## **The Star-Studded Show**

There are many TV filmed dramatic shows, but "Ford Theatre" continues to be the topranking effort. No wonder the stars prefer this program when they decide on the TV plunge!

BC's "Ford Theatre" has long been one of the most potent attractions on TV. There has to be a reason for such popularity.

There is little doubt that this Screen Gems show has remained on top because of its emphasis on star names. Almost every important personality who has been available for TV has appeared on the series. Many who had previously vowed they wouldn't be caught dead doing TV of any kind have, one by one, succumbed to the lure of "Ford Theatre."

#### Stars' Debuts

When Merle Oberon, who had been spending most of her time in Europe, decided to return to Hollywood and to re-establish herself, she did a "Ford Theatre." Since her first telecast she has been cast in such big

films as "Deep in My Heart" at MGM and "Desiree" at 20th Century-Fox. Will Rogers, Jr. had made up his mind to retire after having done "The Will Rogers Story," even though it was a notable success. However, he did one "Ford Theatre" show and then another-and has now decided to continue with his career. Irene Dunne, disappointed over the results of her first TV venture as hostess for a series of filmed dramatic shows, had to be persuaded to try the medium again—and she was so satis-fied with the outcome of her first "Ford Theatre" venture for Screen Gems that she agreed to do another play. Paul Douglas is another who had assiduously avoided television in any shape, but when he did one for Screen Gems he found the experience so pleasant and such an easy way to make money that he plans to make more. Keefe Braselle just

recently did "Shadow of Truth" for "Ford Theatre," which was his first TV venture.

The reason "Ford Theatre" attracts such big names is not hard to define. The big argument is that these stars know they will be in productions that are handled with all the finesse and know-how of a major motion picture company, since Columbia Pictures Corporation is behind the Screen Gems set-up with all its facilities. In fact, this is the only instance to date where a motion picture studio is directly engaged in TV production.

#### Movie Know-how

The series is always notable for its excellent production values—its outstanding sets, top direction, the best of camera work, outstanding quality in costuming and in make-up. Burnett Guffey, for instance, who won the award as the best cameraman for "From Here To Eternity." has photographed several "Ford Theatre" productions. Gert Andersen, under contract to Columbia for twenty years as a camera operator, is now getting his chance as cinematographer for this NBC program. Jean Louis, the noted costume designer at Columbia, has on several occasions done the clothes for a Screen Gems production and Helen Hunt, hairdresser par excellence at the studio, has lent her talents. Clay Campbell, head makeup artist at Columbia, has been called in several times to do tricky make-up for the TV series.

With such a set-up, no wonder the stars feel that this show is their best bet.

"SISTER VERONICA" brought Irene Dunne, as a nun, back to the TV screens. Taylor Holmes was featured in the cast. Important stars, such as Miss Dunne, have helped immeasurably to make "Ford Theatre" a hot bet.



Then there is the matter of re-runs, which also has its bearing on the future earnings of the stars. "Ford Theatre" has repeats on "Your All Star Theatre," which is now playing in 133 markets. and "Regal Theatre" which is another "Ford" re-run. There are other examples too.

The types of stories filmed for this program are also reasons for its popularity. The series is slanted primarily towards the women since about seventy five per cent of the stories bought come from the "slick" national magazines. So where does this leave the men? Well, they go along for the ride but every once in a while a story tailored for them is tossed in.

Producing the successful shows are three men who have worked in almost every major motion picture studio—Irving Starr, Michael Kraike, and Irving Briskin. With all their experience, they seem to have found what the public really wants.

what the public really wants. To prove that "Ford Theatre" intends to keep up with all new developments, all the shows are now being filmed in color—the first instance where a major dramatic program has gone into color to this extent.

There is still another answer to "Ford Theatre's" success—it knows what the public wants and it is determined to go on giving it to them. Some may call this policy too commercial, but have you heard anyone's arguing recently with the importance of being successful?

Traditionally fine music has been the keynote of this program since its inception in 1928. The discriminating programming has resulted in everlasting popularity. The program has been honored with many awards.

Among the roster of musical artists who have been starred on "Voice of Firestone" are Eleanor Steber, Lily Pons. Lawrence Tibbett, Nelson Eddy, Dorothy Maynor, Lauritz Melchior, Igor Gorin, Gladys Swarthout, Ezio Pinza and Patrice Munsal.

The most-sung vocal n u m b e r s through the years have been "Siboney," Schubert's "Serenade" and the Bach-Gounod "Ave Maria." The most played orchestral numbers have been Strauss' "Blue Danube Waltz" and Tchaikovsky's "Waltz of the Flowers."

The theme music of "Voice of Firestone" was composed by the late Mrs. Idabelle Firestone. The opening number is "If I Could Tell You" and Page Six the closing theme music is "In My Garden." When Mrs. Firestone died last July a touching memorial broadcast was aired as a tribute to her.

#### Howard Barlow

Howard Barlow has been conductor of the Firestone Symphony Orchestra for eleven years. Barlow might have spent his life as a singer but for a single conducting lesson when he was a high school student.

Young Barlow was conducting the glee club, of which he was a member, while the class waited for their regular teacher to arrive. The conductor came in, watched the boy unobserved, and offered to give him a lesson in conducting. The teacher was Wilburforce J. Whiteman, Paul Whiteman's father. The names Howard Barlow and "Voice of Firestone" have since become inseparable in the past decade or so.

In 1949 "Voice of Firestone" bowed on television, becoming the first musical simulcast in the field. "Voice" originated its programs from the Center Theatre in New York before it was demolished. The Center Theatre

was the world's largest television studio-theatre in 1950.

The program switched to ABC last June, after a twenty-five year association with NBC, because of difficulties which arose over a proposed time shift on NBC. Firestone's television show suffered a drastic loss of audience in its Monday night time slot. Conversely, the Firestone simulcast on radio maintained a steady high rating.

NBC felt that the reason for this inconsistency was due to the fact that Firestone's video show faced strong competition from another network and was also surrounded by programs of a wholly different character. The net proposed shifting the telecast to a more suitable day when programming emphasis was placed on cultural presentations. Firestone did not find any of NBC's proposals acceptable and thus switched to ABC where it will be presented on the same day and time it has had for the past twenty-five years.

Next season. NBC has Leland Hayward's "Spectaculars," Sid Ceasar, and "Medic" lined up to combat that competition from that "other" network on Monday evenings.

The "Voice of Fircstone's" temporary problems have been solved and the program will undoubtedly be around to celebrate its golden anniversary. There will always be an audience for fine music. TY-RADIO LIFE

YOU'D THINK THE H-BOMB WAS going to be screened in person the way they're guarding the names of the big shots being set to appear. I have an inkling of two or three and there'll be more to match. Talent pool is en-larged due to telecasting from both New York and Hollywood, Live, of course.

GALE STORM AND HER FAMILY MAY end up tenting for a few days, all because the Gale Storm-Lee Bonnell house nearing completion in Royal Oaks won't be finished for the scheduled September 7. It's a dream house worth waiting for-radiant heating under all the floors, master bath overlooking a fish pond and aviary, kitchen with two wall-ovens, barbecue, floors of slate and walls of petrified wood.

ARB-TELEQUE RATINGS FOR AUGUST show programs have jumped around like Mexican beans. I'VE ALREADY TAKEN A CRACK AT THE lack of entertainment values in this program, but after witnessing all the backstage work constantly re-quired to keep all the "Marco" cards straight, I'm wondering if the same time and dough wouldn't be put to better advantage on straight entertainment.

KTLA HAS HAD TO CONVERT A BRACE of bungalow-apartments to shelter the forty-seven girls sorting



and filing the "Marco" cards. Payroll. for this alone runs close to \$2500 weekly.

LUCILLE ELINGS, AN ATTRACTIVE GIRL with thespian proclivities, has done an excellent job organizing the girls who organize the cards. Most of her aides are college gals who enjoy personal responsibility.

THEY SHOWED ME EIGHT BOXES WITH NOTHING but Smith cards; seven with Johnson; five with Brown; three and a half with Jones, There are also lots of Walkers, Mor-risons, Millers, Kelleys also a Wil-liam Shakespeare. (They think this might be a gag.)

I DON'T GET ONE THING-why entrants have been allowed to send in three cards apiece and also why they have been allowed to send in fresh batches of cards whenever the whim-sy moves. Mercy! What a mess of detail! "Seventy-five is unlucky for me," wrote one lady who wanted to try her luck with a new set of cards. Another woman grew so excited over prospects of winning that she spilled lemonade on her card and smeared it so badly that she had to submit a so badly that she had to submit a new set. I even saw cards completely unreadable ..., some with no names ... some with no numbers! I thought "goof box" was a good name for the carton into which these duds were flipped. Lucille let me test her filing sustem by clocking her while she lo system by clocking her while she lo-cated my "Marco" ducat. She was slightly nervous, but managed to pro-duce it in thirty-five seconds.

WON'T IT SEEM FUNNY, BUT NICE, to have "Kukla" on ABC-TV? Contrary to reports, "Medic" won't invariably be serious. Jim Moser has even written a comedy farce for one of the shows . . . Maybe the reason TV set sales here thudded to a scant 15,000 last month was the public's anticipation of color ???

THINGS I'VE ENJOYED RECENTLY include the Bowl rebroadcasts on NBC radio Sunday evenings. Eddie Fisher and Tony Martin were standouts ... "Gildy" writer John Elliotte wrote me a friendly note regarding my critical comment on the TV pilot film: "Per-haps you'll be interested to know that the great majority of the criti-cisms coincided almost exactly with your own." He and co-writer Andy White are striving to correct the devia. White are striving to correct the deviations.

## HOLLAND'S TUNNEL

From the mail bag came a couple of interesting letters. One was from Mrs. Stanley Adams of NAFBRAT in answer to my criticism of the organization's stand on such children's shows as westerns. In that column it was asked if anyone ever heard of a child's being harmed from watching one of the better westerns. Mrs. Adams enclosed a newspaper clipping about a girl who accidentally hung herself supposedly trying to copy a hanging scene she'd seen on TV. Our answer to this is, considering the number of children watching westerns, this one instance, tragic as it is, does not mean that such shows are harmful to the many, many youngsters who are western fans. It should also be noted that the coroner's jury ruled "she may have been imitating a scene she saw on television." It does not say it was proved TV was the cause of the accident.

True, that's a small point. And true that there are many programs on TV that are bad for a child, but we still say that NAFBRAT's line-up of objectionable shows leaves little that is allegedly good for any youngster to watch. Mrs. Adams then goes on to say: "We are preparing a compilation Mrs. Adams then goes on to of opinions and comments of psychiatrists and child psychologists about the current programs aimed at young audiences." This is perhaps a good audiences." This is perhaps a good move, but wouldn't it be a good idea to combine this study with a similar study of the reactions of children and their parents to the shows being watched? It's amazing how lucid and intelligent youngsters can be when it comes to discussing TV. Then **NAFBRAT** would really get to the core of the matter. And certainly the vast majority of parents could add some interesting facts to the study. Re-search in the home—not just from psychiatrists—is the more direct route.

One final point—what's wrong with children's developing hero worship for such fine citizens as Bill Williams, Jack Mahoney, Duncan Renaldo, Roy Rogers? Hmmmm?

Radio producers and executives might pay heed to a letter from J. R. Johnston who writes, in part: "The way the radio stations are treating us (Mr. Johnston is referring to older people who have listened to the radio for years and can't afford a TV set) "is just outrageous, bordering on contempt. They don't care if we have something to listen to or not and give us nothing but the same old records of recorded band music ... on Saturday nights (the day most important to us), there is not a single show or any other real program on the radio except music, music, and again music. CBS has even moved their two measly shows that were before on Saturday nights to Monday because they don't want to bother about a replacement for Lux Radio Theatre. Why shouldn't they spend some money on old faithful listeners? Even in wintertime there are no shows after nine o'clock p.m. and that is the time when most people relax and would be most thankful for a little amusement. . . We have three radios at home but if nothing is done for us and pretty soon we will sell every one of them and somehow buy a small TV set." Seems Mr. Johnston has several points in his favor. We have long contended that, for the most part, radio is not making enough of an effort to come out with top productions. Isn't it about time for some action?

If the opening night audience had had its way at the Cocoanut Grove, Harry Belafonte would still be singing. This man, who has been seen on such TV shows as "Toast of the Town." is one of the most sensational entertainers we've ever seen. He has a personality that knocks you for a loop, a style of delivery that is senloop, a style of delivery that is sensational, and a voice that sends you out of this world—literally. The Grove can look forward to packed houses. This is really an acti

Do wish that those in charge of Mutual's "Could This Be You?." a fine documentary program dealing with traffic violators, would somehow do so mething about the mumbojumbo that characterizes the remarks of most of the violators. It is almost impossible at times to hear or understand what these people are saying. The show is aiming for life-like realism, we know, and the interviews are recorded on the spot, but the listeners would like to be able to understand what is being said.

Odds and Ends: Johnny Carson's last-minute substitution for Red Skelton, who suffered a brain concussion in an accident during rehearsal, proved again how very talented this Carson kid is. Why, then, is it so difficult to find the right kind of show for him?

Elizabeth Patterson will play her original role in Lux Video Theatre's "Welcome Stranger" this Thursday. She is the only one from the cast of the picture to repeat the same part. . . Robert Cummings' new show has been sold. This is not surprising, considering the terrific raves the pilot has been getting. Looks like Bob has a hit. . . Jack Webb's movie, "Dragnet," is a solid sock in most instances. Only a rather unsatisfactory ending is a let-down.

Even though it will be placed opposite "Lucy." the new NBC-TV show. "Medic" is sure to gather unto itself a lot of fans. It is a brilliant offering—an adult program and a credit to TV. It proves how much television can do when it wants to put on long ponts. Don't miss it! . . TV producers and casting directors should see some good talent Monday and Tuesday nights at the Academy Playhouse on N. New Hampshire when Actors Unlimited presents another program. Dates are August 30 and 31. Go and see this show.

This person is Welk's approach to his listening (but unseeing) audience; we refer to Ralph Portner, the radio announcer who certainly deserves some recognition for a job well done.

We're hoping the above will be deemed worthy of appearing in the "Ear, Eye Inspire the Pen" column. We have been weekly regulars at the Aragon for three years and have met many others who feel Ralph Portner is past due for some justified credit. He is doing a splendid job, practically incomparable—out where the waves of the "blue Pacific" rest their white caps on the beaches of Ocean Park.

Mr. Portner now refers to the waves of the "blue-green Pucific." He tooked at the orean recently and it appeared more green than blue to him, so he combined the two.

"Now, I like TV but there's no kidding about it being quite a strain," Preston went on. "And living on the lot in a trailer as Sheila and I do doesn't give us much of a chance to 'get away from it all.' Both phones are going all day long, with Sheila on the long end of the calls taking care of my business, so she is actually a secretary. She has all the makings of a TV widow.

#### Married Life

"As if I didn't load her with enough work she also has me and my mood to combat. I have times when I'm pretty tired and irritable, but Sheila patiently dons the cloak of the understanding wife. She gets up every morning and fixes my breakfast. I come home for lunch since our trailer is right next door to the sound stage, and at the end of the day I am so tired I don't exactly bounce in the front door with the effervescence of a teen-ager.

"I have repeatedly told Sheila that she doesn't have to get my breakfast, but her only comment has been, 'If you can get up to go to work, I don't see why I can't get up and fix your breakfast.' All in all, Sheila is a slightly sensational wife. She never complains about anything—and there are occasions when she could do plenty of complaining.

Preston Foster, also known as "Waterfront's" "Gap'n John," takes a look at himself as he is away from the TV sound stages—and decides his wife is a patient woman.

"In addition to my work in 'Waterfront.' I also have other interests that are time-consuming. For instance, Sheila and I make several personal appearances with our act. This act consists of songs and patter and it has been catching on quite well. It all began six years ago when a friend suggested that I switch from the ukulele, which I was playing, to the guitar. Sheila got me a guitar for Christmas, we started working up an act together with some emphasis on folk music, and then after we found we didn't bore our friends with our entertainment we took it into theat.

"Often I'll get a sudden change of schedule for our act and will forget to inform Sheila. Then, at the last minute, I'll tell her we have to do a show. With about fifteen minutes to get everything ready, I can understand her occasional comment, 'Can't you some time give me more than fifteen minutes notice?'

"Lately, Stephanie, my sixteenyear-old daughter from a former marriage, has been joining us in the act. She is very serious about her career and has an excellent singing voice. This last summer she spent in summer school to get further ahead on her credits so she could spend more time on her career. I am convinced she has what it takes and am doing all I can to help her. I've felt this way ever since the first time she went on stage with us. She played before 2700 people and had all the showmanship of a veteran.

"She is so excited about her career she doesn't even think about dates. Once, when we were all up north. Lois Moran, who plays my very lovely wife in 'Waterfront,' arranged a party. Her son. Tim, had a date all picked out for Stephanie. but Stephanie simply said to me, 'Don't you think it would do my career more good to work with you and Sheila on the act instead of going out on a date?' I'm not worried, though, because I figure that romance will come into her life in due time all right."

At Hal Roach's where "Waterfront" is filmed under the able supervision of producer M. Bernard Fox for Roland Reed, Preston usually finishes PRESTON FOSTER AND HIS WIFE, SHEILA, live in a trailer on the Hal Roach Studio lot when he's making "Waterfront." work around six or six-thirty. He goes into his trailer and then friends drop in for a chat. He and Sheila are usually through dinner by eightthirty and they watch TV until about nine-thirty at which time Preston hits the sack to study his script.

"As a rule. Sheila is tired by then too." Preston commented, "but sometimes she puts on the ear-phone attachment and watches TV without any sound bothering me.

#### Ranch Life

"When we have time off we like to go to our ranch in Bouquet Canyon. We have about 400 acres and the only other inhabitants are the cattle and a few horses. It's really quiet there and we get away from it all. I used to do a great deal of work on the ranch but I'm too tired now to do anything but occasional road-scraping and lawn work.

"The ranch is our haven, but lately I've been getting the bug to own a boat again. This is probably due to the 'Waterfront' influence. At one time or another, I've had speed boats and cruisers. I do all of my own piloting for the 'Waterfront' shows something most people can't believe. They ought to come down to San Pedro some time and see for themselves." Preston is the casual-type of guy. His wardrobe is typical of his informality. He's become so used to wearing his garb as "Cap'n John" that he hardly ever buys any new clothes except for sport coat and slacks once in the proverbial blue moon.

"What's the use of getting clothes?" Preston smiled. "When I'm working. I wear the same thing, when I go to the ranch I'm in dungarees, and since Sheila and I have little chance to go out. where would I wear anything 'dressy?'"

#### **Business Venture**

At the moment, Preston is combining his TV activities with a new business venture—a brake-lining business. The product is called "Lock-On" and is said to revolutionize brake linings.

"It was invented by Ted Bonkowski, a friend of mine who was one of the top oboe players in the country," Preston remarked. "I met Ted through his brother, Lou, who was my arranger for the act. I introduced them to Don Scott, who was formerly head of the hydraulic engineering department for Bendix Brakes. I'm very active in this business. I'm even on the board of directors—as public relations head." The last was added with a laugh.

Such is the private life of Preston Foster—the man who is just idling around looking for something to keep him busy.

# HE MAKES PEOPLE DO THE Darndest Things

> HE FACT THAT most normal human beings get a kick out of eavesdropping whether they are prone to

admit it or not, accounts for much of the success for television's most unpredictable program—"Candid Camera."

KHJ-TV's "Candid Camera," is a completely unrehearsed program of secretly-filmed scenes from real life. Allen Funt, the man who has become known as "America's Most Famous Eavesdropper," maneuvers unsuspecting people into all kinds of real life situations. What the people do and say is filmed by hidden cameras, and the edited scenes become part of the unpredictable half hour which makes up the show.

Funt, who developed his candid recording technique for radio some seven years ago, and later adapted it with even greater success to television, believes that people caught in the act of being themselves are better performers than the best actors in the world.

#### **Typical Gags**

Typical situations in the "Candid Camera" series found Funt, posing as a tax collector, taking a taxpayer's money and then handing the funds over to an "assistant" with instructions to go and bet it on the races. The spontaneous reaction of everyday people to situations like this, and hundreds of others, make up the h u m an comedies seen on each telecast. Of the "classics" which have spread Funt's fame by word of mouth from one TV viewer to another, these are typical:

One telecast found Funt getting himself arrested in a small town. When questioned by the local policeman he calmly explained that he was a bomb salesman. Funt then talked himself out of a trip to the jug, after the arrival of highway police, by pointing out that he meant that he was an aerosol bomb salesman.

#### **Got Laughs**

Millions of viewers rocked with laughter at the reactions of a locksmith called in by Funt to remove the shackle which fastened his secretary to her desk. Funt explained apologetically that he'd lost the key and—less apologetically—that the secretary had been spending entirely too much time away from her desk.

Allen Funt has taken on a thousand part-time jobs to set the scene for these various escapades. He can make believe that he's a bootblack one day or a dentist the next. He's posed as a genius. dolt, or even a madman—and gotten away with it. Still and all, Funt has never been an actor. "I look like Joe Blow," he says, "and I don't have to strain to sound like him, either."

When the forty-year-old star of the secretly filmed "Candid Camera" series was discharged from the Army, he developed an idea he used with great success at Army camps. He had set up a "gripe booth" at Camp Gruber, where soldiers could unburden their gripes into a microphone when no one was around. Their voices were transcribed by a wire recorder and later played back at a camp show. The results were so funny Funt decided to improve on the technique. The result was the famous, "Candid Microphone" radio program and "Candid Camera," when the idea was adapted for television.

#### How Filmed

The mechanics by which Funt catches the uninhibited "performances" of people off-guard are not complicated, according to him. He simply hides microphones in devices as common as a Kleenex tissue box or a hearing aid, and the camera is often hidden behind a special mirror. The correct spotting of both camera and microphone are, however, works of art. Funt and his staff have often worked all night to install their equipment in a vantage point and then have spent the entire next day waiting for subjects to come into their "set." Many times a set-up in a place of business may have to be changed several times before Funt can come up with high-quality shots and recordings of his subjects.

On-the-street shots may find Funt's cameramen working from a peephole in a parked moving van or the specially constructed back area of his station wagon, while engineers have "planted" microphones and speakers in such anomalous spots as mail boxes, soft drink machines, trash cans and even bird cages. The result: a passerby suddenly finds that a "little man in a mail box" is talking to him and hears every word he says and another "Candid Camera" scene from real life is underway. BILL BRENNAN, PRODUCER OF "COMMON," and pretty Fran Bennett, Ralph's attractive aide on the show, encourage the tradio-ite to sign his first TV contract. HEN KNX's personable disc jockey, Ralph Story, made his TV bow last July he went from the frying pan into the fire. Early morning radio listeners were accustomed to Ralph's pleasant, cheery, confident voice but seeing the debonaire performer on TV was an added treat.

After "What Do You Have In Common?" made its debut Ralph was inwardly suffering the tortures that plague emcees. When asked "How do you like the transition from radic to TV?," Ralph candidly remarked that after the second show he thought the program was going down in flames and he with it. Everything that could possibly go wrong did.

#### Boners

"One contestant goofed and couldn't recall the incident she had in common with her two fellow panelists even though I told her what it was," he winced.

"Then there was the miscue. I was getting ready to introduce the next September 3, 1954 tipster, a model, and the director started to wave frantically from the sidelines and in stage whispers shouted it was time for an announcement. I never did get back to the model on that particular show. And she was so pretty too.

"On the same show the jackpot question was switched without notifying me and when the question was asked I sneaked out of camera range to find out the correct answer. The director scribbled the answer on a piece of paper. But I couldn't read it because I wasn't wearing my glasses. Finally, after close scrutiny, holding the paper a half inch from my nose, I learned the answer at the very same moment the panel guessed it. I stepped in front of the camera just in time to say 'Ah, yes! you have answered the \$1000 jackpot question correctly.' Radio was never like this." Ralph lamented. "If I didn't have so much pride I would have cried right there."

Those who saw the show never surmised that these "little" things were happening to upset Ralph so. He appeared unruffled throughout the telecast. His frustrated, nervous, punchy feeling after that show was a rugged conditioner.

#### Security

The security problem on this show is quite a headache. The show is not framed. There is no set-up among the contestants. The various participants, having something in common, do not see each other until they are on stage. Before air time the groups are scrambled up in different dressing rooms and figuratively kept under lock and key. By mixing up the groups the producer throws them off. Invariably they think they are going to appear on camera with the contestants sharing the same dressing room. But nothing could be further from the truth. And all the yaking that goes on in these dressing rooms between unrelated contestants trying to find out what they have in common is for naught.
