DESILU: A Dream Come True

ED-HEADED LUCILLE BALL and Desi "The Tempo" Arnaz became husband and wife eleven years ago, but just got married again October 15..., this time on television. When they stepped into the husband-wife roles of the "Ricardos" in "I Love Lucy." KTTV, Monday 9:00 a.m., they formed more than a comic TV team. They started the cameras rolling to keep pace with video's rapid rise in becoming show business's most enterprising industry.

Like a Play

Many weeks before you started viewing the antics of the "I Love Lucy" household, Desi and Lucille formed a TV-film production com-pany known as Desilu Productions, Inc. It was this same organization that was responsible for the recent successful personal-appearance tour of the famous redhead and her Latin orchestra-leader husband. Ho mey sets, especially suitable for the "Ricardos," were reconverted from one of the motion-picture sound stages at the General Service lot at 6633 Romaine Street.

A unique theater to be known as the Desilu Playhouse was built, bleachers with soft-cushioned seats to take care of 300 people were made ready for live telecasting with an audience. They decided to film "I Love Lucy" not as a movie, but as a play that would go on uninter-rupted from the time it starts until the time it finishes. Why like a play? A unique theater to be known as play?

Desi Explained It

Desi explained it this way. "Be-cause we want an audience to be present and the audience not to be bored by the process of making many takes, like they do in the movies. The people at home like to feel that they are a part of an audience that is reacting, whether they are laughing or applauding, and an audience dictates to an actor what to do ... it helps our timing immensely. It's more fun for the people in the bleachers and for us on stage, too." Those bleachers, by the way, are not uncomfortable at all, and are constructed at a higher level than usual to afford the audience a full November 30, 1951

view of the stage without obstruction by huge TV cameras. The set was made realistic with real furniture, actual plumbing and plants that are really growing.

It Was a Natural

It Was a Natural There was no doubt about choos-ing the "I Love Lucy" script for Desi and Lucille. It was a natural. It's all about a girl named "Lucy" and a guy named "Ricky." She keeps the household going, while he is busy with his band playing at a night club. Desi said, "It was enough like us to be interesting, and dif-ferent enough so we would remem-ber when we were acting and when we were living private lives." we were living private lives.'

Another regular couple on the se-ries is "Mr. and Mrs. Mertz," the

landlords, played by William Frawlandlords, played by William Fraw-ley, outstanding movie actor, and Vivian Vance, actress featured in the recent movie "The Blue Veil." Jess Oppenheimer, producer and writer of Lucille's air show, "My Favorite Husband," holds the reins for the telecast, with writers Bob Carroll and Madelyn Pugh assisting. Marc Daniels, a fine Broadway di-rector, directs, while Karl Freund, one of Hollywood's ace cinematog-raphers, is in charge of the cameras.

Long Rehearsals

It takes all-day rehearsals, six times a week, to get a half-hour TV show ready for the viewers at home. This sort of schedule allows little free time for this famous couple, (Please Turn to Page 34)

ed halfback whizzed by us, gritting his teeth and propelling his legs like a speeding locomotive. After a long downfield run, his outstretched arms failed to grab a long Waterfield pass.

Trotting back to the huddle, the frustrated receiver took a lot of heckling.

"You should have had that one in your hip pocket."

In a mild yet very serious tone, even Head Coach Joe Stydahar had a few words to say: "When you halfbacks and ends go out for passes, I want you to dig hard all the way. If you slow up here in practice, you'll slow up in the game."

When the Bob Waterfield and Norm Van Brocklin passes started to click (as ninety per cent of them did), the players clapped their hands and yelled out victory whoops as if they had just scored a game-winning touchdown. And none of this enthusiasm was put on for show purposes.

At the Game

HEY PLAY like a bunch of high-school kids!" That was the very first impression we had when we recently took in a morning practice session of the Los Angeles Rams at Gilmore Field.

Before you fervid Ram rooters get all riled up, allow us to explain. We were not referring to the actual caliber of play (how ridiculous can you get!) but rather to the pep and enthusiasm exhibited by the gridders.

Although daily workouts are necessary to keep a team in top shape, one would think that the boys would take it easy on these days, especially in the professional ranks.

At Practice

But not these Rams. Out in the center-field portion of the barren Hollywood ball park they were running, and running hard, through some passing plays.

In motion to the left, a fleet-foot-







atop the L. A. Coliseum, and along with 70,000 screaming fans we saw for ourselves how this hustle paid off.

The rampaging Rams were redhot. Van Brocklin, who led the entire league in passing last year, and Waterfield, star quarterback for the past six seasons, were hitting the breadbaskets of Davis, Hirsch, Fears, and company with an amazing degree of accuracy.

Originally granted a Cleveland franchise by the National League on February 13, 1937, thing were rough for the Rams during the first few years.

Finally in 1945, led by the league's most valuable player, Rookie Bob Waterfield, they won the world's championship.

That was a great victory for the Rams. However, the next year an even greater victory followed—at least as far as Los Angeles grid fans were concerned. President Daniel F. Reeves moved the club to Los Angeles. **ELROY "CRAZY LEGS" HIRSCH** starred for Wisconsin and Michigan during his college career, was All-American in 1942-43, and played with the Chicago Rockets before signing with the Rams in 1949.

Once again it took a while to get started. In 1949, the new club won its first division championship and repeated again last year. Both times, however, hopes for a world title were spoiled.

The Philadelphia Eagles beat them 14-0, in 1949, and in 1950 the Cleveland Browns came from behind in the last twenty seconds to win, 30-28.

But the Rams are a young and cocky bunch, with Waterfield and Guard Jack Finlay being the only ones over thirty years of age.

Sooner or later, these youngsters are going to get their horns on that title. If you don't believe us, just ask any of their thousands of loyal L. A. fans. Better yet, ask the players themselves.

Owens summer home nine miles outside of Waikiki (father Owens calls it "way out in the country") made a discovery on which his father can capitalize.

The eleven-year-old, with the agility and daring of a half-grown cat, had scaled a mountainside and discovered an opening. The door to one of the Hawaiians' ancient burial grounds had been shaken away by an earthquake or a volcano. Butch's shouts brought his father, camera in hand, scrambling up the hillside.

This discovery and investigation led to another legend and probably to another TV show production and song for the historian-maestro.

The talent to perform as authentically as the numbers and legends are written isn't too hard for Owens to procure. Because of his complete familiarity with things Hawaiian,

ARRY OWENS is the top salesman of things Hawaiian. His Royal Hawaiians are known the world over, and have done more than any other band to popularize Island music.

Chronicler

Native music and lore had never been written down until the man who recruited an eleven-piece orchestra from Hawaii, Oahu, Maui and Molokai became known. It had been handed down from one generation to another, losing a bit each time. Owens set himself to the task of perpetuating the enchanting melodies and became, in a sense, the island's musical historian. So far, he has more than 100 Hawaiian folk songs on paper. In addition, he is a celebrated composer in his own right, credited with such hits as "To You Sweetheart, Aloha," "Dancing Under the Stars" and "Palace in Paradise," to name but a few.

This Polynesian specialist uncovers Hawaiian culture in the same way you and I learned the legends and grew to know the people of the towns in which we lived. While most tourists to Island shores loll in the bar of the Royal Hawaiian drinking rum from a coconut shell, the composer of "Sweet Leilani" spends his time driving the back roads of the Islands or visiting his old friend Aikane, the Kuna. The term means "the priest," and this venerable character travels by cattle boat from one island to another to talk with his friend Harry Owens over a bowl of mulberry punch. More than one tale of Aikane's has wound up on Harry's KTLA show in the form of a beautifully choreographied and musically constructed specialty. As have other legends enchanted the nation in the form of pop tune.

Discovery

Owens was first to introduce the authentic Hawaiian steel guitar to American bands. His three-month vacation in the Islands last summer found him bringing back to "the mainland" and to television audiences the second Hawaiian instru-

ment. He discovered the cane pipes during a tour of the Islands with another old friend who serves as a • guide. Timothy McGregory, a native Hawaiian of obvious Scotch ancestry, introduced the maestro to these pipes, played in sets, and made from cane about three and a half inches in diameter. The length of the pieces determines the pitch.

In order to bring this instrument to the United States, it was necessary that Owens, his guide and his eleven-year-old son, Butch, spend a day in travel to the cane growths. The group drove as far as possible by car over the high Island roads. Then, on foot, lugging an electric saw and a box, they made the rest of the way on foot. The lengths necessary, from a four-inch piece for low E to a twelve-inch length running up two octaves to E, were carefully clipped to avoid splits, then packed and returned to the car and Owens's home to await their plane ride to the States.

At their meetings, entertainments and parties Harry hears the best of music, sees the best of entertainment, and meets some of his best friends, all from his beloved Islands. And none are reluctant to appear on their friend's show.

Owens proclaims Hawaiian cooking the finest in the world. His wife, a former Boston girl, now patiently awaits a shipment of ingredients from the Islands so that she can prepare for her husband the "twonights-a-week-Hawaiian" dinners he thinks effect a nice balance in diet. This super-salesman lives his commodity.

And in reverse, the United States couldn't have picked a nicer unofficial ambassador to the people of the Islands than this pleasant musician.

In 1933 large pictures of movie stars, surrounded by wreaths, were used as decorations on Hollywood Boulevard; however, this was discontinued the following year. The parade was held continuously until 1942, when it was canceled because of the war.

Parade festivities were reinstated in 1945 when the present metal Christ-mas trees were built. The initial cost of the new motif was \$135,000. The ghostlike dismantled trees are stored unprotected on Lockheed property when not in use. And the unkindness of the elements necessitates redecoration each fall.

The average cost of this now tradi-tional parade is about \$50,000, and more than four million people have attended the parade since 1945.

"See It Now"

It seems, according to reports, that Channel 2 Mount Wilson engineers got crossed up on instructions and went on the air at the usual 1:00 p.m. instead of the 12:30 p.m. "See It Now" New York relay time set for the telecast.

"See It Now," video successor to CBS Radio's "Hear It Now," which won CBS Radio's "Hear It Now," which won a George Foster Peabody citation last season, projects into the medium of sight and sound the Murrow-Friendly technique of presenting the news through the people who make the news. Persons and events on the front pages during the week will be seen and heard on "See It Now." The pro-gram will be in effect the news mass gram will be, in effect, the news magazine of television.

With Murrow as on-camera editor, the news will be presented through live pickups of events, and with mo-tion pictures specially filmed for "See It Now." The news will include per-sonal interviews, overseas reports, biographical features, human-interest stories, documentary features, and late news breaks.

Latest Color-TV Order

Theater color TV is out for the duration of the current material shortage, according to a government order from the National Production Authority. Not only that, it means no more man-ufacturing of color television sets and color adapters to be used in conjunction with present sets. No color TV appliances can be manufactured for general sale until the materials short-ages are ended, but the making of color television equipment for experi-mental, defense, industrial and certain hospital and educational uses will still be permitted. Experimental work on theater TV and color theater TV can continue. This certainly makes it look like a straight black and white video picture for the time being.

Turned by greed to absconding with fifty by greed to absconding with fifty thousand dollars of the bank's money, the teller was finally found wander-ing about the scenes of his every-day life as he waited for the train that would bear him and the ill-gotten gains away. One night in El Paso, Texas, though, Lee hypnotized his opponent in a regular match. In Tucson, Arizona, following the regular events, he put more than 200 people into an hypnotic trance.

"California Caravan"

For many years the United States, particularly the East-ern seaboard, has been described as "the melting pot of the world.

After 175 years of national independence, we have a new melting pot. California, especially since the gold rush of 1849, has been aptly labeled as "the melting pot of the United States.

Appropriately enough, each Sunday afternoon there is a radio program which delves into the past history of the early California settlers. The radio version, based on 'official records, is dedicated to the circuit courts of Amer-ica and is called "California Caravan."

Last week's story, "Delayed Revenge," was a typical one. 'Sarah Althea Hill'' (Irene Winston), a San Francisco belle, wanted to "get her hooks" into a millionaire bach-elor, one "William Sharon" (Ken Christy).

Playboy "Sharon" had different ideas. Although he had signed something called a "declaration of marriage," he figured he was getting all the benefits of married life without investing the usual two dollars.

"Sarah" was determined, though. First she tried some magical and idiofic tricks recommended by a "Madame Zee-ah-bong" (Irene Tedrow). When the Madame's formula proved unsuccessful, she then used the second-best means—the United States law courts.

For eight years she and her attorney, "David S. Terry." (John Dehner), whom she later married, struggled with the courts.

To make a long story short, "Sarah" finally lost the case. Several years later, September 3, 1888, to be exact, the revengeful "Terry" killed the judge who had handed down the unfavorable decision.

Frustrated and penniless, "Sarah" entered the "Land of Twilight." In layman's language, she went off her bloom-ing rocker and ended up in a California nuthouse.

The basic idea for "California Caravan" is a sound one; the acting is creditable; and the entire production dem-onstrates that writer-director Larry Hays spends a lot of time preparing this half-hour drama.

The "California Caravan" may not enter the "land of Oscars" this year, but if the present pace continues it can at least be assured of rolling along for several more recorded miles .- T.H.

Several days ago, I was talking to one of the assistant coaches at USC. He was plenty burned up about the hammering that sports have been taking the past few months.

"Why do all these guys take off on sports just because a few players make mistakes?



Don't they realize we're having one of the great college football seasons of recent years? Why can't they bring out the good points ---which far over-shadow the bad ones, believe me."

As far as I'm con-

cerned, this coach's points were well taken. Yet, recently sports have received a 41-page slap on the wrist from a judge who prob-ably doesn't know a football from a hubbard squash. At the same time, the NCAA has called emergency meetings with an eye to eliminating the "evil" in college athletics.

One of their first proposals was to wipe out the Bowl games. How ridicu-lous can they get? Ninety-nine per cent of all teams never appear in one of the post-season classics.

To get down to facts, what brought about all of this criticism? Was it the athletes themselves?

Well, first there was the unfortunate basketball scandal, centered chiefly in the New York area. Was that the fault of football?

Then, some ninety cadets were hoisted out of West Point for cribbing in exams. That was the fault of the Army, not football.

And finally there was the overemphasized case of Johnny Bright, the Drake backfield star who had his jaw broken by an overeager Oklahoman who was certainly out of line. Yet this wasn't the first—or the last— Yet. time that slugging has taken place in sports. So why should the entire game be blamed for the actions of one man?

Of course the NCAA's proposal to ban the Bowl games is the biggest laugh of all. I doubt whether the member colleges will take their motion very seriously.

Norman believes that today's musical tastes "for the good old tunes of yesterday . . and for the tricky novelty tunes reflect the insecurity of our times and the urgent quest for escapism." He believes that the jazz picture is completely confused at this time by the internal cults, such as Dixie and bebop fans, who do not accept each other on an equal basis.

Does TV Hurt Disc Jockeys?

Gene Norman, Radio-TV Platter Man, Was Quick to Answer That Question

His Record

Proof that Norman speaks as a man who is tops in his chosen profession is found in the many honors which have been bestowed upon him. He has been named number-one disc jockey in a Campus Magazine poll taken in colleges in eleven Western states, and number one in the annual poll conducted by Bandleader, the national music magazine; he was elected president of the Los Angeles Disc Jockey Association in 1946 and has held this post each year since that time; and for the past three years he has been among the top four DJ's in Billboard's national poll. His distinctive voice has also led to narration assignments in many movies such as "The Jolson Story," "Mr. 880," and "Half Angel."

Many memories of the people who are behind the records he has put on the turntable are interwoven into Norman's disc-jockeying days. He recalls Frankie Laine as a newcomer When asked if he liked Western music, Norman said flatly, "No." According to him, Badlands-inspired tunes are not popular in any particular section of the country. "Thirty miles outside of every metropolitan area there's nothing but Western music." Personally, he finds squaredance-type songs "monotonous, repetitious and childish" except for the rare numbers like "Tennessee Waltz" and "Red River Valley." He likes folk music and said of it, "I think it's magnificent and expresses the true art of a country." Norman would not be pinned down to naming his favorite record or type of music, for he claims, "There are thousands of records I really like ... it's too hard to pick a favorite."

Perhaps the greatest proof that the disc jockey is not on his way out and especially one Gene Norman is the fact that his great number of loyal fans have followed him from radio to video.... Gene is one living example of his statement that "the disc jockey will be the last thing to be hurt by TV."

the turntable, knows from being in both radio and television that the disc jockey will stand firm in the foundation of both mediums. From his camera position on KNBH's five-day-a-week night spot, he said, "TV disc jockeys will have a lot to offer viewers if they take easily to the use of musical film (such as the Snader Telescriptions used on his telecasts, no doubt) and if they have a wealth of ad-lib musical knowledge at their beck and call when they step before camera." He is the first one to add: "The television platter spinner can't be in business with merely a voice and a handful of records." As for radio and its disc jockeys, Gene continues, "Radio is not on its way out, as some might think. It will go on and on, and so will its disc jockeys."

ENE NORMAN, a young man who has given uncountable platters that initial push on

Gene's actual work during his Snader telecasts is to introduce by anecdote or back-stage bit the artists who appear a few minutes later on film. For instance, before Nat Cole shows up singing "Remember," Gene has set the stage for Nat's appearance by recounting the time the eminent Mr. Cole got his knuckles rapped for playing jazz piano when he should have been rehearsing hymns for his church. Fairy Tales on TV

There has been little opportunity for Andersen's make-believe existence to creep into Jean Hersholt's "Dr. Christian" r a di o role (Wednesday, 8:30 p.m., KNX) otherwise than in the similarity between unfolding a real-life episode and a make-believe story. With the coming of TV, Jean Hersholt is looking forward not only to putting "Dr. Christian" on the video s c r e en, but also to giving youngsters who gather around the TV set a chance to get acquainted with enchanting fairy tales. He believes that they form some of the fondest memories of childhood.

He has some definite ideas about how the TV version of "Dr. Christian" and the fairy tales should be handled. It would never do to force Jean Hersholt to make a decision as to which he would prefer doing on TV, "Dr. Christian" or Andersen's fairy tales, because both have been very close to him for many years and he would never be able to choose between them. He would like to see fairy tales done on film, with a blending of both the dramatization and the narration of the stories.

About the possibility of televising fairy tales, Hersholt said, "I hope it can be done, although it would be an expensive operation. I think it will come soon." Would he like to do a TV show based on telling fairy tales? "Definitely," he said, "I would be interested in doing it." He commented further, "I know the Russians think fairy tales are terrible, but let's compare it with Santa Claus. We never suffered from believing in Santa Claus, did we? Well, I believe that fairy tales can only do good for our children."

His Philosophy

If and when Jean Hersholt does TV, he will do it on film. Of that he is positive, because of the tremendous strain on a person who does live TV each week. When asked if delving into the secrets of Andersen's fairy tales had changed his philosophy of life, radio's "Dr. Christian" said, "Well, it's like my 'Dr. Christian' role. My life has been enriched by playing the part of a kind, understanding country doctor. Perhaps part of his philosophy has unconsciously become part of my philosophy. Who knows? It's that way with the fairy tales... or maybe it's that a man grows more mellow as he gets older."

Fairy tales have played an important part in Jean Hersholt's past, and it looks as if they will do the same in his future. Now that he is a grandfather, he said, "It's been a long time since I read fairy tales to my son and now I'm looking forward to reading them to my grandson ... and to the day when he'll see them on TV."

"Model" Teleprompter

All Video Performers! If Your Mind Goes Blank, Relax! KLAC-TV's Engineers Come to Your Rescue With Their Telecue "Model" Invention

LAC-TV's CHIEF engineer, Bob Conner, has invented a teleprompter to end all teleprompters. It is especially designed to aid the newscaster and make him appear to be casually discussing the news instead of reading it. This new invention makes all other tele-aids completely obsolete.

other tele-aids completely obsolete. Conner claims to have perfected this demonstration "m o d e l" after months of secretly checking figures and face values. The end result is the work of the entire KLAC-TV engineering staff, which after comparing and compiling figures finally worked out the vital statistics for this "model," and of KLAC-TV newscaster Ed Lyon, who volunteered his services as the human guinea pig. Close observation of the "model"

Close observation of the "model" and newscaster over a period of three months revealed the newscaster has never been caught devoid of facial expression while working with the "model." Common flaw in other inventions, such as the playback device and the enlarged ticker tape, is their tendency to give the announcer a completely blank expression as he utters words being whispered in his ear or, in the case of the ticker tape, a quizzical look resulting from peering at the tape from a distance of five or so feet.

However, KLAC-TV engineers have though rather reluctantly, admitted their demonstration "m od e l" also contains a flaw. Conner, speaking for the group, said, "It has come to o u r attention, following the three months of close s c r u t i n y of the 'model' at work, that the newscaster can read only cheerful news reports." "We have as yet not been able to find a way to remove from the an-November 30, 1951 nouncer's face that gleeful look and from his voice that joyous intonation which results from working with the 'model.'" Conner continued, pointing out that he and his staff will remain on the job twenty-four hours a day if necessary to solve this vexing problem. Meanwhile Ed Lyon is offering all the assistance he can, realizing full well that a newscaster cannot go through life accounting for only the brighter side of the news.

In case you are curious about how this new development aids the newscaster in presenting his news telecasts, Ed Lyon explains the invention thus: "Upon considering this invention when brought to me by Bob Conner," said Ed, "I discarded the idea as mere folly. Knowing that I was having a great deal of trouble in refraining from referring to notes while doing my telecasts, Bob persisted and asked that I at least give this engineering achievement a test. Finally I agreed to give this latest development a whirl if he'd bring it into the office and allow me to look it over. Needless to say, once I saw the demonstration 'model' I knew Bob and his staff had developed something and I volunteered my services immediately."

"The first night," Ed admitted, "I had an awful lot of trouble. I couldn't keep my eyes on my notes and I didn't know the news well enough to read it off. However, I knew I had the situation licked. I was looking directly toward the camera, upon which was placed Bob's model, and I couldn't tear myself away. At my next newscast, I knew I'd know the news by heart. Nothing could deter me from looking directly at that camera."
