Is a Signal for at-Home Listeners to Halt Everything and Concentrate on Those Songs. That Lucky Telephone Call May Be for You!

> Sunday, 5:00 p.m. ABC-KECA, KFMB

F YOU have a telephone, like music, and harbor any interest in getting your hands on a jackpot of prizes to end all jackpots, then "Stop the Music," with its manifold chances to play a game, is your meat.

For a whole sixty minutes, each Sunday afternoon, this nationwide musical quiz goes on. Harry Salter's band, with Kay Armen and Dick Brown vocalizing, entertains with tunes old and new. First-time listeners, unaware of the game aspect of the show, may be surprised at the shout, in a familiar voice, of "Stop the music!" The voice is that of Bert Parks, able emcee who also handles a Friday night money-dealing hope chest called "Break the Bank," over the same network.

His cry of "stop the music" occurs at any time during either an orchestra selection or any of Kay's and Dick's voca's, and is the signal that an at-homer's phone is going to ring. The lucky resident in Pittsburgh, BERT PARKS, EMCEE, stops the music as a listener at home attempts to identify correctly the tune being played.

Portland or Pismo Beach (or any one of the other thousands of towns across the country) who answers this phone call is going to be asked by musical-quizzer Parks, "Do you know the name of the selection our orchestra was playing when we stopped the music?"

Should Mr. Listener know and correctly identify the tune, he is not only rewarded by a fine prize (usually a radio-phonograph, refrigerator, or gas stove), but he is also offered a swipe at the "Mystery Tune." This "Mystery Tune" is played for him by the orchestra and should he guess this one, the jackpot of trips, bonds, a car, house-trailer, a coat of paint for his home, and myriads of other

equally desirable acquisitions comes his way.

Audience Joins

If the recipient of the lucky telephone call was careless enough not to have been listening to the show, or just plain couldn't guess what the interrupted song was, he still gets some pretty fair swag by way of consolation. There the chance to guess the tune is passed to a contestant from the studio audience.

Failure to guess even the simplest of tunes can and does happen. One day Bert Parks almost fainted upon introducing himself to the man whose phone number had been blindly chosen. The phone's owner told Bert he was a member of the San Francisco Philharmonic. Then friend musician went blithely ahead and missed his guess at a tune.

The pinch-hitting studio audience member must content himself with guessing the interrupted tune and receiving the resultant prize. He doesn't get a crack at the "Mystery Tune." Should this audience member think he'd have done better staying home from the show and lurking near his phone, he's figuring against the halfdozen-odd heads that got this show up in the fairest manner possible for all concerned.

Chances of being picked from the audience, to take up where a wrong guesser (via the phone) left off, are greater than the chances of having your phone number picked out of the



racks and racks of telephone directories behind the scenes at the show. So, to balance this disparity, no jackpot chance for the visitors at the show.

The phone work is kept within the confines of pure chance by having a blindfolded guest pick a telephone directory from the rack that holds every known directory issued by the telephone companies. The book is opened at random, and the still blindfolded guest puts his finger on a number and accompanying name. This happens ten or twelve times during each week's show. Listeners don't have to write in, they don't have to send ten thousand box tops, they don't have to do anything but have a listed phone and a liking for jolly, fast-paced entertainment. The element of chance can land a call any place, and the yell from Bert Parks that starts Lady Luck on her nationwide Sunday flight is "stop the music!"

"By the Beautiful Sea"

Which Crashes Almost to the Doorway of a Malibu Home, Gordon Jenkins and Lyricist Tom Adair Have Written Marvels of Melody

"HE GUY'S a genius" is a praise scattered somewhat recklessly toward the many gifted folks in show

business. So, any individual, not to say a team of two individuals, who could really merit this extravagance might be cautious about accepting it, or a scribe about bestowing it.

Cliches notwithstanding, composer Gordon Jenkins and lyricist Tom Adair are the accomplishers of great miracles in music. On a week-to-week deadline, for the flicker of radio presentation, they have careened out more than eighty-four *original* melody productions from five to twelve minutes' length during the past two years.

These range in content from "Football," "Hop-Along Hank," "Love Is Here to Stay," "The Lost Chord," "Shadrack," and "South America, Take It Away," to "Apple Blossom Festival," "Home," "Bill of Rights," "Abraham Lincoln," "The Freedom Train," "Senior Prom," and "Lumber," to name a few.

"The American Poem," their largest radio work, is fourteen minutes long. From this remarkable exhibit, Page Six almost any operetta, notably a city, industrial or holiday sequence, could be taken, and made into a full Broadway musicale with costuming, scenery and some plot. Single like achievements by Jerome Kern and Dorothy Fields, Richard Rodgers and Lawrence Hart, Arthur Schwartz and Howard Dietz, George and Ira Gershwin, have enjoyed New York and road runs of many months and often years. Gordon Jenkins and Tom Adair have put a new hit performance on the boards every seven days!

Now, it might be coloring it to claim that Jenkins and Adair can whip out this sort of thing with no anxiety or effort. It is true they have had most of their operettas composed and ready to go after three days of working "mornings only," under such stressing conditions as views of the sea from adjustable beach chairs while sunbathing in the Jenkins Malibu-home patio. If this appears to constitute "the easy life" it might be fair to add that it's the well-carned one.

the profession with some risks and disappointments. He was unable to sight-read when, at sixteen, he took a piano-playing job at the St. Louis Opera House. By valiant concentration, he was able to memorize every note in the complicated orchestrations and give perfect keyboard accompaniment.

"Terrible" Player

His chance two years later to join St. Louis station KMOX's orchestra demanded an audition for the musician's union, which meant reading music. "Union representative Ben Rader clucked in sympathy as Jenkins faltered through one page of music after another and finally rested his head against the piano, almost ready to sob and certain he had failed." Miraculously, he was in. Years later, when Jenkins met Rader, the union man chuckled: "Say Gordie, remember when you were a kid and auditioned for me? You were terrible. If I hadn't heard you play before I'd have sworn that day you couldn't even read music."

Jenkins has been his own instructor. At twenty-two, he became the youngest big time arranger in the country (for Isham Jones, whose theme, "Blue Prelude," he wrote). He created his first great hit, "You Have Taken My Heart," with Johnny Mercer in 1933. Then, he smashed his hand against broken glass while he was conducting Broadway's "The Show Is On," and when he recovered from a serious laceration and resulting infection which nearly cost him his life, his contract was gone. He left New York and came to Hollywood to join Paramount as a twenty-sixyear-old musical executive. After two years of picture work he joined radio's show, "Men With Wings"; by 1938 he was chief conductor and arranger for West Coast NBC, handling Jack Carson's "Signal Oil Carnival" and "Little Old Hollywood" (where he first met Adair).

Tom Adair, who is gregarious and widely interested in the world in contrast to Jenkins's introspectiveness and slight irascibility, has been writing songs for about eight years. He was a civil service clerk in the Los Angeles Water Department when he met planist Matt Dennis and wrote "Everything Happens to Me" and "Let's Get Away From It All." He and Dennis worked together with Jenkins on the "Hollywood" in 1940.

In April, 1941, Tom was drafted. He spent nine months in Infantry and four years more in Army radio

To do its part in helping make everyone, and motorists in particular, conscious of the ever-growing rate of highway accidents, the special safety

announcements will let listeners hear the pouring of two ingredients of tragedy . . . alcohol and gasoline . . . and the auto crash which too often follows their mixture.

Such a series is of paramount public service. Close to 400 persons were killed accidentally over the recent Memorial Day week-end. If traffic fa-talities aren't curbed, Fourth of July must still be labeled "unsafe and insane.

Your Cue (Shows You) May Like)

"Country Journal"

Even if you are a confirmed city-dweller, you'll find charm in CBS's "Country Journal," KNX, 1:30 p.m. Saturday. Valuable as a farm information program, it has an appeal far wider than its original intention.

So many subjects and personalities are covered in these broadcasts that it is difficult to list typical items. Most interesting to us have been the inter-views with editors of country news-papers. To a man, the newspapermen have proved to be charming, humorous and intelligent. Each editor has in-cluded in his talk the reasons his particular area is noteworthy. The Rich-mond, Virginia, editor of the Southern Planter lauded the Chesapeake Bay seafood, America's best; others have pointed with pride to their scenic resorts, local celebrities, biggest crops, etc.

Don Lerch, director of the program, features important farm information, with additional news covered by specialists in the particular field. A re-cent example was the description of the U. S. farmer's fight to eradicate the Japanese beetle pest. The Department of Agriculture supplied recent information on the menace, an ento-mologist forecast areas due for damage and a research expert gave in-structions on how the pest was to be dealt with.

Rural clubs, including the famed Four-H group, are interviewed and their special projects are aired. On $\ensuremath{\mathbb{N}}$ the spot broadcasts are cut in from areas where important events are occurring-even the most confirmed city-dweller would be interested in the coverage of the horticultural happenings at the recent Newark Rose Fes-tival. Particularly valuable (considering the season) was the recent outlin-ing of farm-policy planks in the plat-forms of various GOP candidates pre-ceding last week's convention.

Morton Downey

Proceeding on the theory that at 11:15 p.m. there are many listeners who can't stand disc jockeys and are sated with news, NBC is presenting Morton Downey on KFI, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. To no one's surprise it happens to be the pleasantest late-evening segment on the dial.

The old master of the sentimental ballad and the whistling break is as potent as ever when it comes to sooth-ing song. His lyrics are still charged with quiet emotion, and youngsters could take a lesson from him on how to sing a slow ballad without drag. ging it to extinction.

Morton features the songs he does best—all on the order of "The Very Thought of You," "Why Do I Love You?" etc. His whistling is the most melodious on the air, Jolson and Crosby notwithstanding. Along with Jolson, Downey is one of the few oldtimers whose voice is as good and whose style is as interesting as the day he made his first hit.

In keeping with the hour, the program is soothing in every department. Talk is at a minimum-Downey and announcer Joe King both read their lines in a sleepytime voice that is guaranteed not to charge you out of your seat. Carmen Mastren's orchestra follows the Downey vocals like a quiet whisper. A celeste and a nice non-electric guitar furnish exactly the right mood in the orchestrations. A male quartet is held to one number a broadcast and is comparatively unobtrusive considering it is a quartet.

The Coca-Cola commercials are short, extremely quiet and even enjoyable. As shows go, this one may be more or less obscure-but what a lesson it could teach to the bulk of big-timers worrying about their budgets and their audiences!

A good word came out from one of these new video firms. The organization headed by Joseph Cotten, movie star, last week finished the first in a series of fifteen-minute video shows on film for a cost of \$2,000, which is claimed to be \$5,000 under the current market.

But it won't be long before a third station in the Los Angeles-Hollywood area will be going on all eight. It was announced last week by Robert Hinckley, American Broadcasting Company vice-president, that KECA-TV will be "on the air" by November 1, one month earlier than originally scheduled.

And movie-making David O. Selznick is following the lead of Paramount with plans for immediate activity in video.

Robert L. Redd, bright young man long associated with radio, has substantial proof of television's drawing power and sales appeal in Southern California. Last Sunday Bob organized a program starring screen and radio personalities, and featured it on Mike Stokey's KTLA "Pantomime Quiz Time." Purpose was to plug the Memorial Medical Center, and was the first time a civic venture has been promoted through commercial television entertainment. The reaction far exceeded Redd's expectations.

Since Sunday, literally hundreds of calls and wires offering assistance have swamped him. Included were five sponsors of local programs who called to offer time for Memorial Medical Center plugs on their own radio programs.

The teams were made up of Jack



Carson, Kay Kyser, Constance Moore and Lee Bowman competing with Tom Lewis, Dr. Webster Marxer, chairman of the Memorial Medical Center board; Major C. C. Mosely, leading California aviation executive; and Leonard Firestone, prominent tire executive.

The Page Cavanaugh Trio will soon be featured in its own video show over KTLA when they debut their "Hollywod Showcase" talent parade program. That should be sumpin'. The boys know all about talent.

KTSL (Don Lee television, formerly W6XAO), switched Wednesday and Thursday night headliners so that now, on Wednesday night, it presents "Do You Remember?," a nostalgiainducing peek into the old days... in quiz form. On Thursday nights the station carries an excellent variety bill, almost hidden by the title "Music Hall." It is this single reporter's opinion that not a nightclub bill in the whole wide city can touch the acts we saw at KTSL's "Music Hall." Both shows are at 8:30 p.m.

STOP AND GO SIGNALS

To pace "The Johnson Family" program properly, Mutual producer J. C. Lewis has had to invent a series of unusual signal lights to attract Jimmy Scribner's attention.

Scribner, who also writes the show, enacts 23 different characters on it. He gets so engrossed in talking to himself that he cannot be signaled through the usual studio hand-armmouth methods. So producer J. C. has devised a light box to put on the table before Jimmy at each broadcast, signaling as follows:

Red (danger), "You're bellowing." White (o.k.), "Level and timing just right." Green and white, "slow it down, you're too fast." Red, green and white, "Ad lib to suit for thirty seconds."

# The "Night Editor's" Own Story



Hal Burdick Left His Real Editorial Desk for A Fictional One That's Piled High With Success And Even Higher With Work. But Hal Loves It

### Monday-Friday, 9:45 p.m. CBS-KNX, KSDJ

OR THE past twelve years, one of the most warmly received spinners of radio yarns has been Hal Burdick, the popular "Night Editor." Last May Hal once more moved his fictional newspaper desk into range of local listeners. After the home edition has been put to bed, and the newsroom crew is waiting for the press run to start, Hal invites listeners to pull up a chair and settle back, while he starts to spin another of his fascinating short stories.

Now, we knew Mr. Burdick was really an old newspaperman. Stories and articles on him have revealed that he started working as a newsboy when he was nine, and for the following fifteen vivid and exciting years progressed to newspaper reporter, feature editor, and finally city editor of the Seattle Times.

And from all the stories we'd heard about "night editors," they seemed to be pretty hard-bitten fellows, not particularly approachable by any but their newsroom cohorts. It was with this alarming picture in mind that we visited the CBS studio to meet Hal Burdick and turn the tables by getting a story from him!

The wildest flight of imagination couldn't dream up a more erroneous picture of radio's "Night Editor" than by visualizing him as a tough, editortype meanie. Hal is six feet of unassuming, friendly charm. He enjoys

people, is just as interested as he is interesting, and blessedly remembers the days when he was on the quizzing end. As a consequence of this last he precludes the questioning that might overlook facts pertinent to the Burdick story by entertalningly and interestingly telling about his family, his radio stories, his home in Palo Alto, and even about Mike R. O'Phone and Mr. Martin! The latter two are respectively a stout-hearted little Irish-terrier-tinged mutt and a huge red cat. Hal cheerfully admits to having swiped stories from their antics.

### Original Tales

All the "Night Editor" stories are originals. As Hal explained it, "Just about anything can suggest a story, and after all the years of newspaper writing I had it's not too hard to round out the yarns. For instance, I I once told the story of an old retired seafarer. His life had been the sea, and he wasn't too happy in a snug little cottage. But the people taking care of him thought that best, so there he was. Early one morning, however, he couldn't stand it any more, so he stole out of the house and plodded down to the docks, getting there just in time to stumble across a gang who were robbing a boat. Single-handed, and pretty old, he was no match for the ruffians, so he summoned help by his loud yelling and clacking.

"The robbers were apprehended, and the triumphant old fellow carried home. 'Carried,' because the old sea-

farer turned out to be a parrot. That story had been suggested by the bird next door from us, who was the walkingest, talkingest parrot I ever saw!"

"Another time, when a deadline was near and I seemed devoid of ideas, our pup suggested to me the story of 'Mike, 12-F.' This 12-F dog had a fighting heart, but not much in the way of size and muscle, so had been refused by the service. One day after the war he was telling a new friend about it and learned that the other dog had been a war dog. Twelve-F Mike was tremendously admiring, but he felt bad, too. However, his turn came, for the war dog turned out to be blind, and Mike got to serve by taking this fine new friend on long walks and runs the 1-A war dog could never have made without the help of 12-F Mike.

"I'm a great deadline worker, and my poor family can always tell when the zero hour is approaching. I intend having things neatly in order, and all my notes lined up, but I never seem to start in time," Hal sighed... "I may as well face the fact that my best work is done in a big, disorganized rush. That's funny, too, because I really enjoy writing."

### Story Into Serial

One of the earliest "Night Editor" stories, titled "Dr. Kate," dealt with the work and ideals of a young woman doctor. This narrative was so enthusiastically received that Hal was requested to get up a daily program built around the main character. He talked it over with wife Cornelia, and together they drew up the "Dr. Kate" strip starring Cornelia and written, produced and directed by Hal.

The ten-year-old show, on a local San Jose station, is now an hour-long daily, called "Dr. Kate Calling." Hal's "Night Editor" series started twelve years ago. In 1946 the couple tried to take the long, long vacation which busy, successful workers always (*l'lease Turn to Page 38*)

Places like Bryce, Zion, the Grand Canyon, Taos and the Mesa Verde are covered with deep snow through. out most of the year and the climate even in mid-summer is really pleasant, with warm days and cool nights. So if by any chance you are one of those who have avoided the Southwest because you have thought of it as a hot barren area, please change your opinion and plan to go there this year. You will have a grand time and see many interesting things. It is entirely different from California or the Northwest that I described last week, so much so it might be another world, nevertheless it is just as delightful a vacation. land.

First of all let's visit Salt Lake City, Utah, and then swing quickly down into Northern' Arizona and New Mexico. Salt-Lake City nestles at the foot of the Wasatch Mountains close to the shore of the Great Salt Lake. It is a beautiful city of wide streets dominated by the magnificent State Capitol building. There is so much to see around Salt Lake City that it is a delightful vacation center. The Salt Lake with its heavy salt content, the world's largest opencut copper mine at Bingham, the huge smelters, the great Salt Flats, the beautiful Provo Canyon and the Timpanogos Caves—and not so many miles e as t w ar d, the amazing Dinosaur National Monument. These are just a few of the things you must see and will enjoy. But in the southern end of the state two national parks will call you: Zion and Bryce, two parks that although close together offer striking contrasts, and yet both are outstandingly beautiful and should be seen by everyone who loves unusual scenery.

Zion is a rugged canyon with steep colorful cliffs in a great variety of colors. There's the Great White Throne, a huge mass of white rock that dominates one end of the canyon, the narrows through which you can wander along a beautiful trail bordered with flowers, with the river singing a delightful accompaniment. Then you will be inspired by the Angel's Landing, the Three Marys, the Patriarch, the Checkerboard Mountain, the Grand Arch, the Weeping Rock, each one different, each one inspiring and strikingly beautiful and colorful. When you have seen Zion you may be tempted to skip Bryce, as many people are, but don't do it, because Bryce National Park will delight you. It's a huge horseshoe-shaped area filled with thousands upon thousands of fantastically shaped formations in gold, white, yellow and orange formations that have been created by erosion and corrosion through the years—words could never describe the awe-inspiring beauty.

Not so very far to the south is the north rim of the Grand Canyon, reached by a delightful highway that takes you through the Karbab Forest. The Grand Canyon is so well known as a scenic wonderland that I feel it needs no description. However, I would like to mention that the north and the south rim are both delightful but quite different, the north rim being 1,000 feet higher than the south. If you want an un-usual diversion take a ride across the canyon on a mule, stopping overnight at the Phantom Ranch. It's a real experience. You can travel by highway from the north to the south rim crossing the Colorado River by the Navajo Bridge and on the way you are likely to see some buffalo (bison), because two large herds graze in this area. Also you will cross the northeastern end of the Painted Desert, which in many ways is more impressive than at the point where it is crossed by Highway 66.

### **Good Pivot Point**

Flagstaff is another good headquarters for the vacationist, because near at hand are the Wupatki Ruins, the Sunset Crater, the San Francisco Peaks, Walnut Canyon, Ice Caves and magnificent Oak Creek Canyon.

Near Holbrook are the Petrified Forest and the Painted Desert and to the North is the Canyon de Chelly (Shay), one of the most interesting of the National Monuments. The canyon is unbelievably beautiful, lined on both sides with red cliffs that rise straight up from the canyon floor. A great many Navajo Indians still live there in hogans and in the cliff there are numerous cliff dwellings. And speaking of cliff dwellings, if you are interested in

promise themselves, but the pull of show business proved too strong, and they returned to the air two years later.

The busy Eurdicks have one son, the seventeen-year-old Hal Burdick, Jr., (nicknamed "Bud") who seems destined to carry on the Burdick tradition in show business. Just last year, "Bud" produced, cast and directed a production of "Arsenic and Old Lace" in the Palo Alto Comunity Playhouse.

"You know," Hal mused, "I just might draft Bud to help me with my series... now that I have five stories each week to do. I'll probably run out of ideas this time for sure!"

Hal's answer to a question regarding his "safety valve" against overwork, worry, and a real possibility of a paucity of plots, could serve as a lesson to more temperamental and thus less successful story writers.

"Sure I have a 'safety valve.' Whenever I think I can't possibly get up another story, and haven't any notion of what to write... I just sit down and start typing. It would be pretty silly to sit there and write unrelated words, so something always comes out.

"The biggest thing in the way of help to a writer is liking to write. I do, you know, but not all writers *really* enjoy it. Say, that gives me an idea for a story . . ."
