the limelight to the status of a forgotten pauper for whom fellow actors put on "benefits." (This has happened to some of yesteryear's big-timers.)

For Milton Berle, in March of this year, signed a thirty-year contract with NBC-RCA. Berle, born in 1908, is in his early forties. When his contract, which actually amounts to an "annuity," expires, the bearded Berle will be in his early seventies!

Life Insurance

Nor does it seem that Mr. Television will have to break his back to

maintain this contract. At risk of engendering a great unrest in the heart of the daily commuter who looks forward to twenty years more on the same 8:05, we outline the reported details of Milton Berle's "life insurance."

First of all, Berle's actual working years are the first twenty of the thirty. (H-m-mmm-m, a sixty-someyear-old Berle keeping up that pace?)

Those twenty years are divided into five-year periods. The first five years, Berle is committed to work thirty-nine weeks. The second five years, only twenty-five weeks. This work is as a performer, in both cases.

During the next five-year period and the next, Berle need never set foot on a stage. (But we bet he will!) His work, under the contract, would be as a producer-writer-director-production consultant. Each five-year period commits him to only a halfyear's work out of each year.

Easy Street

The last ten years are "Uncle Miltie's" own. He need not bow, when passing, in the direction of the RCA building, nor even pass through NBC's portals. But he will still collect the somewhere-around \$50,000 yearly the celestial contract calls for.

All this in addition to the money Mr. Texaco gives to Mr. Berle each week, and the take from guest ap-

pearances on other shows and at other networks.

Like all true fans, we feel that it couldn't have happened to a better Berle! Milton was first with the most, and rightfully earned his "Mr. Television" moniker.

Carry On

But we can't help wondering what will happen if Mr. Berle wants to go on in the role that won him his "dream deal," as one of the big trade journals called it. At fifty and sixty and seventy, will Milton Berle still be the capering, whooping, whistling singer, comedian and dancer who changed Tuesday night to "Berle night" in millions of American homes?

Our accompanying pictures show what we think *could* happen if "Uncle Miltie" sticks by the spotlight to the last day of his unheard-of thirty-year contract.

Another improbable occurs. Just "what if" a great game of taxes and wages were to go on in America during the next thirty years. The commuter of the 8:05 is still riding, but making a million dollars a year so he can live after paying taxes. And poor Berle would be stuck with his thirty-year contract! Of course, being Berle, he would make great television jokes about its tenure. Being Berle, he would also moan aloud ... "I should live so long!"

"Queen for a Day" Model Grew Up on Television

Thursday, 7 p.m. KTSL, Channel 2 Monday thru Friday, 11:30 a.m. KHJ, KGB

UNE LYDEN, one of the pages who poses, plays and performs before the camera, but never steals the show in video's version of "Queen for a Day," has grown up in the still infant television industry. June was fortunate enough to be born neither too early nor too late, for when she started modeling feminine fashions in Los Angeles department stores, television was just opening its arms to young hopefuls who could face camera and win applause. About two years ago June



started modeling nylons for the commercials on "Queen for a Day." As a free-lance performer she also did modeling jobs on other television shows. With her measurements . . . height 5 feet 6 inches, weight 115 pounds, bust 34 inches, waist 24 inches and hips 34 inches . . . this was not difficult for her. June was "born" on television with the birth of the video "Queen for a Day" show. She also appeared as a page in some of the movie scenes of the broadcast and made a public appearance with the airshow at Camp Pendleton. At

Her Mother Helped

She gives her mother a great deal of the credit for starting her off in the direction of modeling, with speech, posture and poise training. Her mother seemed to remember to give each of June's brothers and sisters a push in the direction of show business. Perhaps it is because her mother, who came from Holland at the age of seventeen to this country, has always harbored ideas about the theater, dancing and being an actress.

When June talks about her own first steps into television she can not help but mention her sisters, Roxane, age three, and Marlene, age eleven, and her brother, Robert, who is eight years old. They're all in the same business and are truly babes in a young industry. She is proud of the radio acting, television film performances and movie roles they have had. There have been times when she has given her young brother and sisters pointers on modeling, but she admits that they have more acting roles to their credit than she does. Because June's career has thus far been centered around doing commercials and modeling, her young brother said in surprise after viewing her first speaking part, "Oh, at last they've given you something to say." Much of the conversation around the Lyden dinner table or family circle is about show business, June admits. It seems her father is the only one who is not in it. No, June has never worked in a show with any of the young mem-bers of her family, but she hopes to some day. Whenever June does a stint on the video screen, the little ones of her household come to her

feedbox of a little enterprise called the American Telephone and Telegraph Company (which just celebrated a steenth successful anniversary and its millionth happy stockholder!) on the celebrated—but incomplete—coaxial *cable*. Somewhere in the course of the report the subject in question became a coast-to-coast micro-wave *relay*—but nevertheless, we are happy to quote our friend quoting from AT&T. Now we all know as much as the phone company:

"The transcontinental relay system is being built primarily for telephone service. Initially, the Omaha-San Francisco section will be provided with four channels, two in each dire, ion. One channel in each direction will be used for telephone service. The remaining channel in each direction will be used for protection of telephone service and, subject to this requirement and any requirements brought on by the national emergency, would be available for TV service. The construction of the new system has not advanced sufficiently to enable us to determine with any degree of certainty when it can be placed in service for TV. Until we know more specifically when and to what extent these facilities will be available for TV, and know the over-all requirements for TV service on this route, we shall be unable to act upon requests of network broadcasters. It is expected (and here our friend used capital letters, EXPECTED) that the Omaha-San Francisco section may be available for TV use by late 1951..."

KFI-TV Sold

When KFITV, Channel 9, went on the block a week or more ago, to be snatched up by General Tire and Rubber Company, the purchase portended far more than the sale of a television channel and its facilities.

It means for one thing that General Tire, which owns the Yankee Network (radio), which in turn owns a healthy part of the Mutual network, is now in a fine position to establish yet another television network. It could immediately set up a net with outlets in four major markets, and from far smaller, acorns than this have mighty oaks grown and grown. Yankee owns WNAC-TV in Boston. Mutual owns WOR.TV, in New York, and WGN, a fellow stockholder in Mutual, owns WGN-TV, in Chicago. Linking these four, the owners could establish that fifth network which would immediately be competition for NBC-TV, CBS-TV, the new United Paramount-ABC, and DuMont. Members of the Gimbel family, of departy ment-store fame, are also Mutual shareholders, and have an application pending for a Philadelphia station. It, too, would probably tie in with the General Tire wcb.

"Is that bad?" is the logical question. It would prove an aggravation only because the four existent networks are already chopping at one another to get more and more time on the network facilities which exist. Many areas contain but a single station, and the coaxial cable is constructed to carry only so many shows in each direction. With everyone scrambling for time, those station owners could pick and choose and would find themselves far greater bargaining power.

Earle C. Anthony's reasons for getting out of TV, aside from the money consideration (Channel 9 has been said to be in the red to the tune of \$40,000 monthly from the station's inception two years ago) have not been given Rumor has it that Anthony's resentment toward unior had something to do with the sale. While Anthony does pay the union scale to his performers, Television Au, thority was still striking his Channel 9 station so Anthony would sign an AFRA contract.

The television station sold for \$2,500,000, and a change of ownership will be effected immediately upon FCC approval. It is also locally hinted that radio outlet KFI may go on the block, with NBC picking up the station which has served as its local outlet for many years.

in democratic government combined with fine entertainment. Show is a thirty-minute stanza, appearing but once a month. Joe Micciche, radio and TV coordinator for Los Angeles County, emcees. Frank Allen Hubbell, noted composer and conductor, conducts the sixteen-piece Los Angeles County orchestra on the show.

The program is set up to tell viewers about the county in which they live—about its government and problems —including freeway, school, smog and other problems. It will depict 101 years of progress in the county government, utilizing still photos from 1850 through 1951. For the first time in our history, every branch of county government will be brought together to put the program on the air. The County Art Institute will do the art work; props will come from the Mechanical Department; photos and motion-picture films from the Flood Control. and Air Pollution Control departments, writing from the county clerks, etc.

The opening show featured Roger W. Jessup, chairman of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors; John teGroen, president of the Professional Musicians' Association of Los Angeles; soloist Elizabeth Waldo, noted violinist; the Gabriel Ruiz California Dancers—all in native costume. Also on view was a special film on smog, featuring the story of how industry is trying to solve its problem.

All of us in range of KTLA's beam (within reason, of course) should by the mere fact of geography be mighty interested in Los Angeles County and what goes on therein for our good. This monthly hour is as fine a way as we can find to dig into the wheels behind scenes. It literally does combine information with entertainment. Seems we once heard someone drop the remark that this is what television is so ideally designed for: information plus entertainment.

"Range Rider"

One of the principal reasons we first watched Jack Mahoney in one of his "Range Rider" series was that we heard he works in moccasins. We kept on watching because both the tall athlete and the stories in which he appears are unlike many of the booted, spurred and cautious crew who have formerly appeared on TV. Jack fights all files on the TV films in which he stars.

The former Marine pilot from World War II had been in Hollywood for a few years, doubling for motion-picture stars in epics calling for plenty of action, leaps, falls and other dangerous moments. Of course when you are six feet, four inches tall, a recognized athlete of long standing and a crack rider, this isn't quite as hazardous work as it might have seemed to some of the stars for whom Jack engaged in fisticuffs and fell off cliffs.

Nor does Mahoney have a special suit of clothes which identifies him whenever the screen lights up. He keeps to plain frontiersman-type shirts and jackets and rides a plain brown horse. In his "Range Rider" adventures he is always accompanied, hampered (many and many a Thursday night we have groaned and wondered just why the scripters find it necessary to make him quite that stupid!) and abetted by "Dick West, All-American Boy," played by Dick Jones, a twenty-three-year-old Hollywood 'discovery.

In any mention of this exciting film series, we must credit fully directors Armand Schaefer and Lou Grey, and the cameramen who pick up superlative shots of the countryside. The series is made even better by intelligent filming—always a treat.

The Jerry Colonna Show

If Jerry Colonna weren't possessed of a distinctive howl, a pair of rolling eyes and a drooping, luxuriant mustache, all of which in themselves are chuckle-provoking, his initial show, at least, would have come off no better than a trip through an empty airplane hangar. By that we mean there were only occasional glimpses of the interest-ing, tucked in corners here and there.

The first two shows we have seen began with whim-sical make-believes: Colonna as a roving reporter; as the pilot of a to-the-moon rocket; or as a commentator, TV-set repairman or inventor; funny bits we thought should have gone on longer have gone on longer.

Few people realize, unless they have attended a local jazz concert and seen Colonna hitting it up with the best of ' / "cats," that long before he was identified as a co-iedian Jerry played with Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw, -Paul Whiteman, Bunny Berigan, Tommy and Jimmy Dor-sey and Gus Haenschen. His vocal caricatures of "Road to Mandalay," etc., have concealed the fact that he is ac-tually an accomplished singer and a composer.

tually an accomplished singer and a composer.

It was his antics and sense of the ridiculous which drew him from the music world onto the radio shows of Fred Allen, into movies, and finally into partnership with Bob Hope on the latter's radio show.

The actual presentation of Colonna in a TV show was well done. Stuart Phelps directed, Joe Bigelow, who knows comedy backward and forward, produced, and Cookie Fairchild and his boys provided the music. All good ingredients of what must be a fine TV comedy show when the blending is finished and the right proportions reached. Right now we think the batter needs a liberal helping of a fine ingredient called "Colonna." It should stand out, not be subordinated to other "stuff."

The Mario Lanza Show

Sunday, 5:00 p.m. CBS-KNX

Delightful listening, summer, winter or any time at all, is the wondrously toned voice of Mario Lanza. In the case of his new series, he's putting a much needed spark in hot-weather radio-ing and also taking the quickest possible road to personal air-type fame.

Only one thing about Lanza's performance leaves us dubious—as golden as his tenor tones seem, can he retain the breathtaking pace with which he takes and sus-tains the high notes?—even to a relatively untrained ear, he seems to be straining at the bit on some selec-tions, like a few notes in last Sunday's vocalizing of "Granada" "Granada."

Maybe we're skeptical about a miraculous talent because it's just that—too good to be true—but eighteen or so weeks hence, we'll be more able to tell.

Music encompassed a pleasingly varied range and struck an even balance between classical favorites like Toselli's "Serenade" and Lanza's own current "Be My Love." The latter was definitely smart showcasing for Lanza as both a full ballad and opening show theme, as were introductory commentaries on other songs which pointed up Lanza's current "Caruso" picture. Luckily such commercial sidelights added to rather than detracted from Lanza's billing.

First of Lanza's guests was "Club 15" vocalite Gisele MacKenzie, who sustained the show's "pop" note with sprightly chirped ballads. The whole was excellently backed by Ray Sinatra's orchestra, which also managed a couple of highly effective instrumental numbers.

Diversity, well-paced commercials, good backing and the Lanza voice indeed spell an excellent half hour that we won't miss during our coming summer Sundays.

Saturday coverage of the week's news is well worth making a regular listening post.

He was born Georges Gaston Fischer on September 21, 1914, in Shanghai, China, of a French mother and an Austrian father, but became an Italian subject shortly after the first World War, when his father, legal advisor to the Italian Consulate in Shanghai, was made an Italian citizen by royal decree.

During his childhood, Fischer traveled extensively in China and Japan with his parents, until 1927 when his mother took him to Europe to continue his studies. They crossed Siberia and Russia by the old Trans Siberian rail-way and in fourteen days arrived in Moscow.

Fischer attended school in Paris, then went to Switzer-land for four years of study and finally entered Oxford University as a student in law. He graduated in 1935 and was called to the bar at Middle Temple, London, in 1936.

In 1935 he visited the United States for the second time (the first was in 1922 with his mother).

With his father he spent several weeks in Los Angeles, where the American Bar Association was holding its 1935 convention and the elder Fischer had been invited to lecture on Chinese law.

Back in London and admitted to the bar, Fischer had practiced for only a few months when he was called to Italy for military service. He was discharged a second lieutenant in 1938 and re-turned to Paris, where he entered famed Sorbonne University.

Fischer had planned to join his father's law firm in Shanghai, but his' father advised against it, in view of Japanese aggressions.

So he came to the United States, entered the University 'of Missouri's school of journalism and got a degree.

In the spring of 1940, he joined United Press in New York City, where he served as assistant Latin-American editor on the war desk, handling the China-Burma-India dispatches. He joined CBS in New York in 1944, writing master scripts for the foreign department which shortwaved the news to Europe and Latin America in coopera-tion with the U.S. State Department. In 1945 he became a naturalized American citizen; in 1947 he joined the CBS news staff in Hollywood.

Fischer speaks French, Italian, German and English fluently, has a reading knowledge of Spanish. The Chinese and Japanese he knew as a child, he has forgotten, he says.

gotten, he says. Fischer acquired not only another degree at the Univer-sity of Missouri, but a wife as well. He married Anne Sonin, a Kansas City, Missouri, girl and a fellow student at the University in August, 1939. They have three daugh-ters—Mary, seven, Lucie, four, and Gige, sixteen months old. "Gige," he explains, is a contraction of Georgeanne, who was named for her father and mother in that order. His three daughters, according to Fischer, would make His three daughters, according to Fischer, would make him a lesser man than his father, in the eyes of the Chinese. He recalls the Chinese used to say of his father: "Dr. Fischer very clever man, has only sons."

Dr. Fischer did have three sons and their present whereabouts and activities are completely in keeping with this cosmopolitan family. Raoul Fischer is an engineer in Shanghai, and the family has managed to keep in touch with him despite the Communist conquest. The other brother, Dr. Edmond Fischer, is associate professor of bacteriology at the University of Geneva.

About the Gaston-as Georges Gaston Fischer he came to Hollywood, but already established here was movie commentator George Fisher. To avoid the confusion, Fischer dropped the Georges and became Gaston.

favorite to other set-siders. This might easily be the case with the musical airshow presented in such a consistently pleasant manner by "The Choraliers" and the Wittnauer 'Symphonette.'

Host Frank Knight does more than introduce each song by name. He precedes the music with an imaginative, often nostalgic narration part poetry . . . as an invi-tation to the listener to lend an ear to some choral arrangements. Each selection is a melodious blending of male and female voices, in which many of the vocalists' performances are a notch or two above the average mas-culine or feminine crooner's. Besides the outstanding vocal treatment, each musical offering of "The Chora-liers" shows the touch of a music master who cares about his artistry.

A recent airing of this broadcast included a rendition of "I'm Falling in Love," "Trees" and "Valencia." Music by this well integrated group presents old favorites in a new way, but without resorting to a shocking treatment merely for the sake of being different. Few evenings with this radio show could possibly prove unsatisfying to the listener, as the selections are highly diversified and adequately contrasting to satiate almost any musical appetite. Even the commercials are pleasantly easy to take, and by their dignity, diction and intention hold the listener's attention and linger in his memory almost as long as the popular tunes played.

After a half hour of "The Choraliers" there can be little doubt that it is the sort of program which is true to its touting . . . "one that the whole family will enjoy."

"Lux" Soundman

If they were handing out awards for radio's noisiest man, Charles Forsyth, exclusive soundman for CBS's "Lux Radio Theatre," would be nosing out many other candidates. He is celebrating his fifteenth anniversary with the show. During the decade and a half that he has held forth in the sound booth high above the Vine Street Playhouse stage, he has created some 75,000 effects for the popular air drama.

When "Lux" goes off for the summer months, Forsyth takes himself on a "busman's holiday." In a sound truck equipped with 300 feet of cable, four microphones, re-cording apparatus, a camera and a heavy fishing pole which he uses to reel in the mike from the end of the cable, he takes rugged expeditions in search of new and authentic sounds. Among the most exciting noises he can re-create are the rattle of a striking snake and the buzz of attacking bees.

As a child, Forsyth started out with musical aspira-tions, and at one time formed his own dance orchestra, but loved to tinker with noise-making devices too much to give it up. Today he has a sound effects library which is valued at an estimated \$25,000.

When people have vacation and time to relax, they'll listen to the radio—if not at home, then in the car and with their portables on the beaches. HE SIXTY-GIRL Hormel caravan gave Hollywood, a city renowned for its good talent, a glimpse of

one of the most unique entertainment units in the business on its recent Southland visit.

It is the only group of its kind in the nation — one which travels from coast to coast, presenting two network radio programs and at least two stage shows a week; and one whose every member is a crack saleswoman!

This artistic and practical-minded venture began in 1947, when Jay C. Hormel organized a drum and bugle corps, composed of twelve ex-service girls, for the "Spam" post of the Austin, Minnesota, American Legion, and as a merchandising unit for Hormel foods. From this nucleus grew today's popular radio and stage unit.

Traveling in a car caravan of thirty-three white autos and five trucks carrying instruments, music and a portable radio control booth with all the equipment necessary to broadcast and stage their shows, the girls lead an action-packed existence. Frequent "breaks," with pay, allay the high-speed working times. Ten days off every two months, with a

liberal travel allowance to take them home, keep the girls enthusiastic over their work.

All are over twenty-one . . . spend much of their time sightseeing and are generally camera-"happy." The group's cameras range from brownies to eight- and sixteen-millimeter movie-takers. Many of the lovely girls can sing as well as dance and play instruments. Their versatility is an amazing thing to watch, as show producer Bill Conner, who's been with the troupe for three years, still attests.

"A truck accidentally ran over her cello, so one of the girls left the orchestra for the dance corps," he recalls. When they are on the road, the girls' schedule is as strenuous as it is varied. In teams of two, they visit stores as public-relations representatives for their sponsor. Returning to headquarters, they prepare the evening's or next day's programs, which are usually staged in American Legion halls, theaters, radio stations, or (increasingly) at service camps.

Personnel manager Nancy Bollinger receives hundreds of requestapplications each month from girls who want to join the talented travelers. She schedules on-the-air auditions for promising applicants whenever the troupe visits in or near their home towns. "Marriage causes most of our 'casualties,'" she explains. Monday through Saturday, 6:00 a.m. KFVD

DDIE RODRIGUEZ claims he's the most fortunate man in town, and upon investigation, we learned that he is a most deserving fellow. Eddie is emcee of KFVD's "Buenos Dias" program, combining disc-jockeying, public-service announcements and commercials. The program is bilingual and appeals to listeners both young and old. Eddie has been nicknamed "The Mexican Arthur Godfrey" by his many fans. His radio delivery is friendly, informal, ad-lib and sincere. In addition to spinning top Mexican tunes, he concentrates on public-service features.

His files are bulging with letters of appreciation and gratitude from various civic groups such as the Red Cross, Community Chest, and X-ray Foundation. Broadcasting to the Latin population (Los Angeles is the second largest Mexican community in the world) has resulted in better understanding and cooperation. In the recent Los Angeles County X-Ray Drive, the response from the Mexican group reached unprecedented numbers. Because of his efforts the Spanish-speaking citizens of Los Angeles have been helped to acquire a feeling of "belonging," and have responded to this cloak of recognition. Enthusiasm and humility are

Enthusiasm and humility are Eddie Rodriguez' two outstanding

characteristics. Despite his busy routine he has a methodical sense of organization with a typical mañana flavor. Eddie left his native Mexico at a pre-school age and settled with his family in "El Pueblo de Nuestra Señora, La Reina de Los Angeles de Porciuncula," otherwise known as Los Angeles.

"There was nothing unusual about my childhood; I just grew like Topsy," volunteered Eddie. "I assimilated American customs and cultures along with my Mexican heritage as I grew. I barely finished high school when old devil finances compelled me to affix a social-security number after my name." Laughingly he recalled, "After several odd and sundry jobs, I found my services engaged for various civic celebrations whenever the knowledge of Spanish and English was required.

"My experience with a microphone and public-address system gradually led to a rounded apprenticeship at KPMO, Pomona. Pomona was excellent training for the early-morning farmer's hour at which my KFVD program is broadcast."

Upon request, Eddie listed Mexico's "pop" favorites. Mexico, with its gay music, has popularity polls comparable to ours. Heading the list are Maria Victoria, blues singer; Pedro Vargas, Mexico's Bing Crosby; Pedro Infante, hillbilly or ranchero singer; Los Panchos Trio (compares to our King Cole Trio); Ruben Reyes, the local Sinatra, and Lalo Guerrero, vocalist of novelty tunes. (His Mexican versions of "The Thing" and "Mule Train" have reached phenomenal sales.)

Supplementing his radio activities, Eddie Rodriguez is a contributing editor to various Spanish-language magazines and newspapers. And whenever there's a huge promotion campaign afoot which is directed to the Mexican group, you'll usually find Eddie right in the midst of all the promoting.

Eddie also provides the bilingual commercials and introduces the films on KFI-TV's "Spanish Film Hour," which screens the best of Mexican films. Spanish commercials run longer than their English counterparts. Just for fun, try saying "blonde oak" in Spanish and discover how many more words are employed.

Señor Rodriguez has little spare time for a hobby or diversion. His family of four occupy whatever free time is available.

OME MONTHS ago, Bill Gwinn and his partner, Jesse Martin, started a half-hour show on the ABC-TV network. It was then called "It Could Happen to You." The new title is merely The Bill Gwinn Show.

Fate in Song Form

Premise of the show finds a reactivated candid eye catching mo-ments of personal song history. Couples from all parts of the country are invited to visit the program and relive the circumstances surrounding a song which materially changed the course of their lives. Triumph of the moment arrives when the audience chooses a grand-prize winner of the day, awarding that couple everything in a carload of prizes from vacation to luggage.

On one occasion, a hotel room, a violin and the song "I Don't Stand a Ghost of a Chance With You" took the spotlight. "Cotton - Eyed Joe" changed another couple's life radically, but not the way planned. Still another scene was laid in New York's Chinatown in a restaurant, where the song "Together" and good food found themselves mixed.

Jack of All Arts

Singer, student, head of a collegeformed band bound on a world cruise, college professor, writer and finally television headliner have been Bill's roles. He is now a mem-ber of the Laguna Beach fire department, complete with helmet and red suspenders. Songs played a huge part.

No one song changed Bill's life. It has been almost all song of one sort and another.

His career began to the tune of the cable cars, for Bill was born and raised in San Francisco (to this day he praises that city to the skies), where he applied his vocal talents early in the role of extra with the June 22, 1951

San Francisco Opera Company chorus.

Prior to attending Stanford University in Palo Alto, Bill went to a private school, exaggerating the reason with "I went there when I found I couldn't get out of a public school." Later, when an opening occurred in Hollywood, Bill was immediately drafted to lead the fun on a popular show, "What's the Name of That Song?" Most apropos. This half hour turned into a simulcast, and Bill was established for TV.

It was at Stanford, while studying in the English Department, that Gwinn met and won Dorthea White. Lohengrin was the music of this joining. Bill Junior, ten, and Michael, eight, with their mother, form the trio who join Bill in his leisure hours of song or sport, at their lovely Emerald Bay beach home.

All the Gwinn family are avid record collectors.

mentator; Clete Roberts, KFWB and KLAC-TV newsman; James McNamara, KLAC-TV news director; Chet Huntley, ABC radio newsman; Larry Thor, free-lance artist and formerly of CBS; and George Martin, Jr., KTTV news commentator, have culled the daily newspaper reports. Each week the guesting key newscasters vary, as do the divergent opinions held by these men.

Unique Program

This broadcast of "News Is Our Business" is unique because KFWB gives to each radio commentator appearing on the program the right to be identified by his own radio **IT APPEARS THAT** three roving reporters, Dave Anderson of NBC-KNBH, Bob Garred of ABC, and Chet Huntley of ABC, are vying with one another for the floor.

station or network. Another novel feature of this air newspaper program is that all the proceeds from the broadcast are turned over to the Radio News Club. The objective of the Radio News Club itself, which quite naturally lends impetus to the work of the guests, is "to help elevate professional radio news standards in the broadcasting industry." This club is purely a professional group. Among its five presidents have been Chet Huntley, Clete Roberts, James McNamara, Al Gordon and David Anderson.

At the close of each broadcast the last few minutes are devoted to predictions and a backward glance at what the previous week's panel did with its predictions. Also, from time to time key national figures are "grilled" by the newsmen. One Friday night Larry Thor predicted that the Allied troops would once again cross the 38th Parallel in Korea and at another time Spud Corliss, formerly of ABC and now with the Los Angeles Times, went out on a limb to say that crime-curbing legislation would soon follow the Kefauver senatorial crime investigation.

News Analysis

News director Al Gordon gives the radio men free rein to discuss any subject worthy of news coverage, and appoints a moderator for each mike meeting. The entire format and flavor of the program is pointed toward news analysis, rather than straight reporting. A roster of the radio voices which have appeared on "News Is Our Business' would be proof enough that all the guests are well qualified to digest news in an authoritative manner for a wide listening audience.

"News Is Our Business" offers radio's highest ranking newsmen a chance to take a busman's holiday, and that is exactly what they do when they get together with opposing opinions which are given and taken in a spirited but amiable fashion. It gives club members a chance to toss the news around, and perhaps in some instances fight it out, but in the process they lay the week's news on the table for the benefit of their club as well as radio listeners.

Men of Music - Kudy Jehrager

WDY SCHRAGER, musical director for "Lux Radio Theater," graciously invited us into his music library for a chat. This man of music, white-haired and smiling, was completely charming and we talked endlessly about his favorite subject --music and more music. Be it jazz, symphonic, musical comedy or opera, he loves them all.

Rudy has been associated with "Lux Theater" for fourteen years, serving until last season as assistant to Lou Silvers. Rudy received Silvers' baton when the latter resigned. The resignation and promotion were an unexpected surprise, but Rudy was well equipped to handle his new chores, for in addition to his radio work he has scored music for many motion pictures. Some of them are Charlie Chaplin's "M. Verdoux," "Sleep My Love," and Disney's "Treasure Island."

Musical scoring for a dramatic show has its own peculiar problems, as you probably realize. Rudy reads the script each week and minutely studies the plot and tempo of the story. For an allotted air sequence of perhaps four or five seconds he must compose appropriate mood music so that the listener can visualize the scene. The music is so well coordinated with the script that many listeners may not realize the importance of the scoring. But the music is an integral part of the script; just try listening to an hour-long dramatization without a musical background! We venture you would find it a long sixty minutes.

Other "Musts"

The direction of the music must be flexible. If an actor reads his part too slowly or too rapidly, Rudy must make the necessary adjustments in the orchestra's timing to June 22, 1951

avoid any embarrassment or disruption of continuity. His musicians have keen powers of concentration and are capable of split-second change in playing a bar of music or even one note.

Born in New York City on August 28, 1908, Rudy inherited his musical inclinations from his father, who was a singer. Papa Schrager started his offspring on his musical career at an early age. Rudy was proficient at the piano and pipe organ before he completed grammar school. His formal music education in cluded study at New York University, the Juilliard School of Music and the University of Southern California. During vaudeville's heyday he was an organist, later a pianist and finally an orchestra leader for the Loew's and B. F. Keith vaudeville circuits.

He is married and has one daugh-

ter, Susan, who is eight years old. He and his wife, Dorothy, a former floral designer, live in West Los Angeles.

One of the most distressing situations Rudy Schrager has experienced as musical director for "Lux Theater" was a last-minute switch of scripts when music clearance was not granted on a musical-comedy story. At the eleventh hour a new script was substituted and while the cast were feverishly learning their new lines, Rudy, at wits' end, composed a complete new score for the revised program.

"After such rare occasions as this," sighed Rudy, "I take off to some secluded spot for deep-sea fishing, where the only timing I have to contend with is that of pulling in my line when I feel a nibble at the other end."
