Pleasure Vacation

At the time of our talk, Jack was anticipating a real summer vacation. "I'm going to South America," he grinned, "over my manager's dead body. Strictly for pleasure. No singing." But of course, he admitted, he has hopes of finding some swell new Spanish songs while he is down there.

And we did. We were ushered into what surely must by the jolliest sickroom in the world and met the merriest invalid imaginable. Sigmund Romberg, everybody's favorite com-

poser (you probably started humming "One Alone" as you picked up this article), was propped up on pillows on a chaise longue, happily smoking cigarettes. He cheerfully admitted that he was suffering from sclatica.

"How would you like some tea?" he smiled before we could launch into our interrogations. After a little fashionable coaxing we admitted that we would. Mr. Romberg leaned back on his pillows and carolled at the top of his voice (in the key of F sharp, we think), "Oooly-ooolyoooly-oooly!" The nurse looked in the door to assure him that tea was on the way. "You can tell he's a musician," she laughed. "Whenever he wants anything, he yodels."

His Favorites

We were a little perturbed at talking music to a man who has over two thousand published compositions and seventy-seven operettas to his credit. "My own favorites?" he echoed in answer to our query. "When I Grow Too Old to Dream' is my favorite of the songs-"The Student Prince' of the operettas."

Mr. Romberg explains his music in unusual terms. "The symphony conductors do not play my music they say it is too low-brow," he wrinkled his forehead in the manner of a man dismissing a Romberg selection. "The jazz-men, they say it is too high-brow. Do you know what I call my music, then? I call it middle-brow music. On my concert tours I play the things that symphony conductors don't play—waltzes, marches, Lehar, Gershwin, Kern ..."

"No Romberg?" we cried.

"Well, I think I used to be too modest about that. Now I devote the last twenty minutes of the concerts to my music. I know that when I go to hear Fritz Kreisler, I don't care if he plays the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto in G. But if he doesn't play his own things, 'Caprice Viennois', 'Liebestraum', 'Tamborin Chinois', 'Marche Viennois', I am so disappointed! I think maybe people might feel the same way about me."

According to Romberg, no composers since Victor Herbert and John Philip Sousa have gone on concert tour with their own orchestras. The rigors of one-night stands could dim the enthusiasm of anyone less energetic than Romberg. He loves it! "I also love radio," he said, "but I get a kick from a live audience." For over four years he has spent six months of the year on the road and has played before as many as 15,000 people at one concert. For his participation in civic celebrations and soldier entertainment he has be en awarded citations by the Red Cross and the Treasury Department, has been made an honorary citizen of Dallas, Newark, Hartford and Kansas City (they presented him with a K.C. steak, too!) and a Louisiana Colonel. Romberg is very proud of all these scrolls of proclamation and calls them his "citizenships."

Is Humorist

"Do you know a joke I play on my audience?" Romberg suddenly chuckled. "I have a big sign on the stage—next number is the most popular march in the world. Can you guess what it is?"

"Stars and Stripes Forever?" we ventured.

"No," he said delightedly-"go on, guess some more!"

Our knowledge of marches being less than academic, we finally gave up.

"The Wedding March!" he shouted triumphantly. "And no one ever plays more than the first eight bars. I play it all!"

light with the same feeling and precision with which he puts together a musical arrangement. He's a stickler for accuracy and likes to tuck in subtle little ingredients that make the difference (be it food or music) between an ordinary dish and a sensetickling serving.

Isn't it odd how the "have's" invariably display talent in more than one field, while the "have-nots" dub along, completely minus? Take Russell. As orchestra leader for Cass' "Bandwagon", his musical ability was acknowledged, but he's an expert chef, too. He talks medicine like an old sawbones, His machine shop has his neighbors green-eyed, while his f lo w ers, vegetables, and eggs would constitute a career alone. After you've ch atted awhile with Henry Russell, you leave with the teeling that he could have made a name for himself in any one of half a dozen fields, besides music.

His Background

Started clarinet at nine, plano at fifteen, toured for a year with Ted Fio Rito, then returned to finish high school in Fargo, North Dakota; with brother, Morris, went to Chicago to break into music — had exactly twenty-five cents of their savings left the day Ted Weems hired them; sang, as well as arranged for George Olsen; first published tune, "The Madame Swings It"; met the singer, Cuquita, at Pierre's in New York (she gave up an engagement in the Rainbow Room to become Mrs. Henry Russell Olson (yes, Henry is of Norwegian stock); appeared on the Novachord's first commercial presentation (with Horace Heidt); sang with Heidt's band and recorded for Colum-Heldt's band and recorded for Colum-bia; played to more than 2,000,000 G. I.'s during the war; doubled as machinist at Lockheed and director of band on "Falstaff" show, the choir on Andy Devine's show, and conductor on Dick Powell's show. He was signed for Cass' program in September, 1945.

She's given up her career, but don't think for a minute she's not right there, pitching for Henry Hubby all the time (one of her gay passing remarks prompted Russell's new song, "Pin Marin").

The Russells are parents to Cuquita's eleven-year-old Eddie, son by a former marriage. The grief of losing their own little daughter last summer will, we hope, begin to fade as they expect a baby's musical crying to blend with Papa Russell's piano playing come fall.

Oh, yes. Here's the recipe you've been waiting for:

Eggs a la Russell

Ingredients: 3 large onions, 1 small can pimientos 20 pitted green olives, 8 slices bacon, 10 eggs, olive oll, salt, pepper, Worcestershire, 1 large can tomatoes. Serves 6.

Dice onions and fry on slow fire in small quantity of butter or olive oil until almost brown. Add pimientos, chopped olives and tomatoes with juice, let simmer for several minutes, adding salt and pepper to taste, 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce and ¼ tsp. powdered mustard. (Chili powder may be added if desired). Beat 10 eggs with & tbsp. cream, pour over rest of mix, letting simmer and stirring until eggs are thoroughly cooked. Serve on lettuce bed, garnished with parsley and shredded bacon.

wood. He is also working on a new production for Broadway, as yet untitled—"the title is the very last thing," he confided. How does a composer compose? Romberg does from forty to sixty songs and chooses from those the ones to be used in production. "And if I think of a melody in the middle of the night, I do not jump up and write it down—I go back to sleep and if I remember it in the morning, all right—if not ...," he shrugged philosophically.

"And I do my best work under pressure." "The Student Prince" took him six months to compose—"Blossom Time," his quickest job, only three weeks. "I was still teaching them the songs from 'Blossom Time' on the train going to the Atlantic City opening!" he recalled. "What instrument do you play?" we wanted to know. That brought on the question game again.

"What do you think I play?" he asked.

"Piano?"

"And all the string instruments. In my orchestra I have fifty-two pieces, forty of them strings."

All composers, even those who write jazz, should study the classical composers, Romberg informed us. And then suddenly added, "Who are the Three B's?"

"Bach, Beethoven, Brahms," we replied proudly. Mr. Romberg beamed at us as fondly as if we'd sung a soprano aria, and assured us that we were very clever indeed.

For nearly four decades Hungarianborn Sigmund Romberg has been creating a wealth of operetta melody. His first success was "Midnight Girl' in 1913, and his latest, "Up in Central Park," after running for fifteen months in New York, is at present in Chicago. "Big hit," he informed us.

In between these two operettas, he has created such romantic favorites as "Maytime," "Blossom Time," "The Student Prince," "Desert Song," "My Maryland," and "New Moon," among many others.

Victor Herbert, George Gershwin and Jerome Kern were all Romberg intimates. Of Herbert, Romberg recalled fondly, "His heart shone out of his eyes." Kern, at his death, left the remainder of his manuscripts to be added to Romberg's huge musical library.

Regretfully, we realized that we'd drunk all our tea and eaten all the cookies and come to the end of our interview. We shook hands with the yodeling invalid who had given us his permission to go down and look at his library of musical scores and manuscripts before we left.

"By the way," we asked in parting, "Do you happen to know the man who lives next door?"

"Of course," smiled Romberg. "He is my friend, Ira Gershwin."

Well, it was awfully nice meeting you Mr. Romberg—and you too, Mr. Gershwin!
