# She Knew What She Wanted

**F**ROM THE time she was four years old, the blonde beauty who waves the baton on ABC's "Super Circus" has known what she wanted to do.

Rummaging in the attic of her grandfather's home, Mary Hartline discovered her great-grandfather's cornet, a battered instrument so ancient that Indian pennies were used to cap its keys. Exhibiting the treasure, she begged, "Grandpa, teach me to play this!"

## Blow Easy

Her grandfather Crowder, who winks as he boasts he used to be better than any two other trombone players in Decatur, obliged. To help out hands too small to hold the cornet steady, he suspended the cornet on wires from the ceiling, and then directed, "Now walk right up to it and blow easy."

Mary didn't dream then that learning to "blow easy" would lead her to a white-booted femceeship of one of television's most popular and wholesome children's shows. But she did try, very hard.

Her parents regarded her devotion to the cornet as mere childish fancy. But they indulged her by regular lessons when she was seven, and when she earned an assignment with the high-school band, they bought her a new trumpet all her own. Mary turned right around and won first place in the state high-school music contest—a contest in which beauty didn't count.

By that time Mary's ambition went further. She wanted to lead a whole band. So she began to study conducting, and the year after high-school graduation her work paid off. ABC's radio network built a show called "Junior Junction" around her. When television added sight to sound, she was a "natural" as the glamorous band leader of "Super Circus."

## Voice of the People

Evidence of her popularity is heard more than seen. Each Sunday as the elephants, acts, trained animals and the rest of the tanbark specialties roll by the stands wherein sit a host of "Super Circus" visitors, screams of joy go up from hundreds of small throats. And when the "Princess" of the circus comes past in her white boots, baton skirts and cap, with her blonde hair gleaming, the approving din is doubled.

## Business Woman

It was long rumored that Mary Hartline owned a good chunk of "Super Circus." The network blew

up this rumor, but does admit that Mary is hard at work getting up a line of Hartline merchandise. There will be toys, books, apparel and foods. Mary's own favorite item is the Mary Hartline doll she plans.

Late 1952 should see a troupe of short-skirted little girls running about with the little "Hoppys" and Roy Rogerses of every neighborhood. Their legs will be like sticks emerging from prized white boots, and their thin, childish arms will wave Mary Hartline batons.

But the youngsters to whom Mary is the personification of a fairy princess will just have to give up on the hair that is the Hartline TV trademark. The floating blonde cloud is naturally pale gold. It is kept at exactly twenty-two inches, and shows Chicago's dirt faster than a pair of white gloves. Abundant soap and water four times a week take care of this. Washing, setting and drying takes four hours.

And what small fan is going to stand still for this sort of treatment?

*Here's How a Group of Clever Fellows Integrates Live and Film Action to Amaze and Amuse the at-Home Looker*

ONE OF THE COMMERCIAL BREAKS chosen by the above group is to be inserted at a spot in the film where two servicemen are scuffling in a conservatory. Under direction of KTTV's setting and design expert, Seymour Klute, a studio conservatory similar to the one in the film is being created. Working here are Salvatore Lombardo and John Richardson from production; Sam Madison, floor manager.

WE DIDN'T like the picture much, but the commercial was wonderful," some KTTV lookers recently wrote in reference to an integrated "Brew 102" video advertisement.

Jimmy Vandiveer, who originated commercial integration so effectively when he was handling the Chevrolet plugs with Art Baker as spieler on KECA-TV, has transferred his know-how to "Brew 102," client of a new advertising agency in which Bud Edwards, Jimmy, Jack O'Mara and Rollo Hunter are associated.

Trick of this unique technique is to preview the upcoming Wednesday night film and, at proper intervals, select a spot where it is possible to segue smoothly from the celluloid to live action on the part of studio announcer Jack Latham.

This is really delicate business, as TV-Radio Life discovered when asked to sit in on the evolution of one night's commercials. Clustered in a small projection room at KTTV, the agency and studio staff searches for a film moment that may be du-

tion to be meticulously observed with a product like beer. Movie technique is used in making the switch from film to live. "We can't cut to an unnatural shot," Jimmy claimed. In fact, the commercials, done live in the KTTV studios, make the film quality look inferior, hence the commercial telecast is purposely brought down to a quality resembling that of the film, a move which led Vandiveer to observe, "Ours is the only TV program in the United States where the picture is degraded!"

Rear-screen projection is employed to obtain background effects needed for the live insert to simulate the movie. Heavy dramatic pictures are easiest from which to pick the spots for the commercials. But despite the fact that Jimmy and assistants are by now thoroughly schooled in making top-notch, integrated commercials (almost 300 under their belts) they still spend six man-days a week preparing the inserts, this time exclusive of set building, which is done by Seymour Klute and his KTTV crew. An entire evening, usually Tuesday, is devoted to rehearsal of the commercials.

It is considered worthwhile, however, because lookers don't leave their sets when "the pitch" starts. "Instead," claimed Vandiveer, "they wait to see what we're going to sneak in."

plicated, within reason, in the studio and has enough interest or excitement so that lookers won't realize that the commercial is sneaking up on them. Such moments occur, for example, during a fight, when a fellow juggles a priceless vase, a chap is absorbed in toying with a model plane. Identical props are made for Latham to hit, juggle or toy with as the film is cut and studio action begins.

With at-home lookers, picking the spot when a commercial is about to

descend has become a game. The smarter the set-siders become, the harder the commercial crew has to work to fool them. "We used to cut the sound track," Jim said, "but now we leave in sound, either music or dialogue. Bob Hiestand, our director, is clever at picking music to match that on the film's sound track."

#### Formula

Care must be taken not to break the mood of the film too sharply; nor should integration of the commercial in any way offend, a precau-





This briefer spot is not unlike its hostess's "Lee Hogan Presents," also on KNBH, and from three years at this latter helm Lee has a list of hundreds of fine guests and just as many ideas about what makes a show entertaining.

The sponsor representatives who visit the program in the company of other guests (who tell viewers of handiwork, vacation clothes, hobbies and anything else that seems like "a good idea" for the viewer to see) are a charming lot, and their work histories, backgrounds and personalities are drawn out perfectly through Lee's graciousness and know-how.

While a close analysis reveals the show to be about as commercial a bit as anywhere on TV, its progress from 7:00 to 7:15 turns it into an informal visit with some nice, very interesting people.—J.P.



# PICK of the PIX

No room for railery today.

"Of Mice and Men." This picture, one of the best of all time, is the screen version of John Steinbeck's great play about the itinerant farm-hand, his search, common to all men, for peace and security, and his endless dream for a piece of land of his own. Poignant, humorous and compassionate in turn, the film advances its theme by tracing the lives of two such wanderers, characters which have become legend in American literature: George, the small, good, and generous man, and Lennie, the giant with the mind and desires of an eight-year-old boy. The tragic denouement of this relationship is one of the most epic ever put on film, and underscores with compelling emphasis the author's thesis that the love of fellow man is the food for a hungry spirit. The acting, by Burgess Meredith, Lon Chaney, Betty Field, Roman Bohnen, Charles Bickford, and Bob Steele, is excellent, while Lewis Milestone's direction and Aaron Copland's musical score add immeasurably to an important motion picture.

"Wintersset." Another film from a famous play, this one by Maxwell Anderson. Loosely based on a phase of the renowned Sacco-Vanzetti case, the story relates the efforts of a son to prove his father was unjustly convicted and executed for the crime of murder. His labors bring him at last to a New York slum dwelling, where he finds the only witness to the crime, the judge who condemned his father, and the gangster who actually committed the murder. Against this background, Anderson has written a modern poetic tragedy whose theme espouses the basic dignity and courage of man, and although by the highest





**THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN:** Les Paul-Mary Ford's "Confessin'" (Capitol), Rusty Draper's "Devil of a Woman" (Mercury), Ames Brothers' "Stardust" (Coral), Andrews Sisters - Dick Haymes's "Here in My Heart" (Decca), Billy May's "Honest and Truly" (Capitol), Billy Eckstine's "Hold Me Close to You" (MGM), and Eddy Howard's "Be Anything" (Mercury).

In the jazz field, Good Time Jazz heads the list with **Bunk Johnson's** "Careless Love" and "Down by the Riverside" that can boast the only Johnson vocal ever recorded. . . . Again available on this label are great **Pete Daly** waxings of "Sobbin' Blues" and "Jazz Man Strut" . . . and if you didn't know **Benny Moten's** "South" could be sung and swung, listen to **Clancy Hayes's** lyrics to **Bob Scobey's** frisky Frisco beat.



With the Presidential elections in the offing, latest candidate to be announced is Decca's **Louis Jordan**, who, with the assistance of his Tympany Five, states his platform musically on "Jordan for President" and promises great things if elected.

As a preview to a forthcoming Crosby flicker, Decca has just reissued a goodie from some years back, "Lily of Laguna" and "Wait Till the Sun Shines, Nellie," both with **Bing and Mary Martin** at their informal best. . . . Another reissue pairs **Mr. Rhythm** with **Judy Garland** for "Mine" and "You've Got Me Where You Want Me." Both discs were mellow then and are mellow now.

Another glimpse of what to expect when the **Neal Hefti Orchestra**, with vocalist **Frances Wayne**, hits the Palladium in the near future, is provided on four new Coral sides. "Sure Thing" and "Why Not?" are top Hefti instrumentals while "Ev'rytime" and "Lonesome and Blue" spotlight **La Wayne**—and if the rest of the band's library stacks up to these examples, Hollywood dancers are in for a treat.

We especially liked **Satchmo's** lyrics on "Kiss of Fire" (Decca), the **Nellie Lutcher** revival of "Keepin' Out of Mischief Now," **Ella Fitzgerald's** individuality on the lovely "I Hadn't Anyone Till You," and **Nat "King" Cole** singing "What Does It Take" to that solid beat of **Billy May's** band as he used to do with his trio. . . . # Wrestling Is My Business

Wrestling's greatest extravaganza has come and gone—but is far from forgotten. No one who attended the wrestling matches at Gilmore Field last Wednesday night will ever forget.

It was the colossal production to end all colossal productions and wound up breaking all records. It was attended by more people and took in more money than any other wrestling match in history; 25,256 people paid \$103,277.75 to see the undisputed heavyweight wrestling champion of the world determined.

Equally important, it was the most smoothly handled crowd and the best organized and arranged event I have ever attended. All of the credit for this goes to Mrs. Aileen LaBell Eaton, who took care of the millions of details in staging this great outdoor show.

For me, it was the highlight of twenty-five years in the sports world—announcing the main event. I can't begin to describe the feeling of excitement that prevailed over the big field. The sea of faces in every direction when the field was lit up was awe-inspiring.

So I was wrong in predicting the outcome! Well, as I mentioned before, I was not really pulling for either man. Whoever won was the better and, like you, I wanted to see it decided.

I said the Baron would wear Thesez out about the halfway mark in the two-hour match. The terrific pace the Baron set tired Thesez out around the twenty-minute mark. Not that Lou was through or winded—but he was definitely at the point that he did not make any more of those fast moves which characterized the first fifteen minutes of the match.

After about twenty minutes, the Baron was driving Lou from corner to corner with elbow smashes that could be heard to the farthest corner of the bowl-like field—elbow smashes that made every one of the 25,000 spectators flinch.

When I visited Lou in his dressing room after the match, he showed me his side, which was red, swelling and puffing, making it difficult to breathe.

Lou showed that he had what it takes to make a champion. Although his speed was slowed down, his mind certainly wasn't. He waited his time until before the third fall when the Baron was overconfident. Lou had the Baron exactly where he wanted him. Leone held a plain side headlock and Lou hoisted him high over his head, fell over backwards with him, driving his head into the mat.

The force of the fall combined with the weight of both men drove Leone's head into the mat hard enough to

break the neck of a weaker man. Then it was all over—the supremacy of the heavyweight championship had been decided once and for all.

The most dramatic moment in a drama-packed evening occurred during the rest period between the second and third fall when the Baron went berserk. His trainer, Hugh Nichols, was fighting and pleading with him not to lose his head and to take it

easy. Leone was trying to get to the semi-conscious Lou, who was being worked on in his corner by the seconds and handlers.

Out in front, standing over Lou ready for action, was his manager, Ed "Strangler" Lewis. If the Baron broke loose to come in for the kill, the beloved Strangler was ready. I will never forget his stance and expression. There were many exciting moments. It was a great match and a real champion won.

Leone had plenty to say in his dressing room later. Mainly, he was kicking himself for not listening to trainer Nichols. If he had only obeyed Nichols and bided his time for an hour and fifteen or thirty minutes, he would surely have been the champion. He knew where he had failed, but blamed his Latin temper.

Leone did not come out of the match unscarred either. One side of his face was swollen and bruised and he believed several teeth were loosened from the force of the last Greco-Roman back body drop. Of course he is still wild and fuming for a rematch. When I moved on to Lou's dressing room, Lou said he had chased the Baron for a year trying to get a match. When he got hold of him he found he had treed a grizzly bear and had no intention of giving the Baron a return match in a week or two.

## SHARPE BOYS MAKE SPECTACULAR DEBUT

Mike and Ben Sharpe, making their first appearance as the world's tag-team champions, certainly looked unbeatable by easily defeating Vic Christy and Sandor Szabo. I believe they are the world's largest tag-team combination, too. One is six feet six and the other six feet seven, and they average 265 pounds each. After watching how easily they disposed of their opposition, I know John Doyle is going to have his hands full getting opponents for them when he brings them in later in the summer.

Looks like the mountain is coming to Mohammed this week as Hombre Montana hits town for an extended stay. El Hombre, weighing a mere 350 pounds, is the Pacific Coast heavyweight champion and a really surprising matman. He is much younger than he looks with the heavy chin whiskers and as fast and agile as a cat.

His tremendous bulk dumfounded spectators and his opponent on his sole match here some time ago—an immovable object in the flesh.

This description may sound a little corny and overdone, but when you actually meet and talk to the thirty-three-year-old grunt-and-groaner, you soon realize it is true.


An amiable man with a million-dollar smile, he tells you about his boyhood in Phoenix, Arizona, and how at the early age of seventeen he was already a professional wrestler.

## "I'm Going to Study Music"

*A Bold Announcement From a Top Musical Director*

**S**UCCESSFUL ARRANGER-composer Frank DeVol is going to study music. Perplexing to us maybe, but simple for him.

Although music has been part of Frank's life since early childhood, he has never had any "academic" training. "At the opportune time, I'm going to pursue music technically and formally," he explained with a smile. "I hope some day to compose classical music . . . just what form is a rather moot point at present."

Frank's father, a musician, wanted his son to become a lawyer, but music was Frank's major interest from early boyhood. When his father became leader of the band at the Grand Opera House, young Frank haunted the theater, helped his dad take care of the music library, number pages, and patch torn music sheets, and assisted in cueing musical scores for silent movies.

Frank's aptitude for piano, violin and the wind instruments was challenged by his flair for arranging

and composing. Subsequently, combined or singly, he became instrumentalist, singer and arranger for such bands as those of Ben Bernie, Horace Heidt, Alvino Rey and Rudy Vallee. Frank's instinctive comedy bits were evidenced on radio long before television audiences enjoyed his humor on "Pantomime Quiz."

### Radio-TV Commitments

In addition to his five-a-week versatility as conductor-arranger-singer-instrumentalist-comedian on CBS's five-a-week "Jack Smith-Dinah Shore-Ginny Simms Show," he conducts his own TV show, emanating from the Lido Ballroom in Long Beach over KTTV.

The Long Beach Chamber of Commerce has cited Frank for his contribution in combating juvenile delinquency. Saturday night finds seaside teen-agers jiving at the Lido and drinking Cokes while the "older folks" execute the more sedate dance steps.

Cashing in on her dad's musical-ventiveness, Linda DeVol, without parental confirmation, volunteered her father's service when her alma mater sorely needed a school song. Pressed into scholastic service, Frank composed a song for Van Nuys's Robert Fulton Junior High School. Two weeks later, quite coincidentally, according to Frank, the DeVols moved from Van Nuys.

### Scales and Sharps

Although Frank's round-the-musical-clock routine leaves him little time for hobbies, whenever possible he relaxes by reading or going to the movies. He's an inveterate moviegoer who, we suspect, pays more attention to the scoring than to the dramatics. An early riser, he usually works and lunches at his Toluca Lake home with his wife and two daughters, Linda and Donna, before racing off to the studios for rehearsal. On occasions when his radio show is taped in advance, Frank has arranged and recorded as many as thirty-five arrangements in a week. But if he had to do it all over again, the scales and sharps would win hands down.

associated with music. Everyone remembers tunes of the past. Another thing, we all recall the good, happy times, while we tend to forget the ugly, unhappy things. That's why I blend the music, the laughs and the dramatic into my show."

Hughes described his production as "A slice out of my own life. It's a story with heart in it, plenty of heart." His approach to producing is based on his ability to reach his listeners because he has trained himself to "feel their heart beats."

#### A Family Man

"Remember the Time" is a family-situation air show, which is a natural for Hughes. He boasts unhesitatingly: "I'm a family man. I believe in the American family." No one would deny that there is plenty of the "nostalgic stuff" in this KNX drama. That's exactly the way Hughes planned it. "A family, comedy situation . . . this is universal," he explained.

Hughes is one producer-director who believes that he has "the finest cast in radio. Mary Lansing ('Peg') has been one of my favorite radio actresses for years. She is a real, honest, sincere person." He praised both Gil Stratton, "Jimmie," and Marian Richman, who plays the eleven-year-old "Marianne." It's nothing for the members of his cast to change voice and play their own daughter or their own grandfather. Gordon's co-writer, Gomer Cool, is especially suited to working with Hughes on the scripts, because both men are about the same age and just chuck-full of memories.

As you might expect from a man who admitted, "My one ambition is to be known some day in show business as 'The Family Man,'" Hughes spends his spare time playing with the kids. He is known as "the only ole man in the neighborhood who plays with the neighborhood kids." With his two sons, Gordon, eleven years old, and Tim, aged five, Hughes has plenty of opportunity to indulge in his great love for boxing, swimming, football and baseball.

Hughes looks forward to the day when his "Remember the Time" will be on television. He knows that then he will make it the same kind of show . . . "not a great show, but a good show."

his air show, is proud to tell anyone that most of the scripts for his "Remember the Time" are based on his life experiences interwoven with old-time recordings which add the sugar and spice of the good old days.

As he explained it, all the girls he ever went out with are wrapped up in "Peg," his radio wife. Many of the air escapades enacted by his radio youngsters are duplicates of those which actually happened to the members of his own family, only perhaps at different ages.

Hughes has no trouble remembering those good old days, since he is blessed with an almost photographic memory. "Remember the Time" episodes concentrate on the music, recording artists, news events and happenings between the years 1917 and 1935. It's the period 1926 to 1930 which Hughes claims were "the wonderful years."

#### Memories

Our director calls his air show a "musical-comedy-drama" for a very specific reason: "Your memories are

# "Ham"?

**N**EWSCASTERS SPEND a great deal of time telling about other people's troubles.

When TV came around, the boys in the news room discovered they had a few problems of their own.

Nowadays, being seen on the screen has made the TV newscasters conscious of many aspects of show business to which previously they paid little attention.

The news staff at KNBH is a typical example. In Glenn Hardy, Elmer Peterson, Paul Pierce, and Don Rickles, the NBC-TV outlet has four of the finest and most respected announcers in the game.

Although these men belong to what might be called the "more conservative" school of announcers, even they have been concerned over the question: "How much of a 'ham' does a TV newscaster have to be in order to hold his audience?"

### The Experts Speak

Glenn ("I've always wanted to be an actor") Hardy admits "You have to be a little bit of a 'ham.' There is an extreme, however, and I try to hit the middle."

Elmer ("Being a former platform lecturer has helped me in TV") Peterson ad-libs most of his program with the aid of what he calls an "idiot sheet." (Just a big piece of paper, off camera, with key words written on it.)

"Although it would help to have some acting experience, the most important thing is to have a fundamental understanding of news," Elmer explained. "After all, if even the most capable actor got stuck for something to say, where would he be?"

The answer was obvious—looking for a job.

Paul ("I underplay the news") Pierce gave what he considered the three essentials for a successful TV newscaster: (1) a "sense" of news; (2) good physical appearance; and (3) a conventional approach, both in speech and mannerisms.

"I do not believe," Paul continued

emphatically, "that news should be over-dramatized. Contrary to the way many are doing it now, news should be delivered with a minimum of ranting and raving."

Don ("I get irritated with acting newscasters") Rickles brought out one final and very important point:

"You must remember that people who watch the news on TV are, in general, of the more mature type. A news broadcast is an entirely different type of program than a comedy show or a wrestling match. Taking this into consideration, it would be disastrous to 'ham' up a news program too much."
