Is There Chance for New Faces on TV?

Horace Heidt Talks About His Youth Program on Television

OUR YEARS ago Horace Heidt started hopscotching around the country developing his "Original Youth Opportunity Program." Today his great aim is to send many more such talented young performers into homes throughout the country via television.

Every night when it's "Family Night With Horace Heidt" on KLAC-TV, at least twenty of those young artists whom Heidt discovered on his cross-country talent search appear in front of the TV cameras. We asked this popular music man, who is world-famous for his work in helping unknown youngsters up the ladder of success, what he thought about TV as a medium for discovering talent.

Tremendous Opportunities

He said, "The opportunity for young people to perform on TV is tremendous. In the old days a beginner had to play the vaudeville circuits for eight or ten years before he was known. Now one TV appearance can do it. You're either in or out after your first video showing. All a beginner has to do today after guesting on a TV show is to go down to the nearest gas station the day after the act was on and ask the gas attendant if he liked it. The public today knows what is good and what is not good."

Heidt was a little hesitant about defining in a few words the word "amateur." He explained it this way: "I never considered anybody on our show an amateur. We had very complicated auditions for young people who wanted to join our group. These kids were not amateurs, they were American youth who were getting their first big opportunity. I guess an amateur is the person who goes on for the first time."

We asked him whether he thought there were still a great number of undiscovered artists in this country.

LYZABETH LYNCH, one of Heidt's discoveries, joins the music man in a musical arrangement on his KLAC telecast. "Yes, there are a tremendous number of unknowns. Why, if we took a good swing of America tomorrow we could come up with ten stars."

At present Heidt's TV show originates from the KLAC-TV studio, and according to Heidt there is not much chance of the telecast originating from his "Youth Opportunity Ranch" near Hollywood, because of technical problems.

New Faces on TV

He remarked that getting a start in television was "like starting all over again for me. Networks were all looking for comedy routines when I believed in a sincere family show. But that's an old story with me."

Heidt believes that his search for brand-new acts is just the thing television needs and television is just the opportunity the unknowns need.

He said he had told more than one TV executive, "You want new faces on TV? Our show does nothing but introduce talent, new faces."

In the future Heidt will continue to divide his time between television, personal appearances, radio and his "Youth Opportunity Ranch." Television will be his main interest, and he said, "We stick together out here on the ranch and we'll expand this thing into national scope soon."

arouses public interest. If the radio stations were ever eager for such a battle, certainly KMPC and KFWB of Los Angeles have had that opportunity during the current baseball season.

the current baseball season. First of all, the rivalry between the Hollywood and Los Angeles ball clubs has always been a natural.

KMPC, with Bob Kelley calling the shots, has been handling the Angels games exclusively ever since 1948. Well known for his provocative broadcasts, Kelley has never left any doubt in anyone's mind that he is strictly an Angel booster.

This year KFWB also decided to go all-out for baseball by obtaining rights to broadcast all the home and away games of the Hollywood Stars. To handle the play-by-play accounts of the games, the station and the Stars chose a newcomer to the West Coast, Mark Scott.

Battle Begins

At the beginning of the season both stations launched heavy promotion campaigns. They bought billboard displays and heavy advertising in the local papers. Most significant of all, each station had an average of thirty spot announcements every day on the air, stressing baseball coverage.

However, a "radio war," like any other conflict, isn't very effective unless personalities are involved. Certainly here was a chance for Kelley.

who has been known to criticize other announcers and writers, to really let loose with some of his sharp remarks. It was also an opportunity for young Scott to come on the scene with a verbal crash.

The fans waited. But nothing happened. Nothing happened, that is, except some very exciting ball games (including several eighteen-inning marathons) and some excellent playby-play accounts by both Kelley and Scott.

The name of Bob Kelley is familiar to all Southern California sports fans, especially for his work with the Angels and the Los Angeles Rams, professional football champions.

Mark Scott

Originally from Chicago, where he won seven letters in high school. Mark Scott was also a three-letter man at the University of Illinois. Before getting his "big break" out here he did some sports announcing in Indiana and Virginia, specializing in baseball. Relatively an unknown before hitting the West Coast, he has already received high praise for his style from both laymen and experts.

Since both of these men are usually on the air at the same time, they don't get a chance to hear each other very often. However, what they have heard, they have liked.

"I'm giving it to you straight," Mark commented one night after a ball game at Gilmore Field, "I think Kelley is one of the best in the country."

And Kelley: "I've not only met Mark personally and like him, but I've caught him occasionally on the air, and think he does a swell job."

How are you going to start a "radio war" on baseball when two "opponents" talk like that about each other? THE CREW OF SIX who weekly erect one of boxing's finest rings look about for the perfect place to start erection of the portable ring.

VERY WEEK, for televiewers only, the top amateur boxing champions of the nation slug it out. By now the eyes of probably every sports promoter in the country are fixed gloomily on Hollywood and this entry into the rich sports-promotion field. With reason.

Not only are the boxers the best of the amateurs, but the studios in which they fight provide the best ring possible. No box-office arena could afford the sort of equipment which is rushed into construction weekly. Showers, locker space and a padded fight ring run into real dough. An ordinary arena, with boxoffice take, can't afford this sort of thing. But TV can. That's because there isn't a stadium in the country, even filled to capacity, that can play to as many people as exist in the TV audience. And that TV audience pays for the arena, the showers, the lockers and the fight announcers through the powerful figure known today as the sponsor.

TV Will Elect the Next President!

(CBS-TV correspondent, who is now covering the conventions at Chicago, expresses his opinion in this exclusive story for TV-Radio Life).

I may not be able to predict who will be our next president but I certainly can predict with confidence who will elect that president. It will be you, the television audience. You who own those 17,300,000 television sets now in operation throughout the country and you non-owners who are frequent visitors in the homes of your friends who do.

It is a wonderful thing that you television viewers will play so important a role in the coming election because you are the best-informed people not only in this country but anywhere in the world. It has long been our philosophy that if you give the American people the facts they will make the right decisions. This election should help prove it.

Unprecedented

Never before in American history will a presidential candidate be seen and heard by so many millions of Americans. In the past no matter how widely a presidential candidate traveled he could see and be seen by only the smallest fraction of the people who will see him campaign on television this year. With the advent of radio, a candidate was able to reach with his voice millions of Americans who, for the first time, were able to hear words spoken by a candidate.

In the 1948 presidential campaign, the candidates were seen as well as heard by many people who had been denied this privilege in previous elections—but with only 403,000 television sets in homes — that number was small, indeed, compared to the people

who will see and hear the candidates on their television sets this year.

You people with television sets are able to hear answers from the candidates and their spokesmen to the kind of questions you would ask them if you were able to sit in the same room with them and, what is equally important, you are able to watch them as they give those answers. You learn much about the candidate's ability to deal with the people around him, the kind of impression he will make on representatives of business, labor and foreign governments, the very people he will have to deal with if he is elected president. You are able to hear and see him as he expresses his position on the vital issues of the campaign.

Lots of Work

CBS-TV made elaborate plans for the coverage of the conventions themselves. One entire wing of the second floor of that colossal amphitheatre five miles from the Loop in Chicago is being taken over by the radio and television networks.

Although the cameras on the floor of the amphitheatre are pooled, with each network contributing part of the equipment and part of the personnel, CBS-TV is doing a number of special originations in which Edward R. Murrow, Walter Cronkite and I, together with some fourteen other CBS correspondents, are taking part. We cover committee meetings and conferences that go on behind the scenes in hotel rooms where important decisions are being made. We bring before the CBS television cameras for interviews. delegates, candidates, and all sorts of interesting personalities at the convention.

The national committee members are evidencing tremendous interest in the television coverage of the convention and are constantly asking us questions about ways to get maximum effect. They are interested in discovering the kind of decorations, the kind of music and the type of lighting which will be most effective on television.

Mr. President-No Stranger

Thirteen weeks prior to election day, Westinghouse will sponsor on CBS-TV a special series of programs aimed at getting out the vote. The series is being planned so that it will be a new kind of Lincoln - Douglas debate. Spokesmen for each candidate will debate on each of thirteen major campaign issues which CBS-TV will select for coverage on this series. The national committees are being asked to select their best-qualified spokesman on each issue so the television audience will have a clear understanding

of just where each candidate stands on these vital questions.

When the sound and the fury have subsided and November 4 rolls around, the man who is elected president of the United States will be known by more people than any government official anywhere in the world. They will know better than any people have ever known what their president looks like, what his voice sounds like and for what he stands.

If local TV bxing fans are getting a little annoyed these days trying to figure out "wh's who" in the ring, I don't blame them.



Take the Harper-Fuentes fight (?) last week at the Olympic, for ex-ample. If you turned to Channel 13 in the middle of the second round, you would have Leard announcer Reed Kilpatrick making brief, descriptive comments about "Fuentes do-ing this," and "Har-

per doing that." But yos wouldn't have known for several rounds which guy he was talking about, because both boys wore the same kind of trunks.

Don't get me wrong; I'm not criticiz-ing Reed. He's been dong a fine job on KLAC's coverage of the Tuesday night brawls. This same problem of distinguishing the boxers has been bothering lots of TV announcers.

I've talked to several of the local lads and they all have the same trou-ble. They can't keep saying: "Fighter X has got his back to you now," or "Fighter X, who just threw that right, and was on your left, but is now in

the middle between the referee ind his opponent, looks tired."

The boys move around too fastn the ring for that kind of dialogue, id it would require too many tiresoe appositive clauses. TV announce realize that they should keep the words and comments to a minimu. and let the viewers do their ow. watching and form their own opinions

Many times, especially nowadays, one of the boxers is a Negro. As one announcer put it: "Sure, it would be a lot easier for me to say 'the colored boy' and 'the white boy.' But I don't believe in making that distinction amongst boxers."

This is the way it should be.

The boxing ring is one place where the Negro is assured of a fair shake. There's no color line in the squared circle. That's one place where a man has to stand on his own feet (or lie on his back), regardless of race, religion, or nationality.

The solution to this entire problem is fairly simple: make one boxer wear white trunks, the other, black.

For each bout, and especially those to be seen on TV, the State Athletic Commission should make it compulsory to have the boxers wear trunks of contrasting colors.

This rule would not require any added effort or expense. And it would be a big break for the TV announcer's voice and for the viewer's eyes and ears.

Let's face it. TV is not only here to stay, but it is now (and probably will be for some time to come) the number-one medium for selling a sport to the public.

If the State Athletic Commission takes the time to make looking a little more pleasant for the TV fan, the viewer in turn will make life a lot more pleasant for them. How a-boot it, gentlemen?

A HALF-JOKING REMARK ABOUT DOING a "Camel News Caravan" from Hollywood was made a few weeks ago by NBC's John Cameron Swayze at a wedding reception, but the person hearing it took the crack seriously and within a few days John Cameron heard his newsroom associates buzzing about the trip "Caravan" (and naturally star Swayze) were to make to California. Last week the junket materialized with three days' origination of the program from workers to put on the telecast, with

Hollywood headquarters and two days' origination from San Francisco's Top O' the Mark.

THE WORD "ORIGINATION" IS USED LOOSELY, for now that the program has celebrated its coast-tocoast spread by doing its first trans-continental telecast from Hollywood, you lookers know that "Caravan" travels, as it should, from pick-up to pick-up wherever there is news in the nation.

NEWS IS PLENTIFUL THIS YEAR and will still maintain high interest into the first of next year, according to Swayze, who thinks that whatever administration comes in will hold keen public interest. He naturally feels that TV is a potent conveyor of news and looks ahead to the day when the medium will be able to deliver all of its news by actual live pick-up on the news-origination spot. In New York, "Caravan" uses daily about thirty workers to put on the telecast, with about 100 persons actually on call.

NOT TOO MANY RADIO NEWS-CASTERS have made a completely successful switch from radio to TV, as successful switch from radio to TV, as Swayze has, so I asked him what he thought was the biggest stumbling block in switching. "Adherence to a script," he promptly answered. TV must be talked, not read, and eyes must be on the camera—"the right camera," he added smilingly as he re-called some of the times he had been caught looking earnestly into the lens of one camera only to discover that it wasn't "hot" at all.

COMING TO HOLLYWOOD WAS NOT a new experience for Swayze, for shortly after World War II he headed NBC's news and special-events depart-ment here. In fact, on this trip he spent some of his visiting time looking up former haunts. First day he was here he climbed into the fancy car decked out for promotional purposes

with "Camel News Caravan" and John Cameron Swayze emblazoned on the Cameron Swayze emblazoned on the side. Heading from the Beverly Hills Hotel, where he was putting up, to The Valley to take a look at his for-mer home, he was quite amused to see some people eyeing the car and then saying in subdued but perfectly audible tones, "Yes, it IS John Cam-eron Swayze." He felt flattered and till evite puzzled to know here people still quite puzzled to know how people here would recognize him so readily. Then the car and its curious passengers drove away and he saw that the li-cense plate was one from New York, where. Swayze is a household name.

LAST WEEK WHEN MY LUNCH-EON-INTERVIEW with the distinguished Swayze took place, we met at the Beverly Hills Derby, across the street from the Beverly-Wilshire Hotel, and as we stood on the corner after luncheon, John Cameron gestured air-ily toward the famed hostelry.

IT SEEMS THAT SIX YEARS AGO when he and his family moved to California, the housing shortage was still severe and the only decent place they could get to live in was a motel in Santa Monica. So every day, John Cameron would drive on Wilshire Boulevard from the motel to seek employment in Hollywood (where he soon was engaged at NBC).

MEANWHILE, MRS. SWAYZE HAD HER PROBLEMS trying to round up supplies, and if your short memory needs refreshing, I can remind you that right after the war it was still hard to get face tissues, candy bars and such. Since she was new in the (Continued on Next Page)

Little towns around St. Louis which had been closed, opened to collect \$4000 and \$5000 on the strength of Lou Thesz's name and reputation. In Montreal he drew \$25,000.

Off all these figures, Lou gets at least 15 per cent, plus expenses. Add these thousands up night after night and you can see he is doing very well for himself.

Lou says that he owes this bonanza to the publicity he received on the big match. He has a lot of ability and is well-liked by everyone, but his record has been up and down. He has been defeated, and has been held to a draw by many of the mat crop. In defeating Leone, he proved that he is the best of the current crop. By pinning the Baron for the final three-count, he made himself the biggest drawing card of all times—surpassing even the records of Ed "Strangler" Lewis, his manager, and Jimmy Londos during the gold rush of the roaring twenties.

I am taking off for a short vacation and have written Lou, asking him to do a guest column during my absence. I can't promise it as yet because my letter to him may not catch up with the traveler in time to make the deadline.

However, one sure guest writer will be Wild Red Berry, poet, philosopher, misogynist and matman extraordinary. Red will probably give the editor and printer fits trying to squeeze his awesome vocabulary into the space allotted for wrestling news.

Another bright spot on the wrestling horizon is the arrival on July 23 of Page Thirn four George and Bobby Becker, the personable boys from Brooklyn. Television fans will remember that we formed a trio and made with the singing before they left last fall. Georgie said that they were practicing up and should be in good volce for a concert when they arrive.

Also Gorgeous George is currently campaigning locally after a forced month's lay-off. The Gorgeous was riding at the peak of his career, traveling in the East with fabulous guarantees, when he was flattened, not by a flying tackle or a flying mare, but by the lowly, common mumps. He has spent the last month recovering on his Beaumont turkey ranch.

California Athletic Commission refused the station a license. But no license is necessary to stage an amateur sport on a TV station. The bouts are all conducted in complete compliance with the Amateur Athletic Union regulations, but no admission is charged at the studio. Hence, no license.

No sooner was the announcement made than the smell of pancake make-up, familiar around CBS-TV's studios, gave way to the smell of fresh lumber. By six o'clock of the first evening the popular four-round matches were staged, the ring was up, the cameras and lights were arranged, and Tom Harmon, Sports Director for CBS radio and TV, was casing the ringside for the spot most advantageous for his blow-by-blow account of the bouts.

By eight o'clock the smell of fresh wood had given way to a variety of odors usually found only around gymnasiums.

The Miracle of Tape

FTEN NEWSMEN find that miles and hours are insurmountable obstacles in covering a story, but not the editors of "CBS Sunday Desk." To them distance and time are like giants easily slain by a little radio invention called "tape."

It works like this. Barney Miller, night editor of the CBS-KNX newsroom, who is also the editor of "Sunday Desk," assigns CES reporters from Timbuktu to Hong Kong to cover any "hot" news story that occurs on their beat. During the week these stories come in to Miller at the CBS studio, where he listens carefully to the taped newscast. He clips these to the bone, combining bits of conversation, background noises and information until he has the complete story compiled in about three



or four minutes of air time. Each taped portion is then ready to be put on mike along with announcer Dick Joy's commentary.

"Sunday Desk" also includes the latest Hollywood gossip as reported by George Fisher, noted filmland columnist, and the up-to-the-minute sports picture as told by veteran sportsman Tom Harmon. Taped onthe-scene human-interest stories are aired each Sunday as part of the news broadcast.

Special coverage is given to any event which may have particular local interest in the regional Pacific Network area. Often as many as thirty or forty reporters have worked on the complete air show. It is nothing for stories to originate from Washington, Tokyo, New York, London, Paris and Glendale, California, all in the same thirty minutes.

Always a Newsman

Miller spends ten hours on Sunday and at least that many more hours during the week getting "Sunday Desk" into shape. This is, of course, besides his regular CBS editorial duties. He has been an ambitious writer ever since he started newspaper work during his college days at the University of Oregon. During the war he was in the Navy and traveled around the world twice, visiting many of the places where his top news stories originate today. radio actress Jessie See, and they have two sons, Michael, fourteen, and Patrick, nine. "Mike" is often busy acting on radio, while "Pat" spends his spare time acting in movies.

Dick Joy is the announcer who does his part of "Sunday Desk" "live," incorporating it with the taped sections from all over the world. Dick has been broadcasting news for fifteen years and plays much the same role on the newscast as an emcee does on a variety-type show.

Bob Hafter is director of the "Sunday Desk." He is the man who sees that the taped news stories and Dick Joy's commentaries get on the air in the proper sequence. His is a demanding job, because this type of broadcast is very tricky to put on the airwaves. When compared to a newspaper office, Bob is like the headman in the press room and Miller is like the editor.

Radio's Future

"Tape," according to Miller, "is more flexible and faster than any other medium." He believes that television will not be able to cover with the same speed, completeness and flexibility any story handled by radio tape.

Radio has a great future when it comes to news coverage, according to Miller. "Radio," he said, "is going to have to get back some of its adventurous, daring spirit. It can afford to try anything. If it doesn't work, it has nothing to lose and everything to gain for the listeners."

With the help of some disk-jockey friends, they advertised for applicants. Three hundred girls turned up for the audition. The boys sang and danced with every hopeful in turn to make sure they wouldn't miss a prospective "Lark."

When they came to girl number 278, they stopped the audition. They had their "Lark," and it was Toni. You have seen the resultant perfect blend of singing and dancing on CBS's Mel Torme Show and other variety offerings.

The Boys

It was Bob Smith who originally decided to form the Mellow-Larks, when he met Tommy Hamm at the time both were appearing in "Jolson Sings Again." Bob had come here from Des Moines, Iowa. The Navy introduced him to the West Coast, and after seven years of service he came back and trained at the Hayden Drama School.

Tommy, an Arkansas boy, had gone to Oklahoma A & M; started his show-business career as vocalist with the Orrin Tucker orchestra; had done a Coast Guard stint with Rudy Vallee, and had sung about in different vocal groups before the Jolson picture.
