# The Story Behind "HOLLYWOOD CALLING"

Plans, Work, Talent and Lots of Excitement Went to Make Up NBC's Great Giveaway Show

Sunday, 2:30 p.m. NBC-KFI, KFSD

HE TENSION and excitement at NBC before the premiere broadcast of "Hollywood Calling" were as great as that backstage at a Broadway opening. So many preparations had been made, so much coordination had to click, so many people were waiting for the outcome. Everyone at the network was touched by the excitement. People who said they hadn't been interested in giveaway shows were assuring each other: "This is different."

Now that the program has been established and the staff has calmed

down, we'd like to reprise the beginning and try to reveal why "Hollywood Calling" is different.

Everyone can't win the prizes, but maybe everyone can have the entertainment, was the revolutionary theory behind the formatting of the program. Henry Russell and his orchestra, a choral group, George Murphy for emcee, guest movie stars and actors were lined up to keep the show moving while the telephone quiz was made. Particular attention was paid to pacing the program, to keep it moving while the mechanics of the quiz were going on. To keep the questions from bogging down into a rut, the clues were given in a variety of guises, musical parody, impersonations, sound effects and scenes.

Disgruntled listeners (and even winners) have proven that there are "bugs" in many giveaway and quiz programs. The NBC staff of "Hollywood Calling" decided early in the stages of formatting to rid their program of the "bugs." First was the discarding of any recording tricks. What profits a listener who stays glued to the dial listening to a phone quiz that took place hours or even days before and was recorded to be played later? Or one on which the phone calls to contestants were made before the program went on the air? For that reason, "Hollywood Calling" is cleared coast-to-coast for a live broadcast and the phone calls are made while the show is actually on the air.

Contestants and listeners have been jaded with lists of gigantic prizes given away over the past few years. How to perk up an audience that is bored with refrigerators? "Gifts that money can't buy," a new category of prizes, was added to the list. If a contestant fails, he still a

wins an interesting item; it may be one of little intrinsic value, but its appeal is enormous. It may be the scarf worn by Jennifer Jones in "Portrait of Jenny," a cigarette case from a Humphrey Bogart picture, any movie prop that would have a particular interest for the contestant on the other end of the line.

Movie studios have been particularly cooperative with the program. They realize that the publicity they receive is logically included on the program, not hammered home. The weekly stars are charged with the task of matching up the contestant and the prize. In the few moments the star is on the phone, he endeavors to learn a bit of the contestant's background. Backstage, a writer matches up what the star has learned with a list of fascinating movie props available. In a matter of seconds, the star has the information and is relaying it to the excited person on the other end of the wire.

Calls are made three or four ahead to keep the show moving. Ten operators from the phone company and a supervisor are stationed in the corridor of NBC, contacting numbers. Every phone directory in the nation is available. The set-up of drawing numbers is a story in itself. Gov-ernors of the states draw numbers that designate states, cities, pages and numpers of the names on the pages. There is a number for every two thousand listed phones in the country, rather than one for each phone directory. In the latter case, the twelve residents of Broken Arm, Wyoming, would have the same chance of their directory being drawn as the several million in the Manhattan New York directory. The residents of Broken Arm would have their chances multiplied by many million in winning a chance to guess on the program.

Vick Knight, director of the program, is generally regarded with awe for the job he has done and is doing on "Hollywood Calling." His job virtually calls for a superman. He wears a headphone—on one ear he gets the contestant's end of the phone conversation, on the other he gets the supervisor of the telephone operators and can also switch on the musical conductor and emcee Murphy. Out of the wall of the control booth, he can hear the whole show!

There are ninety-five people directly concerned with the program. Sixty of them are on stage while the (Please Turn to Page 15)

LATE THIS MONTH these two lovable brainchildren of creator Burr Tillstrom will again join singing mistress of ceremonies Fran Allison in the "Kukla, Fran and Ollie" program to be seen or KNBH, NBC's Hollywood video.

The only "live talent" appearing on the show is the telegenic stage, radio and video star, Fran Allison, long known to *listeners* as "Aunt Fanny" of Don McNeill's "Breakfast Club." Fran expertly ad-libs with the little Kuklapolitans while Burr Tillstrom, creator of the amusing oddly sad group, puppeteers them. For each performance, Burr merely gives Fran a rough idea of what will happen, and she just meanders into the act to take things as they come.

Tillstrom has been a professional puppeteer for more than fifteen years, making his debut in a Chicago department store. Not only does he manage to be the puppeteer, he simultaneously watches the daily show's progress on a screen, switches voices and characters with unbelievable dexterity and agility, and manages the dozens and dozens of props necessary to the whimsical adventure series of his puppets.

While legions of new fans are a nightly occurrence, "Kukla" and "Ollie" are almost old-timers. During the war, "Kukla" did some fast work in bond drives with the Red Cross and in entertainment centers for service men. Tillstrom still gives voice and action to his lovable crew when they perform between TV shows at hospitals and orphans' homes.

#### Accolade of Them All

An example of the hold which the round-headed "Kukla" and "Ollie," his sorrowful, one-toothed dragon, have on the hearts of their fans lies in the story about a New York radio executive. In this case, the executive was a woman, quite a worldly soul, to whom celebrities of any sort (but especially those of radio or video) came a dime a dozen. Too many of her "best friends" fell into the celeb category for her to be much impressed by mere "fame."

An absolute and nightly fan of the Kuklapolitans, this young woman about Manhattan wouldn't miss an evening of their antics. One night, to her joy, she heard "Kukla" mention having seen her, the mere viewer, in a crowd some place! Off to the phone she rushed to call her friends and tell these folk, at whose word radio and television shows are built or bought, of her greatest of thrills! "Kukla" had actually said her name!

"KUKLA" AND "FLETCHER RABBIT" work up a rare bit of tympanic entertainment. The fact that this sort of whimsical stuff comes off well five nights a week is tribute to facile-minded Tillstrom and his right hand, Fran Allison.

She plays herself—as if she could be anyone else—in a backstage musical built around her famous songs. She's got the sort of brassy personality and musical stage projection that swamp the rest of her pretty good radio cast.

It's interesting to note that some of the songs she sings have had their lyrics changed since the last time you listened to a Merman record or saw a Merman show. That great crashing song. "Heat Wave," is a notable example.

#### "Rocky Jordan"

Jack Moyles as the intrepid "Rocky Jordan" of "Cafe Tambourine" is surely one of the most attractive air heroes engaged in melodrama. Heard at 5:00 p. m. Sunday on KNX, he's still battling international intrigue in Cairo with an assortment of native characters and a beautiful girl in the new series.

The longevity of this program is based on the same appeal that the old Peter Lorre-Sidney Greenstreet

movies had. Radio cast supplying the typical characters lurking around the "Cafe" is excellent. Betty Lou Gerson, Byron Kane, Jay Novello, David Ellis and John Dehner, all equipped with beautiful speaking voices, gave the first broadcast an all-star send-off.

Musical conductor Dick Aurandt obviously enjoyed his chores in atmosphering the exotic setting and contributed a completely apropos score.

# Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

#### "Hollywood Mystery House"

There seems to be something about five, ten or twenty-five minutes past the hour when announced as the time of a show, that immediately categor-

izes it as more or less a filler, not of strictly A-1 caliber. We know that the 8:05 p.m. announced for KLAC-TV's Sunday night "Hollywood Mystery House" keot us, until recently, from catching it. First presentation we saw was "Mystery in the Mojave." a comedy-mystery with a plot as frail as the title suggests. What kept us around was not the script but the highly professional, excellent performances on the part of all actors and actresses (with the exception of one poor soul not quite sure of his lines) and the beautiful set construction by Jerry Tamblyn.

Spot is a live show, emanating from the confines, and we use the term literally, of KLAC-TV's studios. Yet somehow the illusion of a ranch house, the wide-open space of a back forty acres, and the long rides through the night came across as well as any motion picture we have seen outside of "Treasure of the Sierra Madre," carefully shot to picture as much of the outdoors as possible.

Jack Kelly, Chris Fortune, Cathy Qualen (daughter of movie actor John Qualen) and Mel Marshall carried off the principal roles. Their craft in avoiding a single glance at the television cameras added to their natural performances in a story that found a merry group of dudes plunged into solving the murder of the ranch owner. The denouement hinged on a secret magnesium deposit or some such credible factor. The comedy touch and fast action redeemed completely any boredom of plot.

The wits behind camera direction at KLAC-TV belong to a miss. Betty Turbiville can be credited for shuttering that abetted nicely (save for some rather long fades) the performers' work.

## "Pal Headliners"

The title "Pal Headliners" seemed to us suggestive of small animal friends who had somehow, distinguished themselves sufficiently to appear in the local seventy-two-point banners. That happy thought lured us into sticking around for the fiveminute spot on KTTV, Sunday night at 7:25. It was thus we uncovered one of the best small commercial video shows we have seen.

"Pal" refers to Pal Hollow Ground Razor Blades. A pitch for these precedes the news show, and what a pitch! During the time Pal's different kinds of blades are flashed on the screen, a narrator tells you about them. With a timing old vaudevillians would envy, the commercial shoots catch lines at the viewer, each time getting him back just before attention strays... e.g. "you can change shave to save in one second" or "takes the H out of shave for you men."

The four remaining minutes of recently seen film dealt with tiny Bonnie Prince Charlie, son of Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh. The exclusive Movietone shots of the baby and his adoring parents were of the most intimate type, showing small Charles and mother rolling about on the grass. Old film of other eras brought Edward VII, George V and the present ruling couple onto the television screen, while commentator Ed Thorgersen posed the question as to whom the baby resembled.

Happy little Charles resembled nothing so much as any other happy, beloved baby who was blissfully unaware of the camera, but it made a good gimmick to tie together all the film secured for one of these regrettably brief presentations.

"Headliners" is part of the "Crusade in Europe" package ABC sold to CBS-TV until such time as ABC is rolling here on the Coast.

Money and obviously some thought have been spent on this show. Too bad the various panels around town which spend their lunch hours in wordy, valueless and vaguely general discussions of what is good and what is not so good with video don't study small films like this.

#### Frank Veloz Show

The new Frank Veloz video show (KNBH, Channel 4, Sundays at 8:30 p.m.) is an entertaining half hour that instructs at-homers and audience members in dance steps, then pits the audience couples against one another as they trip the light or heavy fantastic. Frank Veloz has long been acclaimed as America's greatest ballroom dancer. After a few more shows he is likely as not to be acclaimed video's most gracious emcee and able host. Probably biggest tribute to his social and entertainment-wise abilities were the noticeable ease and happy, unself-conscious m an n er with which audience members glided or clumped through routines before both

Here's how it goes: Musical gifts combined with an attractive on- and off-stage personality—Lily Pons, Artur Rubinstein, Eugene List and Ezio Pinza.

Musical gifts combined with a provocative personality that gets into print—Beecham, Levant, Stokowski. The late Grace Moore was also in this category. Attractive and peppery personalities in addition to great musical talent—Maggie Teyte and Toscanini. Extraordinary musical talent that draws crowds removed from any offstage attraction — Horowitz, Heifetz, Menuhin, Kapell, Casadesus, Serkin and Stern.

Personalities who have improved their appeal through movies and radio --Lauritz Melchior and Jose Iturbi.

Jean Holloway, the talented young lady who writes four shows a week, including "Railroad Hour" and "Mr. President," got to thinking about radio comedy. "Wouldn't it be wonderful," she mused, "if I could team Helen Traubel and Lauritz Melchior as a couple of married opera stars! Ah well, it wouldn't work—but if it did ..." Jean enlarged on the idea, flew to New York and contacted the Metropolitan stars. They both thought it was a wonderful idea—and the audition record is going to be cut any day.

"They both have a great sense of comedy," revealed the writer, when we asked for details on the show. "I've even used incidents that have happened to them in opera and some of the gags they've played on each other." Seems that Melchior took a diabolical delight in holding Traubel Page Twelve

Striving to be pleasant, he asked Jim where he worked.

"Say," pounced the other patient, "can you get me two tickets for 'Queen for a Day'?"

an audience and the television cameras.

Everyone in there pitching turned a simple format into lively entertainment. Four girls and four men were chosen from the attendance. The distaff side danced with a young man from one of the Veloz schools; the sword side with a pretty instructress from the same school. Excellent camera work expedited the performances. No disembodied feet twinkled around on viewers' screens. And no footless, grinning bodies gyrated up and down. The men behind the four-lensers combined hefty camera arrangement with the knowledge that it still takes both a body and a pair of feet to do any dancing. Good camera work was doubly welcome during the spectacular dance by Veloz himself and a professional partner—a feature of each show.

Halfway in the show, before the finalists were chosen and suitably rewarded with a long series of free lessons from Veloz studios, the guest star of the evening appeared. First show guest was Bill Anson, who took the opportunity to tout his own hopedfor video "Joe Penner" show. Bill went through an interminable routine as Penner, then asked if folks could write in and tell him how they would like such a show. The time could well have been spent in either another exhibition dance by Veloz or further instruction in the dance.

Frank Veloz's partner, Yolanda, will soon join the show to dance with her husband and serve as hostess. Mrs. Veloz is currently foregoing the lure of the television lights to mother the newest, fourth Veloz baby.

Show's interesting audience shots and stage effects were possible through NBC's use of their new Image Orthicon. Entire half hour went on at room illumination, or about one-fifth of the light ordinarily necessary. This not only kept the participants from dropping off like flies as they capered about, but allowed the audience members (all without benefit of make-up, having been picked on the spot) to televise well.

# Second Glances (Critical Comment)

#### "Dark Brown"

The recent Pasadena Playhouse-KTTV production of Phillip Johnson's mystery melodrama, "Dark Brown," proved almost conclusively that video requires a technique all its own.

The actual story was engrossing enough. The central character was a nineteenth century English wife whose vivid imagination, insinuating mother, and harassed, secretive husband combined to drive the girl nearly mad. Of course her husband's absences from home (falsely explained, for obvious reasons, by an ailing aunt) turned out to have been spent doing odd jobs as local executioner, as unfortunate a way of bringing home extra bacon to wifey as an author could have devised.

The hour-long adaptation of Johnson's original play was done by Samuel Herrick. Mr. Herrick at one time studied with Madame Maria Ouspenskaya for three years in New York, and later became production manager for the Southerm California Tour of the Ouspenskaya Company.

The play's "Arthur Brown" was portrayed by Frederick Berest, an instructor at Pasadena Playhouse and director in charge of California state-wide One-Act-Play Tournaments. Motherin-law "Mrs. Collins" was Margaret Brewster, former trainee at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. The rest of the cast were actresses who double in voice and ballet, are nice-looking girls and have enviable dramatic abilities and records. The stage sets were excellent in both interest and authenticity.

What more can you ask? Nothing but a treatment suitable to video.

Sunday's participants stuck by stage technique. with the half-laughable, half-annoying result that the most covert glance on the part of a player seemed like a prolonged. baleful glare; the slightest pause made the actor seem as though he had been momentarily smitten by catalepsy; the slightest idiotic coyness of the housemaid role turned her into a frightening lunatic; and the husband's tortured reluctance to tell his wife about his "side-line" work turned him, too, into a malevolent maniac. That's the way the stage emphasis came-over television. Yet it seems impossible to believe that director Herrick didn't watch the rehearsal through the eye of a video camera and realize the spectators, too, would be right on top of the actors, rather than seated rows back in a theater.

If what was wanted was a well-acted stage presentation, "Dark Brown" was it. If what was wanted was a video presentation that kept pace with the Sunday night movie show, news coverage and special studio variety bills of this weekend day, it would have been well to speed up the action, dialogue and bits of stage business about an even fifty per cent. That way attention and channel indicators wouldn't have strayed.



#### Much Ado About Milty

The other day we were reading an English movie magazine, just for kicks, and we came across an intriguing item on Milton Berle. The British correspondent, evidently never

having seen nor heard of Berle before, identified him to readers as the biggest thing in U.S. television, and as someone who "does imitations."

This puzzled us, too, until we realized that the writer of the column had probably heard from an American friend or a U.S. publication that Berle was renowned for doing other people's acts. We feel the British movie magazine writer should be informed that there is a difference. To our way of thinking, someone who takes another's act and gives name credit to the originator is called an "imitator" or "impersonator." Someone who takes an act without giving credit is called (among other things) a "comedian." See?

ALBUM OF THE WEEK (Decca): Fred Waring and the Pennsylvanians with their great array of talent are a natural in presenting eight sides from the Irving Berlin musicale, "Miss Lib-



erty," most of the numbers already on their way to being hits. Outstanding sides fea-ture Jane Wilson ("Paris Wakes Up and Smiles"), Joannne Wheatley ("You Can Have Him"), Joe Ma-rine ("I Love You"),

and the very impressive choral work on "Give Me Your Tired, Your Poor." ... RECORD OF THE WEEK (Colum-

bia): Frank Sinatra goes to work on the oldie "It All Depends on You" to fine uptempo'd backing by Hugo Winterhalter, and what comes out rates with the best in a long time. . . . Reverse is in direct ballad contrast with a fine assist from the Ken Lane Sing-ers on "I Only Have Eyes for You." ... LP-MICROGROOVE (Discovery):

Here's a top-flight concert in the jazz idiom featuring Phil Moore's Orchestra in "Concerto for Piano" and some very fine 88ing by Calvin Jackson, "Trombone Concerto" with Murray McEachern as soloist, and four shorter compositions, "Misty Moon Blues," "Day Dream," "125th St. Prophet," and "Cornucopia" to round out thirtysix minutes as neat and entertaining as you'd want to hear. . . . DANCE **BAND** (RCA Victor): Vaughn Monroe should have another biggie in the rejuvenated "Some Day," with its catchy melody enhanced by the usual full Monroe arrangement and vocal assist by the Moon Men. Flip-over is "And It Still Goes," a pleasing enough tune that doesn't add anything to "Some Day," the side to watch.... NE OF the most familiar sights around radio row is an orchestra leader bouncing blithely into a studio before show time, apparently without a care

in the world. He has time to shout jolly greetings at friends and to linger chatting with other artists.

The show's comic, dramatic actor or whatever the leading role may be, usually arrives with furrowed brow and a contingent of helpfuls who have either suggestions or service to offer.

Unlike him, the orchestra leader hasn't any real cast or script worries to age him early. Outside of seeing that the men seated before him actually blow, beat or strum successfully, he has only his own performance to worry about. That's because the union (in the case of Los Angeles it is Local 47), that giant organization that so well takes care of its own, has provided an "orchestra manager" for every band on a TC show. On smaller shows, employing fewer men and not going transcontinental, the leader himself in many cases assumes this responsibility.

# Orchestra Managers

An Orchestra Manager Has to Know His Music, His Musicians, and Just What To Do in Case the Drummer Breaks His Leg Fifteen Minutes Before Show Time

actually drawing music from the orchestra members for the leader to relegate to his manager? There are the hiring and replacing of band members to be done. Arranging and copying are taken care of by the manager, who was once upon a time referred to as a music "contractor." The copied arrangements must be returned by the copyist to the manager, who in turn sees that the band members have them at rehearsal and show time.

August 21, 1949

The musical aggregation must be paid, taxes extracted, and records of their wages, taxes and hours sent not only to Uncle Sam but to the agency representing the sponsor, to the union itself and to the men. The manager has to see to it that the "boys in the band" are on hand at show time, in case of an unscheduled rehearsal and for regular rehearsals. If the drummer oversleeps or breaks a leg shortly before show time, he has to be replaced fast and by the

right man. In short, the manager does all the "bird-dogging" for the leader.

This orchestra manager has to know music as well. Realizing the difference between "Tippy-Tin" and an aria from Bizet's "Carmen" isn't enough. The manager has to know who blows best in the brass and reed section group of musicians around; he has to know what drummer will best fit the specifications of solid-beat background drumming or of razzle-dazzle break tympany and what piano styles belong to what eighty-eighters on the local scene.

Not all the seventy-some managers for Local 47 are as versed in these knowledges as is Harry Harris, longtime manager of the band on Jack Benny's show and of Phil Harris's show band. Harry has an edge on most in years and experience.

The Sunday of the last Harris-Faye show at NBC this past season we corralled the jolly, blue-eyed man who calls the Harris bandmen "thirty of the very best," to try and find out what makes a manager.

In Mr. Harris's case (Harry's, that is), he couldn't help knowing music for the life of him. Since the time he was in his teens, Harry has been associated with it. He was bandmaster for the old Barnum show, was with Wallace's circus even before that showman imported the German animal trainer, Hagenbeck, and called one of the greatest big tops of all time the Hagenbeck-Wallace Circus.

Harry was clarinetist with L. G. Field's minstrels when that joyous outfit of entertainers was called a trouping show. As the years progressed and trouping shows and tent "rep" shows turned into theater en-

# Tougher Than Midnight For Cinderella!

(Robert B. Turnbull was born in Prescoll. Arizona. and has been with KIIJ's sound-effects department since December, 1942. Formerly a high-school atl and drama leacher, he also spent three years in the Army Engineer Corps, where he rose to corporal. Some of the shows he has worked on are "Sherlock Holmes." "Cisco Kid," "Gregory Hood." "Red Ryder." and the Roy Rogers program. He has just completed a book on radio sound effects, now at the publishers.)

HIS IS the story of a sound effect ... a sound effect conceived by Paul Franklin, writer director of Don Lee's "Red Ryder," and brought for th after considerable labor by yours truly.

One day Mr. Franklin (I always call him Mr. Franklin behind his back) nabbed me while we were getting ready for a "Red Ryder" rehearsal.

"Bob," he said, "in next Thursday's script there's a somewhat unusual sound effect. I thought I'd tell you now what I want, so you'd have time to work on it."

"Well thanks, Paul, that's mighty thoughtful of you," I said with a sickly grin. You see, compared to Paul Franklin, H. G. Wells has the imagination of a mud turtle. Paul's just full of gee-whiz stuff!

"Here's what I want. In the script the villain has developed a deadly bacteria culture that's capable of wiping out all the range cattle!"

"Why 'Ryder' will never stand for such villainy!" I stoutly and loyally protested.

Paul favored me with the wellknown Franklin Frozen Eye and continued. "Now, along about page nine 'Red' visits this crackpot scientist, who shows 'Ryder' the bacteria. It's in a small beaker, and when he takes the lid off, I want to *hear* the stuff. I want to get the feeling of a menacing new and unknown culture that spells instant disaster just by its very *sound*!"

"Ulp!" I brightly responded. I could sense disaster already.

#### "Only a Show!"

"I see you get the idea," Paul chuckled as he observed my confusion. Then he gently continued. "Take it easy, boy, after all it's only a radio show."

"I know that," I managed to quaver, "but I'm the guy that has to dream this up."

"No," he corrected, "I dream it up, you just do it! But there's nothing to it. All I want when that lid's removed is a sound that gives the feel of a fomenting, bubbling, terrifyingly menacing, dreadful, hideous, iniquitous, plaguing witch's brew embodying all the villainous, horrible attributes of an instantly deadly bacteria culture!"

SOAP SUDS WHIPPED with an egg beater is just the thing when held close to the mike. It has a very active lowvolume sound, and by script build-up has the association of an insidious menace.

SELTZER WATER has a nice, active sound, but it always seems to call automatically for the tinkle of ice cubes!

# "For cows, that is," I daringly amended.

Ignoring my irreverence, Paul continued. "In a word, I want to scare the pants off the listeners!"

"Yes sir," I replied, resigning myself to the deviltry afoot.

"Okay, now get to it," snapped Paul over his shoulder as he walked away. Then he stopped, took a beat pause, turned around and made a beautiful fade-to on mike, where he delivered the 'snapper.' "Oh, I almost forgot. There's one more little item. I also want the sound of a diamond rapidly dissolving in a solvent so potent that it will dissolve anything!" And with that he left, spreading light and good cheer.

I sought out Norm Smith and Bill James, the other soundmen on the show. But they had their own headaches. So I struggled along as shown in the accompanying photos and finally came up with what Paul wanted.

On Thursday I was rewarded with Mr. Franklin's three-teeth-too-many smile as he casually said, "You see, lad, there's nothing to it!"

Yes, the life of a soundman may sometimes become tiresome, but it's never dull. Now and then a writer will dream up a sound cue that's tougher than midnight for Cinderella.

THE DIAMOND dissolving was an easy one-just drop an Alka-Seltzer tablet into a glass of water. **COMPRESSED** OXYGEN bubbling in a tank of water is much too big a sound for that supposedly originating in a small beaker.

So Goes Don Otis. When Radio's Far-Reaching Tentacles Back-Seated Live Performance, Otis Went Along. Now He's Deep in Video's Toils

OMEONE recently and almost wistfully asked Don Otis, "Don, how did you get into television?"

"When the station went television, they told all of us we'd better get together a video show," was the amazingly simple explanation Otis gave for the accomplishment that represents 1949's biggest white hope for evenuence in radio for everyone in radio.

True enough, KLAC wouldn't have urged just anyone to "get together a TV show," but they were familiar with the popular record-spinner's first-hand knowledge of honest-to-

goodness, well-executed entertainment.

Otis has not only heard and enjoyed-he has personally knownmost of the recording artists of the last decade. In his series of record shows and one brief stint (one that he relinquished gladly to return to

his beloved music purveyor's post) as a young businessman type program manager, Otis has had 'em all on the air with him.

ment (currently seen as a half hour but soon to return to its former length) of which the keynote is easy-going informality. Performing guests ostensibly visit Mr. Otis in his own home. Against a backdrop that pictures the lights of Hollywood twinkling below a big window, the guests gather to take turns at singing, instrumental performance or specialty acts.

Visitors to the Otis "home" have included Victor Borge, Duke Ellington, Clark Dennis, Jack Fina, Dizzy Gillespie, Woody Herman, Earl Hines, Gene Krupa, Liberace, Nellie Lutcher, the Mills Brothers and Wingy Manone, Kay Starr, the popular Trenier Twins and many, many more.

One reason the show comes off so well is that a good deal of rehearsal time is put in. Three hours of honest work are done before show time each week. Don doesn't assume that because a man is a big hit on the bandstand he'll somehow magically know how to conduct himself on video.

"No matter who the guests, they go through the same rehearsal I have to. If they object to rehearsing, I simply use some star big enough not to object."

Don's contributions to the show, aside from his easy, pleasant personality and obvious gift for showmanship, include the writing, picking guests, choosing songs, keeping tabs on props, lighting and just about anything else that comes under his eagle eye. He works hard and thrives on every second of it.

Like most folk who find themselves in the enviable position of starring on a television show, Don has nothing but good to say of the new medium.

Public performance is not a new thing to Otis. Most radio addicts, who know Don primarily as the man who stayed behind the scenes to plav their favorite records, don't realize he got his start, as a seventeen-year-old, singing in theater lobbies where the management, in the old days, sold sheet music of the feature songs from the film inside. Later he sang in a night club and for thirteen years announced in radio.

Today, in the new medium he didn't dream about when he first warbled a note or announced a record, Don finds himself working both harder and more happily.

The inexhaustible fellow whose youthful appearance makes it hard to believe the quite true fact that he was a contemporary and good friend of the late Russ Columbo, not

#### Old Days

At one point in his orchestra-leading life, Harry Harris had a couple of sidemen named Matty Matlock and Francis Craig playing for him. Matty earned fame as an original "Bob Crosby Bob Cats" member and a crack arranger; Francis Craig will long be lovingly remembered for "Near You."

About 1929, when people were

only stars in his own show, he holds twice-weekly auditions and scouts the local clubs and entertainment citadels for new talent.

Some time ago, when Radio Life interviewed Mr. Otis, he was concerned with playing records by good artists for his listeners. At that time he expressed a thankfulness that he was doing work he enjoyed. "Think how many fellows are stuck with jobs they hate. I'm very lucky to be doing this!"

Recently when Radio and Television Life interviewed him again, he was concerned with providing visual entertainment and good artists for his viewers. He expressed a thankfulness that he was still doing work he enjoyed. "I'm really lucky now." spending money for food rather than for entertainment, band business took a slump and Harry retired to San Francisco to be with his son. Both later moved to Hollywood.

It's impossible to talk to Harry Harris without enjoying his seasoning of anecdotes, principally about the son he is so proud of. Harry's boy is today also a musician, better known as a comedy star of radio and screen. But Harris tells of having given the boy his first band job.

"We used to play in a theater, doing mood music for the old silents and playing the prologue. This kid of mine, a big, lanky fellow, always used to come in late and stumble around in the dark, knocking over cymbals and chairs. I could always count on his arrival during a pathetic scene just when Gloria Swanson or Mary Pickford lay dying. In he'd clatter!"

Father Harris was responsible for his son's entertaining way with a song, too. Being only seventeen years older than his boy, Harry found the parental hand was a little difficult to wield.

"I used to want the boy to get up and sing numbers with the band, and how he hated that! He would rather have stayed there with his drums, and I'd have to threaten to fire him. But after he got a taste of performing, he started enjoying it."

Today Harry Harris has good reason to smile proudly over his "youngster's" abilities. *Phil* still enjoys his drums, still sings great songs, and numbers high among today's leading performers.
