Why "Scrooge" Never Grows Old

Listened in every spray, While the whole camp with 'Nell' on English meadows Wandered and lost their way.")

This is precisely the same effect which happens each Christmas when we hear the Dickens tale—our minds wander and lose their way.

A Wonderful Part

"The third reason, and probably the most important one why Scrooge will never grow old," Mr. Barrymore continued, "is simply that Scrooge is a wonderful part to play. Some actor will always want to do it."

And that's exactly what Mr. Barrymore has done ever since 1934. That was the first year he enacted the role on radio. With but two exceptions, the current narrator on CBS's "Hallmark Playhouse" has starred as "Scrooge" every year. On Christmas Eve, 1936, his wife suddenly nassed away and his

On Christmas Eve, 1936, his wife suddenly passed away, and his brothei, the late John Barrymore, took the part on the air. In 1938 Orson Welles was heard. Lionel resumed the role in 1939, and has portrayed it annually ever since.

Message for Lionel

Mr. Barrymore's explanation of "why Scrooge never grows old" was a simple, sincere and valid one. However, he did neglect to mention one very important point:

Although it is true that gifted artists and their works never die, it is also true that no man, no matter how gifted, ever achieved greatness alone. It takes fine actors to keep them and their works alive and immortal in the minds of men.

This, also, Mr. Barrymore has done. And for this, Mr. Dickens, if he were still alive, would have said, as we say now to our modern Mr. Scrooge: "Merry Christmas, Mr. Barrymore. Merry Christmas."

HEN YOU think of Christmas, you think of Charles Dickens and "The Christmas Carol." Although the famed English author wrote his memorable tale over 109 years ago, the plot and the characters come to life again

each year at Yuletide. Poor Bob Cratchit. Little Tiny Tim.

THIS YEAR, as he has been doing ever since 1936, Lionel Barrymore will once again portray his famous role of "Scrooge" from Charles Dickens's "A Christmas Carol" over CBS radio.

Equally synonymous, especially to millions of radio listeners throughout the world, are the names of "Scrooge" and Lionel Barrymore, truly one of the greatest and most respected actors this nation or any nation has ever produced.

People never seem to tire of the story, nor of Lionel's interpretation. Why does Scrooge never grow old?

Mr. Barrymore answered that question himself one Sunday afternoon at the CBS studio.

The Answer

"Young man," Lionel began, hesitating momentarily to find just the right words, "there are three main reasons why people will always listen to "The Christmas Carol."

"The first reason is simply because the author, Mr. Charles Dickens, was a great artist. The works of a great artist like Leonardo da Vinci or Velasquez will never get old.

"Secondly, instead of listening to what I might have to say on the subject, you would do better to read Bret Harte's poem 'Dickens in Camp.' It will explain how I and many others are affected by Dickens's work."

(The setting of the poem takes place around a camp-fire in the Old West. During the night, amidst the men's "rude humor," a young man "read aloud the book wherein the Master had writ of 'Little Nell':

"Perhaps 't was boyish funcy for the reader

Was youngest of them all, But, as he read, from clusteriny pine and cedar

A silence seemed to fall;

The fir-trees, gathering closer in



THROUGH YEARS of publicity on it, and his own jokes, Jimmy Durante's nose is the first thing that probably occurs to millions of listeners and viewers when his name is mentioned. To people in the radio-TV or picture industry who know him, Jimmy's big heart and inspiring niceness are the first things they think of in connection with the little veteran of show business.

ACH CHRISTMAS Day, in an attractive gray house on a quiet street in Beverly Hills there g at h e r s a crew of friends who have met to celebrate together for years. The host is Jimmy Durante, to whom Christmas just wouldn't be Christmas unless his "boys" were with him.

Old Friends

"That's da best thing I ever get for Christmas." Jimmy confided. "Knowin' the boys will be with me. And Maggie. And Miss Little." She is the young lady photographed with Jimmy on his infrequent nights out. Maggie is Jimmy's housekeeper of many years, the one who keeps his refrigerator stocked with milk and corn flakes.

"Knowin' ya got these friends is the greatest thing. If I go to New York, the boys go. If I go to Asia, the boys are there," he rasped fondly. "That's really my Christmas."

Knowing that Jimmy Durante has at one time or another had everything, including these friendships, and must be a pretty tough fellow to buy gifts for, we asked him pointblank, "But Jimmy, what did you find in your stocking this year?"

His reaction was typical. Before he cited a thing, he muttered bashfully... "Dey shouldn't a done it."

Eddie Jackson, long-time pal and one of the really spectacular triumvirate of Clayton. Jackson and Durante which was reduced to a twosome with the death of dancing Lou Clayton, brandished a cigar and gruffly interrupted, "He says that about everything. Tell 'em what you got, Jimmy."

plained, "I don't do much gambling. you know. Just hop down there once in a while." Rather sadly, "What a beatin' I take!"

He glanced at a wafer of gold on his wrist and clucked something unintelligible over a beautiful watch. The same "Dey shouldn't a done it!" was some place in those mutterings. Jimmy will pore over a gold watch or a pair of hand-knit socks. The watches in many cases come from the head of a network, or top man of a big talent agency, but to Jimmy it is as though the gift represented scraped-together dollars and post-Christmas privation on the donor's part.

"And I got a cuckoo clock!" he beamed. "One of those Swiss clocks with the little birds and the long chains ya wind it with. Dey make 'em in Germany."

Again Eddie Jackson punctuated the conversation with his cigar. "Swiss."

"Yeh, Swiss," pondered Jimmy. "Or Germany."

Frustrated Fisherman

"An' I got a whole lot of tackle."

Anyone who has seen Durante's home knows that the frustrated fresh water fisherman is loaded with every conceivable bit of tackle he could use in a lifetime. But the gift had delighted him.

"Now that I'm not doin' any radio, I can go up to Clear Lake and get some fishin' done." Jimmy has had a home at Clear Lake since the days he and his late wife lived there. He's always planning a trip back to fish and rest, and has kept the place as beautiful as it was originally. But demands have interfered, and the plans and tackle pile up.

He appealed to Eddie Jackson, from whom immediately poured a list of treasures from full sets of tables and chairs for Jimmy's new work room, through the clothes department, watches, gadgets and things for his home.

"And a record," prompted Durante. "Say, did you ever hear Marian Harris sing?" Here he warbled a bit of the song that made the late, oldtime singer a headliner. " 'I Ain't Got Nobe-od-y...' She was da king of

Why J Believe in Santa Claus

S I LOOK back over my more than thirty years in show business, I can say, "Yes, I sure do believe in Santa Claus." When

"I'm still doing what I've always wanted to do since I was seven and have made a go of it," you've got to believe in Santa Claus.

First Santa

Back in my home town of St. Paul, as a kid, naturally I was told all the stories of Santa and his reindeer. Like everyone else, I hung my stocking by the chimney Christmas Eve and gave faint inklings of what was to come by my pratfall down the stairs the next morning to find what Santa had brought.

As I grew older, and my woolen stockings changed to nylon, they hung next to the most important chimney any of us possess today ... let's call it hope.

My folks, in a sense, were Santa Clauses to me all my life. Though neither of them had ever been in show business, they spent the greater part of my youth waiting patiently for me at the stage door with nary a word of complaint between them. (Even though I was slightly upset the time my mother made me stay home and attend high school rather than gallivanting with some vaudeville all over the country.) Since there was little vaudeville out here, few people had heard of me so I had trouble getting a job. However, Mr. Sennett took a liking to me, put me in what I think was the last picture he ever made—"Way Up Thar"—and from that I gained a successful picture career.

New Santa

In 1941, a chap named Dick Mack became Santa Claus in my life. At the time, he was producing the Rudy Vallee-John Barrymore radio show.



He'd seen me in films and vaudeville and felt that I would be good on radio.

But it took more than thought on his part to give me a role. Everyone else connected with the show thought that my comedy was too visual, that I would never go on radio. But S Claus Mack—and for no reason at all, for he had never even met me kept fighting until finally they agreed to give me one guest shot. I guess I did OK. I remained on the show for some years after that.

All Santas

And now I'm in television. The American people are the Santa

Clauses here for their wonderful support of me through the years.

Oh, there's someone up there, too, who's been pretty great to me since birth, giving me the talent to get this far.

So, you see, I believe in Santa Claus. Maybe not one like the storybooks say. but many. They may not all wear white beards or come sliding down chimneys on Christmas Eve ... they may crop up in the middle of any month and look just like any ordinary human being. But they've still got the *spirit* of Santa Claus inside them. Isn't that what counts?

She was killed, but her father lived to give her diary to the world. Anne Whitfield played the girl and Jeff Chandler the father, both capably. As usual, Andy Love's direction was sympathetically delicate and the ending abruptly provocative.

MORE POINTS: TO PETER POT-TER'S "Juke Box Jury" for a compact and entertaining show and to Peter for not yakking it up all the time. He shows extremely good sense in saying just enough to appear hospitable and in the know without detracting from the fine names guesting with him. Some of the camera shots of guests off-guard add interest and the guests themselves are exceptionally good, even if they don't all claim to be platter experts.

STILL MORE: TO KNBH's "HALLS OF SCIENCE" a prideful point for the excellent talk of Dr. Wayne Simmonds on antibiotics. This is just the kind of information TV can disseminate superbly, yet where are the do-gooders to applaud this series? ... A potential point to a show called "Carson's Celiar" on KNXT. (Maybe you saw the clever "Hour of Incision," prompted by the televising of a birth which recently made the headlines.) The show is done with an off-hand air which might be



more effective if production were not on the skimpy side. But lots of possibilities here.

OLD-FASHIONED MEAT LOAF

This, to me, is about as good a meat loaf as can be made.

- 2 cups soft bread crumbs
- 2 eggs
- 2 pounds ground beef (chuck or round)
- 34 cup minced onion
- ¼ cup minced green pepper
- 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish
 - 1 tablespoon salt
- % cup undiluted evaporated milk or milk
- 14 cup catsup
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 12 cup catsup

Prepare crumbs from fresh bread, removing crusts if desired. Break eggs into large bowl and beat slightly. Add meat. Toss lightly. Do not overmix . . . the meat loaf will be tough. Add all of the remaining ingredients, except the ½ cup catsup. Mix lightly. Place in a small meat loaf pan. Spread top with catsup. Bake in a 400° F. oven for 45 minutes, or until done. Delicious served hot or cold. Yield: 6 servings.

A famous and controversial mystery story left unfinished by the death of the great Charles Dickens will be completed by a group of modern mystery writing experts on CBS's "Suspense."

Elliott Lewis, producer-director of the series, explains: "Ever since Dickens's death, in 1870, writers have specu-lated on how to end 'The Mystery of Edwin Drood.' No one, of course, will ever know—but I thought it would be interesting to try to develop a logical ending, in key with the rest of the story, and present it on 'Suspense.'"

This experiment is scheduled to be aired in two installments, January 5 and 12. Guest stars are vying with one another to appear on what can well be one of "Suspense's" most unusual dramas.

Ear, Eye Inspire the Pen

Until very recently, my reading was limited to Braille books and magazines but now I have a friend who reads TV-Radio Life to me and I derive a great deal of pleasure and information from it. Your selection of articles, the choice of telling words, and the explaining phrases, give your magazine a special and interesting appeal to me.

I certainly would like very much to find out something about my favorite singer, Terrea Lea, who specializes in folk songs. Her nine o'clock Saturday night program, on

KFI, is tops on my list of Thanksgiving blessings. Folk songs, as Terrea Lea interprets them, help to keep my mind at peace with things and give me a deep sense of serenity that comes from reasoning rather than impulse. I go a lot by voices and I get the distinct impression that Terrea Lea is not burdened by the weight of vanity. When she sings her songs, she "infects others with her own feelings," and that was Tolstoy's requirement of a true artist.

I wonder if your magazine published Terrea Lea's story before I had someone to read it to me. If so, is it possible for me to buy that particular issue? If it has not yet been published, do you suppose it will appear at any time in the near future? I know very little about editing, but it stands to reason that the only way an editor can know what the readers want to read, is for them to write in. Sooner or later, I'm sure, we have to separate things that serve us from things that do not. I find that music supplies a constant need in my daily life. Every time I throw another day on the pile of memories, if I have managed to hear at least one good musical program, I feel I have had a good day, indeed.

Terrea Lea's folk songs have a high inspirational value; they echo the best in our nation's past, from which we can draw a sense of spiritual certainty so much needed at this time. It seems to me that the message of her songs about the early pioneers is simple but important. It is that freedom is like love, because it can be multiplied only by being divided. Terrea Lea faithfully expresses the feelings that went into the creation of those songs comprising a history of our emotions. I guess I have been un-necessarily wordy in this letter, but gratitude is my favorite form of prayer. I know from experience that it is not easy to be happy but the enjoyment of good music can do a lot to give us peaceful minds which is even more important. Only children want to get old, the rest of us want to achieve maturity and a peaceful mind can be ever so helpful in that achievement. I started out to compliment your fine magazine and to ask about the story of Terrea Lea but obviously I have gone a bit afield. If

Then television came along and changed the entire complexion of wrestlers. People who had never before heard of wrestlers became interested and the demand to know more about the men who came into their living rooms regularly increased.

Service clubs, ladies' aid societies, churches, employees' meetings and schools put in their bids to have the wrestlers attend their meetings and speak to them. The fellows who were able to fulfill these engagements were so popular that more and more requests were made.

Among the most sought-after mat-men in the country as after-dinner speakers is Sammy Menacker, cur-rently a promoter in El Paso, Texas. Sammy is not only a top-notch wrest-ler and prosperous promoter, but a member of the national manipulations. member of the national magicians' association. He is recognized as the greatest sleight-of-hand card handler in the profession. This talent, combined with his smooth, polished man-ner and colorful background as a wrestler, has made him a sensation in the club-meeting circles.

Another man in great demand is Dr. Lee Grable, the amazing hypnotist, psychoanalyst and fine sportsman. The young doctor of philoso-phy from Arizona has endeared himself to fans with his clean, fair wrestling style as well as for his keen, intelligent mind. Wherever he appears people flock to see and hear him.

These are just two of the college men, the amateurs who loved wrest-ling so much that they forsook their other training to pursue their fortune in the professional ranks-there are many others.

The one glaring example of an old timer—the exception which proves the rule—is Wild Red Jerry—a man who admittedly never finished the seventh grade. And yet Red is the most desirable after-dinner speaker in the nation.

He figured that he had thrown everybody who was anybody in the ring, so why not tackle the English language? He wrestled the dictionary, and succeeded in putting a headlock on Webster. In fact, Wild Red, the Kansas sunflower who went to work in the coal mines when he was twelve years old, has poor old Webster hanging on the ropes.

Wild Red, with his thinning red hair, faded old wrinkled ring robes and blood and thunder type of wrestling, has parlayed his vocabulary into an income bracket which means he keeps twenty cents out of every dollar. He will be here the 29th to welcome in the new year at the Hollywood Legion Stadium.

Should Bowl Games Be Outlawed?

EW YEAR'S DAY in America is not only a time for festivities and resolutions. It is also the time for the big Bowl games throughout the nation.

This year, as always, the wolves are out again, howling that the bowl games should be outlawed. Their theme song contains the same repetitious refrains: "Strictly commercial. Too much emphasis on football. Big Bowl games mean big money to the big schools at the expense of the players and the public."

In order to get some first-hand information on the subject TV-Radio Life recently interviewed Tom Harmon. Now, Tom, as everyone knows, is not only an all-time gridiron great, but ever since his college days (with the exception of his wartime activities) his announcing chores have established him as one of the mcst capable and critical authorities in the sporting world.

A familiar voice and figure on the Pacific Coast, Tom also added to his national reputation recently with his fine coverage of the NCAA telecasts over NBC-TV.

Now Hear Harmon

This is what the former All-American from Michigan has to say about Page Thirty-eight post-season games in particular and about the collegiate football picture in general:

"Abolish post-season games? Absolutely not. Too many people are honking their horns about de-emphasizing football. Speaking not only from personal experience, but also from an objective viewpoint, I firmly believe we should put more and not less emphasis on collegiate football.

"Because of various pressure groups, college football is not being handled as efficiently as it should be. However, there is no problem today that couldn't be solved by an honest approach on the part of the colleges.

"For one thing, I believe college football players should be subsidized, but not the way they are doing it today. Too many schools are devoted to the big god 'Win.'

"Every college, no matter how big or small, should provide books. tuition, fees, room and board for their players. But no more. There should be no outside dough or handouts or gifts of any kind, and the entire program should be under the supervision of the various college presidents.

"This system would eradicate many of the unethical and unfair practices that we read and hear so much about. Any kid who is accepting extra money from outside sources should be barred from the game."

Players Favor Games

"Some people claim that the bowl games cut down on the Christmas vacations of the players themselves. There is not a fellow on any squad who would not want to spend his Christmas vacation playing in a postseason game.

"The present arrangement between the Pacific Coast Conference and the Big Ten has done a great deal for the Rose Bowl and for the respective schcols. Both conferences are equal in scholarship and caliber of football, and I see no reason for it not continuing for many years to come.

"The biggest cranks and critics of collegiate football are people who know very little about the game. Offhand, I cannot recall any one person, either player or coach, who has ever spoken out against postseason games.

"Anyone who is closely associated with football does everything in his power to help the game."
