Is "Stories of the Century"

ESTERNS ON television came of age with KTTV's "Stories of the Century." This is the first time a series, made especially for television. brings to the video screen the dramatic pageantry of cattle rustlers. Indian massacres. border raids and the panoramic splendor of the rolling hills and plains of the great West.

Except for the classic Western motion pictures shown on the home screen, TV's oaters, generally are made with a handful of characters, who repeatedly tread the same worn sets and are backed by familiar old stock footage of outdoor scenes. "Stories of the Century" was the first series to dispense with low budget production and thus escaped the hazards of making a Western on a shoestring.

Production

"Stories" is produced by Studio City TV Productions. utilizing the facilities of Republic Studios. Through the affiliation with Republic, they have been able to use the creative producers, directors. writers and other talented craftsmen in the motion picture field. Morton Scott, president of Studio City Television states: "The primary factor behind our entrance into high budget television production, evidenced by our 'Stories of the Century' series. is obviously the highgeared production facilities available at Republic Studios, together with a pool of top manpower developed over a period of three decades.

"We have the advantages of the departmental efficiency built up over a period of years by Republic. A smooth operation from our story department to casting and on into the technical phases of production enables Studio City Television to produce high quality TV subjects. We are proud to be the first to capitalize on our natural resources in the interests of an improved television product."

Although budget figures were not available, "Stories" is believed to be the largest budgeted TV show of its kind yet produced by the films-forvideo industry. "Stories" uses hundreds of extras, extensive locations, and numerous sets.

The scripts are based on official newspaper files and records and the individual programs present accurate stories of historic personalities at the colorful turn of the century. Jim Davis stars as "Matt Clark," railroad detective, and Mary Castle portrays "Frankie Adams." his undercover agent. Miss Castle and Davis with a varying supporting cast of top talent enact such stories as "Belle Starr," "The Dalton Gang," "Frank a<mark>nd</mark> Jesse James," "Geronimo," and "Joaquin Murietta."

Response

like our own Sheriff Biscailuz who is shown here

chatting with Mary and Jim at a special party launching the "Stories of the Century" series. A press junket aboard the Santa Fe's "KTTV Special" was a most appropriate

way to herald a new western series.

The response to "Stories of the Century" has been very encouraging. From a selling factor, its sponsor, Sears Roebuck, couldn't be happier. Whenever Sears advertises a commodity on "Stories," it's assured of a complete sell-out.

The station, too, is pleased with "Stories of the Century's" growing popularity. The reaction to this program has been so favorable that KTTV is revamping its Sunday night programming in September to fall in line with this outstanding telefilm series.

Time alone will tell whether or not "Stories of the Century" achieves real video importance. They seem to be starting out in that direction.

Something New

In Westerns?

This Show-A Matter of Life and Death!

IM MOSER got sick the first time he watched a doctor operate. After the surgery was over, an understanding young medico drew him aside and explained the doctor's approach to surgery.

"I learned detachment," Jim stated. "I learned to take the personal side out of surgery... to view the human body like a piece of machinery being repaired." He has never again become ill.

This lesson was one of the first Jim learned during the nine months he actually lived at a local hospital to gain authenticity for the new NBC-TV "Medic" series which he created and writes.

"In the hospital they called me 'Dr. Moser,'" Jim related. "My 'specialty' was ENT—ear, nose, and throat. Once I was standing by in surgery. A woman doctor turned to me to ask my opinion about what was being done. I just didn't answer her. I didn't know what to say. But usually when I got in a jam like this, someone who knew why I was 'interning' always came to the rescue and said I was 'a medical student.' It would have been too involved to go into a full explanation." Jim was a full-time hospital resident during those nine months, going home to his family for week-ends only. His being a stickler for authenticity is more understandable when one realizes that Moser wrote 169 of the original Jack Webb "Dragnets."

"Medic" is more exciting than "Dragnet," Jim claims. After working on "Medic" since 1949, he had a difficult time persuading TV executives that he had a great show. Jim's pilot script, written after his arduous grind at the hospital and countless gruelling hours poring over medical tomes and journals, received indifferent reception from network program directors. "A very hice show but ..." and "A nice stride ahead for TV but let somebody else ..." were words which some TV "know-its" are no doubt already eating. The script bounced around for four months until Worthington Miner, NBC-TV producer, saw it and acted swiftly.

It took nine months to receive the go-ahead signal from the Los Angeles Medical Association. "I'm a stubborn man!" Moser said after it was all over, "but I got pretty impatient waiting for the okay.

"I don't think the public knows their doctors," he explained. "In this series we want to put the doctor in

a good light and teach the public something about medicine while also teaching the doctor something about his patients.

"There are good doctors and some not so good. Sometime we may even televise the story of a bad doctor, just the way we did the story of The Bad Cop on 'Dragnet.'

No Dearth of Material

"Possibilities for scripts are endless. You can take medicine and do anything with it. In fact I wrote a farcical comedy for one program, but right now it's on ice. To those who are afraid 'Medic' will be grim, I can say there are as many up-beat stories as there are sad ones. My one problem in writing the show is to fight sensationalism. I never will tell a story without making a point. Every story WILL make a point . . . will combine entertainment with information."

Moser's first show of the series, the powerful story, "White Is the Color," was shot at General Hospital. It made its point about leukemia. Other "Medics" though perhaps not as shocking as this film, will be every bit as authentic. A minimum of actors is used. In the first show there were only four actors—the doctor, young mother, husband, and one nurse. Remainder of the "cast" were legitinate surgeons and nurses performing duties at General Hospital. The TV film camera was only five or six feet from the table in surgery. During extremely technical shots, the rubber-gloved hands of the real docto were used instead of those belonging to actor-"doctor" Richard Boone.

For the second show, "Laughter Is A Boy," the story of a little lad with cleft palate, Moser tried desperately to find a child with this impairment for the lead, but those he screened were too introverted. He taped yards of talk by cleft-palated children so that little actor Jeff York, who finally played the part, would sound true-to-life.

Another "Medic" program is called "My Very Good Friend, Albert." It's the story of a Swedish immigrant who makes his living playing cello. He loses his hearing.

To discover how sounds come to a man wearing a hearing aid, Moser put one on for half a day. His script on polio was one of his toughest he spent three weeks in research, one week writing and several hours in an iron lung to learn how this felt.

Numberless hours in research are accepted by Jim as part of his job. "A good doctor does a tremendous amount of reading," he pointed out. "Dozens and dozens of journals."

Other topics studied and scripted include a heart operation filmed in San Francisco and titled. "I Climb the Stairs"; "With This Ring," story of an un-wed mother; "Death Rides A Wagon," about a cholera plague; "Day 10." story of bubonic plague; and the assassination of Lincoln. From time to time historical themes like the last-named will be screened. Carl Sandburg read and approved the Lincoln script before it was filmed.

Approval

All scripts are submitted to Los Angeles Medical Association for an okay. There are no general restrictions on Jim's writing—main purpose is to have the Association approve the manner in which doctors are portrayed. One doctor, who must remain nameless in accordance, with the medical code, serves as technical adviser on all "Medic" shows.

In the tremendous effort of placing "Medic" on TV and feeding scripts to his brainchild, Jim Moser has had a liberal education in medicine. He has learned about ailments he never knew existed. In fact, after a few short weeks of "internship," Jim began to have a suspicion that he was about to succumb to every new illness about which he learned. That's all over now. His sole consuming thought is to make "Medic" the finest documentary drama on TV.

Apparently his friends are convinced Jim knows what he's writing about. They come to him with their aches and pains, ask him for diagnosis and prescription. After four years, Jim has watched so many surgery cases that he feels like a surgeon.

Modestly he admits, "If I had to, and if there were no complications. I believe that I could perform a successful appendectomy."

"I have always tried on my show to do things that would be of real help to the ordinary homemaker," Norma said. "I think the average woman thinks that to be really glamorous or to be a really good cook takes a lot of time, and this is where I have an answer. It doesn't take time if you know the little tricks.

"I do believe that almost every woman gears her activities with one purpose in mind-to please her hus-band or her favorite boy friend. If she wants to look better it's usually to make the 'apple of her eye' look more searchingly in her direction. If she wants to cook well it's because every red-blooded man is sensitive to good food. While the old adage of 'the way to a man's heart is through his stomach' isn't entirely accurate. there's enough truth in it to make it worth heeding.

"Actually. what I suppose I've really tried to do on my show is to make women remember the importance of being feminine. "Shower of Stars"

Thursday, 8:30 p.m. KNXT, Channel 2

"Shower of Stars." CBS-TV's first color extravaganza from the West Coast, was a glittering musical fan-tasy. The thin story line in the pre-miere show satirized movietown's making of biographical pictures.

Fred Clark appeared as a confused movie producer and Marvin Kaplan as the frustrated writer who suffered at every whim of the indecisive pro-ducer. This story line, "corny" as it was, gave the program some sem-blance of continuity. "Fade ins" were made from the producer's office to the potential "movie sequences" starring Betty Grable, Harry James and Mario Lanza. Everything from opera to boogie was covered by the trio of stars, who were making their TV debut.

Glamorous Betty Grable and tinted TV go together. She sang and danced her way right into video stardom, proving that she wasn't number one box office for so long without reason. Grable's gams were generously displayed throughout most of her numbers. These ranged from the sexy "Baby Won't You Please Come Home" to the somewhat conventional "I'm Just Wild About Harry.'

Her Harry played his trumpet sweet and hot and did much to add to the musical enjoyment of "Shower." Har-ry's numbers included "Let It Ride" and "I'm Just Wild About Harry.

Mario Lanza was welcomed back to the spotlight with tremendous applause from the studio audience. His songs were pre-recorded and he simply mouthed the words. There were times when the synchronization was off, but it didn't seem to have any effect on the audience's enthusiasm for Lanza. Of his three selections— "Vesti la Giubba," "Marechiare" and "Be My Love"-the latter got the best reception.

William Lundigan was an affable host, delivering low-pressured com-mercials on Chrysler's forward look. which stressed modern design. Gor. don Jenkins' musical backstopping was fine. Producer Nat Perrin and director Seymour Burns did a creditable all-around job. Robert Sidney's choreo-graphy was eye-catching.

Those who viewed the show on color sets had a definite advantage over black and white viewers. The conventional screens looked drab when compared to the tinted sets. However, color merely enhanced the program, it did not make the talent perform any better.

Rusty even gets his allowance.

ABC's "Make Room For Daddy" is one of the best family-comedy series on the air. Rarely do they go overboard and exaggerate a situation until it reaches incredible proportions. "Daddy" proves that a show can be both discriminating and humorous at the same time. Sheldon Leonard's direction is tops. As far as Danny Thomas and the rest of the cast are concerned, well, we ran out of superlatives a long time ago. M.R.

"Lady In The Dark"

Max Liebman scored roundly with his second NBC color Spectacular. Televising a proven hit like "Lady In The Dark" did much to strengthen the argument in favor of using video adaptations of the tried and true.

The Gertrude Lawrence starrer of a decade or so ago came to life in a blaze of color. Those who saw the show on color sets were thrilled by the vivid color and life-like quality of the telecast. It was the closest thing to actually watching this musical-extravaganza in a theater.

"Lady" is a musical play concerning a woman who subconsciously rejects femininity because as a child she was labeled "plain." To compensate for her feeling of insecurity she busily "turns out magazines instead of babies." She consults a psychiatrist about her wild dreams, in which sheis always symbolized as a captivating enchantress.

The outstanding act of the play was the circus dream sequence. The staging, color and music made it the hit of the show.

Ann Sothern was a glamorous, beautiful dancing doll. Her voice was pleasant and she was certainly an excellent choice for "Liza Elliott." The cast —James Daly, Carleton Carpenter, Robert Fortier, Paul McGrath, Sheppard Strudwick and Luella Gear—were all perfect, Carpenter's interpretation of the slightly mad photographer was very amusing. He measured up well

against Danny Kaye who originated the role in the Broadway show.

The Moss Hart book has a timeless quality. Music by Ira Gershwin and Kurt Weill was as tuneful as ever, especially "The Saga of Jenny" and "My Ship." Billy Freidberg and Max Leibman captured the full essence of the play in their TV adaptation. Costumes were lavish and Paul duPont can take a deep bow for his wonderful creations. Rod Alexander and Bambi Linn were, as always, dancers extraordinaire.

"Lady" was a top-notch production from every angle; even the commercials were palatable. M.R.

Richman belongs to the Cantor and Jolson era. Granted, he was the kingpin of Broadway, and there are a lot of folks who have tender thoughts of Richman and the era he represents, but it takes more than a show saturated with memories and nostalgia to compete with current video fare.

To disrespect great showmen who live in the past would be foolhardy. Tradition is part of the theater. But a TV program cannot be built on sentimental tradition alone.

The packagers had better come up with a worthwhile format or viewers are apt to look-and-see Harry Richman just once for old-time sake. M.R.

Dave Comes To Town

Dave Garroway, the genial emcee of NBC-TV's "Today," which greets the hardy souls who watch TV from eight to nine a.m., paid his first visit to Hollywood last week and succeeded in impressing everyone who met him.

For a while he wasn't sure he was going to make the town. His plane developed trouble and was forced down in Arizong. The flight time from New York was sixteen and a half hours, which gives you a rough idea of the difficulties encountered.

While in Hollywood, he did a stint on Johnny Grant's early a.m. show and also a spot at Grauman's Chinese **Theatre** for his "**Today**" program. The Chinese sequence was a neat production job, a solid effort from every standpoint.

Dave was showing signs of fatigue since he had not slept for over thirty-one hours. But he's used to getting little or no sleep. He gets up at four a.m. in **New York**, arrives at the studio at five for a rehearsal, and then begins his three hour show at seven. With Dave at the helm "Today" has been a marked success, drawing in \$11,000,000 in revenue for **NBC** last year. This is the largest income ever grossed for one show in the entire realm and history of show business.

"When I was first approached about doing this program," Dave commented, "I said that nobody would be watching it but those who had gotten home late the night before and were too tired to turn off the set, but I guess I was wrong. More people seem to get up early these days."

This is Dave's sixth year in TV. The quiet, unassuming, modest guy is a credit to the medium. It's good to see success come to people like him. J.H.

THE DAY AFTER PREMIERE of "Shower of Stars," there was a large-size furor in Hollywood and a top brass conference at Television City over the accusation that Mario Lanza was merely mouthing words to his own records when he sang on Chrysler's telecast with Betty Grable and Harry James.

FAKING FOR PICTURES AND NOW fact Donald O'Connor played it smart all last season, I believe, by pre-recording his Colgate songs. After all, a performer can't be hustling around all over the stage and do a top-notch vocal job simultaneously. So the crux of the Lanza controversy seemed to be the use of records, and the real nubbin of the deal, so the ole grapevine had it, was how old were these records? Were they special recordings made a couple of days before the telecast or were they regular commercial discs, waxed a couple of years or so ago, when, perhaps, the singer (who has been dieting recently for his video debut) might have been in better voice?

LATE FRIDAY AFTERNOON, following huddles, CBS-TV issued a statement from network president J. L. Von Valkenburg. Here's the gist of it: "When CBS-Television engaged Mario Lanza to appear on the 'Shower of Stars' both he and we were in agreement that his performance would be by means of pre-recordings, a practice common to the entertainment industry for productions of the size and scope of this one. Actually, the prerecording session for Mr. Lanza was set up for Monday, September 27th. Just prior to this Mr. Lanza told us that his physician had advised him it would be impossible for him to undertake this taping session and to participate in the production to the extent we had originally planned. In view of this, we eliminated a complicated finale to the show in which he participated. We also eliminated a comedy sketch which featured Mr. Lanza. We also decided that, due to Mr. Lanza's physical condition, we would have to use already existing records instead of newly pre-recorded ones."

SO MUCH FUSS WOULD PROBABLY not have been kicked up over the whole thing were it not for the fact that Chrysler and CBS flew in eightyfive TV editors from over the country for the premiere show and resulting publicity is what you might call transcontinental.

Well, anyway, Lanza did show up for the telecast!

LARGE TURNOUT OF THESE EDI-TORS enjoyed a luncheon date with Dingh Shore the day after the "Shower of Stars" premiere and subsequent Crystal Room gala doings. The scribes were really living it up in Hollywood, but what puzzled some of them was that they weren't asked to join the studio audience to witness the show. This was what they had expected, with, of course, a chance also to view the action on monitor sets. Instead, they sat on risers in a nearby studio

FAKING FOR PICTURES AND NOW FOR television isn't anything new. In

and looked at the show. "Just as if we were back home," one of the puzzled columnists said.

ELSEWHERE IN THIS ISSUE I believe there is a comment on the Grable-James-Lanza efforts, so my final remarks will be (1) Color on the Liebman specials and on the "Shower of Stars" was certainly handled differently, "Shower" going in for bright splashes—and maybe this is exactly what fans expect of their color programs! (2) Where does Betty Grable's hot hoofing put Sheree North, who was really mentioned after she did some fancy gyrating on Bing Crosby's telecast last spring?

ONE OF THE MOST POPULAR GEN-TLEMEN at the pre-show party thrown at Television City was Dr. Frank Baxter, who, with his accustomed wit, tagged the "Shower of Stars" "a drizzle of meteors."

GEORGE MONTGOMERY PUT IN AN appearance at Dinah's luncheon and I felt so pleased when he took his table place next to me. George's furniture-making business is going full blast—he now employs seven—and he told me he is making all the pieces for the Fred MacMurray's new home as well as his own and Dinah's house under construction.

THERE WAS QUITE A CONTINGENT of television and radio stardom at Helen Hayes' "What Every Woman Knows" christening at the Huntington Hartford. I saw the Jack Baileys, Ozzie Nelsons, Don DeFores, Ralph Edwards, Liberace with Joanne Rio, and a dozen more. Barbara Edwards sadly told me they had almost not attended the premiere, due to the serious post-operative condition of Ralph's longtime production head, Al Paschall. He's still in critical condition in Santa Monica Hospital. Incidentally, the decor of the new theater is beautiful. You'd scarcely recognize the ancient Lux Radio (not television, as some misinformed claimed) Theatre.

Signe Hasso, as the actor's sympathe-Signe Hosso, as the actor's sympathe-tic ex-wife, and Edmond O'Brien, as his press agent, also perform credit-ably, while Shelley Winters, in her first big role, does a believable job Inst big role, does a believable job as the waitress who is picked up by the actor and falls victim to his Shakespearean delusion. I think the most memorable scene in the film is the one in which Colman explains his struggles, his climb, his life as an actor I t is a fine speech in a fine actor. It is a fine speech in a fine screenplay, which was written by Ruth Gordon and Garson Kanin, and well directed by George Cukor.

TV-RADIO LIFE

HOLLAND'S TUNNE

DUG BY JACK HOLLAND

There's been a lot of talk over KNBH way about Jack Latham who takes over the news slot. In fact, this personable fellow does twenty-eight news-casts a week, sixteen on TV and twelve on radio. His preference, incidentally, is TV since he feels that news on radio, production-wise, is inclined to be dull.

"My one aim is to cover the town more by film," Jack explained recent-ly. "In fact, I won't be surprised if in the not so distant future ninety-nine percent of TV news will feature film clips with the one percent devoted to the newscaster. At the present we have three and a half cameramen out covering the field for news. The half is my rather facetious term for an assistant, who is actually a very capable and expert photographer in his own right.

"Much of our spot film coverage comes from free-lance photographers. For example, when that cement truck was hit by a train recently, all of our cameramen were out on assignment. We finally managed to contact one We linally managed to contact one and told him to get to the accident as soon as he could. About ten minutes later one of the free-lance photog-raphers called and said he had about two hundred feet of film on the wreck —and did want it? We did.

"We have gone to great lengths to get coverage of special news events. When the French soldiers, brought here from Indo-Ching and Dien-Bien-Phu, arrived at Mather Field, our crew chartered a plane to go up to Mather to photograph the arrival. I had heard there was one nurse aboard, who was tending to the litter cases, who spoke English, so as the soldiers were being taken from the plane I kept an eye out for her. I finally saw a nurse, a very attractive girl, who was speaking to each soldier as he was taken off the plane. I couldn't help noticing how their eyes lit up and how broad was their smile when she spoke to them. I went over to her and said, 'I understand you speak English. KTTV has another good entry in "This Is Your Music." starring Byron Palmer and Joan Weldon. This is devoted to one thing-music, and yet there is very real originality in the production. The numbers are staged attractively, the numbers are staged attractively, the settings are highly imaginative and the singing of the stars couldn't be better. If you want to relax and just listen to the music of America, "This Is Your Music" is your dish.

Back to Hollywood. This Larry Fin-ley is quite a guy! Here's a fellow who is so busy he almost has to make an appointment with himself for a sandwich. He takes three hours out of his busy day, beginning a half an hour after his radio show is over, to audition countless hopefuls. "Memories," as a musical term, has been much abused—but it would be hard to find a better title to describe Columbia's new album by Morton Gould and his Orchestra. In nostalgic mood, this outstanding composer-conductor has selected a wonderful dozen of songs, rich in memories, each a hit in its day, and each one of which, in Mr. Gould's adroit and effective arrangements, still has an extraordinary amount of vitality, no matter how long ago the original was written. The incomparable 220-pound Ameche has stormed over opponents for three seasons to the tune of 2,599 yards.

Wisconsin and Rice have only met once before on the gridiron, in 1952 when the Badgers won 21.7.

The Rice Owls, co-champions of the Southwest Conference and Cotton Bowl victors over Alabama, are figured to be a stronger title contender this year on good team speed, an explosive backfield featuring All-American candidate Dick Moegle, an improved pass-ing game and a seasoned pass defense.

The main concern of coach Jess Neely is finding suitable replacements for the entire first string line of '53 that graduated. Of the 13 returning lettermen, only six are linemen. This gives you an idea of the backfield strength with seven veterans for four positions.

He was in the east on business and had already bought tickets for the Sunday game. Del Webb, co-owner of the Yankees. rode down town from the Washington airport with me ... all smiles ... not because of the American League finish, but due to the fact the Yanks made more money this season as a second place club than in 1953 as the pennant winner.

There were no smiles evident, however, around the DuPont Plaza Hotel, where the Rams were guartered in Washington, Several key men were injured, and could see only limited action in Sunday's game. Coach Hamp Pool and his staff were a gloomy bunch as they sat in the lobby consoling each other over the fates that had beset the Rams after such a tremendous start during the exhibition grind.

On our way downtown to test one of the famous Washington lobsters. Pool confided to Bob Kelley and me that he was genuinely concerned over the game coming up, and frankly didn't feel the Rams figured to be such heavy favorites.

Saturday was a day for preparation . . and the Rams ran through a light work-out, just to limber up. But, as luck would have it, two key men, Stan West and Jack Dwyer, suffered pain-ful and sidelining injuries in this brief

drill. A darker and more sinister cloud hovered over the hotel that night.

Then came the day of the game. . Pool's disclosure to the bus trip members of the Rams' party that the sideline flanker play would be used as a weapon to partially offset the epidemic of injuries. "I don't know if it will work or not, but we've got to try something with so many of our regulars injured." he explained.

Don't Call Them Deejays

Amos 'n' Andy, also known as Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll, have started a new show after twenty-five years in radio. And they have moments when they wonder why.



THE MOST POPULAR TEAM in the history of radio may be playing records and interviewing stars on their "Music Hall" but this is no slipshod effort. They even have a script to guide them. Hold on for some good laughs, folks, when you hear this show. (CBS photos.)

> VER CBS way there's a new radio program that ought to be a real delight. Called "The Amos 'n' Andy Music Hall" show, it is probably the most unexpected venture of the season.

When the news leaked out that Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll were going to take their famous "Amos 'n' Andy" characters into a new type of radio show, almost everyone was surprised. Why would these two talented men, after spending twenty-five fabulously successful years on radio, invite more work for themselves? The reaction was even more amazing when it was heard that they were going to do a show that had all the earmarks of a disc jockey thing.

However, those who have heard the program agree that this has as much connection with a deejay epic as "Little Orphan Annie" has with Zsa Zsa Gabor.

No Deejays

"We are not doing any disc jockey show!" Freeman Gosden explained heartily. "Yes, we're playing rec-October 8, 1954 ords—three or four of them—but we're doing far more than just spinning a few platters. As to why we started this new program, we've asked ourselves the same question. It all began when a friend of ours tossed us the germ of an idea, and we carried the ball from there. The show we have now is considerably different from the original idea—we can assure you.

"On all of our five-night-a-week programs we intend to tie in what records we play with a real story line. Our guest stars will not be interviewed in the usual way but they will be part and parcel of our 'plot' for the day. For instance, when Liberace and Jack Benny were our guests, we worked out a gag where only one star was expected—Liberace. Benny arrived unexpectedly because he said he had heard that we were to have one of the most important stars in the country as our guest and he naturally assumed he was the one. On the Frank Sinatra program, the 'Kingfish' interviewed him—along with 'Amos' and 'Andy.' The gimmick here was that 'Kingfish' told everyone he knew all about Sinatra and then asked Frank questions like 'You're married to Zsa Zsa Gabor, aren't you?' The 'plot line' was concerned with how to pay Frank his fee for appearing.

"We plan to do a comedy skit in our shows, but at times this won't be possible. For example, with Sophie Tucker and Judy Garland the cmphasis can't be on comedy. Instead, it must be on the moving highlights of their lives. Some of the other guests will be Burns and Allen and Tony Martin, and we even plan to take in people from other walks of life—such as sports figures."

Radio Fans

It was natural for Gosden and Correll to take this show to radio instead of television. They still remain two of radio's biggest boosters.

"We know radio isn't what it used to be." Freeman remarked, with a hearty agreement from Correll. "TV is the popular monster now, but we still feel radio has an enormous audience. The number of car radios tuned in alone is proof of that. Anyway, this has been our business for years. We enjoy it but we make a real business out of it."

The programs will be taped either in Gosden and Correll's office or at CBS studios—without an audience.

Naturally, a venture like this has to be paid for—and so you'll find commercials. But the program, originating in the "Grand Ballroom of the Lodge of The Mystic Knights of the Sea," will not be surfeited with endless plugs, such as are heard on disc jockey shows.

"We have about two or three commercials on each show," Correll stated. "Some we'll do just as Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll. Some will be given by the guest star. Others will be done by 'Kingfish' or 'Amos' or 'Andy.' But even these will have a comedy twist on occasions—and will be given with humor.

"We've heard that the other complaint, outside of the commercials, about most record shows is that the deejays play the top tunes over and over. We don't plan to stress the favorites. In fact, we will even go back into some of the popular classics of yesterday. And we won't be introducing any new numbers. We'll let the others take care of that."

Now that Gosden and Correll are knee deep in more work, they have moments when they wonder just what got into them. They are especially in a confused state when it comes to finding enough guest stars for their show.

"This alone has proved one thing," Correll said with a laugh, "we always thought we were crazy and now we know it."

ALE STORM, who is the proud mother of three boys, has found that TV children don't a l w a y s make the happy combination they are supposed to. In fact, she has found that being a TV parent isn't the easiest job in the world.

"Regulating my boys' TV fare has been something of a problem." the pert little "Margie" of NBC's "My Little Margie" remarked. "Naturally, my boys love it—but there are difficulties. When we sold our house and moved into a rented home until we were able to be in our new place, we had quite a situation on our hands. The boys couldn't ride their bikes any more since we were living in the hills. they had no friends there, and so they had a lot of time on their hands. As a result. Lee, my husband, and I had to pry them loose from the TV set. Our main objection has always been that we didn't want the boys to watch TV when they should be playing outside or studying. We didn't want them to lose the urge to think up things to do, either.

"Ordinarily, Lee and I manage things so that TV isn't taking over our house. On week-ends we plan little outings so that the boys don't have much time to watch television. We also have quite a rule against their watching TV during the dinner hour. We don't let them take a tray into the den and gulp their food down while being engrossed in the adventures of some television character. We feel that the dinner hour is the time when parents have the greatest influence on their family—and we don't want anything to usup that feeling of closeness. Of course, sometimes on Sundays we may all take a tray into the den and watch TV together, but at least there is still a family unit then.

"During the summer, Philip, Paul, and Peter stay up no later than nine. In the winter Philip is in bed by eight-thirty and his brothers get to bed by eight. So with this schedule and with their studies to do, which always come first, there is little time for them to see TV.

"Lee and I are especially sure to see that we never use TV as a baby sitter. There's a tendency among some parents to let the television take over their parental responsibilities. Maybe they don't want to be bothered with the children at times and so it's easier to let them stay glued to the set. This is one temptation I personally feel no parent should succumb to.

much. It also has a tendency to heighten such nervous habits as thumb-sucking and nail-biting. Being such an inactive, passive pastime it encourages such traits.

"However, I must confess that I don't think there are too many shows that are bad for a child to see. I think TV has regulated itself pretty well in putting on programs at a later hour that are not right for children. Besides. boys and girls seek their own level after a while. They usually don't watch shows that aren't right for them—at least not for too long a period. Philip has gone away from space shows and Western3, for instance, and has become a devoted follower of situation comedy programs. He even likes 'Panorama Pacific,' and 'The Big Picture.' shows that one would think would appeal only to adults. His other favorites are the funnies and Art Linkletter.

"There has been much discussion, too, about how close or how far away a child should sit from the set while watching TV. I feel children's eyes are different. They like to be close to a set and most pediatricians I have talked to say this is natural. They soon find the right distance anyway.

"Frankly, in spite of all its drawbacks, I think TV can be a fine educational device for children. It has taught them a lot especially has it taught them to recognize the products advertised on the shows. And how loyal the children are to those products! If they really like a program and then go to the market with their mothers, they see to it that the products advertised somehow get into the market basket.

"Not that I think TV is good only to sell cereal and the like. It can make children more alert to the developments taking place in this world today. It can bring them closer to the advances of the times. And it can create a wider range of interests.

"It strikes me that with such potentialities TV has a real challenge and an obligation to both parents and children. Let's hope its lets neither down."

ARENTS have to realize one thing about TV as far as their children are concerned—it is a barbituate, an opiate, a Mickey Finn. And it's up to mother and father to see that their youngsters aren't completely doped."

So spoke Dr. Frank Baxter, who has brought the intellectual approach to TV on his KNXT "Shakespeare on TV" program—and made it pay off.

"Let me say first that I think television a wonderful thing—when used properly." Dr. Baxter went on. "It's so wonderful I still find myself saying, 'I don't believe it will work.' But it can be a damaging thing, especially to today's youth.

More Variety

"I think TV must begin to offer a more balanced diet. There is a vast audience for new ideas, new programs. I can still remember when the party was given to announce the debut of 'Shakespeare on TV.' Many people there drank a good deal but few believed the idea would go over. That it apparently has is proof that audiences want something different —and, yes, intellectual.

"I don't believe the industry, so far, has thought much about shows for our children. There is certainly not enough variety in programming.

"There seems, in my humble opinion, several things wrong with children's shows. To begin with, some peace must be made with sponsors. Programs are too highly spiced with commercials. This business of drilling products into a child's mind is in highly questionable taste.

"I also don't approve of the shows of violence—and by that I don't necessarily mean western. I should say the western because all these outdoor epics are the same story over again. You know when the fight will start, you know when the hero and the villain will knock over a table, when they will knock down some shelves, when one will be thrown over the bar, when they will start fighting up the stairs and when one will be knocked over the bannister. There's just no imagination in these pictures—and they are definitely remote from reality. They depict a part of the west that never existed. What happens outdoors in the western isn't so bad but what happens indoors is dreadful.

LL ROADS these days lead to television. Even the biggest and most famous of them all, the Great White Way of Broadway, has capitulated to the demands of the giant new TV industry.

Sooner or later it had to happen. For a long time now the vast TV public has clamored to see the top Broadway productions.

When CBS-TV finally decided to bring the "Best of Broadway" into the living room of millions of American homes, the network went at it in a big way.

Best for "Best"

First of all, they took one of the best times available. For over three years now, the Pabst Blue Ribbon Bouts on Wednesday at 7 p.m. has been one of the top-rated programs on the air. Westinghouse, through the co-operation of the Pabst Brewing Company, was able to obtain one Wednesday night each month for the Broadway plays.

The next problem was: which plays should they select? The answer was obvious: if they were going to call the series the "Best of Broadway." that's exactly what they should get. As a result Broadway's best musical comedies and dramatic plays of the last three decades were lined up.

The opening one, "The Royal Family." seen on September 15, starred Helen Hayes, Claudette Colbert, Frederic March, and Charles Coburn. The George S. Kaufman-Edna Ferber comedy was viewed "live" over the CBS-TV network — ninety-four stations altogether.

The remaining "Best of Broadway" plays to be seen during the coming year include:

"The Man Who Came to Dinner" by Moss Hart and George S. Kaufman, on October 13.

"Panama Hattie" on November 10.

"Ah Wilderness" by Eugene O'Neill, "The Guardsman" by Ferenc Molnar.

"Idiot's Delight" by Robert Sherwood.

"Arsenic and Old Lace" by Joseph O. Kesserling.

"The Barretts of Wimpole Street" by Rudolph Besier.

"The Time of Your Life" by William Saroyan.

"The Philadelphia Story" by Philip Barry.

Producer Talks

In an exclusive interview, TV-Radio Life discussed some of the aspects of the "Best of Broadway" with Producer Martin Manulis. The producer of "Suspense" since October, 1952. Manulis has an impressive list of Broadway plays to his credit and has directed such stars as Shirley Booth, Tallulah Bankhead, Sara Churchill, Donald Cook, John Loder and Jeffrey Lynn.

Did Manulis think the one-hour TV show would be able to do full justice to the more lengthy Broadway productions.

"Yes. Definitely." he replied. "We found, for example in the cutting of "The Royal Family" that we eliminated the sub plot elements and the lesser characters who had no bearing on the major story, we were able to retain the major characters and story in full."

Will any of the original scripts be changed? Will any lines be censored?

The reply: "There will be no basic changes in the original scripts. The original, of course, will have to be cut. But in 'The Royal Family' we found that we had scarcely a line or two which was not written by Kaufman or Ferber. Our attempt is to make a TV show primarily—but a TV show of a play as opposed to a scenario. As far as I know there

will be no censorship other than that of basic good taste for family viewing. This privilege will be exercised by ourselves."

Are any of the original authors working on the TV plays?

"Yes. Howard Lindsay and Russel Crouse on "Arsenic and Old Lace"; William Saroyan on "The Time of Your Life"; Phillip Barry, Jr., on the late Phillip Barry's "The Philadelphia Story"; and we hope Robert Sherwood on "The Petrified Forest."

In Color, Too

Does Manulis himself prefer to work on a TV show or a Broadway play?

"It's hard for anybody as stage struck as I am to choose between producing a Broadway show or a TV show. But when it's on 'The Best of Broadway' the producer gets the best of both worlds. The plays are top flight as is the production. The casts are more impressive in name value than could ever possibly be assembled for a Broadway production," he answered.

"The Best of Broadway" is transmitted and received in color, though of course the great majority of Americans see the performances in the usual black and white. What affect does the color have upon production?

"Color affects very much the planning of the physical production," Manulis replied. "The settings, the properties in furnishing and costumes must be designed specially, not only for their fitness to the play, but their harmony to the color-physical production is very much like a Broadway play rather than for black and white television."

Will the "Eest of Broadway" hurt the box office of Broadway productions, particularly on the Wednesday night of the show?

The reply: "As this could only apply to New York City and the few October 8, 1954 major cities in the country which have live theatre, I don't think we are in serious competition. I hope that the 'Best of Broadway' will be exciting enough to keep avid legitimate theater goers at their sets on Wednesday night."

Finally, the \$64 question: Will the people who have seen the original plays on Broadway be disappointed after seeing the one-hour TV version?

Manulis gave a firm reply of "No" to this one. "We have attempted to preserve and so far on the first two scripts, I think we have succeeded in keeping the values of the plays which first made them successes. That is, the dialogue, basic characterization, major story lines, laugh lines, etc.

"I think if the viewer has already seen the full stage play and liked it, he will only have a happy and satisfactory nostalgia from seeing the play again and the high moments will be there for him to enjoy.

"A case in point from an actor's standpoint: Fredric March played 'The Royal Family' on the stage and in motion pictures. When he read our version of the play, he felt that only three lines had been left out that he especially remembered as fine moments in the play.

"The three lines were quickly restored—and only one turned out to be his."

ANOTHER ONE of Hollywood's great stars to finally hit the TV fold is the lovely Claudette Colbert.
