There's Fire in "Gunsmoke"

Radio will always be alive and kicking with shows as good as this knockout Western

RANKLY, it's amazing that "Gunsmoke" ever got on radio.

This CBS show which airs Saturdays at 6:30 p.m. is so lacking in formula stuff and cliches that it's a miracle it wasn't dismissed in the beginning with the typical reaction, "It'll never go—it's too different."

And it certainly is original. Its Western hero, Matt Dillon, is not the All-American-boy type—in fact, at times he sounds like a heavy; he doesn't win all of his fights; he doesn't barge into a saloon, take on six or seven guys and knock them all out cold; he isn't in love with some poor little lassie whose father owns a ranch on which the mortgage is past due; he is friendly with a dance-hall girl of questionable reputation; the dialogue in the show is literate and has none of the tired old lines like "How'rya podner?" or the "he went that-a-way" drivel.

No Conventional Hero

In almost every instance, the stories of "Gunsmoke," all of which center around the exploits of Marshal Matt Dillon of Dodge City in the 1870's, defy convention. Matt is no stock heroic but a human being with his own particular emotional problems. In one script he was faced with the decision of whether or not to amputate a man's leg. The man was dying of blood poisoning, no dector was available, so Matt was asked to do the operation. After debating the matter, he decided to try the amputation. So you think Matt saved the man's life. He did not. The man died.

Another time Matt met two men who looked familiar to him. All during the half-hour show he made references to the fact that he knew those men but couldn't remember their names. At the end he remembered. They were the James brothers. Can you imagine a Western with a marshal who wouldn't recognize such noted outlaws?

How Show Was Born

Norman Macdonnell, producer-di-June 12, 1953 rector, and Johnny Maston conceived the idea of "Gunsmoke." They had long wanted to do a Western that would appeal to adults. One script was tried out on "Escape," a show Norman was directing, and later another was done on "Romance."

Both were so successful that the two men tried to sell the idea to CBS, but with no luck. It was too diametrically opposed to all conceptions of Western shows on radio. Also, at about the same time CBS was working up a rather typical formula Western to be called "Gunsmoke."

"I guess we used subtle and sundry means," Norman remarked, "but the first thing we knew our scripts went on as 'Gunsmoke' instead of the ones originally set by the station. I think we had such a difficult time selling the show at first because radio was in such a state of flux that no one wanted to try anything different. That's why we're co gratified to see how fast the program has caught on.

"Selling the show was one problem. The other was convincing those in charge that William Conrad was the perfect Matt Dillon. Bill had been playing a lot of heavies on radio and no one could see him as the hero type— simply because he didn't sound like the young Western guy. Those who objected to him on those grounds are now praising him for the same reasons."

As for Bill Conrad, he thinks "Gunsmoke" is the greatest thing that could happen to an actor as do regulars Parley Baer, Howard Mc-Near and Georgia Ellis.

Mail Pull

The mail that comes into Norman's office is excellent testimony to the show's realism.

Several amusing letters have come in. One was from some people in Dodge City who wrote that they knew Matt Dillon was a real character who had come from Dodge City but they couldn't place the exact years in which he was Marshal. THE TWO MEN who make "Gunsmoke" the hit it is: left, producer-director Norman Macdonnell and Bill Conrad, who stars as "Mat Dillon." If you think all Western shows are alike, listen to this one and you'll have a few surprises. The regulars on the CBS radio show are, left to right, Parley Baer, Georgia Ellis, Bill, and Howard McNear. They certainly prove there's still a lot of talent on radio.

As a matter of fact, Matt is a purely fictitious character.

Then there was the Governor of Kansas, who appeared on a broadcast of "Gunsmoke" and thanked CES for such an authentic picturization of Dodge City as it used to be. But he hastily assured listeners that the city had become quite civilized since then.

Apparently a couple of boys in Montreal. Canada, didn't hear the Governor because they wrote about their plans to tour the United States and mentioned they had thought of passing through Dodge City. However, since hearing the chow they decided they should skip a visit to this wild and dangerous city. Norman Macdonnell, of course, assured them that the place was perfectly okay now.

Don't look for "Gunsmoke" to hit your TV screens. At least, Norman and his co-workers are against the idea.

"Our show is the perfect one for the medium of radio," he said. "Besides, we couldn't be as accurate as we are now in details. For example, marshals in Dodge City at that time wore derby hats, watch charms, button shoes, and other such fancy trimmings. Can you see a Western hero dressed like that on TV?"

As long as shows like "Gunsmoke" stay on radio, the medium will never have to count itself out. TV should, as a matter of fact, immediately onlist the services of Norman Macdonnell and Bill Conrad. Maybe they could bring some life to an often ailing youngster. Behind all the glowing words written about the TV stars are those people whose job it is to sell the pretty words to the public. But oh! the ulcers they get!

The Problems of a Press Agent

AL BOCK, now a leading independent Hollywood publicist, has a unique slant on the Problems of a Press Agent, for Hal started with NBC in San Francisco in 1933 and during the past

cisco in 1933 and during the past twenty years has noted a change of emphasis. "Over a period of years," he commented, "it's interesting to see a gradual and definite change of talent from just entertainers, troubadours or buffoons to solid and important business corporations. The trend in our national living has made it necessary for them to do this, rather than be itinerant artists." Bock points out that expectancy of a "career life" is extremely short, especially in regard to TV, which he tabs "a man-killer."

Accordingly, the networks, agencies and sponsors now deal with "talent" as they would with any other business concern. This practical attitude has brought about a change in publicity, which has turned from the fantastic milk-bath, guinea-hen-under - glass-for - breakfast type stories to more realistic publicity. In other words, as Bock puts it, "the days of the out-and-out baloney are gone. Today's publicist with a client feels he has a piece of merchandise—and so you have to figure out how to sell it. It's like selling a can of beans. First you determine what kind of beans you have and then what kind of market for them."

Temperament

In line with the more realistic approach to publicity, the problems of the publicist have changed. Temperament is seldom displayed, though Bcck claims he has never found anybody big ("with a capital B") with temperament. He has had ample opportunity to witness any outbursts, for he successfully headed up NBC's Western Division Press Department for many years (and was the first Westerner to win the annual Billboard Award for exploitation in the radio business—in fact he was a two-time recipient, both in 1940 and 1941).

Gone, then, are the days of the actress "with ninety per cent temper and ten per cent mental." Though Bock seldom had to deal with such persons, he does recall a couple of incidents. One involved a bit of hoity toity on the part of a famous movie star appearing week. ly on a big radio dramatic series. It was the duty of Bock's department to get publicity_photos of this star, but the actor continually refused to pose. Finally he magnanimously consented to stand still for "just two pic-tures." On The appointed day, Bock sauntered into the studio and got his two pictures—two apiece, that is, from eight photographers he as-sembled for the great occasion! "I never had any trouble with the star again," Bock remarked.

A well-known singing star who rcpeatedly gave trouble by refusing to pose because she didn't have on make-up was also handled neatly. One day Bock appeared in the studio to make his tired bid for pictures. Just as the diva started voicing her customary dodge, one of Bock's assistants produced a complete makeup kit. All the star could do was to take the kit and capitulate to the camera.

One of Bock's rules is always to straighten out misunderstandings with the people with whom he is dealing. "I've always felt that if you don't understand or have a misunderstanding, you can work it out by talking for a minute," he stated.

For stars whose hat size becomes enlarged his stock remedy is the silent treatment. It has never failed.

One of the smartest publicity men in town is KTLA's Howard Wormser. Howard came to the station with an extensive background which included publicizing such famous names as Red Skelton, Benny Goodman, Kay Kyser, and many more.

Other Press Agents

"Oddly enough, one of the biggest problems a publicity man in a motion-picture studio or TV station faces is other press agents," Howard commented, "The independent publicist gets in our hair more than a little by his happy habit of doubleplanting stories. I know of one press agent who makes a habit of sending the same idea for an article to as many as three magazines. Then when the identical story appears in two books-or maybe even threehe concocts all kinds of excuses to explain away the mishap. Usually he places the blame on the station, which had nothing to do with the whole thing."

Nursemaid to Stars

"Most publicity men, however, get their man-sized headaches from playing nursemaid to stars. A few of the satellites can get into come royal messes. One big name I onco handled got into a sordid affair involving a soldier. The outcome of the deal was that the soldier robbed the star. I was given an emergency call by the performer, who had fool ishly called the police to report the theft. He suddenly realized he would be at a loss to explain the whole situation without putting himself in an awkward light. I managed t turn the story around enough t take any embarrassment off the star In short, he emerged as something of a heroic character.

"A press agent, like anyone elsa can be fooled by a personality he to plug. That's why I think it's beter to forestall any future problems by knowing the star well before "aling on the job. There is one TV name I once worked for—and it wasn't until I had been with him for a few

months that I realized he was not the sweet guy I had thought he was. In fact, he was a no-good per-son. But I had a contract and I had to continue 'selling' him.

"It's easy to publicize someone whose talents you respect. I was never very fond of Benny Goodman as a person but I could 'sell' him be-cause he had great talent in the as a person our reveal sent min ver cause he had great talent. In the case of Sigmund Romberg, whom I also publicized. I had an easy job because he had talent and also a likeable personality."

More Headaches

"One of our biggest problems," Pat began, "is supplying plentiful and new pictures every week for all the magazines that are now entering the TV field. To get the stars to take the time to nose for the art to be sure time to pose for the art, to be sure that pictures are kept exclusive for the various publications—all this is a headache. It's even worse when so a neauache. It's even worse when so many times the magazines don't like what you've shot. Then they want a

whole new set immediately. "We press agents are very anxious

to cooperate with magazines and newspapers because that's our job, but we do get a little irked when

we're asked to write the stories for we're asked to write the stories for certain publications. We feel, per-hap naively, that the magazine should be sufficiently staffed with writers to handle this chore them-celvee

"Editors, too, give us headaches. They are, in some cases, a class of people who get easily upset. Most of them are cooperative but we do have them are cooperative but we do have selves. those who get imagined hurts and those who get imagined nurts and dash to the network vice-president with a complaint. If we have failed to do our job, we deserve such com-plaints, but it is hard to please everyone all the time.

"Then there are some sponsors who give us a few trials. Sponsors who have us a new trians. sponsors may put the pressure on us if a show inay put the pressure on us it a snow isn't doing so well—and then we have to start beating the drums. More than once we in the press de-nartment have kent a show on the partment have kept a show on the channels."

Not Appreciated

"I don't want to sound as though we press agents are only an inch rewe press agents are only an inch re-moved from being martyrs, but in all honesty I think that we haven't a well-appreciated job. We hear plenty when there are complaints but seldom do we hear anything about a chore well done. Talent is equally disinterested in admitting when a publicist has done rather well by them.

"But we stay in the business be-cause it's always a challenge. We may get ulcers and nervous break. downs but we're hams enough to get a glow when we see a story of ours hit the front pages or get a big layout in an important magazine. Maybe we're all just frustrated

SO THAT I WON'T BE CONSPIC. UOUS by my absence, Lifeliner hereby tosses a few Coronation condensations into the already-stuffed hopper. First, a salute to good old radio for a bang-up job. Because there's a distinct thrill about listening to an event while it is occurring, I tuned in my portable at 2:15 a.m. and stuck with Coronation proceedings until con-clusion (6:00 a.m.). This supplied a basis for comparison with later-re-leased radio transcriptions and televersions.

A FEW OBSERVATIONS: Full impact of the Coronation ceremonies was dissipated by condensation, both on radio and TV. There was a sweep, a momentum, that built steadily from start to finish. To cut it was a crime.

SINCE THE NETWORKS HAD GONE to such extravagant lengths to do research, expend man-power, and fly the films back to this country, I think: (1) They should have cut out the nonsense of making it a time race to get the film back and concentrated, instead, on a quality telecast. (A few hours more wouldn't have mattered to most lookers.) (2) They should have pooled their film ar-rangements and set their energies to (3) They individually should have chosen a reasonable cross-country time to do one telecast and one only

and to make this of sufficient length that damaging cutting would not have to be resorted to. (With money in six figures being thrown around, why stop at a mere matter of cancelling a few more regular programs?) (4) They should have realized that the music of the rites was an integral part and some of the most magnificent ever broadcast. Coordination of the full orchestra, superbly trained choir and the Abbey's tremendous pipe organ provided incomparable richness and significance. The many fanfares created a rare excitement and expectancy in themselves and the Te album was truly inspiring. (Hope an album will come out with this ma-jestic music on records.)

SO MUCH FOR THE DEBIT SIDE. On the credit, TV turned in an un-excelled job in research and commentation. To those unable to hear the actual ceremonies, the TV film served adequately to give the plain citizens here an idea of what it was all about. I'm sure many of them must have reflected on the gracious and solemn young lady, who, he-cause of birth, was the center of international attention; and then in contrast recalled a recent January morning when our President-Elect spoke his brief and simple vows to become the actual, not figure, head,

PICK of the PIX

I. D. Lacy of Beverly Hills has just sent me a postcard which states sim-ply and charmingly, "You dog." I am assuming, of course, that this is meant as a compliment to my heavyfooted badinage,

but in that case I think he at least could have said, "You sly dog." If you think I'm a dog, Mr. Lacy, you should have seen the one I was with last night.

"Voice in the Wind." (5) June 19, 10:00. Here we have a turgid



melodrama about an eminent Czechoslovakian pianist, Francis Lederer, who plays Smetana's "Moldau" at a concert in defiance of the occupying Nazi authorities. For this he loses his wife, is thrown into prison, escapes, goes mad and generally has a hell of a time. The picture is quite soggy for the most part, but the theme of courage in the face of totalitarianism is always stimulating and when the film is thus concerned it acquires an integrity that makes it worth watching.

"Heart of New York." (5) June 16, 10:00. Al Jolson made five or six pic-tures in the early thirties and this is one of them. In it, he plays a scala-wag who does his best to get along without working so that he can enjoy the ineffable delights of being a completely irresponsible man. He sings "Hallelujah, I'm a Bum," gives up the girl he loves, Madge Evans, to a millionaire, Frank Morgan, and when last seen is sitting in the park wondering what the poor people are doing.

"To Be or Not To Be." (13) June 16, 7:00. This is a pretty funny farce about a famous actor in Czechoslova-kia who poses as a Gestapo agent in order to help his theatrical troupe get out of the country. The late Ernst Lubitsch has given this film his usual deft touch and drawn good perform-ances from Jack Benny and the inimitable Carole Lombard.

"Back Door to Heaven." (2) June 18, 11:00. This is the familiar but always poignant story of the boy who never had a chance, becomes a gangster, tries to go straight and fails. It stars Wallace Ford and Van Heflin and is, in spite of its age, pretty good.

"The People's Enemy." (2) June 15, 10:00 a.m. Preston Foster is a no-good guy who kills people for a living and tries to bring about the demise of Melvyn Douglas, who, he thinks, has double-crossed him. He is thwarted. however, in a smashing climax that left me limp with ennui.

Moments That Changed My Life

By Tito Guizar As Told to Mildred Ross



It happened in 1942 when I was filling an engagement at the Chicago Theater. Lillya, my youngest daughter, caught her finger in a stage door and cut it badly. I rushed out of the theater to get a doctor. In my excitement I completely forgot about using the telephone. I also forgot to wear my topcoat in subzero weather. I ran to a doctor who lived several blocks away and stood shivering outside his house, velling hysterically for him to come quickly. I screamed at the top of my lungs, straining my voice heedlessly.

The doctor's stitches mended little Lillya's finger, but I lost my voice.

I had to cancel my engagement at the Chicago Theater and for the next six months I was unable to sing a note. The doctors could do nothing for me. It was a matter of time, they said. The specialists refused to comment on whether or not I would ever be able to sing again. All I had were my prayers and faith.

Singing My Life

But singing was my very life. It had always been by means of selfexpression. If I were sad or happy I would sing about it. Until this had happened there was no silencing my laments or gay melodies.

During the next several songless years, time seemed endless, But gradually my voice returned and I tried singing again. However, after every performance my voice weakened and I had a relapse. This lasted for about three years. It was the most nerve-wracking thing that ever happened to me.

Rest, medication to relieve the irritation, and mild vocal exercises to forestall losing my voice completely became a daily chore. Although physical pain was absent during my convalescence, spiritual frustration was always with me. Finally in 1946 I regained my singing voice, and fortunately there wasn't even the slightest change in tonal quality or range.

I have never told this story before. At the time it happened I was panic-stricken, but later I realized that it was the turning point of my life. Sometimes it takes such a tragedy to give one a truer perspective of things. This incident has always been a family secret, but fate has been good to me and I am happy to tell it to you now. It was my lesson in faith and it strengthened my belief in God.

N SHOW BUSINESS Broadway symbolizes the big time.

But not to Dave Street, To him, Broadway is just an-other main drag in an oversized city.

He's not rationalizing, either. He's not a guy who says he dislikes steak just because he's never tasted any. On radio and TV and in the theater, the smiling Irish tenor has had his full share of fame.

"I was on Broadway for three and a half years," Dave explained one afternoon before his KLAC-TV show. 'I did all right for myself during that time in New York. I was making good money. Around \$1500 a week. But it wasn't worth it. Back there, it's too dirty, too noisy, too crowded, too much of everything. It's not for me. I'll work for less money out here, and live a lot happier life.

Not New

Although Dave is a newcomer to Channel 13 viewers, he certainly is not unknown to the public. In addition to his own network show on NBC, he was also the featured vocalist on the Joan Davis show and "Meet Me at Parky's." Later he moved to New York, where he ap-peared on "Broadway Open House" (Dagmar's old hangout), and with Arthur Murray and Ken Murray.

Now he's back home doing his own afternoon program on KLAC-TV and also co-starring with Betty White on her show.

Actually, Los Angeles is Dave's original home town. He was born here December 13, 1918.

did a daredevil bicycle act. In high school Dave applied some of his father's abilities by participating in gymnastics on the horizontal bar and flying rings.

Dave's big ambition in show business is to do a musical comedy. Television-wise, his plans include a show with an easy, informal format similar to "Broadway Open House."

No matter what his future may be, Dave intends to continue to make his home in Southern California. Broadway is "not his beat."

Guy Madison is a lone wolf. . . . " He prefers solitude most of the time. ... He doesn't talk much, but when he does he speaks with a purpose. . . . As Wild Bill Hickok on TV and radio he's close to his own character because in real life he moves quietly and quickly and gets the job done with a minimum of hullabaloo. ... When he's working he stays hard at the job with no clowning around. . . . When he's relaxing, he believes in blocking off anything associated with his work. . . . For instance, he loves to hunt and fish, but he won't allow a publicity photographer to come near him for shots of this outdoor life because he thinks that would be a close connection with work. . . .

He has an uncanny intuition about people. . . He can judge a person accurately in five minutes. . . On this basis some people get the lifelong friend treatment from him almost at once. . . Others never get anything more than cordiality from him. . . He places a high value on friendship. . . He believes politeness and humor are necessary if friendships are to last. . . He doesn't look upon himself as an actor but as a performer. . . He believes the word "actor" should apply to people like Jose Ferrer, Montgomery Clift, and Marlon Brando, who do varying characterizations. . . He sees himself in a category with John Wayne, Randolph Scott and Gary Cooper, who basically remain themselves in all their pictures even though plot situations may vary greatly. . . He's the only big-time TV personality with a 3-D picture coming up. . . Warner Brothers produced it ("The Charge at Feather River") and chose Guy to star in it on the strength of his success as Wild Bill Hickok. . . .

His tastes are simple.... Though his yearly earnings are enormous from TV, radio, movies and the sale of shirts, boots, hats and other merchandise items put out under the "Hickok" brand, he drives around town in a Ford pick-up truck....

He once was easy-going about his work, allowing others to make decisions for him. . . . Now he firmly guides every phase of his careerfrom publicity to script writingand he doesn't hesitate to demand changes when his own judgment tells him something is in bad taste. . . . He is not a "know-it-all." . . . He's quick to ask guidance. . . The two people from whom he most often seeks advice are his agent, Helen Ainsworth, and Andy Devine, whc's his co-star in the "Hickok" series. . .

He feels uncomfortable wearing a tie.... This protest against formality is his guide in accepting invitations. . . If he thinks the party will be the type where he can relax and take off his tie, he's likely to accept... Like all men who are celebrities he constantly encounters aggressive women... He resents them because they are a blow to his male ego which demands that he take the initiative.... He is conscientious about answering letters... Even fan mail which shows unusual thought gets his personal attention....

He hates to shave.... When he's not working he grows a beard.... He never unloads his problems on his friends.... He feels they have enough troubles of their own.... His personal antidote for worry is the thought that hardly any of his present problems will be important a year from now.... Everybody who works with him predicts he'll soon be one of the biggest names Hollywood has ever known.

of the world's most powerful nation. Many listeners and lookers must also have been cogitating the wistful ways of people, their love of tradition. glamour, pageantry, and above all their fundamental humanness and equality.

THE QUEEN IS TO BE ADMIRED FOR allowing the cameras such free access to this, the greatest day in her life. Feelings of endearment must have been stirred in those who saw Her Majesty making small gestures to help the Wardrobe Mistress adjust the Queen's gown or who noted little Prince Charles on the balcony, when he reached out to touch his mother's gleaming new bracelets. In essence, the story was one of Human Beings their universally appealing and qualities. Even Charles Collingwood, a crack speaker, evoked my warmly sympathetic response when he muffed the sign off a little — with a re-mark something like "We have just heard the rites queening a crown."

JOHNNY MERCER, WHO'S BEEN so busy writing for movies, for Broadway (and writing period) that he hasn't done a regular radio show for a blue moon, is back this week on CBS-KNX, nightly, Monday through Friday, from 9:45 to 10:00. It had been nine years since I'd interviewed Johnny, but the other morning when he was cornered backstage at CBS, he appeared to be the 'same likeable chap, easy with the conversation and full of shrewd comment.

JOHNNY, WHOSE HITS HAVE BEEN stimulating contributions to our music, thinks songwriting today is in a bad way. About five new songs out of 100 are any good, in his opinion. He considers the period from Victor Herbert to 1941 the golden era and lays the blame for much of our present circumstances on the big grab for the Yankee dollah. He believes too many people are compro-mising their artistry with "what is commercial."

HE EVEN FEELS THAT TODAY'S CROP OF extremely young and un-

prepared record performers is largely due to the influence of money.minded managers whose foremost desire is to make a quick buck. Some of the un-seasoned young. sters who have shot to fame on a single record are caught short. They've no

real experience and Johnny Mercer scanty means of gaining it the way the old timers did-onstage, where

poise and polish were acquired in the tedious but irreplaceable hard way. Johnny feels that many of to-day's record hits are not bona fide smashes, in that some clever manager, for example, can promote a disc, flood the juke boxes and other mechanical devices with it, and force acceptance. How unlike the days of "You Must Have Been a Beautiful Baby" and the unbeatable "Star Dust," whose composer, Hoagy Car-michael, and Mercer collaborated on the Award-winning "Cool, Cool, Cool of the Evening"!

IF A RECORD IS GOOD, in his judgment, Mercer will spin it on his new platter and chatter show. He's typically relaxed about his five-a-week broadcast series, just the way I remembered him when he and the Pied Pipers were on NBC during World War II (and Johnny used to slay 'em with "G.I. Jive" and "Doo-ration Blues"). I asked him if he still played the piano the way he used to-with one finger. "No," he replied, "I've pro-gressed backward. "Don't play at all, anv more.
