# What's New With Mel Blanc?



*The Man With the Versatile Tonsils Is Back at the Mikes After His Annual Big Bear Summer Spent Hauling In the Trout And Casting a Speculative Look at Video*

**T**HE SPECULATIVE look Mel Blanc is casting toward TV is a cautious one. Mel is as eager as anyone to have a fling at the fabulous new medium—but he also feels there's never been a wiser place to apply the philosophy of that old axiom "Look before you leap." "And I've gained ounces of prevention multi-fold just keeping a watchful eye on my own set. It's a good way to learn the 'don'ts' of television."

Currently, Mel remains a TV hold-out while wisely waiting for "the right vehicle." "On television, I won't have the chance to do as many shows as on radio. My face isn't as flexible

as my voice." On the radio, even Mel's own mother doesn't always recognize his voice.

Mel has, however, developed a half-dozen vocal interpretations that have become identifiable Blanc creations—among them, his roles on Jack Benny's CBS show including those of Jack's violin teacher, his parrot, the train caller and perennial Al Jolson's perennial impersonator, and on Judy Canova's NBC comedy series, the parts of "Pedro" ("I thee-eeenk!"), "Paw Canova" and "Tex." Mel stressed the importance of consistent character identification, citing the case of Frank Nelson, who has contributed so much to radio's big comedy shows for so many years, but who only recently has begun to establish his identity with the public

with his "Yeee-aaaaas, Mr. Benny?" laugh line.

**"Hizzoner"**

With the Benny and Canova shows so recently returned after their summer hiatus, Mel has also just resumed his microphone activities following his own annual respite from the radio grind. There once was a day when he doggedly kept his nose to the ether grindstone twelve months out of every year, but since he adopted the wiser "Life's too short" philosophy, he has become so regular a resident of Big Bear Lake that this fall will see him inaugurated as its Honorary Mayor.

He has, in addition, been given the distinguished rank of Rear Commodore in the Big Bear Yacht Club and is, as well, the composer of a novelty tune titled "Big Bear Lake" which is available on record as interpreted by Blanc's own elastic tonsils. Also available, on Capitol wax, are Mel's many children's records that feature his many cartoon voices. Latest of these is an album called "Bugs Bunny Sings," which includes the novelty vocals of "Bugs Bunny," "Daffy Duck," "Little Tweedie Bird" and "Yosemite Sam." All of Mel's cartoon-voice children's albums have placed consistently among the first eight in Billboard's popularity listings, and the actor credits highly the work of Capitol's Allan Livingston, who produces them, Billy May, who does the music, and Michael Maltese and Warren Foster of Warner Brothers' cartoon department.

# Worth His Weight

**L**IKE THE corpulent character he has so aptly portrayed for the past four years, J. Scott Smart tips the scales at 260 pounds. However, his resemblance to ABC's "Fat Man" is purely physical, for Smart is a direct opposite of the pretentious private eye.

Perhaps even more fabulous a character than the one he fictionalizes is Smart, who is a recluse, a painter and an extremely shy, even lonely, man.

## All Alone

By no stretch of the imagination could Smart be called a typical New Yorker. Although he has lived there more than ten years, he detests the clatter-and-clang way of life, calls

it "too much nonsense." The Maine coastline is his home throughout most of the year and a fisherman's shack his abode, where he can "batch it" and "sit and watch the other guys go fishing." A confirmed bachelor, he describes his solitude as including "Just me and the sea-gulls." (Smart claims to have an artist's inferiority complex which may explain his reticent behavior when he is with strangers.)

Only during the summer does Smart leave his hermitage, for then it becomes, like other ocean resorts, a "forty-cent tour." The rest of the time he flies once a week to New York for the "Fat Man" show, returning immediately to his shack, to paint water-color seascapes (many of which have hung in New York's celebrated Twenty-One Club).

## Vicious Circle

Just as incredible as his personality is J. Scott's career, which began in the theater at the suggestion of everybody except himself and his family. He used to be a dancer as well as a drummer, musical talents he channeled into spots with Eastern straw-hat circuits, consequently to appear in musical comedies like "No! No! Nanette!" and "Pink Lady." During the early '30's, J. Scott developed into a dialectician, a talent he used on varied radio shows including "The March of Time" and the Fred Allen show.

Around 1938-9 Smart came to Hollywood to appear in "100 Men and a Girl," the Deanna Durbin starrer. He was given a Universal contract, but since nothing came of it he went back to New York, and this time it was the stage that saw him next. ("Separate Rooms," with Alan Dinehart, Glenda Farrell and Lyle Talbot, was one of his plays).

In 1946 he auditioned for "The Fat Man," won the role and again came back to Hollywood, this time to star in the Universal "Fat Man" series, the first of which was filmed last summer.

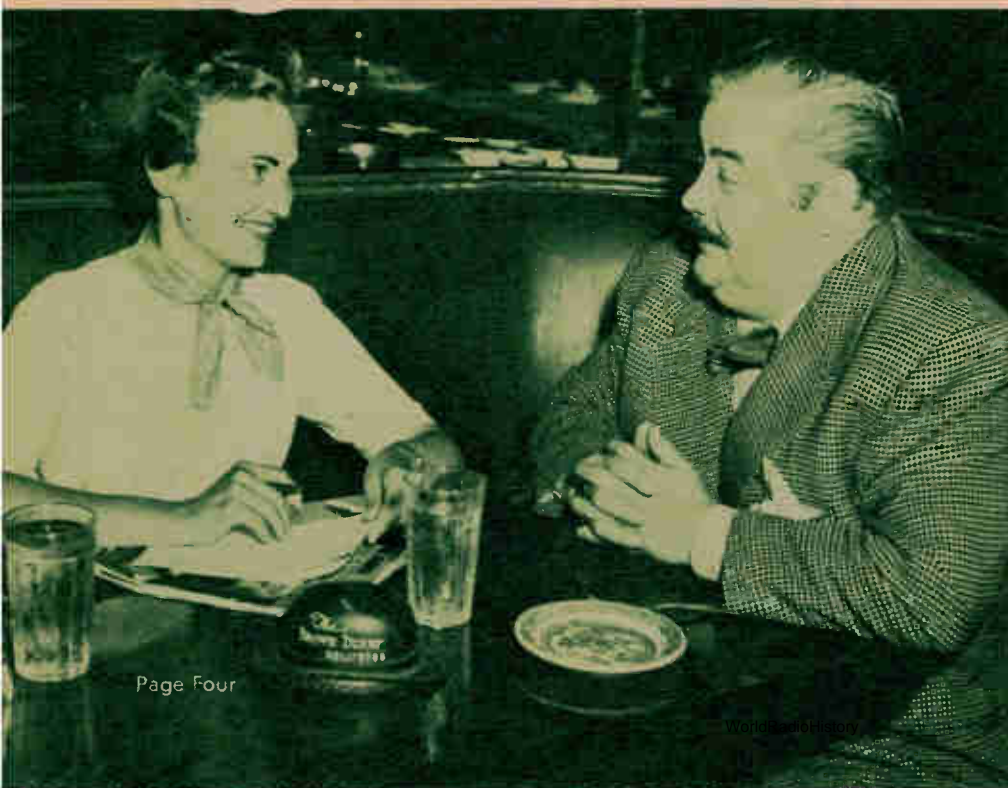

# The Secret of Jack Benny's Success

**B**ENNY'S BACK!" That was the by-word around radio this fall when Jack Benny and his familiar team of laughmakers returned to the mikes for their nineteenth season. It is, at the same time, Benny's first of what will probably mount up to a comparative string of successful seasons in the new video medium. (KTTV, Channel 11, check TV logs for time and day.)

Benny is back, as always, in his familiar role of the balding, penny-pinching patsy, but his CBS Jack Benny program, as in the past, will be replete during the coming year with riotous new laugh skits, new characterizations, new guest surprises.

This indestructible quality of the great wit's character creation and a show format flexible enough for a perennial infusion of fresh idea material and talent point to the secret of his enduring and inimitable success. As radio critic John Crosby once wrote: "Benny hasn't, as is so persistently rumored, been doing the same thing for eighteen years. He wouldn't have lasted that long if he had."

Comedy situations in a Benny program season have, year after year, been marked by freshness and originality. New characterizations, his own and those of an odd assortment of fellow actors and actresses, have

paraded across the script in endless procession. His guests, too, have been spectacularly impressive, as witness the case of the Ronald Colmans, who appeared sixteen times on the show.

But the program personalities, including the whimsical portrayals of regular cast members, are probably the most memorable highlights of the Benny saga. Among those who turned up last season was Frank Fontaine, a new comedian, playing a mentally retarded sweepstakes winner named "John L. P. Sivony." Mel Blanc, a regular, did a week-by-week impersonation of Al Jolson. Benny himself added another facet to his characterization, that of the naive treasurer of the Beverly Hills Beavers, a boys' club.

**"Hiya Buck!"**

Who doesn't remember the famous Buck Benny of the long-running "Buck Benny Rides Again" sequence? Andy Devine, whose entrance line was "Hiya, Buck!", was the chief stooge of this comedy turn. The skit ceased with the release of the Paramount film "Buck Benny Rides Again," in which Benny and most of his ribbers appeared.

Mr. Billingsley was a quaint character dreamed up and played by Ed Beloin, a former writer. A subnormal self-appointed house guest, Mr. Billingsley consistently made wry comments at the wrong time in a dry voice. Beloin, never an actor, always had Benny worried that he'd miss his cues or fluff his lines.

Another witty specimen knocked on the Benny door announcing "A telegram for Mr. Benny." The role was played by Harry Baldwin, Benny's secretary, who would glow over his laconic line with Barrymore-like pride at the end of each performance.

Mr. Kitzel, a current fabrication, is played by Artie Auerbach, former New York newspaper photographer. His "peekle in the meedle with the mustard on top" and his baseball stories are laugh toppers. Mabel Flapsaddle and Gertrude Gearshift, the Benny telephone operators, enacted by Sara Berner and Bea Benaderet, tie the program in knots with their saucy badgering of the boss.

Off and on the show have been

ing-cold rooms that were the only accommodations—why, my husband even fixed a portable lamp for me to warm myself by . . . but ha, I wouldn't go through it again! When you're young, inconveniences are fun, you know . . . but I'm a grandmother now!"

#### **Comedy and Drama**

Jane went into radio "whenever it was there was no more theater," and since that time has become a favorite with listeners, originally as a dramatic actress and in the past few years as a comedienne. "You know," she confided with a wink, "at first no one thought I could do comedy! Really. Then I went on Jack Benny's show as 'Emily,' the elderly admirer of ('that dear boy'), and afterwards came parts with Sweeney and March, Bob Hope, Jack Carson and now 'Our Miss Brooks.'" A wistfully serious Jane adds, "I do hope no one will forget I still do drama."

#### **Home Body**

With a newly remodeled and redecorated home in the San Fernando Valley, Jane has been in a whirl, figuring interior and exterior designs. "All finished now," she sighs, "and

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Looks Like

An all-star staff helped producer-star Al Burton celebrate the Second Anniversary of "Tele-Teen Reporter," KLAC-TV, last Wednesday. Among those joining the festivities were Al Jarvis, Don Otis, Hawthorne and Eggbert, Eddie Ryan, Ronnie Kemper, Sam Balter and Herb Allen. . . . Next week "Miss Teen-Age America" will be presented on "Tele-Teen Reporter." . . . NBC-TV's "The Big Story" documentary was chosen as one of the nine best TV plays of 1949 in "Best Television Plays of the Year," to be published by Merlin Press. Five hundred plays, seen on 103 TV stations throughout the nation, were scanned before the nine best were chosen. . . . Natalie Kalmus Television is branching into schooling in color TV. Kalmus, who for over twenty years was associated with Technicolor as color director, is emphatic in her contention that the problems in color TV today are the sending rather than the receiving. . . . "The Kid From Powder River Ranch" announced hiatus due to inability to maintain regular program time on KECA-TV. Search is now being made among TV outlets in Los Angeles for a good spot for the program, and some assurance of cooperation in giving it stabilized time. . . . First filming of Shakespeare's works for television is now in progress under the banner of Avon Pictures, Inc., a partnership of Sol Lesser and Douglas Fairbanks, Jr. First two pictures on the slate are "Julius Caesar" and "Anthony and Cleopatra." . . . The Ford Dealers of Southern California are picking up the check on KTTV's "The Alan Young Show," which is sponsored in the East by Esso and in the Midwest by Kroger Grocery. Ford sponsorship is here only. . . . The sensational young comic-mimic, Frank Fontaine, has been signed to a two-year radio and TV contract by CBS. He will continue to be heard on a number of Benny shows . . . and CBS is working on a TV format for him. . . . Robert Clarke has been chosen for the lead in "The Three Musketeers," one-hour feature film going into production this week at Hal Roach Studios for the Magnavox Theater television series. . . . Auditions of children under twelve years are being planned soon to fill a ten-person cast of the television show "The Smiley Burnette Bugle." . . . Show is being packaged by Hamilburg Agency and Smiley Burnette, and format of the

TV show follows closely Burnette's editorship of a Western newspaper, with the kids reporters who bring in promising juve talent to show. . . . Mal Boyd has already set Gene Raymond for two guest shots during his marathon of Eastern video guest shots. They are NBC-TV's "Leave It to the Girls" and CBS-TV's "Celebrity Time." . . . Stu Wilson's sponsor—now hang onto your hats — "Mother's Pride Creamy Root Beer"! is so enthused with Wilson's KFI-TV "Square Dance Happy Time" that it is contemplating building another show, a radio show, around the couple. . . . Jo Stafford, who is on the air around the world at least two hours and fifteen minutes every week, may make her television debut in color. . . . She has been requested by CBS to go to New York for their first big all-out color show.

## '51 Series to Cost More

Gillette and DuMont battled out the bidding for this year's World Series to the tune of \$800,000, with Gillette making a dubious win and picking up the tab. The razor company then got off the hook, if you can call \$150,000 out of \$800,000 any sort of help, by divvying with NBC, CBS and ABC (each at \$50,000) on costs and presentation. Gillette earned first refusal rights to next year's diamond series, but current word is that they won't go for the \$1,000,000 which Baseball Commissioner A. B. ("Happy") Chandler has set up as the mark to shoot for on the part of a hopeful sponsor. Word is also that Chevrolet will step in and bid 'em up. Well, you have to sell fewer cars than razors or blades to make up a million! In any event, it is a safe bet we will see baseball again.

## September Record

September sales of television receivers broke all records when 739,700 sets were bought by the public, and total U. S. television homes reached an estimated 8,269,400 as of October 1, 1950, according to a statement issued by Hugh M. Beville, Jr., NBC Director of Plans and Research.

Unprecedented buying in September was spurred by the attraction of greatly expanded fall program schedules and by the extension of television network hookups. On September 30, fifteen markets joined the NBC interconnected network, giving 604,000 television families their first opportunity to see "live" network programs. Eighty-four per cent of all United States TV homes are now served by linked stations, ranging from Jacksonville to Boston and as far west as Omaha.

The debut of Nashville, Tennessee's WSM-TV, on September 30, brought the total number of operating stations to 107. Until the FCC resumes assignment of facilities there will be no further television markets added to present total of NBC's sixty-three, Beville said.

You now see comedy star Stu Erwin and his lovely wife, June Collyer, on KECA-TV, in "The Stu Erwin Show" . . . every Saturday night at 7:30. . . . And there's now a homemaker's special on KECA-TV every Monday thru Friday at 1:00 p.m. . . . If you're home at that time, tune in for Grace Lawson's cooking and nutrition talks.

relatively mediocre idea when the emcee is one of the best, the mechanics of the show are well planned and effected, and some interesting extra talent is thrown in.

Show is a quiz session, with Art Baker appearing as skipper of the good ship "Tico." Each week a panel, consisting of three guests, sits around the captain's table. Four entertainers are members of the ship's crew. Each week the cruise takes viewers to different parts of the world, as the panel attempts to identify the places visited.

Not too novel. But Baker is so good in anything he does on TV, and his crew, Margaret Kerry, Nancy Wible, Ralph Hodges and Hal Smith (all of whom sing and dance out clues to the pictures shown) are so cute and capable, that these participants provide a good show all by themselves.

The places to be identified by the visiting panel are pictured, in part. A giant Teleflex screen is used, and these pictures, partially concealed, are thrown on that panel. Then the four-some of entertainers augment pictured clues by song and dance. If no one guesses, the picture thrown on the Teleflex screen is made clearer. More clues are added. Baker, all the while, keeps up the line of easy chatter in which he excels, making it more interesting for the viewers and for his guests. For some weeks now KTTV has been incorporating front-line film on the Korean war in its regular newsreel. Now Bob Allison, head of the KTTV Television Newsreel, reports that so much exclusive footage has come in from Charles de Soria in Korea that he, Allison, will have to break up the coverage to run the film on all nights. KTTV was the only television station in the country having its own staff cameraman at the invasion of Inchon.

Some of the scenes shown have been, are, and will be the front-line inspection by General MacArthur, smoking remains of Inchon after the invasion, arrival of the first United States planes at recaptured Kimpo airport, the Han River crossing and advance on Seoul by United Nations forces.

Inchon scenes cover the roundup of civilians for screening and questioning, imprisonment of Red soldiers, and treatment of war casualties.

In addition, Allison runs any special footage that comes in during the week from de Soria, now in the Seoul area.

Each time we watch KTTV's newsreel and this first-hand coverage, the thought occurs—too bad all schools, everywhere, aren't employing television in their curricula. It's a good bet that any TV station or outlet on

earth would cooperate with the schools in supplying marvelous footage that would bear out the old adage of one picture being worth ten thousand words.

"Crusader Rabbit" is a lovable, determined doll of a rabbit whose creators (Fairbanks Studios) put him through paces and fed him dialogue apparently designed for children, but with such tongue in cheek that at times the nightly five minutes could hold its own with a popular threesome (KF&O) no longer seen locally.

Sponsored by Friskies (a rabbit recommends a pup's fare!) the series has been running for weeks and weeks. Seldom does it fail to offer less than one good laugh a night, and for a five-minute series that racks up a good batting average.

Done in cartoon with a supposedly "straight" narrative, it carries "Crusader" and pals on their Quixote-like journeyings. Currently all are in the Great Southwest, at the mercy of the "Schmohawks," a fabulous lost tribe of Indians. Sounds silly, huh?

Well, it's the sort of whimsy that won't bear description. Any comment would be pretty heavy-handed. But push the juves aside some night and get a front seat at 6:00. It lasts only five minutes. If you don't succumb you've lost nothing—if you do, you're welcome.

## Second Glances (Critical Comment)

### "Beulah"

What a great waste of talent lies in the casting of Ethel Waters as the kitchen queen in ABC-TV's televised series of an old and highly successful radio series, "Beulah." Not because the "Beulah" story is any less in any way than other television fare—and certainly the balance of the cast should keep Miss Waters happy with their performances. But to hear gems such as "Diamonds may be a girl's best friend, but a bank account ain't no poor relation"—instead of the songs she does a little bit better than any one alive—comes as a poor surprise to any Waters admirer.

For the record, the cast features Ginger Jones and William Post, Jr., as "Mr. and Mrs. Henderson," and Bud Harris as the evasive "Bill." Butterfly McQueen is the neighbor "Oriole,"



and Clifford Sales is "Donnie Henderson." Story lines usually, as in radio, find Harry Henderson, Beulah's employer, bungling situations and causing consternation among the feminine contingent. The resourceful Beulah usually finds the situation that saves the day.

It's great entertainment—unless, as we said, you happen to be a Waters fan. In this case, the image on your TV screen will slowly fade into nothingness while your memory creates a picture of Ethel Waters on stage, vocalizing with the Duke's band of old, or in the center of any one of a dozen unforgettable "Cabin in the Sky" scenes. Your video picture and mental image will never mix.

NBC says it's getting about a thousand requests a week for those Hedda Hopper editorials. . . . Shirley Mitchell is a mother now. It's a girl, and not a "little Shirley," hooray. Shirl thought up a pretty one—Stephanie Brooke. . . . "Railroad Hour's" choir director, Norman Luboff, will deliver a lecture on choir arranging and conducting at L.A. City College, November 15. His audience will be members of the school choir and music-appreciation group. . . . Air actor Ted de Corsia, who usually plays gangsters in films, will pull a switch in his new one, "The Folsom Story." He'll be the warden. . . . Ralph Edwards has just been voted show business's best-dressed man for the third time this year—this time by the board members of the Men's Apparel Guild of California. . . . Lawrence Tibbett has had to withdraw from the host role on the "Metropolitan Opera Auditions of the Air"—which returns to the ABC mikes November 14—because of a previous Broadway commitment. . . . Sydney Greenstreet weighs in just about right for his role as NBC's "Nero Wolfe." The fictional hero supposedly tips the scales at 272, Greenstreet at 280. . . . "Hallmark Playhouse's" music director Lyn Murray and radio director Dick Mack collaborated on a tune, "Baby," which will be heard in the forthcoming film "The Prowler." . . . History repeated itself for Carmen Dragon when he conducted "Showboat" for a recent "Railroad Hour" airing. It was thirteen years ago that he did the arranging for "Showboat" under Meredith Willson's baton shortly after arriving in Hollywood from San Fran-

cisco. Carmen also first met his wife, Eloise, during rehearsals of the production in which she sang in the choir. . . . KECA's "This Is California" is making its first annual selection of outstanding Californians. . . . "Broadway Is My Beat" star, Larry Thor, has a new pet—a skunk aptly dubbed "Chanel." . . . Warren Hull, quizmaster of "Strike It Rich," is going to night school with his twenty-year-old son. Hull says he was driven to it by the thought of sometime being caught on the other side of the mike on his quiz show. . . . NBC's "Voice of Firestone" has received the second annual Lowell Mason Award for "outstanding contribution to music on the air."

### Radio's Future

Mark Woods, Vice-Chairman of the American Broadcasting Company, speaking before the Eastern Annual Conference of the American Association of Advertising Agencies' Radio and Television Production recently, declared that he is "firmly convinced that radio has a place—and an important one—in the world of tomorrow, despite the reiterated announcements of its demise at the hands of television."

Pointing out the dramatic strides that television has made in a short period of time and the attendant publicity that it has received, Mr. Woods said: "Radio, without the fanfare that has accompanied the march of television, has also been marching steadily ahead. More people are listening to the radio than ever before. The radio business in an over-all sense is also at a new high. And at this moment radios are outselling television sets two to one. Significantly, a great proportion of these radio sets are being purchased by owners of television receivers. All that does not, it seems to me, add up to a picture of a sickly or moribund industry."

The following salient facts for radio's continued and ever-increasing popularity were also pointed out by Mr. Woods: "Availability and mobility. Today you can hear radio practically anywhere—at home, in your car, at the beach, at the summer resort or camp, on planes and trains and boats; its ability to switch instantaneously from one place to another, and the fact that radio—and only radio—reaches the people while they work."

Speaking of the advantages of advertising on radio, Mr. Woods said, "Radio is the only medium through which an advertiser can economically reach the vast bulk of American homes with heavy frequency of impression. An examination of media

shows radio offers the lowest transportation costs in all advertising. It costs an advertiser far less to reach one thousand prospects via radio than via newspapers, magazines or television."

In concluding his talk before the 4-A's meeting, ABC's vice-chairman said "Considering radio's inherent assets—universal coverage, its frequency of impact, its steady expansion, its unmatched economy, I know that there is a place—a most important place—for radio in the world of tomorrow."

### Listening In

From a single recent script of NBC's "Halls of Ivy" have been culled these excellent examples of what we call good radio writing. Show's scripter is Don Quinn.

"There is no more doleful sound than the hollow reverberation of an idea striking a brass hat. . . ."

"It's one of the grosser untruths that a man's mind is necessarily as cluttered as his desk. Tidy thinking leaves little time to deal with the enormous accumulations in any man's normal day. And besides, you never know what interesting tidbits might emerge from the debris. . . ."

"The appetite for scandal grabs for the smallest morsel and can fatten on crumbs. . . ."

"I've found that sometimes the best way to straighten things out is to take a walk around the block—to walk around in a circle and wind up where you started. . . ."

### Teachers Rate High

As you've probably noted, school teachers have been receiving considerable attention on radio-television this past week, in observance of American Education Week, November 5-11. We want to add our own word of commendation to the members of this most worthwhile profession and to remind the readers of this periodical of the importance of public education and the desirability of public interest, cooperation and active participation in the activities of our local schools at all times.

Also, it's only fitting to note at this time, in a nationwide survey conducted by public opinion analyst Elmo Roper and reported on CBS's "Where the People Stand" a few Sundays ago, school teachers won the highest accolade as useful citizens of the community.

The figures showed that about ten per cent voted in favor of lawyers as



the most important people in a community, and thirteen per cent for the merchant. In third place, the mayor, (first selection) or some other top public official rated twenty per cent. Above the public officials ranked the clergy with twenty-seven per cent. But school teachers topped them all with a vote of thirty-one per cent.

"The results perhaps point up just what a high purpose people believe teachers have," said Mr. Roper. "Maybe they think the teacher affects them through their children in a more personal way than do people in the other occupation lists. Whatever the reason, it is clear from these results that teachers are indeed held in high regard."

Now, we add, what about their paychecks?

Bob Hope recently voiced what he called "a comedian's report to the mothers and fathers of the world," from Tokyo via ABC's Walter Winchell show. In the event that you missed what he had to say, we print his remarks in part:

"Your kids have done a wonderful job. I was particularly impressed with how young some of them were. It was hard to believe. They were at an age when you would expect them to be playing football on a sand lot, yet they're over here playing dead in a mudhole so they can get back up again and make a touchdown on the Manchurian border. I wondered how most of them could be old enough to know what they were fighting about. And I talked to some of them and saw their determination and stopped wondering.

"I asked one, who has been with the 24th Division since the beginning, if he thought he'd make it home for Christmas and he said, 'I don't care if I do or not. I want to stay here until there is no more Communism, so I'll know I won't have to come back.'"

### Salinas and Sons

Twelve-year favorite with KOWL's Spanish audience is Elena Salinas' six-day-a-week chatter-music show, which recently became the only program in any language to pass from husband to wife to sons.

Inheriting the stint from her late husband, Elena has now brought her two boys, Victor and Gilbert, into mike range. While the pert and pretty señora continues in the Spanish vein, the sons direct their fifteen-minute segment in English to Mexican-American youth.

Gilbert, a student at Dorsey High, where he is a member of the gymnast team, disc-jockeys, announces commercials, ad-libs in bright style and is the keeper of controls. (Show is broadcast directly from the Salinas home.)

Victor, the debonair one who recently returned home after three years service with the Navy in the Orient, appears only on the Saturday airing since he's studying television, radio and electronics for a future career.

The unique way of making radio a family affair is heard daily from 7:00 to 8:15 a.m., and Elena thinks it's pretty wonderful having her sons to solo the show 'cause now she's got time to cook their breakfasts.

Territorially, Joe Thompson says his show reaches from the tar pits to the smudge pots, being picked up at various time spots on and around the five o'clock hour by stations spread along the coast on the Pacific Coast Network chain. We think it's worth your while to check your local radio log for his program listing and dial accordingly. He disc-jockeys listenable music in a listenable manner. He doesn't forget that he's at the mike to spin records, and when he does talk it's usually to bring you informative tidbits about the artists whose music he is playing and frequently a well-handled personal interview with a music notable.

If his show sounds professional all the way, it's no wonder. He started in radio some twenty years ago and progressed quickly into big-time broadcasting. He has been a producer for NBC, both in San Francisco and New York, and is now a producer at ABC. Disc-jockeying, however, has always been his first radio love. He began his air career whirling wax, and has long nourished the ambition to return to it. With the Joe Thompson Show, he's fulfilling this ambition—and resultantly, bringing dialers a good disc-jockey program.

## Off Mike (Personalities)

### "Nora Drake" Now a Book

A novel, "The Nora Drake Story," by Cornelia Blair, based on the early life of CBS's popular daytime serial heroine, has just been released for book-store purchase by its publishers, Duell, Sloan & Pearce, Inc.

The program, a serialized story of a young nurse's career in a metropolitan hospital, has been a regular Columbia network feature for three years, with actress Joan Tompkins as its star. Her picture is on the cover of the book.

The novel delineates "Nora's" development through her formative years, from the age of nine until she finishes her nurse's training course. The radio drama was initiated at the point when "Nora" left the Army Nursing Corps to enter private practice.

### Ben Grauer's Twentieth

Radio dialers know NBC's Ben Grauer as an announcer, sports commentator, political analyst, narrator, moderator and emcee. He is a compact, genial man who has been heard on the air in this variety of capacities for twenty consecutive years.

In the space of two recent weeks, he ad-libbed stroke-by-stroke at the National Open Golf Tournament, narrated Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf" with the NBC Symphony, exchanged quips with Howdy-Doody and covered the UN Security Council for the television audience.

The National Academy of Vocal Arts has characterized his voice as "the most authoritative in the world"—although at the College of the City of New York he nearly flunked a course in public speaking (he subsequently won a prize, at graduation, for ex-temporaneous speaking).

As a child actor he also appeared in several Broadway productions: "Maytime," the revival of "The Flordora Girl" and the Theater Guild's "Processional."

Now, thirty-four years later, he rounds out his theatrical career as a producer. With Norman Rose, Grauer is co-producer of a new off-Broadway group, Theater Venture, which launched its season with Shaw's "Mrs. Warren's Profession," starring Estelle Winwood and John Loder.

into the NBC studios for a drama audition. Two hours later he walked out with an announcer's contract. During the past twenty years, he has covered every national election return (during the turning of the Truman tide, in 1948, Grauer was on television for sixteen consecutive hours); the Morro Castle disaster, the Hauptmann trial, the assassination of Count Bernadotte in Israel, and countless other special events.

During that same period he has announced for Walter Winchell (1932-1948, the longest association on record of an announcer with a single program); the NBC Symphony and literally scores of other well-known programs.

Grauer is unmarried, a bibliophile (he has more than 3,500 rare books in his midtown apartment), an amateur archeologist (a member of four archeological societies and the only lay member of an expedition to Southern Mexico which discovered the largest stone head made by western man), an ardent rumba dancer and a gourmet.

Among radio boners he recalls was one which occurred during a Winchell broadcast. Grauer had a frog in his throat, literally croaked through his lines, and signed off with "This is Ben Grauer squeaking."

Grauer considers his most memorable broadcast that of Eisenhower's return in 1945.

Grauer covered the triumphal return of General Eisenhower in Washington, New York and Abilene, Kansas, and said, "The first was the formal, official welcome, dignified, restrained; the return of the victorious soldier to his commander. New York interrupted its lunch hour to watch Eisenhower as he waved to the cosmopolitan throng. But Abilene—that's where America was paraded for Eisen-

hower. That was the heart of America."

## The Bennys at Home

Through Jack Benny's consistent practice of using his home as a setting for his comedy, his audiences feel that they know every nook and cranny of the house. Their letters indicate that they believe that Rochester is Benny's real-life servant, and that Benny actually has a creaking safe in the cellar.

The facts are, of course, that far from being a household employee, Rochester (Eddie Anderson) is himself an employer of servants. And there is no basement safe, or any of the other hilarious nonsense by which Benny has delighted a couple of generations of fans.

The home life of Jack and Mary (Livingstone) Benny is just about what you would expect of two persons of their position.

They live in an early American type house in the heart of Beverly Hills, though the interior decoration is in an attractive and comfortable modern. The decoration was done, incidentally, by William Haines, once a leading motion-picture star.

Probably the only real way in which their life differs from that of other persons in similar circumstances is in the names and fame of their close friends. Their most frequent guests are the Robert Taylors (Barbara Stanwyck), Dr. and Mrs. Joel Pressman (Claudette Colbert), Mr. and Mrs. Danny Kaye, George and Gracie Burns, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Vidor (Doris Warner), and Mr. and Mrs. William Goetz.

There is no fixed schedule of entertaining. They believe in having parties only when they feel like it, and this may be a couple of times in a week or not for a month at a time.

They go through the usual run of party fads, like most other couples in Hollywood—canasta tournaments, charades, square dancing. Their favorite entertainment is to herd their guests from the dinner table into their large, informal den to see an unreleased film. Since their friends are all picture people, they like it too.

Benny, an early riser, is up and dressed by 7:00 a.m., ready for a round of golf, business appointments or sessions with his writers. Mary Livingstone is a golf addict too, but much more leisurely about it. Her most frequent partner on the greens is Jane Wyman.

They don't care much for night clubs, but they will usually attend the opening of a new act at Ciro's, the Mocambo or the other clubs that feature top-flight shows. They dress informally. Benny says he gave up white tie and tails when he left vaudeville. Their companions on these infrequent night-club excursions usually are Bob Taylor and Barbara Stanwyck.

Other comedians love to have Benny in the audience. He laughs loud and applauds hard, doesn't look upon them as rivals. If they're good, he enjoys it and lets them know it.

The Bennys drive their own cars, and for Jack this is a favorite relaxation. There are few things he enjoys more than getting behind the wheel of his automobile and setting off for Palm Springs, Yosemite or some other quiet, attractive spot. Mary, who thinks of driving only in terms of getting from one place to another, doesn't accompany him on the jaunts. She would rather stay home and work on her golf game.

Now a third car has been added. Their sixteen-year-old daughter, Joan, is a senior student at the Chadwick School for Girls in Palos Verdes, California. Until this year, she boarded at the school, but on her sixteenth birthday, her father surprised her with a convertible so she could live at home and drive back and forth to school.

## Harry Knows

Whenever Harry Babbitt, popular CPN singing star, meets somebody new, he generally surprises them by guessing, but a few moments later, exactly where they come from. Not just the state, but often the city—and once in a while even identifying the specific section of that city.

Harry claims this peculiar knack came about through his many years of touring the country with the Kay Kyser musical organization. They'd play one-nighters, night clubs and stage shows from coast to coast, and Harry was meeting new people constantly, noting their speech and relating it to the section of the country in which they happened to be at the time.

Then, during the war years of 1941 through 1943, Harry had a daily round-trip drive into Hollywood from his home of some ten miles each way. He would frequently pick up hitchhiking service men, and after they'd talk a few minutes Harry would usually name their home town for them. After entering the service himself in 1944, he continued to use the same trick on his Navy buddies.

"There are certain key words that give away a man's home town," Harry explains. "Persons in one area say some words entirely differently than people from another section, which is how I often spot them. After I've asked enough of the key words, I can generally tell where a person's home town is."

Harry says he seldom misses on Eastern states or cities—that he is generally correct with Midwestern locations—and that the Western states are the toughest to name accurately.

"People who live in California now," Harry said, "are seldom native Californians. They don't lose the peculiarities of speech that identify them with a different state."

Boston and Brooklyn are the two cities easiest of all to spot, he claims. He sometimes has trouble with people from Oklahoma and Texas, though. Residents of those two states sound so much alike, he said, it's difficult to determine which is their home state. Bet Texans won't like this.

### Cranberry Mince Pie

(Something different for Dad)

- 1 1/4 c. cranberry sauce
- 2 T. sugar
- 1 T. flour
- 1/4 t. salt
- 1 1/4 c. mince meat
- 1/2 t. lemon juice
- Pastry

Combine cranberry sauce, sugar, salt, mince meat, lemon juice and flour. Line nine-inch pie pan with pastry, fill with fruit mixture.

Arrange narrow strips of pastry across top of pie in lattice fashion. Press ends of strips firmly to edge of bottom crust. Bake at 450 degrees for ten minutes, reduce heat to 350 degrees, bake for about twenty-five more minutes.

**I WAS STOPPED COLD** BY a page ad declaring that "Color . . . Color . . . Color . . . Is Here with—TV!" Now really! Let's be fair about it. Color with anybody's set IS NOT HERE. Rochester as the extrovert valet and chauffeur constantly befuddles the harassed Benny. Mary Livingstone is the heckling girl friend whom Benny constantly threatens to send back to the hosiery counter at the May Company department store.

Practically every important figure in show business has guested on the Benny lunfest, but Fred Allen's visits have been among the most notable. Benny and Allen carried on a feud for years on their own programs. Every once in a while they crossed over for mutual calls, letting

Smartly, he has never played up the obvious grossness, but has relied on his acting to execute for him credits on "Theatre Guild," "Mr. District Attorney" and "This Is Your F.B.I."

### Ladies' Man

Socially, he admits to being every bit as much a success as the next fellow. "I get just as many comelither smiles from all weight divisions of the fair sex," he says with a twist of the moustache, "and my advice to women is to forget dieting and concentrate on developing personality instead." # Planning For the Future

**A**BOUT the same time the Los Angeles Rams were first covered by the cameras and the USC-UCLA boys began working out daily in preparation for their second season of being televised, we ran into Tom Hanlon. Tom, in his fourteenth year with CBS, is as well known among sports fans for his radio color coverage of the Rams' games for Rexall as he is among record lovers for his "Merry-Go-Round," a record-contest session for night owls.

Tom's explanation of why *he*, an old hand, isn't in television is simple. "No one asked me," he grins.

Subsequent conversation brought up a serious doubt that Mr. Hanlon could have been persuaded a way from any of his current assignments. In the first place, Tom serves as Night Operations Supervisor for Columbia, and that chews up the time from five o'clock in the evening to one o'clock each morning, five days each week. On Friday nights Tom does the commercials for "Escape," commercials paid for by Richfield of New York and consequently heard only in the East. Each of the five nights he gets up his own show called Altes Beer Scoreboard. All decisions, scores and times from the day's major sporting events are broadcast by Hanlon at this time. From 11:15 until 12:00 Tom conducts his popular "Merry-Go-Round," which improves its own rating a notch or two each season. At midnight, properly heedful of the witching hour, Tom goes onto the Steve Allen show. He also does the radio color, or analysis, on the Rams' football games for Rexall, and on his days off goes out to Gilmore Stadium or Carrell Speedway to cover the midgets and hot rods, respectively.

## Radio vs. TV?

Hanlon's job on the Los Angeles Rams' broadcasts is to keep set-

siders informed of what's behind the plan. Sportscaster Bill Welsh can tell people about the incomplete pass, or the fact that a play was good for a first down, but it is Hanlon who explains that one man is pulled out and another sent in with specific instructions for a play built around Glenn Davis, who turned out to be so fast that he tripped on his own interference and it wasn't the fault of the new man sent into the game at all! Information like this is pretty valuable to the eager listener.

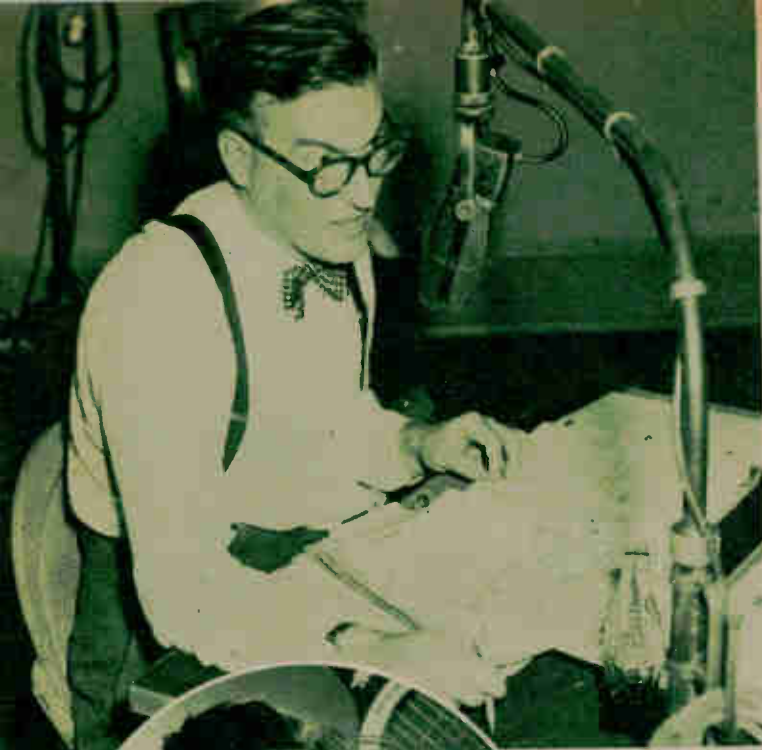
Asked about the advantage of television coverage over radio's, Hanlon is pretty noncommittal. He will sound off both vehemently and at length on the mistakes the promoters, who hope to have television and still retain the big gate, are making. "No effort whatsoever is made to

keep the attendance at an event comfortable. Driving in a crowd is hard; usually there are no parking facilities, or else you are charged a fortune to park; the concessions don't sell particularly good things, and the seats were made for midgets. The only place and event that has handled a crowd right is the Indianapolis Speedway, and look at the crowd which turns out to that classic every year."

Tom points out that, conversely, television coverage leaves out a lot the attendance enjoys. "That is the fault of the announcer and the color man. They make no attempt to play to the audience, either here or at home. The announcer could very well lead the cameramen into these things if they haven't the ingenuity or ini-

**B**ECAUSE HE wears amazing bow-ties, weirdly designed sports clothes and horn-rimmed glasses, and seems to have a lot of fun just acting human, Dave Garroway has been called an eccentric. At least that's how Chicago claims their bright young NBComic who weekly becomes "At Large" in viewing homes the country over.

A puckish sort of personality, Dave has both bewildered and delighted people since 1946 when his "11:06" radio show burst upon the startled ears of Chicagoans with urbane comments on nuclear fission, the artifices of women, Senator Bilbo and the art of listening to other people's conversations in telephone booths

... to name just a few of the subtly treated subjects that are now recognized as part of Garroway's general patter.

#### Confusion

What confused listeners above everything else was the way Dave had, and still has, of treating his listeners like people who were just about as intelligent as he was. After a year of orientating themselves to the Garroway humor, dialers set up a hue and cry about the phenome-

nal disc jockey who used to sell piston rings but admittedly did such a poor job of selling that he had to enter Harvard Business College to improve his abilities.

The course undoubtedly helped, for Dave forgot the piston rings to write a book called "You Don't Say," a column that listed the 800 most frequently mispronounced words. Instead of pounding doors, Garroway made his pitch to school teachers,

telling them that if they could pronounce fifteen of the words correctly, they could have the book for free. He never had to give a book away.

### Former Page

All this was before Dave became a page boy at Radio City in New York, advanced to a guide, then guide trainer and finally on to announcer's school. Here they told him to go home. But Dave believed in himself, even after his first audition in which he finished twenty-third out of a class of twenty-four. (He often worries about what happened to the other lost soul.)

### Good for KDKA

KDKA in Pittsburgh, however, had other ideas about Garroway, for they hired him as a special-events announcer. It was on KDKA that he became the only sports announcer to cover a golf tourney in which he himself competed . . . and won. His golf, by the way, is quite good, for Dave won his first two round matches in the United States Amateur Golf Tournament when he was fifteen, pulled down several city championships and just missed taking the Pennsylvania Amateur tournament in 1940.

After Navy duty during World War II (he was stationed in Honolulu), Dave again descended upon Chicago and from his local "11:06" clam-bake began a network radio show in 1947.

When NBC-TV decided to screen a TV variety show from Chicago, Dave seemed to be the logical candidate for a starring role. It has never been known exactly what NBC-TV had in mind for the show, for it became another showcase for Garroway's inimitable talents . . . reason why it is simply titled "Garroway at Large."

### Acts Himself

Dave in person is as natural as he is on the screen. Chicagoans say he talks the same, acts the same and thinks the same. A common sight around "The Loop" is Dave driving his 1930 Rolls Royce which he bought for \$200 and, remembering all about piston rings, rebuilt himself at a cost of \$1,100.

Much has been said about Garroway's sly wit—a colleague named Fred Allen is responsible for the quote "Garroway's the most refreshing personality uncovered by the new medium," and columnist Winchell has described Dave's stint as "The first with a professional flavor . . . big-time all the way" . . . but perhaps the most accurate account of all comes from the droll comic himself, who claims quite humbly, "Actually, I don't try to be funny . . . just interesting."

tative to see diverting spectacles themselves."

Pressed to admit that the rivalry between radio announcers and analysts and their counterparts in television does exist, Tom grins, "Certainly. It is intense. There has never been a substitute for the dollar."

Hanlon's real love is the speedway, and whether it be Indianapolis or Los Angeles' own Carrell, he's on hand whenever the midgets, stock cars or hot rods flash around thrilling attendees.

And it is during his radio coverage of these that Hanlon experiments for future television. He handles the mike chore as though every one of the 7,000 fans there were an individual audience to be entertained. Hanlon is a firm exponent of the premise that audiences should be entertained as much as possible so that they will remain audiences.

Happy as he would be to have television move in to cover the flashing cars, Tom expresses a worry. "If I ever do go into television," he admits not without a lot of pride, "I'll have to take Tom, Jr., along. That boy (the fourteen-year-old Tom told us about seems more to be training for the Olympics than for sportscasting, if his more than forty push-ups a night are any indication) has a scoring system all his own, with 'x's' and charts, and doing it fast as light. that is *infallible*. It's those young minds," he moans.

Whether because of, or in spite of, one of his own tests, the Southern California Timing Association (SCTA) made Tom an Associate Member. While he didn't use one of their stock cars or hot rods, Tom did take a Mercury with super high-compression heads out onto the road or river flats the group use, and hit 108.

"But, as the father of three children, that once was enough for me!"

gallery. He was all cooperation, no complaints. When I offered suggestions on poses, he respected my judgment as the cameraman and did as I suggested.

Wynn turned serious for a few minutes during the shooting and talked enthusiastically of his pet project, a better break for the people of retirement age. He is a strong force in the movement to utilize this dormant brain and man power, and of course he is a good example of the cause he champions. Men and women in their sixties should not be forced into idleness, they have at least twenty good years ahead of them, and still have much good to contribute actively to society. Hearing Wynn speak in this vein was a revelation. It was a nice thing to know about a man whom up to then I'd only thought about as a guy who wore funny hats.

As a matter of fact, I had never been a particular fan of Ed Wynn. Probably because I'd never seen him on the stage. Even in television, I don't think he gets completely across. He has a sense of humor that's way inside which you don't catch until you meet him personally.

The thing I remember most is the way, just before I'd click the shutter, I'd hear him titter a little to himself. I guess he was enjoying it too.
