Ask anyone in Studio City about Hawthorne and you'll quickly be told that he is not only a very serious person in real life, but also a hard-working and conscientious civic leader.

scientious civic leader. Hawthorne is honorary "active" mayor of Studio City, a non-paying job he has held for three years. He takes it seriously, devoting much time and energy to civic matters. While most comedians seek complete privacy away from their job, Hawthorne prefers to be a contributing factor in Studio City's community life. As honorary mayor he has crusaded for civic projects of all sorts and has been instrumental in having the city of Los Angeles make many necessary street improvements.

Practically all of the top comics of show business are equally serious off-the-screen. Fred Allen is almost a morose individual in private life; Groucho Marx, Red Skelton, Jackie Gleason and Red Buttons are likewise dead pan off stage. Hawthorne sums it up this way: "Being funny is a serious business. We work at it for years, just like anybody else works at a job. We hope to improve. We learn the tricks of the trade. It becomes a serious matter

So I made myself become the world's most ardent advocate of positive thinking. Almost immediately everything good started to happen to me. Now it's a natural philosphy on which I base my entire life."

He Changed

Ed Sullivan Is Star-Maker par-excellence. He has introduced many stars of today on his very successful "Toast of the Town" show. Here's a guy with REAL humility.



D SULLIVAN is not only one of TV's most astute producers, but he is also responsible for the current success of many of today's leading stars. Among his discoveries are Toni Arden. Theresa Brewer. Jackie Gleason, Wally Cox. Johnny Ray, Frankie Laine, Eddie Fisher, Faye Emerson, Rosemary Clooney, Bobby Van. Roberta Peters, Anna Maria Alberghetti, Frank Fontaine, Sam Levenson, Audrey Hepburn. Guy Mitchell, Victor Borge, and even Martin & Lewis.

"'Toast of the Town' has been on TV for five years now," Ed commented during a rehearsal in New York, "and frankly I'm proud of the personalities we've introduced. We may have helped them up the ladder

a little, but they had very real talent to begin with.

"Toni Arden was brought to me by her manager. No one had given her a chance at all. In fact, very few would even hear her. I gave her an audition and immediately spotted her on "Toast of the Town."

"On the same show that night was another newcomer. Theresa Brewer. She is now a famed recording personality. I had heard her first at a benefit on Long Island. She had a bad cold that night but I could see that she had real talent. Not long after this, I did a show at the Roxy Theatre in New York featuring all new talent. I put Toni Arden on first, and then presented Theresa. Both girls were sensational!

"As for Jackle Gleason, I had seen

him perform and had thought he was the best book comic in the business, so I put him on 'Toast.' Everyone connected with the show thought he was a sensation but the audience didn't go for his monologue. Jackie felt the monologue was the wrong material to use, so later when CBS signed him. I used him again on one of the summer 'Toast' shows. He did what he wanted to do and was so great that not only did CBS find a sponsor for him but we used him on three other shows that summer.

"As for Johnny Ray, Nancy Compton, a dancer who had been on our show. told me of a young singer who was playing at a club with her who was creating a riot among the teen-agers with his singing. She asked me to come see him. I heard



him and thought he was quite terrific so I called his agents and casually mentioned Johnny while I was talking about other clients. The agency wanted to know where I had heard of him and I didn't go into details. He came on 'Toast' just about the time his song, 'The Little White Cloud That Cried' came out and rocked the place. The kids loved him but the parents thought we were crazy to present such a personality.

"Margaret Truman was my big coup. I had repeatedly tried to get her on the show but got nowhere. Then one day I was lunching with Mimi Benzell, opera star, who appeared on 'Toast.' Mimi said, 'Have vou been trying to get Margaret Truman on the show'? I told her I

first several years ago. My daughter, Betty, had seen them and liked them a lot. They were as funny then as they are now. I'm still grateful to Betty for insisting I use them on the show.

"I met Audrey Hepburn about two years ago in London. She told me she was planning to come to New York and I told her that if she did a play I'd at least give her a good notice. She finally arrived in 'Gigi' and it was after she appeared on 'Toast' that Paramount signed her. She is now a real star.

"Frank Fontaine also got his start from our show. He was playing in Boston at the time and going no place. He was on "Toast' four or five times and clicked from then on.



had and she said she thought Margaret was about ready to try TV and arranged for us to meet. I thought Margaret was a charming girl—and when she offered to sing I was amazed because I hadn't planned on suggesting this, even though I had wanted her to sing. I was especially impressed by the fact that Margaret asked me to make no reference to the White House connection—so I simply introduced her as Margaret Truman. Everyone loved her.

"Wally Cox was on 'Toast' three times. The first time he did a weird little song. He made his big hit on our Oscar Hammerstein biography show. This was in 1951.

"Martin & Lewis got about \$125 when they appeared on our show December 18, 1953 "In looking back over the performers who got their chance on "Toast' I realize how much I owe to the astuteness and imagination of the West Coast showmen. The top men there used to see the talent on our show and call the talent scouts here to sign someone. You see, the men here just wouldn't waste time watching TV. They thought it wouldn't last."

Ed Sullivan will undoubtedly continue to create more new stars—just as his "Toast of the Town" will continue to be a show that can be depended upon for good taste and really great entertainment. This Sullivan man is TV's most amazing individual, at least for our money.



ED HAS BROUGHT many of the nation's most famous sports figures into TV prominence. One of his most interesting guests was "Sugar Ray" Robinson. The fighter hasn't gone into show business but he proved he could do all right if the TV bug ever bit him.

LONG BEFORE HOLLYWOOD heard of Audrey Hepburn, Ed introduced her to the country on his show. She is now Paramount's hottest bet after "Roman Holiday." It was through her appearance with Ed that she got her Paramount contract.

F'S A SAD state of affairs. but it's true. Good music the classical type—is losing popular favor so fast it may soon find no market on TV and radio at all. After all, what other conclusion can be drawn when you think how seldom the classics are heard any more—and when the 'William Tell Overture' is known simply as the 'Lone Ranger' music? What has happened to the public's desire for good music?"

And so spoke Roger Wagner. This noted musician-composer k n ow s whereof he speaks. His Roger Wagner Chorale is a regular favorite on TV- radio, and in the recording and concert field. For a long time it was synonymous with the "long hair" kind of music. But recently, to fit the demand, it has turned to the more popular field. A recording of "Impressions of Brazil" on Capitol label has, in fact, been a steady seli-out.

"However, don't think that the Chorale or I have turned our backs entirely on the classical field," Roger said. "We recently recorded a big work for Capitol records. It was the Faure 'Requiem' and we used a thirty-seven piece orchestra and thirty-three singers. We have big hopes for that.

"I think the trouble with the public's tastes in music is that the people have been radio-educated. They turned on the radio and all they heard were the popular ditties of the day. Most of the time such offerings haven't been musically worthwhile —and they certainly have shown little invention. One type of song is popular and immediately you get dozens of initations. Take 'I Believe.' for example. There must have been about eighty attempts since then at the same kind of number.

Does the Public Want Good Music?

In which Roger Wagner, noted musiciancomposer, makes the startling claim that good music will soon be a lost art on TV.

"I don't think I realized how much we have turned away from the classical music until I went to Europe with the Chorale this last summer. I saw people there plowing the fields and singing the theme from Brahm's Fourth Symphony. In London one day I was riding in a taxi with a friend. He and I were discussing a certain theme from a Prokofieff Symphony. He said it occurred in the second movement. The cab driver suddenly turned around and said, 'Oh, no, it doesn't. It's in the first movement and the melody goes like this.' He then proceeded to sing the theme.

"I'm afraid we're still an uncultured audience here. We're afraid of anything that is remotely 'long hair." We stay away from good music in droves and go on asking for more of the same pop stuff.

"For a long time I was associated with the classical field, Roger went on, "but I soon realized, as have others, that if I wanted to make a living I would have to start doing more popular things. My group has worked in several motion pictures but it wasn't until I did some work in 'Let's Do, It Again' and in 'Happy Time' that Hollywood realized I could do something beside the classical. late toward increasing the public's musical knowledge. Andre Kostalanetz did much to make the classics more familiar to people, and Stokowski certainly made Bach more interesting with his free-wheeling interpretations.

"You know. it's a funny thing about music. So many regard the long hair variety as a stigma, and yet all good 'pop' men have an extensive classical background."

Just as Roger has. Born in Paris, he was early put in contact with choral work since his father was a choral director. His musical career began as an organist. He then turned to composing and arranging, and seven years ago organized the Chorale. He took twenty-four singers with him to Europe at a cost of \$30,-600. He is the only person in the country who keeps sixteen singers under personal contract. They get their weekly salary whether they sing or not.

Most of the Chorale's TV work is done on the Joan Davis NBC show, "I Married Joan."

Roger Wagner still hopes for a rebirth of the better music, but in the meantime he confesses he has written a number called "Sing Boogie." If anybody can re-educate the public musically, however, he may very well be the person to do it.

"There have been a few steps of

The excellent narra. tion is spoken by Frederic March, another reason to watch this engrossing, graphic study of the life and time of the greatest religious artist and one of the most remarkable men in history.

"Rocket Ship X-M." (5) Dec. 19, 9:00. A group of scientists, among them Lloyd Bridges, John Emery and Osa Massen, set out for the moon in a space ship and treat us to a fairly authentic version of the rigors and travails such a trip would entail. They float off into space, duck passing meteors, and finally, on the moon, en-counter a race of people completely ravaged by the glories of atomic warfare. The picture thus has a message, and I'm all in favor of messages . . . especially if they say something.

"Lost Continent." (5) Dec. 25, 10:00. Here is another science-fiction "Thriller." Cesar Romero, John Hoyt ,Hugh Beaumont, and a couple of others explore an uncharted island in search of a rocket and run into prehistoric monsters, earthquakes, uranium fields which turn everything green (still black and white on your set, and in this case just as well), finally winding up in a boat gently awash as the is-land blows up. At this point, Hoyt observes that he hopes the world doesn't also blow itself up, and I couldn't help agreeing with him.

"The Long Voyage Home." (13) Dec. 20, 3:30. Still one of the best films to be seen on TV, this is a filmization of a group of one act plays about the sea by the potent American play-wright, the late Eugene O'Neill. A John Ford production with John Wayne and Thomas Mitchell.

"The Quiet Woman." (2) Dec. 19. 12:00 noon. Shhh . . don't make a sound.

EVERY NOW AND THEN YOU STUMBLE across a Los Angeles success story, and, less frequently, across one involving the success of a woman (or women) in business. The other noon I had the happy assignment of lunching with three gals who have made the grade and rate a hefty mention.

THESE SUCCESSFUL WOMEN are Gwen and Lorrayne, familiar to viewers

as the "Pink Ice" girls, and radio's "Lonesome Gal" who last week cancelled her program on forty-two radio celled her program on forty-two radio stations across the continent to go exclusively with the "Pink Ice" girls. From here on out, L.G. will do the radio plugging for this fabulously successful cosmetic, while Gwen and Lorrayne will do the TV pitches. "Lone-some's" husband will direct and pro-duce the stint. duce the stints.

"PINK ICE," ACCORDING to its partners, Gwen and Larrayne, will do

about half a million dollars' busi-ness this year in contrast to 1952, when the whole-sale gross was \$1000. This certain-ly establishes "Pink Ice" as a ly esta "Pink Ice" as a success.

GWEN AND HER MOTHER HAVE

struggled with

their brainchild since the mid-30's. Gwen, who was in the movies and worked alongside Lucille Ball as a Goldwyn girl, got lead poisoning from the makeup. Her mother, who was in the business of making and selling small cosmetics, concocted a soothing beautifier for her daughter's use, and results were so spectacular that Mrs. Seager was practically forced into making up little containers of her product for Gwen's chums at the studio. Word-of-mouth advertising was responsible for the early success of "Pink Ice." However, the enterprise went through two serious flops and as recently as 1949 Gwen and her mother were forced to sell their business for \$10,000. Mrs. Seager, however, retained the rights to the name and formula.

THINGS WERE SO BAD THAT Gwen set out to get a job somewhere else. She ran into Lorrayne ,whose fortunes had taken a similar dip when her thriving dance studio had been forced to close during the war. The two gals hit it off instantly and in one inspired moment, casting about for something they could make a success of togeth-er, decided to try "Pink Ice" as a joint business

LORRAYNE FLEW TO NEW YORK to borrow money and came back with \$2,000 earmarked for promotion. On the day the girls were supposed to start their big sales drive, Lorrayne's father died and \$600 of the \$2000 went for funeral expenses. After deducting trip expenses, the girls started their promotion on KTTV with about \$1,200.

IT WAS SLOW CUTTING "THE ICE" but eventually sales started to pick Page Twenty-six

up. Early this spring, Gwen and Lor-rayne knew they were "in business." Orders started running into hundreds, and then thousands. They themselves were making as many as thirty TV appearances weekly.

THE GIRLS WERE PUSHED TO CA-PACITY, filling all the orders themselves, then lugging the boxes to the post office. Some days they would sit with their hair in curlers and "Pink

Ice" daubed over their faces prepara-Ice" daubed over their faces prepara-tory to going on television to plug "Pink Ice," meanwhile filling cartons and sealing them for shipping. This was strictly a mail order operation. The money rolled in so fast they could scarcely take care of the orders, let alone deposit the bills. Said Gwen, "I remember that one time I had over remember that one time I had over \$6,000 in cash under my bed. I was just too busy to go to the bank and deposit it." They hired a girl to help them with business details and a young man to help Mrs. Seager with the packing.

IN JUNE THIS YEAR, their whole-sale sales were \$20,000; in July they climbed to \$30,000; in August they were \$40,000; in September they had \$98,000. Stores which now stocked "Pink Ice," couldn't keep the product on their shelves, the demand was so brisk. Gwen and Lorrayne flew to San Francisco and arranged to outlet the product there. Right now sales have leveled off, Los Angeles at about \$60,000 a month, with San Francisco running neck and neck. Early next year the girls expect to go to New York to arrange for national distribution of the product. Their enterprise, which consists of six separate companies, now employs about twenty per-sons. They "farm out" the manufacture of their cosmetic; their own bond-ed chemist, however, taking charge of the formula.

THOUGH "LONSOME GAL" had been on the air for several years, and only recently unmasked and revealed her identity, it wasn't until a matter of weeks ago that Gwen knew that this personality was no other than her long-time friend, Jean King, who also

There seems to have been some divergence of opinion on the merits or demerits of Jack Benny's appearance on "Omnibus" a few weeks ago. If you saw it, you will remember that the master comedian did a version of his much-maligned and kidded movie, "The Horn Blows at Midnight." As far as this columnist is concerned, it was far and away Benny's best effort. He did a notable acting job in a script that was a standout. What impressed me was Jack's adroit handling of the more serious moments in the showall of which proved that he is much more than just a comedian. As for the script itself, it was something to note the deep spiritual values that made it something above the ordinary. Maybe the writer didn't know he was giving a spiritual meaning to the story but it was there - and reine story but it was under a number freshingly so. Everyone concerned with this show deserves a big bow. "Omnibus," already a fine adult show, took another giant step ahead.

Talked to Barbara Stanwyck re-cently. She thinks Jack Benny is the master showman of them all—and she doesn't seem to be far wrong. She made one TV appearance with Jack in a take-off on "Gaslight" and has done a repeat of the same show with

him. She said she would work with Jack any time because he knows how to treat guests but that she was not in the least interested in doing TV on any regular basis. "It's just too much work," she commented.

As for the second version of "Gas-light," it has been sitting in the archives pending a court action brought against Benny and company by MGM. Seems that the studio doesn't like a TV satire of its movie version of "Gaslight." Can't see the logic here. Why was the first telecast permitted then? And wouldn't a second show give a lot of good publicity to the movie in case it was ever re-released?

It's not new but it's still depressing -this business of seeing TV stars giv-ing commercials at the end of their shows. So many people resent this that it's hard to see how plugs by the stars could help sales. It's more than ridiculous to see people like Jack Webb and Ray Bolger and Danny Thomas spout out the merits of the products after playing such specialized characters in the show. This is com-pletely without dignity. And there should be an end to it!

A big bow to Lucy, Desi, Gale Storm, and Charles Farrell for giving that big party last week at the Palladium for all those who made pledges to RTRA. The organization, serving many charitable groups, was over-whelmed at the action of these four stars. As were the several thousand who attended. From us at TV-Radio Life, a big, big thank you and a heart-felt cheer to these stars. felt cheer to these stars.

Seems that most of the ladies not only get it but love it, so guess we're the only one out in left field. . . . There are two types of sports fans in Southern California. Kelley haters. And Kelley lovers. Naturally I'm referring to Bob Kelley, the An-



I'm referring to Bob Kelley, the Angel, Ram, and regular KMPC sports announcer.

> Actually though, Kelley only deserves half of the ridicule or raves. The other half belongs to his partner in crime and criticism, Jim Healey.

Many people know of Jim Healey, but few know

about him. Or how he got hooked up with Ole Kel. Or exactly what his relationship is with battling Bob.

Except for the first six years of his life in Spokane, Washington, Jim is strictly a local product. Attended Beverly Hills high school. Then to UCLA, where he really got interested in the brawny boys as Sports Editor of THE DAILY BRUIN. Next stop was the HOLLYWOOD CITIZEN-NEWS, where he pounded out sports copy for two years.

Although Jim had run into Kelley on various assignments, it wasn't until a Christmas Eve party in 1942 that the Jekyll-and-Hyde of L. A.'s sporting world finally got together. Ole Kel was having a ball. Really enjoying himself. Suddenly he realized it was time to get to the KMPC studios and write his regular show. Halfkiddingly, half-seriously, he turned to Jim:

"Healey, ole man, why don't you display the true Christmas spirit and write my sports program for me tonight?"

"Okay, I will," Jim replied. (For three years, 1946 to 1949, Healey had helped Dick Furcell at KFWB with his program, so he knew how to handle a radio script.)

"You're not kidding, are you?" Kel asked.

Jim wasn't. He was off to the studio, wrote the show, and had it ready when Kelley came in. Impressed with Jim's work, two months later Ole Kel made it legal. He hired Jim as his regular writer.

Probably the most amazing fact about the Healey-Kelley combo (and they have four years working together to prove it) is that they agree on practically every controversial topic that comes up. In sports, even more than matrimony, this is unbelievable.

Of course there have been a few exceptions. While writing copy on the eve of the Billy Graham-Art Aragon battle, Jim honestly thought that Graham would win. But it would have been bad policy for Ole Kel to turn his back on "his boy," the Golden Page Thirty-eight

While Red appeals to all ages, there can be no question that it is the teen-agers who have contributed a great deal to his success. It is the teen-agers who have picked up such expressions as "ho, ho—he he!", "You I Like," "I'll give you the horns," and "Strange Things Are Happening," and made them everyday expressions.

Part of Red's appeal to the teenagers is that he looks like one of them. His closely-cropped hair, his vouthful expression and his ever ready grin belie his thirty-four years. Red evokes an immediate response from his audience and he is the only comedian who does a "quiet-down" instead of a "warm-up" for the studio audience just before his Monday night CBS-TV show. Red's overly enthusiastic audience likes to join right in and show him they know all of his expressions. Last year Red's studio audience, always well filled with teen-agers, would get a little out of hand and Red found they tended to spoil his timing and interfere with the show generally to the detriment of his vast unseen audience. Consequently, Red finds it advisable to spend the warm-up period explaining to his audience that while he wants them to enjoy themselves, he'd appreciate it if they wouldn't talk to him while the show is on the air.

Red's mail bears evidence of the esteem in which teen-agers hold him. Here are a few quotes from some recent letters: A teen-ager in Stamford, Conn., writes: "I am one program. In school all the children are saying 'horns to you' so I know they watch your program too."

Another young viewer from Ohio writes him: "I am fourteen years old and watch your show every night. I think you are the greatest. Every Tuesday morning while walking to school you hear, 'Did you see Red Buttons last night?', and then we all start singing the Ho-Ho Song."

From Brooklyn comes the following :"I have been a great fan of yours since your first television show. A great many of the girls in my class belong to your fan club."

A teen-ager from Rochester writes: "I sing the Ho-Ho Song so much all my friends are calling me "The Ho-Ho Girl'."

And a young lady in Hollywood writes Red: "I am so happy to see you back on television. Your show is really tops. It seems that everyone out here loves your show and I wish it originated from Hollywood."

Two of the characters that Red's teen-age fans seem to like best are "Mugsy Buttons" and the "Kupke Kid." Mugsy is a young man who is forever deflating his elders, especially those who represent authority in the person of a judge, a policeman or a truant officer. No matter how much they push him around, Mugsy always seems to get the best of them.

The Kupke Kid, on the other hand, is a naive, hard-working youngster who gets pushed around and gets into scrapes because he is at the right place at the wrong time.

Perhaps there is a little bit of "Mugsy" and the "Kupke Kid" in every teen-ager and that's why they find these two characters especially endearing.

> ORE AND MORE programs have been hitting the channels and radio lanes putting great stress on

the sufferings and troubles of people throughout the country. It's taken on the aspects of an emotional whingding.

It's probably true that such programs do some good—if they are handled in good taste. But what about those who present such offerings without any semblance of dignity or consideration for the people involved?

One TV and radio show that specializes in the problems of the ordinary person is CBS's "Strike It Rich." It deals strictly in sentiment—but with a difference. And it was to learn how this program feels about sob stuff that Warren Hull, the capable emcee. was contacted for some blunt and honest opinions.

"I'm a bit prejudiced about this subject." Warren commented before going into the studio for his New York show. "We don't devote our whole time to sob stuff. Instead. we try to be constructive. In fact, we go to great lengths to keep our show from becoming maudlin. Sure people do break down on occasion but we always try to cheer them up. However, they don't come to us as a iule until they have no place else to turn. In most cases, there are no agencies in their home towns where they can get the needed help. And we're proud that we've been able to help—honestly—so many people.

Are TV and radio programs emphasizing human troubles too much? Are they pouring out the emotional problems without thought for persons involved? Warren Hull of "Strike It Rich" gives his views on this much-debated matter.

the hills in Kentucky. She wanted to study as a doctor so she could be of assistance to her people, but she didn't have the money for such training. Through 'Strike It Rich' she was able to start her career, and is now in Kentucky giving aid to those who were never able to afford a doctor before.

"When it comes right down to it, the sob stuff comes more from the viewers than from those on the show. I'll never forget the reaction from our audience to the case of a little boy who had an incurable disease and only had a few months to live. We didn't mention once that the boy wouldn't live long. He was such a cheerful little guy and this impressed everyone. He was asked a certain question and gave the wrong answer. He was so upset about the mistake he started to cry, but since his parents knew the right answer we didn't count his a miss.

"If we had wanted to stress the boy's suffering we could have played up his illness, but we did all we could to make him happy instead. We try to make people happy when they're on our show.

"We have had some on the show who tried to play up their troubles, but we have found audiences resent this. Those with a basic dignity get much more response than those who feel sorry for themselves.

"There was one seventy-eight year old prospector from California who needed to have cataracts removed from his eyes. He won the necessary money and had the operation. I saw him later and he said, 'You'll never know what this means to me.' That, incidentally, is a remark we hear more than anything else—and it does make us feel as though we're doing a worthwhile job.

"The prospector never for a moment felt sorry for himself. He had real courage—and as a result everyone was pulling for him.

"Everyone on the show is anxious to help the people who appeareven the crew. This is a wonderful thing because if all of us didn't honestly believe in the good we try to do we would certainly get bored with the whole deal.

"Naturally, hearing of such troubles does affect all of us on the show. Often I go home at night very depressed. And the only thing that keeps the spirits up is remembering that in our own little way we are being of service to the needy. Alsowhen you hear of what others go through, it reminds you to count your own blessings.

"Too much sob stuff on TV? Only if a show is just out to get the sobs and only if it completely takes away a person's own basic right to dignity."

It's too bad there aren't more people like Warren Hull conducting certain programs on TV.

Stalwart Jon Hall, Hero Of Many Adventure Movies, Takes Video In His Stride And Says:

AMAR of the Jungle" is a natural for Jon Hall. The handsome actor has been associated with the great outdoors ever since childhood.

He was raised on the beautiful South Sea Island of Tahiti, where he learned to swim almost as soon as he learned to walk. As a matter of fact his skill in aquatic sports, developed during his boyhood in Tahiti, won him his first movie role in "Hurricane" which incidently was written by his uncle, James Norman Hall, in collaboration with Charles Nordhoff.

Subsequently, most of Hall's films were outdoor sagas. Even the lush jungle surroundings on the "Ramar" set remind Jon of Tahiti. It also reminds him of Florida where he owns citrus and avocado groves.

It is quite understandable, therefore, that when Jon contemplated television he wanted a series with an outdoor flavor. He left Columbia pictures, where he was under contract, and gambled on "Ramar." It was a gamble that paid off, inasmuch as the popular series is seen in almost 100 markets.

Actually "Ramar" is a Western played in the jungles. Jon, on the side of law and order, always wins out. The series, however, has been educational for both its star and its viewers. Jon claims his knowledge about jungle life has increased tenfold since starring in the series. Even the characteristics of the various tribes in Africa form familiar patterns for the TV-adventurer. Through the medium of TV film, Jon Hall has become the modern Martin Johnson.

"Ramar" also sharpens Jon's memory processes. The studio shoots three scripts in six days, and that takes a heap of memorizing. There's no time for idiot sheets on this busy schedule. John explains that it's a matter both of learning and forgetting as quickly as possible.

Whenever Jon makes public appearances the small fry flood him with questions about the jungles, and he is becoming quite an authority on the subject. There was one sharp moppet who baited Jon with an impudent, "How come you showed tigers in your show last week and there aren't any tigers in Africa?" With a sigh of relief, Jon informed the youngster that he had undoubtedly missed the first part of the program which explained that the tigers had been on a boat which capsized off the shores of Africa.

"TV's great," Jon exclaims, "but you certainly have to watch your p's, q's, and tigers."

MANTEL ORNAMENT. To give candles height, secure them on tin cans, advises Lloyd. This piece com bines pyracantha (red-berried shrub) and magnolia. Clear shellac or plastic spray gives gloss. In place of cotton you may use flour, sugar, starch, or soap flakes to simulate snow.

How to Make Your Own Christmas Decorations

KECA-TV's GARDEN EXPERT, Gordon Baker Lloyd, is stressing "do-it-yourself" decorations this Christmas. Gordon, who is a great believer in using things which Nature has placed at the decorator's disposal, has been collecting pieces of driftwood, old branches, rocks and weeds for years. Even though he gives away most of what he gathers, he still has a treasure-house of more than 2,000 items. In making the accompanying Yuletide pieces, Mr. Lloyd pointed out, "There is practically nothing to buy. Anybody can make them."



TABLE ARRANGEMENT. This natural arrangement combines Christmas greens, pittosporum, and a thistlelike weed called Teasel. A spray shellac to give the centerpiece a luster, and drifts of snow add interest.

TABLE ARRANGEMENT. Place on over-sized white candle in center, then bank pine cones and Christmas balls around it. Dibs of snow make fine contrast, especially if you're using the arrangement on a dark-finished table.

DOOR ORNAMENT. Lloyd, if you will note, does not use ribbon or similar fragile materials apt to become sad in rainy weather. Any good, long branches wired together, plus pine cones wired into top of cluster will do.
