### **"Destination Unknown"**

HIS STORY will give TV-RADIO LIFE readers a chance actually to see part of a TV program even before it goes on the air. As a matter of fact, to make the situation even more unusual, it's a quiztype, audience-participation program —and you may be the winner.

Quiz shows are a dime a dozen on TV. So are audience-participation programs. Strangely enough, KTTV's "Destination Unknown" combines both of these elements to make it a really different type of production.

"Destination Unknown" is an Open Road Production and was created and produced through the combined efforts of Lynn Rogers, Bill Steen, Rick Spalla, Elmer Haskins and Bill Burrud. Burrud does the actual narration and production of the weekly telecasts. At the present time the twentyeight-year-old producer is one of the busiest men at KTTV, doing three full-time shows---this one, "The Open Road," and "Before Your Eyes." While not the hottest things in the TV world, all three of these are entertaining, educational and well-supervised programs. In contrast to many types of shows seen on the screen today, they are a credit to the industry as a whole. In addition, all three have steady, reliable sponsors.

#### Format

The fifteen-minute format of "Destination Unknown" is simply this: narrator and producer Bill Burrud gives clues and shows pictures of two well-known places. The name of the place is never actually told on the air. That's up to the viewers to decide. The person who sends in the correct name, and also answers an essay question for the sponsor, is awarded a week-end vacation at one of California's leading resorts. The grand prize will be a ten-day trip to Mexico City.

This week on KTTV, Channel 11, Monday, September 14, at 7:15 p.m., the pictures you actually see on this page will also be shown on your TV screen. As he does every week, Burrud will supply additional facts and pictures.

To our knowledge, this is the first time any publication has been able to show pictures of a TV quiz show —even before the program is put on the air. If you tune in, we think you will enjoy this fifteen-minute travelogue—and you might also be the lucky winner.

CAN YOU NAME THIS FAMOUS LANDMARK in Southern California? If you can, you may be the lucky winner of the weekly Travel-guiz conducted by "Destination Unknown" on Channel 11. Additional film shots and facts of this location and the above vacationland will be shown this week on KTTV.



HIS fall, NBC-TV's "Your Show of Shows" starts its fifth year. Again, Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca will cavort. Again, ace producer Max Liebman will be on tap. But will the millions and millions of listeners still be looking? Can "Your Show of Shows" go on to greater heights? Can it maintain its quality and quantity? Can it last and how long?

These were some of the pointed questions your TV-Radio Life reporter put to gentle-speaking, forthright Max Liebman when he was recently vacationing in Beverly Hills.

"Last season," he observed, "our rating dropped five points. I think it was due to over exposure. Oddly enough, the dip came just when we were doing our best shows."

Over-exposure (stars appearing so much before the camera that lookers wearv of them) can be a dangeorus pitfall in TV. As Liebman put it. "In most families, the parents either send the children on vacation or go away themselves to get away from the children. The same is true in TV. There comes a time in a show when certain facets, certain phases. or the over-all patterns begin to have a familiar look to the viewers." When this happens, it's time for a shakeup.

#### Some Changes

This season, Caesar, Coca and satellites will not be exposed to lookers every week. Every fourth week they'll have "time out." Furthermore, those performers who comorised "regulars" last year will be "irregulars" this season. The Billy Williams quartet will appear on ten of the thirty shows for the 1953-54 season. The Hamilton Trio will perform on fifteen of the series. Others of the old standbys will be back from time to time, but not weekly.

"This was a tough decision for me to make," remarked Liebman. "It took four years to build these personalities. Then at their height, to send them out was difficult." But it was done to make a better "Show of Shows."

When the program first began, another factor was involved—a factor which has undergone change. Four years ago, TV was a novelty to which ardent fans devoted enormous portions of leisure time. As "Show of Shows" ascended the rungs of popularity, lookers formed the habit of staving home Saturday evenings to watch this ninety-minute extravaganza.

But now, according to Liebman, "the great Saturday night habit of socializing has become competitive again." People are inclined to step out or play cards. To compete with this socialization trend, Liebman is shrewdly changing the aspects of his show.

During "Show of Shows'" weekly hour and a half, many acts have been presented in the past. This year the acts will be fewer and longer. There will be no set rule, but as few

as three "items" may comprise the entire program; for example, a domestic sketch, a movie satire, and a Gilbert and Sullivan adaptation. There will be a guest star weekly, which means an element of freshness and surprise. This may counteract the looker's attitude of "Whadda they gonna do **this** week that they didn't do a dozen times before?"

#### Humor Mill

Along with the weekly surprises, there will be the ever entertaining faithfuls, Caesar and Coca. Earlier this year, there were rumors that "Show of Shows" was having trouble —that Caesar 'wasn't speaking to Coca, that Coca wasn't cooperating with Liebman, that Coca, in fact, had gone after Max with a paper knifc. There were rumors that the show was to be cut to an hour, that it was to be split into three half-hours, that Caesar and Coca were sundering as co-stars and that each was heading up his own show. Further rumors intimated that Sid and Imogene were holding out for more money. Any one of these rumors, if substantiated, might have pulled the rug out from under "Show of Shows."

Rumors are all they were, according to Liebman, who obviously enjoys speculating on how some of the tales started. The gossip about Imogene Coca feuding with Liebman began, so Liebman thinks, from the fact that she instituted a "friendly suit" against him in order to collect a contractual amongt of \$3500. Liebman asked her to undertake legal proceedings, as this was her only recourse to gain relief from a quirk in her contract. Only the story leaked, however, the \$3500 came out in print as \$35,000.

Truthfully, claims Liebman, either Sid Caesar alone or Imogene Coca alone could be the star of a big TV show. The false report that Coca wanted to split with her co-star and head her own/ TVenture probably started from an innocent reply Imogene gave to a New York interviewer. In it she expressed the whimsical opinion that it might be fun to work in a situation-type comedy where she would do the same role week after week, without having to jump from one production number to another in a bewildering variety of parts.

#### Mushroomed

From such a casual observation as this, the tale of Coca's wanting her own show probably grew. Liebman also thinks a disgruntled lesser. September 11, 1953 employee may have given some of these smoldering rumors an additional fanning into flame. The gossip made it difficult for everyone concerned. As great as Caesar and Coca are individually, "something happens" when they perform as a team. Liebman calls it "theatrical chemistry." Truthfully, both Sid and Imogene want to stay together.

Like other rumors, the ones about money were also false. Caesar, said to have been "holding out" for something like \$12,000 a week, was actually under three-year contract to NBC. Stipulations in this contract were that salary be increased each year. "He doesn't care about more money," Liebinan stated simply. "He doesn't want the raise."

Money for the show itself is something else, however. To buy talent and produce a ninety-minute TV opus requires wads of that green stuff. Last year, published figures for "Your Show of Shows" gave \$82,500 as the weekly cost for talent and production alone (no time included). With money requirements like this. it becomes a speculative matter of "how long can the sponsor ante up?" People begin to worry that lavish TV programs will price themselves right out of the market.

According to Liebman, "Show of Shows" is costing fifteen per cent more this season (for talent and production) than it did last season. "I think we have reached a peak," he summed up briefly. "However, in terms of three half-hour shows, our hour-and-a-half costs are not expensive."

In terms of keeping "Your Show of Shows" on top of the heap by cutting the length of the program into cither an hour or thirty minutes, Liebman has only one answer: "I'm willing to do anything to retain the largest audience. I prefer an hour and a half to one hour because it offers more opportunities in what is presented. I realize that what is happening in TV, in many respects, happened in radio. In radio the one-hour shows gradually gave way to half-hour programs. to economics, radio sponsors Due couldn't carry the one-hour load. But anything that tends to defy the tra-ditions of radio, I'm for!" Which means that Max Liebman prefers the ninety-minute production.

#### His Role

Liebman's opinion carries great weight. Though billed as producer, and though admittedly under contract to NBC along with Caesar and Coca, Liebman actually owns "Your Show of Shows" and NBC actually "sub-lets" Caesar's and Coca's contract to him. True, NBC might decide to place any one of the three on other programs, but chances are this won't happen. One network official expressed his and the feelings of his co-workers when he labeled Caesar, Coca and Max "the unbeatable three."

The trio is anticipating something exceedingly exciting this coming December, for their show has been selected by NBC for experimentation with color TV. "Color may make a big difference," observed Liebman, as he asided that though TV as a medium was a "wise old child," it was still a child. TV's mechanical aspects can conceivably add tremeudous luster to even the brightest program.

No show, almost everyone will admit, is ever better or brighter than the brains behind it and The Brains of "Show of Shows," Max Liebman, has not only amazed lookers by coming up with something interesting for four years, but what's more, he hasn't missed one single week. Asked how he managed to "hold up" and whether he worried about "the well running dry," Liebman admitted that he did worry when the show was new. Now he doesn't. The ideas seem to keep coming and once the show goes on camera, Liebman adopts the attitude that "it's in the lap of the gods." He remains calm under all circumstances, even when the scenery starts falling (as it did once last season).

"I'm not a desk man," confessed Max (as he prefers to be called), "I work in the salt mines—seven days a week and four nights. When 'Show of Shows' started, I frankly didn't think we'd last as long as we have. The lawyers drawing up the contracts kept discussing matters about 'the third year' while I sat back and said to myself, "There'll never be a third year.' As we start our fifth year, I hope to recapture those five rating points we dropped last year and I hope to add two more. I envision this as a season that will bring us back and beyond everything that's gone before."

Like so many others in the broadcasting industry, Bill was nursing an ulcer and headed for a nervous breakdown. But a simple box of crayons prevented him from cracking up.

Pill and his family were vacationing at Laguna Beach. One dismal day they were confined to their hotel room and Bill became restless with his enforced inactivity. He sheepishly asked his son, Bill, Jr., if he might borrow some crayons to while the time away. As Bill sketched the grav coastline with its faint shadows he began to relax. Tensions seemed to leave his mind and body.

This unpremeditated drawing lesson started Bill Davidson on a new hobby which worked wonders on his ulcers. The more he pursued his art the calmer he grew. In due time he joined the Businessmen's Art Institute of Los Angeles. As a matter of fact some of Bill's paintings were placed on exhibit by the group a few months ago.

Jack Bailey, Ira Cook and Eddie Dean are a few of his radio freres who are members of the Art Institute. Members are free to work in any medium they wish but they must adhere to one strict rule ... no shop talk. "Can you imagine Jack Bailey not talking about his 'Queen' show?" smiled Bill. "Believe it or not, we find our art classes so absorbing that talking about radio is the farthest thing from our minds."

#### Memorable Coverage

Bill has done about everything there is to do in radio and more basides. Thinking back over the past two decades his most momorable ex-

perience occurred when he covered the opening of the San Francisco Bridge.

Cheerfully he climbed the 700-foot tower. The fog rolled in as the ceremonies began. Fortunately Bill's intuition had prompted him to prepare a script in advance. His two "unprepared" colleagues stationed below couldn't see a thing and they kept switching to Bill in the tower, who blithely described the proceedings from his script. Bill was really high man on the totem pole.

Two hours later he proceeded to descend from the tower and his legs were so numb from standing in one spot that he could barely stand on them. He didn't have enough money to hire a cab, so he wobbled home. He spent the next two days in bed. The following year when he was asked to climb the tower again for a broadcast salute commemorating the bridge's first anniversary, Bill, needless to say, declined with thanks.

Radio isn't as hectic for Bill any more now that both have ripened to maturity. Bill keeps busy with his KECA afternoon airer, his art, and his family. Bill has always been at ease with the microphone but not so with the ladies. That is all but one lady. Lillian Hirsch, his wife. #### Paul Coates, Confidential File

Hard-hitting Paul Coates is giving the TV treatment to his newspaper column. He plans to bring to viewers the kind of expose' he's been writing about in his pillar. Whether it be gambling, graft, or prostitution, Paul intends to tell televiewers all about it.

His initial stanza was an expose<sup>6</sup> on a lady nudist and a B girl. The lady nudist conducted herself with a great deal of decorum. She was dressed. Even though the camera's concentration on her bare shoulders tried to make you believe otherwise.

Her information about nudist colonies was scant. Their premise—that there is no shame in the human body Page Eight --permits wholesale sun bathing. Before individuals are eligible to join their group they are carefully screened and only those having the highest moral and character references are admitted. But the law does not permit **nudist colonies** in Los Angeles. Enough said.

Paul dwelled a little longer on his interview with a masked B-girl. B-girls are his pet peeve. The B-girl's answers were as direct and cutting as were Paul's interrogations. She was a divorcee who had answered an ad for a cocktail waitress only to learn that the establishment wanted a hustler for the bar. She took the job because. as she explained, she figured if she didn't take the sucker's money someone else would do it. Her reason for appearing on a show which was out to do her no good was frankly for the financial remuneration.

A film insert showing the dawnfall of a wayward stranger on Main Street preceded this interview. It was a cumbersome film and took too long to get to the point. It slowed the show up considerably.

The entire show needs some revamping but it has good potentialities. The prolonged build up about the three million people in Los Angeles and the inside track that the newspaperman has with the multitude is, for our money, over-production for this type of show.

Fortunately the station and sponsor announce disclaimers of Coates's views. Coates bars no punches and it's quite possible that he'll embarrass the police department with such remarks as—"I've got a new campaign ... I don't like this business and I'm out to get you!"

Isn't the police department out after the same B-girl racketeers?

#### No Jinx for Joan

In the Oct. 31, 1952 issue of TV-RADIO LIFE (page nine to be exact) we predicted:

"Keep the name of Joan O'Brien in mind when you think of girl vocalists. With the proper training and guidance, she could develop into one of the really big names in show business."

The cute, blonde singer on Cliffie Stone's "Hometown Jamboree" was only sixteen years old at the time, and it was the first recognition given to her by the press.

Again, on March 20, 1953, (page 39), TV-RADIO LIFE stated:

"... it'll be kind of interesting to watch Joan O'Brien grow older. Show business, like fate, has many strange twists. But from all indications beauty, talent, sincerity, and any other attributes you care to mention—Joan O'Brien should blossom into one of the nation's most popular vocalists."

Result: this week CBS-TV announced that Joan will appear as the featured female vocalist on the coastto-coast "Bob Crosby Show" for a week beginning Monday, September 14.

#### "Beany's" Problems Solved

We don't want to fall into the "I Told You So" category BUT we did tell you that "Time for Beany" would appear on KTTV. Now that it's official, look for "Beany" on Channel 11 as a Monday-through-Saturday feature.

To make way for "Beany" and to log it in its original time slot—6:30 p.m. —the station cut "Ramar of the Jungle" to a fifteen-minute stanza. Once and for all the "Beany" dilemma is solved.

#### En Route Home From Alaska:

THE NEXT FIVE YEARS WILL WIT-NESS significant changes in Alaskan broadcasting, chiefly because TV is at hand. As I mentioned previously, grants have been made for three TV stations (two in Anchorage and one in Fairbanks). Young "Augie" Hiebert, associated for ten years with famed Colonel Lathrop, is heading a group of Anchorage businessmen for onc Anchorage TVenture, while Kiggins and Rollins hold the other Anchorage license and the sole grant, to date, for Fairbanks.

THIS KIGGINS-ROLLINS OUTFIT is interesting because it stems from San Diego. Two of the key men, James Duncan and Wilbur Williams, are Southern Californians—Duncan used to be with KTLA and KFMB-TV in San Dlego and Williams was assistant supervising engineer at Channel 8. They hope to be telecasting by the first of the year.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE LATH-ROP STATION in Fairbanks, KFAR, is planning to do about TV. I gained the definite impression that it was too KFAR away from everything to groove into the usual amenities and exchanges with visitors, so the report from this outlet will be a big, fat blank. Sorry about this, because I'd heard KFAR was an important outlet if for no other reason than it monitors Russian programs and is monitored by the Russians.

FAIRBANKS' OFFICIAL HOSTESS, Eva McGown, more than made up for the situation—you may recall that the fabulous Mrs. McGown, who has lived for forty years in Alaska, was honored by being a subject of Ralph Edwards' "This Is Your Life." She's still thrilled over her TV appearance and showed me pictures of it.

BACK IN JUNEAU WHEN OUR ship docked for a few hours, Jim Lawson, manager of the CBS affiliate, came aboard to pay a call. He said "Our Miss Brooks" was the most popular show on his outlet and that listeners flooded his station with protests when Eve & Co. went off for the summer. Lawson opined that TV was at least five years away from Juneau but I guess "Miss Brooks" will be top video fare there when it does appear.

I'M SHARPLY REMINDED, when thinking of Eve Arden's vehicle, of "Papa" Freund, camera genius about whom I wrote a recent yarn that prompted an immediate protest from Captain Donald W. Norwood of Pasadena. Apparently I got mental indigestion trying to assimilate all the impressive facts in "Papa's" biography and without meaning to, credited him with dreaming up the Norwood Director. Freund was granted a license in 1942 to manufacture and distribute it only. Apologies to Captain Norwood, who invented this exposure meter, and Page Twenty-six who also has a long list of photographic innovations, most recent of which are the Norwood Flashright and Speedright.

ALONG THE PHOTOGRAPHIC LINE, one picture I'd like to have caught at Juneau was that of the blind and almost deaf dog which had the reputation of never missing meeting an incoming ship. I tried to find this faithful animal but failed. Seems he picked up the vibrations from the ship's whistle, then hurried down to greet the vessel and claim his reward bones and other doggy delicacies.

LAST PORT WE TOUCHED HOME-WARD-BOUND was Ketchikan, where the CBS people gave us such a grand reception on the way north. This time a friend of Hollywood's Sybil and Hal "Mac" McCreight, was standing Bock, on the pier ready to escort me to the crab cannery and other interesting spots. "Mac," who sells Macintosh clothes like crazy to discriminating men of Alaska, proved to be a keen raconteur. (During the eight years he has been probing every part of the territory, he has acquired a fantastic stock of anecdotes.) "Mac" came aboard to have luncheon with our party just before we sailed. One thing he was especially eager to order was fresh milk, which I think I mentioned as being scarce. It's almost impossible to keep cattle in Alaska and airborne milk sells for about sixty cents a quart. The ships, of course, carry a round-trip supply out of Seattle. Saw only one "big" dairy, near Fairbanks, where they have to keep the cows in-side more than half the year, putting them up in quarters with special windows, exercise room, and food.

ENOUGH OF MY "REPORT" ON ALASKA. Have some new slants on Statehood (against it) and my fill, for awhile, of glaciers, mountains, streams, fish, wildlife, waterfalls, snow, ocean, lakes, pine trees and scenery in general. Despite my month's stay, I'm still what's known as a cheeckako, or newcomer. Only if I go back sometime and spend the winter will I be a qualified Sourdough.

#### Home Again.

HOLLYWOOD SEEMS AS HECTIC as ever, but the Fall season has great elements of excitement. Will spend the next few days trying to catch up with developments for the coming TV-radio season, which, to this Sourdough of going-on-fourteen winters in the Hollywood hinterlands, looks like a whale of a proposition!

#### Dear Mr. Underhill:

It was a pleasure to see your letter. In 1911 I made a trip to North Africa and brought back 1000 date palm offshoots for my father, who had a subtropical nursery under the name of the West India Gardens and who was interested in getting and distributing all subtropical fruits that would grow in this part of the world.... (He introduced the Fuerte and Puebla varieties of avocado).

Introduced the Fuerle and Puebla Varieties of avocado). The following year (June 1912) I started around the world with my younger brother, Wilson Popence, to get further date varieties. We went through Northern India, where we found nothing of value; then to Eastern Arabia and to Iraq, the principal commercial date growing region of the world, now as in the past. I brought 16,000 off-shoots to this country, most of which were planted in the Coachella Valley. ... I had one of the finest collections of oriental and other literature on date growing, which I turned over to the department of horticulture at UCLA.

Rex Koury, music director for ABC's Western Division, is rounding out twenty-five years of professional life. His first organ-playing assignment was in a small new Jersey movie house. The regular organist, after being badgered for weeks, finally permitted the youngster to fill-in the five-minute "breaks" with the admonition: "play real softly."

Today, Koury batons the ABC's radio network "Cinema Time," and other programs. His TV scoring of the "Tale of Two Cities" earlier this year was very commendable. The two half hour presentations were scored with the opulence of a screen production and the on the nose timing of radio. This was no mean feat in a spectacle with a cast of 150 people.

Koury also batons the CBS "Gunsmoke" whose theme has been published as a popular Western tune, Page Thirty

Before the baseball season comes to a close, let's give a little credit to a couple of guys who haven't received much publicity this year.



I am speaking about Fred Hessler. and Eric Paige, who help out Bob Kelley and Mark Scott, respectively, on their KMPC and KFWB baseball broadcasts.

Kelley and Scott certainly get their share of press notices — favorable

and otherwise—but no one has ever written anything on Fred or Eric. These are the "thumbnail" sketches which both boys gave me when I talked to them:

FRED HESSLER — Born March 20, 1912, in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, Reared and educated there and got his first radio job with WHBY in Sheboygan in 1936. Attended University of Wisconsin for three years. "Although I played quite a bit of softball, baseball, and basketball in school, I don't think you would consider me as the 'athletic type.'"

Worked as the "sports voice" for WTAG in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and for the Wisconsin network. Covered the baseball and basketball games of the University of Wisconsin in 1940 and 1941. Also did play-by-play of Three Eye League games.

During World War II spent three years in the Air Force. Settled in California after the war, and worked originally as staff announcer for KLAC. Wanted to get back into sports, however, so he grabbed a job with KGER in Long Beach, doing high school and junior college games. It paid off.

In 1950 he got the "big job" he still holds—Director of Sports for Armed Forces Radio Service. He does more play-by-play accounts than any local announcer, but of course we civilians don't hear them. Has also called Tidewater Associated football games for five years.

This coming football season he will do the color for the L. A. Rams games along with Ole Kel. When Kelley handles the telecasts, Fred will do play-by-play over KMPC. Married, with two children.

**ERIC PAIGE**—Born July 2, 1923, in Newark, New Jersey. Reared in Caldwell, New Jersey, where mother owned a beanery. Played football and baseball in high school and college. Attended Susquehanna University for a year and a half. Entered the paratroopers in 1943.

After discharge in 1945 attended Seton Hall for two years. Gave up "premed" course, auditioned for radio job, and landed staff appointment at NBC station in Beckley, West Virginia. Covered basketball and football games Page Thirty-eight

This moment brought tears to the eyes and chills up and down the spine.

TV-RADIO LIFE

**Paul Coaries** is certainly getting to be a popular man around the TV lanes. He has produced a real shocker in "Confidential File" over KTTV. The use of film clips was not only effective in the account of B-girls but it was startlingly frank. Looks very much like Paul is on a real crusade —one that could possibly be dangerous for he's playing with dynamite. He deserves a lot of credit. His show is at least something different and has a punch. The only drawbacks are those Stewart-Warner commercials. They go on forever. This is one sure way to convince an audience to buy

Not too long ago this was the one studio that would not allow any of its stars to even go near a TV set. Now, the bars are coming down—fast. Janie Powell, one of the top stars on the lot, made her TV debut on Wally Sherwin's "Stairway to Stardom" show and then was on the Peter Potter show. Here comes the stars, gang!

Speaking of Janie, she is the new Cocoanut Grove attraction at the Ambassador. Her TV appearances no doubt were part of the exploitation for her Grove stint, but regardless of the reason she should pack the place. She follows Gene Nelson into the night spot. All of which reminds me that many people are judging these two much too hastily. The real story has not been told, but when it is you'll see a brand-new picture. Anyway, here's wishing Jane luck at the Grove —and let's hope she appears on TV more regularly.

Rumor has it that ABC is letting Elmer Davis go. There is some talk that he has no sponsor—hence, the axe. But again it looks mighty suspicious. Davis has been for years one of the nation's most outstanding news commentators. He could always be depended on for an honest and frank appraisal of the news. It is fondly to be hoped that he will not leave the air—or that some other network will pick him up and fast.

Just wondered recently why the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences has never given an award for the best original teleplay. Certainly the writers are a very important factor in the success of any show—and they should have proper credit.

Here's an idea that should really catch on. **Roger Wagner**, prominent musician composer and whose **Roger Wagner Chorole** is always a musical highlight, has joined with some friends to form a club. They will automatically buy any product advertised on TV that has a fifteen second or less commercial. This is their protest against the endless spiels that are constantly interrupting movies and most TV shows. How about forming such a club yourself? A little while back I was being bad. Oh, I knew I wasn't being a good girl and I knew I was going to get a spanking, so this is where I tried that thing I was talking about. I said to daddy, "Will you kiss me before you spank me, daddy?" I knew what that would do to him. He kissed me and then he pretended to be awful strict—but he just barely touched me with a flip of his wrist.

Sometimes I think a child should try to get on the good side of her mother when her daddy is about to spank her. My mommy and daddy always tell me why I'm being spanked so at least I know what's going on. But once my daddy was going to punish me so I said to my mommy, "Mommy, you don't want daddy to lose his temper, do you?" This sort of helped them both to laugh a little and I didn't get much of a spanking.

#### **Keep Fathers Young**

I like to teach my daddy to be

interested in things I like because then he doesn't notice some of the things I do. And, besides, I think all daddies should be kept as young as possible so they'll remember some of the things they did when they were children. This way they can't get so mad at us kids when we act up.

The Moment That Changed

Leighton Noble's

NE MAN'S death gave a new life to another. That's the tragic but true story of the moment that changed Leighton Noble's life.

Back in 1936, Orville Knapp was one of the biggest names in the band business. He played at the finest hotels and ballrooms in the country.

As a result of a lucrative business deal, Knapp found himself one day with a wad of dough on his hands. A flying bug, he had always wanted to own his own plane-so he bought one.

One afternoon in Boston her took off in his two-seated Stinson-and never came back alive. He was silled instantly in a crash at the irport.

At that time the Knapp organiza-tion was playing at the Ritz Carlton in Boston. The featured singer was September 11, 1953

a young man by the name of Leighton Noble. He had joined Knapp in Los Angeles a year earlier.

During the remainder of the engagement at Boston, and for six months following at the William Penn Hotel in Pittsburgh, Leighton took over the leader's duties.

#### **Baton Bug Bites**

"It was the first time in my life 1 ever fronted a band," Leighton explained during a TV-RADIO LIFE in-"And it was the first time terview. "And it was the first time in my life I ever really thought about it. However, after that first experience, I knew that this was what I wanted to do in life."

Eventually George Olsen became the new leader of the old Knapp crew. And eventually Leighton left the organization and went out on his own.

His first engagement with his own band was at the famed Meadow-brook in New York in the winter of 1937. With the exception of a few years' layoff when he played in motion pictures, the congenial KTLA star has been twirling the baton ever since.

Almost unbelievably shy and unassuming for a first-rate bandleader, Leighton and his "Noblemen" have played at the leading hotels and ballrooms from coast to coast. Like most men in his racket, the personable maestro grew tired of living out of a suitcase. So when the oppor-tunity came for him to appear reg-ularly on KTLA's "Bandstand Re-vue," he quickly accepted the offer.

#### Another Welk?

Leighton has three big assets in his favor at the present time: (1) a well-established name in the band business; (2) a regular TV show on Channel 5; (3) a sharp manager by the name of Sam Lutz, who also handles Lawrence Welk.

Sam originally managed Leighton back in 1946. "Believe me, if it wasn't for Leighton back in those days, I probably wouldn't be in business today," Lutz recalls. "He kept me going when I needed it badly."

If Lutz can achieve the same success in Southern California that he has with Lawrence Welk, he'll be a mighty happy, well-heeled man. And so will Leighton.

OU KNOW, it's funny how you tag a star by the kind of role he plays. You assume he's just the kind of person he appears on the screen. And then you start talking to him and you realize there is so much more to him.

Take Desi Arnaz, for instance. On "I Love Lucy" he's the comic character who butchers the King's English and tries to keep Lucy in line. Yet, behind this buffoonery is a man with great ideals and beliefs.

I was talking to Desi at MGM where he and Lucy are lighting up the sound stages for "The Long, Long Trailer." Somehow we got off on the subjects of his beliefs, what principles have guided him.

"What does happiness mean to you, Desi?" I asked him.

He thought for a moment, a warm smile crept over his face, and he said, "It does not mean money that's for sure. My life is an example of that. I've had money several times in my life and I've been broke several times. And some of my unhappiest moments were during the periods when I had the most money.

"To be happy means, at least to me, to be with those you love, to be doing the kind of work you want, to give the best of yourself for the benefit of others. I'm with those I love. And now I'm acting, which was always my ambition. When I

had my band I was making about \$200,000 a year and I was miserable because no one would give me a chance to prove I could act. Now I have that chance. As for doing what I can for others, I can only hope that I'm succeeding in that."
