The Musical Mr. Willson Reveals How He Cajoles and Traps the Radio Listeners By Applying His "Two Hysterical Ideas"

AIT till Dennis Day finds out about Meredith Willson! The boy with two shows oughta hear about the

with three networks. Meredith guy and his "dear little Talking People" are on the air this season doing their enchanting commercials on the Mere-dith Willson show cn ABC, "Henry Aldrich" on NBC and "Mr. Ace and Jane" on CBS. (There's a chance that he'll make it four networks by the time this is in print!)

This commercial tour de force only

goes to prove one of Willson's "two hysterical ideas" about radio. Seems the man got it into his head a while back that radio commercials should be entertaining. This revolutionary idea has been eagerly pounced upon by Jell-o, Willson's sponsor, with the result that you'll hear it on the aforementioned programs.

Hysterical idea number two in the Willson scheme of things is that "successful radio must be absorbing." Nobody has any quarrel with that but how many people have tried to do it? Meredith's idea of cajoling the cagey radio listener who would just as soon be listening to "The Purple Phantom" is to draw him to the pro-

gram like a man sinking into quicksand.

Trapped

Meredith is haunted by a mental picture of this radio listener (and he's the one who adds up to Hoopers) jauntily striding across the room to turn on the good old "Purple Phan-tom." "His hand is on the dial," says Willson darkly. "He's just about to turn it when I say, 'Ever hear a five-hundred-dollar chord?'" This is the moment of indecision when the in-sidious Willson strikes! He pictures his listener pausing to wonder about this. In his leisurely Mason City fashion, Willson goes on with the story of his five hundred dollar chord. Seems that a movie studio exec had once heard Meredith's orchestra play "Ta-ra-ra-Boom-De-Ay," using an un-usual chord. The exec wanted that chord and sent a man with five hundred dollars to buy it from the maestro at two o'clock in the morning. Willson figures that by the time he's reached this point in his story, his listener would rather die than not hear that expensive chord—and anyway, you can always catch "The Purple Phantom" at the halfway point and keep up with the story. . .

So Meredith plays "Ta-ra-ra-Boom-De Ay" and points out his golden chord. By this time, the reluctant listener has gone back to the sofa to relax and listen. In order to catch "The Purple Phantom" he would have to get up, go over to the radio and dial to another station. Willson figures that his listener won't do that twice in the same half hour, so there you are! Let Mr. Hooper call his head off - everybody's listening to Meredith Willson. They can't help themselves.

The All-Music Flop

The Willson technique came about because of a magnificent flop. When Meredith got out of the Army, he came back into radio with the idea

for an all-musical show, a show on which he was prepared to expend all the time, talent and experience he owned. The announcements, the commercials, the introductions-everything was musical, nothing was talk. The audition record was cut. "It was all I ever wanted and dreamed and believed about an all-musical show," he says wistfully, "and it was a flop." The word "flop" requires quali-fying, however. People in the profession loved the show. Many made treks out to the Willsons' to hear it, every Willson gathering included a playing of the wonderful audition record. But at the necessary asking price, no sponsor was interested.

"So I decided to make the music incidental to the talk," he sighs. In reality, however, it's the "talk" that traps the lackadaisical listener into paying attention to the not-so-inci-dental music on Meredith's present show. This listener will find himself delighted with the quartet from "Rigoletto," explained the Willson way. He'll learn that Tschaikowsky was the father of be-bop—and inci-dentally hear part of the lovely Tschaikowsky Sixth.

Willson vs. Radio Music

Willson points to stacks of scores of symphonies, operas and operettas when you wonder if he'll ever run out of material to propound his delightful musical hoaxes. "A tremendous source that's never been tapped," he smiles affectionately in the direction of his shelves of scores.

The lack of ideas in most musical programs, he attributes to two attitudes—those of people with no urge to create and those of the "nothing

Somebody Has to Be in Charge of All That "Take It or Leave It" Money, and It's an Efficient "Girl Friday" Named Hattie Colbert

Sunday, 8:00 p.m. NBC-KFI, KFSD

HE comes from Harvey, Illinois, right outside of Chicago, and five years ago attrac-

tive Hattie Colbert saw her first radio broadcast with all the naivete and thrill of a typical tourist.

Now, officiating onstage each week at NBC's "Take It or Leave It" show, Hattie dispenses money, efficiency and poise like the reliable assistant producer she is.

In 1943, Hattie accepted an invitation to visit a girl friend in Hollywood whose husband is a radio executive for Paramount Studios. Shortly after Hattie arrived, her friends had to accompany movie-star client Chester Morris to Nevada, for his guest appearance on the Ginny Simms -show. Hattie went along, just to see what a radio program was like. She had a good time, but certainly paid no attention to any technical details like production, timing and script.

So, a week later, when the Simms show producer called to ask if Hattie would like a job with the Biow agency, working on the program, it was some surprise. Hattie is still also impressed with one of the first windfalls which came with that new job---six weeks, expenses paid, at the swank Waldorf Astoria, while Ginny Simms was broadcasting from New York!

Way With Money

Hattie was assigned by Biow to the "Take It or Leave It" program a year and a half ago. Since that time, she has paid out more than \$40,000 to contestants and distributed about 1200 pen-and-pencil sets. She has handled fan mail amounting to nearly 100 letters a day, and answered all ticket requests. ("Take It or Leave It" is just starting to fill requests which came in last May.) She has helped the show's two succeeding emcres, Phil Baker and Garry Moore, keep their question categories and quizzees straight during the pressuring thirty minutes of each broadcast; and in spite of the noise and confusion she has authentically maintained her own list of names and addresses and winnings with nary if 'ary a miss. During the show, Hattie has a desk right by the microphones. Before the broadcast, fifteen folks are selected from the audience and Hattie collects their case histories as they file onstage. "The hardest thing to get out of them is who they are," she chuckles. "They start to shiver and shake and forget their names and where they live. Some of them even have to pull out their driver's licenses to tell me."

Hattie has a practiced eye for spotting "regulars," and is quite famed for her memory in this respect. She recently recognized a woman who had been on "Take It or Leave It" when Phil Baker was still emcee, but it developed that the contestant had only come onstage at that time and had not actually appeared on the program.

Producer Ed Feldman and emcee Garry pick four out of the fifteen as show participants. The remaining hopefuls receive consolation Eversharp Pens. The show then starts out with nothing but Garry's few preliminary words with his contestants and Hattie's record for efficiency. Her biggest responsibility, of course, is paying each quizzee proper due for questions up to and including the sixty-four-dollar one.

Hattie carries about \$300 in cash with her to each show, and a blank check for the jackpot winnings. Every week the jackpot is at least \$640, with this amount doubled, tripled, quadrupled, etc., as the shows go by.

When she's asked how she feels about handling all that money, Hattie reflects: "About like a bank teller, I guess. None of it's mine until the end of the week when I get my own pay check. The rest is just like so many pieces of paper."

Radio Man Jay Stewart Offers Tips to Mallet-and-Ballers Interested in Hollywood's Latest Lawn Game - Croquet

T REALLY makes me laugh when people talk about the 'comeback' croquet is making," remarked radio emcee Jay Stewart. "The game is one of the oldest of all modern forms of entertainment, and hasn't needed a 'comeback' since King Louis the Fourteenth burned up the lawns of Paris with his sizzling smashes."

Jay's historical reminiscing took place on his own croquet court at the beautiful new Cheviot Hills home the Stewarts enjoy. Wife Beverly and daughter Jamie had staked out the court, and were patiently waiting for Daddy to get with it.

Daddy's audience was Helen Wald, Candy Vrooman and Evan Sax, all of whom he knows through his radio work on ABC's "Surprise Package." Other assignments are CBS's "Everybody Wins" and "It's Fun to Be Young," and NBC's "Take It or Leave It."

A few minutes after the game had started, Candy's ball struck another,

The maestro waxes violent over those programs that stick by the "And now the orchestra asks the musical question—'Who?" type of format. Another hate is the introduction that goes: "And now, Poppy, what're you going to sing?" "'After You've Gone'." "Aw, gee, wish I could stick around and hear it." "Silly, that's the name of the song— 'After You've Gone'." And that is where Mr. Willson gives up.

Willson's Book

In Meredith's newly published book, "And There I Stood with My Piccolo," he does some amusing gnashing on this subject—and on many others. The morning we interviewed the man he proclaimed "I've only read it once this morning," indicating that he had exercised admirable restraint. We stole a look at the book jacket—"A blend of nostalgic reminiscences, hilarious anecdote and sound musical comment," it read.

Indirectly, the book grew out of Meredith's "two hysterical ideas." After writing his own show in order to put across his entertaining commercials and absorbing ideas, he got into the habit of writing. After his show season was over, he just went on writing—about Mason City, Hollywood, music, musicians, radio, his mother's hired girl. composing, careering. . . From Meredith and his book you can expect anything—and everything.

RECORD NOTES TO YOU BY ANDY MANSFIELD

THE NATIONAL SYMPHONY ORCHES-TRA conducted by Enrique Jorda again rates the best in its four twelveinch sides comprising "The Russian Easter Festival Overture." . . . Here all the brilliance and fire, combined with the religious solemnity of the occasion as envisioned by Rimsky-Korsakov, is masterfully interpreted with resounding brass passages that are transformed into minor melodies for strings. . It's tops in performance and tops in Decca full-frequency-range recording for a Chord in G! . . . AL GOOD-MAN conducting his orchestra and chorus also does a fine job with hits from Romberg's "The New Moon"an eight-sided album featuring Earl Wrightson, Donald Dame, Frances Greer and Earl Oxford as soloists.... Romberg's lovely melodies "Softly as in a Morning Sunrise," "Lover, Come Back to Me," and "One Kiss" have always been good listening, but here's an album that should not be missing an album that should not be missing from any music lover's library—it's an RCA-Victor three-noter. . . . **THE MODERNAIRES**, vocal group but good, have a pair on Columbia in the novelty field—"La Cucaracha," given a pleas-ant modern touch in vocal presenta-tion, and "Dummy Song," replete with sound effects and able to ride on its own even though the melody smacks own, even though the melody smacks of a popular college ditty. . . Easily a double-noter. . . **PERRY COMO's** "By the Way" and "For You" are strictly on the soft mellow side—slow in tempo with very schmaltzy Russ Caseand-his-muted-strings orchestra to do the backing. . . . It's nice and easy-on-the-ears music — and when accom-panied by soft lights, who knows? Otherwise, a pleasing RCA-Victor two-noter. . . . WARING'S PENNSYLVANIANS, with the lovely voice of Joan Wheatley as soloist, have gone back a few years to present "All of a Sudden My Heart Sings"-the melody built on the "Winter Wonderland," a seasonal perennial which always makes this adopted Californian homesick for eastern Pennsylvania. . . Here is easily two notes of Waring on Decca. . . BENNY GOODMAN and his band of a decade ago made their reappearance on RCA-Victor's "Jam Session" and "Somebody Loves Me" to the tune of a pair of notes. . . . Music is obviously dated, but it's a swell filler for that Goodman collection. . . . STAN KENTON has another top original instrumental in the up-tempoed "Harlem Holiday" with a strong and steady dance beat throughout-reverse side of this Capitol three-noter is mostly June Christy's vocal with Kenton backing on the blues-flavored ballad "Don't Want That Man Around" and the weaker side, but don't miss "Harlem" —it's terrific!

The Circulating Miss Harris Has an Honest Newspaper Attitude and Style. By Being a Friend to the Stars She Gets a Good Story

Monday-Friday, 2:25 p.m. CRS-KNX

REAKFAST date with a studio personage. Dictating letters or on the phone until noon. Stop to hear repeat of yesterday's broadcast with Diana Lynn. Meet Lloyd Nolan in Lanai Room (Beverly Wilshire Hotel) for today's air interview. Lunch date with Edmund Gwenn, to do interview for tomorrow. Back from lunch at 2:45 to write script. June Lockhart's housewarming at 5:00 p.m. The Cobina Wright party for William Randolph Hearst and his new bride. See Richard Greenes off for England. Dinner at LaRue. To Melville Cooper's, to honor Valerie White, star of "The Winslow Boy." Ciro's, to see Abe Burrows. Time for a nightcap and bed.

Sound like somebody's fabulous pipe-dream? It's also an average day from the memo calendar of Radie Harris, Columbia's "Broadway and Vine" reporter, who spends her summers in Hollywood, her winters in New York, covering the celebrities.

Radie has a suite at the Beverly Wilshire while she's in California; she's now returned to the East and her comfortable Parkwest apartment. October 31, 1948

There are two good reasons for her yearly jaunts to the Coast. She hates the New York summer heat. She gets a changed outlook on her job.

"When I come out here I'm a fresh face," she says. "I get a new slant on the stars and really accomplish more. When Hollywood comes to New York, I'm a familiar face. We're old friends, talking over old times."

"At Ease'

People have never disconcerted Radie. When she graduated, with journalistic honors, from New York's Calhern School for Girls, her folks treated her to a trip to Europe. Radie came back planning to attend Columbia, but during the summer her father had met the editor of the Morning Telegraph. Radie wheedled an introductory note and went down to apply for "a spot writing obituary notices or something." She arrived as the motion-picture department was being organized, and was hired on a week's trial, with the warning, "If you're no good, I'li have to fire you, even if your father is a friend."

Her first assignment was to see the movie at the Strand and review it. Radie went home instead and practiced typing. "But I must have seen the picture." she clarifies, "because six months later I became

Motion Picture Editor." She was all of seventeen at the time.

What's on the Books

Radie frankly picks her radio interviews for name value, but she keeps in active touch with folks behind the scenes. She does a Variety column, "Broadway Runaround," and in New York she covers all the nightclub, film and play openings, in addition to her air and social life. She writes all her own material, and has never had a kickback on a script.

"It's much harder to do a fiveminute script than a fifteen-minute one," she adds, "because you're always aware of what you're throwing away." Radie thinks the best reassurance she can receive from her audience is the one that her show is too short.

Her most treasured tribute from a celebrity was from Noel Coward, whom she met in London for an interview. "I was terribly edgy about the scene in his play, 'Point Valaine,' where the interviewer comes to see the actor and is treated most acidly. When I left, he said, 'The greatest compliment I can pay you is that this hasn't seemed like an interview at all!'"

A for 'Appiness

Probably Radie's most electric quality is her own enthusiasm for her job. She considers it a terrific challenge to capture the real personality of a star and put it across in a script. When she has repeat visitors on her show, she gathers entirely new material each time. "I never find anyone exactly alike," she smiles.

Dr. Walter A. Maier Preaches a Non-Pacifying Sermon Against Biblical Violators. Yet His Oratory Has Been Popular Radio Since 1927!

Sunday, 9:30 a.m. MBS-KHJ, KVOE

'M A METHODIST, but I love your service. It's so uplifting." "We enjoy your broadcast every Sunday while we are eating dinner. You could hear a pin drop."

In the more than 13,000 letters they write every week to Mutual's "Lutheran Hour," people around the globe admit a common emotion. They are spellbound by the preaching force of Dr. Walter A. Maier, whether they advocate or not his unswerving tirades against divorce, birth control, liquor and sin.

"The Lutheran Hour" has begun its sixteenth radio year and is now heard on more than 1100 stations of the world. Dr. Maier went on the air in 1927, in the attic of an old building near the St. Louis Concordia Seminary, at which he was a professor of ancient languages. He broadcast fifteen times a week with sermons, book reviews and discussions of family problems, and answered letters as they came to him. Soon this correspondence was voluminous; (and today, although Dr. Maier still answers- personally 100 to 200 letters a week, there is a staff of 100 persons to handle the bulk of the mail).

From his attic, Dr. Maier expanded to a two-station hookup in Detroit and Cincinnati. In 1935 his program moved to Mutual. "He started from scratch," say his associates, "with something which was against the opinions, or at least not with the blessings, of a lot of people. But he has proven over the years that he has a real idea. The program has never seen a season when it did not go forward in number of stations, listeners and letters received."

Text Is Testament

Dr. Maier holds, dynamically, to the Absoluteness of the Scriptures. "Book \cdot of-the-month discussions must not crowd the Book of Eternity from the pulpit," he declares. He keeps a file of newspaper stories on today's human bewilderments; and if divorce or juvenile delinquency or immorality is most in the headlines, that is the subject of his sermon.

Before he goes on the air he whips off his coat, vest, shirt, tie and belt, and in his undershirt he advances to the microphone. He limbers up his arms and shoulders. Then he preaches, his fists flailing and his eloquence taxed to the full.

When he was a student at Harvard, Dr. Maier won the Billings prize in oratory. In the rallies he conducts during the summers, to

raise funds for his broadcast, he has pulled 75,000 persons into Soldier's Field, Chicago, and four times filled the Chicago Stadium. In Cleveland, he was called upon to preach five times in one afternoon, to the crowds which so overflowed capacity. At the Hollywood Bowl rally this October 3, requests for seating were on file six months in advance.

"The Lutheran Hour" chorus, comprised of second and third year ministry students (and highly commended by Fred Waring as a musical group), also travels the country in the summer. In thirty-four days this year, the boys, under their own supervision, covered 5000 miles, gave forty concerts and made four radio appearances.

Doctor and Hulda Maier have two sons of their own, Walter Arthur, twenty-three, who just joined the ministry, and Paul Luther, seventeen, who is still studying. The Maiers have their home on campus at the Seminary, and in spite of the tremendous funds involved in maintaining the "Lutheran Hour" project, family income is \$240 a month, Dr. Maier's salary as a professor.

Still a Dynamo

In addition to his sermons and management of the radio series, Dr. Maier makes speeches during the week and as many public appearances as he can arrange. He is assistant p astor of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in St. Louis. He is developing a plan to pioneer religion in television. He is a motion-picture censor. He has written seventeen books (one of which, "For Better, Not for Worse," is a popular text for prospective matrimonials); and for ten years he has been working on an Old Testament study. Dr. Maier's personal collection of religious manuscripts is considered one of the foremost in America, and includes first editions of most of Martin Luther's published works.

One of the studio pages, whose job it was to keep the audience members from filing on stage, stepped through the curtain that separates spectators and members, and told actor Paul Frees that an elderly man in the audience wanted to see him. Curious, Paul followed her. A white-haired old gentleman nearly embraced Paul, and started volleying conversation at him in some completely foreign tongue. Paul, correctly assuming it to be



there's always been a burning yen to perform, and he let nothing stand in the way. Not even school.

When he was fourteen years old, Paul left the home-town high school in Chicago, resigned from his afterschool job understudying the basso-profundo of the Chicago Light Opera Company, and, operating on his pet theory that one hour of experience

Austrian, replied in English that he didn't know the other language. The old man was amazed, then went on to explain to Pau; in English, that he thought surely the actor must speak the Austrian language, other-wise how could the accent Paul's evening show role called for have been executed so perfectly?

The gentleman from Vienna would have been even more amazed had he known the whole story on young Mr. Frees, actor and dialectician.

Self-Taught

Paul has had only a few months of formal dramatic training. His family is not of the theater. Paul has never studied the languages. The answer to his dramatic facility lies in the fact that in his make-up

is worth ten thousand hours of study, lit out as singing-emcee of a group of entertainers. The youngster did anything the occasion called for ... singing, comedy patter, tap dancing, even stooging. Today Paul

laughs at some of the harrowing experiences a bunch of teen agers were bound to suffer, but the tough going wasn't funny then. Like most hard lessons, their teachings stuck, however.

After a year of this, Paul returned to the Chicago fold and spent the years until his enlistment in World War II making personal appearances in night clubs, singing, emceeing and doing impersonations.

This background, in addition to an injury that resulted in months of hospitalized reflection on life, helped Paul decide on radio. His approach was as naive as his decision. He went to the stations and agencies, stated that he wanted to do radio, and auditioned. Talent buyers sat up in their chairs and listened to the auditicn records twice. The curly-haired, brown-eyed young man who made those records had seemed like a good fellow, and a nice one, but his appearance had given no indication of his dramatic ability or the almost magical ear that enabled Paul to pick up fine shadings in a dozen or more dialects, then reproduce them. Listening talent-hunters didn't take into account the years of experience in front of one of the toughest audiences in the world to please—night-club attendances. Paul Frees suffers no more self-consciousness or nervousness during performance than most people do at walking down the street.

In the year and a half since Paul "decided" he would enjoy working in radio, he's run the gamut of (Please Turn to Page 39)

portrayals on both local and coastto-coast shows, he's established himself soundly on half a dozen regular programs, and he's experienced complete amazement at the size of the checks good work in radio can bring.

Familiar Voice

Paul is heard on "Today's Children," he is the West Coast announcer for Arthur Godfrey's hour, he does impersonations for Spike Jones, works "Sam Spade," "Amazing Mr. Malone" and "The Casebook of Gregory Hood" regularly. Paul has done not only the role of the pediculous "Abdul" on "A Man Named Jordan" regularly, he also plays half the other roles called for by the story line. Surest identification of the Frees tones is mention of the narrator who weekly introduces "S-u-s-pen-se!"

The Frees home is in San Fernando Valley, where Paul shares with wife June the anxious care of Belle Frees McPherson, a Blue Doberman pup, whom they, in the very best dog-owner tradition, term "the smartest pooch in the world."

Success in radio has left time for the actor to follow an old urge for the allied arts. He sketches constantly, drawing all the characterizations suggested by his radio scripts, caricaturing fellow actors, and doing sketches of his dog. Paul has recently taken to both oils and water colors as mediums, but explains that his only real results to date are scratched hands. He's not content with buying his canvases ... instead stretches his own.

Paradoxically, Paul gave up singing as a career in favor of radio. Now firmly established as an actor, he recently registered for new courses of instruction—in voice.

But the colossal bulk of the work is Dr. Maier's almost single responsibility. He is now fifty-five, and his colleagues are inclined to worry about him much more than he himself troubles. "He's had unlimited stamina for years," they say, "and we just feel he's going to go on and on. We hope so, anyway."
