Living Up to the Name of the Show, The Men in the Audience Are Left Sitting, While Their Ladies, Who Daily Come First, Gaily Participate

NE OF the most cleverly operated of all the participation shows on the air is KHJ's "Ladies First." Every woman who walks off Vine Street into the big studio

that houses this amusing, informative half-hour knows the word "participation" means *her*—if she can qualify.

Qualifications for a chance at the prizes and on-stage fun entail more than a pretty, upturned face or the most frantically waved hand in the crowd. Nor are guests chosen because the old home town happened to be Broken Bow, Idaho, and that announcement might sound funny on the air. Participants qualify by their wits. As each audience member enters, she is handed a pink sheet of paper on which she is to write a four-line poem about the show . . . master of ceremonies Bob Moon, announcer Brother Bob Shannon, soloist Ken Carson and organist Ed Truman . . . or about the position of "First Lady" on the show.

#### Three First Ladies

Their efforts, and choice from the day's audience of three winners, are completed during the half hour before the show actually hits the air. "First Lady" of the three whose poems brought them on stage is indicated by a metered audience applause reaction. Mrs. "First" is suitably rewarded with gifts and flowers, and Madam "Runner-Up," second-place winner by audience applause, is left to hazard a guess at

the day's quiz, which entails a sizable jackpot.

The balance of the show is fairly standard in format. A personality from each of the different worlds of feminine fancy is daily "put on the spot" to answer questions directed at her by the attendance. A "lady of fashion" is chosen from the audience, introduced over the air, and her costume described. The chosen "First Lady" reads the daily chosen letter from a shut-in who writes to the show requesting a favored song. One day each week lovely Rita LaRoy appears to help members with problems of dress, make-up and style.

That's the format. It is the youthful, versatile, jolly staff that keeps the show from being run-of-the-mill. From writer-producer Larry Hays to the engineer, the gang harbors an enthusiasm that is bound to generate a response in viewers and listeners.

The good-natured kidding that

goes on before the show doesn't stop when the red-lettered "On the Air" sign appears.

The group have dubbed their emcee, Bob Moon, "Lover Boy" Moon. This handsome thirty-year-old, who in spite of his youth brings fifteen years of radio experience to the stage with him, is teamed with "Brother" Bob Shannon, announcer, heckler and fall guy for Moon's gay ad-libbing.

It is the romantic voice of popular Ken Carson that turns each day's "Shut-in Song" into a tender, personal message for some listener at home.

#### Visitors From Afar

There is a standard joke among those familiar with daytime audience shows concerning the fact that the attendance is made up principally of out-of-staters. Few hands go up when the call . . "And who here is from California?" goes up from an emcee. The Middle West is nine times out of ten represented more

heavily than the so-called "Golden State" from which the show emanates.

The bulk of the cast on "Ladies First" have their own standard joke about meeting these guests from afar.

Bob Moon is from Nebraska. "Brother" Bob Shannon comes from Wisconsin. Ken Carson spent his early days in Oklahoma and Kansas. One of Hollywood's best-known pianists, who acts as organist on the "Ladies" show, is named Eddie Truman, and he grew up in Illinois. Assistant director Comer Heine, who magically keeps things in order and on time when the levity is at its highest pitch, is also from Nebraska.

The boys are unanimous in their chortled opinion that . . . "the best way to meet old friends and friends of friends from home is to work in Hollywood on an audience-participation radio show."

YOUNG FLORAL EXPERT EDDIE PEARLMAN brought some of his prize corsages to "Ladies First" one day, and passed them among the winners. Here Eddie Truman helps hold up a happy "First Lady" while Mr. Pearlman does a pin-up. **FRANK AND JOSEPH, FAMOUS HAIR STYLISTS,** were among the guests "put on the spot" to answer questions about the current styles and suggested coiffures. Bob Moon and the audience member seem to be sharing a joke—possibly about her already short hair.







# **College** by Radio

An Ambitious NBC Plan to Bring Anglo-American Literature Study Course to Listeners Has Resulted in Successful Blending of Education and Good Shows

XPERTS may have doubted the idea that radio can be a great educational force, but NBC with the help of a softspoken staff producer is currently putting such skeptics to shame. The network's "NBC University Theater," which started last summer, came into existence because of a desire to provide an organized use of broadcasts for listeners. Unguided fumbling around a dial for loosely scheduled programs may sometimes result in information, but the network doubted that such a course could lead to actual education. So the NBC Education Department huddled with representatives of some leading universities, and came up with a college-by-radio plan with the "NBC University Theater" as its core.

#### **College** Course

Here's the way it works. Such schools as the University of Louisville, the University of Tulsa, and Washington State College will give university credit for a mail course in English-American literature. Listeners hear the hour-long dramatizations, study guides sent them by the university they register with, and send in reports based on their listening.

Aside from the academic atmosphere that surrounds the Sunday morning broadcasts, the happy blend of fine radio adaptations and an exceptional director has resulted in a warm welcome from listeners and the press, as well as students and teachers. A New York newspaper recently labeled it "one of the most ambitious and artistically successful dramatic series on the air."

The director for the series is An-

drew C. Love, a veteran NBC Hollywood staff producer, whose easy manner and unruffled calm seem to bring out the best in the radio actors he puts through their paces each Sunday. Andy knows the delicate shading necessary to give a production the best quality. Recently, to point up a characterization, he told an actor to realize that the character was a man who "sprinkles sugar on his grapefruit instead of pouring it on."

The novels are dramatized for radio by NBC's script staff in New York who ship the completed scripts to Hollywood. Major film actors and actresses are engaged for the chief roles, and Andy draws on the small but talented group of radio stock actors for the bulk of the parts. Special music for each performance is composed by NBC Western Division music director Henry Russell, who huddles with Andy working over the proper mood for each script for hours before sitting down to write the score.

Well-known works like "Of Human Bondage," "The Short Happy Life of Francis Macomber," "Passage to India," and "Three Soldiers" are typical of the broadcast fare during the recent months. The program recently announced its seventeen-week spring session will include dramatizations of "Jane Eyre," "Moby (Please Turn to Page 32)

Roosevelt, Wendell Wilkie, John Barrymore, or other famous, outspoken people, turned bright red, shifted uncomfortably at the implication that he alone could suggest a pattern of success, and finally summoned an answer.

# "Dog Bites Man"...

Isn't Considered Real News Any More. But Hank Weaver Would Find Out WHAT Man, WHAT Dog. and WHY—And a Good Human-Interest Story Would Show Up

"YOU have to be interested in your subject before you can interest anyone else." The young broadcaster who started in radio with no knowledge of the medium is living proof of his simple, but sound, advice.

### Sports-wise Through Experience

A former newshound, Weaver's first actual mike experience was a one-shot coverage of the hockey game at the old Polar Palace in Los Angeles. He did so well that the man for whom he substituted, Frank Bull, called him back again and again. Weaver certainly had no trouble calling every play on the rink, and his interest was understandably un-bounded. It had been beside a pond in the Homewood Cemetery in Pittsburgh that the much younger, much smaller Hank had perched on a tombstone to put on his skates for the first of some hundreds of hockey games he subsequently played over the years.

Since that chore at the Polar rink, Weaver has covered auto racing, baseball, boxing, football, track meets, six-day bike races, speedboats and aquaplane races - even bull fights. He has the know-how from having actively participated in every sport except jai alai.

Hank's early radio career was in-terrupted by a stretch in the Marine Corps that saw him, as combat cor-respondent, put in 35,000 miles of air travel in the Pacific. He visited twenty-seven islands, spent a total of five months aboard troop transports, and had his report of the flag-raising ceremonies at Suribachi the very first filed and carried by AP. Hank went into the service as a private, emerged as a five-stripe sergeant.

After the war, Hank returned de-termined to branch out from sports into human-interest reporting. The result of this ambition saw him as interviewer or newscaster on just about any special event that took place west of the Mississippi, He conducted hundreds of interviews with everyone from the man on the street to national and international celebrities.

On KECA's current "Main Street to Malibu," which Hank writes and broadcasts, he again proves that en-thusiasm and "self-interest" (the unselfish sort he mentioned as a must for those who hope to interest others) pay off.

"For instance, when I go over the wire services news that comes into (Please Turn to Page 32)

Chanteuse Line Renaud and Yves Montand, soon to be seen in this country, joined Maurice in the vocal depart-ment, Paul Baron and orchestra supplied the music.

Production was smooth in the American manner. Local Hollywood radio-ites Raymond Morgan, William N. Robson (in a departure from "Door-way to Life") and Sam Pierce can be credited with this. Spirit and sparkle seemed wonderfully French and an amazing departure from the usual ra-dio fare. Best of all, the show has brought Chevalier back to his old audience.

# In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Purely Editorial

This is purely an editorial admonition, aired without even the safe "it seems to us" that everyone outside of DuMont himself adopts when commenting on television.

BUT: don't listen to the fellow down the block who is waiting for a half dozen or so miracles to pass before he buys a television set. If you want one now, go.get it. A set need not cost half a thousand dollars . . . there are eminently satisfactory sets on the market for around a hundred, payable on time, many places. One "portable" is a lulu!

There will be no immediate obsolescence of sets. Maybe ten or fifteen years from now we'll all laugh back on the early TV "boxes," but by then we will be laughing back on a lot of things.

The twaddle about holding off buying a set until the video fare improves is just that . . . twaddle. Close questioning of the "conservatives" you hear airily indulging in the pastime of criticism usually reveals that these cheery fellows neither own nor watch a set.

Just about every radio show finds its parallel in video. Some are well done . . . some poorly. But are you going to judge video news by the man who sits and reads from the teletype tape, glancing only occasionally at the camera . . . or are you going to judge by the excellent film clips, taken only a dozen or so hours before, that most of the channels use to spice up their news?

And are you going to judge film fare by "Hopalong Cassidys," (which, incidentally, *we'll* go along with any night they are shown) or by Alexander Korda productions? Both are on.

There is wonderful fare on all the channels coming out of New York by tape. Next time the knocking-it-without-trying-it gang wax loud about "waiting until video grows up," ask them where else they could watch Jose Ferrer, Rudy Vallee, Beatrice Lillle, Nanette Fabray, Imogene Coco and up to half a hundred other entertainers, all from Broadway, without seeing them on video.

All of which is a long way of saying if you are pondering getting a TV set, don't wait. It's great.

### Looks Like

KFI-TV finds that the average number of viewers per set is 2.3, according to a survey made by Facts Consolidated. That's a good daytime record for TV.... "Rumpus Room," starring Page Fourteen

Ben Gage, is picking up 400 dollars per week from Dr. Ross Dog Food. This sixth sponsorship on KTTV is to go for fifty-two weeks. . . . Ole Olsen and Chic Johnson are tentatively set for their TV debut on a new one-hour show, originally scheduled for CBS release, but which will probably wind up as an NBC release. CBS is quibbling about time with sponsor Buick. Show is expected to follow the "Hell-zapoppin" format. . . Addition of ten new sponsors for NBC's TV in Holly-wood, KNBH, has increased the total amount of sponsored time on the network station to thirty-two spot announcements per week: seven and one-quarter hours of kinescope-recorded commercial programs; fifty minutes of sponsored film shows, and one fifteen minute live show per Waxman top the casts of the latest Grant Realm American Tobacco Com-pany's "Your Show Time" films. The long-dreaded invasion-of-privacy clause is to be tested in court. Three swimmers of Buster Crabbe's Aquacade are suing KLAC-TV for \$7,500 damages for telensing the trio in a charity event. The American Guild of Variety Artists is abetting the swimming trio in the suit for televising an event for purely charitable purposes. in a video show for Ford Motors. Story-book and fantasy angles will be used. Show starts in New York in April, and will undoubtedly follow out here soon. . . . One of the costliest deals so far for making TV films may be consummated within a few days when General Mills selects a local company to produce fifty-two half-hour "Lone Ranger" films. . . . Abe Burrows re-cently signed an exclusive seven-year contract with CBS which ties up all his radio and TV services, as well as making him available as head writer for any radio shows CBS wants to use him on. . . . The video industry can use the copyrighted music of ASCAP members through April of 1949. Since 1941, ASCAP, in order to encourage this new means of communication of music by eye as well as by ear, has granted free use of members' music, and recently extended permission for one more year. . . . Fanny Brice will make her TV debut Easter Sunday, April 17, on KNBH, with Hanley Staf-April 17, on KNBH, with Hanney Stat-ford.... Albert Dekker will star in a new TV program being set up by Bill Watters.... Henny Backus is now regular comedienne of the KTTV "Rumpus Room" show.... Looks like RCA will soon show a kinephoto sys-tem designed for moreling TV images tem designed for recording TV images on motion-picture film. This first of such processes will be held at the NAB Chicago convention next month. . Jack Smith becomes the first of the top radio singing stars to realize the future of television in the field of entertainment, and this week has or-ganized his own video company, TV

Productions, in connection with his agents. Jack plans to present both live and film shows, specializing in fifteenand thirty-minute musicals and featuring guest vocalists, musicians and Hollywood stars. . . Mike Stokey's "Pantomime Quiz" switches from Sunday to Friday night on KTTV. . . Looks like neither KTTV, currently telecasting fourteen hours, nor KNBH, telecasting nineteen hours weekly, will step up their schedule to fullweek lensing without more sponsors.

... When the Marcal Theater reopened, the TV cameras were trained in it all. A big screen and inside TV job permitted the audience to see themselves. ... A "Looks Like" we hated to hear was that KECA-TV will not open up Channel 7 in May after all, but will again postpone to June.

### We Point With Pride

. . To the excellent coverage of hockey matches performed by KTLA. This bears more than a mention. When you consider that the puck flies across the ice more than fifty miles an hour, and that the skaters themselves sometimes lose sight of this small black object, the camera's following of the game is an amazing thing. Very seldom is a play missed, and KTLA's cameramen and director on this sport should receive special kudos. . . . To KTTV's four night a week presentation of "The Meakins" (Jack and Patty) sizing modern versions of the art of the dance... To KLAC-TV's "Picture Album," in which Bob McLaughlin combines real entertainment with guest artists of note.... To KNBH's camera work and production general-ly. They set a mark to shoot at. To KNBH's

Some prideful pointing might be done at a behind-scenes operation on the part of KTLA, which recently refused sponsorship for a Channel 5 show called "Hollywood Opportunity," despite the fact that any and all of the video stations welcome new coin with open arms.

The "Opportunity" show is a weekly amateur talent sifting deal, and  $KT_{LA}$ head man Klaus Landsberg felt tha. acquiring Harrison Productions as sponsor would be commercializing amateur talent. This is a costly way to maintain integrity, and the station is to be congratulated on keeping an amateur hour just that—an amateur hour.

### We View With Alarm

That this early in the TV game, great similarity between shows on different channels is creeping in. One instance is KTSL and KNBH's almost simultaneous beaming of Rin-Tin-Tin, Jr., serials. Of course KNBH's is called "Lightning Warrior," and also stars George Brent and Frankie Darro; while KTSL's features Rex, King of the Wild Horses, and sundry actors. We eagerly watch both. . . . It was with great alarm that we recently dialed from one early evening group of pup-

pets to another and to still another, only to find that the lead puppet in each case was being hypnotized by an evil force. Like we said before, Ho, hum! . . . One station shows the old film of "Smart Guy," so next week another channel proudly presents "Smart Guy," enacted live and brought here by kinescope... The newscaster who tears a strip from the station teletype, sits in front of the camera, and reads to the viewers. Very dull.

# "Dog Bites Man"

the network, my eye is caught more by local items than by news of the peace conference or of changes in our government administrations. The other newscasters will all carry the world news, anyway. On the local stuff you can never tell what will turn up.

"One day I read a small item on the wire report about someone's pet being taken to a dog hospital for a blood transfusion. That was the first I had heard of this practice, and went to the hospital to see what the 'story behind the story' might be.

"It just so happened that a repre-sentative of the SPCA was out there on an inspection tour. When a partially blind German shepherd, the animal that usually gave the blood when transfusions were necessary, was brought in this SPCA man rec ognized him. The dog had been one of the first indoctrinated into the K-9 corps, and this man had worked with the K-9er for several months, showing him in Madison Square Garden and helping him train other dogs. The SPCA man spoke to the dog, calling him by name and put-ting him through a couple of commands."

As a result of Hank's including this bit for dog lovers in his evening's "Main Street to Malibu" broadcast, the lonely, half-blind dog, whose only postwar duty lay in serving as a blood-donor for other pups, found a home. A veteran, whose own service in the Pacific had left him with but one arm, called Hank and asked if he could have the handicapped dog as a companion.

#### **Interest Stimulates Action**

Another time, Hank's interest in behind-the-scenes stories led him to follow the news item about a leper housed in the General Hospital. His calls revealed that the young Mexican service man, Pancho, had to be literally held in bondage. After talking with the doctors at the hospital, who explained that the public's mis-conception of leprosy as a highly contagious thing made this solitary confinement necessary, Hank talked with veterans' organizations and clearance agencies for the government. His resultant air editorializing stimulated enough interest to motivate moving Pancho from his confined quarters to a leprosarium in Louisiana. #### **Attains Success**

. In addition to the highly listenable quality of the broadcasts the education-by-radio plan seems to be work-ing. The University of Louisville reports that inquiries arrive at the rate of about 250 a day. Dr. Harvey Web-ster, in charge of the Louisville course, admits that at first he was highly skeptical about the possibility of really teaching students literature while they were absorbed by the novelty of the radio performance. Now he says the excellence of the writing and direction has kept the dramatic quality of the novels intact.

Dr. Webster reports that keeping up with all the registered students is a full-time chore for several English Department assistants at Louisville. The staff answers all questions by people registered in the course, and grades and comments on the listening reports mailed in to the school. Some of the students have been interested but misguided-like the one who thought Dos Passos' "Three Soldiers" was un-American and the character who loosed a flood of invective at the program because he claimed "Passage to India" was anti-British. But the all-time favorite of the university faculty and the network is the grimy note which came in one day. "College by radio stinks. Only ignorank people listen."

In the first place, the quartet, made up of writer-host-emcee Bill Stulla, Bob "Boychoir" Mitchell, who plays the piano, celeste and o-gan on the same show (sometimes simultaneously), Buddy Jobe of the steel guitar, and handsome tencr Paul Owen, have all worked so lcng and extemporaneously together that entertainment is second nature to each.

#### Video Natural

In the second place, their fortyminute program, a great part of which is observance of l'steners' birthdays, anniversaries and other special occasions, is a natural for video.

"Instead of just telling who the anniversary couple will be, we are now able to show you the guests," explains Bill. "We can show the 'Birthday Train,' with its 'Smile Ride' passengers, too. All the mothers who want their kiddies on the passenger list can simply send in pictures. KFI-TV has a wonderful piece of equipment which makes it possible to project snapshots of the children, where formerly we could only mention their names.

"Our fondest hope is that now we may be able to get some of the housewives we have entertained during the past few years to come down and entertain us. I know a lot of the gals must be able to sing, whistle, or do some sort of a little act."

The four gentlemen who do a radio show each morning, then a couple of hours later entertain on television, are as qualified a group as you can find to provide six hours and fifteen minutes of merriment each week.

Bill Stulla, who once won the National H. P. Davis Memorial Announcers Award, writes the scripts. After a brief run-through, these scripts are tossed to the wind, with nothing saved except the names and addresses of the folks to be saluted on appropriate occasions.

Bob Mitchell, music man who plays everything from bop to Beethoven for listeners, is the youngest member of the American Guild of Organists. This honorary fraternity of the Wurlitzers and Hammonds requires that a stringent examination be passed before the accolade is bestowed.

Buddy Jobe, who plucks the steel strings, as well as always joining the day's vocalizing, almost nightly benefits different small musical combos around town by joining their ranks.

Paul Owen, the handsome young man who made such a hit in "Lend an Ear" with his "Molly O'Reilly" number, leaves "Ladies' Day" each afternoon to work at directing a choral group. This group's most recent appearance was on the Ross Hunter Show that played here in the city last March.

A yet unseen member in good standing with the "Ladies' Day" family is the mythical horse "Sylvester," a noble steed born of sound effects behind the singing of a Western ballad, nurtured by listener requests, and cemented into reality by famous cartoonist Frank Webb's color cartoons.

Maybe that "wonderful piece of equipment which makes it possible to project snapshots" can do something about bringing viewers "Sylvester."

treatment, magazine story, novel or play is a major feat compared with placing an original radio script. "If you write an interesting script, there is a very good chance of its being bought," she insists.

Her advice to script-writing aspirants is simple and straightforward: "Learn by writing—no one can teach you or tell you, beyond pointing out a few script details, how to do it. Try and get a staff writing job on a small station and actually write. Or pick a show that takes free-lance scripts, listen to the program carefully for several weeks running, study the slant of the show and write a script for it." Jean loves radio writing and believes that the aspiring writer should feel the same in order to succeed.

With so much scripting required of her each week, Jean finds that her life is ruled by radio. Her work doesn't end with the last typewritten page. After studying her subject and writing her script, she must go over it with the director, see it through stenographic, check it during the actors' reading, correct it where needed, cut it for timing and sit out the rehearsals in case there are any changes before she finally hears it

EAN HOLLOWAY is certainly one of the most successful radio scripters in the busi-ness. A list of her credits is so long that it's virtually impossible to compile. At present she does all the "Mr. President" scripts and many of the "Railroad Hour" shows and is writer of the "Hallmark Playhouse" series. She has two movies, "Till the Clouds Roll By" and "Words and Music," to her credit. She created the "Mayor of the Town" program for Lionel Barrymore and Agnes Moorehead. Pretty good for a girl who didn't want to be a writer! San Jose's gift to radio shone in the drama classes of the San Jose State Teacher's Col-lege. Whenever an original script was needed, Jean dashed that off. But acting was the main thing, the scripts a means to an end. At nine-teen Jean was visiting school friends in New York. To prove to her that "pull" was the only way you could be a school of the school of the school of the school of the provided school of the get into radio, a friend mailed one of Jean's drama class scripts to the Kate Smith program. supper at a New York hotel and giving the customers close, complex harmony the like of which had never been heard before. Among the tunes that struck his fancy was an eartantalizing Jewish chant called "Bei Mir Bist Du Schon." Mr. Levy went to work combining this tune and this talent into something less complex and more commercial, and what came out was a Decca record that launched a million-dollar career.

"Which brings us to a couple of other men in our lives," announced the sisters. "The Kapps—Jack and Dave, president and vice-president of Decca Records."

"And the Decca Indian!" added Patty. "He's probably one of the most important men in our lives. If it hadn't been for him, we might now be buried alive under a wild fiveminute arrangement of uninhibited hot licks."

#### Indian Guide

The girls explained that there hangs in the Decca recording studios, in New York and here on Melrose in Hollywood, the famous portrait of the Indian with arms outstretched and profile lifted to the sky in a symbol of resigned abandon. On it the Kapps have had printed a cartoon balloon which reads, "Where is the *melody f*"

In the early days, the Andrews girls' feeling for close harmony and fast rhythms frequently led them into such unpredictable patterns of unconventional harmonies that the basic strains of the original melody were wholly unrecognizable. The Decca Indian is, and has long been, their gentle yet effective reminder not to stray too far from the proven path of a successful melody.

"Which brings us to the subject of our arrangements," the sisters went on to say.

fascinated by her work on the "Mr. President" program, though it is far from an easy writing job ("I. have no easy shows," she sighs happily). "Mr. President" requires a great deal of research before the actual scripting is attempted. After an actual incident in the life of an American president is selected, Jean gets to work with the histories, texts and sources concerning the statesman. She finds a great variance in the anecdotes and incidents as she traces them from one book to another. Depending upon the political leanings of the author and the era in which the book was written, the identical incident can be colored as contemptuously or as heroically as the biographer desires. Jean weeds out the emotions of the writer involved and reconstructs the scene from many sources.

Jean comes by her job on "Mr. President" with almost an inherited right — h er great-grandmother saw and talked to Abraham Lincoln! It happened right after the Civil War when Lincoln had s t op p ed in a Southern town. Jean's great-grandmother, 'then a tiny child, was on the sidewalk. She stuck her tongue out at the president and called him a "D— Yankee." Lincoln picked her up. She pulled his beard. "Some day," said Lincoln to the irate child, "I hope your father's people realize I'm fighting for t h em and not against them." Jean once used this anecdote a b o ut her great-grandmother on a program. Two thousand letters from listeners arrived at the post office in the tiny California town where she still lives. "Nothing is sacred to that child!" was her comment. Jean patterned "Marilly" in "Mayor of the Town" after her beloved relative.

"The Railroad Hour," adaptations of Broadway musicals, is another show to which Jean contributes to be seen. Jean's problem is to translate them into radio terms. She must pack scene changes, song cues and story line into the brief amount of time left after singing numbers are set. On the Hallmark show Jean must preserve the author's message and effectively draw the characters in the same way the author drew them, in addition to turning the written story into a radio play. She had the task recently of turning a two-volume novel, "The Prairie Years," into a 20-minute program.
