Cartoons for Children

KNBH's "Uncle Tony" O'Dare First Taught Drawing on Radio, Has Now Found Video an Excellent Medium for Animated Instruction

Monday through Friday. 6:00 p.m. KNBH-Channel 4

HEN a toddler proudly shows you his latest drawings of mama or papa, don't laugh at the gigantic ears, the lopsided mouth or the crooked nose,

for that youngster might some day be a great artist.

"Be encouraging," asserts KNBH's amiable cartoonist "Uncle Tony" O'Dare, "for if a child is artistically talented, he will show it by attempt-ing the difficult without knowing any of the rules." If little fingers can project imagination onto paper, there is an excellent prospect of de-veloping the flair veloping the flair.

With his Monday-through-Friday teleshow, "Uncle Tony" has been of great inspiration to ambitious youngsters who yearn to express them-selves with brush or crayon. With nearly two decades of teaching car-toonery, in classes and on radio, behind him, "Uncle Tony's" clever animations are now a nightly must with young set-siders. Besides illustrating the simple steps of drawing by turning circles, symbols and letters into amusing figures and objects, he also conducts a Good Deed Club open to all children.

For Art's Sake

Although he modestly declines classifying himself as an "artiste," Tony is also a serious painter with an amazing dexterity for recapturing the line and form of his idol, Michelangelo. At eighteen the young Italian painted a thirty-foot mural in the Catholic Church in his home town of Missoula, Montana, and after grad-uation from the state's university he studied under George Bridgman at the Art Student's League of New York.

When 1933 hailed the Chicago World's Fair, Tony's religious pic-tures, depicting "The Mystery of Life" and the "Creation of Adam" among others, covered an entire wall

in the Hall of Religions at the Cen-tury of Progress. The compositions were on exhibit for two years there and later at San Francisco's World's Fair. In 1935 the much-lauded art work (in the manner of the old masters) was displayed at the Los Angeles Public Library.

Jack of All Trades

Not the type to starve for the sake of art, Tony's life has been full of versatility. Instructor, cartoonist, animator at Walt Disney Studios, singer, he has been nearly everything ... even waiter, bartender, salesman and truck driver. With his (Please Turn to Page 34)

Only phase of the show that bothers us, and it's a traditional one, is the anachronism of having Germans speak English with a German accent and occasionally throwing in a "Ja Wohl." We know there's no way around this dramatic problem—but there it is.

"2000 Plus"

Now that radio has discovered the millions of science fiction fans in the U. S., air melodrama has taken a turn toward robots, space ships and rock-ets. First show to tap this audience was "2000 Plus," KHJ, 7:30 p.m., Sun-day. (Understandably we confused it at the outset with NBC's "Dimension "" X."

"2000 Plus" has all the interesting accoutrements of super-science fiction, along with the inevitable "Sometimes science can go too far" and "Who are we, poor pitiful creatures, to explore the secrets of the Universe" themes that crop up in all these stories.

The program gives its molecular melodrama an authentic air that makes it more exciting. A recent "rocket ship to the moon" story had an almost documentary flavor as the take-off orders were given in all languages (even Russian, we were in-terested to hear).

Science-fiction fans live in a world all their own, we have decided after meeting a few of them. They demand high standards in their fiction. The fact that "2000 Plus" meets with their approval is praise enough for this New York-Sherman Dryer produced program ...

The hint is: Just drop a little vanilla in the paint before using it in the house and you will not have any odors from it. The vanilla will not discolor the paint either.

Here is a hint for keeping flower pots on the fence and fence posts. Just drive a long nail into the fence or post ($\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ of the way, leaving an inch or so sticking out). Place the flower pot over the nail (nail goes in the hole on the bottom of flower pot). Now you can shake the fence or bump into it without the worry of your flower pots falling over and breaking.

Use your egg poacher to heat the baby's lunch. Simply put his carrots, spinach, etc. in the sections.

When writing with ink and you make a mistake and want to erase it, take a tooth pick, wind a small amount of cotton on one end, dip into Clorox or any similar bleach and apply gently to the part you wish, to be erased. Be sure that the paper is dry before writing again in the same place.

An ordinary matchbook makes a neat sewing kit for your purse. Remove an the matches from the book and wrap the cover with thread. The stubs of the matches make a handy cushion for needles

On washdays put your left-over starch in one of the ice-cube trays and keep it in your freezer. During the week when you rinse out a blouse or something that needs starch, simply take as many cubes of starch as you need and dissolve them with boiling water.

Removing the screw-in base of a broken light bulb can be something of a problem. Try pressing a large cork over the jagged edges of glass. Then the base can be unscrewed easily. For safety make sure the current is off.

To take care of paint brushes, drill a small hole in the handle of each paint brush and run a stiff piece of wire through these holes. Lay the wire, with the brushes on it, across the top of a container. This will keep the

paint brush off of the bottom of the container, and the bristles will remain straight.

Instead of removing boiled eggs from the boiling water with a spoon, try, using an orange-juice strainer. You'll find you will have a firmer grip and can cool the egg more easily under cold water.

To keep the saws of your table saws separated, put them in an old record album, it will keep them from getting nicked and you'll know where they

Laying linoleum is an easier job if a large suction cup such as a drain plunger is used to lift the corners. For a tight grip, rub soap on the cup's edge.

Take a wire pot-scouring pad to scrub potatoes, carrots, etc. instead of peeling them. Then you do not lose all the best part of the vegetables. Hold them under running water while scrubbing.

Looks Like

First J. Arthur Rank, now 20th Century-Fox, through their head man, Skouras, says 20th won't furnish any pix for MacDonald's Phonevision. Twentieth will use their pictures for their own big-screen theater TV early next year. Phonevision meanwhile is making a case of refusals, saying it is illegal for any movie company to refuse the use of film to Phonevision, which will offer standard prices to book the films for telephone telecasts. . . . Looks like there is a change of format, expansion to a half hour, and the addition of a new starring personality to "Lee's Lair," a Monday night KTSL program. Popular solo-singing planist Matt Dennis now joins the sportsminded who gather in the "Lair" to entertain and interview the visiting sportsworld and celebs. . . . Dells Restaurant owner Mike Gaynes is interested in originating a television show from his La Cienega eatery featuring a once-a-week, half hour celebrity interview program. He's already interested his La Cienega neighbors, the Century Theater Group, in providing talent for the show.

Looks like the Al Jarvis "Clock-watchers' Club," seen on KLAC-TV, is disproving any mention that there is no place for daytime TV. His contest draws an average of more than 5,000 letters a week. , The NBC-TV audition on Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis is delayed again while that footloose duo fulfill a New York night-club commitment. "Miss Los Angeles" is going to be selected via television. KTTV announces. All local unmarried girls between eighteen and twentyseven are eligible, and the station asks that you contact the station if you have some undiscovered beauty living next door to you. . . The Andrews Sisters' manager sent letters to all TV stations informing them they may not imitate the Sisters on tele-. His burn is credited to three Gotham comics who played a record and anticked it up, as the Andrewses, to the sound. Invasion of privacy. . . . Screen and stage vet James Gleason is discussing a TV-radio series of circus stories to be written by Thomas W. Duncan, author of "Gus the Great" and "Ring Horse." Duncan would create a new clown character for Gleason to play.

Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

"Yesterday's Newsreel"

If you can bear to give up the first fifteen minutes of "Hoppy's" Sunday night reels, you will profit greatly by watching KTTV's (6:30 p.m., Channel 11) series of old-time newsreels.

Each fifteen-minute stanza covers a sporting event, a few personages of the era, fashions, aeronautical developments, and a general timely topic of the year. And the years range from before the twenties through the middle thirties. One night we even saw some faded early footage on the original Pancho Villa, Mexican badman who gave the United States Cavalry a rough go of it for some years.

If sports mean to you such legendary figures as Bobby Jones, Helen Wills, Jack Dempsey, Red Grange, Paavo Nurmi or Bill Tilden, you can sooner or later see them all.

And if you have forgotten that we once had presidents who weren't named Roosevelt or Truman, the "Yesterday's Newsreel" is a good refresher course with clips on Taft, Coolidge and Hoover.

Hardly a new masculine viewer will be able to contain his horror—at both the old and the somewhat similar contemporary—when the fashion parade of the old days is flashed. But with the dowdy dress some other pretty wonderful things were going on, and this Sunday night slot is a great opportunity to look back on them.

Pet Exchange

No matter what its recentness, our last mention and recommendation on many scores of KTTV's "Pet Exchange" (Friday, 7:00 p.m., Channel 11) has been too long ago.

This show started about a year ago; Frank Wright's Calo Dog and Cat Food Company stand the cost; and it is a half hour devoted to finding homes for pets. The entertainment value lies in the animals paraded—everything from pups and kittens to lions and elephants. (A recent four-and a-halfton pachyderm visitor nearly played hob with the set when she excitedly trumpeted and the blast of air from her great trunk carried away part of a flimsy wall.)

Well-known guests—usually big names from the movie colony or stage or radio—put in a weekly appearance to give their pitch on the care and welfare of four-footed friends.

That's all very good, but our praise goes not for the fun of the show, but to the myriads of people who work ceaselessly after the show has faded from the channel. Calls asking for dogs, cats, birds and mice are followed up, homes are checked as to their desirability as future resting places for the pets in question, and the animals are catalogued for further checking on to make sure they are happy.

Pets are taken in, allocated to the different homes about the city that the S.P.C.A. maintains for the homeless four-footers, and the animals are catalogued for mention on the show.

What other television show puts in this careful, detailed effort on their props between appearances?

Of course the boxing bears, visiting elephants and performing lions seen appear only to keep things lively for the unimaginative who can't get their kicks from just plain dogs, cats and birds. These animals have homes, trainers and jobs, and aren't available by calling the show and asking for them, as are the other animals on view.

The Calo show gets the homeless pets they offer for viewers from the Southern California Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, and if you haven't seen the quarters the Society maintains for pets they have taken in, a lesson is in store for you. They are an endorsement for humanity.

Perry Como's Supper Club

Practically ever since it went on the air, KNBH, Channel 4 (Sunday at 8:00 p.m.) has been carrying the eastern kinescope of Perry Como's Chesterfield Supper Club. By very reason of its continued weekly presence and continued weekly excellence, we just accept without mention. It's a good show to watch.

Each week Perry, the Fontanne Sisters and Mitchell Ayres's orchestra hang a few songs around some simple gimmick, introduce a guest or two, and generally have fun. Typical was a recent Sunday's stunt of having the viewer follow Perry around the day before the show to see what went into making up a telecast. There were songs to be chosen, song pluggers to be listened to, the Fontanne Sisters to be rehearsed with, and guest Morey Amsterdam to be endured throughout his tortuous pursuit of Como in an effort to "sign him up." This last bit of horseplay was alive with Amsterdam antics, gags and routines, and the comedian served as perfect, foil for the Como.

For a brief few seconds the wellknown canine of eastern television, a bored basset hound, put in an appearance. He yawned, eyed the camera, RADIO-TELEVISION LIFE

shot the principals a couple of disdainful glances and that was that, but we go along with the consensus. He definitely has personality!

We've been Como fans since the days when he used to hang on a mike and sing "Wishing" with Ted Weems's band. 'He's singing just as well, but what Mr. Como has added is tremendous savoir faire and the ability to emcee most graciously.

Guest Appearances

KTLA not long ago added new hours to its weekly schedule and started telecasting at 1:00 Sunday afternoons on Channel 5. Only last week we got with the new shows, wondering what could go on that could be labeled only "Guest Appearances" and still be interesting enough to televise.

Dick Garton—we like to identify him as co-emcee of the Wednesday night KTLA "Man's Best Friend" show starring Gypsy, Freckles, Pancho and all—holds down the host's chair, with Korla Pandit on hand at the organ.

The first guests we saw were none less than Buddy Cole and his wife, the pretty Yvonne King. After some interesting, informal chatter, both Yvonne and Buddy performed, Buddy at the piano with some of his best-knowns from his albums; Yvonne vocally with an old standard, "Everything Happens to Me."

They were no sooner out of range than two marvelous East Indian dancers not only performed, but explained their dances and their costumes.

Between guest appearances Korla entertains at the organ with the mood music for which he is so famous.

Garton has an easy manner perfectly designed to put dropper-inners at their greatest ease, and he apparently knows enough about each guest so that there is no halting, stumbling question-andanswer routine to suffer through before you finally discover whom you are seeing and why he is a guest of note.

We don't know whom you might meet Sunday afternoons on "Guest Appearances," but apparently they will all be caliber guests who can actually entertain.

"Easy Aces"

That delightfully sardonic "Mr. and Mrs." team, Jane and Goodman Ace, are back again making matrimonial mockery, this time on KTSL's Channel 2 via Du Mont teletranscription, each Wednesday night at 9:15.

Listeners who chuckled sympathetically over the barbed domesticities of mr. ace and JANE will find their video format comes ever closer to the hearth, for the "Easy Aces" typify a couple whose sole entertainment is, naturally, television.

Premiere found them, along with Jane's mother, a lovable old hypochondriac, absorbed in a filmed presentation of the Irish Sweepstakes. Jane of course was vowing she'd give a hundred bucks if she could win and buy some new dresses. "Mama" was wistfully thinking of all the operations she could have were the purse to come to her. Goodman was frantically trying

to hear the film's narration, placate the two women, explain to his wife the values of money and convince his in-law that there was nothing left within her to remove.

Only disappointment voiced here would be that but a fleeting glimpse was to be had of the "Aces" themselves. Show concentrates mainly on these veterans' glib commentary and odd observations, focusing on the pair only at the end. However, their chatter does suffice . . . and old radio fans will vouch for that.

Fun at the Beach

The antics of some of Los Angeles' beach-goers have been considered entertaining enough for national magazine coverage, but it took KTLA to realize the potentialities of a Sunday afternoon video show lying in our local sands.

Now each Sunday at 3:00, a trio of the Channel 5 cameras are hauled down to Lick Pier in Venice. Two of them are perched on platforms in the sand, the third toted to the end of the pier where water traffic will be easily caught by the lens. Dorothy Gardiner and Ken Grauer interview the game players and eager passersby and generally spark the activities that make up the hour-and-a-half session. Water skiers, tumblers, acrobats, kids just around for fun of the games and contests KTLA puts on, lost screaming children and chilled-looking adults all contribute to the melee that immediately sets viewers to wishing they were at the beach.

Second Glances (Critical Comment)

Ruby Still Sparkles

Big excitement for this viewer was the recent guest appearance of the tap-dancing flash of the thirties, Ruby Keeler, on the Ken Murray show. Ruby, retired for almost fifteen years and the youthful looking mother of five children, was our first favorite movie star. You can imagine with what trepidation we awaited her appearance on TV.

Murray set the show off on the right foot by giving her a production-number setting that brought in couples dancing in the costumes and to the tunes that Ruby made famous in her musicals. Hoofers did a bit of "Forty-Second Street," a West Point cadet and a gal in organdie soft-shoed to "Flirtation Walk," sailors reprised "Don't Give Up the Ship." All very exciting.

Ruby made her entrance to "Liza," and if you saw "The Jolson Story" you'll recall the significance of *that*. She proved to be the same looseankled, forthright little hoofer that we remembered, her lovely dancer's legs as trim and silky as they were in "Go Into Your Dance." Her taps were as mellow and measured as ever as she did her "Liza" and "Forty-Second Street" numbers, and the way she had of telegraphing a gag-line by ducking her head just before she said it remained the same. My, we enjoyed it--maybe this is the golden age of TV!



While the public worries about converting to color television, if, when and as; and while the FCC is in a turmoil over the decision they ultimately have to make regarding which color system (CBS, NBC, and Color Television, Inc.) they will accept as most workable—the theaters may beat the whole bunch on regular commercial video broadcasting through providing big-screen color before it is available in homes. Paramount Television affirms it has two color systems ready for its theater TV process, and 20th Century-Fox is working on largescreen color video.

The theater men realize that to be at all successful they must offer something more than people can get at home; they also realize that RCA's unveiling of a TV tint tube that fits the coaxial cable and the highly successful demonstration on standard, commercial, twelve and and ard, commercial, twelve and an and finchscreened RCA table models of its single-tube system behoove the movie makers to get with it *first*, or else be obsolete by the time color arrives in homes.

The folks at Twentieth are being equally secretive about their process, but it is believed to be a film process, and an outgrowth of one of their developments in the line of color for regular film-making.

Those buyers waiting for color seem to have a good long wait ahead of them, and the possibility of missing a tremendous amount of fine entertainment in the interim. The FCC doesn't move with the speed of light at best, and with bigger and better developments arising almost daily in the three network systems under consideration, more hearings on color seem to be in the offing. Waiting for color before buying seems a nowhere precaution.

Like Frank Fontaine says, I wasn't doing anything, just standing there in the Studio Bookstore, not doing any-thing, when a large, familiar figure loomed in the doorway. Turned out to be Sigmund Spaeth, whom I've recently mentioned here in connection with songs that sound like other songs. Having thus conjured up the former "Tune Detective," I managed to dig a few facts for this column. Spaeth, understandably mistaking me for a lady book dealer, told me he was interested in plugging his new book, a novelized version of the Clara and Robert Schumann love story. His ABC program, not heard locally, was broadcast from Hollywood while he was in this area.

I was interested in the musicologist's continuing adventures with the American popular song. His book of several seasons ago, History of Popular Music in America, is the most fascinating thing on the subject.

He revealed that on trips like the current one he lends an attentive ear to juke boxes in restaurants and that he thinks the old-time music being revived is giving a needed lift to popular tunes in general. We got on the subject of his recent lists of the most popular songs of the last fifty years. They were, in case you missed the Variety and Time articles: "Sweet Adeline," "School Days," "Shine On, Harvest Moon," "Let Me Call You Sweetheart." "Down by the Old Mill Stream," "I Want a Girl." "St. Louis Blues," "Smiles," "Stardust" and "God Bless America."

"But people get confused," he sighed. "They thought I'd said those were the best popular songs of the last fifty years. Best and most popular are two different things." In order to straighten readers out, Spaeth then compiled his list of the best. "Waiting for the Robert E. Lee," "Lazy," "The Man I Love," "Chloe," "Til See You Again," "All the Things You Are," "If I Loved You" and "Were Thine That Special Face."

Two of the most popular songs, "Stardust" and "St. Louis Blues," also made Spaeth's "best" list. Big surprise was his rating of an overlooked Cole Porter tune from "Kiss Me Kate," "Were Thine That Special Face," a beautiful and seldom played number. Spaeth looks for it to do a slow climb, a la "Begin the Beguine," another Porter hit that took a mere decade to catch on after its introduction in a Broadway musical. "When Cole read the list, he called me up," Spaeth smiled. "He was very pleased."

"Beany," Engaging Lead Man of a Popular Television Puppet Series, Isn't Unlike Most Small Boys in That "Eating Time" Has Great Bearing on His Life's Story



Monday-Friday. 6:30 p.m. KTLA, Channel 5 N OLD jingle about snips and snails supposedly ties up the mystery of "what little boys are made of." One of the most popu-

lar little boys in the country, the propeller-capped, grinning little "Beany," no doubt substantiates this. It is how "Beany" came into being that makes a story.

Like most small boys, real or fancied, events of his life are closely linked with eating. He was conceived in a Wilshire Boulevard delicatessen late one night. Creator Bob Clampett had stopped by for a late snack, and as he ate, watched, then eagerly sketched, a rosy-faced child dressed in a striped shirt, beany cap and suspender suit, his idea of long mulling was taking form.

Table Talk

"Beany's" actual birth was the result of another round-table coffeeklotch session among Bob and his team of workers who today are principals in the successful "Beany" picture. The name "Beany" arose from a breakfast-table session between Bob Clampett and his mother. Several names were possible choices, but Bob's mother held out for the present perfect moniker.

Bob grinningly says there are, outside of the show's dear little title character, five real principals. Daws Butler, who does the voice for "Beany"; Stan Freberg, who articulates for "Cecil"; set-designer and artist Bill Oberlin; writer Charles Shows, and a producer-director by the name of Bob Clampett.

Any time that, after a regular show, these five turn out of Para-

mount's KTLA to go next door for a snack, new "Beany" adventures are born.

It was table talk that led to the inspired "Schmoon" trip. Inter-planetary travel was discussed as a theme, but the moon seemed too cold a body for the popular crew to try and force, educationally, onto children. It was Bill Oberlin who came up with the warmer, unexplored "Schmoon."

These inspired "cuffo" ideas, while charming, aren't relied upon solely. A good deal of work and research follow up each jolly suggestion. Once the trip was decided upon, the entire group of "Beany" creators spent evening upon evening trooping. en masse, up to the observatory. When rocket propulsion came into the puppet-series story line, Bob's own intensive study of a book on rocket propulsion served as guide. The group painstakingly copied and studied charts of the interplanetary system before plotting the "Leakin' Lena's" flight. These accurate charts were later craftily integrated into the show and put on view to stimulate child interest in the real heavenly bodies.

When the group hit upon the idea of a safari into the jungle in the "Middle of East Nowhere," a suitable jungle was painstakingly searched out. From an old travel book a photo depicting a lush South American jungle was finally chosen as the model.

bers of the moment and invites his correspondent to furnish information of tourist interest. He also calls singers and musicians touring the U.S. and records phone conversations to be played later as interviews.

"VE FOUND out one thing," Carl "The Squeakin' Deacon" Moore declared, "there's something of home folks in everybody. Everyone's either visited a farm at some time, or lived on one, or wanted to. And our television show is done with the hope of pleasin' the home folks.

"When I thought about doing a program on television, I set my mind to think of something original yet with proven entertainment factors. In the end, I tried to combine the established appeal of many things like the humor of Bob Burns, who had the country folks laughing with him and the city folks laughing at him; the gimmick of Uncle Ezra's five-watter which supplied the springboard for variety acts such as folks always like to see; and the homespun ways of Will Rogers, who has always thrilled me to pieces and who has remained my ideal and sort of a goal."

The result was KECA-TV's homey Saturday night fun-fest, "Squeakin" Deacon's Store." Its setting is the town's general store where the Deacon, who occupies every official capacity in the township, presides over the comings and goings of the townsfolk who regularly gather there. During the second haif of the program, a pseudo radio show is staged during which talented young people perform. The Deacon happily related to us that one of the youngsters who appeared on his show was viewed by Roy Rogers, who was so impressed with her ability that he had her signed to a contract.

Penned All-Time Hits

The Deacon's own career story is one of a homespun Arkansas boy with an ear for music and a talent for fun-making. He started out with a high-school band playing the De-Soto Gardens in Hot Springs, went on the road with an eight-piece Dixieland jazz band, later playing hotels all over the country including a smash engagement in Chicago's swank Drake.

"Deacon" Moore is co-writer of such nostalgic standards as "Ding Dong Daddy," "St. James Infirmary" and "Bye Bye Blues." He has appeared in Warner Brothers pictures and is heard daily over radio's KXLA in addition to his weekly Channel 7 video capers. Glamorous cables make him dream as his listeners do of traveling. From Rio, he's found himself addressed as Senhor Masterios. But surprisingly homey was this one from Chez Innez in Paris: "LOVERMAN SQUEEZE ME SOLITUDE STOP RESTAURANT INNEZ FEATURES SOUTHERN FRIED CHICKEN PARIS MAGNIFICENT."

Hollywood, got one of Hedda Hopper's fabulous hats, Dorothy Lamour's sarong, Bob Burns's pig (which went for the highest bid of \$300,000) and the shirt right off Bob Hope's back. Back in Wichita Falls, Texas, the auction lasted fifty-nine minutes, brought in 1,300,000.

Comedian Hope came back into the picture when he was the initial guest on Johnny's civilian-time program, "Johnny on the Spot." (The show title came from the name Ben Gross dubbed on Johnny after he had airscooped a plane crash on Wall Street.)

In 1947, Johnny trekked to California ... his home-town friend, "Speed" Riggs, was influential in the move, and also had Johnny doing some Lucky Strike testimonials on radio. For a short period, he strayed away from the air to promote racing in midget and stock cars, but came back with shows from the King's Restaurant and Ham 'n' Egger, and now has a nightly record and chatter show with the stars airing from Ciro's. (KLAC, immediately after the baseball games.)

Besides radio, Johnny has appeared in several movies, including "Fancy Pants" (Bob Hope starrer) and "Gun Crazy," and was thrilled to have the reporter role in "The Babe Ruth Story." Still an avid baseball fan, he's partial to the Cleveland Indians, will still modestly tell friends how he hit the only home run of the game when the disc jockeys held their annual "Out of This World" series last year.
