For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

Made Memorable

Nothing pleases us more than to hear someone do a good job at the microphone, particularly when it is a good job done with a not-so-good script. This was recently accomplished by Joan Bennett, when she starred on the January 16th broadcast of CBS' "Suspense", in "Overture in Two Keys".

She turned a script that would otherwise have been termed inferior into a talked-about broadcast.

Because we have previously often spoken unfavorably of screen stars' guest appearances on the radio (and rightly so, we think, as so many of them are not mike-wise), we consider it only fair that when a guesting movie celebrity does give a commendable performance, that mention be made of it.

Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

Frank Parker Show

Frank Parker, we think, is pleasant listening personified, and it's very gratifying to find him on our dials each weekday at 11:45, over KECA. Radio isn't always so good as to bring listeners the people they want most to hear in the type of show listeners think they should have. That's quite an order, and the Frank Parker Show fills it.

Ably aiding him in the pleasant patter department is announcer Andre Baruch (who also makes you want to spend a pleasant afternoon browsing through your neighborhood Newberry Store) and on the feminine side of the picture is Kay Lorraine. Like Frank, Miss Lorraine lends an experienced voice to a song, and together, they offer extremely listenable renditions of melodies you aren't likely to hear on other shows.

Bob Elson

"Bob Elson on the Flagships" sounds like a super Buck Rogers type children's show, but don't let the title fool you. It's interview entertainment of high quality heard on the air every week night at 10:15 on KNX, just in time for the folks who are beginning to be sated with the jive record programs and who aren't yet ready to settle down with the goodnight news.

Former sports reporter Elson did a similar series of broadcasts from the Twentieth Century Limited and his present program has the same excitement of people who are going somewhere. In the terminal, Bob catches the passengers who are en route via American Airlines and queries them about their jobs, their homes and their destinations. We have yet to hear a dull interview. This is partly due to Bob's ability as an interviewer and partly to the fact that everyone seems interested enough in his or her occupation to speak of it intelligently. Lately we can recall hearing a student, a disc jockey, an ambassador, a chemical engineer, a furniture buyer, an interior decorator, and an advertising man among the many people who

Yesteryears

With our radio dials deluged with recorded shows of varying content, it takes something on the unusual side to attract our eye—and ears. Lately, we've found ourselves looking forward each morning to the very listenable twenty-five minute feature on KMPC called "Those Were the Days" (Monday through Friday, 9:05 a.m.), a show which presents just what the name implies.

If you find enjoyment in hearing again the hit tunes of the past few decades, wrapped up in a nostalgic package of lost thoughts, you'll be entertained by "Those Were the Days". Written and produced by Lou Huston and narrated by Charles Stone, it recalls to mind the minor and major happenings of the years past and embellishes your own cherished memories with recorded melodies fondly remembered.

For instance, how often can the average middle aged housewife identify the "Carioca", "Big Apple", or "Pennsylvania Polka"?

Nevertheless, Irene keeps her show moving at such a fast clip that she never tries the patience of listeners who are sick of hearing dull contestants getting the answer dragged out

Etting's Return

No recent event in radio was looked forward to with greater anticipation and excitement than Ruth Etting's and excitement than Ruth Etting's return to the spotlight via Rudy Val-lee's January 21st broadcast. Save for the occasion of vital news happenings, we have never seen NBC employees gathered around the building's loud-speakers as they were for Miss Et-ting's appearance at the Vallee micro-phone phone.

We think everyone who listened will agree that the famous singing star did not disappoint - but that Rudy, the veteran showman, did!

Except for Miss Etting's all-too-fleeting time at the microphone, the show was sadly lacking in sparkle. There was no feeling of suspense which should have preceded the songstress' stint, her introduction was poorly written (save for the Falstaff poem!), her two numbers only teased our appetite, and no one (not even Rudy and his trapeze act) should have followed the climactic appear-ance of Etting. The program should have closed on that thrilling note.

complete medley of many of the songs she helped make famous.

All of the above notwithstanding, Ruth Etting made it a thrilling and memorable occasion. In the past six years, a parade of varying feminine song stylists has made its marks on the public's taste in music. We were curious to hear this famous song stress of a decade ago, to learn if her particular vogue had changed and if not, what our reaction would be to it now.

We found ourselves delighted when the Etting vocal revealed itself to be her identical style of old, and it made us realize that many of the singing styles of today will not weather the years as well.

We were given a nostalgic whirl with her wistful warbling of "Shine On, Harvest Moon", and the quickie interview which told us a little something of what she has been doing dur-ing the years she has been away, satisfied much of our curiosity.

In addition, our backstage glimpse revealed the beautiful Ruth to be a still utterly charming woman, with soft grey hair, tanned skin, those same large sad eyes, and a warmly natural and modest manner ("My husband thinks I have a nice singing voice, but I don't know," we heard her remark).

Yes-R.L. joins with W.W. in heralding Miss Etting's triumphant return with the best of our verbal orchids. We'll admit it was a feather in Vallee's cap just to have the incompar-able Ruth return via his programbut if he had employed the showmanship to be expected from him, he could have made that feather look like a full-fledged Indian headdress!

What Exciting Years?

A good idea that got off shakily on the wrong foot on its first broadcast is the new sustainer, "Those Exciting Years", heard on ABC, Thursday at 8:30 p.m. The show is a nostalgic and reminiscent one, based on the great news stories of the past.

Quinn Ryan is the narrator and the show starts well with the orchestra playing a tune popular in the bygone year during which the news story took place. In this case the tune was "Sleepy Time Gal" and the year was 1925. We were reminded that "Arrow-smith" and "Beau Geste" were the best sellers, that Graham MacNamee broadcast the first World Series and that the Scopes Evolution trial was in progress. All very pleasing.

Then the big news story-a dramatization of Floyd Collins, a Kentucky farmer who was trapped for seventeen days in a cave. Collins was pictured as a poet and dreamer, a courageous explorer who went down into the cave to study nature. The story was greatly over-musicalized, and over-poeticized.

In the clear cold light of 1947 the twenties look ridiculous at best and Floyd Collins seems like merely a very foolhardy young man.

We asked a young old-timer if he recalled the incident when it happened. He did. "Why did Collins go into the cave?" we wanted to know.

"As I recall," our informant told us, "he was looking for a good place to take summer tourists."

Like we said, the show has a wonderful idea, and an effective format. Let's hope it begins to play fair with its listening audience and gives us the real news stories of the past, stark and unvarnished as a newspaper report should be.

T IS estimated that a total of some seven hundred manhours go into the presentation of a single hour long "Lux Radio Theatre" broadcast. A group of five mem-

bers of the program's personnel regularly view hit Hollywood movies, with an eye to adapting them to the medium of radio. Many are difficult to transfer to sound, a few have proven impossible. One such is "The Spiral Staircase", in which the feminine star (Dorothy Maguire on the screen) does not speak. "What would we do with her on the air?" "Lux" scripter Sam Carter threw up his hands. "We're afraid that her voice on a filter, to suggest her thoughts, would become tiresome."

Carter stated that it nevertheless remains their desire to do this particular screenplay, and they aspire for a solution.

Almost all of the motion pictures present various problems of preparation for their presentation over a microphone. A main difficulty, of course, is reducing the length of the drama from the one to two hours of running time it was given on the screen to the forty-five minutes allotted for the actual story dramatization on the airshow.

Radio Life is Ushered Behind the Curtain Of Radio's Top Dramatic Show to Discover Its Behind-the-Scenes Production Problems

"Another difficulty," scribe Carter pointed out, "is scene-setting. On the screen, the audience can see where the actors are. On the air, it often becomes necessary to insert a stupid line like, 'Well, here we are in a restaurant.'"

CBS' "Lux Radio Theatre" originated first from New York with adaptations of Broadway plays. Shortly after its inception, the show was switched to the West Coast, with its scripts garnered from cinematic gems, usually featuring the talents of the stars who originally appeared in the screen versions. Considered by most as radio's top dramatic show, "Lux Radio Theatre" is now in its thirteenth year.

ADIO'S NEWEST hit show is "Juvenile Jury", featuring a panel of five children from six to eleven

years old. No prodigies these, they are typical American kids who ride the airways once a week to tackle the everyday problems of childhood.

Twenty-eight-year-old Jack Barry deservedly receives much of the credit for this show. He originated the Jury and conducts it with affable grace and charm. He interviewed thousands of kids, looking for just the right five who would be glib enough to hold a radio audience, and natural enough to make the questions and answers believable.

Jack Barry's brain child was born at the "Uncle Don Show". Barry saw a group of youngsters doing a play

for Uncle Don. After the show, he got them together and asked them whatever questions popped into his mind. Their answers were so logical and original that he decided to try these kids on a show.

The kids comment, debate, and decide on questions submitted (by letter and in person) by other boys and girls of that approximate age bracket. Out of the mouths of babes have come some of the wisest and funnlest words aired on the kilocycles.

The five moppets who comprise the Jury are Gienn Mark Arthurs, Patsy Walker, Miriam Blumberg, Dick Orlan and Stevie Apter. They tackle such questions as "Should an eleven-year-old girl wear lipstick?", and pose such problems as: "A few weeks ago, my uncle gave me a toy electric train, but before you know it, my father took it apart. When he put it together again, it didn't work. That's what happens to all my toys. What can I do?" Or a mother will write in and ask the Jury what to do about her eight-year-old son who has been copying his father in criticizing her hats.

On one of the early broadcasts, a fourteen-year-old girl wrote in the following complaint: "Every Saturday night my parents leave me to take care of my three younger brothers. It is very dull, except when the babies start crying for different things. What should I do?" The Jurors sailed into this one. One juror advised "Spend half of your allow-

Director Fred MacKaye is a veteran of stock, Westerns and radio, and originally was assistant director of the program, the position now held by AFRA-ite Charles Seal. Ex-reporter, ex-director Sandy Barnett, who does the story

adaptations for the broadcast, was formerly its director, while his coworker, writer Sam Carter, who handles the show's framework and interview dialogue, formerly worked as a publicist and story writer. Harry Kerr, who lines up the stars for each Monday's airing, also formerly worked in publicity and, preceding his service in the Navy, was one of "Lux's" writers, too.

Musical conductor of the series for the past ten years has been Lou Silvers, who arranges and conducts the show's score, and composes, with Rudy Schraeger, the original music used. This phase of the "Lux" production also presents its problems. Permission can seldom be obtained, because of union restrictions, to use the original score from the movie, and in addition, "Lux" ordinarily employs an orchestra with an average of fifteen pieces in contrast to the sixty-piece group doing the initial screen scoring.

The actual Monday night six o'clock airing of a "Lux" broadcast is preceded by numerous conferences and rehearsals—the preliminary ones between the producer, director and writers, the initial rehearsals with the engineer, sound man, musical conductor, and AFRA cast (with its members "standing in" for the stars), and then, on the Friday evening before broadcast day, the first rehearsal with the program's complete personnel, including name performers, in attendance.

Cut Record

A full dress rehearsal is held on Sunday afternoon, with a record of it being waxed, to which the program's cast and crew listen upon its completion. Last-minute cuts and revisions are then made, with final rehearsals scheduled on Monday afternoon before airtime.

Equally meticulous care goes into the preparation of the interviews with the stars which are heard at the close of each "Lux" show. "For instance," reported Carter, who pens them, "when Lauren Bacall and Humphrey Bogart were scheduled to appear on the program, I went out to their house and we sat around for awhile, chatting leisurely. The conversation centered on boats and chickens, those being the Bogarts' main interests, and the interview with them was written around those subjects.

"Oh, and Lauren's whistle!" the scripter recalled. "She blew it on the show, remember? Well, I wrote that in, after an episode that occurred while I was talking with them at their home. When Mrs. Bogart wanted to call in the butler, she blew her whistle!"
