In the Daytime It's RADIO

Says Garry Moore, Who Is Finding Old Fans And Making New Friends on His CBS Ayemer

HEN Garry Moore auditions his present CBS show for sponsors, he'd like them to take up a dust rag and clean the le listening. He knows

office while listening. He knows that his afternoon show is probably being heard by house-cleaning ladies and he feels that the comedy mood must be a leisurely one.

Much of radio comedy, Garry feels, has lost the intimate note that made it welcome in the first place. "Nighttime radio won't be killed by television," he claims, "it'l' aie a suicide. Gradually a shr d note has crept in--now if a joke dies, it's a tragedy. Everybody's out-punching everybody else and most of the shows have a frantic feeling." In daytime radio, Garry feels that he can try anything. "Don't do anything interesting on your program during the five minutes I listen to the news on another station," a lady recently wrote to Moore. So the whole Moore show obliged by telling jokes without punch lines, humming snatches of tunes and doodling on the piano for the required five minutes. Everyone, including cast, audience and listeners, had a fine time helping the lady who didn't want to miss anything.

Daytimers Are Friends

Nighttime listeners. Moore feels, don't have the friendly feeling for performers that the daytime crowd has—or the memofies. "I get at least five letters. a day from old 'Club Matinee' fans who want me to repeat routines that I did ten years ago. They kemember them much better than I do." His favorite comment on his present program was made by a reviewer who said, "The Garry Moore show reminds me of old-time radio—it sounds like fun." His show creed seems summed up by his wish "to come into a lonely room and make happy sounds." He also believes that, regardless of ratGARRY WORKS HARD on the show, smokes one cigarette after another and confers with Hattie throughout the broadcast. The indispensable Hattie first worked with Moore on "Take It or Leave It."

ings, a sponsor will sell more product with a daytime audience.

A visit to the broadcast is enough to convince one that the show is as happy as it sounds. Garry looks about ten years younger than he is -and it's not just because of his famous crew cut. His cast, announcer Howard Petrie, singers Ken Carson and Ilene Woods and pianists Irving Miller and Billy Wardell, are as relaxed and informal as their boss. He's known Ken Carson since the days when Ken was one of the Ranch Boys trio on one of Moore's Chicago shows. Garry sort of feels that he's Howard Petrie's discoverer. Howard had been a staff man for thirteen years when Moore asked for a tall announcer to stooge against on his New York series, "Everything Goes." Petrie turned out to be such an able farceur that he was named "most versatile announcer of the year"-after thirteen years. Music man Irving Miller was also heard on that program. Girl Friday Hattie Colbert, who sits next to Garry at the mike during the time the program is on the air, is also a gradu-ate of another Moore show, "Take It or Leave It.'

Fun With Daytimers

Garry calls himself "a writer who learned to talk" and he still scripts most of the program. He finds he can ad-lib better on the daytime series because the hour-long program gives him the room to do it. Twice a week, the cast answers questions from the audience. Half of them are gag, half serious. They range from "Can I have a date with Ken Carson?" to "Why is Hollywood so full



of phonies?" Garry's answer to the latter was "They send us busloads from New York every day."

Moore has gcod reason to believe in the power of daytime radio. He once got a steam roller from listeners who sent in bits of pieces of the machinery that go to make one up. It took only a year. As a matter of fact, he got his name the same way. Originally tagged Garrison Morfit, he was tagged Garry Moore by a lady in Pittsburgh who submitted that monicker in his naming contest. He would love to find her and bring her out to Hollywood for a salute on his present show.

The ingratiating charm of softspoken Moore is ably demonstrated by his tour de force in the ladies' room at I. Magnin's in San Francisco. He had asked some lady tourists on the program to name the most beautiful sights they had seen. They agreed that Magnin's ladies' powder room was indeed one of them. Garry mooned that he, alas, would never be able to 'see it. So the store gave him a cocktail party in their famous powder room, and attended by Grover Magnin, Garry shaved in one of the basins—"Before the store opened, of course," he adds. So if you're ever in San Francisco, ladies, visit Magnin's powder room and across the mirror you will find, written in lipstick and lacquered over for posterity, "Garry Moore was here!"

Is What Fans Call Handsome Vaughn Monroc, Whose Lungs Match the Strength of Hercules

F THE society ladies hadn't gone for Vaughn Monroe's handsome face and physique back in the days when he was trumpet playing in the late Jack Marschard's orchestra, perhaps today he would still

chestra, perhaps today he would still be blowing that horn. However, maestro Jack took in the lingering glances Monroe-wise and made Vaughn lay aside that bugle to cuddle up vocally to the mike.

With that touch of psychology, the boy who won trumpet contests in high school forgot about the brass section and became a singer.

For a guy who never went big-time with name combos, Vaughn has moved since 1940 with the speed of a jet. He's aired a CBShow since 1946, has waxed RCA-Victor records, with several like "Ballerina" and "Ghost Riders" splitting the million mark, and last summer he decided to try the movies for size.

Western Hero

As the two-gunned desperado in Republic's "Singing Guns" the "lockjaw lark" is portraying a role he's yenned for years. The flicker is not cowboyish. It's blood-and-thunder Old West, the best from Max Brand's pen and, as Vaughn describes, "There's not a cow in the whole film."

HANDSOME BAND LEADER'S

combo was named "All-Around Favorite Band" in the Eleventh Annual College Poll this season. Check the corded summer suit. Ah! Those suave Easterners! Instead of studio props, he wears his own black boots (bought in 1933), twirls his own gun (vintage 1882), and would probably have used his own saddle, but it wasn't the right kind for the movie. Only difficulty Monroe had during the take was to get used to pulling the gun out righthanded, since he's a southpaw. Also in the opus Vaughn introduces "Mule Train," written by Johnny Lang, the tune which has caused some rivalry among pop singers these past months.

Several years back Vaughn was in two other pictures, but he wasn't noticed much except by Monroe fans (including two very dear young ladies aged seventy-six and seventy-nine, in California). Perhaps the most enthusiastic of the brawny baritone's following are his wife, Marian, and tiny daughters, Candice and Christina, for whom Vaughn named his two airplanes, Cantina II and III, (combination of the girls' names).

While Vaughn was here, wife Marian accompanied him to "make a home away from home" while the little girls stayed in the newly built Boston menage because school was in session. Unpretentious youngsters, they are prouder of the exclusive records Vaughn made especially for them—lullables and father-to-daughter chats to be played when he's away—than any of their popular dad's best-sellers.

HERE is no evidence that the weather in Southern California is changing." So stated Floyd D. Young, familiar to listeners as the Fruit Frost Warning purveyor.

Mr. Young knows his weather. He has been relaying information to the public since 1917, saving an estimated crop loss of \$200,000,000. Since 1924 he has used radio to disseminate this information, which the public considers so important that last year, when KFI toyed with the idea of eliminating the nightly 8 o'clock warnings (from November 15 to March 1) the idea was em-



Wet and Warmer?

What Kind of Weather Will We Have This Winter? Fruit Frost Warning Expert Floyd D. Young Has a Few Interesting Observations to Make

phatically buried under a landslide of protesting letters.

Last January 9, Radio-TV Life came out with a story about Mr. Young, whom we had interviewed in mid-October. At the time of our talk he had sketched the cold cycles (1913, 1922, 1937) and had said definitely, "We are due for another freeze." The magazine containing this statement hit the stands on Tuesday, January 4. That day Los Angeles racked up the bleak low of 27.9! Yes, Mr. Young knows his weather.

Realizing how interested you readers were in learning more about the functioning of the Fruit Frost Warnings (your letters last season after the article appeared amazed us) we decided to repeat with another mid-October interview. This time we talked to Mr. Young in his office on the seventeenth floor of the Post Office Building in downtown Los Angeles, to which he drives every day from Pomona to head up the operations as Director of Weather Bureau

for California, Utah, Arizona and Nevada.

Comparison

Naturally, our first questions reverted to last winter's record-break. ing cold. Among the comments Mr. Young made about this was a comparison between the effects in 1937 and 1949. Apparently in 1937, economic conditions among growers were so much more promising that they were willing to tackle a job of heroic proportions to save their crops. "This past winter, however, there had already been a number of cold nights when the big freeze came on ... prices were not good, heating oil was three times what it was in 1937 . . . labor also had gone up and growers were discouraged," the weather expert stated. "A lot of them just quit when the freeze arrived. Most of them were the small growers. Loss was about forty per cent in oranges and 50 per cent in lemons" (lemons freeze at about 30 degrees, while oranges can take 27 degrees sometimes all night. "However, these

losses were not due to any failure of the Fruit Frost Warning . . . they happened among people who didn't or couldn't observe the warnings."

According to Young, growers are jittery over this year, for rumors have been swirling that temperatures will be eight degrees lower this winter than last. Blasting this idea, Young says, "Based on past records, we have not had two consecutive years with a severe freeze." He adds, however, that this doesn't mean that we won't have frost.

Forty-eight hours before temperatures in this district started to nosedive last January, Young saw the cold coming. He immediately mentioned the impending dip on the radio. That night and the next morning his department called groups like the California Fruit Growers Exchange to give added information. Young's men also contacted the various packing houses personally.

"Actually," Young explained, "we had two freezes . . . there was the first one and another came about ten days later. The coming freeze showed up first in northwest Canada and Alaska. To get a freeze like the one we experienced, you have to have a combination of circumstances that will bring cold air down here and bring it down fast." Pilot balloon stations sending up balloons two miles above the ground showed that the cold wave was fifty degrees below zero when it started and that the wind velocity from the north was 100 miles an hour.

Assisting Young in preparing the weather forecasts are twelve men. Most of them are scattered at posts from Chico, in the upper Sacramento Valley, to El Centro. Each works out a forecast in his own locality and telephones Young in Pomona nightly between 6 and 7 o'clock. Men at the (Please Turn to Page 8)

Fruit Frost station in Pomona daily (4 p.m.) make up a map of the entire North American continent from the Mississippi west to Hawaii. Using forecasts from the various sections and this map, Young compiles his 8 o'clock broadcast. There is no such thing, apparently, as a general forecast, for conditions are usually so spotty that there may be as much as fifteen degrees difference within a couple of miles.

Kept Hopping

Last winter's freeze kept Young and his assistants busy around the clock, for people were calling up constantly to present their special problems. "I can't keep all my heaters burning. What would you advise me to do?"... "There is two inches of snow and the temperature is so-andso. Shall we try to melt the snow off the trees?" (The answer to that one was to go ahead just the same as if there was no snow... however, if wet snow were standing on the trees for a long time, growers would be told to get rid of it, as it might spot the fruit.)

As a general rule, when we have a wet winter, we do not have a big freeze, although 1937 was both wet AND cold. It is more or less established that freezes come in cycles and that wet seasons also rotate, about every eleven to fifteen years producing a switch. But cycles themselves are not pure: even when going through a dry cycle, there may be one or two wet years and vice versa. Right now we are down at the bottom of a dry cycle. Normal rainfall in Los Angeles is 15.23. Last winter we had 7.99. Our heaviest rainfall on

record was the winter of 1883-84, 38.18, and our last wet season was 1940-41, when we got a drenching of 32.76. "Judging from past winters," states Young, "we should definitely have more rainfall this winter than last."

And for those of you who shiver in your boots at thoughts of last season's 27.9... Floyd D. Young complacently points out that this equalled the record cold of 1937 and 1913, but did not p ss it.

As far as slim and soft-spoken Marian Monroe goes, she stays in the background, still the same girl who's been proud of Vaughn since he was fourteen and she attended Carnegie Tech with him. Through the years she has remained Vaughn's discerning critic, letting others tell him good, while she picks out the bad points.

"International Disc Jockey"

KNX's new platter show, "International Disc Jockey," 4:15 p.m. Saturday, is a good record idea and lots of listening fun. Paul Masterson is the "I.D.J." and his stacks of records are those reputed to be the most played tunes in various exotic capitals across the world.

Conveniently enough, most of the foreign spots claim American tunes as favorites, so the discs are not so flavorsome as the title of the show would lead you to expect. The lone holdout is Paris, where, as usual, an Yves Montand record is tops. "Don't Cry, Joe" is the hit of Honolulu and "You're Breaking My Heart" is a big thing in London. U.S. cut-ins had Les Paul from Boston and Frankie Laine doing the inevitable "Mule Train" from Las Vegas.

Biggest fault of the opening program was the overabundance of atmosphere behind the foreign announcements—Hawaiians beating on guitars and drums, Chinese twanging on sampans (or whatever it is that they twang on), Big Ben ringing from London.

The show will undoubtedly make a hit with disc fans—our special request is more exotic records and less exotic atmosphere.

"Frank Race"

Here's another private-eye type show, "Frank Race," KFI, 9:30 p.m. Friday, with all the ingredients that seem to make these things so popular. "Frank", is an insurance investigator who is surrounded by the usual helper, the usual girl and the usual villains.

Strange characters, all with odd speaking voices or odd accents, creep in and out of the plot. Tough guys hand out pistol-whippings (a type of beating that has become popular through the graphic drawings on movie ads) to "Race," but he survives all.

We're not being snide about "Frank."

There's a lot of good acting in the series, especially by Tony Dubov as "Race." The plots, to judge from the ones we've heard, are unusual—re-

Larry Thor's Record Show

Sunday nights, a little past midnight, a CBS announcer-actor, Larry Thor, spins records in the KNX time occupied by Steve Allen on the other six nights. Usually he plays show tunes from "South Pacific," "Kiss Me Kate" and the like, but two recent programs of ancient hit records have pointed the way we'd like to hear the show go.

Thor is visited by two friends, "Dr. Vincent Arbogast" and "Titus Mc-Fatridge," who drag along a large collection of very old recordings. Creaky with age though the platters may be, the surface noise is hardly noticeable and the spirit displayed by the early orchestras and singers hasn't been touched in the last two decades. Somewhere along the line the moderns just got tired out.

The most recent program of oldies included such gems as the late Frank Crumit's recordings of "Swonderful" and "Abdul Abul-bul Amir," the Peerless Quartet singing "Swanee," Alma Gluck's recording of "Nightingale," "Just a Baby's Prayer at Twilight" by Henry Burr and Bing Crosby's early vocal of "Old Man River" with the Whiteman band. And if there's anything that can keep us listening till one ayem, it's the Peerless Quartet. Well, some people smoke marijuana.

In between recordings, the two "collectors," prodded by announcer Thor, explain in awed, hesitant tones (reminiscent of Ransome Sherman), the background of the artists and records. Their dialogue is whimsical and just right for the program. And they don't make apologies for the records, thank goodness.

Early birds may think we're mad, but night owls could do us a favor by rallying around their dials every other Sunday at midnight. Maybe mass recognition could bring the trio and their orthophonic gems on a little earlier,

Playbacks (Critical Comment)

We Point With Pride

... To a most unusual interviewthat with Mrs. Luther Burbank, widow of the great horticulturist and humanitarian, on ABC's "American Farmer" program on Saturday. The occasion was the one hundredth anniversary of Burbank's birth, and Mrs. Burbank spoke on the establishment of the Luther Burbank Youth Foundation.

... To the performance of Elliott Reid as "Fritz," the garrulous private eye from Chicago, on "Sam Spade." The title of the chapter was "The Flopsy, Mopsy and Cottontail Caper," and Reid ran the gamut of personalities and dialects in his role of "Spade's" self-appointed partner.

We were interested in finding out more about Reid and wondered why we hadn't heard him before. Turned out that he's an eastern actor now planning to work in Hollywood. He's just finished a run in the Broadway hit "Two Blind Mice," with Melvyn Douglas, and has been heard on "Theater Guild on the Air" from New York a: well as other shows. He's been in radio since the age of fourteen, came to Hollywood to appear on the screen in "Sierra." And he'll be heard on the "Spade" show in several future broadcasts.

... To an interesting program that has escaped us till now, "Science Editor" on KFI, 9:30 p.m. Sunday. Hale Sparks is "S.E.," the same fellow who is "University Explorer" for another station. He gives a further explanation of whatever scientific developments and discoveries have made the newspapers in the preceding week, atomic research, "miracle" drugs and even new gadgets.

... To the increasingly excellent comedy delivery of the excellent cast of NBC's "Father Knows Best"—and of course, to scripter Ed James and director Ken Burton.

Sour Grapes for "Sugar-Throat"

George Burns's "boo-boo-boo-ing," likened (by Gracie) to Bing's, was scheduled to receive its proper (according to the sponsor) treatment on the CBS Burns and Allen program of December 7, when Bing's own favorites, the Andrews Sisters, were to appear as "background" voices to "Sugar-Throat's" baritoning.

We View With Alarm

... The short-changing given the scripts on the usually entertaining "Chicago Theater." At present, dramatic portions of the musical comedies and operettas are completely forsaken in favor of rhymed narration spoken by Marion Claire. Granted that "Countess Maritza" isn't a miracle of sparkling dialogue, still the exclusion of the plot lines diminishes its still considerable charm. Also, logged as an hour program, the halting speeches of Colonel McCormick sometimes chop as much as twenty minutes from the musical entertainment.

... The black and white pictures drawn by the soap operas. Right now, the serial "Rosemary" is demonstrating how New York socialites and businessmen are all silly people who think of nothing but cocktail parties and snobbery—while small-town folk practice every virtue known to man. These rules do not always follow. In fact, granted that our experience is highly specialized, we've found it to be just the opposite, "Rosemary."

... The bad timing that has had so many shows going off the air in a sloppy manner recently—could any other theatrical medium put up with this? Imagine the Biltmore curtain lowering on a final Alfred Lunt speech, or the lights in a movie theater turned up before the fade-out, or a night-club comedian exiting without music. Can't be done.

"Creepalong"

The best guest shot of the week was, naturally, Hopalong Cassidy on CBS's Bing Crosby show.

About the funniest gag exchanged between "Hoppy" and "Creepalong" Crosby:

Bing: "You can't be Hopalong Cassidy-he's little and fat and wobbly."

Hoppy: "You must have a cheap television set."

Rita La Roy Show

Enjoyable any time, but particularly so just now before Christmas, is the Wednesday night (7:30) parade of feminine fashion and pulchritude seen on KECA-TV's Channel 7 as "The Rita LaRoy show."

Rita, who can easily give any of her lovely models a run for their money as to charm, appearance and poise, but who stands alone as an interesting femcee personality with a terrific gift of easy gab, serves as commentator during the period which weekly chooses a different theme, fashionwise, for the women who wish to know but who can't brave the crowds and traffic entailed in casing the fashion centers.

Show setting is patterned after a fashion salon, on which KECA-TV has spared no expense or effort. The models and their lovely wares of the evening come into view down a curved staircase, and in their manner and manners alone lie some good lessons. As they approach and parade, Rita's commentary points out for the view-ing madam (or sir) what is what.

The show is more than a period of seeing pretty trinkets and clothes. It's full of good, sensible advice. Furs are currently one of fashion's best, and the most popular of wardrobe features. As Rita pointed out, the value of a single mink, worn as a small choker, over the value of a string of synthetic mink, worn as a wrap, is tremendous.

She not only quotes prices and shows the real economy of good taste but suggests, in most cases, where things can be purchased.

Her knowledge arises out of many years of emphasizing appearance, charm and fashionable, economical dressing for herself and for the group of lovely, successful models in her agency.

A week or so ago, the correct jewelry for both daytime and evening wear was displayed in the fashion telecast. Among the articles was shown the fabulous lapel piece, the Temple of Kashmir, made of solid gold, ivory and precious stones. On this date, Haimoff, one of Beverly Hills' oldest established jewelers, joined Lowell E. Bradfield, furriers, in sponsoring Miss LaRoy's fifteen-minute show. Sponsorship usually goes to houses of this sort.

But Rita also pointed out how attractive jewelry in the under-four-andfive-dollar price range can be utilized. For street wear and before five, of course, only plain gold and silver,

whether synthetic or real, is acceptable to the well dressed. No glitter of diamonds or rhinestones for office and strolling.

Masculine viewers will find attractions other than the models. Loot for them, in all price brackets, is demonstrated almost weekly. The lighters, watches, bands and cigarette cases are currently being shown as Christmas-present-solving suggestions to the Mrs.

"Studio One"

There are a number of shows now on television which bear repeated recommendation. One of these is CBS-TV's "Studio One," seen locally on KTTV, Channel 11, each Monday night at 10:00.

Production of W. Somerset Maugham's "Of Human Bondage" on December 5 brings about this urging of viewers not to miss the hour-long series. While the adaptations of outstanding novels are consistently good, "Bondage" is so well known in both book and picture form that its measuring up to established criteria via television sets a standard.

The story, written originally in 1915, and later filmed with Leslie Howard and Bette Davis as the principals, deals with a sensitive artist-medical student in literal bondage to a cockney waitress. The message is as good today as it ever was, and the fine shading given the portrayals on television retained the flavor of the story.

Charlton Heston and Felicia Montealegre, both familiar names to constant viewers of "Studio One." played "Philip" and waitress "Mildred" respectively. The balance of the casting was equally well done.

Sets were more than adequate, and the boiling down of the big book into an hour's dialogue was beautifully handled by Worthington Miner, who also produces.

This dramatic series provides an excellent answer to the die-hards who stoutly maintain they don't care for television... because they would rath-er let their imagination color their reading. So you've read "Of Human Bondage" or any dozen of the other Bondage" or any dozen of the other "Studio One" adaptations, but it is highly improbable that your mental image of any of the principals was too badly violated by the sensitive yet ascetic portrayal of Maugham's hero as done by Heston. As "Mildred" helped to establish Bette Davis, so did Bette Davis help to plant an indelible impression of the becircled eyed, blonde-headed "Mildred" in moviegoers' minds. If we could presume to offer any criticism of the story above mentioned as done on TV, it would be in Felicia Montealegre's appearance alone. Her brunette hair came as a surprise.

That minor point was the only possible adverse criticism we could scratch up, but our applause for this fine presentation on every other count is unlimited.

Philco Television

Another show, on another network, whose premise for entertainment is

adapting outstanding novels into hour-long presentations is NBC-TV's "Philco Television Playhouse," seen on KNBH, Channel 4, each Sunday night at 9:00.

Each week a novel of a different type is adapted. A couple of weeks ago, Mildred Cram's "The Promise" was a warm-hearted fantasy around a young busin ess couple headed for divorce because of their conflicting careers. The faith inspired in them by a mythical character who revived them from a motor-car crash turned the trick, and all ended happily...or did it? Viewers were never quite sure whether they had seen a play about two live people or a play about a postdeath fantasy. And it made good entertainment.

The following Sunday found Mildred Walker's "Medical Meeting" cast for video presentation. This story centered around the problem of a pair of sincere medical researchers being forced finally to choose between further work in genteel poverty and under comparative anonymity or the opportunity to head up a sanitarium at a higher salary with an all-expensespaid deal. Naturally they chose going on with research... there would be no story otherwise.

From this bit of grim realism and good-deeding Philco passed on this week to "The Wonderful Mrs. Ingram," a tale centered around exposing the supposedly "wonderful little woman" as the scheming shrew she was.

Good plays and good players can't go on forever in television, and repetition of plot or casting is as inevitable as it has been on radio. Philco makes no attempt to spot a comedy every other week (comedy is another field on another night, they wisely realize), and in every Sunday chapter the direction and casting have maintained the same high level. If you like drama, "Philco" is just one more place to get it—in the right form with good players dishing up your histrionics.

Second Glances (Critical Comment)

"Old-Tyme Comedies"

Each Thursday afternoon at 4:45, KFI-TV's Channel 9 carries a fifteenminute early talkie or silent-movie comedy feature. In the face of current popularity of old pictures, books around the lives and incidents therein of early movie personalities, and articles paralleling early movie making and video processes, the idea is great. The presentation falls short.

It is hard to know whether or not KFI-TV was able to get a cast list with these films, but were they able to do so, naming the old stars and comedians as they appear on the screen, with a brief anecdote or rundown on their career (information certainly available somewhere today) would add immeasurably to viewer enjoyment.

Instead of these sidelights, a commentary follows the film, a sort of "Now the lovely heroine is in the clutches of the villain" thing that

further burlesques the film. These older films aren't too easy to find, and their appearance on television is a pleasant surprise in any event. Tongue-in-cheek "Gaslighting" treatment is funny, but the comedies are really worth better treatment.

Again arises the possibility the station hasn't access to information for real fans of the older screen fare . . . in which case we applaud their merely showing them.

"Cavalcade of Stars"

Each Monday night (KTSL's Channel 2, 7:30 p.m.), Thrifty Drug Company assembles a lot of high-priced talent and presents these entertaining groups under the title "Cavalcade of Stars."

Dancers, singers, acrobats, actors and actresses-cream of the New York stages - pass over the Channel 2 screen each week, led on and off stage and through their routines by a young man whose name is almost lost in his similarity to Milton Berle, Jackie Carter is an emcee deluxe-and so is Berle. Carter is a very funny fellowand so is Berle. Carter hypos the audience into laughs and applause as no one else can-except Berle. The two are so identical in whistle, laugh and dialogue that if viewers were to close their eyes it would be a little tough to tell just who was appearing.

The show is a kinnie from the East, and one of the clearest, best-quality television recordings we have seen. Pace of the show is rapid, the talent roster has included headliners from so many walks of entertainment that in this case "pleasing all the people some of the time" must have come to pass, and the commercials are well done and inoffensively inserted. Our only "but" lies in that close resemblance between the emcee of this show and the emcee of the Texaco show.

Toast of the Town

The December 4 telecast of "Toast of the Town" (KTTV, Channel 11, Sunday, 8:00 p.m.) was its 75th presentation, making it, according to the knowledge of its emceeing host Ed Sullivan, "the longest-running live TV show." This, we would think, would also indicate a program's growing maturity and perfection. Unfortunately, to our eyes and ears, "Toast of the Town" does not seem to have improved any with age.

We find its presentation both sloppy and dull. Most of the entertainment presented doesn't rise above a "so-so" reception, possibly because of the way in which the program in its entirety is handled (mishandled).

Now if you think we're dishing out a criticism so generalized in nature that we'd have nothing to say if cornered, here it comes. The whole show could be sparked by just the addition of one simple, vital (simply vital!) ingredient—some display of personality from its stolid-faced, monotonevoiced emcee, Ed Sullivan.

Blind Date

The name Arlene Francis alone would be enough to propel our dialing finger in the direction of KECA-TV's Channel 7 on Sunday nights at 8:30. We've been on the impressive list of Arlene admirers from way back and always go out of our way to see and hear her. She is enchantingly feminine, quick-minded and witty-tongued. Even if a female emcee is one of your pet aversions, you're likely to wind up considering Arlene an exception, because she certainly is just as adept as almost any radio-TV male at keeping a show clipping along at a lively pace.

However (wouldn't you know, after that burst of unlimited enthusiasm, there'd be a "however"?), in our estimation, her videoed "Bilnd Date" program (viewed by us December 4) fell short of providing any kind of entertainment. In fact, our brow remained furrowed the whole half hour, trying to figure out just what it was intended to offer in the way of pleasant eye-ear diversion.

True, there were three pretty girls on hand, "Ice Follies" chorines, wearing three diversified outfits from their "Follies" numbers, but they didn't skate or do anything else to entertain. The male contestants, in vying for a date with these pretties, stated their names and activities to Miss Francis, then donned some fragments of masquerade costumes and engaged the chorines in a few moments of dishearteningly unintelligent, unfunny, uninteresting conversation. At the conclusion of these verbal exchanges, each girl made her choice of an escort (on what basis, we wouldn't know) and the happy group prepared to de-Page Thirty-lour part for their "hard-won" evening on the town (we can only hope the success of the evening did not depend on their conversational adeptness).

We wish our Arlene were devoting her glib femceeing talents to a program of more entertaining format, or that this program, which we remember as being better in its earlier radio days, would somehow add the element of real entertainment to its Cupid'sarrow maneuvers.

Since the day KLAC-TV started its daytime programming (about four weeks ago), the busy Balter has done more than thirty sportscasts each day. Have any of you noticed something familiar about one of the pretty teenagers who helps sugar-coat the Kaye-Halbert commercials on KTLA's "Meet Me in Hollywood" show? The manufacturers hit upon a new slant to make their video-receiver-set spiels more pleasing to the public through using two comely, modernly clad girls as "Sight" and "Sound." The sixteenyear-old who lends her pretty face and peppy dialogue to "Sight's" role is Barbara Ruick, daughter of the radiofamous Lurene Tuttle. Lurene, too, is active in video, teaching for the medium at USC.

Rita LaRoy Honored By TV Academy

Rita LaRoy, star of her own KECA-TV show, was signally honored at the meeting of the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences in Hollywood last week, when she became the only woman ever to be nominated for the office of president of the organization.

Miss LaRoy, even though she was not present at the meeting and was unaware of the step to be taken, was one of six candidates nominated for the Academy's highest office for the 1950 term. This was the first time in the organization's existence that a woman's name has been placed in nomination for the presidency.

It Paid to Tell a Story

Marvin Miller's First Radio Role Came Through as Result of Stretching Truth About a One-Man Show He Suddenly Made Up as Result of Flopping Mike Chores

F ALL the stories versatile Marvin Miller has recounted in his career, perhaps the toughest he has tackled so far was a recent "Behind the Story" of composer Thomas Moore.

As the tale is told, Moore was wed to a British girl known throughout the isles for her fragile beauty. She contracted a dread disease and hid from her husband, terrified that if he once glimpsed her smallpoxscarred face, his love for her would be lost.

All effort on Moore's part to prove his devotion was in vain until he composed the lyrics and melody of a new song and, standing in the doorway of his wife's darkened room, sang of words so sincere that she lit the candle after hearing "Believe Me If All Those Endearing Young Charms."

Now Marvin, who does a crack job on all characterizations in the scries, wanted to project the poignant meaning of the scene to listeners, and to do so he decided to sing the melody. But composer Moore was an Irish tenor, while Marvin is baritone . . . way down low. Ingeniously, he tried a tonal transition and raised his voice up sweet and high. It was not only unusual, it was good.

Several days afterward a friend asked, "How many characters do you use on the show?" Replied Miller, "Oh, sometimes a few, sometimes up to eleven." Thought the friend, "Aha, perhaps a role for me." Much to his disappointment as far as the job went, but more to his amazement, he learned that Marvin does all the roles himself. This the friend could hardly believe after hearing the storyteller turn tenor.

Started with Stories

All of which points out that the able Mr. Miller can do anything once he sets his mind to it. When he first auditioned for radio (announcing) Miller rated a big nothing. Not one to take "no" for an answer, Marvin mentioned he could also do a one-man show. Okayed by the station manager, that's how Miller became a storyteller . . . five times a week for a buck. By the time the series was finished, he had worked forty-two characters into the scripts.

Many listeners remember Marvin for his former "Coronet Storyteller," as well as recent narration of "Tell It Again." Well known for his announcing of "The Whistler," "Railroad Hour," "Beulah," and Louella (Please Turn to Page 43)

Scenic Construction

Lights, Cameras, Actors, Singers and Dancers All Do a Lot Toward Making Up a Television Show. But Behind Them Is a Crew Who Are Never Seen, Yet Who Add Just as Greatly to the Entertainment Values

WO DECADES of motionpicture attendance and the watching of repertoire opera and ballet have conditioned viewers of any enter-

conditioned viewers of any entertainment medium to expect full background. The sets behind a group of actors must be just as tastefully done as are the portrayals that go on before them.

KECA-TV is in a good position to fulfill this requisite. Out on their twenty-three-acre ABC Television Center lot is not only a separate building department, explaining that this particular operation was as important to a finished production as were the thespians.

"A show can be plotted, and we can have all the ideas in the world about how a set should look, but then what happens if we can't get it built in a hurry? Each phase is important. Without any one of them you just don't have a good show."

He waved a hand to indicate a huge, unpainted elliptical wooden

frame, lying behind a formidable array of drills, presses, sawing machines and precision cutters . . . the usual accouterment where artistic carpentry is required.

"On next week's 'Let There Be Stars' show (an excellent variety bill doomed, unfortunately, at this writing to go the way of all unsponsored shows—off the channel) we are doing 'The Moth and the Flame.' That frame is to be the candle base.

"Our carpenters are drawn from the union that handles studio carpenters. They are used to achieving all kinds of effects, so when I explained that the candlestick base should be an ellipse to photograph correctly, they were able to build one to my exact specifications. Should we have had to order this done outside TV Center, both the cost and possibility of error would have rendered it unfeasible.

"Another advantage of having our own carpentry shop lies in similarity of sets from show to show of a series. Should a set be needed after it has been destroyed or torn apart to use elsewhere, the same crew who built it could duplicate from the joint effort of all our memories. And believe me, viewers could spot deviations quickly."

"Biggest and Best"

KECA-TV viewers last fall could nightly see the favorite set of nearly everyone at TV Center. The former "Sleepy Joe" homestead is the largest single video set in existence. More hands than just those of the

carpenters who erected "Joe's" little brown house lingered lovingly about for the building of a great cement tree with real-tree-type branches attached thereto, for the planning of the cabbage patch and the setting up of a small fence and orchard. While "Joe" currently appears only once a week on the scene, this particular set remains for other television characters to enjoy.

Nor is there a single carpenter at Television Center who wouldn't do some tall grumbling were the little brown house to be supplanted by a backdrop or Teletransparency.

THE REGULAR SET OF KECA-TV'S SUNDAY NIGHT "The Ruggles" must remain the same, week in and week out. Should any part be destroyed or removed, skilled carpentry must reproduce it exactly, and quickly.

Back Where He Started

Fourteen Years and Thousands of Miles Lie Between Jack Wormser's First and Present Jobs at the Same Old Stand

FTER fourteen working years, Jack Wormser is right back where he started - geographically, at least. The personable young producer-writer started his career in radio at the old National Broadcasting Company building on Melrose Avenue in Hollywood. But 5515 Melrose is no longer NBC. The broadcasting studios are now leased by television station KTTV, and every Monday for thirty-five weeks last summer and fall Jack was on hand to write and produce the Ben Gage show. In spite of its being Jack's and Ben's initial television effort, the show was in a few weeks recognized as one of the best local variety programs on the West Coast. A far cry from his Melrose Avenue beginning.

Many successful radio men got their start as page boys. Jack preferred fresh air and sunshine. At eighteen he was properly outfitted and stationed at the gate to care for the parking lot and the cars of NBC luminaries. He had plenty of time between cars, and, particularly intrigued with the activities in the sound-effects department, made himself useful whenever possible. The regular sound man whose duty it was to lower the phonograph needle on a fanfare record announcing a news broadcast each night was more than happy to let Jack pinch-hit. He filled in whenever a second (Please Turn to Page 43)

sound man was needed, and dropped Alka-Seltzer tablets into glasses of water with such finesse that his mother, ear glued to the radio, would exclaim with great pride to all within hearing distance, "That's Jack!"

Make Up Your Mind

The maintenance men complained that Jack's parking-lot duties were neglected in favor of the sound de-partment, and issued an "inside or outside" ultimatum. Jack became an official member of the sound-effects department when a decision of "inside" was handed down by the front office. He was responsible for a lot of noise during the next few years. On the old "Gilmore Circus," he stopped the show each week for two full minutes of sound as "Aunt Addie," played by Cliff Arquette, teetered on a high wire and then fell a thousand feet into a wet sponge.

At nineteen, Jack was in charge of sound on the top comedy and dramatic shows at NBC. He became such an expert that Tyrone Power, Rudy Vallee and Charles Boyer wouldn't go through a door unless Jack opened it for them. He is cred-ited with the development of "Fib-ber McGee's" world-famous closet which was a smash in more ways than one.

Soap Operas to Guam

In 1941 the network sent him to New York, where Jack produced "soap operas," but in one year Jack had to leave "John's Other Wife" to join the Army. He was put in the Signal Corps and sent to Officer's Candidate School. In Astoria, Long Island, he wrote and directed training films and in Hollywood he wrote, directed and produced pro-grams for the newly organized Armed Forces Radio Service.

Jack started his two-year overseas duty as officer in charge of a team that followed the invasion forces into newly occupied territories to set up the Armed Forces Radio stations that brought entertainment and information to the troops. The thou-sands of soldiers and sailors who were in the harbor of Eniwetok waiting for the invasion of Saipan heard the top programs from the States via Jack's station WXLE. And they chuckled at an Army sergeant named Hal Kanter broadcasting his nightly Sack Rat Serenade. After the invasion of Guam, Hal, later to become one of Hollywood's top comedy radio writers, and Jack were sent to Guam to establish another Armed Forces Radio station. Shortly after they settled there, Jack was promoted to captain and placed in December 16, 1949

charge of the entire Pacific Ocean Network.

After V-J Day, Jack was sent to Radio Tokyo and made program director for the eighty-six stations of the Japanese network. He had the distinction of directing a dramatic program for the purpose of giving the Japanese people their first true picture about Pearl Harbor and the part their country played in World War II. The program was written in English, translated into Japanese and produced with an all Japanese cast and orchestra. This series received a special commendation from the commanding general as an im-portant contribution to the successful operation of the occupation forces. Radio Tokyo, in those days, was like old home week. "Tokyo Mose," as he was known to the troops, was known to his friends as Hy Averback—Bob Hope's talented announcer. Another familiar face was that of Eob Lemond, announcer on the Ben Gage show and currently seen on the Ed Wynn television program. Producer Myron Dutton and many other radio personalities were there. And, of course, Hans Conried, who had the reputation of being the only soldier in the United States Army who wore argyle socks.

A short time after Jack's return to civilian life, he became one of the busiest producers in Hollywood, with twelve audience-participation shows per week to his credit. He still found time, however, to produce fourteen of the top benefit radio pro-grams for the American Cancer So-ciety, Red Cross and March of Dimes,

Parsons' commentary stint, Miller's voice is just as familiar emoting on drama heavies like "The Saint" and "NBC Theater." Within the first month his "Story" was aired on Mutual-Don Lee outlets, the actor had scored 120 roles plus narrations of each chapter.

Fast Pace

One Sunday Miller raced to five shows on four networks, doing a par-ticularly outstanding job on "NBC Theater's" adaptation of Theodore Dreiser's "Sister Carrie" (also mark-ing his initial guesting on the program).

When does the actor-announcer gather time from this typical pace to sleep? He doesn't. Both he and artist-photographer wife Elizabeth Dawson share a strange phobia regarding shut-eye and get as little of it as possible.

It as possible. They do their relaxing on Satur-days when, with son Tony, they head for San Pedro Bay and their boat. With sails to the sun, the Millers spend a day weekly on the water---Mrs. Miller dozing restfully, young Tony pretending he's an old salt, and Marvin hoping fervently he won't spill overboard ... at least not un-til he learns to swim.

For the past year and a half, Jack has been employed by the Ameri-can Broadcasting Company as pro-ducer-writer. In December of 1948, Jack was asked by Bob Hope to accompany his Christmas Caravan to the Berlin airlift. "This," says Jack, "is my most satisfying and gratifying experience."
