HERE'S NOT A night of the week when you can't talk abcut fishing. For hours, But try to provide

hours. But try to provide a good, active film about fishing for even one night of every week. It isn't easy. The fish has a lot to say about what is going to come out on film and what isn't. If the pescados have filed for a few days, that's it.

Don't Count on the Fish

Mac McClintock, manager of the Pierpoint Landing and oftentimes central figure of KLAC-TV's exciting "Action Fishing" series, beats this tough rap through keynoting the Landing's fishing activities with informality. Every foot of film doesn't have to show the fisherman fighting a sail or marlin or tugging against the pull of a monstrous black sea bass.

When the camera was out on one of the half-day boats (Pierpoint sends out half-dayers, family boats, Catalina-bound, kelp boats, sleepers and anything else the sportsman demands), a film entitled "Set That Hcok" was to be made. The expert fisherman featured was ready for his part, and each time the bait was nibbled he worked away at setting

hooks with a vengeance. In his enthusiasm he pulled the stunt of the luckless beginner. He yanked so savagely that the bait, far from having the hook set, flew back and hit him in the face. This was left in the film of the evening. Mac felt probably every viewing fisherman could identify himself with the mishap.

First Nighter

The Little Theater Off Times Square Broadcast Has Never Originated There

HY SURE I'd like to revive the First Nighter series" was Barbara Luddy's instantaneous reply several months ago to an anonymous phone query.

As a result of this query, the familiar ring of "Curtain, curtain going up" is again heard along NBC airlanes, thanks to the anonymous caller, who is no longer a mystery. He is Mr. Frank Cooper, radio entrepreneur, who a g e n t ed comic Alan Young and persuaded a rightfully stubborn cosmetic firm to relinquish its broadcasting rights to "First Nighter."

Campana has owned "First Nighter" since its inception in 1930. After an absence of two years from the airlanes, they were persuaded to let the show return, even though they were no longer sponsoring it.

"First Nighter" scripts must meet rigid requirements. Acts of violence, abusive or sacrilegious language, and intended humiliation are taboo. Not only does "First Nighter" appeal to the Midwest "Bible belt" but it appeals to everyone who enjoys wholesome, gay entertainment.

Barbara Luddy

Diminutive Barbara Luddy has been co-starring in the "First Nighter" series since 1936. She lives in Van Nuys with her husband, Ned LeFevre, NBC staff announcer, and their two children, Christopher Michael, five, and Barbara Luddy, Jr., twenty-eight



months. Jovial Barbara has transferred her nickname, "Biddy," to her young daughter. With "Biddy" and "Biddy Little" being called about the house it sounds as if the Le-Fevres were characters from nurserybook land. "Biddy" senior spends a great deal of her spare time sewing. She loves to make frills for Junior and curtains, drapes and slip covers for the house. Her husband claims he can tell the seasons by the curtains in the windows.

Olan Soule

Barbara's leading man is Olan Soule. After a diversified theatrical background, Olan took over the regular male lead on "First Nighter" in 1943. His predecessors were Don Ameche, who introduced the show to radio audiences in 1936, and Les

Tremayne. Olan's youthful, studentlike countenance belies his years of show-business experience. At seventeen his initiation was with a repertory tent company, where he served as truck driver, prop man, drummer, actor and specialty performer. Since then he has become one of the country's finest dramatic actors.

When not actively participating on his radio prcgram, Soule works in motion pictures and television. In his spare time, he practices wood-working, is in charge of Cub Scout Pack 78, and is an active member of the First Christian Church of North Hollywood. Of his two children, twelveyear-old JoAnn shows promise of following a theatrical career; while tenyear-old Jon is busily preoccupied with more important things such as baseball.

The long professional association of Barbara Luddy and Olan Soule has fostered a fast friendship for their respective families.

For the Record

Just for the record, and with no intent for disillusionment, "First Nighter" broadcasts have never originated from Times Square. The prelude to an evening at the theater is so authentically re-created that it is difficult to convince some "First Nighters" that the show does not come from Gotham. But in keeping with the spirit of the show, tails and tuxedos are worn on certain occasions.

She Wins

From there on the audience took over. After hearing her heartbreaking story they chose her as "Queen for a Day."

Of course Mrs. Basch was excited about the many fabulous gifts regularly presented to the Queen. But her biggest thrill was realized when the DP mark on her arm was removed by plastic surgery.

Bailey Background

The ageless Bailey (he won't say how old he is) was born John Wesley Bailey III on September 15 in "the teens of the 1900's" in Hampton. Iowa. He's married, has no children, and lives in Hollywood.

During his lifetime the blue-eyed, brown-haired KHJ star has been an insurance salesman, cook (he has a book out called "What's Cookin'"), musician (plays five different instruments), instructor at a dance school, gas-heater cleaner, silverer, house painter (drawing is his favorite pastime), and, cf course, radio actor. A real Jack-of-all-trades, if there ever was one.

Will Not Abdicate

When asked if he ever got bored with the same routine day after day, Jack gave a straightforward answer.

"Maybe it sounds corny and trite. But I can honestly say I love to be around people and my job never gets monotonous. Even on bad days—and everyone has them—I get a pick-up from doing the show."

Concerning the future, Jack hopes to keep doing the same thing. "After all, you can't beat it," he commented. "The ladies do all the work, and we get all the money!"

shovel, remove the handle and replace it with a long broomstick handle. It is light in weight and easily handled. It serves as both hoe and shovel in the flower beds for light cultivating and certainly saves a lot of bending and backbreaking labor.

IF YOU HAVE AN OLD WOODEN SALAD BOWL AROUND, YOU CAN MAKE A VERY NICE CANDLE-HOLDER, FLOWER-BOWL COMBINA-TION, First paint or vanish it (so as to protect it for water), then drive a large nail straight through the center of the bottom of bowl, so that when the bowl is turned upright the point of the nail is sticking up about two inches. You then wrap the bottom of candle with scotch tape, about two inches up, so that when you gently push the candle down on the nail, it won't crack. That makes your candleholder. Now you can use the bowl to float flowers in, or put fruit in the bowl, or use it as a planter for ivy by placing peat moss in first (as peat moss doesn't need the drainage).

YOU DON'T HAVE TO LIGHT YOUR OVEN THESE WARM NIGHTS. JUST DO YOUH BROILING ON TOP OF THE STOVE. T ke as old cast-iron skillet and a grill ribbed rack from an old oven, and cut a circle about half an inch larger than the diameter of the skillet. Then bend the ends back the distance of the extra half inch so that the grill will be one-half inch from bottom of skillet. Steaks and chops broiled in this manner are just as delicious as those grilled in the outdoor harbecue pits and are much less trouble for just a family meal.

California outdoor living, television newscasting, the informality of KECA's "Sons of the Pioneers." and tinkering with cars interest George today more than anything he left behind in New York. One thing he left behind was an Eastern announcing record which caused Walter Winchell once to say, "George Putnam's voice is the greatest in radio." Time magazine also stated: "No other news caster or commentator has more listeners in the New York metropolitan area than George Putnam."

Started in Minneapolis

tion after leaving his home town of Breckenridge, Minnesota. After gaining experience in newscasting and as a general staff announcer, he went to NBC in New York in 1939. From 1941 to 1944 he shared the role of commentator for Movietone News with Lewell Thomas, was emcee of "The Army Hour" and narrator for "That They Might Live." In 1949 he did his first "Week End in Europe" with Tele-News, where he left New York on Friday evening, interviewed families in England, Germany, Ireland and Newfoundland and went on the screen the following Monday.

Putnam has learned a lot about the informality and family feeling of working in radio through his association with the famous "Sons of the Pioneers." He believes they are the "nicest gentlemen and artists" George is one newscaster who has faith in the listener. He said, "I think the listener is a lot brighter than he is given credit for. I want to deliver the facts to him, but let him form his own opinion."

Emphasis on Drama

His appeal as a TV newscaster comes from his intense determination to make reporting "dramatic." Although he reports on the visual and vocal mediums, he stated: "I still like to see the news in print."

When his time is his own, George likes to go horseback riding, train dogs, tinker with his car, talk to people out of his profession and just "enjoy living."

At twenty-four there wasn't enough of anything for George, but today at thirty-eight he has nc great desire for wealth or fame. He isn't looking for the exciting story to give him stimulation to go on in his career because "every day's work is a highlight in my career."

AUL PIERCE, moderator for KNBH's "First - Time Voters," takes a positive stand on one thing. "Politics is serious business on television. We are not in the business of starting fights on TV."

Each week Paul, long familiar to radio and TV audiences on other shows, welcomes four or five firsttime voters to his "First-Time" panel. He also invites two politicans who will answer all questions regarding this year's presidential election, put to them by the panelists. Such men as Averell Harriman, Democratic candidate for President; Thómas Joseph Mellon, Northern California manager of "Governor Warren for President"; and David Foutz, representing Estes Kefauver, have been on camera.

Informative

Paul believes strongly that this type of panel telecast should be informative, above all else. He objects to panelists who deliberately ask "loaded" questions or questions aimed at embarrassing the politicans or taking personal slaps at them. It is not meant as a "sounding board" for citizens who have rabid opinions for or against any political party, maintains moderator Pierce.

During the question - and - answer sessions on the KNBH program, Paul feels like a "verbal juggler." He uses diplomacy rather than a gavel to bring order to the verbal exchanges. He admits that he does get "that desperate feeling when someone starts talking." He said, "I wonder what they are going to say next. The whole thing could go completely overboard in a second. People get very excited when they start talking politics."

No Expert

Many viewers think Pierce is an expert on politics simply because he moderates "First-Time Voters." Pierce disclaimed any such credit, stating "I know all about the political situation, but only because I take time to study the news every day. Of course that is only natural, as I do it for my nightly TV newscast."

He believes most citizens are uninformed because "They don't take time to watch, listen to and read both sides of current political issues." "First-Time Voters' " moderator does not worry about pulling viewers away from top entertainment video fare such as "I Love Lucy" or Arthur Godfrey. He said, "There is excitement building every day during this political year. We don't have any trouble getting our share of the audience."

"First-Time Voters" always makes an effort to keep discussions current. Before the convention they concentrated on convention delegates, during the convention it was the campaign itself and after the convention it's the mechanics of voting.

"Non-Partisan" Paul

Paul doesn't take any credit for originating the idea of "First-Time Voters," which he believes is "wonderful for TV, for the viewers, for the agency and for myself." He insists

In his position as moderator of a political panel, he makes a serious effort always to maintain his "nonpartisan" viewpoint when he is on camera. Of course he receives letters from viewers accusing him of favoring Republicans and others accusing him of being partial to Democrats, often on the same telecast.

He believes that the greatest question yet asked on the show came from an immigrant woman. She asked both politicians, "What is the difference between a Republican and a Democrat?"

Paul mentioned that he enjoyed well-known political leaders who anpeared as panel members. We wondered why he hadn't asked the famous Hungarian panelist, Zsa Zsa Gabor, to appear on his panel.

"Zsa Zsa Gabor? No, because my wife would never forgive me if I did."

Late, But Still First

That the show was an immediate success was not too surprising. The most amazing part about this story of "graveyard TV" is that no station in Los Angeles had thought of it before.

Previous to KTTV's experiment, the chip other known all-night program on television was on WDTV in Pittsburgh, one of the nation's leading steel centers. Figures indicate that the Smoky City had approximately 220,000 people working on the swing shift.

A survey taken by KTTV showed that there were more than 465,000 people working on the swing shift around Los Angeles.

Honesty Pays Off

Actually, as we have already stated, Jackson Wheeler was almost forced into this TV gold mine. He didn't have to do it.

A former CBS announcer ("I have the unique reputation of having done 4,200 consecutive coast-to-coast broadcasts"), he had already made his two movie shows and his own fifteenminute sports program the largest one-man advertising account on KTTV's books.

He and his wife, Thelma, have two children, Charles, eight, and Judith Elizabeth. five, and are expecting a third addition to the family. An active Cub-scout leader, Wheeler recently turned down a \$100.000 contract to go back to New York.

Described as "the West Coast's Arthur Godfrey," he sells his products on the assumptions that "people are not stupid" and that "honesty pays off."

No Superlatives

"I don't 'schlock' the people. I never use superlatives such as 'best,' 'wonderful,' or 'beautiful.' Instead of pushing my products in the public's face. I merely ask my viewers to try



in my office for anyone who wants to see them!")

After consulting with the wheelsthat be at KTTV, the bossman of Jackson's Theater added another movie to his regular fully sponsored shows. (Matinee, 2:30 p.m.; and Owl them. The day I put on something that is wrong, that's the day I'll quit television."

The day will never come, as long as Jackson Wheeler keeps rolling along TV's Revenue Avenue the way he has been.
