# The First American - Jewish **Disc Jockey**

T TOOK Mickey Katz more than twenty years of hard work to finally hit the big time in show business. Oddly enough, Mickey had been sitting on a pot of gold his whole life and had never fully taken

advantage of it. The ABC star has always been an excellent musician, a fair singer and

a "natural" before an audience and with a mike in his hand. A native of Cleveland. Ohio, he

headed his own band at the age of seventeen, and then joined Phil Spitalny's first orchestra. (That was before Phil formed his all-girl ensemble.)

It was in New York during World War II that Betty Hutton first caught Katz and his hepcats in action. She persuaded Mickey and his crew to join her on a special tour entertain-ing GI's in the European Theater of **Operations**.

#### With Spike

Back in the States again, the pintsized comedian landed a job with Spike Jones and toured the country with the zany "School of Musical Depreciation.

Of course these were no slouchy achievements. But up till now Katz hadn't fully capitalized on his biggest asset.

In one simple statement, it is this: Mickey Katz is Jewish. Of course, so are millions of other people.

However, Mickey had several advantages. He not only had a tremendous background in show busiand knew how to satirize his own people—in both words and music.

Mickey was on the right track when he and Hal Zeiger produced "Borscht Capades" and made successful tours around the nation.

The big break finally came when his Yiddish records, particularly such ("Home on the Range"), "Hershele at the Induction Center," and "Tico Tico," made the best-seller lists.

#### **Natural Choice**

These smash hits made Mickey a natural choice to become the "first American-Jewish disc jockey" for the ABC Sunday radio show, which started in September, 1952.

Of course there are many other American-Jewish deejays on radio, but not with a strictly Yiddish show such as Mickey's.

Besides spinning records with a Yiddish twist, "Botch-a-Me" ("Patcha-Me" — Katz style), "Walking My Baby Back Home" ("Shleppin My Baby Back Home"), "Bugle Call Rag" ("Bagel Rag"), "Wheel of Fortune") and ("I'm a Schlemiel of Fortune") and finally "The Little White Cloud That Cried" ("The Little White Knish That Cried").

At the present time he is planning a special trip to the British Isles for ten charity concerts. (You'll continue to hear his radio show on tape recordings.) Mickey assures us, how-ever, that he's coming because he loves it in California.

#### Occupations

#### Wild Guesses

Before the questioning begins, each panel member is allowed one "wild" guess on the basis of the contestant's appearance, an inspection of his hands, the label of his suit, etc. Occasionally "wild" guesses work. #### Thumbnail Sketch-John Daly

The moderator and panelists of "What's My Line?" are busily en-gaged with their own professions when off camera. Moderator John Daly began his radio career, not as an actor or emcee, but first as a relief announcer, then as a special-events reporter and news analyst. His list of news assignments is impressive. He was born in Johannesburg. South Africa. His father was an American mining engineer. His mother was English.

Away from the studios, he enjoys

reading and plays some golf and tennis. His library contains a large number of books on contemporary history, world politics and the Civil War. He and his wife live in suburban Rye, New York, and have three children. John Neal, John Charles IV, and Helene Grant.

#### Hal Block

Husky, curly-headed Hal Block has proved that he is just as adept at dishing out the laugh lines verbally as he is at beating them out on a typewriter. Block is a Chicagoan, and it was law and not humor that originally stirred his ambitions. Upon graduation from the University of Chicago he met comedian Phil Baker, Chicago he met comedian Phil Baker, whose act, Baker, Bottle and Beetle, was a radio hit. Block talked him into giving him a job on his writ-ing staff. Subsequently he supplied hilarious radio material for such stars as John Barrymore, Ken Murray, Burns and Allen and Milton Berle (radio program).

#### **Arlene Francis**

Lovely Arlene has graced practically every television panel show as a visiting guest. She keeps busy, out-side of broadcasting, by lecturing to women's groups and emceeing fashion shows. Arlene has performed on countless daytime serials and dra-matic airers, and also appeared in numerous Broadway plays. She is married to Martin Gabel, Broadway producer director actor. They have a six-year-old son, Peter.

#### Dorothy Kilgallen

(Our personal observation of the panelists gives Miss Kilgallen a slight edge over her confreres at being a shrewd guesser of occupations.)

Dorothy is a working newspaperwoman, following family tradition. However, she branched out as a performer in radio and television, going her dad, International News Service's James L. Kilgallen, one better. Dorothy is married to producer-actor Richard Kollmar. They have two children, Richard, Jr., and Jill-Ellen. Miss Kilgallen exemplifies femininity. She likes hats, perfume, bubble baths, night clubs and dancing.

#### **Bennett Cerf**

Panelist Bennett Cerf has had a long and distinguished career as publisher, anthologist, lecturer and columnist. A native New Yorker, Cerf graduated from Columbia's School of Journalism. After a brief stint as columnist he entered the publishing business. He is married to the former Phyllis Frazer. The couple have two sons, Christopher Bennett and Jonathan Frazer. The prominent publisher-author claims he is still smitten with awe whenever he meets an author. His early experiences with the irrational behavior of a few authors left a lasting impression on Cerf.

#### Comedy

The show has developed into one of the most humorous of all quiz programs, because the audience is secretly informed of the contestant's occupation before the questioning begins.

Comedy writer Hal Block, consciously or otherwise, comes up with

Block muggingly asked mystery celebrity Artie Shaw: "Have you ever been married?" When Dizzy Dean was the mystery guest someone suggested it might be he. "Oh no," said Dorothy Kilgallen, "that couldn't be Dizzy Dean. He sounds too intelligent."

So you see the experts can be wrong, but not often. If you'd like to try to stump them with your outof-the-ordinary job, write a description of your work to the producers of the program, Mark Goodson and Bill Todman, care of CBS, 485 Madison Avenue, New York 22, New York. However, if you're a mortician save ycurself the trouble, because oddly enough they have sent in the most requests to participate, and thus far the program has never duplicated an occupation. What's yours?

#### Paddy Gardenseed

Every time we hear of the Government getting up a gift train or a food lift to friends abroad our hearts swell and chests puff with pride. Well, we can all swell and puff two-fold over the work of a gentleman named Patrick Mozier. You've seen him on numerous TV shows lately. And heard him on radio a lot.

But he's usually introduced as Paddy Gardenseed. And with reason. Paddy is in real life an officer in Military Sea Transport. Every time he goes abroad he carts with him all the garden seed packets he can get together. He last took 155,000 packages of garden seeds, donated by TV and radio viewers and listeners, abroad with him to Guam, Singapore, Borneo and India. Every package, aside from containing a potential ten dollars worth of foød, feeds several mouths for several months.

Figure it up. If Paddy takes abroad a quarter of a million packets of seeds, that is roughly \$1,250,000 worth of food, with no cost to our Government. #### STUFFED PEPPERS

Tricks 'n' Treats

By Corris Guy

If you prefer a milder pepper flavor, parboil the peppers for 5 minutes in boiling salted water after removing seeds and before stuffing.

- 2 large green peppers <sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> pound ground meat

- 1/3 cup corn, cut from cob 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 23 cup chopped fresh tomato
- 34 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon chili powder
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 1 eight-ounce can tomato sauce

Wash peppers. Cut thin slice from stem end of each; remove all seeds. Combine all of the remaining ingredients except the tomato sauce. Pack lightly into the pepper cases. Place in small casserole dish; pour tomato sauce over all. Bake in a 375-degree F. oven for one hour or until meat is cooked through. Yield: 2 servings.

#### Meet Mr. Larkin

One of the great sport stories of 1952 was the dramatic comeback of Keeny Teran. I'm sure all of you remember



the details. You read about it in the daily papers, particularly THE MIRROR, which ran an exclusive story on how "The Kid" licked the dope habit. You saw on Channel 13 how he got off the canvas to defeat Tommy Umeda in a thrilling ten-

round bout.

But how many people remember the reporter who was primarily responsible for the comeback? His name was Lou Larkin.

Ever since the story broke, I've been planning to meet Mr. Larkin because I felt our readers should know more about him. It was a unique experience—a reporter interviewing a reporter—but this past Friday I finally got around to it.

Since I am still a "rookie" in this racket, I soon discovered that although Lou has been in Southern California only since the end of World War II he himself is a "vet" in the TV-radio world.

To begin with, the thirty-four-yearold reporter's very first job in L.A. came about when he walked into the office of a press agent, one Mr. Jack Daly. Today, Jack is the circulation manager of TV-RADIO LIFE who has been greatly responsible for the magazine's phenomenal growth during the past year and a half.

After "breaking in" with "Jackson" (and Professor Daly has a "master's degree" in the art of angles, gimmicks, and publicity know - how), Larkin worked for THE HOLLYWOOD RE-PORTER for two years. In October, 1948, he became the first TV-radio editor of THE MIRROR.

In August, 1950, he attended UCLA for a semester and then returned to THE MIRROR as a "general assignment reporter." He's been doing the same ever since.

Lou's life wasn't exactly dull before coming West, either. Born and reared in New Haven, Connecticut, he broke into the newspaper business as a copy boy for THE NEW HAVEN REGIS-TER at the age of seventeen. Two years later young Lou got itchy britches and knocked around the country getting odd jobs.

For example: a used-car dealer in Norfolk, Virginia, paid him five bucks (a young fortune in the depressive thirties) for thinking of a slogan for his lot. It read: "Used Cars With a Future!" He earned another



Two weeks ago we talked about wrestlers blossoming out into popular after-dinner speakers, but that was only a small part of the story of the demand on my colleagues who have developed not only their biceps but also their wits.

Most current example is Lord James Blears, British Empire champion, war hero and now citizen of the United States. His Lordship appears on the Groucho Marx show "You Bet Your Life" on the radio version, January 7, and on the television program, January 8. Not only does the popular English athlete do well on his bit but he walks off with the Jackpot of around \$2500.

I have mentioned several times in this column that Lord Blears is a witty, interesting conversationalist, and

#### quick fin from a haberdasher for the slogan: "Men Swear By Our Men's Wear."

Broke but happy, Lou finally got around to marrying his high-school sweetheart, Shirley. Still broke, but still happy, they settled first in New Rochelle, New York (where Lou wrapped packages for a department store), and then moved to White Plains, New York (where Lou pounded copy for THE WHITE PLAINS DIS-PATCH).

As with millions of other Americans, the war loused up Lou from 1942 to 1946. He served with the "Americal Division" in the Pacific, and was later a public-relations officer with the Eighth Army in Japan. He and an AP correspondent were the first ones to uncover the Tokyo Rose myth—there were really four of them—during the early days of the occupation.

Finally the ace MIRROR reporter got the most-welcomed heave-ho from the Army—but not before he tried to regain some of the ninety-two pounds he had lost by taking an eighteen-day recuperation cruise back on a slowmoving transport.

After a few whiffs of an un-mild winter in Worcester, Massachusetts, he and his wife decided to come to sunny California to get the chill out of their bones.

There's lots more I'd like to tell about Lou, especially some of the drama and conflict and even the philosophy behind his Keeny Teran and other feature stories. But I've already used more than my allotted space for this column.

I'll sum it up this way: A good reporter, liks a good doctor, must take pride in his work. Lou Larkin, the reporter, has a right to be proud. this network broadcast will bear me out.

Not too long ago, 'way back in 1952, Referee Mike Ruby, once a matman, walked off with the prize money on the Groucho Marx show too.

Currently appearing in the motion picture "My Wife's Best Friend" is the Kansas sunflower, Wild Red Berry, who has a part tailor-made for him as a misogynist. Red's prairie-plain mug is unmistakable.

Wasn't it good to see him last Monday at Hollywood Legion Stadium and on KTTV? If anything, his vocabulary has increased, and he left a plain old Oklahoma boy like me on the far turn with his 16-cylinder words—but he is the same old Red—and he is looking forward to coming here to stay the first of February.

More wrestlers now working in the motion pictures are Chester Hayes, Vic Holbrook, Hans Schnabel and Tom Reneatau, who have been in the cameras at Universal for the past six weeks on a picture called, I believe, "The Thief of Bagdad."

Dr. Barney Kosnick, one of the fellows who paid his tuition through the university and medical school by wrestling, has signed up to do a series with Michael Phillips Productions. Dr. Kosnick has been a thespian for years and even managed an opera company. I am planning to do an article soon on the doctors who have become doctors by wrestling. There are a number of them who earned their way through medical school and who continue to climb into the squared circle for the fun and exercise.

I want to thank the thousands of fans who turned out at the Hollywood Legion Stadium last Monday night. Any of you who missed it, either in person, or via your television screens, missed a real treat. All of KTTV's top stars were on hand and it was a thrill to meet them and have a part in the program. Included were: Jackson Wheeler, whose late show we usually catch after returning from the arenas; Ed Reimers, with whom I hope to cook an arni pflaff on his Cinema Chef program soon; Tito Guizar, Dude Martin, Sheriff John (the boys never miss him), the interesting newscaster George Putnam, Eddie Dean, and many other top-notch favorites.

It was a gala night, and it is a real pleasure to become associated with the friendly staff at KTTV.

## Jimmy Weldon proves: It Takes Brains To Be A Three-Year-Old! By Ted Hilgenstuhler

F YOU went up to a man and said: "You act like a threeyear-old kid," he would be very much insulted. But not Jimmy Weldon. When "Uncle" Jimmy has little "Webster Webfoot" in his arms, and when he's thinking of ideas for his KLAC-TV show, that's exactly what he has to do.

Exhaustive studies in the care of children indicate that it takes great maturity and understanding to learn the whims and ways of a three-yearold child. And when you talk to twenty-seven-year-old Jimmy Weldon, you soon realize that this man has trained for many years to become the TV success he now is.

Originally from Texas, the curlyhaired KLAC-TV star knocked around for many years on radio and TV in the Southwest. During World War II, he was a combat engineer with Patton's Third Army in Europe.

Honorably discharged in England, he studied for several years at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts, made several pictures, and finally returned to the States—accompanying a pretty English ballerina n a m e d Muriel Doreen Jones.

Before he got married. Jimmy wanted to make sure his wife-to-be liked his native land. She did. They were married September 26, 1947.

#### Birth of "Webster"

One day in 1949, while spinning records for a local station in Chickasha, Oklahoma, Jimmy ad-libbed several lines imitating a duck. That was the birth of "Webster Webfoot."

After a successful TV show in Texas with "Webster," and with the aid of such people as Jimmy Wakely and Don Forbes, Jimmy came to Hollywood this past summer and presented his ideas to KLAC-TV and the May Company. The official signing of a contract was just as easy as shooting ducks in a pond. (Please excuse the metaphor, "Webster.")

When you see "Webster Webfoot" just once, you can readily understand why it didn't take Jimmy very long to land a show and a sponsor. Seeing and hearing the cute, sharp-January 9, 1953 witted duck, you just have to smile. The program has been described as "the show everybody watches with a smile on his face."

Although the KLAC-TV presentation is a comedy show for kids, "Uncle" Jimmy becomes very serious and straight-faced when he talks about the aims and purposes of his unique creation.

#### "Uncle" Jimmy Explains

"Children are alike the world over," Jimmy explains. "But you've got to always remember that they are children.

"There are too many shows on TV which scare rather than entertain children. I don't want to scare anybody. I want to make people laughboth grown-ups and the kiddies."

As a consequence of his "crusade" for better children's shows, Weldon stresses two main things: safety and courtesy.

Maybe it's just Jimmy's inherent Southern hospitality, but in person he is undoubtedly one of the most courteous, sincere, and conscientious persons to appear on the Hollywood TV scene for quite some time.

Occasionally little "Webster" gives "Uncle" Jimmy a few anxious moments. But after all, you can't expect a three-year-old to be perfect. Ask any parent.

The near-sandhills refugee and his musicians and hula dancers, whom you see weekly on KNXT's Harry Owens Show, have been recognized for over ten years as the tops in native music. All a listener has to do is hear "Lovely Hula Hands" or any one of a dozen other Island tunes and he immediately thinks of Harry Owens's Royal Hawaiian orchestra.

Yet the man who wrote "Sweet Leilani," "The Hawaiian War Chant," "Lei Aloha" and half a dozen other tunes you hear on TV weekly started out as a trumpet-tootin' pop band leader on the 1930 starvation circuit.

The first notes he bleated on a horn were not on a moonlit beach, surrounded by guitar plucking na-

tives and lovely, dusky misses doing a sinuous turn. His early days were marked by crowded busses. dreary hotels, hash-house food and whitefaced fellow musicians who had it tough getting cakes and coffee.

Yet it was Hawaiian music which got Harry his start. Closing a job one night, Harry and the band he was with cracked out a couple of Hawaiian numbers on the final "set." A total stranger offered Harry a job on the spot... a job in Hawaii.

He went, organized a band on the Islands, played for the guests of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, and swelled a four-month contract into nine years.

#### Royalty Made—Not Born

When Pearl Harbor was bombed, Harry returned to the United States and started successfully familiarizing people here with his band's brand of exciting, captivating native music.

Even if the glasses-wearing Mr. Owens weren't first to admit that he is Hawaiian only where his heart is concerned, the most casual observer of the band can see that some of the fellows in it are about as native as Ole Olsen. As a matter of fact, one of Harry's bandmen is named Ole Olsen. On the other hand, Prince Kawohi is as Hawaiian and as "royal" as you can get, and employs his title honestly.

Almost yearly Harry pays a visit to his beloved adopted land and digs out old, almost forgotten Hawaiian folk melodies to dress up with arrangements geared to the tastes of mainlanders and islanders alike.

He also imports new talent for his show and his band. It is probably lucky that TV at last came to Hawaii December 1, 1952, when the Honolulu station opened. If a kinescope of the Harry Owens Show is sent over the water, the people of the Islands can enjoy some weekly authentic Hawaiian music and dancing.

(If you pick Eddie Bush, you are wrong. Eddie, long lauded for his renditions of ancient Island melodies. and a real Hawaiian, was born on the not so-tropical shore of Lake Michigan!)

About the only people who heed an admonition on life's shortness and what they can make of that brief span are the people who have almost had their own life snuffed cut, as did Jane Froman. Remember when the plane she was aboard crashed into the sea and Jane clung to life and hope in freezing water for fourteen hours? With an injured spine?

There would be no reason to assume that Miss Froman wasn't a Class A sweetness-and-light girl even before her accident if her own words, in a recent article, hadn't exposed her as pretty much like everyone else . . to a degree selfish, impatient, forgetful, just like all of us.

Today her cultured larynx is augmented by a selflessness, an irresistible personality, an incredible vitality and a warmth that comes out like a human radar beam.

She has developed a wonderful weapon. It is a genuine affection for people, all people. Men and women in our Armed Forces, cab drivers, doormen, waiters, elevator operators, bank presidents and network brass.

#### **Tough Audience**

This vital girl who suffered so is bringing good cheer in large doses to people she likes. This is specially true on her new CBS-TV show. "U.S.A. Canteen." It is no coincidence that Jane is a favorite entertainer of the boys and girls in uniform.

"Boys in the Armed Forces," she says sagely, "can be a swell audience. And they can be rough. Real rough.

"They won't stand for the phony or the inept entertainer. And if you play down to them you're a dead pigeon. Do an honest job, the same one you would do for a white-tie crowd, and you're home free. They'll love you."

#### **Never Forgets**

The weapon of honest good fellowship which Jane developed in the process of living a lot and enjoying everyone has as part of it a fantastic memory. She makes people so important to her that she doesn't forget them.

One of her favorite stories is about a GI she met overseas during World War II. The boys, she says, insisted on giving her trinkets after each performance. No Hope diamonds, just simple little gifts to show their appreciation. One GI after a performance rushed up and fumbled at an inexpensive ring. It was too large, much too large, so the boy wrapped it with a ragged string.

#### The Test

Years later, in New York City, Jane was in a cab when the driver turned around and looked at her. Plaintively he asked . . .

"Do you remember me . . . during the war . . . in Germany . . .?"

Jane had occupied a good many recuperative hours remembering occasions and faces and learning to value them. Her response was without hesitation.

"Of course I do. You were the GI with the ring you had tied up with string. What's more, I've still got it."

Cab drivers are among Jane's most faithful supporters. Rehearsing for "U.S.A. Canteen" recently, she took a cab for the studio, and the cabby refused to accept the fare. "You have given us so much enjoyment when we were in the service," he mumbled, "I figure you've paid many times over for the ride."

Jane, who would make a terrific public-relations expert, didn't arfront him by refusal. "Okay. How about me sending you some autographed pictures for your children?"

"Great." the happy cabby enthused. "Make it three. I got three girls."

She thinks Fritz Kreisler is tops in the classical field, for violinists, with Joe Venuti taking honors for the jazz field.

The violin which Ginger uses was made in Czechoslovakia and is 103 years old.

Besides her various night-club appearances, she plays each Friday for the patients at the Sawtelle hospital for veterans, and at church every Sunday morning.

Remarks Ginger, quite bluntly: "I'm not saying it to polish apples, but I love my work on 'Dixie,' and I especially like each and every person who has anything at all to do with the show."
