The "New" Penny Singleton

A CUTE LITTLE blonde stepped into the spotlight at the famed Biltmore Bowl. In her hotel room before the show, she described

herself as being "green as grass." Working at supper clubs was an entirely new experience for her.

Like a diminutive doll, she sang, she danced, she cracked jokes. Her voice had a wide, vibrant range; her shapely legs glided through a classy Charleston; her comedy routine sparkled with fresh, witty lines, delivered with professional touch.

At the end of each skit, smiling faces and wild applause demonstrated that the crowd enjoyed what they saw and heard.

Everyone in the audience knew the young lady. It was Penny Singleton, better known to millions of Americans as just plain "Blondie."

New Yet Old

Although the people there had at one time or another undoubtedly laughed at the zany antics of "Blondie" and "Dagwood," that night they were not applauding a memory.

They were applauding a new, fresh face on the show-business scene. The "new" Penny Singleton.

Actually, Penny started out as a singer. When only nine years old (her name then was Dorothy McNulty) she got a job singing for illustrated song slides in a Philadelphia movie house.

Later, as a singer-dancer-comedienne, she appeared in several musical shows on Broadway. After many different types of movie roles in Hollywood, she finally became "typed" as "Blondie" of the famed Chick Young's comic strip. All told, she and "Dagwood" (Arthur Lake) made dozens of movies and piled up over 600 radio shows to their credit. Several years ago, the team broke up.

Comeback Trail

With the exception of a six-week stint with Ken Murray's "Blackouts" and a few TV shows back East, "Blondie" went into a sort of semiretirement.

That wasn't too hard to take, either, because in private life she is happily married to movie producer Robert Sparks, and is the devoted mother of two lovely girls, Susie, nine, and Dorothy, sixteen.

However, Penny came back with an entirely different routine, and even a cute new hair style which she calls "My Dutch Boy," or "Penny's Bang Bob."

One night after her performance she explained the reasons for her comeback.

"I've been in show business all my life. Show-business people are my kind of people. I believe that anyone in this business has a gift. They have been given this gift for a special reason, and they should use their talent for the enjoyment of others as long as they can.

"My work does not disrupt my family life. And as long as I can make people happy, I shall continue to do so."

Following her appearance at the Biltmore, Penny expected to play at several night clubs and make guest spots on television.

She is also very much interested in doing her own show on TV. Judging from her successful supperclub engagements, she seems to be a sure bet for a future TV career.

It won't be the "old Blondie," though. It'll be the "new Penny," which is really another version of the "old Dorothy." It's confusing on paper, but mighty pleasing on stage.

They All Sing His Praises

French-Born Director Philippe deLacy Has Many Admirers

HILIPPE DE LACY, KTTV director, has an enviable number of friends. Unsolicited, they sing his praises.

The modest, handsome, talented director was reticent on only one subject, himself. When it came to television, he was brimming over with conversation.

Philippe believes that some day the stature of television directors will receive the recognition accorded to those in the motion-picture industry. A director's identification with a telecast will have the same significance as the names of directors John Ford, John Huston and George Stevens have to motion pictures. He feels that eventually a star system will evolve around TV directors.

"A good director is not merely a technician," he says. "He must have an imagination and a talent to understand everyone's point of view... actor, writer, cameraman ... and be able to direct and coordinate all facets as one would on a football team."

Philippe has had an excensive background in the entertainment field. In 1921 at the age of four he began his theatrical career, appearing with Geraldine Farrar. Later he was in such stage productions as "The Bluebird," "Spring Fever," and "Winterset." His films included "Peter Pan," "Beau Geste," "Anna Karenina" and "Four Feathers."

Subsequently Philippe tried his hand as a motion-picture director. In 1937 he joined the "March of Time" as an assistant to Louis de Roche-

mont. His rich and varied experiences with these film documentaries helped him immeasurably with live TV documentaries. When Time did a feature on Father Divine, Philippe was in close association with the cult for two months. They dubbed him "Blessed Lamb."

Although they do not articulate the name bestowed upon him by Father Divine, his associates at KTTV think the name suits him to a T. Philippe is patient and understanding. He never loses his temper. He joined the station the day it opened. His credits include "Success Story," "Without Fear," Buster Keaton, Joe Adams, and a host of other shows.

Philippe likes special-events telecasting because no other medium can compete with its on-the-spot coverage. He thinks phonevision is the coming thing. And he wants to go on record as saying that in his opinion KTTV has the greatest creative group of engineers in town.

For the record this is what some of his associates have to say about him.

An agency director, Leonard Shane: "Philippe deLacy is the cleverest and most versatile TV director in Hollywood. Obstacles never stand in his way. His creative ability sweeps them aside ..., he puts his heart and his soul in his work."

Television actress Lenore Kingston: "Philippe is a thorough showman, an artist with great vision. He isn't afraid to allocate some responsibility to the technical crew. He can draw the proper response from an actor... His over-all understanding of the end product puts him head and shoulders above other television directors."

HANDSOME deLACY has a glib tongue when it comes to television, but when he is the subject of conversation he becomes most reticent.



Religion Is News On Channel 2



Nearly all television and radio stations schedule programs revolving around religious themes. The customary practice, however, was supplanted by "Light of Faith," which is under the immediate supervision of Grant Holcomb, Director of News for KNXT.

When the decision to present a religious program was made last spring, KNXT officials expressed concern over the tendency of presentday news reports to emphasize violence and catastrophes. Then and there, it was also decided that "Light of Faith" would be treated with the same consideration for reportorial values as were the station's other news shows.

Holidays

In the interest of greater news value, Holcomb pays particular attention to various religious festival days. During the Easter season, programs were arranged so that com-

plete information as to observances and beliefs of both Protestants and Catholics were highlighted for KNXT viewers. The same care was taken during the High Holy Day season, so that the tenets of Judaism and the significance of the season would be emphasized.

But special observances in the Christian and Hebrew religious calendars are not the only "news angles" determining individual "Light of Faith" programs. Any other newsworthy occurrence rates its full share of attention.

Expedition

Last summer a Protestant minister appeared on the program just previous to departing on an eight-week archeological expedition to Palestine. Shortly after his return, he was again scheduled for an appearance, so that he might report the results—and the religious significance—of his group's research. In this manner, news and religion were effectively combined.

Prior to the start of the series, a survey was conducted to ascertain population percentages in the Los Angeles Area of the three major religious groups, Catholic. Jewish and Protestant. Guests are scheduled in direct ratio to these figures.

With the sure instinct of the veteran newsman, Holcomb recognized that the authorities on religion were men trained in the field . . . the clergy. Therefore, each week a minister representing a different church or temple is seen on the program, thus acquainting Los Angeles citizenry with the men who are faced with the task of directing the spiritual life of the community.

No Sponsor

While Holcomb keeps a constant eye out for important events and schedules guests accordingly, he does not write the script for the show. Once the clergyman has accepted the engagement, he is on his own. Holcomb reasons, "I wouldn't like it if one of those fellows told me how to report the news, so I don't tell them how to report on religion."

No sponsorship is permitted by KNXT for "Light of Faith." Station executives feel that commercial backing, no matter how institutional in form, would weaken the impact of the program.

Or, as Holcomb says, "God doesn't need a sponsor."

Were you one of the fans who two Sunday mornings ago stumbled sleepily to your set and got Channel 7? The New York Giants and San Francisco '49ers were meeting in a pretty important tilt. Important to the Rams, especially.

But you tuned in a Western movie. One that didn't end by the time the game should have started. So you frantically called KECA to find out what gave. The harried operators didn't have time even to greet you as cheerfully as usual. "The game is on Channel 9" was your succinct answer. Probably a lot of you didn't ever take the time to call later and find out what caused this switch.

KECA-TV had announced the switch in Channels. At 10:42 an announcement ran; then two others were spotted during the Western that went on and on... and on. Might not it have been more serviceable, and just as simple, to run a tape more frequently across the bottom of the picture, announcing the game's temporary new slot?

A union jurisdictional fracas resulted in the switch, we learned later. The game went on from New York's Polo Grounds, which are linked with DuMont for TV. DuMont is affiliated with one union, ABC with another. So Union No. 1 wouldn't feed to a net affiliated with Union No. 2. Rather than disappoint pro-ball fans, ABC generously turned the game over to another channel, with the DuMont-affiliated union piping the game to the West.

We are glad to report that ABC got a good many letters commending their generous gesture and announcements that the game could be seen—on another channel!

YOU NEVER KNOW, DO YOU? A week ago Wednesday I met Clinton "Buddy" wiss, one of my favorite people, coming down the elevator in the Equitable Building, corner Hollywood and Vine. We chatted for a moment during which he told me June Allyson was set for one of the leads in the movie adaptation of his book, "The Long, Long Trailer." Friday Buddy was dead—a completely nexpected heart attack.

OLD-TIME RADIO PEOPLE WHO t was bigger than Hollywood as a T was bigger than Hollywood as a adio center feel especially bad about losing such a sweet chap. In the old days, Twiss used to announce "One Man's Family." He also did news and special events for NBC. In Hollywood he became chief announcer for the network and spieled "The Standard Hour's" commercials and announce-ments. After he left NBC he worked with Carlton E. Morse for a few years before chucking the whole thing for before chucking the whole thing for a cross-country tour in a trailer. His book resulted from this trip.

I REMEMBER WITH GREAT HAP-PINESS a story I did for Radio Life (in 1942) at Buddy's suggestion. He was responsible for getting all his NBC announcers together in the Announce Lounge for a session of recalling their most embarrassing or uncomfortable experiences. As most of the men had handled special events (which come

under the category of sitting on the edge of a smoking volcano) some of the stories were pretty funny. Some were dillies and involved such gigantic fluffs I couldn't print them.

BUDDY GOT A KICK OUT OF TELL. ING about going aloft in the Lockheed Electra, the first army supercharged job. At 30,000 feet, Twiss was supposed to broadcast a report of how it felt to be flying high. A doctor from Mayo Clinic was aboard to conduct experiments to see how high the men could go without oxygen masks. Constant pulse-taking, chest-thumping and tabulations were going on so that when broadcast time drew near the only place Twiss and his engineer could seclude themselves was the men's room.

WITHIN A COUPLE THOUSAND feet of the goal the doctor popped into the "broadcasting studio" to thump Twiss's chest and take his pulse, then said, "It's a wonderful thing we're

doing. Only three ships have been made like this. Italy built one, France built one, Now we have one. Too bad about the other two. They exploded in mid-air!" So scared he could barely talk when he first went on the air, Buddy expected to be blown to smi-thereens any minute.

ANOTHER SPECIAL EVENT HE COVERED was a big canyon fire in Hollywood. To get it on the air he persuaded the master of a mansion on top of the hill to let technicians use the house phone. Then Twiss went down the canyon to do some first hand coverage. When he returned to the hilltop estate it looked as if the wreck-ing crew had just finished. Twiss used his best banana oil to assuage the his best bahana oli to assuage the angry householder and gave him an especially strong pitch on what a won-derful and superior medium radio was, scooping even the most alert news-papers on things like fires. The irate gentleman heard Buddy through, then acidly took his card out of his wallet and presented it to Twiss. Buddy took one look and cast about for the pro-verbial hole to crawl into. The man verbial hole to crawl into. The man was publisher of the Herald-Express.

EVEN TODAY I CHUCKLE recalling the yarn Buddy relished most. Leopold Stokowski was to be interviewed in his sulte at the St. Francis in San Francisco between the Philharmonic rehearsal and performance. "Stoky" greeted Twiss and the NBC techni-cians who were going to put him on the air and then said apologetically, "Tm dreadfully tired. Do you mind if I slip between the covers and rest before we go on the air?" Full of

sympathy, the men consented and sat around quietly while the famous con-ductor climbed in bed and drifted off to sleep. As broadcast time grew closto sleep. As proadcast time grew clos-er, there was a hurried consultation about what to do. Twiss did not feel he could go over and say, "Hey, wake up. We gotta go on the air," so he did the next best: got up on top the bed, scrooched beside "Stoky," set the mike on Stokowski's chest and started the interview. Fortunately, the con-ductor woke up sufficiently to ad-lib a good show. Twiss treasured a recording of it. I treasure Twiss's stories.

ANY TIME QUEEN JULIANA CAN'T MAKE IT over here and wants to send a topnotch stand in, she can dispatch Madame J. H. van Roijen. A poised, blonde matron who speaks beautiful English, Madame van Roijen is wife of the Netherlands Ambassador to Washington. She has four childrentwo boys and two girls, ranging in age from seven to seventeen—and they're all happy American school children.

MADAME VAN ROIJEN, HONOREE at a small buffet luncheon in Palm Grove of the Ambassador last Tues-day, spoke delightfully of American TV and her hope that some day it will cross the ocean to help her people understand our culture more fully. "You've no idea what an impression the New York symphony made on my country," she stated. Right now, The Netherlands has only one TV station (experimental).

"AMOS 'N' ANDY" COULDN'T have celebrated their 10,000th radio broadcast more fittingly than to reunite former cast members on the program, among them wonderful Bill Hay. Deep-voiced Hay estimates that in the seventeen years he was with the famous team he participated in at least 6,500 programs. It was Hay who put them on the air for the first time as "Som "" Henry." Bill even now receives about twenty letters a week from fans who want to know what he is doing. They'll be happy to learn that Hay is enjoying life—"never had as much fun as in the last three years!" He and Mrs. Hay have traveled, were given royal treatment in Scotland. She is still a great radio fan (and letter-writer-more than 700 epistles this year) and he is enthusiastic about lawn bowling (just missed national championship by a couple of points). ALBUM OF THE WEEK: It's called "Hollywood's Best," and when the "best" means eight Academy Awardwinning songs interpreted by Columbia's Rosemary Clooney and Harry James Orchestra, it couldn't help but be tops. Songs like "The Continental" (1934), "Sweet Leilani" (1937), "Over the Rainbow" (1939), "You'll Never Know" (1943), and the others are nostalgic reminders of those years when each was the best. Rosemary and The Horn work well together, for both are extremely versatile

and both have the ability to get the most out of a song, as this collection easily proves.

TINSEL AND MISTLETOE: First of the new Christmas discs to arrive features Don Cornell (Coral) in a pair of new tunes in contrasting tempos: "Let's Have an Old - Fashioned Christmas" shows possibilities as a ballad, while "I've Got the Christmas Spirit" is more on the rhythm side and the weaker of the two. . . Molly Bee (Capitol) will be heard plenty on "Willy Claus," with the youngster displaying plenty of



style... Rosemary Clooney and Gene Autry (Columbia) have the best so far on "The Night Before Christmas Song," with its lyrics adapted from Clement Moore's famous poem... Louis Armstrong and Gordon Jenkins Orchestra (Decca) add still another version to this label's much-recorded "White Christmas," with "Winter Wonderland" on the flip. Since Louis sings 'em straight, there are better versions available—but don't try to tell that to Satchmo's fans!

WITH THE VOCALISTS: The Modernaires (Coral) have another great rhythm arrangement of yesterday's "Gotta Be This or That"; however, "Wildflower" on the flip falls far short as material for this group (maybe it would be more apropos in the spring). . . . Mindy Carson (Columbia) sings nigh and wide for the uptempo'd "Barrels 'n' Barrels of Roses," but really shows her individual styling on the ballad "All the Time and Everywhere" for the better side. . . Fran Warren (MGM) wisely stays on the calmer side for lovely waxings of "I Worry 'Bout You" and "Anywhere I Wander"-both with showcasing accompaniment by Ralph Burns Orchestra and Chorus. Patti Page (Mercury) once more hits the bell with "Why Don't You Believe Me," good material and fine arrange-ment. "Conquest" on the flip (evidently pilfered from Newman's "Captain From Castile" theme) leaves much to be desired lyricwise and strongly on the monotonous side. . . . For contrast, listen to Mary Ford's easy, relaxed and warm vocal chorus with Les Poul (Capitol) on "M" Baby's Coming Home." . . . It'll make you wonder why he ever went away. . . . A.M.

Do DJ's Get Graft?

N GENERAL, people react similarly to two of the three famed monkeys. They don't like to see evil or to speak evil. But there are occasions when even the most highminded seem to enjoy hearing evil.

With this in mind, then, here's a nice, nasty rumor that's been circulating around radioland.

It concerns disc jockeys. It involves alleged graft. And here's how some of the tongue-waggers think it works:

Disc jockeys select and play musical records. For this, in addition to their commercial yak-yak. they receive wages.

The gossips claim that the platter spinners are "persuaded" sometimes to choose songs and artists which they ordinarily wouldn't play. The deciding factor—so goes the rumor takes the form of a bribe, or handout, or graft, or whatever you want to call it.

If true, it's not a very ethical procedure.

In order to find out the answer to this not-very-pleasant question, we polled several of the leading DJ's in the Los Angeles area.

DICK HAYNES, **KLAC**: "I've been a DJ for over fourteen years, and I have never in all those years been offered a bribe."

LARRY FINLEY, KFWB: "If it's true that DJ's get graft, then I'd like to know about it. In all my time on the air, I've had only one man come up to me and offer money to play a number. His daughter wrote a song, which was recorded on an off-brand label. He offered me \$50 a week if I would play it twice a night, each week. The record was never played on my show.

"To my knowledge no DJ gets extra money for playing records."

PETER POTTER, KLAC: "I have never taken a dime for playing records and I don't intend to. I have had offers, but none in the past three or four years."

LARRY BERRELL, KBIG: "Definitely not. I not only have never taken any graft; I have never been offered any, either."

BOB McLAUGHLIN, KLAC: "No one has ever offered me any graft. They know that if they did they would get nothing but a good smack in the nose."

IRA COOK, KECA: "Competition today amongst disc jockeys is keener than it has ever been before. Therefore, I can't sacrifice what reputation I've gained, for a few extra dollars. It's true that I've been approached, but I have never accepted any gratuities." **PAUL MASTERSON, KECA:** "Nobody has approached me with any such offers. People in the business have told me that such is a fact. However, personally, no one has even hinted they'd give me anything for plugging a record. They haven't even offered to take me out to dinner."

AL JARVIS, KECA: "During my sojourn as a disc jockey, I have been offered percentages of songs, gas rationing stamps, nylons, and even Confederate money. But it is my experience that if a song is so bad it has to be given away, that if on its own merits it can't be good enough, then I wouldn't want to take advantage of my radio and TV viewers."

GENE NORMAN, KLAC: "I have never taken a bribe, and never will take one. It would be poor business. If I lose control of the records, then I would eventually lose control of the entire show."

BILL ANSON, KFWB: "I haven't heard of any graft out here, and I certainly have never taken any extra money for plugging a record. Besides, no one person could possibly have enough money to buy a hit."

Looks like a unanimous decision, as far as the DJ's are concerned. To a man, they say: "No. No graft."

And after all, who would know bettor than they do?

Experimental TV Still With Us?

troupe to test public taste, it is an actual experiment in technique. Every viewer who sees it is watching the fruit of an original idea.

Same Cast

The performers are basically the same group who have made radio's "Standard Hour" beloved by millions.

In the absence of a Western TV network, producer Michaelis decided on film for the show. A simulcast of the radio show wasn't feasible, because a program made up entirely of artists performing in conventional dress, before a conventionally ar-

ranged orchestra, all needed for radio, would have little visual appeal.

But producer Michaelis was told repeatedly by TV experts that nowhere outside of New York or Hollywood could he hope to produce the show he had in mind.

Thus was the "Palmerscope" filming method introduced. First of all, the program is actually run off before TV cameras and transmitted over a closed circuit, wholly within the confines of a sound stage. Palmer's camera photographs the program directly from the viewing tube of a "master monitor."

The Advantages

Fewer technical personnel are involved, with a consequent payroll saving that even television welcomes. and costly lighting is eliminated. A TV camera is ten times as lightsensitive as conventional movie cameras.

The costly delay involved in waiting for "rushes" was eliminated by the director doing his "dissolves" and other camera tricks right on the monitor, without going near a film laboratory.

Like any Hollywood musical, the sound track of the "Standard Hour" for TV is recorded apart. That way no rustling dresses drown out the sound of the music, and possible acrobatics during the dance routine don't let the viewer hear landing feet thump the stage.

And yet with all this thought, perfection and work behind the Stand-

ard Hour for television, its future at this moment of writing remains undecided. While radio's "Standard Hour," now about to launch its twentv-seventh year, will continue, the TV show may or may not be prolonged beyond the experimental series you see now.

The Decision

And what decides its fate? Something the Standard people call "audience reaction." More simply, you. If you watch the show and a rating service calls, you have done your bit. If you watch the show and nobody calls you, your bit just might lie in dropping a post card to Standard lauding them for bringing a longtime air favorite to visual life.

Score a Fight

(Editor's Note: A former lightweight fighter himself, Ruby Goldstein has gained a national reputation as the No. 1 referee via television. Millions have watched Goldstein in action during some of video's greatest fights.)

HE TELEVISING of boxing matches has made that sport one of the most popular in the country. Most people think that scoring a fight is a complex system known by relatively few. On the contrary, it is a simple procedure with a simple formula.

Each referee is given a scorecard with various categories of boxing proficiency set down. The categories are: clean punching, aggressiveness, ring generalship and defense. At the end of each round I check the categories which I believe the fighter

showed best during the round. Watching the fight on TV, you can make your own scorecards with the same categories and referee the fight along with me or my colleagues.

In addition to the four categories I will mark a "W" or "L" alongside the fighter's name. I will also put down the number of points he deserved in that round. A one-point round is given to the boxer who wins the round by a narrow margin. A fighter will get two points when he has a clear-cut majority during a round. Even to TV viewers watching a fight for the first time it is easy to pick out a two-point round.

A three-point round usually involves a completely one-sided three minutes. There is also a four-point round. That happens when a fighter scores two knockdowns and has complete command of the situation.

In states where the point score is in effect, as in Illinois, the ten-point system is used. If the fighter has an advantage it will be in the ratio of 6-4, 7-3, 8-2, just the same as a one-, two-, three- or four-point round. If a fighter loses a round because he fouled his opponent, he will lose it by a 6-4 margin.

The decision is derived by totaling the points for each fighter, and the boxer with the most points wins. However, if a fighter is called the winner on two out of the three officials' cards, he wins. They do not total the points of the officials to determine the winner.

In other states, the use of the "won and lost" record in rounds holds precedence over the point score. If the "won and lost" rounds are even, we then go to the point scoring system and the fighter with the most points earned during the fight will win.

Clean punching is an all-important factor in deciding a round. Hard punching must also be included. A fighter must not only be aggressive, but he must still punch and score. The other items, ring generalship and defense, are also taken into consideration.

Scoring a fight isn't a baffling art known to just a few of us. During the next Wednesday night Pabst Blue Ribbon Bout, make your own score card and score the fight. I'd venture an opinion that you'll come as close to the results on your card as the referee and judges.
