# A New Deal for Ken



"WHERE WERE YOU?" is an interesting new series. Here Ken Murray interviews by remote Captain Joseph McConnell, triple jet ace of the Korean War.

> T TOOK a man with a cigar to introduce a novel twist to TV.

The man is Ken Murray. But you won't see his cigar on his new show, "Where Were You?" which is being seen locally on KTTV. Nor will you hear the typical Murray jokes. That phase of Ken's career has been dropped and in its place is a man who is completely devoted to a show that can be one of the most informative and entertaining offerings on TV.

"Where Were You?" may be compared in some ways to Edward R. Murrow's "Person to Person" but only in an abstract sense. It does feature an interview with a famed personality but that is only one segment of the show. Basically, it introduces, without identifying, a noted figure of the past, surrounds him with film clips representative of his era, and then lets the viewer guess his identity. The clips themselves are of very real educational value in that they picture the manners and morals of the times.

But, actually, no description of the show does it justice. You have to see it to appreciate it.

For those who have followed Ken's career, his switch to a show of this type shouldn't be a surprise. Many remember his dramatic work in "The Valiant" which was part of his famous "Blackouts." And those who saw his TV shows from New York about three years ago remember the documentaries he introduced on his hour long program.

#### Jean Holloway

"Actually, it was Jean Holloway, November 19, 1954 who is writing 'Where Were You?' who got me started in documentaries," Ken stated. "Now she won't even let me have a cigar during my narration for 'Where Were You?' and she's against the few jokes I make during the show. When I was doing the Budweiser program a few years ago I went over to her place one night to get some sketches from her. Two especial y interested me—one on West Point and one on the Air Force. To get them I told her I wanted to have Van Heflin or Joseph Cotten play them. She said she'd like to see me do the part. And that's how it all began.

"The idea for 'Where Were You?' was really an outgrowth of a hobby I've always had. I've kept detailed records of people and events from the year 1903 on. I wanted to get this collection for my children. One day my brother-in-law suggested I make a TV show out of this material.

"Actually, what we are doing, then, is recording history in terms of people instead of events."

Ken was so convinced he had a solid property that he invested \$80,000 of his own money in the beginning. He made four pictures and then made a deal with Bing Crosby Enterprises. Many companies, however, wanted to buy the show once they saw it. To date, more than twenty-six pictures have been filmed and Ken has hundreds of possible subjects on tap for the future.

#### Problems

"We naturally have many problems connected with the show," Ken went on. "There is the matter of sending our camera crew all over the country

to film the various personalities in their own homes. There is the problem of getting famous men and women to agree to be present at a specified time for us to film their interview. There is the vast amount of research necessary for each show. Royal Foster and Jean have this unenviable task. They spend countless hours reading every bit of material available on a certain year. Then there are the film clips we use. These I was fortunate enough to get from one of the major studios. But perhaps the most difficult problem of all is tracking down the people we want to use on the show. It took us months to get Betty Lou Oliver, the elevator operator who fell seventy-two feet when the Empire State Building was hit by a plane some time back. We finally got her through an insurance company.

"But every show has its problems and we feel the rewards on 'Where Were You?' more than compensate for its difficulties. I want an adult show, something to complement the mind. People don't like to be educated but they like to be brain pickers. We give them that chance here. There is definite educational value in our show but there is also entertainment.

"We were worried too about our audience appeal, but I know there is no show that appeals to everyone. There is enough in 'Where Were You?' though. to give us a very wide audience. It should appeal to all but the smallest of children."

Ken's program is a film show that looks like it's live. The interviews with the people involved are filmed and then Ken talks to a blank screen and cuts in with his questions.

Ken's family has also appeared in several of the episodes. His wife, Betty, has worked in the comedy skits, which are part of each show, and his three children have also been involved. As a matter of fact, this is a family affair since Jean Holloway's husband, Dan Tobin, is the typical American husband who is featured in all the comedy skits.

We'll make you a guarantee once you've seen one "Where Were You?" show you'll want to see them all. That's a sure sign cf success.

## WHAT'S SO

S SMOG blanketed Los Angeles in the early Fall, so George Gobel did likewise to millions of TV viewers from coast.to-coast.

The NBC-TV star also made tears come to the eyes of the public—but they were tears of laughter. As a result of his own show, and his spectacular skit on the "Diamond Jubilee of Light" telecast, Gobel definitely established himself as the comic sensation of the season. Mention the word "Gobel" to the average TV viewer, and immediately a smile came to his face.

Although there was little doubt that the diminutive comedian had "arrived," a great aura of mystery surrounded him.

Immediately, the columnists and critics started to tear George apart; they wanted to know what made him tick. They knew he was funny, possibly even "great," but they wanted to know why.

Goodness knows, ever since the advent of TV on a large commercial scale, hundreds—even thousands—of new comedians, with new faces, and with iokes (some new, some old) had been exposed to the public. Some of them died after their first performance; some started a little flame of stardom but slowly flickered away to obscurity.

#### Not Gobel

But not Gobel. After a year of frantic searching by the top names in Page Four show business for a perfect format for Gobel, he finally landed in the average American living room with a thunderous crash (of laughter), and he has stayed there ever since.

Everyone wanted to know "Why?" "Why should Gobel succeed where others failed?" "What's Gobel got?"

#### Answers

The answers were as voluminous as the laughs on one of Gobel's shows.

They said it was his size. Small men (Gobel stands a mere five feet six inches and weighs only 135 pounds) have always had an advantage as comedians. As a general rule, audiences have a greater sympathy, and consequently are more relaxed and easy prey for a pun from a small man rather than a six foot giant

They said it was his "warmth individual charm, and wonderful grassroots humor." Because of these things. Gobel always gives the impression that he is on "the same level." never "above" his listening public

They said it was his "intelligence." Gobel seldom relies on a put or "slapstick" for his laughs. His source of humor (as it should be with all "great" comedians) is in his very words, and in the way he expresses them.

They called him (such as Hodda Hopper), the 'master of the unfinished sentence' A very apt phrase indeed because time and again Gobel will stop talking abut a s the iect completely—and as mart the unspoken word are furn. What was it the poet said about "those words unspoken are sweeter still"?) In Gobel's case, he should have added the phrase—"and funnier still."

#### The Real George

Many other explanations were expounded by the experts to determine what Gobel had, that all the others lacked. To some degree, all of the theories about the thirty-four year old humorist were true. His size helps with the laughs; he does have "warmth. individual charm. and wonderful grass-roots humor" his approach to humor is "intelligent" (that's why his writers like to work with him); and he definitely is the "master of the unfinished sentence."

In all these analyses however, the demons of the typewriter forgot one important thing: they forgot to ask the man himself. Not one had the time or inclination to go up to Mr. George Gobel and ask: "So what's so funny about Gobel?"

(Ah-h!—you guesed it you little darlings! Yes, indeed, we dood it!)

It was immediately after George had finished a script rehearsal at the NBC studios. The serious-faced Gobel listened to the question, and gave a straight-forward unfunny answer:

"This question of trying to figure out what makes me tick is one of my pet peeves. I honestly don't know why I am funny. I'm no analyst, I've never tried to figure it out, and probably never will.

"Ever since I started telling jokes

in public, I don't think my style has changed much. Of course, I have made many additions, but basically my approach is the same as it always has been.

"There is one thing, however. This business about my being the 'master of the unfinished sentence.' I guess that started because of my guitar playing. Many times, going from a song to a story, I would stop in the middle of a sentence and either play the guitar or tell a joke. I found out that for some reason the audience laughed when I stopped suddenly."

(Editor's note: You might say they were laughing at nothing, then, eh George? Ha! Ha? Oh. yes, as you were saying).

"Anyhow," George continued, "there is no one definite person or definite style that you can pin my humor to. My humor is just the way I tell things."

#### No Ad-libber?

"For example," George pointed out, "here's a script the way the writers have put it on paper. I don't read it the way it's written; without changing the meaning. I read it the way I say it, the way it is natural for me, and I hope funny.

"Also, unlike many comedians, I am not a great ad-libber. I can't say funny things on the spur of the moment."

Maybe George Gobel doesn't think so, but he is a great ad-libber, or whatever you want to call it. As an examp'e, on the "Diamond Jubilee" show, at one point in the telecast when George was actually on the air there was a slight confusion about the script and about the "brain chart" he was making constant reference to.

Momentarily confused, George turned to the men offstage and remarked: "I don't like to be made sport of!"

Now does that honestly sound like a funny line—in black and white or November 19, 1954 in the way anyone else would say it? Of course not.

But the way George Gobel said it, it was one of the most humorous and most memorable lines on the entire two-hour telecast.

There—in the proverbial nutshell you have the answer to the question "What's funny about Gobel?" The answer: Gobel—that's what's funny about Gobel!

You don't believe it? Watch and listen to him sometime—or just ask your neighbor. He'll tell you:

"George Gobel? He's a riot. Keeps me laughing all the time. Why? I don't know why. I'll leave that to the experts."

# It Got Its Face Lifted

"CBS-TV's "The Ray Milland Show" has itself a new look—and everyone seems to be happy about it. But what brought about this change? Could it be a man by the name of Harry Tugend?

VIRGINIA FIELD had a solid part in one of the shows. The new format has tossed some acting plums to several stars. (Bureau of Industrial Service, Inc. photos.)

> O ONE was too happy last year about the "Meet Mr. McNutley" show. Especially the star himself — Ray Milland.

That was the season for Ray to be a comic buffoon, an addle-pated professor. The name of the show was just as ridiculous as asking a star of Ray's talent to play what amounted to a jerk. So when the new season began there were changes called for—and they were made.

The biggest move was bringing Harry Tugend, noted motion picture writer and producer of many of Paramount's biggest hits, in as "head man." And the first thing he did was change the title to the more sensible "Ray Milland Show."

#### **Ray's New Stature**

"I had worked with Ray for several years at Paramount," Harry commented. "I knew what his capabilities were and what he would be best received in. I felt he should be given something with more stature instead of just broad comedy. So I thought of making Ray a professor of Dra-

matic Arts—a sort of combination of Dr. Frank Baxter and the famous Dr. Baker of Yale. I liked the show business angle because I have always felt that show business was the royalty of America.

"I hope the new programs we're doing are giving Ray more dignity. We're also putting in prominent roles for other performers—such as the shows which featured Hans Conried, Virginia Field, and Henry Hull. Some people have felt that these stars have somewhat stolen the show, in instances, from Ray, but this doesn't bother him at all. He's concerned only with doing a good program. And the fact still remains tha Ray always solves the problems in the shows and that it is his program. The audience, of course is going to be the judge. It will be up to them to say whether or not the show was good.

"We changed the title because to me, 'Meet Mr. McNutley' sounded like corny comedy. The 'Ray Milland Show' seems to have more dignity.

"Ray can do almost any kind of part and I want to make use of his versatility. He does wonderful things with his face. In fact, he could have been a fine silent motion picture far. Phyllis Avery amazes me She really sparkles. She's one actress who is so vital and expressive you know what she's thinking every minute. You can see her mind working. With Ray and Phyllis' undentable taken it's no wonder we can shoot each show in two fays."

#### Vs. Graucho

There is still only one drawhack-

the Milland program is in its same time slot, right smack against Groucho. And this worries Harry Tugend, not only because he likes "You Bet Your Life" but because he is also a close friend of Groucho's.

"Groucho is one of the toughest shows to be against." Harry said firmly. "I'd rather be against a top program like 'Dragnet' or 'I Love Lucy' and I'll tell you why. If we don't get the audience the first five or ten minutes it is doubtful if they'd turn to 'Dragnet' or 'Lucy' because they would already have missed the opening of the plot there. But they could and would turn to Groucho at any time. Consequently, we can't afford any lulls in our show—and that's why I feel scripts are the most important part of our program or of any program for that matter. Groucho is also tough competition because he has a different 'cast' each week.

"Of course, I consider Groucho one of the three greatest wits in the country, the other two being Georgie Jessel and Fred Allen. So if we get people away from him we're just plain lucky."

If vou'll note, "The Ray Milland Show" isn't stressing comedy entirely. In fact, a good part of its openings aren't comic at all. Some episodes will have pathos, some will have suspense, others will be intimate little stories primarily between Ray and Phyllis.

It's good to see a company take on a rejuvenation job on a show in which they have confidence. In fact this one can turn out to be so good that even Groucho will watch it.

On the human side, Dick Kerr, a comic with a tricky voice, did some amusing monologues and the lovely King Sisters put over their tunes pleasantly.

Santa came early this year, but the nursery set doesn't seem to matter a bit. This morning program is strictly for the pre-schoolers, who don't have a particularly keen sense of timing insofar as holidays are concerned.

Jovial, rotund Santa (Hal Smith)

whisks the children up to the North Pole and for a pleasant half-hour they listen to children's records and get a brief discourse on good behavior. Santa's white book is to record good deeds, his black for wrong ones. Quite possibly child psychology exponents would not be in complete agreement with this segment. But the parents seem to like it. At least, that is what their letters seem to indicate. Santa has become the disciplinarian, and a successful one we might add, in many a household.

Santa leads the youngsters in prayer and as a special treat converses with his imaginary friends Impy, the gnome and Dixie, the Pixie.

Although toys were quite in evidence throughout the telecast, the only pitch Santa made was for a book entitled, "Santa's Own Story of The First Christmas." If this is the extent of the merchandising to be done on the show, Santa can never be accused of taking advantage of the nursery trade with his very early visit to the videolanes. M.R.

#### Skelton Surprise Package

## How To Be A Good

'M a mother-in-law myself —and have I worked at it! In fact, I've a doubleheader on my hands since I have two married daughters —and the things I've learned would delight almost any psychiatrist!

You know, there have been psychological books about almost every problem of human nature, but it does seem that only now are psychiatrists getting around to mothersin-law. It's about time!

There is, as I have discovered, quite a difference between fathersin-law and mothers-in-law. After the son or daughter leaves the fireside and starts living a new life, the father's career goes right on. The mother's, however, is over. She feels at a loss. She wants to be helpful and she doesn't know how. She suffers from a deprivation of affection. She is actually a displaced person. So it is not too surprising that in her attempts to adjust to her new life she makes more than a few blunders.

Young people starting out on their own are apt to regard a mother-inlaw as of not too much use except as a baby sitter. They're so excited with their new stature that it's natural for them to feel this way. "Mother" is fine with them if she'll drop by occasionally but not say too much. In fact, it's better if she doesn't say anything at all. And yet "mother" goes right on trying to be of help.

#### Faux Pas

I can remember one of the sev-Page Forty eral *faux pas* I pulled. One day I gleefully took out three personable filet mignons from my freezer and proudly carried them to my daughter's house. I was sure she and her husband would greet the sight of the steaks with glee because it was towards the end of the month and I knew about their strict budget. Well, the gesture was all right but I had forgotten one thing. My daughter and her husband were proud of the fact that they still had seventy-three cents left and a can of salmon to carry them through the rest of the month. The steaks had thrown their plans into a cocked hat. I had hurt their pride. I had interfered with the achievement of their independence. I learned then there was no point in my saying, "I only meant to help" or in my daughter's saying, "T know you wanted to help, mother, but —" so I decided then and there to button my lip. I have kept my lip buttoned on that and other matters for several years now—and I have found that silence is the best antidote to an awkward situation. Some time later, and with a sense of humor, it doesn't hurt to talk about the matter—but always with a laugh!

#### Nc Advice

I have found that it's much wiser for mothers-in-law never to interfere in any way and particularly it's good for them not to give advice. Oh, perhaps a subtle point can be tossed in the right direction by a device like making a general criticism of another couple. Make up the story you're telling if you have to. Use it as idle gossip. And then hope that the young people towards whom it is directed don't get on to your game.

It's not good to give advice even when it's asked for. Every mother has found herself in the position where her son or daughter comes to her with a marital problem. Here is the perfect pitfall for the mother to fall into, since it's her natural inclination to take her own child's side. But I think it's much safer to let the son or the daughter talk, to be a sounding board, just ask a lot of questions, and come to no conclusions. Most of the time if the offspring talks enough he'll come to his own conclusions. And then, at least, no one can blame the outcome on the mother-in-law.

My daughters are fortunate in a way. I'm much too busy working in "December Bride" and in pictures to have time to drop in on them and give them whatever pearly words of wisdom I may have stashed away. I don't heartily approve of a mother-in-law dropping in unannounced. I always telephone before I visit my daughters—and their husbands. Fortunately, I have no problems because I happen to have very understanding sons-in-law.

Sons-in-law in particular, need to be considered. A mother-in-law accepts quite normally her own husband's place in the household. She occasionally forgets that the son-inlaw has just as much right to find his department in his home. He cannot be expected to do everything the same way her husband did. The

mother-in-law has to let him adjust to his place. In fact, she has to let him and his wife adjust to their places.

The crucial point in the relationship between a mother-in-law and her new family is about a year or two after the son or daughter gets married. In the beginning, the mother-in-law is still consulted about problems and then comes the time when she is no longer so much in the picture. If she can get by this period, she will find that in about six or seven years she will reach a far more adult understanding with her family. She may even find that as a mother-in-law she is really someone who is loved. That's if she is careful about her actions previous to that time. For the first five years the kids are anxious to prove themselves. They have an attitude of "Don't look yet. mother.

#### Grandmother Now

Then comes the time when the mother-in-law becomes the grand-mother. She knows just what to feed the baby, when to feed him, how to take care of him-and she's driven by some urge to pass on her invaluable information to the parents whether it's wanted or not. But she forgets that, although she

Sometimes a situation arises where it's almost impossible for a mother-in-law to keep quiet. She feels that, in all honesty, she must make her ideas known. This has happened to me on occasion. So I have writ-ten a note to my daughter, ex-pressing how I feel, and always being careful to add, "Maybe I'm right and maybe I'm wrong but this being careful to add, "Maybe 1111 right and maybe I'm wrong, but this is what I think and I think you're heading for a 'all." By adding that I give my daughter the right to refuse or take the opinion. After I've written it I leave it alone for a few days and then I go back and read it again and make deletions. Then it is mailed. I never have gone to see my daughter about some problem because too often a tone of voice can cause rancor, words pile upon words, and soon the fire is blazing.

#### **Outside Help**

You can't think clearly when emotions are too involved.

Usually, if a mother-in-law isn't changing it's because of some very real trouble inside her. If she refuses to try to change then the only recourse left open is for the couple to see to it that she remains around people of her age who share her views. And a mother-in-law can be too old to change if she's forty or eighty. Age, after all, is not depend ent on years but whether life seems to be ahead or behind. The future is always unknown and always demands change

I guess that's the major point a mother-in-law has to face. She has to look ahead to a new life. She has to change with the times. She has to start all over again in kindergarten if she hopes to build a firm new foundation with her family. She can do this if she wants to.

Well, I've had my say-and I'm glad. It's not often that a mother-in-law can talk as much as she wants to without feeling like kicking herself in the back.

Red Skelton never lights a cigar, because in his early vaudeville days a loaded cigar exploded in his face, nearly blinding him. He says he refuses to go through a prop door with a prop concrete block tied around his neck and refuses to talk on a telephone because he wants to see to whom he's talking.

Jim Jordan has an unusual superstition that started twenty years ago in Chicago during the early days of radio. Jim would write his name, and doodle a bit. on the first page of his script. He did so because in those days, despite the many revisions. actors received but one script per show and Jim would hurriedly affix his name on his script to protect his sole copy. With two decades of broadcasting to his credit. Jim would no sooner start rehearsing a show until his signature, with flourishes, was penciled on his script. There have been occasions when Jim was unavoidably late for rehearsals. Instead of plunging right into rehearsals to compensate for his tardiness. Jim always takes time meticulously to sign his name on his script and then gives the go-ahead for rehearsing.

#### Negative Approach

Groucho Marx says: "I have no superstitions. By now 1 thought everyone knew I was a die-hard realist." Ray Milland simply comments: "I have no superstitions." Art Linkletter likes to flaunt superstitions. He embarked on a world-wide trip on Friday the 13th merely because it was Friday the 13th.
