HEN it comes to beauty problems, there is scarcely a woman alive who isn't faced with some perplexities. Far

Rita LaRoy, KTTV's "Glamour Session" queen, was informative and frankness itself when we asked her "What's Wrong With Most Women?" She outlined five common denominators that we femmes are partially or wholly guilty of.

Completency

Undoubtedly you have been aware, at one time or another, of these five Page Four beauty failings. Newspaper and magazine features, radio and TV commercials are constantly hammering "beauty," "grooming" or what have you. Perhaps we have been overly saturated by these reminders and have become immune to them. Procrastination will not give you the trim figure you've been dreaming about or that peaches and cream complexion you envy. "Wishing will not make it so; better get busy and start doing something for yourself," cautions Rita.

Following are the faults which, Rita claims, trap more women most of the time:

Overweight—is a problem that requires more will-power than anything else. Watching those calories is a challenge worth meeting ... slimming down will do wonders for your health as well as your appearance.

Hair—is, as the old saying goes, "a woman's crowning glory," but some women are crowned by Zulu creations. Hair conditioning starts with cleanliness, then comes proper styling.

Skin—is a mirror which requires babying. Diet, cleanliness and suitable cosmetics are the basic ingredients.

Posture is a physical and emotional combination. Sloppy walking habits are more frequently than not caused by too high a heel. Lack of confidence in one's self can be spotted by your gait. Your head and shoulders are meant to be held high and not burrowed down like the head of an ostrich.

Make-up—is to create an optical illusion, not disillusionment. Color and subtle shadings are all-important; $h \in a \lor y$ theatrical make-up should be confined to the stage.

Self-Improvement

Frankly, Rita LaRoy hasn't expounded anything new or unusual. But she is adamant in her insistence on self-improvement, and her definition of personality is one that is practical . . . "Personality is confidence in your appearance plus your thinking." Not Webster-ian, true, but beauty-wise it has a great deal of applicability.

Rita, a former actress, is a television pioneer . . . she's been in it since 1947. In addition to her twiceweekly KTTV show, she keeps busy with her accredited modeling school and agency. One of her favorite stories concerns a young housewife who enrolled for a modeling course because her marriage was on the rocks. She wanted to prepare herself for a career so she could be gainfully employed after her divorce. Mrs. Housewife quit after three months to take a second honeymoon with her reawakened, re-enamored husband.

The Popular Cowboy Has to Face the Fact That TV Is No Longer a Novelty — Rogers and Autry Are!

NE SWELTERING day last July a black-shirted, leanlooking cowboy hero rattled his spurs down a flight of steps and into the NBC photo lab. It was "Hopalong Cassidy," on hand to trade blazing sunlight for blazing lab lights during a three-hour session of publicity stills, color shots for magazine-cover use, and action pictures for story illustration.

"Hoppy's" popular picture-length features, boiled down to a commercial fifty-five minutes, had been running weekly on KNBH, and soon the silver-haired immortal's new halfhour epics were to start on the full NBC-TV network.

A teetering four-legged chair was the only prop used by Bill Boyd. A huge still and color camera, light tripods and a bank of bulbs filled most of the room. The "background" was the one plain wall of the cubicle. The other three were lined with Christmas trees, Easter cutouts, shelves of photographic equipment, charts, and blow-ups of favorite shots of the cameramen.

"Things sure have grown since the last time I was on this exact site." drawled the handsome actor. "It was thirty-two years ago to the month I visited Sunset and Vine, and came in an entrance at probably this same spot, to make a picture. It was the old Famous Players lot then," twirling his handsome ivory and white

.45's. "That was my first picture, 'Why Change Your Wife,' with Milton Sills playing the lead."

The shooting session became warm and tedious. But Boyd, with never a touch of temperament or temper, posed, rattled off anecdotes and answers, punctuating the conversation with his famous booming laugh.

"Someone asked me the other day why I'm making new pictures for TV. I guess I'm just tired of seeing the old ones myself!"

At a question about "Topper," Boyd showed the first defensiveness against the questioner who obviously felt the big white steed might have carried "Hoppy" safely through enough adventures to have earned rest.

"Why, I wouldn't make a picture without him! He's the same horse, just as pretty," mused "Hoppy" fondly. "Right now he's busy doing what I have been working at—taking off some weight!" Again the big "Hoppy" laugh.

As Boyd worked, a real phenomenon among the working people in a television station occurred. Stars are not by any means a rarity around NBC. Work never stops, words aren't hung upon, and heads don't turn. But with the cowboy to end all cowboys on hand, completely blase publicity men put down their newspapers and grinningly listened. Mail girls with arms full of envelopes, at least some of which must have been marked "Rush," drifted in and stayed. Other personnel stood by, goggling like regular sidewalk autograph hounds.

The enthusiasm extant seemed an answer to the question that must have been on every mind. Can "Hoppy" do it again? Can he be the top TV attraction he was two, three and four years ago?

"Cassidy" had been off the screens at home for a year or so, and during that time well-known contemporaries of his, Gene Autry and Roy Rogers, had each made a bow to King Moppet.

Finally, encouraged by Boyd's outspoken good humor, someone dished it out. Point-blank came the question of competition hurting "Hoppy." Without batting an eye or deviating from the pose he held for the camera, the veteran actor waxed as frank as the question directed to him.

"It hasn't hurt me now. There's no change in our merchandising, and that's a good indication. Things may have quieted down out there, but if I could take you with me for just one day around the country, I'd show you what I mean.

"I think the best explanation of 'Hoppy's' popularity is the fact that I don't have to count on solely the kid audience. They have fads, and always will. Good healthy sign. But I have two other generations who know me.

"There are the grandparents of today. They must have liked my first pictures, or the picture business wouldn't have made me a star. That's all based on cold cash that pictures bring in. You get the box office, or you don't get the star build-up.

"Then there are the parents of today's kids. These people are old enough to remember me, too. Now these parents and grandparents probably never heard of Roy Rogers before their kids started acting like him and wanting Rogers outfits.

"As far as 'making it again' goes— I don't think I've ever lost it," he grinned.

"And remember one more thing. My pictures will never be dated. The period they portray is sixty years old now. In twenty years the Early West is still going to be the Early West, an era that never loses its appeal. The clothes won't look ridiculous, they will merely reflect a time. What Happened to Lanza:

Several years ago a round-faced young singer of Italian descent let fly with the voice that he himself likened to Enrico Caruso's. That point re-mained moot, but no doubt lingered about his popularity. Girls swooned and bought new eight-by-ten picture

frames. The singer, Mario Lanza, made a movie in which he played Caruso. Box - office "take" shot up. Time Mag. azine interviewed the new rage, and likened his ego to his appetite. Both huge. But the Lan-za - sung "Be My



Love" sales contin- Mario Lanza ued, undeterred by rumors of the recording artist's fondness for spa-ghetti and rudeness to the press.

Radio Favorite

Finally an NBC radio show was built around singer Lanza, and a pretty solvent corporation by the name of Coca-Cola adopted the pay check each week.

For two years Lanza sang a night a week, and radios everywhere tuned the local NBC outlet, which co-starred a Canadian girl vocalist.

More rumors started. This time they concerned the temperamental Latin's bombastic ill-temper at radio rehearsals. But his public's applause contin-ued, at a far more even keel than the star's weight, which seemed to vary like the thermometer of a night-cool-ing desert. Up and down, up and down.

Word got out that a big studio was slimming Lanza down for a new pic-ture, "The Student Prince," destined to top even his Caruso role. The picture went into production, but Lanza didn't. He simply failed to show up for work. Trouble more than brewed. It boiled away at a great rate.

Kill the Picture

Finally, in an unprecedented move, studio executives called off the top-budget production and threatened to sue the star whose continued absence from the set had put them in the red more than \$700,000.

An apparently penitent Lanza ef-fected a "reconciliation" and the stu-dio doors were thrown open to the young artist for "talks." But Mario didn't show up again! Trade-paper re-ports had him angrily moving from the home of his parents; speeding un-concernedly down Sunset Boulevard in a bright car; battling over a Chinese dinner; and finally squabbling with the old friend who was sheltering him during the whole huge storm.

But Mario went on with his radio show. This he apparently liked. And certainly listeners liked him.

Until one night when millions of radios turned to the right spot on the dial and the announcement floated out

that this was the Coca-Cola Show fea-turing Miss Gisele MacKenzie.

The pretty dark-haired Gisele had been sharing the show with the starchloving star for two seasons. With great dignity the sponsors offered no expla-nation. They still haven't. An eager press, knowing full well that by this time the movie company was seriously considering abandoning "The Student Prince" and had ordered its attorneys to proceed with a suit against the star for money already sunk in production, were wild to get to the feed box and get the dope.

Too Busy

The agency which does publicity for Coca-Cola straightfacedly released this information: "Lanza is in the midst of negotiations with MGM regarding the resumption of the filming of 'The Stu-dent Prince' and is contractually unable to appear on his radio show until the problems which interrupted the production of the picture are straight. ened out

The problems are straightened out. MGM did abandon the picture. It did order its attorneys to proceed against the star with a suit for the cash in-volved. The studio felt five million odd dollars a fair amount.

Almost concurrent with the suit against the singer, Coca Cola gave up its radio show. September 26 saw Gisele warbling her last note, alone, for the soft-drink company. And Ray Sinatra, a composer-pianist of some distinction, raising the baton for the last time. At least this year.

Meanwhile, rumors about the self-styled Caruso continue to float. But they will scarcely answer the idle wonderings of the millions who find a new show wafted to them during the old time . . . such idle wonderings as "Whatever do you suppose happened to Lanza?"

TV Daddy Talks About Baby

Allen B. DuMont, the father of television, didn't stay in Los Angeles very long last week, but he certainly had plenty to say at a special press conference at the new Statler Hotel.

Dr. DuMont, who admits he has been mistaken on numerous occasions for Dwight Eisenhower, answered questions freely and directly on almost every phase of TV during the hourlong session. Very briefly, here were some of the highlights:

1. The average TV screens used in homes will get larger than the twentyone-inch screens now so popular.

2. The number of lines on our screens (about 525 lines) will remain the same.

3. Because of cost factors, eighty per cent of TV manufacturers do not equip sets with the maximum set of lines, DuMont utilizes approximately 400 lines, while others vary from 250 to 300.

L. East of Omaha, Dr. DuMont says, the DuMont network is the third largest, right behind CBS-TV and NBC-TV.

5. Most independent TV stations, like independent radio stations, will have a touch time of it financially, and sooner or later will have to affiliate with larger networks.

6. Color TV will not be available on large scale for five to ten years yet.

7. If the FCC approves of it, pay-asyou-go TV has great possibilities.

Theater TV will not greatly affect home TV.

9. Even with UHF, there won't be more than 800 TV stations throughout the nation.

10. International TV (except for links between Canada and Mexico and the U.S.) is still a long way off.

Directly active in television ever since 1928, "Daddy" DuMont gave the over-all impression that he has not only been vitally interested in his brainchild during the formative years,

SENATOR NIXON'S TV (AND RADIO) speech has been pretty well chawed over by now. But before the furor dies down completely, let's reiterate the obvious: that more than ever lookers realized the potency of the TV medium. I wished I might have turned from TV and tuned the radio for a few minutes to determine how much the audio suffered by comparison with the video, but those

radio listeners with whom I later checked apparently used their imaginations to complete their own pictures, for they were, they admitted, frankly moved.

AGREE WITH THOSE WHO THOUGHT the cameras were trained too often on Mrs. Nixon. Once would have been enough to show her tense form and fixed face. I agree that Nixon may have overdone it a bit with the dog incident. But I disagree with those who picked other flaws with the presentation, because inherently this was not a "production," but the plea of a man with his career at stake. He was not talking just to TV and radio crit-ics. He was talking to his countrymen, and the proof of his effectiveness did not lie in the grace with which his stance and gestures struck his viewers but in the fact that people professedly not of his political thinking admitted that they got lumps in their throats.

"WELL, THAT'S THE WAY SHE GOES," said "Mr. Peepers," as usual, when he signed off his summer stint for Ford last week. Whereupon, this reporter felt rebellious. For I have enjoyed the whimsy and gentle satire of Wally Cox (I call him a male milque-toast "Miss Brooks"). I think that if "My Little Margie" is good enough to nab a sponsor for winter TViewing, so is "Peepers." Last week, his bit of business with the mailman about the rainy weather was delicious. It cap-suled the cliche-sagging comments

that everyone makes when it's drip-ping. And "Peepers'" halting goodbye to the school nurse and the English teacher's poem-reading production at the induction center were priceless. It's a crying shame to see a chuckly show like this go down the drain, and I hope the protesting letters pour into NBC, New York, not only to keep "Peepers" but to sell him "Well, that's the way she goes" definitely should not apply to this teleseries.

NBC's "Railroad Hour," long noted for its professional interludes, became unwittingly but pleasantly involved

Jerry was so impressed that he brought the lyrics to Hollywood and showed them to the "Rail-road Hour's" choir director, Norman Luboff, who com-posed a lilting melody to match the student's delight-ful lyrics. "It's Some Spring" was given the full treatment for its debut. Gordon Mac-Rae, Carmen Dragon's orchestra, and the Norman Gordon MacRae Luboff Choir presented the song on the "Railroad Hour's" coast to coast broadcast.



Britain's Transcription King

Many of our listeners are aware of transcribed radio series such as Frederic W. Ziv's "I Was a Communist for the F.B.I.," starring Dana Andrews, and "Bold Venture," which starred Humphrey Bogart. These are samples of which starred Humphrey Bogart. domestic radio productions.

Representing the English counterpart of Ziv and other American transcription firms is Towers of London, Ltd. Harry Alan Towers, at thirty-one, produces and distributes more transcribed radio shows than anyone else in international commercial broadcasting. Since 1946, the fairskinned, dark-haired Englishman has built his business until he now produces and sells forty programs of his own and distributes sixty others. His shows are heard from Hong Kong to Trinidad.

Currently NBC, CBS and MBS are airing Towers platters. Mutual carries the Gracie Fields Show and "Black Mu-seum" starring Orson Welles. NBC features "The Adven-tures of the Scarlet Pimpernel," starring Marius Goring, and CBS has logged adaptations of C. S. Forester's novel "Captain Horatio Hornblower."

Ordinarily radio producers, with only one continent to cover, have trouble gauging public reaction to a show. Towers has to worry about the world. He sees to it that his shows "are suited for the whole English-speaking world." Towers tapes every kind of show, and somehow most of them have an international flavor. At the moment, Towers is leery of crime shows. He detects a world-wide "revulsion" against them.

I hope Flo Chadwick makes 50,000, 000,000 dollars. She's earned every single cent she ever gets.

The "Remote"



OST Southern California TV lookers were but dimly aware of what a "remote" in telecasting meant un-

til two and one-half years ago when a little golden-haired girl plunged to her death in a deserted San Marino well. At that time, KTLA and KTTV rose to the tense situation and, by dint of tremendous labor, ingenuity and endurance brought the TV lookers of Southern California an intimate glimpse of the Kathy Fiscus rescue efforts.

Not All Tragedy

Since this sad but memorable incident televiewers of Southern California have grown accustomed to all kinds of "remotes." In fact, they invariably expect that any disaster, manhunt, troop return, visit of a celebrity and other interesting events will be brought directly into their living rooms by remote telecasting.

Lookers have had loge seats for such telecasts as the A-bomb blast, General Eisenhower's visit, Marine

maneuvers, MacArthur's homecoming, the Tehachapi earthquake. Warner Brothers' fire, and Florence Chadwick's Catalina Channel swim. The Cost

In receiving such telecasts in the comfort of their living rooms, very few viewers realize the amount of stamina and effort involved on the part of the remote crew. Relay stations must often be erected and put into operation. Rugged terrain must be conquered, thousands of dollars worth of equipment must be safely transported and often life and limb placed in jeopardy. Take. for example, the case of KNBH in televising the Catalina swim: About twenty people and a forty-foot remote-control unit were required to telecast that thrilling event. When KTLA covered the Tehachapi earthquake recently. not only were the usual twenty people and two remotecontrol trucks needed, but enough food to last two days and one night. For insurance reasons. none of the markets or restaurants could touch their supplies.



THE FIRST MICROWAVE telecast of atom tests was made by KTLA's able staff. The cameras were fastened to the top of the remote truck with ropes to withstand the powerful shock of the blast.

RUGGED TERRAIN held no barrier for KTLA's equally rugged crew, who with the pooled assistance of the other six local television stations effected transmission of atombomb tests made at Las Vegas

Gene Autry's Success Formula ... No Variation From the Tried and Proven

York and try the big time. Autry took Will Rogers's advice and went to the big city, but didn't exactly make the grade then.

Gene went to Oklahoma and was working at a local station when Art Satherly, of Columbia Records, who had seen Autry in New York, came to visit Gene. He was impressed enough to have the cowboy make his first recording, "That Silver Haired Daddy of Mine." It has since become one of the twenty top sellers of all time (over 5,000,000 copies) and Gene has become one of the top recording personalities of all time. He's one of the few to have ten songs sell over a million copies.

Many Activities

But records and his weekly CBS Gene Autry Show are only two of his many successful ventures. He's actively engaged in movies, where he's remained as a top star for over sixteen years. He has his own television productions, owns five ranches, oilwell interests, two music publishing companies, radio stations and a Western store in Arizona.

Any one of these enterprises would tax the average man's energy, but Autry is not an average man. He believes nothing succeeds like success and has proven it. In addition to all these time-consuming activities, he also makes six rodeo performances a year and fulfills many personal-appearance engagements. His energy at the end of a day, week or year is as boundless as a schoolboy's, because he has learned the art of relaxation. Characteristically, Gene insists that there's no secret to his record. "I have always tried to make the most of what I had. I never depend on luck, but I sure take advantage of it when it comes along. What success I've had has come mostly from hard work and concentration, day after day, year after year. That's the basis for a long life in show business. Don't let the public forget you."

GENE AUTRY TAKES TIME OUT TO WRITE a letter in the cabin on his private plane, which he pilots to and from his personal-appearance tours. The CBS star credits his success to hard work and stick-to-it-iveness. HELPING GENE BEHIND THE SCENES and a great contributing factor to his success is his lovely wife Ina Mae Spivey. The Autrys celebrated their twenty-first wedding anniversary last April.





BS'S Gene Autry, a product of Tioga, Texas, parlayed a natural talent, a twelve-"bit" guitar, advice from the late Will Rogers, and a capacity for hard work into one of the most phenomenal success stories in show business.

Rogers's Advice

When Gene was a telegraph operator, he spent his spare time between messages singing and playing his \$1.50 guitar. One night a man came to the telegraph office to wire the syndicated column he was writing. As he stood at the window, he heard Autry going through his repertoire. After the message was sent, the man told Gene that he should go to New

Music means everything to Cliff. He met his wife, Toodie, while working as accompanist for an amateur contest in which she was competing. Cliff fails to tell how she fared in the contest, but evidently everything worked out all right, as they were married in 1939 and now have four children. Judy, the eldest, twelve, shows promise of following in her dad's footsteps.

"She has participated in the intermission quiz of the "Symphony for Youth' broadcasts," he said proudly. "and what's more she knows the right answers." Judy studies piano and some day hopes to become a concert pianist.

One portion of his show, in particular, rewards Cliff with a deep feeling of gratification. That is the segment devoted to filling requests submitted by shut-ins. "It is more than satisfying to be able to bring a little joy to shut-ins," he says. "It makes me feel that my music, aside from its entertainment value, is serving a worthwhile purpose. After all, it doesn't require too much stretch of the imagination to think that perhaps my music has some psychotherapeutic value."

Like most musicians, Cliff traveled a great deal. He played the usual circuits, and was a member of the October 3, 1952 orchestra aboard the S.S. Bremer. This engagement came to an abrupt end when the German ship was taken into custody in 1939. One of Cliff's favorite stories concerns the time he doubled in brass at a small hotel.

His booking covered piano renditions supplemented by waiting on tables. Cliff was great on the ivories, but got into a lot of trouble as an intermission waiter. He just couldn't remember the patrons' orders and was finally fired for not being sharp. Cliff is quite certain he's the only musician in history ever to be fired because he was not sharp.

A MUSICIAN WHO wants his children to become musicians all four of them. The eldest, Judy, is adept at piano and cello already.





Turntable Tintypes No. 9 of a Series **Frank Bingman**

N A CLEAR, bright night, you can see the "man in the moon." Each weekday night at 10:30 over KECA, you can hear "Music from the Moon."

Because his name is never mentioned on the program, few people realize, however, that the suave, mellow voice behind "Music from the Moon" belongs to Frank Bingman.

Frank is no stranger to radio fans. He's been out here in California since 1937, and has handled dozens of announcing chores, Abbott and Costello, the Ginny Simms Show. "Great Gildersleeve," Jack Benny Show, Joan Davis Show, "Maxwell House" and "Hollywood Players" among them.

Born, reared, and educated in Washington Court House (it's a town, not a building), Ohio, Bingman hitchhiked to New York at the age of seventeen. Combining a scholarship with a busboy's job, he attended the Feagin School of Dramatics for a year.

Back in Ohio, he worked in a grocery store until another scholarship came along, this time at the Schuster-Martin School in Cincinnati. Here, he became a free-lance actor in radio and met and married his wife, Valyanya.

In Frank's own words, "She's the brains in the family," and operates a dancing studio. They live in their own home in Outpost section of Hollywood, and have one child, Bruce Michael, eight.

During World War II, Frank worked on radar, and saw combat duty in several Pacific invasions, set up a radio station in Korea, and was honorably discharged with several decorations.

Returning to Hollywood, he worked at KFAC and Mutual, and has been with ABC since October, 1951.

Five nights a week, this "man from the moon" comes "down to earth" and broadcasts the ten o'clock news over KECA.
