CBS-Television City

An Architect's Dream of Tomorrow

T IS fitting in our Twelfth Anniversary Issue that TV-Radio Life is able to report on what may well be a milestone in the television industry. We refer, of course, to CBS-Television City, now under construction on the site of the former Gilmore Stadium. The world's first exclusively designed TV plant will open on October 1, 1952.

Gilmore Island . . . TV City

Lore-laden G i l m o r e Island was once the stamping ground for the Spanish dons, the setting for the filming of "The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse" and the locale of an oil boom. Tomorrow, twentieth-century man's ingenuity in concrete and steel will be conceived on Gilmore Island in an ultra-modern television city. When completed TV City will cover twenty-five acres and include a thirteen-story administration building of 600,000 square feet. However, only the initial unit, comprising fifteen acres, will be readied for October. The additional space will be added when lease contracts on surrounding land expire.

Initial Plant

The initial plant is built around a core of four gigantic studios. In addition to being among the largest sound stages ever constructed, two of the new TV studios will be equipped to seat audiences of 350 people each. Yet the walls separating both the audience and nonaudience studios can be easily moved so that the size, shape and number of stages can be readily changed. The studios will be completely interchangeable, for flexibility is the keynote of Television City's design.

The n e w - t y p e "sandwich loaf" buildings were evolved after more than fifty attempts by the architects. First they conceived plans for circular buildings, then for octagons and pentagons. In addition to the studios. the initial four-story administration building will house writers, directors, producers and other administrative personnel.

Geared to serve the needs of the mammoth studios are the set-design facilities, the carpenter shops, the paint shops, the set-storage rooms and the property rooms. Each step in the technical operation from the artist's concept to the ultimate set is housed in ample workshops. Tremendous freight elevators will carry the sets to the studio's stages.

Spacious dressing rooms for CBS-TV stars, tremendous rehearsal halls. press facilities and employees' lounges are not to be overlooked. The architects... Pereira and Luckman

... have thought of everything. For more than two years they conducted intensive research and study before presenting their plans for a television city to the CBS Board of Directors.

Architects

William L. Pereira and Charles Luckman were students at the University of Illinois more than twenty vears ago. They were re-united recently when they formed their architectural - engineering partnership. Professional recognition came early to Bill Pereira. He has won

numerous architectural awards the Scarab Medal, the Humanitarian Medal and the Philadelphia Art Alliance Award ... all for his excellence in design.

Prompted by his graduation-day marriage, Charles Luckman deviated from his architectural career, pursuing the "mad dollar" in joining Colgate-Palmolive-Peet on what he considered a temporary basis. The "temporary" job stretched into a long tour of duty in the business world. He became the ultimate head of the huge Lever Brothers organization, and entered the government's fold as Chairman of the Citizens Food Committee. As chairman he directed the nationwide effort which sent one hundred million bushels of wheat and grain to the hunger ridden people of Europe. His alliance now with longtime friend Pereira is really a dream come true.

While Los Angeles, with its television - minded citizens, e a g e r l y awaits the unveiling of Pereira-Luckman's CBS-Television City next fall, Mayor Fletcher Bowron's statement appropriately sums up the situation: "CBS-Television City is another great indication of the future, and of the fact that another industry will have its roots in Los Angeles."

We established this procedure at the Awards' inception to eliminate the possibility that one actor or production would monopolize the top spot, and thus defeat our purpose: to seek out the greatest achievement in each field and thus encourage progress.

This year's Awards came after many meetings by the TV-Radio Life staff members, after collecting notes and thoughts during the entire year and following close observation of both mediums. Here are a few comments showing basis for the recognitions:

Femining Supporting Player (Radio)

Jo Gilbert is an actress whose career started with a secretary bit on the old Chicago show, "Judy and Jane." Thirteen years of radio on both Coasts find the versatile Jo with a list of credits literally as long as her arm, and a range of voices that matches.

Jo's ability to double on shows, portraying completely disparate charaoters, has been one of the outstanding attributes that led to her choice for roles on such shows as "Lux," "Screen Guild Players," "Night Beat," "Mr. District Attorney," "Gangbusters" and many, many more.

Masculine Supporting Player (Radio)

Parley Baer has probably been heard by every member of your family in innumerable air roles. He is very well known to "Count of Monte Cristo" listeners, for Parley has played the role of "Rene Michon" on the Mutual show for four years. He is also noted for parts on "Family Theater," "Escape," "This Is Your FBI," "Lineup," "Hollywood Star Playhouse," "Dr. Christian," and "Hallmark Playhouse."

Writers-Adapters (Radio)

Two of the busiest writers in Hollywood are youthful Jerome Lawrence and partner Robert E. Lee. You have heard their "Railroad Hour" "daptations, "Hallmark Playhouse," "Favorite Story," and many more. Their approach is fresh and their scripts are workmanlike. Above all, they want to reach the people, which is probably the reason their lines have "heart" and their accomplishments rate an Award.

Director (Radio)

One of the main reasons "Silent Men" and "Night Beat" have become "must" listening is the guiding hand of Warren Lewis, who was also instrumental in shaping up "The Blandings" as palatable air fare. Lewis's work carries out his theory that a good radio show should be well integrated yet have "easyhanded" direction and "enable all the people to express themselves creatively." NBC director Lewis has

Musical Director (Radio)

Frank DeVol is responsible for the provocative musical arrangements on CBS's five - a - week "Jack Smith Show." Music has been Frank's major interest since childhood. By the time he reached high school he was

proficient in seven musical instruments. Frank has been musical director on the former Rudy Vallee and Jack Carson shows. He is on the roster for the U. S. Treasury "Guest Star" series and has composed and directed music for the National Safety Council's Annual Broadcast for the past three years.

New Show (Radio)

Choosing the best new radio show of 1951 was a definite challenge to TV-Radio Life. Selection finally settled on a series heard last summer-"Pete Kelly's Blues," starring Jack Webb of "Pat Novak" and "Dragnet" fame. NBC's "Pete Kelly" opus was singled out because it cleverly combined mystery and music of the roaring-twenties era. We hope the program will come back to the airwaves.

tion's Nightmare," has by and large contributed more to the public's knowledge of crime and corruption in the United States than many Congressional investigations. In a series of special broadcasts it exposed the "Policy and Numbers Racket," "Narcotics Evil," "Slot Machine and Casino Gambling," "Crime on the Waterfront," and the "Bookie Business."

The narcotic stanza in particular will long be remembered in radio's annals for its vivid presentation. Irving Gitlin, CBS radio network writer-producer, and his staff taperecorded intervlews with criminals and victims alike for the series.

News Coverage (Radio)

Best radio news coverage Award for the year went to Columbia Broadcasting System for consistently top reporting. While it is true that events of national importance such as General Douglas MacArthur's dismissal and return home and the signing of the Japanese Peace Treaty are usually pooled so that no one network can take exclusive credit for coverage, we have found in a year of monitoring news programs that CBS, in addition to its world-wide reports, has presented such newsworthy public-service programs as "People's Platform" and "Capitol Cloakroom." An outstanding news program was the "Year-End Roundup," which presented reports from CBS's reporters stationed in foreign posts. It was a comprehensive, analytical resume of the year's happenings around the globe.

New Personality, Feminine (Radio)

Gisele MacKenzie's decision to become a vocalist instead of a violinist obviously was a fortunate happening, for now we have been privileged to enjoy her delightful song stylings during the past year on CBS's "Club 15" and on NBC as Mario Lanza's singing partner. In selecting Gisele for New Personality kudos. TV-Radio Life is backing up the opinion of Canadian radio critics who had previously dubbed Miss MacKenzie "the voice of Canada."

New Personality, Masculine (Radio)

Before Mario Lanza hit the airwaves, his booming tenor voice had thrilled millions on recordings and in the movies. However, starting in the summer of 1951, and then continuing through the winter with a regular NBC program, the sensational young operatic star became a radio "must" for young and old. His accomplishments made him a natural for our choice as the outstanding New Radio Personality of 1951.

Musical Program

Conversion from twenty-eight years as successful radio fare, TV's "The Voice of Firestone" won our nod for a Distinguished Achievement Award by weight of sheer excellence. Maestro Howard Barlow has been with the program since its inception, as has also Hugh James, announcer.

The simulcast from New York at no time allows the camera to interfere with choice musical selections. Guests are introduced against a bare curtain. Each of the numbers, chosen to please a nation of viewers and listeners, is backgrounded appropriately.

The program consistently features the highest type of music, presented visually in the highest type of camera work, direction and viewer inter-

Disney is generally recognized as the first of the character merchandisers. When he started there was but an occasional movie to whet small appetites for the treasures that would make the bearer or wearer just like one of Walt's amazing, amusing creations.

Today, and by virtue of TV, the frantic parent can count on a program an hour to offer merchandise either for hard, cold cash or via the box-top route.

No Comic Books?

Think of some of the children's favorite shows. Jack Mahoney, a relative newcomer to the scene and portrayer of the "Range Rider" on KNBH, offers beautiful merchandise at some of our nation's best stores. The hats are real felt; the boot is a wonderful sheep-lined, elkskin-soled affair made by real Navajos. The ties are pure silk. The jackets and shirts are real, soft-as-silk buckskin. '52, a backward glance showed that 1951 had seen some great new programs, marvelous innovations, and even a couple of disappointments attend-

ing television's progress and the people who enjoy it.

Enlarged sports coverage made many a set dearer by far to its owner. Football and baseball came into their own. with the filmed roller derbies almost forgotten; while pro football, live. departed at least this Coast's set screens. the nation's college games made Saturdays more than just a day off work. We had the World Series. too, an event almost paled by its forerunning, quick-

ly scheduled playoff between the Glants and Dodgers.

Developments

The nation's coasts were linked by the micro-relay opening in 1951, with the Peace Treaty Conference in San Francisco beating a comedian's debut by a couple of weeks. And it was the year the seven coastal TV stations forgot competition and pooled forces to bring everyone General MacArthur's return.

And 1951 was the year Kefauver hearings alternately entertained a nation and brought it a realization of the loopholes in our laws. It was the year a sad commentary on our times and fears took form in a show called "Instruction for Survival." whose purpose was to keep the public calmly informed of what procedure to take in case of an atomic attack . . . It was the year CBS-TV bought Gilmore Center, and NBC-TV bought a huge chunk of Warner Brothers' lot. Both have "expansion" in mind. . . It was the year Faye Emerson shortened her hair, and lengthened her dresses—at the top . . that Lucille Ball emerged as Queen of the Comediennes and Fred Allen bowed out as almost any sort of a TV comedian . . . that Red Skelton signed for TV and immediately upon appearing captured and held the highest of coveted show ratings . .. that live telecasts from coast to coast became regular fare making

new friends here for old Eastern favorites. Finally seeing Caesar and Imogene Coca's faces made home and TV much more fun!

Not All to the Good

And 1951 was the year that a former strip-tease artist with a lovely face, a load of charm and an all-girl band challenged Ina Ray Hutton's popularity... that KTSL officially became KNXT ... that the first strike in history against a TV station was called. The station was KFI-TV, which became KHJ-TV, and is under new management ... that Milton Berle signed a thirty-year contract: and that "Amos 'n' Andy," one of the oldest and most popular of all radio shows, finally took successful shape on television ... that color TV received a setback at the request of our defense mobilizer, who asked for curtailment of development due to a shortage of vital materials. It was also the year two electronic-minded teen-age boys, not daunted by lack of equipment, adapted a television set for color for one dollar!

1951 was the year that paralleled 1932 in radio. THAT was about the time anyone without a radio and its wealth of information, entertainment and education was looked upon with pity.

And how do you feel about that neighbor who is still coming in nights to watch your television set?

ON THE SET, AS CBS COLOR TV WAS INAUGURATED as a regular broadcast service (later curtailed by Defense Mobilizer Charles Wilson) were CBS President Frank Stanton, Arthur Godfrey, CBS Board Chairman William S. Paley and FCC Chairman Wayne Coy. The historic program originated in New York City.

Radio Year of 1951 Produced Primarily Old,

IKE A STOIC, radio withstood another year in 1951. Subject to much jostling, twisting, turning, it resembled a well-worn kaleidoscope, still falling into pleasantly accustomed patterns. Some of the pieces fell away leaving imperfect designs or vacant places; a few bright spots were added.

One scintillating bit was re-creation of "Seventh Heaven" for "Lux Radio Theatre," with Janet Gaynor and Charles Farrell returning after long absences to do their original roles.

The rise of Margaret Truman as a straight performer elicited widespread interest. For her first venture into a dramatic part, the President's daughter came to Hollywood to costar with Stewart. She also made several sallies onto NBC's "Big Show."

Radio lost one of its greatest when Fannie Brice passed away suddenly in late spring. The medium also suf-

fered deep losses in Barton Yarborough and Wally Maher, two of the most talented actors on Radio Row.

Several anniversaries were marked. NBC rolled up a quarter-century as a network; "Richfield Reporter" rounded out twenty years; Hal Peary chalked up his second decade.

TV-Radio Life enjoyed an exciting year, full of advances. One of the magazine's biggest moments was presentation of its Distinguished Achievement Awards before 500 guests of Hollywood Ad Club. A "Decorate Hawthorne" contest was provocative of much merriment. Despite inflation, TV-Radio Life managed to hold its price to 10 cents; fans responded to this reasonable approach and sent circulation skyrocketing to 60,000.

During 1952 we are looking for a sensible stabilization of radio and are hoping that some new patterns will be introduced to brighten the overall, but fast-changing picture.

VER GET into a huddle with some lighting directors? We did, and found it very illuminating. Youthful Alex Quiroga and matured "Connnie" O'Connell, two of KECA-TV's top lighting directors, have had different experiences and backgrounds but they see eye-to-eye on TV's lighting techniques.

Well, almost. Eager-beaver Alex believes that now is the time to experiment with "artistic" lighting and does so; whereas veteran film director "Connie" thinks that techniques will gradually develop to the stage where "artistic" lighting is feasible. For "Connie," who has participated in the motion-picture industry since 1915, it's a matter of progress; to Alex it's a challenge for today. Our discussion resolved into flat vs. artistic theories.

Flat Light

The tradition of engineers to "flatlight" sets, which they learned in the experimental days of television, still persists. The results are technically satisfactory pictures, but they have little artistic value. They lack dramatic mood and character. Flat lighting consists of emitting light from the various types of equipment in such a way that its direction and focus cannot effectively be controlled. In spite of its shortcomings, such lighting is widely used for several reasons. It is economical because the same lighting setup is used over and over regardless of the set design or dramatic requirements of the story. and great technical skill is not necessary to set it up. With flat lighting it is impossible to convey true authenticity of a dramatic scene to the viewer. All of the scenes regardless of mood have the general characteristics of taking place in a hospital operating room. Another important failing is its complete lack

DRAMATIC LIGHTING as employed on ABC-TV's "Personal Appearance Theatre," which starred Joseph Schildkraut and Irene Billings in a historical drama. of third-dimensional effect. Set designs and props alone cannot give the impression of third-dimensional pictures.

Just as an actor tries to project dramatic expression into his lines. so TV's lighting directors are also trying to create mood and character through proper lighting. There is one dissimilarity though, an actor receives a credit line for his work; whereas the lighting director's name rarely graces a television credit slide. Why the industry slights lighting technicians in this manner is incomprehensible.

Movie Stars

Glamorous stars are deglamorized on video screens. The unflattering, distorted effect is one of the basic reasons why motion-picture studios taboo TV appearances for their stars. Lighting director Alex Quiroga believes that adapting motion picture lighting techniques to television might be desirable. In the movie industry extensive lighting tests are made ... one camera is used ... retakes, recordings and relighting are accepted procedures. But the time element is TV's greatest handicap in its fight for technical per-fection. The word "retake" is unknown in TV. The same general lighting must be used for all types of scenes and shots and several cameras are used. (Selecting the right camera to transmit the image must be a nerve-racking experience.) Obviously motion-picture lighting techniques can only partially be applied to live telecasts. Perhaps the solution to technical perfection is the new magnetic tape. This electronic tape, still in the experimental stages, records images far superior to present-dav kinescopes, and it has all the advantages of tape recording.

Hot or Cold

Just to add confusion to an already confusing problem, there are pros and cons on "hot" and "cold" lighting. "Cold" or fluorescent lighting consists of indirect lighting. or banks of lights. They offer minimum control; they cannot be dimmed. "Hot" or incandescent lights consist of spot and flood lamps. They are more readily adjustable and offer greater control than fluorescent lights. NBC uses incandescent lights on all network shows originating from this Coast; KECA-TV experiments with both. They use a mixture on davtime shows and reserve their incandescent lighting for nighttime programming.

In spite of controversy, theories, and systems the ultimate viewer of television can alter desired results by tampering with the brightness or contrast dials of his television set. Perhaps the viewers are not as discriminating as the technicians. But it's comforting to know that someone with a more discriminating eye is striving for perfection.

ly Hills restaurant to catch her between kitchens. It took a bit of bribing and patience, but we pulled her away from her blintzes and Hungarian goulash.

First thing we asked was, "Mama, why do you still stay in the kitchen, after almost twenty-three years in the restaurant business?"

"If you don't want to lose your shirt you can't leave it! I work like two mules, not one."

Those Wonderful Letters

As she ordered all sorts of delicious dishes from her kitchen for our table we queried about her daily television cooking show. We wanted to know just how this culinary expert felt about doing TV. Did she like it?

"It's wonderful . . . just wonderful. Those gorgeous letters from all the ladies. I love them all. But am so unhappy when I can't answer all the letters, and hope that they will walt. I'm getting help now to answer all of them, those wonderful people."

How did she happen to get in front of the TV cameras?

"In one little moment a lot of things could happen. You could be happy. You could be sad. In one little moment I got on television."

Her Family

Before we could pin the jovial cook down to explaining just what hap-



pened in that "one little moment" we were hearing all about her family. There's Papa, who is usually talking about his Mama, which only prompts Mama to say to Papa, "You're not whistling Dixie!" And there's Harry, Milton and Nate, the three wonderful sons. Harry and Milton are married and that makes Mama a grand-Mama. Mama has one wish for Nate. "I wish he would find himself a nice little girl and get married. He wants to become an actor. Maybe it could happen."

Mama, who never for one moment drops her charming Hungarian accent (because she couldn't if she wanted to), has lived in this country for forty-two years. As a young girl in her native Hungary she worked hard in a hotel at little pay to learn the fine art of cooking.

When the furniture business she and Papa started in this country in 1930 flopped, Mama remembered that she knew how to make blintzes. With a borrowed \$35, a stolen "For Sale" sign that read "Mama Weiss Restaurant" on the opposite side, and plenty of courage and ambition Mama started her business. Today it is a favorite eatery among many movie people, as well as just plain Californians who like something good to eat.

Getting back to her TV show, we found out what Mama thinks of her kitchen-hand, Eddie Coontz.

Mama has lived in many places and she still believes: "The world is all one big city. It's all the same every place. And life, it is wonderful."

Where did she get her philosophy of life, which is no doubt responsible for the fact that few people would guess her age at sixty-five?

"Life teaches you," she said. "It's the greatest teacher, believe me."

Finally back on the subject of video, we asked the happy cook whether it was difficult for her to do TV.

"It's so easy I forget I'm there. That's why I'm always saying to Eddie that something is under the table or in the cupboard when it isn't. Then Eddie has to tell me, 'But we're here on TV, Mama.'"

Mama is Mama on TV as she is at home or at the restaurant. As she said, "I'm the plainest dressed woman on all the shows in television."

A bunch of us were on the steps right behind him and saw a curtain part gingerly as someone peeked out. Then as the door opened wide, a short, generously proportioned middle-aged woman registered surprise and con-

sternation.

SHE WAS MRS. KAROLINE HALO-WAX, one of "Dixie Showboat's" great-est admirers. With her two neighbors, Mrs. Halowax hadn't, until she became ill a few weeks ago, missed a single performance at the theater (nor any of the other nightly audience tele-casts from KTLA) for over a year.

THE STATION, LEARNING OF MRS. HALOWAX'S prolonged convalescence, decided to take a surprise show to her. As she is also an avid TV Radio Life fan, I, too, was invited to "the party." It was rather risky walking in unannounced on someone who had had pneumonia, so the sta-tion consulted the convalescent's doctor and received an okay before the little caravan of good cheer wheeled down Western Avenue toward the bungalow about half an hour after "Showboat" had signed off. Two KTLA ushers in their smartly styled uniforms bore a great basket of spring flowers for the surprise. HERE'S A SAFETY PRECAUTION FOR CHILDREN WHO RIDE THEIR BICYCLES DURING EARLY EVENING THEIR AND MORNING HOURS. Put a small reflector on each bike pedal so they can be seen from the rear. That little attract more attention in traffic than the one reflector on the bike's rear fender.

HERE IS A USEFUL KITCHEN DECORATION. The material needed is: one shallow ceramic dish, one tencent packet of parsley seed and a natural sponge. Place the sponge in the dish, then pour in the water so that one-quarter of the sponge is submerged. Now place your parsley seeds in the holes of sponge until you have most of the exposed surface of sponge planted. Set dish on window sill and then wait. In about seven days, the little green seedlings will begin to sprout all over the sponge. Keep the water level about the same and the natural action of the sponge will keep the seedlings wet. And soon you'll have a very colorful and attractive ornament which at the same time will provide you with fresh, crisp sprigs of parsley with which to garnish your cooking.

HERE IS HOW TO MAKE A NICE FLOWER HOLDER, for when you're out cutting your flowers. This way they won't wilt before you get them into the house. Take a large fruit can (empty, of course), a coffee can, can tempty, of course), a correc can, plus the handle of a worn-out fly swatter. The two cans are fastened together, the handle between them, with two small bolts. That's all there is to it, and it's light to carry and ideal for holding your flowers, as the short-stemmed flowers can go in the coffee can and the long-stemmed coffee ean and the long stemmed ones in the larger can. Put a little water in cans before you cut the

flowers so they will stay fresh and lovely as long as necessary.

THIS HINT IS FOR THOSE OF YOU WITH SMALL KITCHENS, without a table to drink your morning coffee on. Take a piece of half-inch plywood thirty inches long and a little wider than a cupboard drawer. To this you fasten a piece of angle, the length equal to the inside width of the drawer. Extend the angle out from the end of the wood the thickness of the drawer frame. Pull out the drawer about eight inches and slip the angle under the edge of the cupboard, let the board rest on the drawer and you have a table for many uses. It takes very little space to store and you can set it up quickly.

THIS IS AN UNUSUAL IDEA FOR A NECKLACE. There must be many old watch fobs still in existence, and of course they are no longer in fashion for men, so make a necklace out of the watch fob. Simply take a gold chain and attach to the fob. It's very attractive and so unusual.

THE NEXT TIME YOU WANT TO MAKE SURE A SCREW WILL NOT COME OUT, TRY THIS. Just drive a little brad with the point of the brad slanting away from the screw into the wood, and drive it in the end of the slot in the screw.

Another use for worn plastic pillow slips and tablecloths. That's to use them to cover your prized outdoor plants and shrubs that are likely to freeze these cold nights. It gives a much nicer appearance to the front lawn than draped gunny sacking. A pillow slip will cover a small plant nicely Use tablecloths for larger ones. nicely. Use tablecloths for larger ones.

est. We made our choice feeling "Firestone" has the greatest over-all balance of tonal beauty and grace that any television musical show of the past year has offered.

Comedy Show (TV)

A husband-wife team, Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz, made TV comedy history in 1951 with some of the funniest viewing many of us have ever seen. "I Love Lucy," KNXT, 9:00 p.m., Monday, took us all by storm and without an argument received our Award because of some of the finest camera work, production and scripting. Jess Oppenheimer is producer and Marc Daniels the director.

Juvenile Program

(TV) Augment the birds and the bees with every other animal known to zoodom and you have a panorama of education, interest and delightful caperings known as "Zoo Parade." It was this fine NBC-TV children's show that won our nod as the best juvenile program of the past year.

Under the guidance of Zoo Director R. Marlin Perkins, a child (or adult) who watches sees the habits of lions, snakes, birds, bears and almost every other form of what is usually considered wild life presented in an understandable, constructive fashion.

Dramatic Program (TV)

Combining top talent, excellent production, and well-written scripts, plus an exceptional job of integrating film with "live" material, made the "Schlitz Playhouse of Stars" the outstanding new dramatic series on television for 1951.

The men behind the scenes of the full-hour CBS-TV show included Felix Jackson, executive producer, Robert Buchanan, associate producer, Joseph A. Moran, supervisor, Frank Telford, director, and Al Ostrander, set designer.

Documentary (TV)

Ingenuity of Edward R. Murrow and Fred W. Friendly has produced the outstanding documentary-news show of the year. Live pick-ups along the coaxial cable are envisioned on CBS-TV's "See It Now." Projects not feasible or locales not accessible to the microwave relay are recorded on film. The editors scan 20,000 feet of film to select the approximate 3000 feet used on each telecast. "See It Now's" thoroughness and diversification put it in a plane far above the usual TV newscasts and made it our 1951 Awardee.

Educational Program

(TV)

On alternate Fridays for the past Page Forty year, "Success Story's" roving cameras have taken viewers to diversified places of interest. A trip through a plant via KTTV's "Success Story" is an education in itself. Whether it be the Union Pacific Railroad, Kaiser Steel Plant or the Orthopaedic Hospital, the tour is complete and comprehensive, reflecting the detailed preparations of "Success Story's" staff. Each telecast is a "live" remote, requiring on-the-spot editing and demanding the utmost of skill from every crew member associated with the telecast.

Public Service (TV)

The Senate Crime Investigating Committee, headed by Senator Estes Kefauver, became one of the biggest and most dramatic news stories of the year—mainly because of television.

The hearings in Los Angeles were initiated and covered so excellently by KECA-TV that we singled out this station for a Public Service Award.

Sports Coverage (TV)

Through the cooperation of KNBH, local outlet for NBC-TV, the sports enthusiasts of Southern California were able to view practically every major event of 1951.

KNBH's coverage, which rated our sports award, included the final two games of the dramatic Dodger-Giant playoff series, the World Series, all the major grid games approved by the NCAA, the Loyola games, the Rose Bowl Grid classic, wrestling matches from Chicago, and the Friday night Gillette fights.

KHJ-TV kept football fans happy during the grid season by telecasting the Junior College games every Friday and Saturday. During the World Series, Mutual shared honors with NBC, and for basketball thrills KHJ-TV was on hand with top-notch coverage of all the home games of UCLA and USC.

On the wrestling scene, KTLA, KTTV, and KLAC-TV kept the gruntand-groaner fans happy with their exciting, entertaining and always controversial telecasts from the local arenas.

Conversion, Radio to TV (TV)

We selected NBC-TV's "Hit Parade" as the best conversion from mike to camera, for each week It's a new challenge to the producers, stars Eileen Wilson, Snooky Lanson, Dorothy. Collins, Raymond Scott and his orchestra and the "Hit Paraders" and Dancers. Behind the camera, and that is of primary importance in the production of a refreshingly new "Hit Parade" each week, are producers Dan Lounsbery and Ted Fetter, director Clark Jones, technical director Bob Daniels, choreographer Tony Charmoli, and set designer Paul Barnes.

> Producer-Director (TV)

Ralph Levy, a young man with a great creative talent, produces and directs the Burns and Allen Show; directs and is co-producer with Hilliard Marks of the Jack Benny TV show; and produces and stages the Alan Young Show. These multiple assignments of some of Hollywood's most successful originations have made Levy not only one of the most successful big names of the new medium in less than a year—but made it inevitable that he would enter TV-Radio Life's discussion of awardwinning producer-directors.

He was hired for TV in 1946. His first West Coast emanation was in 1949, when he launched Ed Wynn's show, a production which pioneered the entire field of West-to-East releases by TV recording. Levy insists that taste and imagination are top directorial requirements. He possesses both.

New Personality, Feminine (TV)

We believe Zsa Zsa Gabor, beauteous TV personality, made a deep impression on viewers in 1951. Some people have a knack for attracting publicity, but Zsa Zsa exercises a positive magnetic power. We doubt many will argue when we say she is the mainstay of "Bachelor's "Haven." Her provocative personality has carried the sustaining at the time we went to press) for an unusually lengthy period. The video screen served as Zsa Zsa's open-sesame to a motion-picture career. After one look at Zsa Zsa on television, the movie bigwigs signed her for feature roles.

New Personality, Masculine (TV)

It was inevitable that stage, screen and radio star Red Skelton would lend his talent to television and that he would be voted our Award for the new TV masculine personality.

However, the advent of Red Skelton in September, 1951, on his regular NBC-TV Sunday night show exceeded the expectations of even the most hopeful. Almost overnight, he was acknowledged as the outstanding comedian of the TV world.

"Editor's Round Table"

Monday, 8:30 p.m. KNXT, Channel 2

"Does birth control hurt society?" That was the question featured on the above-entitled show. As can well be imagined, the discussion grew mighty lively, with the negative defenders waxing as loud and free as the af-firmatives. Oddly enough, it was the affirmative speakers who wound up sounding somewhat pious in the face of some logical talk by the opposite side about overpopulation, the per-petuation of feeble-mindedness and other defects which society doesn't handle too well as it is.

Reverend Tobias H. Joeckel, of Redeemer Lutheran Church, South Gate, spoke for the affirmative, explaining that his church's dogma on the subject labeled birth control against the Bible's teaching and the moral laws of God. Mrs. Merlin Newkirk, a former school teacher now active in women's organizations, also argued against birth control.

We don't recall Mrs. Newkirk saying how many children she, herself, had borne. Better still, we don't recall either of the negative speakers asking her. The whole discussion was com-pletely impersonal, unmarred by bitter religious arguments, and completely without the vituperation which almost always seems to creep into discussions of anything intelligent and heartfelt, on TV or off.

Mrs. James Greene, official of the Pasadena Planned Parenthood Committee, took the stand that unplanned families can arrive at times not strategic either emotionally or economically; and Dr. Paul Popenoe, head of the famed Institute of Family Relations, admitted that too-large families can be the reason for marital break. ups

Discussions of this sort, rare on any



medium, are naturals for public information. But only one in a hundred programs dares to handle them, and about the same percentage seems capable.—J.P.

Didn't "Meet the Press" panelists know that they had a guest on their hands who would do just that—meet them, without answering them?

One of the latest soap opera type series to hit the already sudser-saturated airwaves is Hope Winslow's "Whispering Streets." Hope Winslow, author, ex-newspaper correspondent and world traveler, is the feminine narrator of this daily drama, as well as its creator.

It is most unfortunate that "Whispering Streets" does not live up to its possibilities. The series is based on stories gleaned from the myriad streets of the world that lead to gay and sad places, streets that all whisper their tales of the human beings who have traversed their pavements. With this wealth of material one would think that these air dramas could do nothing less than give listeners intriguing radio fare.

On a recent airing the story line concerned a man's illegal entry into the United States and his family's frustrations because of this fact; a young woman's search for a new way of life and the meaning of marriage, and the emotional clashes which result from a daughter's indecision over her parents and the man she loves.

An excessive number of emotional incidents are crowd-ed into each air show, which only lessens the appeal which could be gained from a simple approach to a heartrending story. A much stronger cast is needed to enact these human dramas. Many of the performers

But Bristol possesses a certain quality which endears him to those who see him. Requests to see more of him come from people in all walks of life —society matrons, newspaper sports editors, ministers, youth clubs, even a petition from men at a fire station. I have had telegrams, telephone calls and personal requests from people demanding to see him in an unceasing, unending to see him in an unceasing, unending believed wrestling to be faked until she met and listened to Page Seventy Bob Bristol. Another stated that it men like Bob loved wrestling, it must be a wonderful thing.

Wrestling has been his love ever since he was a boy. He was on his way to a promising career as a middleweight boxer but wrestling got the better of him. During the day Bob is an excellent dental technician, working for Dr. R. S. Fisher of Glendale, one of the nation's leading dental authorities.

Bob Bristol is billed on the wrestling cards as the "Gentleman from Glendale," and that he is. This soft-spoken, gentle, honest fellow will achieve his heart's desire of being a great wrestler—at least if his following has anything to do with it. But even if he doesn't, he says, he will be a better man for his experience and healthier because of his training and conditioning.

Charlie has had to sur-round himself with his friends to "keep me on top of the heap," as Charlie explains. This guy is busier than 999 hives of bees, and gets less sleep than the fishes which never close their eyes.

Wading to his office (new one) over umpteen boxes, I was amazed and amused at the same time.

"What's in the boxes, Charlie?" I asked, shaking his hand.

"That's m' mail, Joe," he an-swered matter of factly.

"Lifetime collection?" I questioned further. It looked like Mound City.

"Joe, that's m' mail from the KTTV show—mostly from Range Rider friends of mine. They send in 3000 cards and letters every week. I've been on for seventy-five weeks."

Adding this mail up in a hurry, l was surprised at the total: a stag-gering sum of 225,000 pieces of mail in less than a year and a half, all locally sent. My friend, that's a lot of mail! However, the amount of mail does not impress this gangly mail does not impress this gangly cowboy. The fact that his friends took all that time to sit down and write does make a deep impression on Charlie. He told me that that's why he saves all the mail to remind him to be thankful "for all my friends I've made here in California."
